When the smoke cleared Oter voted for the bill. Those voting against it were Reps. M.L. Clements, Thompson, Walter, Pritchett, David Little, R. Emmett Wayne, Tibbitts, R. Lorenz, John Kearson, R. Boise, and Paul Worthen, R. Boise.
Roberts steered the bill through the House saying education was the number one priority.
He went through the various funds contained in the bill including the \$7.5 million from the general fund and \$4.7 million from federal revenue sharing.
Worthen suggested about \$2 million be

removed off the bill — that consideration could be given to tax relief as well as to the need of rank and file state employees for pay increases.
But Rep. E. V. McHain, R. Ketchum, long a foe of big state spending, disagreed. He said this bill will provide tax relief at the local level — that the state legislature is not authorized to provide the money for the purchase of property for maintenance and operation.
Rep. William Onweiler, R. Boise, agreed.
"This is tax relief for the people back home any way you cut it," Onweiler said.
Total state aid in the bill is \$11.6 million but

only \$7.5 million comes from the general fund. In addition there is \$4.7 million worth of federal revenue sharing.
Roberts said the revenue sharing was plugged into the bill to give federal auditors an "easy audit trail to follow."
Rep. Edna Olmstead, R. Twin Falls, spoke against the bill. He said he recognized it was a relief for teachers to receive salaries across their borders in these inflationary times.
He called instead for a status quo level of funding for the schools. That, Olmstead said, he could support.

Rep. Paul Washburn, R. Boise, said the legislature provided a very substantial increase last year and that while he wants strong state support for education "but this degree of funding is not this high."
But McHain spoke strongly for the bill. He said that relief for the local level is essential but that the money state officials must turn to local taxpayers.

Autonomous status sought

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, wants the Social Security Administration to be an autonomous agency outside the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Church has introduced legislation to set the agency up as an independent body to be governed by a three-member board appointed by the President and confirmed by the Senate.

"Americans," Church said, "have a vital stake in assuring that the integrity of the Social Security system is maintained. In one area after another, it affects the lives of almost every American family."

The Church legislation would also make the agency non-political and independent. He said the bill would prohibit the mailing of announcements with Social Security or supplemental security benefits checks which have any reference to public utility.

Church said in October, 1972, the Nixon administration sent an announcement with the first checks reflecting a 20 percent increase in benefits. The move, he said, implied that the President was responsible for the increase.

BSU funds questioned

BOISE (UPI)—The State University's proposed channel for the use of administrative revenue issued in 1967 into the modeling of administrative offices, the Lewiston Morning Tribune said today.

The paper quoted BSU Financial Vice President Roger Green as saying the transaction, involving \$400,000, had not been approved by the Board of Regents. It also said the legal statements of the \$4.4-million revenue bond sale—Green was not BSU at the time the action took place.

NEW YORK (UPI)—Stocks opened broadly higher in active trading on the New York Stock Exchange Tuesday.
