## Fve Seen the Face of Death-

 By Millumin Stome Eapeeially for PAMILY WEEKLYI've had three heart attacks and .open-hearraorgery und ly foel bet"ter than I've felt in ten years. And I get more out of life. But maybe I'd better start at the beginning - four years ago, back in Scpiember of 1968, when it huppened the first time. I was at home, preparting for work the next day. The "Gunsmoke" TV series was then in its l6th year. It happened just before I turned in for the night. I had - the usunl- symptoms:- pains-in-my chest, difficulty in breathing. 1 was rushed to the hospital where the doctor told ine ! had suffered a severe heart uttuck. I had to spend six weeks in the hospitat and another six weeks at home tefore the doctor let me bo back to work.

Before 1 was released from the hospital, the doctor gave me the customary warnings. He told me: Don't anober-watch your dict, start daing some exercises, purticularly swimming and wälking, and anince itive on, thillside - he told me to get a stationary bicycle.

I was about to learn that once a heart uttack is over you start feeling so bood und so full of vigor that you forget it ever happened. This-cannever happen to me ngain" is the foeling you got-ind you ignore what you. are supposed to do. i began walking past my bicycte, 1 didn't pay much attention to my diet. And I felt tike a schoolboy when my wife Jane caught me outside the houke one morning.
e. helping a plumber - and smoking a cigarette. She asked me what I was doing. "It was so cold out hert, I thought a smoke would keep me warm," I flbbed.

She shook her head in disappointment. "At your age, you should know better!" she said. I wns 64 then.

But I didn't know better. I let my-self-use_every-sticap and_shred_of_my energy at work and at play. I didn't get-onough-ract-aithar-Sa-it hupporiad. Almost two years ifter my first seizure, in August. 1970. 1 had another heart attack.

Once again it happened at night. Again I had the fecling of pain and indigestion, which grew worse. I tried tho old-fashioned remedies pad they-didn't work. As the puin becnme oxcruoiating, 1 gradunlly realized it
was another uttuck
This one was not as severe and I was released from the-dospital-after five weeks. And because it wasn't that severe, once again 1 forgot the doctor's warnings.

A month later, I had my third at-tuek-and the third time was almost the end for me. After five weeks of treatment and close observation, my doctor insisted that he needed other opinions, and-that open-heart surgery might be required. He made it sound very casual, but I tater found out that he had already been in touch with specialists. "Okay," I said, "who do you-suggent?"-f-figured-he'd aptla-me to the famous heart center in Houston.
"Dr. John Kirkland at the University of Aliobama Medical Center," be: told me.
"Alabamal"' I cried out.
"He's the best in the country,"- my doctor said.
"Well, it's my life," I said. "Who in your opinion is the best in the world?"
"Dr. John Kirkland," he repeated. "Besides, all wewant is un opinion." 1 was off to Alabama in carly March of 1971, suppoisedly only for contaltationt-packed-onty-one-palf of pajamas, a couple of shirts and some-incidentals for a three-or-fourday stay. That would have worked out fine, since it was time for ne to start work on the next season's television shows. So if went to Alabama and I took those tests,

1 thought I had passed them all with flying colors. I found out later - that I had flunked them, every onebut particularly the arteriogram, which discovered a blockage in the artery from my right arm to the heurt. When thgy wanted to test me again through my left arm, I refused at first. "Something tells me I shouldn't fool
 God, name it fatc, whatever you like." Hintethe-dector insisted. so 1 sube mitted to this and other examinations. Dr. Kirkland then told me he felt it was best to operate. "What if I don't agree?" I asked. "What if I go back. home now?"

Dr. Kirkland didn't hesitate a moment. "Well, if you do, I won't draw abreath till you get back."

I needed more cotivincing, "All

During thole first weekn nfer I came out of the intensive-care init. they wheeled mo twice every day to the physical therapist, netly Denton,

Who started me on the simplest, most elementaty kind of finger exeroiseslike stretching rubber bands. Three weeks hater she thought I-had gradined to nomore adyaneed type of oxercise. She put a glass and a few pennies next to my bed and ordered, "I witht you to pick up the perniessand put them in the glass." I thought there was nothing to it-till I tried. My hand shook so badly, I simply couddn't do it. But she-was: patient? and persibtent. An angel. And eventually I learned to put perinies in the glass. And then I learned to walk. again-down the hall at first with a safety left, strapped to gee so I wouldn'e fall. Like a child I fparned a lat of things from the very beginning, all over again.

I remember one marping 1 told my wife Janie - "At leasi one thing is settied: I know for sure I'm old enough to retire!"

Yes, but what you don't know yet is what you want to do," she said quictly $\qquad$ that I don't have to work any more." After that she didn't say anything.

but the next day when the doctor came by, he said, "Now, -when-you are ready to go back to work-"
"Oh, no! You're kidding!
"You're too young to retice! Be-- iden, you canit leave the show."
"But really, Doctor," I protested. "Now, come on," he said. "You have a better heart now than youd have had in years. You're physically able to work, and mentally you are not ready to retire."

If still don't know if he was just being a good psychiatrist or if he just knew what was going to happen. But the conndence he give me helped tremendously. I know that. Sure enough. while I missed the first shows of the season, I was ready and able to go back to work for the second.

And this time I had learned my les. son. No more smoking. No more ignoring diets. Proper exercise. And Ifeel great.

But there's more to it. I get more out-of life now than-l ever-did before. Once-you rench the point where you think it is a quarter to 12 , you become much more aware of the things that. really mater.
r.-abile $l$ was recuperating flood of mail and telegrams came in from my fans. Janic woutd sort them out and rend most of them to me. It made me feel that a lot of people had a vested interest in me. I felt they not only wanted me to stay alive bút to go back to work. If I quit now, I felt they would never forgive me. I owed it to them and to myself to keep going.

I enjoy eyerything more these days -being aware of what my wife Janic has done for me, talking to friends, visiting my daughter and her children, just getting up in the morning nad enboying the day no matter what the day is like: Because even amog is better than not broathing air at all.

There has been a difference in my own attitude toward people. I have a short fuse: Y explode casily. I've never been a boozer or a woman chaser, but l've had my charicter flaws aplenty. My biggest are-Impatence and Intolerance and selfishneess. And I used to swear in no uncertain_terms. Tcan's say that I knocked it out completely, but I've sure cut it down. I've become conscious that 1 do more harm than gód thatway $工$ duracd 68 on luly 5 . and I've learned that even ut my age there is room-and the possibility-for improvement.

I've worked hard all of my life. In lact, except for a couple of very brief visits with friends in San Juan Island, l've never taken a vacation until af few months ago when Itook Janie to'Hawhii for two weeks. In the future we plan to travel more. Wa niso bought property in Rancho Santa Fe with three acres of ground, and we'are in the process of buidding a home there.

I think the most conerete lesson I've learned is that the doctors can do a tot-buf your hive to help. yon have to pay attention to what they tell you.

Tests thowed that when full use was made of nonverbal signals, the impact or effect of a given communication was more-than four times as great. 2. Trie. Laughter-provdder one of the most effective ways of handity ernbrirruasturg questions that put you on the apot. ("What did he any when you asked him that koy question?"' "Oh, he just lnughed.") And the way you laugh can give the other person whatever impression may serve your purpose. ("He didn'i say anything, bol hia laughter was eloquent.") As Dr. Joyce O. Hertzler has obeerved in her excelient treatire, "Laughter: A Socio-Scten-

tifle Analysis": "By his behavior, the laugher, unconsciously or conscioualy, can convey a grent mumber and variety of messages to his fellows."
2. False. Paychologist. Albert Mehrabjan has made a tudy of "decelt in communication,"
which shows that people unwittingly give themselves away when they're trying to stretch the truth or "ecll momeone a bill of goods." Experiments showed that when subjecta were being deceitfal there were subile changes in their manner. They
"exhibited more pleasant facial expressions," smiled more, etc. (as though to both reassure their listener and mank their own nervousness or tension). They nodded und gestured leas, talked less, apoke more abowly, made more speech errors, and
tended to position themselvere, slightly farther away from the person they were apcaking to: 4. False. Doing 'it' this way _ causes hard-feclings, makes ene. mies unnecessarily, and tar produce $a$ very unpleasant atttintion. Dint there is a simple, tested method for cutting obnoxious characters down to size and keeping bores and pests from traking a nest in your hair. Le's called the "delayed response" technique. Here's how it works: When a .peat stope by your office desk and-says "Hello," you simply allow a fittle' more time that. usual to elapst before you reapond to his greeting. You answer in your usual tonc of woice, and may_even throw in a smile. He feels greatly relieved. For a brief moment your delay made him feel uncomtortable and at a loss-ns any - man does when the thinks pethapa he's been cut dead and isn't going to be answered at all. Your amile and greeting have reasaured him. But after a few doses of this technique, his ego will bogin to feel it,- and he'll - give you a wider and wider -berth--without retlly knowing ${ }^{*}$ why, except that he feels more comfortable that way. The tecret in using this-method is to delay your response for just the right period: long enough to cause the person to teel just a bit-uncomfortable; but-not-long enough for him to realize what you're doing to him.

Psychological studies at Britain's Universily of Newcatic have demonstrated that people use clothes to tell olhert what they want them to believe about them-sometimei the thes: sages" are valid and help clue others in on the kind of person the wearer is. But sometimes the "messuge" in complefely misleading, as with a quiet. mousy girl in a daring miniakist, or a dull fellow in a sharp suit. In such cases, the wearer is not trying to tell others what he's really like, but is seeking to communionte his ldeal self-image-the kind of person (I) he wisher he was.

How often have you heard somebody saly ${ }^{\text {" }} 1$ just don't understindicatis. 1 lave most animals-dogs, horses, birds-but cats leave me cold."

Well, cats can be mysterious And they-are independent. They do not beg for your understand ing the way-H-dog-doos,_,_,
But part of the prohtem, too, is that so many people fail to recog-nize-and respect-a cat for what it is: a descendant of the jungle, with-eertnin-very-specialized needs. The next time you meet a cat-or consider adopting onetry to kecp' these five important. "fields of knowledge"in.mind:

## 1. How to Handlo

A. cat must be hundled correctly or it will scratch you-not out of meraniness, burjust to hangs on: To feel secure, a cat must be held with one hand under its tronl legsi-und another hand-aupporting its rear. Don't let a citt dangle.

If you must restrain a cat, une a heavy lowel, a pillowcase or a donim bag with a drawstring you can- pull up under his chin. This

## is a handy way to give a cat

 medicine, trim lts claws or even trangpartit if youl can't lay your hands on a carrler in a hurry. Cats hate loud noises. That inchudal your voice, so speak to him in gentle tones if you want rosults, Barking at a cat will get you nowhere but in his bad graces. The only time it is permitted is in discipline. If . Felix is caught climbing the uthpes, you can yell a little, but don't strike him. Spanking a cat only demoralizes him
## 2. How to Food

The most scientifiçally formu lated, highly mulritious diet for cats is the high-quality commercial cat food you find on your grocery-store shelves. Choose a variety of flavers (cats hate monotony)...from a hand that incluydes vitamina and minerals on its list of ingredicrts. Add a handful of dry food, either alone or mixed with the canned, at least once a day. Provide fresh water at all times. If you havo chosen a good-quality commercial food, you do not need vitamith supplemenis, nthough -a sprinkling of brewers' yeast once a day is thought to bey a flen preventive and is generally liked by cats. They ulso like treats of cotlage cheese (good calcium source);-some-vegetables, such as string beans, mushrooms and asparagus; and raw meat, such as cut-up kidney, heart or fiver. Almost all cats like cantaloupe (don't ask me why), and lonce had-it-cat-who-doled-on-artichokes. They bften like ham (which isn't recommended because it is 100 salty) and hard cheese (OK). Don't give your caf cold foods right out of the refrigerator, highly seasoned foods, swets, uncooked fish; poultry bones (hacy can choke him or pierce his intestinal-wull), Unless you are sure your ent can tolerate milk without getting diarrhea, avoid milk or cream.

A kitten should be fed four times a day a a thice-to-six-monthold eat, thres times a day; an adult cat (cight months old can go on a two-meal-a-day achedute. Three sunces of food in the morning and another liree ounces in the evening is the standard requirement. If he isn't eating it itli -at one ntutng, de crease the amount. If he begs for

## 3. How to Groom

Long-haired-cats should-be combed every day; short-hairs should be brushed. (Special cat combs and.brustics can be purchned at your pet bitore) Start at the head and work south, De sure tol get out all tangles and mats. ff they won't comb out, cut them out care-fully-using blunt scissors and qutting away from the cat's body. Turn him over on his back and do the sume thing with his tummy. Don't forget the tail. You will be amazed at how much fur you will get out. Proper combing or brushing will not only provent hair balls, it will also do a lot for your furniture and rugs.
A' cat's nails should be clipped regularly. Ask your veturinurian to show you how. It must be done carefully or you will snip into the quick. A scrutching-pont will_also heln Felix keep his nails in shape.

## 4. How to Koop Healthy

Inoculations: Every 'cat must have shots for feline enteritis as soon as he is two weeks past weaning. The seceond inoculation (a booster) is generally given a week after the first. Feline enteritis is almost always a fatal-dicease with kittens. and extemoly contagious-=but not transmis. sible to humans.

Learn how to spot common ailments.

Frequent ancezing: Can mean any one of several respiratory disuases such as rhinot racheitis or pneumonitis. Can be mild or severe Consult. your veterinaritn.

Vomiting: Can bo just "re: verse gear" or hair balls and mean nothing, or it can be sign of poisoninge cither-mild. or severe. Keep close watch and rush your-catcoa-vet if it continues,

Refusing food: If this continues more than two days, -it usually means trouble. Con-
sels; constipation trinch ip anemin, and other diseases both trivial and scrious. Don't let it continue. See the vet.
Diarriēa or constipitlon: Doth are usually traceable to food. Milk and paw liver are laxiative to cats; cooked liver and cheese can bo constipat-ing-But-if either condition: persists, consulit your vet. (Hair balls often cause either vomiting of constipation and can be helped by giving Felix a dab of Petromalt or a litele. oil in his diet:)

Abscesses: Any painful swelling is probably caused by the bite of another animal (usually another cat) and will need antibioties and possible lancing. Don't try to treat it yourself. Abscesses pre common with cats.
Straining to urinate: Almost always means urinary infection or cystitis. Rushito vet;

## 5. How tō. Troal

Don't treat a cat like n child. but like the bequatiful, highstrung, sensitive animal he is. Although domesticated for 5,000 years, a cat is still close to the jungle. He will always be i hunter; don't beat him if ho-bringa you a mouse or a bird. He is giving you a "present." Pamper his hunting instincts by providing him with toys that stimulate stalking and pouncing, such as a catnip. mouse, a Ping - Pong ball or just a wadded piece of paper. An empiy brown paper bag is also much apprecinted. Spring toys on ton of a scratching post provide hours of amusement. A cat "trece" is great for all ents, especcially Siamese.

On the other side of the ledger, be súre to give your cat plenty of time to slecp. He should nat be fuged with all day. He likes solitude as well us companionship. But don't Bo away for a long period of time and neglect your cat. He will become very unhappy and neurotis if he is deprived of your company for long. Contrary to legend, a cat may tso more independent than a dog. lat he also needs petting 'IA'
