Reagan questions Mondale's commitment to national defense

CHICAGO (AP) — President Reagan, insisting his re-election drivels not "a cakewalk," asserted Friday he has taken a "dramatic far-reaching step" toward a safer world and questioned Walter F. Mondale's commitment to a strong defense. In remarks prepared for the national convention of the Veterans of Foreign Wars the day after he accepted renomination for a second term; the president likened his Democratic opponent to a destructive donkey.

"Now some may insist they're just as committed to a strong deterrent even as they would cancel the B-1 bomber and the (MX) missile." Reagan said of Mondale, who opposes both programs but advocates higher defense spending.

Capping a six-day series of campaign events, highlighted by his acceptance speech before the Republican National, Convention in Dallas on Thursday night, Reagan flew here to boast to the

VFW about his defense build-up, estimated at \$1.5 trillion over five years.

"We have made a new beginning, a dramatic far-reaching step toward a much better, safer and more secure future," he told the veterans.

The president began the day with a final appearance before the Republican National Committee, warning against complexency despite his healthy lead against Mondale in the polls.





Franz Schmidberger, new superior general of the Switssbased "St. Pius X Priestly Fraternity" said in an interview initial indications that the Roman Curla, under Pope John Paul II, would seek normalized ties with the traditionalists have given way to a "slight hardening." In the Vatican's attitude.

Lefebvre, who recently ordained four more priests in Ridgeffield, Conn., in deflance of an Ayear-old Vatican ban, had sent word that he was ready to meet the pope when John Paul visited Switzerland in mid-June, but no such meeting came about.

came about. "The thoological questions which are at issue must be discussed in quiet and with discretion," Schmidberger said, adding that the visit was neither the "right time nor the right place" for such discussion.

"Of course, we are at the pope's disposal," he said. "But we cannot understand why he preached at a (Rome) protestant church last December on the occasion of Luther's 50th anniversary. We cannot understand that he signed the new Canon Law which contains manifest errors. We cannot understand that he concluded the new concordat

with thay which this ceased to be a claim, state."

"The chirch continues on the (reformist) course taken after the Second Vatican Council," Schmidberger said. "No one in a responsible position in the church seems to understand that this will event ally mean its ruin."

One of the reforms killied the traditional 16th century rile, the Tridentine Mass. But Lefebvre and his priests have continued to use it. Under Pope Paul VI, the Vatican reacted with a series of disciplinary measures, culminating 1976 in a suspension "a divinis," forbidding him to say Mass or administer sacraments.

Lefebvre has ignored the sanctions, claiming they are illegal. The controversy, which at times threatened, schism, has eased somewhat under Pope John Paul II. There have been no more Vatican warnings that continued deflance may lead to excommunication of the 78-year-old archibishon.

Schmidberger said he was "appalled" at the June meeting between the pope and the leading representatives of the World Council of Churches, whose membership groups include some 400 million non-Roman Catholics. Both sides have declared the meeting marks an important point in the ecumenical movement, the efforts toward restoring Christian unity.

""True ecumenism consists in trying-to-bring-home Jhe lost sheep," Schmidberger said. "Faise ecumenism seeks compromises ... (and) even-tually leads to the idea of a World Church in which-all religions will have a place with equal rights. It

WASHINGTON (AP) — World inventories of tobacco dropped 3 percent in 1833 as a result of smaller crops in the some of the major producing countries, says the Agriculture Department.

A recent report by the department's Foreign Agricultural Service said the world supply as of Jan. 1 was estimated at 6.91 million metric tons

of Jan. 1 was of tobacco, down 184,000 tons from the level a year earlier. One reason cited for the decline was a substantial decrease in tobacco stocks held by China.
