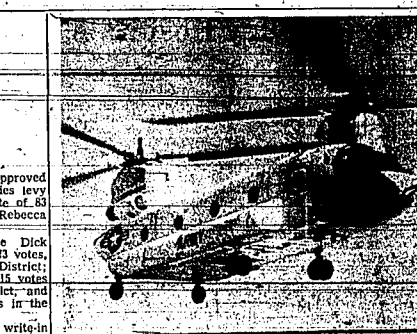

## Nixon To Ask Extension Of Food Stamps

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Nixon administration plans to ask Congress for a major expansion of the federal food stamp program. It was announced today.

House Republican Leader Gerald R. Ford said following a GOP strategy session at the White House that the administration's proposals would be submitted Wednesday to the Senate Select Committee on Nutrition and Human Needs.

Everett M. Dirksen and other Republican lawmakers met with Nixon for more than an hour.

Ford said Agriculture Secretary Clifford M. Hardin would propose nearly doubling the current annual outlay for the stamps, which are sold to the needy at a sharp discount and are spent at face value in grocery stores.

Food stamp appropriations total about \$280 million this fiscal year but at the present rate of spending, the outlay for stamps will be at the rate of \$340 million annually by July 1.

Ford said.

For the next fiscal year which begins July 1, Hardin will ask that the appropriation be boosted to \$615 million annually.

## Guards Of Pope Add 24 Recruits

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Twenty-four recruits were sworn in Tuesday for two-year hitch in the world's smallest, most old-fashioned and most photographed army—the Pope's 75-man-strong Swiss Guards.

The recruits took their oath of duty in a steady rainfall in the Belvedere Courtyard of the Vatican, dressed in the billowy yellow, orange and blue uniforms the artist Michelangelo designed for them four centuries ago.

The only weapons in sight were ancient halberds, the same long staffed weapons with which the Swiss Guards fought their last battle 442 years ago.

In accordance with longstanding rules, the new recruits are all from German-speaking cantons of Switzerland, are bachelors under 25 and are at least 5-foot-8.

## Tobacco Dilemma Continues

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Congress is getting closer to the deadline for decisions on health and cigarette smoking but is still understanding the problem less.

A summation of the situation in the wake of a new round of hearings before the House Commerce Committee is that Congress has about the same information it had five years ago.

In 1964 the surgeon general issued his much-debated report that statistics show a correlation between smoking and cancer death. Tobacco industry experts challenged the findings.

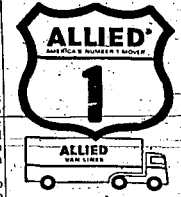
June 30 is the expiration date of a 1965 law under which Congress has, for the specific period, preempted the control of cigarette advertising.

The same law provided for the statement that now appears on every cigarette pack: "Caution: Cigarette Smoking May Be Hazardous to Your Health."

If Congress fails to extend its own controls over tobacco advertising the Federal Trade Commission and the Federal Communications Commission would be free to impose such restrictions of their own.

In deciding whether to restrict or protect cigarette advertising Congress also must consider economic consequences.

Gov. Hugh Scott of North Carolina, the Nation's biggest tobacco-producing state, said the subcommittee that hangs

## War Protests From GIs Said Rising

**WASHINGTON (UPI)** — A former Army enlisted man who edited an underground newspaper while stationed at Ft. Dix, N.J., says opposition to U.S. policy in Vietnam is on the rise in the military services.

A growing number of GIs is calling into question many of the same things that students have begun to question, Allen Myers, 26, said Tuesday in a speech to an antiwar group known as Business Executives Move for Vietnam Peace.

Service men taking a stand against the war, he said, know the risks they are taking and are prepared to accept possible penalties "because they have come to believe that the war is immoral and that they can no longer remain silent."

Myers, of Madison, Wis., said he was honorably discharged 11 days ago after two court-martial and acquittal charges of distributing unauthorized literature at Ft. Dix.

Dr. George Wald, professor of biology at Harvard University, called in his speech for immediate U.S. withdrawal from South Vietnam. He also urged abolition of the draft and recommended rejection of the Nixon administration's proposal to deploy the Safeguard antiballistic missile system.

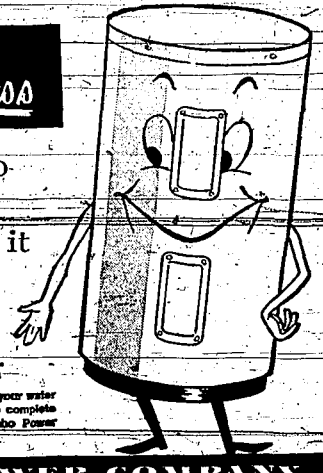

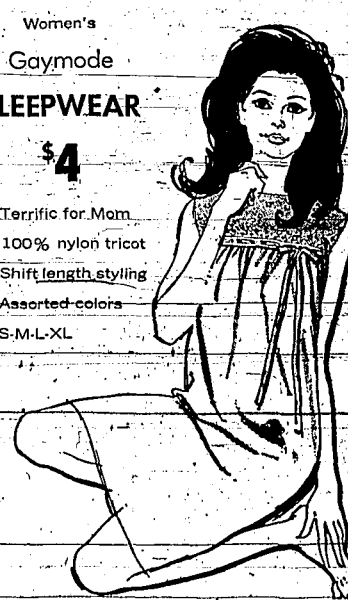

## Authorities Deny Rumors Of New Sea Queen Will Receive Royal Welcome

Jury To Probe Fortas Firm

TOLEDO, Ohio (UPI)—U.S. authorities denied Tuesday night that a federal grand jury might have impaneled here to open a two-year-old case involving Supreme Court Justice Abe Fortas's law firm.

"We're not in a position to impanel a jury because we have no U.S. attorney here," said Federal Judge Frank Klob. "We have a very crowded docket. We have enough to do, let alone adding something like this."

"It just could not be done right now," U.S. Atty. Harry Pickering of Cleveland, who is handling federal cases in Toledo while the city is without a U.S. attorney of its own, echoed Klob's opinion.

"We don't have a grand jury impaneled at Toledo," he said. Pickering added that he would be notified of any plan to call a grand jury here, he conceded, however, that the U.S. grand jury might have ordered an investigation of the case without listing him as a witness.

"We never know what they're investigating," he said. "We don't ask, they don't tell us. We prefer it that way."

today that the Justice Department had begun a grand jury investigation into an action taken in 1967 by Fortas's firm. The Times dispatch said the action delayed the production of documents sought by federal racketeering attorneys from one of the firm's clients.

The newspaper said the investigation had been under consideration for months. John Mattimore, the former U.S. attorney in Toledo who resigned when President Lyndon B. Johnson's term expired in January, said the Fortas firm, Arnold and Porter, represented one of several steel companies involved in a price-fixing case he prosecuted in 1967.

Four steel executives were indicted, but only Irvin Fruchtman of the Fruchtman Steel Co. was convicted. Arnold and Porter represented the Donovan Steel and Wire Co.

Reports of a grand jury reinvestigation of the 1967 case circulated Tuesday in Washington, where some Republicans were demanding that Fortas resign because he received—but later returned—a \$200,000 fee from the family of financier Louis Wolfson, now jailed for stock manipulation.

The British ocean liner will be met by Mayor John V. Lindsay, a welcoming flotilla of military band, and a host of well wishers on her arrival from Southampton, England.

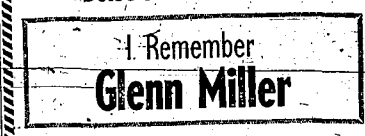

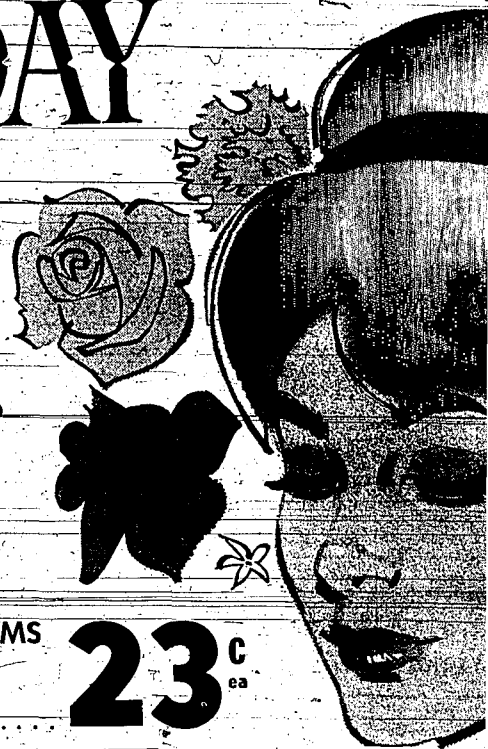

### Key Witness Continues Long Stint

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI)—A key prosecution witness completed his second day of grueling cross-examination Tuesday in defense efforts to break his slaying of a man and kill two Wyoming businessmen, whose bodies were found in a Nevada desert.

The witness, Robert Lindblad of Salt Lake City, testified at the trial of Theodore Linn, 36, of Jackson, Wyo., charged with murder in the slayings of Robert Stucker and Larry Olinger, both of Jackson.

Lindblad, who has been granted immunity for his testimony, answered questions by Dist. Atty. George Franklin on about five minutes. He testified that he shot one of the victims himself and said the other was shot by Glenn Lucas, 48, Reno, who was acquitted of the double murder earlier this year.

Under cross-examination Tuesday, Lindblad said Linn guaranteed payment for the death of Olinger and Stucker and drove the car to the murder scene.

Lindblad drew several large-scale maps and diagrams of the area where the bodies of Stucker and Olinger were found in a shallow grave near Carson City. He also told how he ran from the law for years before turning himself over to authorities.

Another witness Tuesday was Gerold Matthews, a Jackson bartender who testified that Linn told him Stucker and Olinger were killed "because Dave Goldsmith wanted it that way."

Goldsmith, a business partner with the victims in a Jackson business, is awaiting trial in connection with the double murder. The Nevada Supreme Court ruled earlier this week there was sufficient evidence to hold him.

Cernan, Thomas P. Stafford and John W. Young tried out the 12-pound camera in their spacecraft Tuesday and it flashed good quality color pictures to the mission spacecraft center in Houston.

The test was the last in a series designed to qualify the camera for its first spaceflight. Only black and white television cameras have been used before in space, and Apollo 10 also will have one aboard.

Apollo 10 is scheduled to take off on its eight-day, moon orbiting adventure May 18. Only a pressure-proof test of the Saturn 5 rocket's first-stage booster tank remaining to be completed today before engineers can begin preparations for the final countdown next week.

Stafford said at a recent briefing that he hoped to use the new color camera for many hours to show what the earth looks like as Apollo 10 speeds away from it, and what the moon looks like as Apollo 10 approaches and orbits it.

The view out the side in living color is just fantastic," Stafford said. "It's really hard to describe."

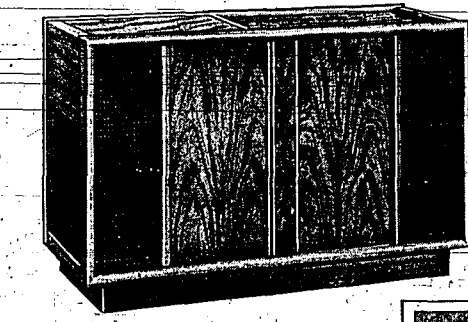

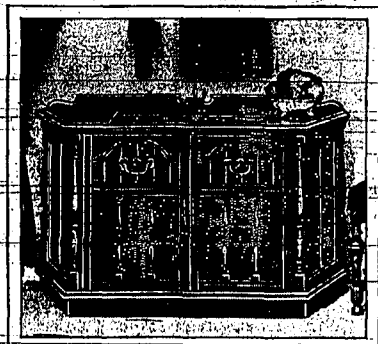

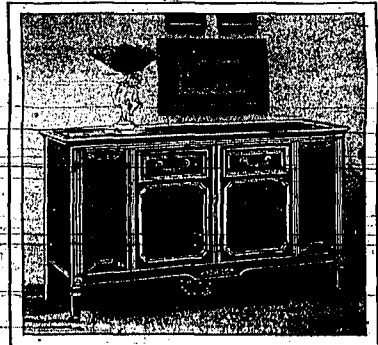

## War Reparations Net Wealth For Most Defeated Nations

Lillenthal, former head of the Tennessee Valley Authority, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission and a veteran of development planning in Iran, Colombia and elsewhere, now is at work on postwar rehabilitation for South Vietnam.

A report prepared jointly with South Vietnamese planners now on President Nguyen Van Thieu's desk estimates that South Vietnam with \$2.5 billion in economic aid can become economically independent within 10 years after war's end.

The report, considered by some to be optimistic, places heavy emphasis on development and reclamation of vast areas of the rice-producing Mekong Delta.

Two of the more exciting international projects which will bolster the South Vietnamese economy are the Trans-Annam highway which eventually

will link Istanbul and Saigon and the \$1 billion U.S. investment program offered by former President Johnson in a speech at Johns Hopkins in 1965.

This the Mekong River development plan, benefiting South Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos and Thailand upon which work already is far advanced.

Lillenthal, however, believes that South Vietnam's own development need not await

these projects, nor does it need await the end of the fighting. South Vietnam's pressing wartime needs for improved port facilities, warehousing and roads already have resulted in impressive groundwork for a peacetime economy. Thousands of skilled Vietnamese workers have been the outgrowth of a new port at Cam Ranh Bay, highway construction and related jobs in a \$1.8 billion military construction program.

She is one of seven students in the United States to receive such a grant.

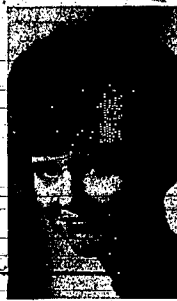

# British Teachers Face Major Crisis As "Backlash" Threatens Education

By MARIS ROSS  
LONDON (UPI)—Britain has adopted the word "backlash" from the United States to describe a mounting campaign against the present system of education in Britain. Edward Short, the education minister, has said teachers face probably their greatest crisis of this century because society has taken a massive lurch toward a reaction, resulting in a general attack on liberal ideas in education. In an argument that is bogged down with semantics and woolly thinking, the attackers deny

their target is liberalism. Rather, they dispute the assumptions on which modern educational methods are based. The backlash stems from two main roots: the student agitation and the Labor government's policy of replacing selective schools for brighter children with comprehensive schools catering to everyone. The bible of the backlash is a pamphlet called "Right for Education: A Black Paper," containing the motley thoughts of 19 contributors. Short said, "In my view the publication of the Black Paper

was one of the blackest days for education in the past century. We should be extremely foolish—if we ignored it—or underestimated the impact it may make because it is so ridiculous and so outrageously behind the times. The very eminence of some of its contributors alone will ensure the widest possible audience for it." The introduction by Prof. C.B. Cox of Manchester University and Anthony Dyson, senior lecturer at the University of East Anglia, protests that anarchy is becoming fashionable, that discipline and hard work are treated with contempt. They ask why "fine schools" like the free grammar schools and fee-paying public schools with their traditionally more academic approach must be destroyed in the name of equality to make way for the comprehensives which, they claim, hold the brighter students down to the level of the rest. Among the contributors, novelist Kingsley Amis said more universities has meant a worsening of standards. Angus Maude, Conservative Party

Member of Parliament, said equality was a chimera and quality was the ideal. Author Robert Conquest said universities should impose a cultural test on entrants to keep out those who "have no idea who Virgil, Verdi, Mendel or Kant were." Short said, "It may be that the immediate trigger which released the backlash has been the activities of a tiny minority of our university students. If this is the end product, there must be something sadly wrong with the system." "But there is much more to it than this. We should indeed be blind if we did not see this in its wider context of a massive lurch in society toward reaction." Short singled out Lord Snow, former member of the Labor government, for proposing "what most people believe is the completely spurious doctrine, reminiscent of Dr. Goebbels, that there is an ineradicable racial and ethnic factor in what he thinks is the ability to achieve." In a speech in New York March 31, Lord Snow said the Jewish people had made an inappreciable large contribution to the world. He asked, "Is there something in the Jewish gene pool which produces talent on quite a different scale from, say, the Anglo-Saxon gene pool? I am prepared to believe that that may be so."

### Fortas Faces New Attack On Integrity

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Supreme Court Justice Abe Fortas faced new congressional criticism Tuesday over his receipt of outside fees, less than one year after the same thing helped to stop him from becoming chief justice.

Sen. Robert P. Griffin, R-Mich., who led last year's successful fight against Fortas' nomination for chief justice, said the latest information about his off-the-bench activities prompt "most serious questions which need to be resolved."

There were scattered calls for Fortas to resign, and Rep. H. R. Groves, D-Iowa, even called for his impeachment. The reactions came after Fortas admitted receiving but later returning a fee from the family foundation of financier Louis E. Wolfson, now serving a one-year sentence for stock manipulation.

As an associate justice, Fortas is now paid \$60,000 a year. There is, however, no regulation prohibiting him, or the other members of the court, from engaging in activities that would bring in additional income. The canons of judicial ethics prescribed by the American Bar Association apply to all judges but do not have the force of law.

Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., said the Senate Judiciary Committee should "make itself available" if Fortas desires a forum to answer questions raised in this week's issue of Life magazine. "These are extremely important charges that have been levelled," Kennedy said. "They reach (to) the integrity of the justice as well as the court."

The Life article said the fee was \$20,000 and Fortas held it for 11 months before returning it. Fortas, in a statement Sunday, mentioned neither the amount nor how long he had the fee nor exactly what services he would have rendered. But he said flatly he has "not accepted any fee or emolument" from Wolfson since becoming a member of the court.

### Canyon Road In Utah Will Remain Open

PARK CITY (UPI) — U.S. Highway 40 through the mouth of Parleys Canyon will not be closed for major repairs until major improvements are made on an alternate route, Chairman Weston E. Hamilton of the State Road Commission said.

Addressing a public information meeting here, Hamilton said about \$200,000 will be spent on State Highway 63 through Emigration Canyon before Parleys Canyon route is closed. The State Highway Department recently announced that U.S. 40 would be closed from the mouth of the canyon to Mountain Dell Reservoir to permit uninterrupted construction of Interstate 80.

Plans called for the major traffic artery to be closed from October of this year to April of 1970. Hamilton said State Highway 65 would be improved by "eliminating the more severe curves" and building a passing lane on steep grades in the canyon.

### School Unit In Pocatello Faces Suit

POCATELLO (UPI) — A suit resulting from an accident which occurred in May, 1967, has been filed against Pocatello School District 25, and three local residents.

Deon Harris, Pocatello, is suing the district and James Harvey Stone, Lindy Tremayne and Donna Tremayne on behalf of his son Gary.

Harris charges that Stone was driving a school bus for the district when the bus struck the boy. The Tremaynes were named as co-owners of an automobile which was also involved in the accident.

Harris is asking the court to award him \$25,000 for severe injuries and a permanent disability, which he alleges occurred as a result of the accident.

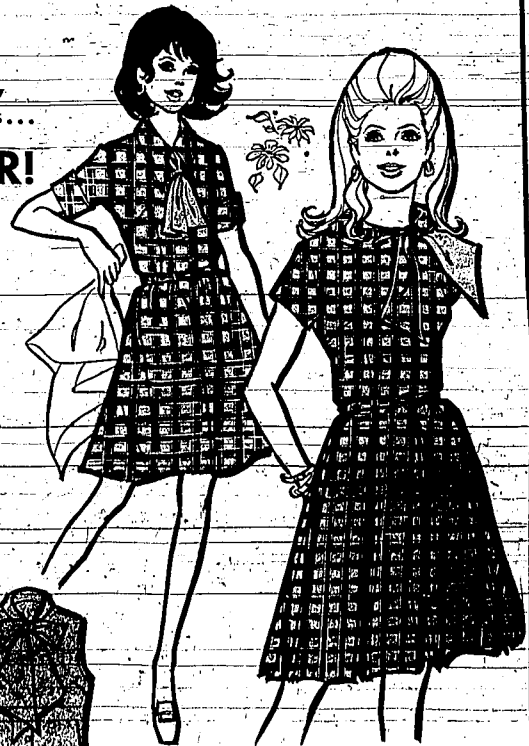

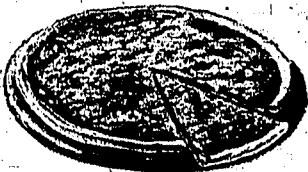

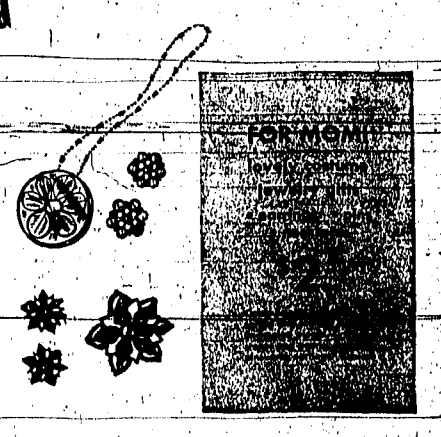
