

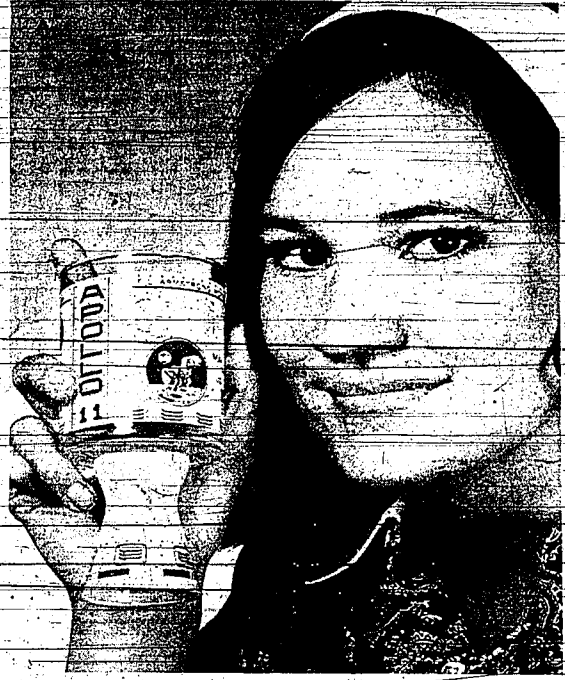

Evans Chief Faces Trial

SUBIC BAY, Philippines (UPI)—The U.S. Navy today ordered the court-martial of the captain and deck officer of the destroyer escort, the Evans, on charges of negligence and dereliction of duty. The Evans was sunk in a collision with an Australian carrier on Sept. 10, the last of 14 American vessels.

The Australian aircraft carrier Melbourne sliced the Evans in two just 7 during maneuvers in the South China Sea. A Navy announcement said the court-martial of Cmdr. Albert S. McLenore, 40, of Vallejo, Calif., the Evans' captain, and Lt. (j.g.) Ronald C. Ramsey, 24, of Long Beach, Calif., will begin about Sept. 10 at Subic Bay. The charges against Cmdr. McLenore and Ramsey are obviously serious ones, and trial by court-martial is the proper way of determining their guilt or innocence, the Navy said. Conviction on the negligence charges would mean two years at hard labor, the dismissal from the Navy and forfeiture of all pay and allowances. The military court would determine the penalty for dereliction of duty.

McLenore was asleep in his cabin and Ramsey was in charge of the disposal of the collision occurred before dawn. The severed bow section of the destroyer sank, killing 74 men. A joint U.S.-Australian board of inquiry found the Evans primarily responsible for the tragedy after a six-week investigation. The Australian navy absolved the Melbourne skipper, Capt. John P. Stevenson, of guilt. McLenore was specifically cited for failing to see proper night orders to awaken him and for his failure to be on the bridge when Melbourne's close quarters maneuvers were exercised.

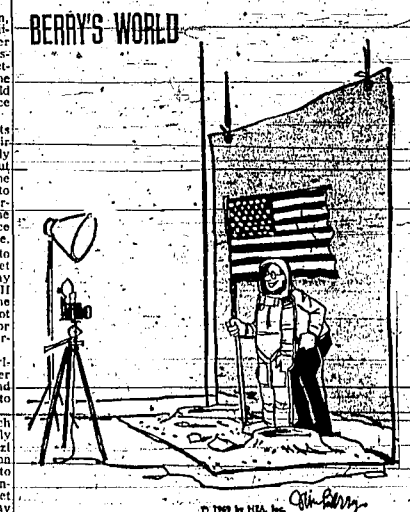

Then there was the young bowler who wound up for a great throw only to have the big ball roll to a stop about 12 inches from the pins without even a threat.

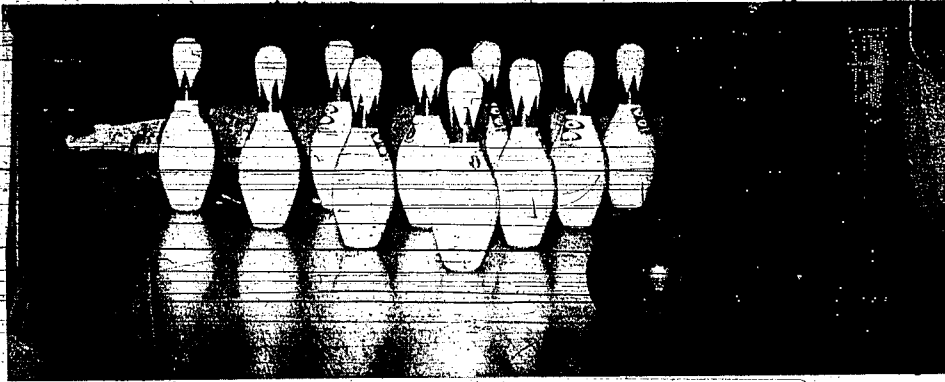
There were probably a few sore arms tossing newspapers Sunday morning in Magic Valley as many of the youngsters bowled several times. All of the youngsters were between 14 and

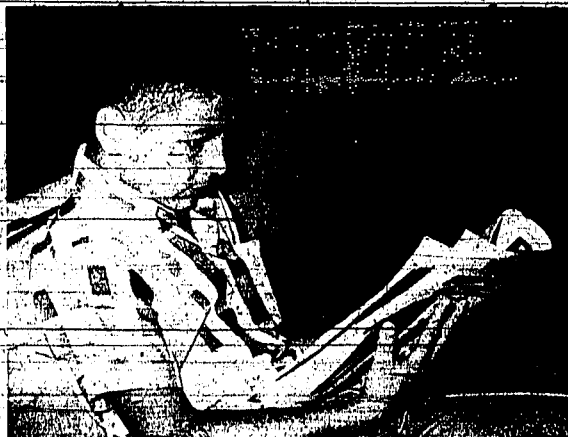

Staggered License Plate Sales Law Under Study

County assessors who will be administering the new staggered license plate sales program in Idaho and will have to explain it to the motorists of their own counties are now attending a series of meetings across the state to discuss licensing procedure.

John W. Farley, director of the Motor Vehicle Division, Idaho Department of Law Enforcement, said under the new system all license plate stickers for 1970 will be issued beginning Oct. 1 and must be purchased before Dec. 31.

Depending on the last number of the present vehicle license plate, motorists will be buying their license validation tags for anything from six to 17 months period and thus may have to pay more or less than the regular fee. However, Mr. Farley said, in the long run it will work out on an equal basis.

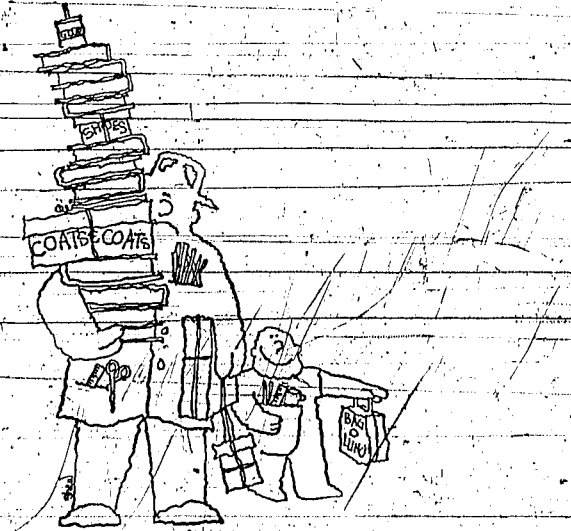

Federal Action Is Sought Against School Districts

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Monday asked the Justice Department to take immediate action against nine Georgia school districts he said had refused to implement voluntary school desegregation plans. Finch said each of the nine districts had been sent a telegram Monday informing them of the action and asking them "to reconsider their refusal to implement their plans." The nine were identified as Clinch County, Coffee County, Dodge County, Emanuel County, Franklin County, Heard County, Rome City, Telfair County and Wheeler County. Finch said he referred the matter to the Justice Department "which has its long and swift judicial recourse" which can be used to protect the rights of the school children involved. A week ago Finch appealed successfully through the federal courts to allow a delay until Dec. 1 for Mississippi schools to implement desegregation plans in 30 districts. He blamed Hurricane Camille, in part, for the necessity of delaying the plan. An AHEW spokesman said the two actions were not inconsistent. Finch obviously tried to make this clear in a statement made during the time he was in Georgia school announcement.

Nuclear Blast Set In Western Colorado

GRAND VALLEY, Colo. (UPI) — Spokesmen at the Project Rullison nuclear blast site in Western Colorado said Monday they were proceeding with all of the steps to conduct the detonation safely. The underground test was scheduled to get underway Thursday in a rural area, 12 miles south of this small community. Scientists are hopeful the project will enable them to recover natural gas now inaccessible to man. In addition to pending court action aimed at halting the nuclear test project, a Denver newspaper reported some opponents planned to sit-in near the blast site in a "last ditch attempt" to stop the detonation. The Rocky Mountain News said the sit-in would involve students from the University of Colorado and others from Denver, Colorado Springs and Aspen. They plan to "have as many people as possible moving around in the trees near the site so the AEC (Atomic Energy Commission) will have to call off the dogs," the paper said. Opponents of the nuclear test postponed the 10th U.S. Court of Appeals to order a halt. An attempt to stop the detonation was turned down earlier by a U.S. District Court judge. A similar court action was filed by Dist. Atty. Martin Dumont, which struck Thursday and includes the region where the

Nixon 'Collides' With Governors

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (UPI) — Broad segments of President Nixon's domestic program collided today with National Governors' Conference recommendations during the opening of Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller. The President outlined major domestic plans here Monday night on the eve of a debate by the nation's governors over the Rockefeller proposals. The report from the New York governor's committee on human resources asked for more federal help for state and local government, including a "national universal health insurance program." Some governors of heavily populated states—namely Rockefeller and Richard J. Hughes of New Jersey—have complained Nixon's proposed welfare program would give them little help compared with states which have done "less" for welfare beneficiaries. Nixon had his criticism clearly in mind when he addressed the National Governors' Conference, reviewing his policies and his "new federalism" to give more power to state and local government. Of his proposal for a \$4 billion increase in federal aid for welfare, he said: "Some object to these proposals—understandably—as seem-

Unions Will Seek Safety Legislation

By ROY MCGHEE WASHINGTON (UPI) — Organized labor has decided to give top priority this year to Congress to a bill to create federal safety and health standards for industrial workers. Senate labor subcommittee headed by Sen. Harrison A. Williams D-N.J., is preparing for public hearings, probably later this month, on the far-reaching legislation. "This country has a horrible record in job safety," a committee staff member told UPI. "Statistics show 14,000 workers are killed on the job every year and injuries on the job cause labor losses six times as great as strikes." "We figure there are about 42 million working days lost because of strikes," but 1.2 million working days are lost because workers are injured. A bill sponsored by Williams would authorize the 14,000 secretary to limit minimum federal safety and health standards for industries involved in any interstate operations. A fight is expected to develop, however, to require employers to maintain the poorest safety records.

Mexico Extends Ocean Limits

MEXICO CITY (UPI) — Mexico will extend the width of territorial waters off its coast from 9 to 12 miles, President Guzman Diaz Ordaz said Monday. In his annual state-of-the-nation address, Diaz Ordaz also reiterated his opposition to U.S. demands to "resist" U.S. protests against nationalizing the waters of the northern part of the Gulf of California. "Very soon I will send to this honorable Congress a bill to increase to 12 miles the width of our territorial waters," Diaz Ordaz told a joint session of Congress. With presidential backing, the bill is assured of passage. Diaz Ordaz also: —Again appealed for a ban on nuclear tests of all kinds.

Lawyers Plan Inquest In Kennedy Case

EDGARTOWN, Mass. (UPI) — Officials and lawyers worked their way through a scorching Labor Day witness lineup in preparations for an inquest into the death of Mary Jo Kopechne, scheduled to open on Wednesday. Last Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, in whose car the pretty Washington secretary died July 18, spent the holiday with his wife and four children in friends at his Squaw Island summer home near the Kennedy compound at Hyannis Port. Dist. Atty. Edmund S. Davis who sought the inquest three weeks after the fatal auto accident and who has received threats on his life spent Monday with some of his six assistants making final preparations for the fact-finding judicial review. Attorneys for Kennedy and the other 10 witnesses were to appear at the inquest in Edgartown District Court kept the stiletts silent—they have maintained since the pre-liquor hearing last week at which they argued unsuccessfully that the proceeding was "accusatorial" in nature—and required full confrontation with their clients, such as the right to cross-examine witnesses and present evidence. It appeared unlikely Monday that the lawyers would make any 11th hour appeal to halt the opening of the inquest by seeking an injunction from a higher court.

Some 27 senators, including Frank Church and Len Jordan of Idaho, are sponsors of the Senate measure.

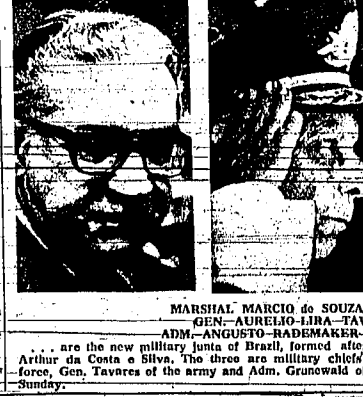
