CAMP EAGLE, Vietnam, (UPI) — Bob Hope opened his seventh Christmas tour of Vietnam today with cheers from 18,000 Gls with jokes on marijuans usage and almost total-silence when he introduced South Vietnamese Vice Fresident Nguyen Cao Ky.

Hope, 67, and his 76-member troupe flew from Thailand for an afternoon performance at Camp Eagle; base camp of the 10ist Airborne Divison 385 miles north-northeast of Saigorn and 40 miles below the Damiltarized Zone (DMZ).

Dozens of helicopter gunahips circled nearby-hills and-infantry-patrols were dispatched from the camp, whose perimeter was fully manned to provide security for the performers.

"I hear you guys are interested in gardening here," said Hope, wearing jungle faltigues with outsized paratroop and aviator wings. "Our security officer said a lot or you planes given gour own grass."





Industry week magazine notes that the Week magazine notes that the nation's industries regard profitability as their chief problem in 1971, in contrast to the usual attitude of taking this necessity for granted. To meet the challenge, they plan to raise prices, eliminate unprofitable operations, boost, production, reduce jobs, and to ask for tax relief.

With inflation expected to continue by the majority of business-leaders, there is a growing demand for more restrictive measures by the government to moderate its

Automobile makers are raising prices to meet the insatiable demands of the UAW, which obtained three-year wage likes in excess of 40 per cent and costing a total of more than \$4 billion. The spreading effect of this inflationary

spreading effect of this inflationary settlement will affect everyone whether or not they but a new car—and some 25 to 30 million will. Seeking to insure themselves against the inflationary effect of their own greed, the UAW also negotiated an unlimited "cost of living" wage boost, the effect of which will be to add further fuel to the fire.
