WASHINGTON (UPI) — Police, working through the night, found no-evidence Republican National Committee co-chairman Mary Crisp's of fife was bugged Sunday the wires that set off the search were used for background music. WASHINGTON (UPI) — A proposed government agency designed to spur the nation onto the "fast track" in the energy battle is too weak. That's the opinion of a man who helped mobilize the United States to win World War II.

The Energy Mobilization Board, nearing approval in Congress, tacks the clout to focus the country's fragmented energy policy, says Robert Nathan, who chaired the planning arm of the powerful War Production Board.

The new energy board, as currently envisioned, is supposed to put energy projects on a "fast track" by removing procedural barriers and cutting the red tape slowing projects such as pipelines and coal conversion plants.

But, Nathan said, the administra-ion and Congress apparently failed to rasp what he and others were sug-

"They made the Energy Mobiliza-tion Board into nothing more than an expediting arm of the Synthetic Fuels Corp. "he said." | wanted it to deal. with goals and policy — not to be just a low-level body."

Nathan's contempt for the present plan is shared by corporate officials and environmentalists as well, al-though their reasons vary.

Present outlines call for the board to have the power to set aside new state and federal environmental laws, and recommend changes in current laws to Congress.

Nathan said it may take "another major crisis" before the United States seriously, confronts its energy proseriously confronts its energy blem, which he views as the gr threat to national security.

"You-don't-mobilize for hostilities without-energy," he said. "If we learned anything in World War II it was that energy is essential."

"This withdrawal, if confirmed, will have to be permanent and continue until the complete withdrawal of the Soviet troops," said the declaration, read-to reporters by Tilalian Prime Minister Prancesco Cossigo.

It said only a total withdrawal would—"re-establish-a situation-compatible with peace and the rule of law and the reby with the interests of all nations."



As Twin Falls officials told the Homebulders Association of Magic Valley last week, taking on more territory to serve doesn't make sense under the 1 percent

Police and fire protection, sewer and water services, and street maintenance don't come cheap. Trying to serve more homes and property with the same dollars just weakens present services even more. Nobody wins. Putting a moratorium on annexations, something the city of Twin Falls is considering, appears to be a smart move. That way nobody-will be playing favorites.

Residents not in the city could still hook onto sewer and water lines at double the normal.

The homebuilders — real estate brokers, mortgage companies and banks, title companies, construction contractors, and others who make money on new homes — know the value of city services.

For example, the Federal Housing Administration and Veterans Administration require homes to have them before they will issue guanranteed loans to buyers.

The threat of a moratorium has the already recessed home industry in Twin Falls worried, but they are not worried enough as a group to press the Legislature to give cities a better break under the 1 percent law.

## Foundation prepared for U.S. reaction force

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The first 100 days of planning and training for the new Rapid Deployment Force have laid the foundation for landing 50,000 fighting men in a two-week period to meet a threat to the Persian Gulf or Middle East.

Marine Li. Gen. Paul X. Kelley, RDF cammander, says he now sees a four-service mobile group numbering up to 100,000 active servicemen and 100,000 reserves, twice the number of reserves the president is currently empowered to call up.

Kelley, whose new command is at MacDill Air Force Base outside Tampa, Fla, told a Pentagon news. briefing the air and sea lifted force

The force would be composed of the most talented members of the Army, Air Force, Navy and Marines, he said, and could be deployed abroad by air or ship.


## Soviets vulnerable, too







The "signature" is comprised or seismic signals that preceded the June 12 cruption that dusted the Portland-Vancouver area with volcanic ash and similar to those recorded just before the May 25 cruption, goophysicists said.

But the massive May 18 blast that lopped 1,300 feet or the top of the 9,677-toot peak still is considered to have occurred without any immediate warning, seismic or otherwise. More than 80 people may have died that day in the area devastated by the explosion.

The only visible signs of activity from the once-picturesque mountain Sunday were plumes of steam that drifted from the crater to about 9,800 feed to be seen. "We think the mountain and the properties of the cophysicists, however, seemed more interested Sunday in what could not be seen. "We think the mountain may be giving us its signature-for-these ash erruptions," Craig Weaver of the U.S. Geological Survey said.

"If a shock wave had caused the devastation near the mountain, such as the blown down trees, it should have shattered windows out to 20 or 30 miles, and this didn't happen," he said. "It should have dented tin cans, and this didn't happen either."

One possible explanation of the force that tore up the country north of the mountain, he said, was a sudden release of gases that had been compressed in the magma, or molten rock, causing a great wind that carried crushed rock out of the crater.

Rosenbaum said he believes such a particle-laden cloud could abrade anything in its path and that might explain the destruction north of the mountain.

He said on exposed ridges closest to the mountain, trees, stumps and soil were removed, leaving only solid rock: Farther from the mountain, trees were snapped off at the ground and bark was stripped from the trunks.

Still farther away, trees were up-rooted, or just topped, as the force lessened: Bark was stripped from the side facing the mountain and un-touched on the other side.





## McCovey puts end USE IT to popular career at San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Willie McCovey of the San Francisco Glants, the leading left-handed home frun hitter in National League history, announced his retirement from baseball Sunday after 22 seasons.

oaseonii Sunday after 22 seasons.

The \_42-year-old \_McCovey's - rethrement will be effective July 10 and
he has asked the National League to
place him on the voluntary retired
list. McCovey, who has a 10-year
personal services contract with the
Giants, will stay on with the club as a
battling instructor and public relations
director.

McCovey had planned on retiring at the end of this season but said his decision was hastened by the fine play, of rookle Rich Murray, whom the Glants recently brought up from the milnors to replace injured Mike Ivie at first base.

"The decision is something I've been thinking about all season," said McCovey, "I said some day a phenom would come along who would move me aside. Well, that phenom, Rich Murray, has arrived.

"I'm just happy I lasted as long as I did and that I managed to accomplish a lot of things in my career."

During his career, McCovey belted 521 home runs, tying him with Ted E-Williams for eighth place on the all-time list. This season McCovey had participated in only 41 games and was batting just 198 with one home run and 13 RBI.

The Giants plan on retiring his number, 44, when they hold a special day for the big first baseman later this season.

Possibly the most popular player

ever to wear a San Francisco Giants' uniform, McCovey made an instant impact on the National League when he had four hils, including two triples, in his major league debut on July 30, 1959. He went on to hit 334 and was named, the NL's Rookie of the Yearthat season despite appearing only 52 games.

McCovey went on to become one of the most feared sluggers in the league, and was selected to the All-Star team six times. In 1969 he was named the NL's Most Valuable-Player after hit-ting .325 and leading the league in home runs (45) and runs batted in (126).

Seven times during his career he hit more than 30 homers in a season and his 18 career grand slams is a NL record. McCovey also is the only player in major league history to hit two home runs in the same inning twice in his career.

McCovey, one of only eight players.


