Kissinger Confers With Lodge, French Premier

PARIS (UPI)—Henry A. Kissinger, President Nixon's top foreign policy adviser, today conferred with Henry Cabot Lodge, chief U.S. delegate to the Vietnam war talks.

Kissinger, who flew to Paris Sunday night from England after accompanying President Nixon on his world tour, arrived at the American Embassy shortly after 9:30 a.m. (4:30 a.m. EDT) to see Lodge.

The two met for one hour and 25 minutes. U.S. officials declined to say what they talked about but said the discussions concerned "technical questions." Kissinger then conferred with French Premier Jacques Chaban-Delmas and Foreign Minister Maurice Schumann.

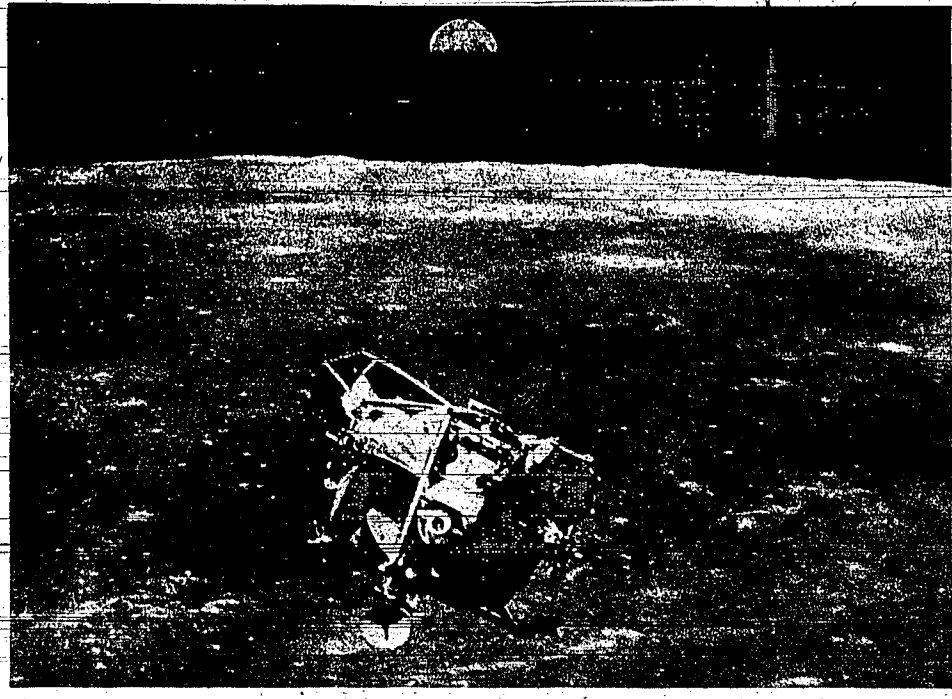

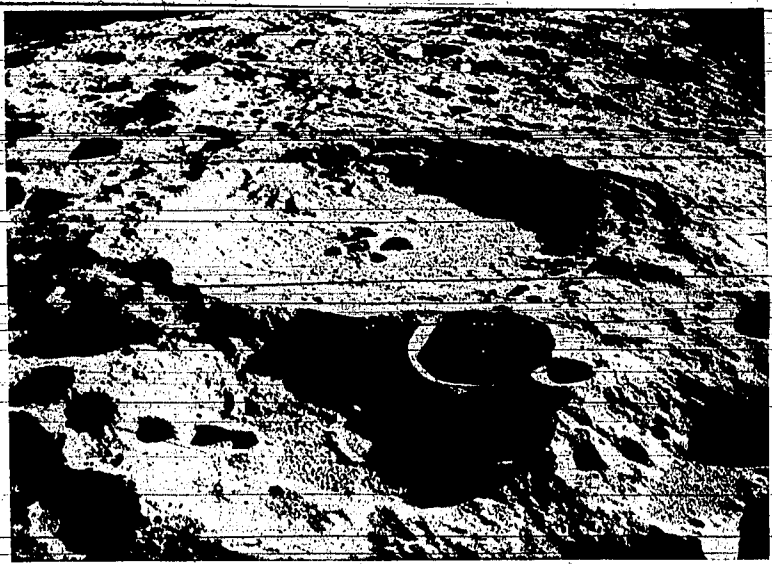

Six Hearings Planned In Area On Idaho Constitution Revision

Six hearings have been scheduled in Magic Valley this month in their area and express their views regarding proposed changes in Idaho's Constitution. The hearings will be under the direction of the Legislative Council through the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Each hearing will be held at 8 p.m. and they are scheduled for Aug. 15 in the Sage Room of the Sun Valley Lodge for the Hailey and Ketchum area; Aug. 15, in the War Memorial Hall, Gooding; Aug. 19, Jerome County Courthouse for the Jerome area; Aug. 20, Chamber of Commerce office, Burley; Aug. 21, Blaine County Courthouse - Rupert; and Aug. 25, American Legion Hall, Twin Falls.

All interested persons are being urged to attend the hearing in their area and express their views regarding proposed changes in Idaho's Constitution. Members of the Constitution Revision Commission have been working the past year on revising the state document.

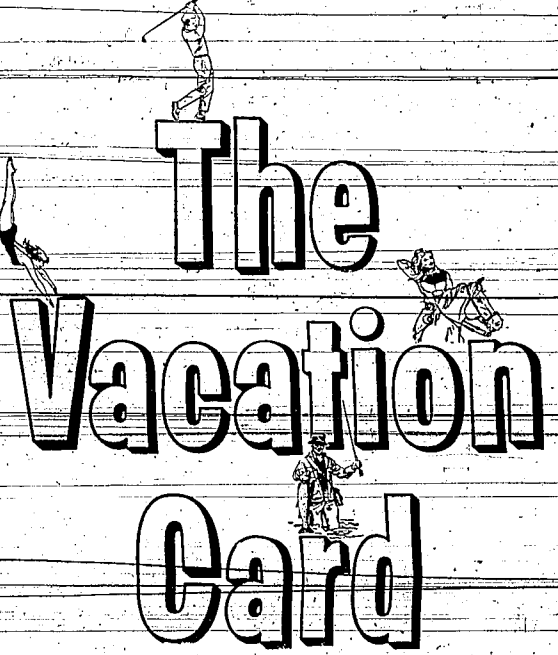
Idaho Sen. John Barker, Buhl, area chairman of the hearings, said their purpose is to acquaint the public with the proposed updating of the state's 80-year-old Constitution and to receive the sentiments of the citizens.

Three area men are members of the Constitutional Revision Commission of which Raymond L. Givens, retired Idaho Supreme Court Justice, is chairman.

The local members include Attorney Douglas Kramer, Twin Falls; State Sen. Don Frederickson, D-Gooding, and Lloyd J. Webb, former district judge and now a Twin Falls attorney. All have expressed a strong desire to determine how residents feel about proposed revisions. Question and answer periods will be held at the close of each hearing.

Commission members will explain proposed changes and copies of the revised form are available from members of the commission, for study by interested persons prior to the hearings.

Members of the Twin Falls League of Women Voters are assisting in informing the public about the hearings and about revisions as proposed by the commission.

Minor Fire Sparked By Plutonium

DENVER (UPI)—An Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) spokesman said Saturday a fire was found Wednesday night in a plutonium storage area of Rocky Flats, a nuclear arms production site operated by Dow Chemical Co.

The fire, which released "minor contamination," was extinguished shortly after it was found, Mike Sunderland, an AEC spokesman said.

The blaze was discovered in an area used to protect plutonium recovered from an earlier blaze at the plant. That fire, on May 21, caused an estimated \$50 million in damage and temporarily halted nuclear production in the United States, a spokesman said.

Sunderland said the fire was limited to two containers of plutonium, an ingredient used in nuclear weapons.

Firm Is Accused Of Faulty Product

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., accused the B.F. Goodrich Co. Sunday of jeopardizing the lives of military pilots by ignoring defects in a brake disc building for a new Air Force plane.

Proxmire charged that the rubber company submitted inaccurate and misleading information about the brake in order to have it accepted for use on the airplane.

He said he would convey to the Senate today the results of an investigation conducted by the General Accounting Office at his initiative.

The GAO report makes it crystal clear the B.F. Goodrich Co. deviated from standard testing procedures and inaccurately reported test data in an attempt to qualify an allegedly defective brake for the ATD light attack aircraft being built for the Air Force by the ITV Corp., Proxmire said.

"The deviation resulted in a grave risk to human life," he added.

Proxmire said the defective brake led to an accident which was witnessed by a Goodrich design engineer. He said the engineer reported the defect to the FBI.

He said the airplane was being tested at Edwards Air Force Base in California, although the brake was built by Goodrich's wheel and brake plant in Troy, Ohio.

"On one occasion," he said, "the test pilot landed the plane and when he applied the brakes the wheels locked and the plane rolled into a skid. The plane remained upright and the test pilot escaped unharmed."

Proxmire, who has been investigating government contracting procedures, said the report showed that "quality control is virtually a myth."

He added: "Had the brake in question been permitted to go into full production for final use on the ATD plane, we possibly would be reading in the newspapers a year or more from now about a rash of inexplicable air base accidents involving defective brakes and wondering how it had all come about."

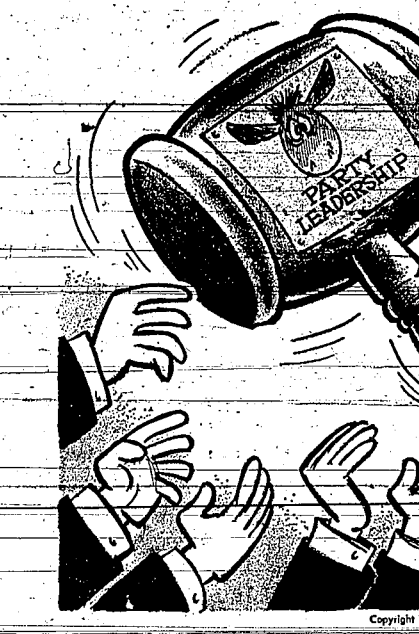

Tobacco-State Senators Applaud Advertising Ban

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The cigarette industry's decision to voluntarily stop television and radio advertising has caused a quiet sigh of relief among tobacco state senators.

"It's certainly relieved some of the pressure," said Sen. Ernest F. Hollings, D-S.C. "We were in the minority."

In effect, the voluntary action relieved Hollings and his Southern colleagues from the burden of a battle they could not win.

The only hitch in the unexpected political blessing has come from some tobacco farmers, Kentucky's two senators, Republicans John Sherman Cooper and Marlow W. Cook, and a few farmers have

complained that the industry gave up too much without fighting enough.

But most tobacco state senators knew the fight would have been a losing one, probably climaxed by government restrictions on cigarette advertising much more severe than those imposed by the voluntary action.

A strong majority of the Senate Commerce Committee, and apparently of the whole Senate, was ready to vote a severe government crackdown on cigarette advertising.

Cigarette manufacturers, represented in Washington by former Kentucky Sen. Earl Clements and former Rep. Horace Kornegay of North

Carolina, knew this. They offered to give up broadcast advertising in hopes of impressing the government with their public spirit and staying off a Federal Trade Commission (FTC) proposal under which all cigarette ads—printed or broadcast—would have been forced to include a stern death warning.

His wording was so severe that Joseph P. Cullman III, president of the Tobacco Institute and chairman of Philip Morris Inc., said manufacturers would stop advertising altogether rather than carry it.

The industry's strategy worked. The FTC suspended the death warning requirement

Jet Plane Does Double Duty As Maternity Ward Over Sea

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (UPI) — "Having a baby in a jet liner several thousand feet above the Pacific Ocean doesn't sound like the best of conditions, but Mrs. Yan Yu Wong-Shek says it was easier than my other two."

Mrs. Shek, 26, gave birth to a 5-pound, 11-ounce girl Friday as she and her husband and two sons immigrated to the United States aboard a Japan Air Lines flight from Tokyo to San Francisco.

The baby's place of birth will be listed as "J. A. 8034," the registration number of the jet. And because her parents are from Hong Kong, the baby has joint Chinese-Japanese citizenship.

Four doctors were aboard the jet when the baby began arriving a month ahead of time. Mrs. Shek was moved to the first class compartment where more room was available. Dr. Wataru Ishizaki and his wife, Yuriko, a nurse, assisted in the birth, first on a JAL transpacific flight.

Egypt Chief Lauds 'War' On Economy

Egyptian Defense Minister Mohamed Fawzi said Saturday the Arab world's economic war against Israel is just as important as the military struggle.

Fawzi spoke in Alexandria, the Egyptian port on the Mediterranean Sea, at the opening session of a 15-day meeting of Arab officials aimed at forcing the United States and other Western countries to boycott Israel or face loss of trade with the Arab world.

Most Mideast battlefronts were relatively quiet. Israel reported two Arab guerrillas slain in the Jordan Valley. Jordan said Israeli gunners wounded a civilian in an exchange of shots near the Sea of Galilee.

Copper Producers Increase Prices

NEW YORK (UPI) — The nation's three largest copper producers Friday posted price increases of two cents per pound for primary copper, effective with shipments beginning Monday.

Kennecott Copper Corp. led off the move and was followed quickly by Phelps Dodge Corp. and Anticondo Co. The increases brought the price of electrolytic wire bars to a range of 48 to 49½ cents per pound.

This marks the third boost in the domestic industry this year. Each increase was two cents, and the domestic copper price now is 26 per cent higher than at the end of the lengthy 1967-68 copper strike, the reason for the birth might never get there.

Humphrey Says Russians Are Delaying Arms Talks To "Catch Up"

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Hubert H. Humphrey, recently returned from the Soviet Union, says the Russians are delaying arms talks until they can catch up.

In an exclusive interview with UPI at his Washington office,

Humphrey said "the overriding concern in the Soviet Union today is not security. They don't advance the discussion on China, but once it is open they are very concerned about the border problems with China."

"And they are very concerned," he added, "lest we seem to be playing off China against the Soviet Union. They want to know where we stand."

Humphrey said the Soviets understand the United States has the economic power to

surpass them when America puts a priority on a project such as getting a man on the moon. Because of that, he said, they realize they cannot win any arms race.

But an agreement on halting the arms buildup, he said, is being stalled because of the so-called MIRV—multiple independently targeted re-entry vehicle—or multiple warhead missile. The MIRV is intended to increase the firepower of existing missiles by putting

more warheads on them and sending them after different targets when the missile re-enters the earth's atmosphere.

"It's my view that the Soviet Union has—and I've never said this to anyone before—that the information they have on our MIRV indicates to them that we're ahead in the multiple independently targeted warheads, and that they're stalling for some testing of their own so that when they get to that bargaining table, they're

in a position of equality.

"Now does this mean there will be no negotiations? The answer is no. I think that these negotiations will start very soon."

Soviet leaders I think now are more concerned about their relationship with the United States than ever before and I believe there is a fortuitous moment for us to proceed to discuss a number of items.

"I think we're now at the stage where we can start to

really negotiate more seriously than we have in the past with the Soviet Union on space technology and cooperation."

Humphrey added the Soviets seem to be more concerned about the MIRV than about the antiballistic missile system (ABM) which has taken up most of the public military debate in the United States recently.

When asked about a comeback in polls, perhaps via the U.S. Senate seat from Minnesota be-

ing vacated next year by Eugene J. McCarthy, the sparkler in Humphrey's eyes was more revealing than his answer:

"One never knows. This is an uncertain time in which we live. I really haven't made up my mind. I don't want to play games with a serious matter like the Senate. I am giving it serious consideration. I like the Senate, but I want to take a big look at what I need to do with my life."

'Mercy' March Shrinks Force To Two Men

Barkley said a dog named Vaughn and Mike Puffman had volunteered to continue the march. Barkley said the two marchers had left Boise Friday and hoped to be in Twin Falls within six days, and then on to Denver.

Barkley said a total of \$4,000 had been collected from the Twin Falls area and the group had remained about \$1,500 behind its monetary goal, and about two weeks behind their walking schedule.

He said only the group could spend only a maximum of \$200 a month for expenses, which meant they could not even buy a trailer at cost. He said the trailer they had rented in Denver would be returned to the dealer.

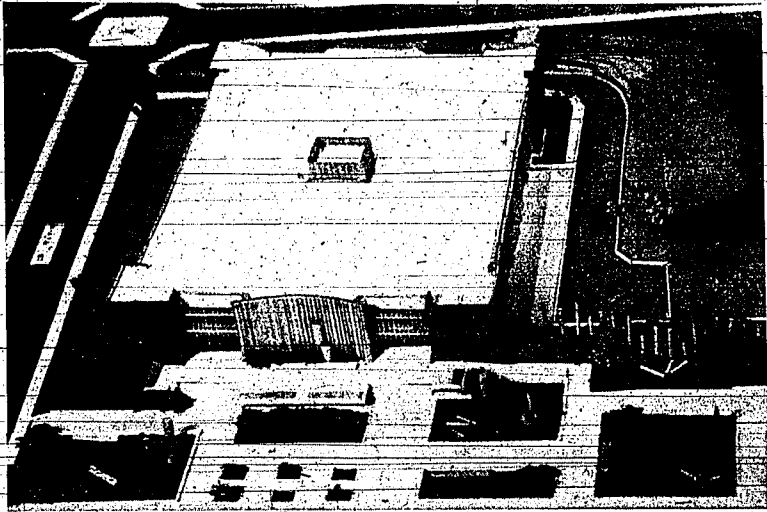

"You can't buy a crowd," she said, still awed by the huge turnout accorded the presidential party in Bucharest. Mrs. Nixon described the Romanians as "a warmhearted people" who have "always felt affection for Americans."

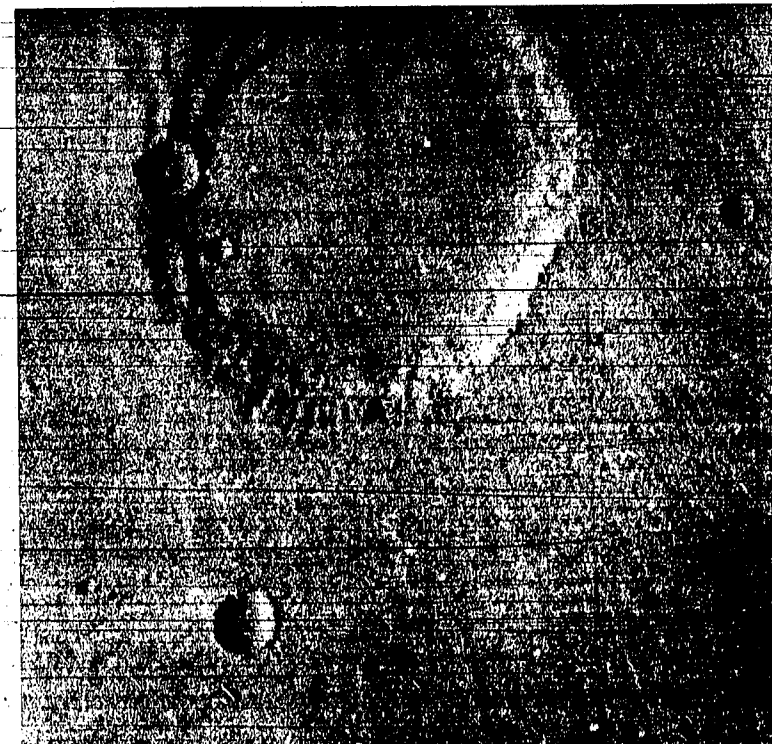

SPENDING By 18-24 Year Olds (1968)



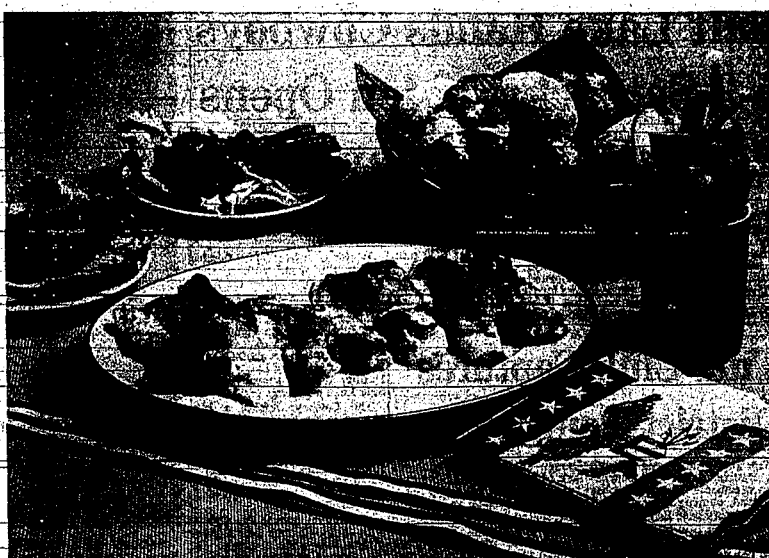

Moon Men Dine On Delicious Foods During Houston Stay

Many of the food items the Apollo 11 astronauts are eating after their return from the moon will be popped into the oven, and served in the same way they are served to millions of American husbands every evening.

Ease of preparation, purity, quality and variety were the main reasons frozen convenience foods were selected for the astronauts' meals during the critical isolation-quarantine period after "splashdown," according to James M. Biggar, president of Stouffer Foods Division of Litton Industries.

After a nine-day diet of wet and dry "space" foods—while going to and coming from lunar landing, U. S. astronauts and the scientists, medical personnel and technicians in confinement with them, will be served food products that are available in the neighborhood supermarket.

NASA dietitians will feed the 23 men in the Lunar Receiving

Laboratory of the Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston, Tex., until Aug. 14. The men will be quarantined to prevent any hostile organisms from being transported to the earth from the moon. During this period, scientists looking for signs of alien organisms, have demanded assurance that diet will cause no illness that might mistakenly be attributed to hostile bacteria.

The crew will have a wide selection of soups, entrees, side dishes, desserts and snacks on the menu. Many of the food items are the same products available in grocery freezers from Stouffer Foods, which has been selected by NASA to supply a major portion of this food.

Following extensive technical tests, officials of NASA's Manned Spacecraft Center and of Technology, Inc., a subcontractor charged with developing the isolation-quarantine feeding program, chose 28 Stouffer Foods products from other processors and suppliers as the bases for the menu.

Among the Stouffer's foods the astronauts will eat are lobster, newburg, lasagna, and escalloped chicken and noodles. There also will be cream-of-mushroom and French onion soups, beef and chicken pies, escalloped apples, Williamsburg orange cake and pumpkin pie.

All Stouffer's products meet or exceed NASA specifications for purity based on bacteria plate count, staph tests, salmonella checks and coliform count. The astronauts themselves also approved the selected foods. During simulated isolation-quarantine situations at NASA headquarters in Houston, the astronauts ate the products that will be served during the actual confinement period.

Food will be prepared by three NASA stewards using Litton's Atherton microwave and quartz ovens in the kitchen of the Crew Reception Area. Meals will be served in the lounge and dining area adjacent to the kitchen.

Stouffer's foods for the three-week menu cycle have been shipped to Glazier Distributors, food broker in Houston, and will be stored in Glazier's freezers until quarantine begins.

Glazier will supply Stouffer's foods to NASA once a week during quarantine. Each Stouffer's shipping case will be packed with dry ice, sealed and delivered to NASA's food receiving room. All food will be delivered at zero temperature.

Food will be received by NASA's head dietitian and will enter the LR through a series of air locks to make sure that the quarantine is preserved. The food will arrive with specific directions from Stouffer's on correct heating time and temperature needed for preparation of each item.

Stouffer's home economists have extensively tested the heating directions recommended to NASA. These instructions were developed for NASA, according to Mr. Biggar, because of the use of the microwave and quartz ovens which cut heating time to 10 minutes for most items.

Stouffer's contracts with about one hour normally required to heat frozen foods in home, or conventional institutional ovens, Mr. Biggar said that NASA's selection of Stouffer's food was based first on quality and then on the variety of food available. Taste and appearance of the food also were important considerations, he said. He said that NASA was chiefly concerned with serving its astronauts the best possible food when they returned from "man's greatest adventure."

Police Battle 25 Women On Pacific Isle

PORT MORESBY, New Guinea (UPI) — Police armed with batons and tear gas fought about 25 bare-breasted native women on Bougainville Island on Friday.
 The women were trying to uproot survey markers being placed in the ground by surveyors from an Australian firm developing a large copper mine on the island which was the scene of World War II fighting.
 For months the natives from the Korovana area had refused to negotiate lease of the land. The administration acquired it by force and gave leases to the mining company for 75 acres.
 When the first surveyors moved onto the land they were watched by about 600 Korovana villagers. About 100 police, including a riot squad, guarded the surveyors.
 Twenty-five women came forward and tried to remove the first marker.
 Police donned gas masks and prepared to fire tear gas into the ranks of women.
 After about a 20-minute clash the women, trailed by other villagers, threw the marker into the nearby sea.
 Bougainville District Commissioner Des Ashton said, "They have made their desire of opposition. I don't think we have any more trouble there."
 Reports from the area said the villagers watched from a distance as police and surveyors continued to work.

Officers May Exhume Body Of Secretary

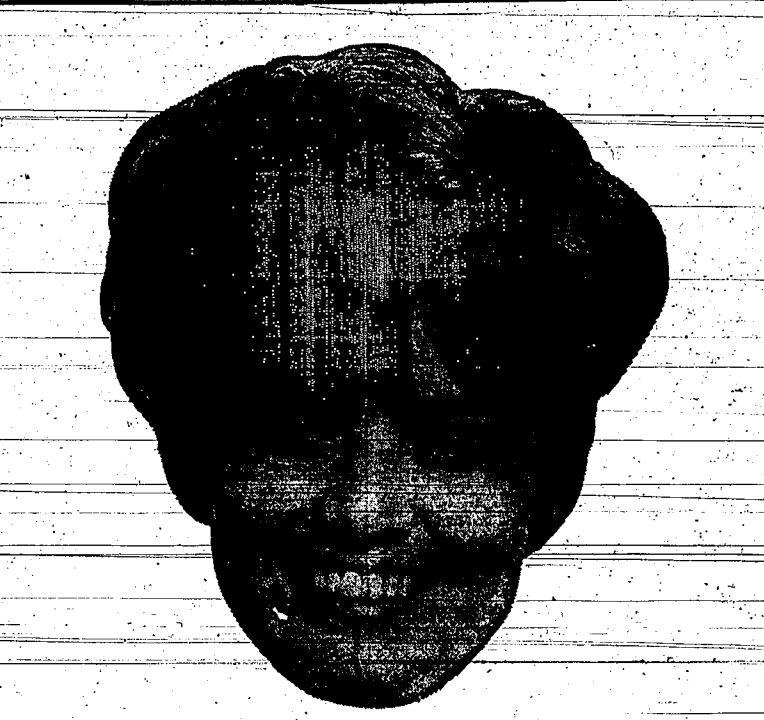
NEW BEDFORD, Mass. (UPI) — The body of Mary Jo Kopechne, the pretty blonde secretary killed when Sen. Edward M. Kennedy's car plunged into remote island pond two weeks ago, may be exhumed for an autopsy.
 Dist. Atty. Edmund S. Dinis, whose southern Massachusetts district encompasses the accident site on Chappaquiddick Island, has decided to reopen the accident investigation, considered closed by police.
 Blythe Evans, district attorney of Luzerne County, Pa., confirmed Saturday that Dinis has talked with him by telephone and asked about the legal steps necessary to exhume Miss Kopechne's body.
 The 28-year-old blonde secretary to the late Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., was buried nearly two weeks ago in Plymouth, Pa., her birthplace.

Officers May Exhume Body Of Secretary

BOISE (UPI) — Judge Merlin Young of the Fourth District Court has ruled that the Old Soldier's Home property in Boise is subject to land condemnation proceedings without the approval of the legislature.
 Young Friday denied a motion for summary judgment filed by the Idaho attorney general and in favor of the Boise and Ada county attorneys, who contended the land may be taken by condemnation.
 It is owned by the state.
 The property is needed for right-of-way in the Curtis Road extension project. The attorney general's office had said it could be sold only with approval of the legislature.
 Young said, "The legislature did not intend to restrict the power of eminent domain granted to counties and cities."
 He added that if the attorney general's position of letting the legislature handle the sale is allowed to stand, it would be unconstitutional.
