Israel defled a sharply worded U.S. demand Thursday to withdraw its troops immediately from west Beirut and said it controlled the Moslem sector, crushing resistance in a final 7-hour armored assault that left dozens dead. The Israeli Cabinet, in an urgent session, said it would not pull out until "the Lebanese army is ready to assume" responsibility for maintaining order.—A U.N.-resolution also demanding an Israeli-pullout was under deliberation by the Security Council.

Lebanese millitary sources said fighting ended as night fell, although the leftist Voice of Arab Lebanon radio said the lull was not the result of a cease-fire.
Lebanese-Primo-Minister-Chelik-Wazzan-appealed to President Reagan to help save his capital, and President Elias Sarkis sent a separate message denouncing the invasion.
"The responsibility of America is great; and

we and the world are waiting," Wazzan said.



# Democrats prevail in battle on \$1 billion jobs program

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The House passed a Demo-cratte \$1 billion public service jobs program Thursday, branded an election-year "hoax" by its Republican

The Republican amendment would have provided \$1.5 billion along with more restrictions than the Democratic plan. Republicans said their bill would provide twice as many jobs at half the cost, but-Democratic-leader-Jim Wright of Texas dismissed that as an "extrayagant claim."

Rep. Silvio Conte, R-Mass., denounced both plans, saying they would just "pour corn down a rathole."

A confident Speaker Thomas O'Neili earlier predicted easy passage and said support for the Democrate' supplemental funding bill was "overwhelming."

The bill, facing an uncertain future in the GOP-controlled Senato-assault-garder 200,000 temporary tobs for the unemployed in repairing and maintaining bridges and roads and other public facilities, including conservation and energy-saving activities.

About 140,000 of the jobs are earmarked for adults, with the remainder for those ages 16-21.

As debate got under way, Rep. John Rhodes, R-Ariz., said the bill "mainly is aimed at helping people who are

running in the election in November."

He called it 'a hoax that will lead the unemployed of the country to believe this Congress has done something for them when in reality it has not done anything."

Assistant Republican leader Trent Lott, R-Miss., called it a 'billion-dollar bailoit box hallout bill.

Lott acknowledged the political risks of opposing the bill, saying a 'no' void "might be misconstrued as anti-jobs."

Republicans revealed an alternative \$1.5 billion plan with the money coming from the synthetic fuels program a move certain to draw Democratic opposition.

Defending the Democratic bill, Rep., David Bonior, DMich., said, "IFOR 200,000 people-who-don't-have-jobs, who don't have hope... this is not a hoax."





WASHINGTON — Back in the days when high school students were put to memorizing Shakespeare, many of us learned to recite a seene from King Henry IV. Part I. The scene came to mind the other day in contemplating the frustrations of Ronald Rengan.

As Act III opens, Owen Glendower is boasting of his magical powers, "The earth did shake when I was born," His companions keep putting him down. Finally, Glendower brage," I can call spirits from the vasty deep."

"Why, so can I," says the young prince, "or so can any man; but will they come when you do call for them?"

The Hotspur question still rings with all its old sandonic overtones, in the matter of the Soviet pipeline, Mr. Reagan called upon our best friends in Europe, notably France and Britain, to hall the shipment of American Lechnology to the Russians. Would they come

when he did call for them? No way.

In the week after that flasco, the president called again, He called upon Israel to haif its settlements in Gaza and the West Bank. He called upon other Arab nations to join Figoria recognizing the reality of Israel. He called upon dordan and he called upon the Palestinians. He would call these spirits from the Mideast's vasty deep, But no one came when he did call for them.

"It was a frustrating time: The headline writers turned happily to the verb "dety." which fits nicely in a one-column head: "France Defice Reagan Demand." England defied. Even Italy defied: On the analy after the president's speech, the Israeli Cabinet ganged up in a bristling statement of rejection: "There shall be no settlement freeze. We shall continue to establish them in accordance with our natural right." The following week we watched on TV as buildozers pushed aside the

sands of Gaza.

In issuing these clari-in calls, and getting nothing but raspberries in return, Mr. Reagan-violated an ancient precept. Spenser told the tale of the lady Britomart, who set out to rescue a fair damsel fron an enchanted castle. She finds an Iron door over which was writ. "Be bold, be oold, and everywhere be bold." Then she spies another door of Iron, on which was writ, "Be not (so bold." Boldness has its uses; it has its drawbacks too.

By mid-morning, seven people had been chosen as tentative jury members. However, those people may be disqualified later if the prosecutor and defense attorney exercise their right to "perempto-ry challenges."

Lodge Thursday reiterated his demand that defense attorneys speed up their questioning of prospective members for the 12-person panel.
