On November 3 the voters o Idaho will have the opportunity to vote for or against, adoption of a The proposal to change Idaho's Constitution has been atudied in depth The-most brilliant ininds in the state have been engaged in this he state have been engaged in this and the top-flight Constitutional Revision Commission has come up with a Constitution which would replace the bigoted, outdated one under which the state now operates.
After a close study of the proposed. Constitution, that the voters of Idaho mark their ballot "for" the new instrument. Action in fo ming the suggested Constitution has not been hasty. The revision commission was commissioned by the Legislature in 1965. Such persons as Rep. Orval Hansen, Kramer, Carl Burke, Rep. Darrell Kramer, Carl Burke, Rep. Dand Lloyd Webb and Senator Manning, Fredericksen composed the Don Fredericksen composed the
original commission. Five members were appointed by the Legislative Branch; five by the Governor and five by the Supreme Court. Many meetings were held all open to the public. During the Legislature held 28 public hearings over the state in every Legislative district.

- The Commission made further revisions based on these hearingsover six of them were in Magic Valley-and met with the Legislature in January of this year with a final report. The Legislature-105 persons representative of our State-ura Convention for two days. They heard all the arguments.
