Three Children Survive

Home bank official and his wire were killed and their three children survived after their light plane crashed about six miles south of Boise during a rainstorm Monday night.

The wreckage of the plane was found shortly before 9 a.m. today. The crash of the single engine Cessna 182 occurred about 8 p.m. Monday.

Killed in the crash were Jim Pavel and his wife, Janis.

The children who survived were Pavel's sons, Sam and Daniel, and a daughter, Jamie. One of the boys was reported in serious condition. He was pinned in the wreckage of the aircraft and a doctor was sent to the scene to treat him before he was removed.


All three children were hos-pitalized later in Boise. The wreckage was found by

a helicopter pilot from Inter-mountain Helicopters. The plane had struck a rolling ridge just outside of Isaacs Canyon and

The children were exposed to driving rain and near freezing temperatures throughout the night.





Dear Dr. Thosteson: My doctor told me I had a very small hernia at the top of my stomach. Is there any cure? Or any chance that some day it will cause an ulcer or probably a

I was 63 last month and would like to have this corrected be-fore I get too old. Please print as I read your column every time it appears in the papers—Mrs. J. R.

I dare say you are more wor-ried about this hemia than you should be, and I have written about it frequently in this column, but perhaps you did not recognize it under its medical

This is not a hernia of the This is not a hernia of the stomach. It is a hernia (or enlargement) of the gap in the diaphragm through which the esophagus passes to reach the stomach. In some few cases there may be enough irritation to cause an ulcer, although this is not common. It is not the sort of thing which leads to cancer, so set your mind at rest about that. If you've missed my discussions of this, I'm sorry, but for various reasons some newspapers cannot print the column every day although I dutifully write one every day of the year. I hope you'll see this one.

To go on, this type of trouble was seldom recognized a generation or two ago, mild cases not causing the patients much trouble, Painful cases were misidentified often as "an ulcer."

X-ray is generally necessary to distinguish these hernias from ulcers. We know now that the hernias are quite common.

The technical name, by the way, is either hiatus hernia or hiatal hernia, and occasionally quite different terms are used for it: esophageal hernia or "upside-down stomach," the latter being, of course, pretty far-fetched.

Anyway, if such a hernia causes little distress, there's no need to do anything about it. If it is frequently painful, a bland diet, the same as used for ulcers, may calm it down. Since sheer gravity helps keep the stomach down where it be-longs, the hernia may trouble

a patient when lying down but not otherwise. Hence raising the head of the bed a few inches (so you lie on a slight slope)

sometimes helps. If a person is overweight, losing some excess fat can provide comfort; if there is less fat in the ab-domen, there is less pressure upward on the stomach.

In severe cases surgery sometimes is required, but simple precautions will control most cases without surgery. Judging from the sound of your letter, whir case isn't one that is likely to give you cause for concern.

Dear Dr. Thosteson: When one has diarrhea with yellow, watery stools, does it mean there is inflammation somewhere in the bowels? I am 69. — E.B.K. it may — or may not. It may be due to lack of sufficient acid in the stomach. Stool studies (to detect parasites) and bowel X-ray are necessary procedures before one can hope to reach a dependable diagnosis.

For example, the House bill providing for a 15 per cent increase in Social Security benefits will be favored over the Senate giveaway of \$2 billion extra in higher minimums. Mills is backed by a 397-0 vote on the House measure.

The House package of goodies, which would cost some \$3 billion less than the Senate's, has the better chance for approval. Once approved by the conference, both House and Senate must accept or

reject it as a whole.

Thus, the Senate could have its cake and eat it, too. It has made its record with which to impress the voters with its generosity. And the

conference can save them from continuing federal deficit and rising inflation that would rob tax savings

or higher benefits of any meaning.
Now, in the privacy of the committee room without a record vote,

He was a little disturbed in that 12 countries owe the United States more than \$9,124 million for expediting their mail into and through the United States and yet are not making any effort to pay, while at the same time they have accepted \$3,762 billion in aid and are yelling for more.

Under-international agreement, the U.S. expedites foreign mail through the U.S. with payment for this postal service to be made within four months. Despite that requirement, 12 Latin American countries are in default of these debts. Some of these accounts are 15 or more years overdue.

And, to top if off, some of these countries have nationalized extensive United States owned holdings.

-"It's time the postoffice department cracked down on these delinquent countries and made them pay their long - overdue debts," Scherle said. "I see no reason why they should be treated any differently than the U.S. taxpayer. If he's short a penny or two on a letter, prompt payment is demanded. The same should be required of these countries which have benefited so bountifully from our aid.'

The countries back on their bills owe as high as \$3,193,607 (Mexico) to a low of \$21,181 (Paraguay). The U.S. has given in aid as high as \$569,000,000 (Mexico) to a low of \$108,800,000 (Guatemala).

The other nine countries owing us postal money are Bolivia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Haiti, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela.

Festival of Lights Reflects Old **Traditions**

Since the dawn of recorded history man has observed that there is a period during the year when the days begin to lengthen and the cold begins to strengthen.


It is the Winter solstice when the sun began to rise over the world with renewed vigor and power for fertility, after a period of low ebb.

The people of the North considered the sun as a wheel which alternately threw its glow upon the earth and away from it. This sun wheel was known as "hweol" and perhaps this is the origin of our word

Colored glass helps in control ling both the amount and the quality of light admitted to buildings. And the combination of light and color forms pat-terns appealing and restful to

tree eye.

Traditionally, stained glass windows complement the architectural design of the building

where they appear.

How It Began

The "how" of creating stained glass windows is complicated n some respects as difficult and time-consuming as it was in the Middle Ages, although modern methods and equipment do give today's stained glass artist cer-tain advantages.

The rainbow-like effect of the

windows comes from pieces of glass — sometimes, hundreds of pieces — fitted together and held together with strips of lead.

Today's artists don't have to make their own glass, leads and

make their own glass, leads and pigments. That's one advantage they enjoy that was denied to the early artist craftsman.

But they do have to plan and work painstakingly, from the beginning of a scale drawing in opment of actual-size paper patterns and on to such final steps as firing, glazing and cementing.







Toward the end of the Third Century, A.D. in a Sicilian town named Syra-cuse, lived a girl, Lucia, daughter of rich and noble parents. Her father had died when Lucia was very young, and her mother, Eutychia, took care of her.

At this time the Roman Empire was governed by Diocletian. Though he had initiated many political reforms he was a tyrannical emperor.

Lucia while a young girl had dedicated her life to God and had resolved to give her earthly wealth to the poor.

Lucia persuaded her mo-ther to visit the shrine of the early Christian martyr Agatha in Catania.

Beseeching Agatha to intercede for her mother. Lucia is said to have effected a miracle, and Eutychia in gratitude agreed to give away a large part of her wealth to the needy.

As was the custom in those days, Lucia was formally betrothed without her consent. However, on learning that he was not marrying an heiress the young man in anger denounced Lucia to the governor of Sicily, a vassal of the emperor.

When the guards came to drag her away to prison they found they could not budge her from the spot.

Then they set fire to her but she would not burn.

In an agony of frustration they plunged their swords into her and killed her.

Perhaps because Lucia's name means Lux or "light" and also because she epitomized such a beautiful spirit, she became the patron saint of the blind. Her feast day is celebrated December 13.



In Sweden one daughter of a family is chosen to represent the Saint; she wear crown encircled with lighted cardles. In one hand she carries a tray of saffron buns with raisin "eyes," and in the other, a coffee pot. She visits each bedroom and wakens the sleeper with a song, offer-ing buns and coffee.

In households where there are no daughters, a girl of especially fine character is chosen to play the part, and she rides down the street on a throne placed on a beautiful float. She is the living symbol of the joyous Christmas season.

Something of a phenom-enon took place recently in certain areas of Southern California.

It was in regard to the trimming of Christmas trees.

3 - Chi Rho, the first two letters of Christ in Greek. Also, it is said, it refers to Christus Rex, or Christ the King, in Latin.

4 — The first three letters for Jesus in Greek. Also Jesus Hominum Saviour.

5—The cross, a reminder of His sacrifice for all men, of forgiveness and salvation. 6 - The crown symbolizes

the King of Kings

7 — The sun or righteous-ness refers to Malachi iv, 2 in the Old Testament, pro-phesying the birth of Saviour.

8 — The rose symbolizes the nativity.

9 - A butterfly recalls the Resurrection, and man's re-birth through commitment




Fun-Loving **King Restores** Yule Tree


