The roll call went generally along party lines, with only 18 Republicans voting with the Democratic majority. The amendment to the intelligence authorization bill is identical to a bill that was approved by the House, 228-195, in July but Ignored by the Republican-controlled Senate. The latest yote ensures that the issue will be dealt with by a House-Senate conference committee.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said: "The vote today was not unexpected. We knew it would be a difficult vote. We think we will do well in the Senate. We think our position will be upheld in the Senate and we hope our differences will be worked out in conference."

### Senators help Hansen's fund

WASHINGTON — Idaho Senator Steve Symms has joined with other conservative Republican senators in a fund-raising effort aimed at boistering Idaho Congressman George Hansen's legal defense fund.

Hansen, who was indicted last spring by a federal grand juy on four counts of filing false-financial disclosure reports, is mounting a legal challenge to those charges, being brought against him by the U.S. Department of Justice in Washington D.C. sijstriet sourt. The silos were not fitted with protective liners, state and federal officials say, adding tests have not been completed to determine whether the structures are leaking.

Retired Li. Col. Oscar Hermann said Thursday the design of the abandoned Titan Missile silos near Bruneau and Grand View in Southern Idaho leads him to believe chemicals-stored Inside are seeping through scalant at the bases of the 160-foot-deep structures.

Hermann—of-Bolse—and—former—Magle—Valley subcontractor Dick Stapleman, said, they believe leakage from the silos and an-artesian, well at Grand View may be creating

a pool under the missile complex that could seep through the earth toward nearby ranches and drinking water sources.

### Prison suits could end in state losing control

BOISE — Idaho's prison system is in danger of being placed under the supervision of a tederal court to relieve overcrowding, state Correc-tions Director Al Murphy sald

tions Director Al Murphy said
Thursday.
"Thirty-two states are under
court-ordered conditions, and I think
it's a real danger that Idaho soon
might be one of these." Murphy said
At a meeting of the state Corrections Board, Murphy said the state
could lose at least four of the more
than 50 lawsuits filed over the past
few years by prisoners alleging Idaho
State Penitentiary immates are being
subjected to unconstitutional conditions.

but when the judge looks at everything, we might have some real problems," he said.

A lawsuit flied by three inmates last
month alleges Murphy and two otherprison officials have systematically
violated prisoner's rights.

The prisoners are seeking damages
of \$15,000 for each inmate and court
orders compelling state officials to
reduce overcrowding and discontinue
allegedly unconstitutional practices
caused by packing the prison.

Hall said it is inevitable that Idaho's prisons will be placed under court supervision. "These lawsuits are not going to go away until we rentove the basic problems of overcrowding." Hall said, "All 50 states will probably be under court order someday."

Murphy said Idaho could face the same problems as Oklahoma, where he supervised a maximum-security prison before taking over the Idaho Corrections Department earlier this year.

Caribbean island, 90 miles north of Venezuela, after Bishop, three ministers and two union officials were killed by government troops.

In Washington, a sender U.S. official said the administration is concerned that the Cuban government may have been behind the coup. "We have mounting evidence" of Cuban -involvement, the sendor official said.

On Capitol Hill, Secretary of State Shultz met in private with kine Senate, Foreign Relations Committee to discuss the events in Grenada.


Last Thursday, state-owned Radio Pree Grenada announced that Deputy Prime Minister Bernard Coard and deposed Bishop and placed him under house arrest.

Western diplomatis said Coard, a hard-line Marxist ideologue, with strong Cuban ties, was runaing Grenada behind the screen of the military council, designed to shield him from public outrage over the death of the charismatic Bishop.

#### Soviet says arms talks useless

Geneva, switzerland (UPI) — The chief Soviet delegate at talks with the 'United States to 'limit medium-range unclear missiles in Europe hinted again Thursday the Soviets might walk out, saying he sees no chance for agreement.

Yuli Kvitsinsky issued the gloomy assessment before a session of the intermediate Nuclear Forces talks—the 97th since the negotiations on limiting medium-range missiles began Nov. 30, 1981.

Kvitsinsky said the Soviets are prepared to stay at the negotiating-table to find an accord 'us. long as it is necessary and if there are prospects; but there are none."

The comment implied a renewed threat by Moscow to break off the negotiations, but after the two-hour plenary session the delegations agreed to meet again next Thready on schedule at the Soviet mission.

#### Russia pushing civil defense

Russia pushing civil defense

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Soviets apparently are mass producing child-size gas masks and a portable protection chamber for bables in the event of the use of 'weapons of mass destruction' in war, a research organization said 'Thursday.

The Advanced international Studies Institute, associated with the University of Miami, reproduced filustrations from an article in the September issue of Voennye Zanafa (military knowledge), a monthly journal on Soviet civil defense.

"Described are special respirators and five different types of gas masks, each in a range of sizes, including a specially designed mask for toddlers which cannot be removed by the child," the Institute said.

The Blustrations also showed a "baby protective chamber" which can be carried, with the baby inside, suspended by a strap over the mother's shoulder or placed on a carriage.

#### Rebels stage largest offensive

PANTASMA, Nicaragua (UPI) — Hundreds of anti-Sandinista rebels stormed the northern town of Pantasma, killing 46 people and setting several buildings, ablince in a dawn assault officials described Thursday as the rebels "worst blow be date." Officials assessing the damage of the attack Tuesday and stifting through several gutted buildings 132 miles north of Managua estimated damage at more than \$2 million.

Among the dead were 11 peasants who belonged to a farmers cooperative, they said.

"This is the worst blow suffered to date in Nicaragua by any town," said Cmdr. Manuel Salvatterra, army chief of staff for the region.

Salvatterra said 100 to 200 rebels of the U.S.-backed Nicaraguan Democratic Force attacked Pantasma, a town of about 1,000 people in Jinotega province, at dawn Tuesday.



specialist for the society.

Wilderness Society officials also noted the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act President Carter ard his Interior secretary, Ceeli Andrus - created 27 million acress of new national parks spread across the Alaskan Indicagne.

The land added today to the Artelic Astional Wildlife Refuge refuge is a key wildlife habitat particularly for a 100,000-aminal porcupine carlboo herd, which crosses the area during migration from cading grounds in the north to southern wintering areas in Canada.

From what we can tell, the school proposal may have broader support in the community than the gymnasium remodeling, perhaps because it is perceived as a clear "educational"—improvement: That—argument was advanced last spring when the combined school and a somewhat more elaborate gym proposal were narrowly defeated by Twin Falls voters.

This time, we hope, the separation of the issues on the ballot will contribute to the passage of one or both.—The school proposal is essentially the same concept as was proposed in April. It would be a 25-classroom facility constructed on land the district already owns adjacent to Robert Stuart Junior High School. The site would facilitate joint busing routes with the junior high, thus saving money in transportation costs.

Cost savings have been designed into the plans in other ways. The building would employ advanced passive solar technology to save energy and could be retrofitted later for geothermal heat. From an engineering perspective, the plan appears to be a sound, efficient one from an architrectural firm. Design West,—which has-considerable-experience—in school design and construction.

The need for the elementary school has grown worse since last spring, not better. During the past few years, about 100 additional children a year have been flooding—into the district. That trend continued this fall.

The newest elementary school in town, Sawtooth, was built nearly a decade ago. It is rapidly filling up, and conditions at the other elementary school as grown worse since last spring, not better.
