





What is a president to do when his best judgment conflicts with public opinion, especially at

What is he to do when significant public questions cannot be debated rationally because too many of us

rationally because too many or are irrational?
Should he just drift as President
Buchaman did on the eve of the Civil
War, waiting for the public to tell
him what to do? Or should he act on
the basis of his best judgment,

the basis of his best judgment, deceiving the public as necessary?
The questions are asked by the Rev. Arthur C. Tennies, writing in the National Observer. They are

the National Observer. They are not answered by him.

"There is no simple answer," he says. "Arpresident will be judged by historians not on whether he deceived the public, but whether he chose the best policy. Deception itself is not the real problem; the real problem is presidents making the right decisions."

Lyndon Johnson wasn't the first president whose promises

president whose promises (something about not sending American boys to fight a war for Asian boys) were not in step with the truth, Tennies reminds us.

Woodrow Wilson ran in 1916 on a platform that boasted "He kept us out of war." Five months later he asked Congress to declare war on

Germany.

In 1940, Franklin D. Roosevelt promised that American boys would never fight on foreign soil, even as he was working to get the United States into World War II.

United States into World War II.

"Apresident has a responsibility
to represent the views of the
people," says Tennies, "but this is
not his total responsibility. What

national policy should be cannot be determined just-on-the basis of popular sentiment at a particular moment. The majority is not always right. We elect a president not just to be an errand boy for the popular whims but to give us the benefit of his wisdom

and experience."
He clies the 1964 election in which He cites the 1964 election in which, "a host of supposedly well-educated and intelligent people" were so terrified by Barry Gold-water that they could not deal with his ideas on Vietnam in a rational

Thus it is suggested that President Johnson had no choice but to pose as a dove in public while planning in secret to implement the very escalation Goldwater was honest — and stupid — enough to talk about.

Yet what might have happened
had Johnson been a little less the
consummate politician and
displayed a little more faith in the ability of the people to make wise

ecisions. The public-would-have-been so stunned and sobered that the hysteria generated over Goldwater would have evaporated and a rational debate on the choices facing the nation could have commenced. Johnson could have led that debate, giving us "the benefit of his wisdom and ex-perience."

But, according to Tennies' thesis democracy is really an impractical form of government and "the consent of the governed" is just one of those fancy phrases to be swept aside when it comes to important matters.

Future Of Flight nsportation is in for a main runway at Twin Falls is now

Jet transportation is in for a hange—and in the immediate

future.

No longer will great, long rum ways be necessary to attract jet planes to communities such as Twin Falls. The Boeing company— in cooperation with an European

in cooperation with an European plane manufacturer—announce a project which will result in the building of jet aircraft carrying from 100 to 150 people but able to land and takeoff, fully loaded, in a space about half that now provided by the main runway at the Twin Falls City-County Airport.

The jet the two builders will produce is to be of the STOL variety of plane. In aviation STOL means "Short Takeoff and Landing" craft. When in service, this type plane would be able to carry half again as many passengers as do the DC-0's now servicing the Magic Valley-through-Twin-Falls, and yet land and takeoff over an area about 3,000 feet long. The area about 3,000 feet long. The

7,200 feet long.
Use of such a plane would greatly
reduce—the—"overhead" of—jettransportation and would make the transportation and would make the taxpayer burden much easier in that the longer runways would not be necessary, would be much easier to maintain and yet would still provide 500 to 600-mile-an-hour transportation modern travelers

Advent of such a plane would mean that even the airports which are practically inside the city—like that at Burley—could be used by these jets with only "beefing" up of

the runway base and no extension.

The same would apply at Halley.

It is a great step forward in aviation. There have been small STOL planes in use for quite awhile. Boeing now says big jet planes with this short landing and takeoff capability will be ready in from three to five years.



The announcement was exciting to scientists because it implies that chemical evolution, a prelude to the evolution of living creatures, is going on

a prelude to the evolution of living creatures, is going on throughout the great universe.

The molecule is OH, or hydroxyl, which is a component of many chemicals on earth which in turn are linked together in living organisms.

Interstellar hydroxyl was first discovered eight, years ago in the extremely rarefied dust clouds of our own galaxy of 100 billion stars. Since then more than-a-dozen-complex-pre-life, chemicals have been detected in the Milky Way.

The first evidence that chemical evolution may also be going on elsewhere in the universe was discovered by a 34-year-old radioastronomer, Dr. Leonid N. Wellachow from the Meudon Observatory in France who is a visiting s research fellow at the Califors nia institute of Technology.
