One reader writes: "We husk our walnuts as soon as possible, and then wash them at an outside faucet. You then drain them for a short time and place them in an oven of a gas stove: Heat from the pilot light is enough to dry them. 'Place the riuts on cookie sheets or in a big roast pan. Stir often.' <br> After a while shell-then-outheap thanice halves for decorating cakes or cookies, Roll the rest with a rolling pin and then place in a far. Refrigerate till used up. I do think. that by drying them in the oven, they do not get wormy. <br> For those who want to spray, commence at 'the beginning of the July when the flies' are generally present. Use Sevin or Gardona, and repeat every two weeks while the flies are present.
