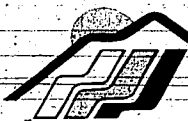

Nicaragua admits blasting chopper

MANAGUA, Nicaragua — The leftist Sandinista government acknowledged that its troops shot down a U.S. Army helicopter and said it "deplores the incident," but blamed it on the U.S. military presence in Central America.

The Pentagon said the United States made an official protest, holding Nicaragua responsible for the death of the pilot. President Reagan expressed deep outrage, but U.S. officials stated that any military retaliation was likely.

Nicaragua's statement, issued late Wednesday, said the troops shot at a military

helicopter that was inside Nicaraguan territory, but it carefully avoided any admission that the Nicaraguans had killed the American.

Officials in Washington and at the U.S. Embassy in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, said the pilot, Chief Warrant Officer II Jeffrey C. Schwab, 37, of Joliet, Ill., was killed by "hostile fire" from Nicaragua after his helicopter made a forced landing Wednesday about 200 yards from the border — inside Honduras.

Government sources in Washington, who spoke on condition they not be named, said the helicopter was "blown off course" by a windstorm that pushed it near the Nicaraguan border.

President Reagan's spokesman Larry

Speakers denounced the attack on Schwab as "reckless and unprovoked" Thursday, and key presidential aides met to draft the U.S. response, which sources said could include possible military retaliation.

The official Cuban news agency, Prensa Latina, said the death of the helicopter pilot "could be the pretext yearned for by the Reagan administration to increase its aggression against Nicaragua."

The Nicaraguan statement expressed hope that the incident will "not be used as an excuse to worsen the already critical situation in Central America."

"The government of Nicaragua," having received the official communication from the U.S. government, "deplores this incident and

expresses its condolences to the family of the dead pilot," the statement said.

It added that the Managua government was "aware of the seriousness" of the matter, and "hopes that this event is a direct result of the U.S. military presence in the area, is the last in which blood of U.S. soldiers is spilled on Central American soil."

The Sandinistas again criticized the Reagan administration for its support of Nicaraguan rebels, based in Honduras, but avoided the anti-American rhetoric that has been usual since the leftists took power in 1979.

Nicaragua's ambassador to Canada denied that Nicaraguan soldiers fired on the helicopter after it landed.

The ambassador, Custodio Sotelo, told re-

porters at a news conference in Ottawa that the helicopter was fired upon as it "deliberately overflew" military installations inside Nicaragua on a mission to create a reason for an invasion.

Sotelo claimed that in 1982, there were 275 documented violations of Nicaragua's airspace from Honduras. So far in 1983, Sotelo claimed, there have been 620 cases of foreign aircraft flying into Nicaragua from Honduras.

The killing of Schwab was the first such shooting episode since joint U.S.-Honduran military maneuvers began in August as a warning to the Sandinistas against supporting leftist rebels in Central America. The attack occurred in an area near which there has been heavy fighting.

Parent battles Bibles

Given to pupils

JEROME — A 26-year-old parent allowing distribution of Bibles in the Jerome School District is being challenged in federal court as a violation of students' constitutional rights.

Joseph Ripplinger and his 11-year-old daughter, Magdalena, filed suit in U.S. District Court in Boise Wednesday, naming the Jerome School District and two administrators as defendants.

The suit alleges per First Amendment rights were violated when members of Gleasons International handed out free copies of the New Testament Bible at Central Elementary School on Nov. 22. It also charges that Gleason members followed Magdalena and a friend from the school and read Bible passages to them after the distribution.

The Ripplingers are asking for \$10,000 punitive damages and an undetermined amount of compensatory damages from the school district, from Jerome School Superintendent Stephen J. Yessinger and from Central Elementary Principal Betty Hyder. The suit also seeks a federal injunction to stop all further distribution of Bibles in Idaho public schools unless they are part of a study on religion, provided by a U.S. Supreme Court ruling. Lawyers for the American Civil Liberties Union are representing the Ripplingers.

However, after hearing of the suit Thursday, Idaho Attorney General Jim Jones said he knows of nothing preventing the distribution of Bibles to anyone who wanted to take them.

"The circumstances might actually

Shultz says U.S. set to rekindle Soviet relations

WASHINGTON — Secretary of State George P. Shultz, who leaves this weekend for a meeting with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko, said Thursday the Reagan administration is "prepared for a thaw" in relations if Moscow reciprocates.

"We are prepared for a thaw, but whether there is one will reflect what the desires of the Soviet Union are," Shultz said in an interview conducted with reporters in Europe via satellite. "It takes two to thaw."

Shultz did not rule out a summit meeting between President Reagan and Soviet leader Yuri Andropov some time this year, but said there must be assurances a summit would

produce results. "We want one that will accomplish something."

Later, at a State Department news conference, Shultz said he did not know whether the Soviets also were interested in a thaw in relations. But he said he will enter the meeting with Gromyko at Stockholm, Sweden, on Wednesday prepared for "a constructive dialogue" and hopes his Soviet counterpart will, too.

"There are great tensions in various parts of the world and it is desirable to have a dialogue and it is desirable to reduce those tensions if we

can," Shultz said. "It perhaps must look that way to them, too."

He added: "If I thought the situation was hopeless, I wouldn't bother sitting down, and I presume Mr. Gromyko feels the same way."

Soviet-American relations are at their lowest state in years, raising widely expressed concern that the superpowers could drift toward war unless the course is reversed.

The Soviets recently interrupted all major arms control talks with Washington after NATO began deploying new U.S. nuclear missiles in Europe. While the United States and NATO insist that the missiles are necessary to counter Soviet missiles aimed at European targets, the breakdown in the arms talks has caused uneasiness among the European allies.

The administration seems eager to create the best possible atmosphere for Shultz's meeting

with Gromyko, which will be held in connection with the opening of the 35-nation European Disarmament Conference in Stockholm. Shultz leaves Washington on Saturday.

The secretary's reference to a possible thaw in relations clearly is part of the effort to improve the atmosphere. Reagan plans to make what his aides say will be a conciliatory speech Monday on U.S.-Soviet relations.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said that in the speech, to be televised by satellite to Europe, the president will let the Soviets know that "we are determined to maintain a realistic and productive relationship." Last March, in contrast, Reagan denounced the Soviet Union as "an evil empire."

Shultz told the European reporters he is prepared to talk to Gromyko about the "full

Scientists link fats to heart attacks

Study proves cholesterol a killer

WASHINGTON — Results of a nationwide clinical trial prove what doctors have suspected for years: Reducing the levels of fatty cholesterol in the blood cuts the risks of heart disease, scientists said Thursday.

The 10-year Coronary Primary Prevention Trial to find out if a drug that alters cholesterol levels can decrease coronary disease and heart attack has proved much more, researchers said.

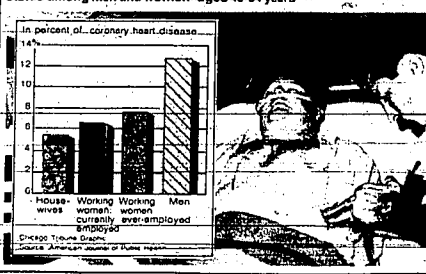
"This is the first study to demonstrate conclusively that the risk of coronary heart disease can be reduced by lowering blood cholesterol, as we previously suspected," said Dr. Basil M. Rifkind of the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, the branch of the National Institutes of Health which sponsored the study.

Although there has been considerable evidence from previous human and animal studies that cholesterol reduction cuts heart disease, Rifkind said it was conclusive until now. Rifkind said at a news briefing.

Dr. Robert L. Levy of Columbia University, a heart disease expert who headed the heart institute when

the study began, said the results have implications far beyond the middle-aged men with high cholesterol levels used in the study.

"Now, for the first time, we have conclusive evidence that people can do something about heart disease by lowering their cholesterol," Levy said in an interview.

"The study showed that the greater the reduction of cholesterol toward normal levels, the greater the reduction of heart attack events," he continued. "Because of this direct relationship, the results can be extrapolated readily to other groups."

Experts estimate that more than 40

Former senator has tumor

NEW YORK (AP) — Former Sen. Frank Church has a "tumor of the pancreas" that was found during surgery Thursday, but it was not known whether the tumor was cancerous, Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center officials said.

Church was reported in satisfactory condition and resting comfortably following the two-hour operation by Dr. Murray F. Brennan, chief of the hospital's gastric and mixed tumor service.

Suzanne Rauffenbart, vice president of the hospital's public affairs department, said Church underwent surgery "for a tumor of the pancreas."

"The tumor was biopsied but not removed and surgery was performed to alleviate an obstruction," she said in a prepared statement.

Gov. John Evans, D-Idaho, said Church's family called him after the operation and told him the former senator came through "nicely."

"I'm guarded but optimistic that the senator will come through the operation in good shape," Evans said.

Chase Church, the ex-senator's son, had reported Wednesday that

his father had a bile duct obstruction that caused digestive problems and had made him lose "a lot of weight."

Ms. Rauffenbart declined to reveal further details of Church's condition. She said that the results of the biopsy on the tissue removed from the tumor would be a "available next week."

"At that time, a decision for future treatment will be made," she said.

Statistics on pancreatic cancer, released last month by the National Cancer Institute, show that only 3 percent of the patients diagnosed as having cancer of the pancreas survive as long as five years, said Edwin Silverberg of the American Cancer Society's statistics and information division.

Church, 59, a four-term Democrat, former presidential candidate and ex-chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, has been hospitalized since Sunday.

Church was stricken with cancer in the 1940s while attending Harvard University and underwent successful surgery. An aide said that in recent years he also has suffered from diabetes.

A Boise, Idaho, native, Church first was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1956. He served for more than two decades until losing narrowly to Republican Steve Symms in 1980.

Church ran for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1976, defeating Jimmy Carter in the Nebraska, Montana, Idaho and Oregon primaries before bowing out of the race.

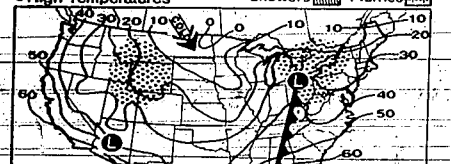
Shultz said, however, that Gromyko will sign the Soviets' willingness to resume negotiations in Geneva on controlling medium-range and strategic nuclear weapons.

Soviets say arms pact almost made it

MOSCOW (AP) — The chief Soviet arms negotiator said Thursday that the United States was about to accept Soviet terms for limiting nuclear missiles in Europe when the deal fell apart last November.

Yuli Kvitlinsky, the head of the Soviet delegation to the discontinued Geneva talks on limiting medium-range nuclear missiles in Europe, said his American counterpart offered to cancel NATO's plan to deploy 572 new rockets if Moscow would destroy nearly two-thirds of its force of 350 SS-20 missiles.

That would have left the Soviets with about the same number of medium-range missiles as currently in the arsenals of Britain and France. Kvitlinsky said an approaching compromise fell apart when West Germany reported the offer and ascribed it to the Soviet Union.

Chief U.S. arms negotiator Paul Nitze has denied the Soviet version of events and said the offer was from the Soviet Union.

Kvitlinsky said the report by West Germany was "a dishonorable act, and the Soviet side had no alternative but to restore the truth. Ambassador Nitze was told what we thought of such partners and their methods."

Kvitlinsky said in a long report distributed by the official Novosti news agency.

It was Kvitlinsky's first published statement on the Geneva talks and on the conflicting versions of what went on at the final sessions. The Kvitlinsky comments echoed a Tass report on Nov. 21, two days before the Soviets walked out of the talks.

Shortly NATO began deploying the American-missiles—and the Soviets

walked out of the arms talks in late November, Washington and Bonn said a new Soviet offer was rejected. The Soviets on Nov. 21 accused the United States of putting forth the offer and then ascribing it to the Soviets and rejecting it.

In Bonn, the West German government rejected the Kvitlinsky's charges. Government spokesman Juergen Sudhoff said the talks broke down because "the Soviet Union continually attempted to maintain a monopoly on medium-range weapons and the West was attempting to achieve reduction on both sides."

Sandinistas pan Kissinger commission report

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP) — The newspaper *Barricada* — voice of the ruling Sandinistas — said Thursday the Kissinger commission's report takes a "classic ultra-imperialist position" that the Soviet-Cuban "imperialist" U.S. interests in Central America.

The Salvadoran government, terming the recommendation "an insane course aimed at the submission of poor and small peoples." *Barricada* said the report "looks for some way of peaceful or diplomatic surrender" of Nicaragua by recognizing that a direct military action by the United States... is a considered only as an alternative of the last resort."

The Marxist Sandinista government had no direct comment on the report, which was presented to President Reagan on Wednesday and warns of the threat of Soviet and Cuban penetration in Central America. The commission suggested continued covert American aid to Nicaraguan rebels could help produce

a negotiated settlement with the Sandinistas, who have ties to the Soviet Union and Cuba.

A broadcast of the rebels' underground Radio *Barbudo-Mari* said, "At the same time they talk of peace, the Yankees intend to increase by 200 percent aid to the moribund regime of (Salvadoran President) Alvaro Magana."

WASHINGTON (AP) — American officials said Thursday they had made major progress toward an agreement with China that could open the way for U.S. firms to compete for an estimated \$20 billion in sales of nuclear power technology.

Peking embarks on an ambitious program to develop atomic energy.

But the officials, briefing reporters at the White House following the departure of Chinese Premier Zhao Ziyang, cautioned that "very tough" negotiations lie ahead if President Reagan is to sign an agreement on peaceful nuclear cooperation when he visits Peking in April.

"We are not going to make any deals just to further our commercial

interests at the expense of our strategic and national security interests," one administration official pledged. But he added, "I think it's in sight. I think we've gone about 85 percent of the way there, but the remaining 15 percent is very difficult."

A senior official involved in the negotiations for the three days of talks between Zhao, Reagan and their top aides said, "We did not expect breakthroughs during this visit."

But he said the United States was particularly pleased by a little-noticed policy statement on nuclear non-proliferation that Zhao included in his visit to Reagan at a state dinner in the White House on Tuesday night.

The officials spoke on condition they

not be named.

Zhao, whose government only recently joined the International Atomic Energy Agency and agreed to abide by its restrictions on exports of nuclear materials, said China remains "critical of the discriminatory treaty on nonproliferation of nuclear weapons."

"But we do not advocate or encourage nuclear proliferation," the premier told Reagan. "We do not engage in nuclear proliferation ourselves, nor do we help other countries develop nuclear weapons."

Calling it "a very significant policy statement," the senior official said, "We very much welcome this statement of China's policy because it

shows that we share certain basic principles on nonproliferation."

The United States, he added, has been concerned for some time that China, which has tested its own nuclear weapons, was "a significant source of nuclear technology for a number of countries that remain of nonproliferation concern, such as Argentina."

In reporting continued progress in the negotiations toward a nuclear cooperation agreement, the official tempered his enthusiasm with caution.

"In one sense we're very close, and in another sense both sides have indicated we've pretty much run out of flexibility."

Hanging may be suicide

SAN ANTONIO, Texas (AP) — A two-star general found hanging in a two-story tower here — bound his own hands and committed suicide after pinning a note to himself saying he had been "sentenced and executed" for "crimes by the U.S. Army," the FBI said Thursday.

But a friend said Army Reserve Maj. Gen. Robert G. Owsby was a "perfect father and husband" who never would have taken his own

Owsby's body was found Wednesday morning suspended in a second-story stairwell at a headquarters building at Fort Sam Houston, said a FBI agent, Sgt. Cowley. His hands had been tied behind him with a military web belt and there was a noose around his neck.

Pilot dies in shootout

POLSON, Mont. (AP) — A 27-year-old handi"man" took a "teen-ager hostage and demanded a plane for his getaway, then killed the pilot who volunteered to fly him to freedom, officials say.

The pilot, 64-year-old Harry Lee Shryock, had traded places with the young hostage, who had tied and told the gunman he was afraid of planes, said the boy and Sheriff Glenn Frame.

The gunman, identified by Frame as "David Cameron Keith" of Columbia Falls, was wounded by police gunfire Wednesday night as he stepped out of the plane and onto the runway of a small airport in this resort community of 2,800.

Keith was reported in critical condition Thursday by a nursing supervisor at St. Patrick Hospital in Missoula, 66 miles south of Polson.

The incident began about 1 p.m. Wednesday when Missoula police reported that an armed man, wearing a bandana, had robbed a pharmacy there, taking about 500 tablets of prescriptions drugs, including Dilaudid, a synthetic heroin.

According to Wayne Mitchell, police chief in nearby St. Ignace, Keith drove about 34 miles to the Post Creek Store and gas station on the Flathead Indian Reservation, burst into the store and grabbed 13-year-old Bill Crose Jr.

The gunman fired a shot, missing

the boy's father, Bill Crose Sr., then jumped into the Crose family's pickup truck with his young hostage, Mitchell said.

The youth said Keith had him stop briefly and get a "yellow bag of dope" from Keith's car.

Keith drove north to where

authorities set up a roadblock along U.S. 93. Frame negotiated with Keith, who demanded an airplane and a pilot, even after being told the weather was bad for flying.

"It was very apparent that he (Keith) was dead serious about killing the boy," said Frame.

Panel eyes cuts in federal budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — A business-oriented efficiency panel, whose chairman declared "the government is run horribly," told President Reagan on Thursday that federal spending could be slashed by \$42.4 billion over three years. Recommendations ranged from more thrifty buying of major weapons systems to paying 3 cents for screws instead of 2¢.

J. Peter Grace, who headed up the 18-month study, said it's high time that the government bring red ink under control, since "no company I know of in this country, except maybe IBM ... could survive" if it were managed the same way.

Grace, who unveiled the hefty, two-volume final report of the President's Private Sector Survey on Cost Control, declared, "The government is run horribly."

He predicted that by the year 2000 the budget deficit would skyrocket to nearly \$2 trillion, and interest on the national debt would soar to \$1.5 billion unless the panel's recommendations are adopted. Last year's deficit was a record \$19.4 billion.

The 10 key recommendations include:

- Scaling down government pension plans to a level more in line with those provided by private firms.
- Upgrading government computers which, on the average, are about twice as old as those in private businesses.
- Requiring the Pentagon to buy, on a competitive basis, commonly used parts and equipment. If criticized the Pentagon for buying 3-cent screws for \$91 and spending \$14 for silicon electric cells that go for 9¢ cents. It

also urged the Pentagon to be more efficient and cost-conscious in contracting for the nation's multibillion-dollar weapons systems.

- Repealing legislation that requires the government to pay wages on construction projects that exceed those offered by smaller, more competitive local companies.
- Increasing efforts to collect back taxes. It said the Internal Revenue Service should turn its "immediate attention" to trying to recover the estimated \$9.5 billion individuals and corporations failed to pay in taxes in 1981.
- Better tracking of the earnings of Social Security recipients to weed out erroneous payments. The system used by the Social Security Administration is three years behind schedule.

Illness retires Democratic senator

BOSTON (AP) — Democratic Sen. Paul Tsongas announced Thursday he will not seek a second term because of a chronic illness, giving the Republicans new hope of regaining the seat in their battle to keep control of the Senate.

The 42-year-old lawmaker did not disclose the nature of his ailment, which he said was diagnosed 3½ months ago.

Speaking to 800 people who jammed a Boston Hill auditorium, Tsongas said he could have run, won and served again, but did not want to neglect his family.

"Last Friday night after three days of campaigning, I helped my daughters to sleep. I was lying there

in the darkness, and it became obvious to me what I had to do," said Tsongas, flanked by his teary-eyed wife, Nikki.

"This is not an easy decision," he said. "But under the circumstances, I have no other choice."

Tsongas informed his Washington staff of his decision on Wednesday, and word soon leaked to the news media. He notified members of his Boston staff early Thursday.

In his years in Washington, Tsongas has become known as a liberal who pushed for "compassionate realism" without big spending for social programs.

His decision prompted many Massachusetts Democrats to consider

a run and give Republicans new hope for recovering the seat. Republicans, who gained control of the Senate in the 1980 election, currently hold a 55-45 advantage in the chamber.

Democratic Gov. Michael Dukakis said he would not seek Tsongas' seat. But possible candidates for the party nomination include At. Gov. John Kerry, former Massachusetts House Speaker David Bartley and U.S. Reps. James Shannon of Lawrence and Brian Donnelly of Boston.

Republican Ray Shamle of Walpole, who lost to Sen. Edward Kennedy in 1982, has had little GOP opposition while campaigning for Tsongas' Senate seat in the last several months.

Airman threatens teacher, faces charges

PAPILLION, Neb. (AP) — An Airman arrested after allegedly brandishing a knife at a preschool teacher will be charged with kidnapping and stabbing two boys whose deaths terrorized an Omaha suburb, a prosecutor said Thursday.

Sarpy County Attorney Patrick Kelly said he would ask that John J. Joubert, 20, of Portland, Maine, be held without bond after arraignment Thursday afternoon.

Kelly said the charges included two of first-degree murder, two of kidnapping and two of using a knife in the

commission.

The slayings of 12-year-old Danny Joe Eberly and 12-year-old Christopher Walden of Bellevue shocked that Omaha suburb of 23,000. More than 100 investigators, including FBI agents, contributed to a four-month search for the killer.

Joubert, stationed at nearby Offutt Air Force Base, headquarters of the Strategic Air Command, was arrested Wednesday at the base after he allegedly pulled a knife on a preschool teacher, who fled to nearby personage and called police, Kelly said.

Investigators working on the killings did not immediately link the incident to the slayings of the two boys, "but one thing led to another in that case," Kelly said.

The Omaha World-Herald—in a copyright story, said the Rev. David Kelly, pastor of the Aldersgate United Methodist Church, called police after a young man with a knife tried to force his way into the preschool in the basement of the church Wednesday morning. The pastor told police that the man grabbed the teacher and threatened to kill her.

Judge says columnist can switch papers

CHICAGO (AP) — A judge on Thursday cleared the way for columnist Mike Royko to work for the Chicago Tribune, saying the Pulitzer Prize-winner's contract with the rival Chicago Sun-Times allowed him to leave the newspaper.

Cook County Circuit Judge Anthony Scullin rejected the Sun-Times' bid for a preliminary injunction that would have blocked Royko's working at the Tribune.

The Sun-Times filed suit in 1982,

contending Royko broke his contract when he resigned from the newspaper Tuesday and signed a three-year pact with the Tribune.

But after two hours of arguments Thursday, Scullin ruled Royko, as a member of the Chicago Newspaper Guild, was protected by the union's contract permitting employees to resign and collect dismissal pay if the paper were sold. The Sun-Times was formally purchased this week by in-

ternational publisher Rupert Murdoch.

The judge also ruled that Royko's personal service contract, which prohibited him from writing for any newspaper distributed in the Chicago area until two years after the contract expired, was "overly broad" and therefore "unenforceable."

Don Reuben, attorney for the Tribune, said the decision sent a message to Murdoch that reporters "are not chattel," he asserted.

Ex-senator sprang from traditional Idaho roots

BOISE — In 1976, when Frank Church launched his bid for the Democratic presidential nomination, he chose to make his formal announcement at Idaho City.

Church, 59, for a quarter-century an important force in Idaho politics, underwent surgery Thursday at a New York hospital. Doctors feared a tumor was blocking a bile duct.

It was at the very same wooden sidewalk where his father-in-law, Chase Clark, launched a campaign that made him Idaho governor, from 1941 to 1945.

He had to fight criticism that he was more concerned with international affairs than with Idaho issues. Church pulled out all the stops in his costly campaign against Republican Steve Symms in 1980.

Emergency funds delayed

BOISE (AP) — The Legislature's budget-setting committee has delayed until next week a decision on whether to endorse the Idaho Health and Welfare Department's request for more than \$2.1 million in emergency money.

But the joint Finance-Appropriations Committee declined to act on the request Thursday because it has yet to receive an estimate of state revenues for the spending year that begins July 1.

That estimate, being prepared by another legislative panel, is not expected to be ready until Friday. The department asked for \$23.9 million to replace federal funds withheld from the state because Idaho had an excessive error rate in 1981 in determining eligibility for various Medicaid programs.

Yentl entertaining, amusing but Streisand has way to go

TWIN FALLS — It's difficult to feel neutral about Barbra Streisand.

It seems you either hate that voice or are a devoted fan.

Yet, her movie "Yentl" elicits neutrality.

Much has been made of Streisand's fight to make this film about a Jewish girl in the early 1900s who yearns to study the Talmud, the sacred teachings confined only to the eyes of men.

Besides producing the film, Streisand also is star and co-writer of the script and makes her debut as a director. Yet, her studio battles and publicity aside, the finished product is all that matters and it should make her proud.

Yentl, played by Streisand, wants to learn instead of doing housework and "darning socks." Her secondary teacher secretly teaches her and she discovers the fact he didn't teach Yentl how to be more like a woman.

When she gets the chance, Yentl cuts her hair and becomes Ansel, a boy. As Ansel, she at last enters the world of books and books. She enrolls in a yeshiva or school and meets Avigdor, a handsome fiery intellectual.

Avigdor has troubles, however. He loves Hadass, a beautiful beauty whom he can't marry. So, he asks his best friend Ansel to marry Hadass.

What happens next is not so much a comedy of mistaken identities, like "Tootsie," but, a whimsical story

about Yentl's education in the study of love and womanhood.

As a director, Streisand has a sensitive touch when directing the scenes between the characters.

Streisand also has an eye for lovely landscapes, diffused lighting and setting a romantic scene. But, her directing techniques are nothing spectacular and often predictable.

Where director Streisand really hits is in the use of her many songs throughout the film. Some fulfill their task of voicing Yentl's feelings and thoughts. Mostly, however, they come in at the wrong time and kill any climatic emotion that had been building.

For instance, when Hadass is asking for Yentl's feelings, it is a moment of tension and tenderness. But it is deflated as another song wells up.

One wonders if "Yentl" could have been better without the singing, which

is all done by Streisand. Instead of using music, maybe Streisand should have concentrated on expressing emotion in spoken words and action.

The actors in the film are good enough with or without song. As Avigdor, Mandy Patinkin is compelling and attractive. Amy Irving plays Hadass with underlying passion, charm and strength. And as Yentl-Ansel, Streisand avoids her usual loudmouthed Jewish girl character and delivers a good sedate performance.

But, Streisand's acting almost is dwarfed by Patinkin's ability and energy.

It is these flaws that make "Yentl" an amusing entertaining love story and nothing more.

Streisand has earned her right to be called a complete entertainer and singer. And although off to a good start with "Yentl," she has a ways to go in her new career as director.

My husband says I was wrong to have called the police, but what were my alternatives? I couldn't take a chance on her carrying out her threat. If I had called a minister or psychiatrist, she wouldn't have let them in. How would you have handled it?

DEAR GOOD: Just as you did. It's sometimes necessary to "disrupt" a life in order to save it. I hope your friend comes to realize that you acted in her best interests. In the meantime, don't judge her too harshly. She could still be far from well.
