Dear Dr. Thosteson: Why does a person lose the sense of smell? I had flu last winter.—
Mrs. G. B.
Dear Doctor: I had flu, evidently the Hong Kong variety, and lost my sense of smell completely. I can taste only safty, sour, and sweet, but no flavors. Doctors said I would probably regain sense of smell but it might be six months; is there anything one can take to help?—Mrs. R. T. J.
Influenza of any type is nicetion. It may be that in certain respects the Hong Kong type is a little worse. At any rate, I have received a large number of letters telling of loss of the sense of smell following the Hong Kong fluepidemic.

This loss is apparently due to damage of the fine nerve ends in the mose, as these are the nerves which pick up odor.

Fin, after all, is a respiratory virus, so it is not surprising that these particular nerves suffer. Ability to smell can be lost because of an ordinary cold, but if returns promptly when the cold ends.

With fin, evidently there is more damage, but one would ordinarily expect the nerves to recover in six months or so. I hast dank thought the cover in six months or so. I hast don't know.
