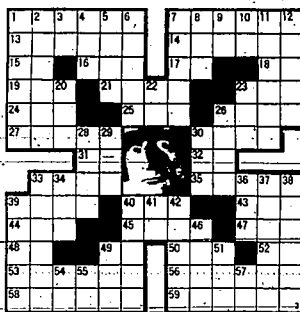

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# Biker drops in Daytime television schedule

MADISON, Wis. (UPI)—America, to black American Lowell White, "is like my home. Each state is a room in my home."

"I've been visiting those rooms in my home to see how things are."

He has ridden a 10-speed bicycle 4,100 miles through mountains, desert, farmland and cities.

He lives on raw eggs, cereal, honey, fruits and vegetables.

"People have been wonderful. Like beautiful," White, 34, from Pacoima, Calif., stopped in Madison Friday on his second bicycle trip across the country on behalf of the Boys' Clubs of America.

"Youth is our future and they need direction and guidance," said the father of two children who is a student at California State University at Northridge.

He also earns his keep. "In Harlan, Iowa, I put in fence posts for the city. I've unloaded trucks for grocery stores. In Colorado, I did some landscaping for a radio station. I cut lawns in Utah."

White started his first transcontinental trek from New York last Sept. 6 and it took him 10 weeks to reach his California home. He left the Los Angeles area again June 5 for a return trip to New York via Galesburg, Green Bay, Michigan and the Montreal Olympics.

He stops at Boys' Clubs along the way "to talk to the kids" and sleeps anywhere he can. Sometimes—in jails—"by my choice"—because jails

provide the cheapest available bed in a bind. And law enforcement officials, impressed with the 5-foot-11, 150-pound White, were happy to offer him a night's lodging.

# Modern cowboy tells his tale

FILER — Modern cowboys are more likely to sleep in buses and camper trailers than under the stars with a bedroll. Today's cowboys are often college educated and sometimes college-trained in the art of rodeo.

They travel by plane and automobile throughout the year on the professional rodeo circuit.

They have a hard time making a living on their profession. Many others struggle along, learning the ropes before they go bust.

Because he has a knack for staying artfully on top of bareback broncs, Joe Alexander has stayed on top of world rodeo

bareback competition five of the last six years.

"The first year I ended up fifth," Joe, nicknamed "Alfie" or "the Great," in rodeo circles, said. "I've been on top ever since."

Alexander started rodeo competition at Casper College, Casper, Wyo., while still a student and began his professional career after graduating with a B.S. in Animal Science from the University of Wyoming in 1970.

He said he thought it unfair to weigh the championship on the outcome of a single contest when a top money winner must attend so many rodeos to hit the top.

"In bareback you have the World Series," Alexander said. "You have seven games to decide the championship."

Other cowboys are unhappy with the changes in the rules this year, according to Cotton Fosser, of Flying U Rodeo.

But Alexander said he will go along with the change.

"I suppose it will have some benefits," Alexander said. "It brings more revenue, it will be good."

"I'll try it. It might work out," he added.

"If the purse puts up to about \$2,000 a go-round, I'll like it."

Alexander has good reasons to like just about anything about rodeo.

He usually wins.

"I won the one in Filer last year," he said of the Twin Falls County Fair and Rodeo. "I had a horse called 'The Game.' He has probably had more money made off his back than any other horse in the history of the sport."

Alexander explained the kind of horse a cowboy likes to get on top of the event is one that will just jump and kick.

"With his timing and your timing you can make a show ride," Alexander elaborated.

"But if he ducks this way and that way, it is hard for a cowboy to show his ability."

According to Alexander, the horse represents 20 per cent of a cowboy's score in the eyes of the judges.

"There are two judges," Alexander explained. "They judge the horse from one to 25 and the cowboy from one to 25."

He said there is a judge on each side of the arena and they each judge the sale of the rider they can see.

"The judges should be pretty close on the animal," he said, because it does essentially

the same with both sides of its body.

"But the cowboy might ride better on one side than the other," he added.

Alexander said he expected a lot of good competition at the Twin Falls County Fair.

He cited Italian-Roy Smith, of Challis who is in the third slot for total winnings as one of the better cowboys expected to be present.

"There will probably be five or six out of the top 15 in bareback at Filer," Alexander predicted.

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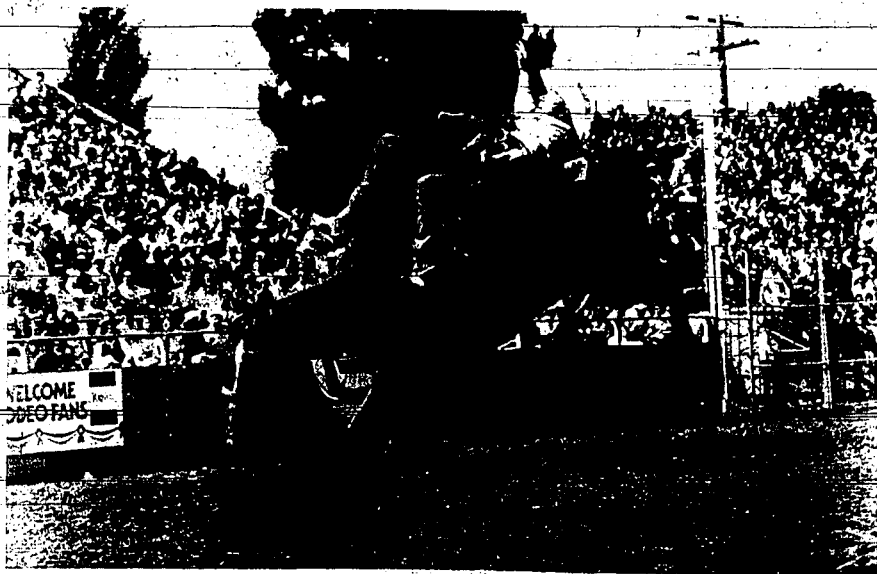

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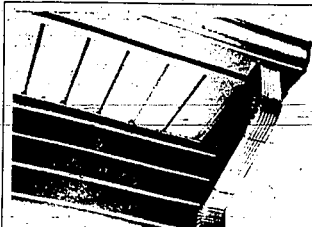
