(Obviously, to have defeated the oremost military power in Asia merely with conventional weapons dominance. And just because the Japanese had to be rooted out of a dozen barren Pacific rocks foot by foot was no reason to believe they
would have bothered to defend heir home islands.)
Another reason the bombs were

into the Pacific war.
