

Idealistic young people generally have young people generally have supported Council Manager government.
The bulk of Pocatellans currently

favoring retention of manager government seems to be those who remember the city under mayor government. They were tired of city debts, a mayor they couldn't get rid of in less than four years,

ger in or in less than four years, street improvements for friends of the mayor which paralyzed city government.

In 1951, Pocatello was ahead of many cities in adopting a form of government which has been government a year since World-War II. The Council-Manager form now is the most popular system of government in cities over 10,000 population. In Pocatello's population group, 25,000 to 50,000, 53 per cent of cities have manager government. The percentage for manager government is \$4 per cent in cities of 50,000 to 100,000. #### The Cattlemen

The Idaho Cattlemen's Ass'n would be in a better position to criticize the potato farmers for seeking official help if the cattlemen themselves were not the uemen themselves were not the beneficiaries of substantial government subsidies.

Lawrence Bradbury of Challis, president of the Idaho Cattlemen's

Ass'n, is particularly critical of the attempt by the National Farmers Organization, which organized the potato holding program, to enlist the aid of the governor in its struggle for better prices. According to Bradbury, "Until the farmers of Idaho start farming for a profit and not for an abundant surplus, there is very little than canbe done for them. To blame and attack the governor of a state for the price of any commodity produced in that state is just poor judgment. Price making is established by the law of supply and demand and the quality of the produce, and not by the governor's office." The potato farmers, Bradbury said, can better themselves only through the use of "sound" economic and business practices," not "headilne seeking ittacks on public officials."

The potato farmers, who unsuccessfully sought the help of Gov. Don'W-Samuelson in their struggle with the potato processors, are understandably somewhat put out with the governor. Cattleman Bradbury can't understand this evidently because he is convinced every producer ought to stand on his own feet and not cry for help when business is bad. But Mr. Bradbury seems to have forgotten his own people, much as they like to Ass'n, is particularly critical of the attempt by the National Farmers
