



Justices all in good health

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Supreme Court opens its new term Monday with all nine justlees in seemingly good health for the first time since

1974.

Last October, William Douglas was straining gallantly to remain on the bench despite the importing effects of a stroke which paralyzed part of his felt side.

Douglas resigned in late Nauember because of what he called "incressant pain." but his seat was not filled by John Paul Stevens until the following January, nearly half way through the term.

Thurgood Marshall. 68, suffered a heart at fack shortly before the end of the last term in July. His health has been a question mark for several years, but he always denies thoughts of retirement and returned to his chambers in August apparently recovered from his latest—titleses—

August apparently recovered from his latest illness.
While the court often is conveniently divided into "liberal" and "conservatives," only four justices are predictable enough to deserve the labels. The remaining five, while helping to trim-criminal right-accorded by the court in decodeago, are less likely to vote as a bloc in other areas of the law.

Nevertheless, there is no doubt the Supreme Colurt of today is more castly able to gather a majority in the name of judicial restraint than in the 1960s.

For court-watchers, the two most interesting justices this term could be the youngest—William Relinquist, 52— and the newest—Stevens, 56.

Rehnquist, who by every available measure is the most conservative man on the court assumed an active leadership role tast term. He

was with the majority in nearly two-thirds of the decided cases.

Although still a dissenter from key rulings on issues such as school desegregation and abortion, he wrote majority decisions withet skielded police departments from broadscate miscondect charges and relaxed press safeguards against their suits. Relanguist is reported to present his positions vigorously in the weekly conferences during which the court votes on its rulings and assigns the writing of opinions: the atoo it arrapid opinion writer and, unlike colleagues flarry Blackmut and Chief Justice Warren E. Burger, is not a bottleneck.

Aside from Reinquist-Burger, 69-5s. the most-consistently conservative member of the equir. He writes relatively few opinions, partly hecause he serves the dual role of justice and the nation's top administrator. Burger can be expected to keep pressing for higher judicial salaries to bottleneck.

Once a plant is placed in the less favorable environment of the home, office or public building, the need for fertilizers is considerably reduced. That's why we recommend scraping off the granules of these "slow-release" fertilizers when you see them in newly purchased plants. For much fertilizer in combination, with how light will make the growth soft or splindly. Also, there are white tand-roundish particles called perlite which is used to make the soil mixture higher and better. These are harmless and should be left in the soil. Don't confuse perlite with slow-release fertilizer particles.



Windowless: 'You can't tell night from day'

TWIN FALLS — Peeping Toms beware ... a new building trend in the Magic Valley may put you out of business.

Increasingly more buildings are adds. being built with very few or no windows, and odds are the trend shoul will continue.

From the Hamilton Building on Shoshone Street, built in 1971, to the new police station, now under construction, windowless and semiwindowless buildings are taking

Richard Heindel, the architect who designed the Hamilton Building for Lloyd Hamilton, building owner, says he thinks a national trend toward buildings with fewer windows has begun.

Part of the reason for this isbuildings with fewer windows savethe consumer money in heat and cooling bills, he says. The savings far outweigh the loss in extralighting-headds.

Another reason windowless buildings have begun to take hold is because some functions of those buildings may warrant the lack of windows, Heindel says.

For instance, the new police building and courthouse addition are being constructed with few windows for security, Helndel says.

Also, courtrooms are now constructed without windows so that there is less chance that a jury will be distracted from a trial, Heindel adds.

"If a person is busy at his job, it shouldn't concern the individual

that much, "Heindel says.

But he admits, some persons, particularly those who suffer from claustrophobia, may not be able to work well in windowless buildings, but notes the use of colorfulmaterials in construction, maps, murals and warm colors on indoorwalls can help make a dull windowless room more interesting.

Persons who work in Magic Valley buildings with very few windows disagree on how those windowless—and—semi-windowlessrooms affect them.

Some feel confined, shut in and afflicted with a feeling of being smothered, somewhat like claustrophobia. Others say, however, the fewer the windows the easier it is for them to concentrate.

Barry Hamilton, a certified public accountant, works in a windowless office in the Hamilton

Building on Shoshone Street

"I like it for two_reasons," he says. "It's been my experience that-I used to spend a bunch of my time watching women, cars that go by and stuff like that instead of concentrating on what's been going on at the deek."

With no windows to look outfrom, Hamilton-says-he-can-concentrate more.

Hamilton's second reason for liking the windowless office is a bit more subtle. When he used to work in buildings with windows, Hamilton says he noticed the difference between day and night-more than he does now.

As a result of his switch, Hamilton says, "It's not as depressing working at night-time because you get the same feeling asyou would during the day."

Others, however, dislike windowless rooms for the same reasons Hamilton likes them.

"T think that it you've been inthem awhile you lose a little contact with the outside world," says Dr. Robert A. Ridgeway, an orthodontist who maintains a windowless office in the Hamilton Building.

"I've been here three years, and

it bothers me that I can't tell what the weather is =...if the sun-is shining or it's pouring rain. I have to get reports from my friends and others who come in the office."

Ridgeway's receptionist and assistant, Teri Spann, Twin Falls, adds-a-simpler reason why she dislikes windowless buildings:


"The plants don't do very well."
Shirley. Welzstein, a secretary in the windowless Burley police department which is located in the basement of the recently constructed Law Enforcement Building there, says she doesn't like working in a windowless office

"I don't like to be in a closed room," she says. "It gives me a smothery type of feeling."

She says she gets the same type of feeling when her family goes camping in a camper.

Despite this claustrophobia-like feeling, Wetzstein says the office is "a nice room and cheerful-looking."

Other windowless and semiwindowless buildings in the Twin Falls area include an addition to Sawtooth Elementary School, the Times-News building, and the addition to the Twin Falls courthouse, under construction.






