As air transportation has grown and airports have expanded, the problem is not just getting to the airport but to the airplane itself. Any plane within a half-mile of the ticket counter is close.

A design concept called "gate arrival"' shortens to about 300 feet the distance from parked car to parked airplane. Instead of a main terminal building with long concourses extending fingerlike out to
the plane, there is a cluster of one level, C-shaped buildings in a triangle formation.
A passenger can drive into and park in the open center of from-Planes are positioned on the from. Praner are positioned on the outer perimeter of each building. In 33 steps from the terminal en of the terminal - he's che length, and boarding the plane.

It's possible, airport officials say. that a passenger embarking on one of the huge jumbo jets may walk farther to his seat after he enters the plane than he did through the terminal.

 The Male Cat's NemesisSudden changes of temperature often trigger urinary Infec-
 tions in male cats, altered or unaltered. If your cat starts to strain in his litter pan, urinate on the rug or other unsuitable spots, cry while attempting to void, or spend a lot of time licking his hind quarters, he is probably suffering from some form of ürinary obstruction or bladder inflammation. It can be a very serious ailment. Don't wait; hoping the condition will go away. It is much more likely to get worse. Take Puss to the veterinarian immediately. Antiblotics are of great help. Distilled water is sometimes recommended. Sjice this pesky disease is caused by a virus, it can reoccur. Surgery is sometimes necessary, but prompt medication can usually prevent this drastic remedy.-By Felicia Ames

Bake 10-12 minutes, or until done. Cool 1 minute, then remove from cookic sheets with spatula to wire rack; cool completely
5. Decorate cookies with frosting. Color vanilla frosting.orange with a few drops of red and yellow food coloring if desired for jack-o'-lantern. Make faces with candy corn, licorice and chocolate candy.

One of the band's chief attractions was a young singer who specialized in "crooning." The reason they might have had doubts was that the boy had a likable, easygoing poise that made him' scem a bit. well, lethargic.

As the summer wore on, 1 developed a regular "crush" on the young singer. Was I the

The years passed, and 'I soon forgot all about that summer at Conmeaut Lake Then, one day in the early 1940's. I turned our radio up to "teenage" volume to hear a new smash hit called "Prisoner of Love." It was being sung by a bobby-sox sensation named Perry Como. I had never seen his picture, but just the sound of his voice made me swoon all over

My mother came in, turned the loudness down, and said "Norma, just because he used to be your boyfriend, you needn't bring down the walls!'

Boyfriend? Me? Perry Como? And then it aly came back. The young mah who sang to me on the ice-creamparlor chair . . those days we spent on the beachy. . . that relaxed, boy-next-door manner.

Although the -sand castles we built together quickly dissolved into ihe lake, and many of the songs have faded, my childhood memories of that likable young man, who the adults said seemed to lack "gumption," will remain till the day 1 dic.

## Wrecked His Life

Le, Dawson, the 37-year-old field general of the Kansas City Chiefs, is proving that pro quarterbacks, like old wine, improve with age. He had one of his best seasons last year, his 15 thees a pro, when he led the Chiefs to the championship of the western division of the American Football Conference and completed passes for gains of 2,504 yards, second highest total in the AFC. He's hoping to bring Kansas City another Super Bowl championship this year as he did in 1970, when he directed his team to a startling upset of the Minnesota Vikings. . Dawson, known as the "Iceman" for his coolness, was troubled by tendonitis early last season, and some said his arm was dead. It wasn't -he threw one crucial touchdown pass after another. His most severe ordeal came during the Chiefs' Super Bowl year. He injured his knee early in the season Surgery was advised. But he gambled that he could just rest the knee for several games and come back for the homestretch drive The gamble paid off. But then, five days before the Super Bowl game, big headlines linked him to a gambling investigation. "I felt like a criminal," he recalls, "even though I was entirely innocent. The torment was unbearable. I couldn'T sleep or eat and I didn't know it ld be allowed to play in the biggest game of my life." As it turned out, the investigaHon concerned a man named Donald Dawson. Len was completely cleared before the big game, and then went on to win it. ... A native of Alliance, Ohio, Dawson was an All-America quarterback at Purdue and led the Big Ten in total offense three straight years. His coach. Hank Siram, calls him "the moat accurate passer in pro football." Although he's cool and taciturn on the field, he's much more expansive off it and conducts a popular sports show on Kansas City TV and radio. ")lawson is married and the father of two.
