



Crimp On Crime

ca's crime rate, destroy organized prime, empty the prisons, unclog the courts and ease the burden of wertifitier.

the courts and ease the burden of everything.

This may be a simplification but it is not a falsification of what more and more lawyers, judges and professors of law and sociology are coming to believe must be done if respect for the law is to reign in America and if the battle against trime is to be won.

Too much of the time and energy of lawmakers and law enforcers, these critics charge, is spent on so-called c r i me s by definition or crimes without victims — gambling, drunkenness, private sexual practices and so on.

In 1968, for example, of the 6 million nontraffic arrests in the nation, more than 2 million were for simple drunkenness.

"The prime function of criminal

drunkenness.

"The prime function of criminal law is to protect our persons and our property," says attorney Norval Morris, "When criminal law-invades—the spheres of private morality and social welfare it exceeds its proper limits and neglects its primary tasks."

When law is used "to coerce men When law is used "to coerce men toward virtue," he adds, it always falls, Even worse, it breeds criminal cultures. Crime syndicates grow rich, bribery flourishes and corruption of police and politicians is invited.

Morris, together with criminologist and penologist Hans Mattick, is co-director of the University of Chicago Law School's Center for Studies in Criminal Justice, if they had their way:

— Public drunkenness would no longer-be-a-crime, Instead-of-clogging the courts and jails with drunks, at a cost of \$100 million a year, they recommend citywide networks of overnight houses, in combination with voluntary dealcoholization programs.

According to Morris and Mattick, if these proposals and a few others became law, arrests in the United States, would be cut in half, from 6 million to 3 million a year, and police and courts could concentrate on "real" crime — mürder, assault, robbery, theft, fraud.

— In-two-rease-they-would-toughen—existing laws—drunken driving and gun ownership.

Since 1900, 750,000 people have been killed in the United States by privately owned guns, says Morris. This is 30 per cent more than in all the wars in the nation's entire history.

Drunken driving is even more deadly, being responsible for about 55 per cent of the nation's annual 50,000-plus traffic deaths.

The reformers are not optimistic that any of these proposals will be adopted in the near future.

But it must be admitted that there is something ludicrous about a score of police cars being dispatched to—arrest—a-topless-collo-player—in-Now-York while people are afraid to walk the streets of the city at night. And there is something frightening about the indictment of public officials in New Jersey on charges of extortion and tax evasion, a scandal involving every level of the state government, the Mafia and even U.S. Treasury agents.

When law is ludicrous and corruption and serious crime are tam—pant—the-health of a antion is not good. Perhaps we do need to reorder our priorities and elevate our sights.

Los Angeles — A group left by a Black Panther was stopped while riding in a stolen car. One of them fired a shotgun at the police, but after a chase and gun battle, they were captured, one of them wounded. Under

questioning they admitted committing an armed robbery at a drive-in restaurant, and planning to attack. Negro security officers to obtain guns.

Also in Los Angeles, Black Panther John Leonard Clark was arrested for burglary, Five other Black Panthers were arrested for robbery. They were armed with a rovolver, an automatic pistol, and a sawed-off-carbine. A month, later, three other Panthers were arrested for robbing a school.

On another occasion, Black Panthers Elmer. Gerard Pratt and Roger Lee Lewis were arrested in Los Angeles for possession of a bomb.

San Diego — Black-Panther, Abraham Barnett was arrested for hurglary. Ten days later he was again arrested for the same offense. The following month, six Black Panthers were arrested for possession of illegal weapons and stolen property. Police sefred three shotguns and one rifle.
