Police reveal sex offense record

Suspected kidnapper served time in prison

UKIAH, Callf. (1P1).— A drilfer. who kidnapped (wo bows was identified Monday as a sex offender who served a term in San Quentin Prison.

One of the two boys was abducted seven years ago; the other on Feb. 14. Both were kept in one-room shack on a coastal ranch.

A spokesman for the state Department of Corrections in Sucramento said-Kenneth E-Parnell, 48, was arrested in-1951 in Bakersfield, Callf., for taking an 8-year-old boy to a remote canyon and committing sex acts upon him. The boy was released in his neighborhood by the abductor.

Parnell, who never stayed in one place long and fived in several northern Callfornia communities in the past few years, was sent to the Norwalk State Hospital for observation and escaped twice, Department spokesman Phil Cuthrie said.

Parnell-was-working as a hutter cierk in Ukiah at the time of his arrest and living rent-free in a shack on ranch where he was a caretaker. He was convicted on sex formed in 1955, but creamed the next year for violating the terms of his release.

In 1956, Guthrie said, he was again paroled and eventually discharged in May 1959.

Steven Stayner, 14, and 8-year-old Timmy, White walked-into Ukiah Saturday night and disclosed the bizarre circumstances of their kidnappings. Steven disappeared from his hometown of Merced seven, years ago, and Timmle vanished on Valentine's Day.

BOISE — In less time than it takes to open a dirty book, the Idaho House Monday voted to restrict the location of stores selling pornography and obscene materials.

On-a-59-19-wide, which-came-after-less than three minutes of discussion, representatives approved Senate Bill 1253. That measure prevents the location of any store which sells or rents obscene milerials within 2,500-rootsing.

The measure, which had already passed the Senate, now goes to the governor.

Police performance

Police officers seldom get a pat on the back, but one is, due the Twin Falls department based on its general performance In 1979.

The statistics on crime and Faffic accidents were released recently and in both categories. Twin Falls police did an admirable job. Performance levels held steady and even improved in some areas indicating the level of professionalism—and—skill_of-the_department—remains high.

It's true that crime continues to escalate in Twin Falls (up 108 cases in 1979) and the police clearance rate dropped 2 percent compared to the previous year. But in most crime categories the Twin Falls force has higher clearance rates than the national average.

Rising crime rates, however, should be of immediate concern to city council and citizens. Specifically, robberies, burglaries, auto burglaries and juvenile crime are on the increase. The latter is of particular importance and is another reason we support maintaining a police officer in the schools.

Although—twin Falls can—point—to—a better-than-average performance on clearing crimes, the police department's budget is

ter-than-average performance on clearing crimes, the police department's budget is

going to have to keep paye with the demand. If the full impact-of-t-percent comes to pass, it's not going to be easy. In the traffic division, a beefed-up program produced some excellent results in 1979.

The department added a car, two men and a radar unit with the result that: traffic arrests more than doubled, the number of speeders mabbed jumped three-fold and the-fold number of traffic accidents in the city decreased by 234 and fewer people were injured.

Unfortunately, the city recorded five fatalities—in—1979—(none—in—1978)—and-drunk drivers caused more accidents than the previous year. Based on these statistics and others, it appears motorists are showing little heed for slowing down and observing traffic

Department statistics also revealed that your best chance of being involved in an accident is on a Friday, between 4 and 8 p.m. Although problems remain, the Twin Falls lorce deserves cream for its overall vigorous

performance in 1979, and encouragement and support to continue its efforts.

WWP asks dual rate hike

SPOKANE (UPI)—Washington Water Power President Wendell Satre announced today that WWP is seeking a 40 per cent increase in electricity rates and a four pe cent like in natural gas rates.

The electricity package would total \$52.5 million, according to Satre, who noted in a news conference that the utility-was getting into a financial bind with double-digit inflation and the rising cost of doing business.

double-digit inflation and the rising cost of doing business.

Satre said the proposed rate increase has a new wrinkle, designed to encourage new customers away from electricity and old-electrical customers to conserve.

Those who use 600 kilowatt hours or less per month will experience an increase of 9.6 per cent or less. Those over that figure will have to pay between 9.5 per cent and 50 per cent maper than the present cost. The WWP says the awtrage user will experience a 44 per cent increase, however, from an estimated 318.06 to \$27.26 per month.

The WWP also asked for interim relief from the Washington, Utilities Commission on the request, meaning the utility would like a partial increase now. The commission has eleven months to act on the increase request.
