## Why Do

 So Many Older Women Suffer Broken Hips?
## By Sondra K. Gorney

TThe telephone rang wildly. Sho sensed troubla and ran to angwer it. "Come over quickly, Gcandráa fell again. She thinks her hip is brokeh."

- Again? This was the fourtil break-in 12 yeara. Seventy-year-old Grandmahad alneady suffered a broken pelvis. thighbone and hip. This was the wecond break for the name hipl Why? Was ahe more-actident-prone than anyone elac, or was there sorfic:-bidden reaton for her falla?
Doctora believe they now havo the answer:
Grandma, like some six million other ofder women in the U.S., may very well be a victim of otteoporotis (bono decalcification). Thisidisease is ono of the common causes of hackache and spontancous fractures, capecially of the: hip. In fact, about a fourth of all women auffer from osteoporosis after the menopaune. At a reault, their bones are caslly fractured. Two-thirds of the one million fractures-irequently of hip or writh-autained each year by women 45 years or older are attributed to postmenópausal oatcoporoais.

How doel this diseaso cdime-about? "Oateo" meana bone, and "porous" means full of pores or tapaces. Living bone is compoted of both a soft framework made of proteln and a dopoilt of calcium salle that form a hard timuc. In the sound adult, the akeleton conatantly rebuilde iteoll. Old bone is continually reabsorbed by tho body, and now bone produced to replace it.

This regeneration is alded by certain hombonerechomical mubuncen:-prodiced by endocrine plands. Dut after mionopause, there in a lack of eatrogen -the Iemale hormono-and this croates a defaciency of calclum and phosphorus. Morecuer, evan when enough calcium and phosphorus aro present, there is no longer aufficiont bone matrix, or foundation, in which they can

be deposited. Thus the bones becóme lighter und ihinnër.
Ontcoporosit also alters, a woman outwardly. Due so the lous df pidein. calcium and other minerals, the spinal column becomes subject to what doctors call' "compression fractures." The apine ohrinkg; teading to a loes of height (as much as one to five inches), and, often, a "dowager's hump."

Once the changes in bone matrix have occurred in a woman, they caninot be reverzed. But they can bo arrested or slowed down. Dr. Gilbert S. Giordan of the Univeratiy of California Medical Center has found that injections of estrogen help to retard furiher height loss in hia patienta. Eatrogen alan relieves the localized lower back pain of onteoparonis.
Dr. Walter Alvarez, omeritus consultant to the Mayo Clinic and medical columniat, urges older woman sufferers to discuss with their phyyicians whether thicy abould take female hormones. He' writes: "Today many phyuiciañs feol that probably every woman at the time of the menopause would do-well to ${ }^{\circ}$ start taking female hormone, and keep taking it as long as the lives."
In addition to hormono-raplacement therapy, other treatment may includde diet-and-mineral. replacement: ${ }^{2}$ A planned diet rich in colcium and protein is advocated, rometimes including Vlitmin'D.- Or meals can be eupplemented whth calclum zailt tablets. Phyaical actlvity is alteo recommended, since prolonged immobilization and oxterty. aive chair and bod reat tend to increane thinning of the bonea.

# Death Races in My Family's Shadow

Mother of Race-Car Champs Al aind Bobby Unser Ass told to Larry Bortstein
ast year's Indinnapolis 500 provided a stern test for mo $\square \overrightarrow{a s}$ tho mother of auto racs leading brother combina$n, A l$ and Bobby Unser,
late in the race, Al was breczalong in his red carlensoute his second consecultive Indy etory, an accomplishment only rec olher race drivers have anaged. In my grandstand seat the Indianapolis Motor Specd ay, I fell a tear of joy and reet:fall to my cheek. Jerry Sen-r-"Doddy"-the fnthar of all Sur of my sons; would have ved to share the moment with ce, just as he would have gloated Al's first Indy victöry in 1970 ad at Robby's victory in 1968. batdy raised his boys to bo great ace drivers, but never snwthem inthe-blgone at Tndy: Frodied a stroke in 1967.
I tell everyone that I root for 1 and Dobby to finith firit and ccond in every race they enter ogether, and it looked like-my vish was coming true at Indy lant May. Though Al was comfortbly ahead in firat, place, Bobby vas rumning sccond in his black enr, with less than 100 miles left o go.
Then, suddenly, ho.crashed.... In the next fow mintutes of unfertainty, my mind went back o another timbi; another racoi Ierry Junior, one of our twin sons born in 1933-Louin was the other-was the first Unier to raco at Indianapolis, fulfiling a lifelong dream of Daddy's'. With his father's encouragement and guidance, Jerry Junior made it to the shrine of American auto racing in 1058 . Rut he was involved in a crash in that year's 500 and, although he wasn't hurt, had to withdraw from the race.
He returned to Indy early in May, 1959, to begin practicing for that year's 500. Daddy and I made plans to leave Albuquerque, N.M., our hometown, $n$ few daye-nfter-Jerry, to-watch-him gualify foc the big race,

Instead, wo went east under completely different circumstances. I flrat ldarned of Jerry'm seripus accident in practice when

Wd my name paged in an Albuquerque aupermarkdt while I What doing my-hougchold altop-

ping. When I went to the front of the storo, the manager told me to. nuh home because word had como fram Indy about a crath involving Jerry.

Daddy and I caught the first pline to Indiapapolis, and we got there to find Jerry in critical condition in the hospital with severe burna. For a few daya, Jerry scemed to be improving. Daddy and' $I_{\text {, 'along with Jerry's wifo, }}$ pent a lot of time-with-him-and checred him wp. It began to look al if he would make it.

But the burns had weakened Jerry to much that he couldn't fight off the preumonia that suddenly attacked his body. Within a few dayn, ho wal dead at the age of 26.

Daddy and I were sitting on the porch of our home one day tearly in 1963 when Bobby camd home and announced that he had found in aponer for a ride at Indy. We hadn't tried to stop the other boys from racing after Jerry's death, but I had hoped they would confine their racing to the amall dirt track: in the Southweat.

As Bobby ant discuasing his Indy-rido-with-Daddy,-I-ran-into our bedroom and cried for 20 minutes. That was the lant time I ever displayed any reluctance at having any of my sons race cars. When I came back out on the. porch, Bobby und his father wara in the middle of a lively talk about automobiles and racing-

Without ahowing the termor I felt, I just joined in the converantion.
But now it wat lnat May at. Indy. ... How could I help thinking agnin of Jerry and the grief Daddy and I had shared over his loss when I saw Hobby's car hit that wally I couldn't look at, the track for several momentis. Portunately, I didn't havo to look to know ihat the accident wann't a eorious onc. My eare told me that-The-crath-hadn't-mounded tdo bad:- Imean- nobby's and Mike 'Moslay's cars were both wrecked, but you can usiually tell by the mound whether the drivers are in any danger. Even when. I looked back on the track and-eaw flre coming out of both cark, I thought Dobby would be

climbing out at any momett:
Sure enough, he did, "with a dazed but relieved expreasion on his face. Moaley, the other driver. had to be taken to the houpital in an ambutance, but be recovered from his Iniuries.
Still, 1 was beft; with the nagging thoupht hataire of my-boyw could have been seriouily hurt while the other was winning a big race. How would I have reactod if it had been that way? 1 can't any. Allla know is that the Unsers have rocovered from their thare of misförtunc before, and Lwould simply have to keep up the family tradition of cournger ahould miefortine over sitrike again.
I've been around racing men for 40 yeari now, and I've grown to realize that thoy aro 'n apocial. broed, that they, require a mpocialif lolad of undoritandinge, Thioy don't always get it, and thit has resultod, in many broken homea and frustrated lives amona race drivera. I was lucky that someone like my husband introduced me to tho often cruel world of motor aports.
'Fl.didn't know one end of a car from-the other when I eame to Colorado, virtually to the foot of Pikes, Yeak, in 1931, to live with cousina. I bad apent my early years in and around Springfield, Mo... and had gone to music schiool there 1 wat going to teach plano and organ. But my bay fever made life miserable for me in-Missouri, so I excaped to the Colorado mountalin.

There 1 mol Jerry Senior. He was dating another girl when he mut me at a pary; brt wo began to date very ateady right from the atart. Our courtalup was one of the atrangeat on record. Jerry

After the first couple of laps, I had lost my fear, and the whole experience became fun. Hut not to Laddy. He looked worried and begm to flag nie down. I didn't pay any attention to him. 1 just kept right on going. When I got out of the carboy, was he angry!

That was the first and last lime I got behind the whed of a racing car. I'm content to leave the driving to Rohby und A , and they do quite a job of it. They're the only brothers who have won the Indy 500 , and, of course,

My sons are close as brothers,' too. They live on opposite sides.

Back in the days just following the Civil War, the U.S. Sente was debating the establish-ment-of the first national park It was a good idea, but many opposed it because so much of the couniry was still a vast, untanéd wilderness.

But one Senator, moro farsecnge than most, argued that the day would come when America would have ed support a stupendous population of 150 million.

When that heppens, Sen Aecrge-Vest of Missouri argued; the country should have a park that would be "a great breathing place for the national lungy." And, so, in 1872, Yellowstonc National Park, still the nintion's largest, was formed, and: nerved as the-foundation of a park sya tem that undil recently wastunique in the world.

Today, with the population topping the 200 million mark and city peoplo gasping for a brenth of clean air, the national parks are fulfilling their role as breath ing places for national lungs.

While there are parks in auch diverse places as Maine and Floridn, perhaps the most spectacular are in the great Western atates of Colorgdo, Montana, Utah and Wyoming, where nature has wrought her miracles with such awesome sights as the Tetons in Wyoming, the frozen rivers of Olacier National Park, Mont. the unbelievablo Indian pueblos preserved in the Mesn Verde of Colorado and the shimmering rock formations in Zion and Bryce canyons in Utah.
ltaly has its juitly. famed Amalf Drive, but it pales in comparison with tha Going-to-the Sun Highwny inclacier Natlonal Parkd A 50 -mile scenic drive, the highway crosses the Continental Divido at Logan Pass. High cliffs,

Bryce Cunyor and Z5on in Utah are cathedrala in stone. Their great sculptured forms are best seen in early morning or late afternoon, when the slanting rays of the sun cause the red rocks to glow with ever-changing hues.

If you onty have a limited time, be certain to take the Zion Canyon Scenic Drive; which affords opportunities to view the high cliffs and the Virgin River, whose croding action oyer the centuries formed a great aboyon.

If geology, botaty and animal Hife arc the main nttractions in most of the parks, Mera Verde in Colorado han atill another powerful lure, the atudy of early Americnn man.

Fior nearly 1,300 years a litleknown tribe of Indlains carved out homes in elifts forated the tho southwest corner of Colorado. Decnuse of the dry climate, thetr spectacular buildings are in a rare state of preservation.
