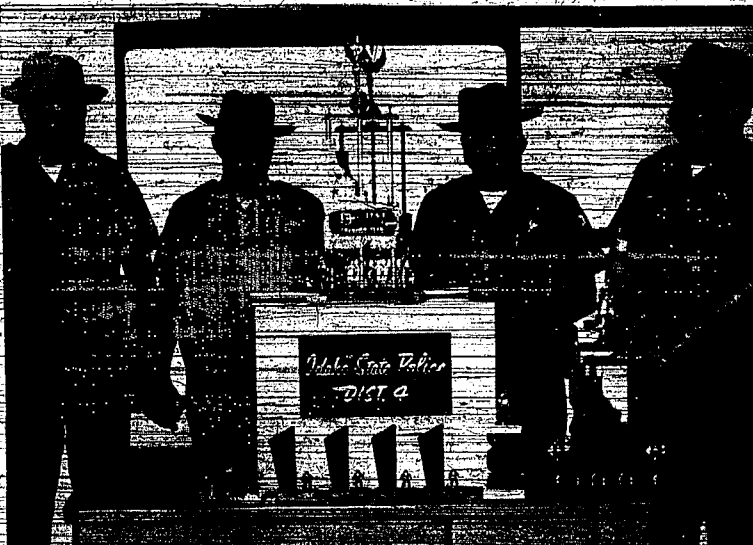

Meat-Inspection Act, 18 Other Laws Passed By Session Take Effect

BOISE (UPI)—Members of the Industrial-Accident Board and the Public Utilities Commission today began the implementation of a bill passed by the Legislature last week.

As of Tuesday, Idaho's new comprehensive meat inspection act went into effect. A law which is as strict as the federal one will take effect in 15 days. The law will require that all meat-inspectors in the state be certified by the state board of education.

The controversial Public School Professional Practices Commission is provided for. The bill is backed by the Idaho Education Association and supported by members of the Idaho School Trustees Association.

The commission will have the power to develop criteria for professional practices, warn and reprimand teachers not meeting standards, and make recommendations to trustees and the State Board of Education.

On Tuesday, Idaho became a member of the Western Interstate Nuclear Compact, dropping the "option" from the title of the Idaho Commission on Atomic Energy. The compact will provide for recording and filing certain documents with county recorders.

Downsizing is now required to be registered, regardless of where the vehicles are operated. Of the 35 registration fees, 30 cents will go to the county, \$2.50 will go to the State Department of Transportation and \$2 will go to the Search and Rescue Fund.

The workmen in the state profited at the start of the new

disability under the Workmen's Compensation laws increased. Another bill going into effect will require that the specific industry benefits under the Workmen's Compensation law for certain permanent injuries by raising the maximum weekly payment from \$37 to \$43 and the minimum from \$23 to \$28 per week.

A new central postal system under the Department of Administrative Services was created Tuesday along with a Division of Weights and Measures within the Idaho Department of Agriculture.

Gov. Don Samuelson will name a three-member board to sit on board of tax appeals in place of the present tax commission, acting as an appeal board. The Sheep Commission also gained a veterinarian in charge, along with changes in the annual assessment of sheep and assessment dates.

As of Tuesday cities can extend their water resource and tend the period for which municipal bonds can be issued from 20 to 30 years. A local improvement district requires approval of 60 per cent of the resident owners of property. The Idaho Water Resource and Recreation Act provides for the maintenance of state lands.

Governor Ponders Legislative Call In Bonding Dispute

BOISE (UPI)—Gov. Don Samuelson said Tuesday he would wait to see if school districts could sell their bonds before thinking about a legislative session of the Legislature.

Two bonding houses have refused to certify school bonds that state school district taxpayers vote in school elections. Samuelson told his weekly news conference that "before we start crying wolf, the school districts should try all sources for marketing the bonds."

"I want you to understand that I'm flexible and if the damage is greater than the cost of the legislature would be, I would look at it again."

Samuelson said he had not yet named a replacement for James DeLoach, who left the post of budget director Tuesday.

Samuelson said that under statutory law the Budget Department could be put under the Department of Administrative Services and the job of budget director put under the merit system.

Until that time, Director of Administrative Services Edward Sawyer will be acting budget director.

Ousted?

CADWELL (UPI)—The Canyon County prosecuting attorney and his staff may have to leave a residence in a trailer house on the courthouse lawn.

Attorney C. Robert Yost and his staff have been given 65 days to comply with a request by judges of the Third District to find new quarters.

The space the prosecutor and his staff occupy will be remodeled for use by the courts.

Commission Chairman William Norberg Jr. said the "matter was being seriously considered."

Equipment 'School' Nets Federal Grant

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A joint management and labor effort in Idaho has earned a \$380,496 federal grant for operation of a heavy equipment school at Welter, the Idaho congressional delegate announced Tuesday.

Sens. Len Jordan and Frank Church and Reps. Orval Hansen and James McClure said the money will permit the school to train 184 young men in heavy equipment operation during the next year.

The school's joint owners are the Idaho Branch, Associated General Contractors and 370 of the International Union of Operating Engineers, the jurisdiction of which encompasses southern Idaho.

The new effort to train heavy equipment operators will be funded immediately, the delegate said.

Farm Help Shows Rise During May

The Twin Falls-area May labor force expansion of 520 workers was due as much to unemployment as employment, dimming the significance of the entire total, according to the Idaho Department of Employment.

Employment within agriculture declined as non-agricultural jobs fell and unemployment numbers rose in the area.

Total employment gain of 270 workers from April was due entirely to the seasonal increase of agricultural hired help. Non-agricultural workers showed a loss of 100, with manufacturing numbers down. Manufacturing indicated a sharp drop as seasonal, peak processing operations ended. Sugar-beet processing showed an unusual increase for the period. The sugar workers' unions were into later than usual, processing of sugar from stored beet juice at the Anatone mill. Sugar Co. plant is under construction.

Non-agricultural employment fell 100 from April and was due largely to the shutdown of potato processing activities.

The total unemployment rate rose from 4.3 per cent to 4.2 per cent. The expectation for June includes a continuation of many processing workers out of work but the availability of other work during the month should reduce the unemployment rate, particularly as additional seasons, including "straw" and "straw" work, begin.

Compared with one year ago the labor force showed a gain of 220 workers. Unemployment played a large part in the gain, however, and accounted for 140 of the annual increase. Total employment was up by 100 with the gains felt mostly within non-agricultural firms.

Some of the developments which may influence the twin falls area were the purchase of 14 acres of land by the Langview Paper Co. to locate a box factory; construction of the runway extension at the Twin Falls City County Airport; an addition to First Security Bank; the opening of a new Del Monte food processing plant in the area; and work on the College of Southern Idaho's health P. E. building.

Unemployment rose by about one third from April to May, primarily due to the completion of potato processing and the large number of workers temporarily out of work.

Q - I am a 72-year-old widow in need of additional income. I have a small railroad pension, but a bank account and own some stock that pays a pretty good dividend. A - I would not be too ready to "ring the bell" on the railroad industry. Last year freight rates were up 10 percent and high levels. NAACP Aide Says Nixon 'Nullifies' Racial Gains

JACKSON, Miss. (UPI) - President Nixon's message on integration is coming through "slightly in favor of black" but "back," says a top official of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

In the areas of school desegregation and voter registration, the Nixon administration has threatened to nullify gains made during the past decade.

Spottswood, chairman of the NAACP board of directors, said the encounters with the "billy clubs and the sickening sigh of the death bullets may have been in vain," Spottswood told the first general session of the NAACP (1968-69) national convention.

However, Spottswood expressed hope the trend was only temporary and rejected the temptation to "join with rioters and the preachers of hate and violence."

The Nixon administration's sleight-of-hand is merely an interruption, a challenge to get up off the floor and fight for the black American's share of the American pie, he told about 2,000 delegates. "It is a cause for renewed vigor, fresh ingenuity and bold action in the arena of citizenship rather than the repair."

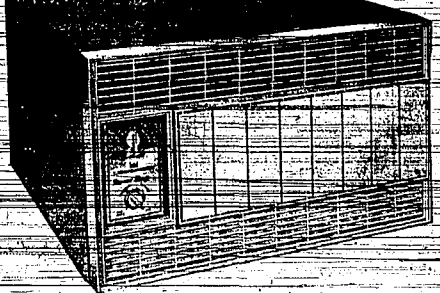

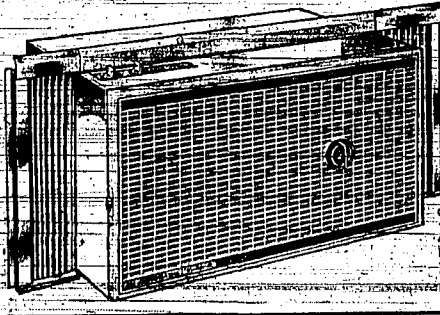

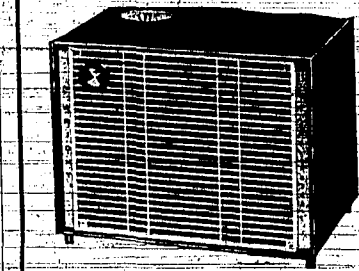

Kuhn Expects No Expansion In Major Leops For Next 10 Years

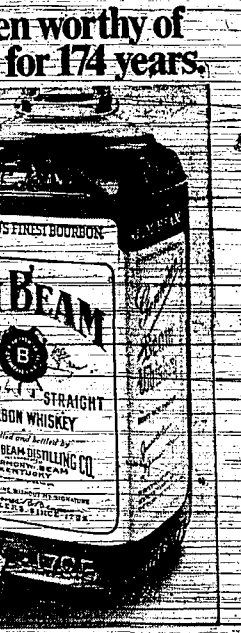

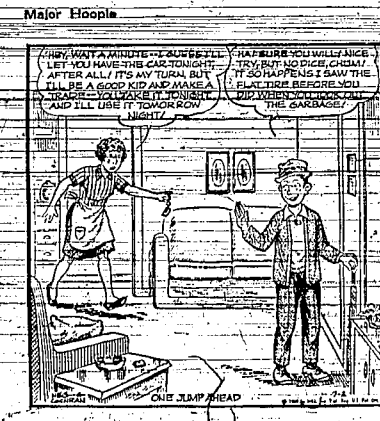
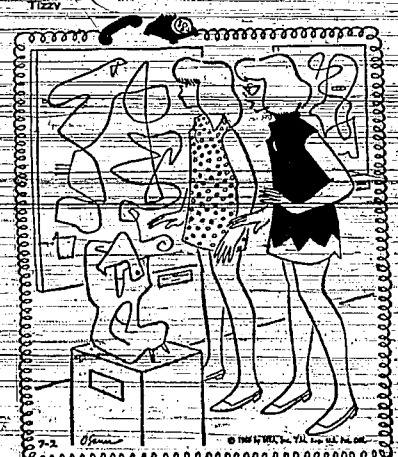
