The fair officially starts Sept. 4 but department heads. will be on hand early Sept. 2 as exhibitors begin arriving to make their entries.

All livestock, except horses in open class, must be on the grounds by 6 p.m. that day. Fat animals will be weighed during the afternoon for the Fat Stock Show. Antique ntries must be in by moon and other department entries

TWIN FALLS - Harold O. Hove probably has more fun than anyone during the annual Twin Falls County .

He has served on the fair board for the past 11 years. including nine as president. and he still loves a fair.

Hove · traditionally proclaims every fair every year the "best-ever" and he says they are.

· Every year the Twin Falls County fair and rodgo grows and improves. In fact, he says, it's getting hard to squeeze the whole show into the fairgrounds and buildings.

Some improvements are made each year, he says, and this year extensive rewiring has been done.

The 1974 fair will be the last for Hove as president of the board. He is retiring from the board at the end of this year and the end of his present term. However, he says he will probably be back at the fairgrounds about this time everywear.

Hove says what makes the fairs so much fun is, "the people," No place else can you meet so many old friends and get acquainted with new friends such as roden producers, cowboys, owners and exhibitors of high quality livestock andyoungsters entering their 4-H and FFA projects.

The Twin Falls fair. Hove says, has attracted some-of-the top Hereford cattle and dalry and other. beef breeds to Filer that can be seen anywhere in

the nation.
The wonderful cooperation we have from all parts of our country, state and nation tells the secret of our continued growth and success. We are now spoken of as the outstanding county fair in the United States. Have ड्यार्ट

At fair time, Hove and other members of the lawboard, who all serve as volunteers, usually arrive at the grounds at 7 a.m. and are still there at midnight Sometimes they slip away for an hour or two to see if . their business is running properly, but they spend most of the week at the mirgrounds.



"If you don't have anything to do you're not paying any attention." he said. One month before this year's fair. Shouse said he had already begun to prepare for the 1975 county fair.

The preparations are for setting up new barns. With expanded livestock and horse shows this year, the barns are already needed. But now, the best that can be done is to prepare for next year's fair...

Infiation has gotten in the way of some planned changes. A main street running through the fairgrounds was to be paved this year. Estimated costs are in the \$11,000 range for the asphalt and inbor to pave the road. Shouse said. During an "ordinary year." he added, the paving cost would have been between \$5,000 and 96 000

certain breed of horse used for racing, a good barrel horse is one with agility, sound legs, and a level head, according to past barrel racer Mrs. Karen Jones, Filer.

She said a horse built with long welfmuscled hips adds to the speed and drive of the animal. Geldings are the most reliable and a good disposition is important, she said.

The traiging process is lengthy and can take several years. Jante Morton, barrel racer from Richfield, explained the beginning training process.

The first step is to walk the horse around the barrels, slopping at the positions where the horse should begin to make the turn.

Following the walking, if the trainer feels the pattern has been learned by the animal, it can be troited, loped, and, when the animal is far enough along and has, the pattern learned, speed can be added. The procedure can take up to eight months, depending on the horse.



Evel's life story told

TWIN FALLS - Evel Knievel began more than 25 years ago on the road which has led him to the edge of the Snake River Canyon, poised and ready

for his biggest lump ever In the mid-10's in Butte. Mont., a little boy-named Bobby Knievel-went to see stunt driver Joey Chitwood jump over a Cadillac at a local track. The act put a gleam in Bobby's eye, and he went home to try it himself

As Knievel tells it, in an article by Lawrence Linderman, "I went home and Liore off one of the garage doors and made a bulloff ramp out of it, and rode my bicycle off the edge. I called my younger brother and we talked it over and decided that I was pretty good and we were going to put on a show for the neighborhood kids, so we ripped the other garage door off and made a







State tax on his total income from the daredevil feat is likely to be much

According to Howard Johns auditor for the Idaho Tax Commission. Knievel will have to pay the usual 3 per cent tax rate of 75 cents on each \$25 ticket sold. Based on the planned 50,000 tickets, the sales tax will by \$37,500

Tax commission attorney Bob Miller said the state probably will tax a portion of Knievel's total income, including the millions be will receive from closed-circuit theatre

probably will tax Knievel based on ratio between the property, sales and persons employed in-state and outofstate

For instance, if the commission determines 50 take place in-state, then 50 per cent of Knievel's total income would be taxed, Milier said.

If Knievel files as an individual, all taxed income over \$10,000 would taxed at 7.5 per centwhile a tax on a Knievel corporation would be 6 per cent according to Larr Alder, chief auditor of


The action affects national resource lands between Interstate 80 north and the canyon and lands from the Hansen Bridge to approximately two miles west of U.S. Highway 93.

In early July, Peggy Greene, Twin Falls, the owner of Blue Lukes Trout Farm, and six of his employes, went up the rivor one day and found Skycycle N.1. The way they tell the story, it wasn't hard to find the machine, but getting the half-ton vehicle on the boat was another matter.

Greene and Rulon-Thompson of Jerome led the expedition up the river for the search. Using grappling hopks, they found the cycle in about

20 minutes.

The cycle was located about 100 feet downstream from the jump site toward the northside river bank. Greene said. Water depth was about 50 feet.

Fair leader Miller dies

FILER The 58th annual Twin Falls County Fair will be the first ever without Walter Miller, veteran superintendent of the horse division and long-time fair board frember.

Mr. Miller died July 12 at age 81 a few months after he retired from the fair board. He came to Filer in 1912 from Blinois and was one of the first residents of Filer to participate in the first Twin Falls County Fair.

That was in 1916 and Mr. Miller recalled that the exhibits were stup in tents. A horse lander, he exhibited his prize Belgian horses, in the first county fair and continued to show horses for many-years. By the third-annual fair, he had assumed the position of superintendent of the horse department.

He also judged horses in other fairs and shows in Blackfeet, Jathe Fails and exhibited in many large fairs and shows in the Northwest. In 1920, Mr. Miller took a carload of his registered Belgian horses to the Pacific International Exposition in Portland, Ore. There he wonty grand champion mare award, reserve champion stallion award and the top breeder award for having the best group of five entries from any one exhibitor.

Mr. Miller served as superintendent of the rapidly expanding horse department of the county fair for 45 years, changing hats in 1961 when he became a fair boardmember and relinquished the superintendent position.

... He served on the fair toard until early this year when he retired because of ill health.

At the time of his death, Mr. Miller still resided on the 120-acre farm near Filer where he settled on arriving in Idaho.

Entr-board members and guests paid tribute to him during the annual fair board dinner for the press and friedla Aug. 19. Chalrman Harold Hove caulted for a minute of silent tribute and a prayer for the veteran fair board member and superintendent.

He must ride for eight seconds and is disqualified for being bucked off o touching the animal with his free hand Saddle brone riding, the rodeo classic, has the least number of entries.

One reason for low number of entries is that a_ background of breaking rough horses seems a prime pre-requisite for a successful competitor;

another is that the newcomer has a much breaking into-the winner's circle due to the many one event specialists in professional rodeo.

There are cowboys who have started riding bareback brones or bulls in high school and cultive. and soured to the top in cases are few when a contestant can bounce into the limelight in saddle brone riding if he hasn't had a solid foundation of riding rank, unbroken

Another difficulty is the saddle Itself Many cowboys have a healthy fear of being hung up in a stirrup:

The wild spurring anties cowboys use in bareback brone riding often confuse spectators.

The ride who develops a rhythm, and can "jerk his knees," often is doing the body against his riding hand.-With nothing but a hand.—With nothing but a bareback riggling which has a bandle similar to that on a suitcase, cowhoys have a problem staying on the twisting, explosive horses.

Judges look for the difficult, horse and the cowboy who is in command. The split second that a rider allows his seat to be thrown back from his riding hand tuenoffs foreshadows a launching; the further back he moves-and the straighter his arm is pulled—the more helpless he is

Lipizzán horses People who were fortunate enough to see the trained horses at their recent performance in Pocatello, or at the Expo 74 in Spokane, will welcome another chance to view

Ostermaler was trained r to be a top dressage horseman by his father, at member of the Spanish Riding School in Vienna. Austria. He has carried on the family tradition of Training Lipizzan horses, symbol of the powerful stria-Hungarian empire. which faded after World War L

He not only trains and rides his Lipizziin horses but also the beautiful Andaluzian horses of Southern Spain.

Lapizzan horses are schooled in dressage, maneuvers, fused when wars were. Toughty on horseback, Dressage talls upon the animal to strike out with his forelegs while kicking back with the rear legs at the same time.

Andaluzian horses were bred and trained for the great bull rings in Southern Spain. Their training developed a side-stepping motion which gives them the appearance of dancing Through skilled training. the two breeds have earned the title "The Dancing White Stallions."

Lipizzaner horses are born dark in color and slowly turn white. Training begins when they are four years old. Slow to mature. they are a very hardy, breed, and live to 25 to 35

years of age. Some

the age of 32. A little known fact is that traditionally, or perhaps bay Lipizzaner stallion is always kept at the Spanish Riding School, as the only time there has not been a black or bay at the school, tragedy has fallen upon Austria.

In 1945 during World War TI the United States Army was directed by General George Patton to rescue the school horses and its faimed art treasures. The grateful Austrian government gave to General Patton six mares and two stallions which

were brought to the Unite States Ostermaier's fin Lipizzaner stallions is grandson of one of thes horses presented to General Patton

Ostermaler had one of his famous Lipizzaner stallions were chosen by the Austrian government to represent the Spanish Riding School on its 400th anniversary. He and his Lipizzaner were the first in America to receive the

The transfer will bring both Lipizzan and Andalyzian horses for performances during all four days of the fair and rodeo.
