It was the first time since the April, 1997, military takeover that a court had assessed lighter sentences than the prosecution asked. The heaviest sentence was life imprisonment for Prof. Dionystos Karageorgas, 37, convicted of leading the antigovernment movement. The prosecution had asked the death sentence for him. - Withdrawal

As a sure sign that another mass As a sure sign that another mass protest against the Vietnam war is on the way, the Nixon Administration has begun its propaganda buildup for a coming announcement of further troop withdrawals. Voung people are mobilizing for anti-war demonstrations April. 15, and the Administration, which uses troop withdrawals to 'pacify America rather than Vietnam, is hoping to take the steam out of the demonstrations in advance.

The current line is that planned withdrawals during the next 15 months will reduce American forces to 225,000 men by the middle of 1971. That is, of course, a long time off, and a good many thousand Americans will lose their lives in the meantime. The Administration, did not fulfill its proclaimed withdrawal goals for 1969, and there is no reason to think this one will be

no reason to think this one will be fulfilled either. It is mainly useful for damping down protest.

Even if the current goal were attained, however, the important point is not that the American forces would thereby be halved, but that half of the present force would still remain in Vietnam — on terms. Ikely to make the occupation likely to make the occupation permanent. On the other hand, a determined effort to negotiate a political settlement would make it possible to withdraw all of our troops, not just half of them, by the middle of 1971. That ought to be the objective for a President who went into office on the strength of a promise to end the Vietnam war.

Mr. Nixon's 10,000 word, statement is adagrtised as the most detailed ever issued by a President on this subject, yet it would not have seemed necessary had Mr. Nixon not been accused of weak, dilatory leadership in the area of civil rights, and its very detail will hardly—relieve him of the accusation of ambiguous leadership. Among these details are some that do not, and some that require still further explanation.

Those who believe in equal rights for all will support the President's promise to enforce court decisions barring—legalized or do juro segregation everywhere, and will welcome a fiscal commitment to help upgrade black schools caused by the de facts segregation.

They will also note that Mr. Nixon has not offered any serious help in combating de facto segregation or its effects, either in education or the housing patterns that create it. And they may well-ask where the President expects to find the billion-and-a-half dollars for helping racially impacted schools in other domestic programs that are already short-changed because of war ex-

penatures.

Mr. Nixon's words on bussing and on neighborhood schools are both political and regrettable. His flat opposition to the one and total

support of the other may appeal to his rural and suburban white supporters, but if adopted as national policy would prohibit use of bussing where it may be appropriate. Millions of school children have, after all, been bussed to schools for various reasons, including the shameful one of segregation. Though the President accepts the idea that "massive racial isolation" has bad effects on children, he is equally concerned that children are "sensitive to conflict." Amid the rhetoric on his middle ground he avoids placing withen his possible of the power behind the goal of seeking the utmost racial integration, emplastizing compensatory education instead.

But compensatory education, though helpful, is no final substitute for integration in schools. James S. Coleman, Johns Hopkins professor and principal author of the monumental 1966 federal study of education, recently reiterated that "integration alone reduces the existing gap between black and white children by 30 per cent." Integration alone is, in short, a major educational tool. It is the

major educational tool. It is the Negro thildren alone who are being asked to wait for the advantages. The Njxon statement is anything but a clarion call for integration. This is, after all, a century after the Constitution was altered to provide equality among races. It is no time for a middle ground between segregation and desgregation, or for enforcing the Constitution, slowly, or for "governing by ambiguity," which is what John Gardner, a Republican and former Cabinet member, sees in the White House.


