LEWISTON — A Connecticut con-gressman is drafting an Idaho wilderness bill which is expected to include more than 8 million acres, an

include more than 8 million acres, an aide to the legislator said.
Herb Holtz, legislative assistant to Rep. Samuel Geldenson, D-Conn, said the bill would include all remaining roadless areas on national forests in the state.
The bill, expected to be introduced within the next two weeks, would be the largest wilderness proposal to be introduced to Congress for Idaho, the Lawiston Morning Tribune reported Thursday.

The GNP report revised growth down alightly for the fourth quarter to 4.3 percent from an earlier 4.9 percent estimate. The change put GNP growth for all of 1984 at 6.8 percent, still the strongest growth since a 10.1 percent gain in 1951.

All sides agreed that the department's estimate of growth in the gross national product — the total output of goods and services — was much lower than the 4 percent rate that had been widely expected for January through March.

The 2.1 percent gain was the weakest performance since a 1.6 percent rise from last July through September, a period of slumping growth, which was followed by a 4.3 percent rebound from October In other bad news, the report said that a measure of infiation tied to the GNP — the implicit price deflator—rose at an annual rate of 5.4 percent in the first three months of the year, the lastest clip since a 5.6 percent pace in the second quarter of 1982. Reagan is the first U.S. president since Herbert Hoover not to meet his Soviet counterpart, and while he said he was not interested in a "get acquainted" session, he did not insist on a pre-arranged successful outcome.

Reagan first offered to meet with Gorbachev in a note delivered by Vice President George Bush last week during the tumeral services for the late Soviet leader, Konstantin Chernenko.

Since then there had been no reply, but Reagan said he doesn't feel rebufed because "the man has only been in office for a few days."

Even as he extended the hand of the lumder to the Soviets, the president set up a fresh confrontation with Congress when he said he was opposed to extending the federal memployment benefits.

MIRKIAIM assails benefits tax WASHINGTON (AP)—millions of American jamilies, especially the young and the poor, would have to give up employer-paid health insurance if Congress approves a plan to tax employee benefits, AFL-CIO Fresident Lane Kirkiand said Tunxday. Taxing employer-paid medical insurance contributions "would dismanile the safety net of employee group health insurance," the head of the 13.7 million-member labor federation told the House Education and Labor Committee. Kirkiand said the nation's deflicit problem can best be resolved "by roversing some of the real inequilies in the tax code, not by levying additional burdens on working people." Todd Maddock, Pollatch Corp. northern region public affairs director at Lewiston dismissed the Geldenson bill as a Joke. "I think it's ridiculous." I think it's representative of the kind of ideas that might come from those who earn their livings outside the state, "Maddock said.

Sorensen said the new bill's total acreage was expected to be 3.6 million, acres, which would include some 85,000 acres of BLM land but exclude the rest for a later debate. "We were trying to stop terminal use of natural resources like we have here in Idaho," Sorensen said.

The aid provided under the bill would include seed, fertilizer, pesticides, farm tools, vaccine and veterinary help, blankets, clothing and sheller.

ATLANTA (AP) — Doctors around the nation reported no widespread flu outbreaks last week for the first time in more than two months, the Centers for Disease Cohtrol sald Thursday.

No states reported "widespread" outbreaks, those over a region covering more than half the state's opculation, the federal CDC said. Eight reported less severe "regional" outbreaks, the agency said.

It was the first time in more than we months that flu had caused despread sickness in no state.

Goetz robbers got what they deserved

Just when it seemed that the Bernhard Goetz case was about to fade from the news if not from our consciousness, a grand jury in New York has announced it will hear from the man himself — who may be indicted for attempted murder.

The case has raised all sorts of responses from Americans. Some people — perhaps a majority—think Goetz was thoroughly in the right to draw his gun and shoot to kill the four thugs who tried to rob him in the subway. To others, he acted with cold, calculated intent. Her lurked in the subway, a victim turned hunter, for his prey.

Our, own view inclines toward the first. Goetz may have armed himself for the eventuality of an assaut, but that didn't give the four punks the right to attempt a robbery on him, which they did with impunity. In short, they tried to rob him. He shot. They got what they had coming. Too bad, but case closed.

A Now, the grand jury will consider the case, apparently on the basis of new evidence that Goetz's intent was to kill the four youths.

But from what has come out so far, we can't imagine an indictment against him, much less a conviction.

The four would-be robbers all have long records. They, were clearly intent on committing a crime. Would any jury in the country hang Goetz out to dry for protecting himself against such people?

Lurking in this case is a deep public distrust of the criminal justice system in America. People know that, too often, the victims goes on trial, that the rights of the victims.

For many, Goetz' act was the correct one, even if it

defendants take precedence over the rights of the victims.


For many, Goetz' act was the correct one, even if it was outside the law. If he is convicted now, respect for the law will reach a new low.

There are some ugly sides of this. One is that the defendants are all black and that Goetz is white. For some people of both races, the case somehow may symbolize a strained relationship particularly of peoples thrown into an inner city's crushing environment.

It may also represent, the social psychologists say, a social fantasy for many who have either witnessed or been a victim of a mugging themselves and see, in Goetz a victory of good versus avil:

Just in term of the criminal law, the Goetz case has demonstrated the difficulty of drawing a firm ethical position. No one deserves to be the victim of a crime. Not Goetz, and not the four youths he shot.

But in the end, they were the criminals first. That, for many people, makes them less deserving of sympathy. That, in our view, is where the line is drawn.

Next week, Rep. Richard Stallings will be taced with a critical vote on the AX missile-system. It's time to look again at the MX, to evaluate it no both strategic and budgetary criteria, and to get word to Stallings as to bow se stand on this controversial issue.—The MX missile is an ICBM with carriesten individual nuclear warheads each capab of hitting a distinct target. 





Local production often flat despite effort, performances

TWIN FALLS—The heart-warming music and lyrics of Jerome Kern and Oscar Hammers tein rescued the Dilettantes" "Show Boat" production from a slow death.

Although it was evident much hard work and effort went into the large-scale musical, it lacks

excitement and pizazz

The exceptions were Roger Vincent's "O! Man River" number and "Can't Help Lovin' That Man" and "Bill" sung in purest tones by Cathleen Flores as Julie. Every time I hear her, she seems to get better.

One scene, however, made seeing the production well worth the three hours spent in the Fine Arts Auditorium at the College of Southern Idaho.
