South Hills to be off-limits to woodcutters this year

TWIN FALLS Sawtooth National Forest officials this year are placing most of the South Hills off-timits to frewood cutters and are boosting firewood fees substan-

Twin Falls District Ranger Jerry Davis Thursday announced the new rules Thursday announced the new rules Thursday sayingthe actions are necessary to clear out stands of diseased and aged trees. Firewood cutters this year will be able to take wood from only about 10 percent of the 310,000-acre Cassia Division south of Hansen, he said.

Two large areas will be opened and developed for woodcutters — a 21,000-acre zone and the southwest of beadine Ridge in the western part of the South Hills and a 9,000-acre tract about to miles west of Oakley in the eastern part.

The rest of the Cassia Division will be closed to public

woodcutting. The only exceptions will be areas opened to people holding special commercial or small wood lot permits, said forester John Bell.

Firewood also will cost more. The price of the initial permitwill remain at 510 and still will entitle cutters to two cords of wood. However, the price of wood will double to \$5 from the current \$2.50.

The condition of the trees is a main reason for changing the freewood cutting system in the 30,000-acre forest south of Hansen.

"By cutting down areas of seased and overmature trees discased and overnature trees and restricting cuttings to these areas, we will be able to regenerate the areas with young healthy trees," says Twin Falls Disfrict Ranger Jerry Davis.



Stockman off target in attack on Amtrak

David A. Stockman, director of the Office of Management and Budget-cutting, says that the country's only hope of fiscal salvation is riding Amtrak out of Washington on a rail.

Shutting down the subsidized national passenger train network, he says, is the litmus-test-for Congress-If it cannot drum up the nerve to do that, it cannot cut the budget anywhere.

On test votes so far, Congress has protected the \$684 million subsidy for Amtrak's next fiscal year.

Congress should continue to protect the service, if only for the 20 million passengers who offer have no other way to travel except by train. It also should pay-close attention-to-the-perfectly logical argument-by-Amtrak President W. Graham Claytor Jr. that a smaller subsidy would mean shutting down service and laying off workers, and that most of the smaller subsidy would be swallowed up in severance pay.

What possessed Stockman to fasten so fanatically on Amtrak is a puzzle. Amtrak's trains already pay more of their operating costs than Congress intended that they should when the system was created at the insistence of privately owned railroads that wanted out of the passenger service.

Fares are cheaper than on other forms of transportation. For health reasons, some cannot fly or drive. Some cannot travel any other way because there is neither bus nor air service to their hometowns.

Stockman argues that Amtrak's subsidy is \$35 per passenger, if one counts the government's tax loss when business travelers write off the cost of their tickets. 

This mix of ignorance, propaganda, and skepticism of propaganda produces a complicated impression of America. Some of the most educated people I have met, express simultaneously an exaggerated idea of simultaneously an exaggerated idea of Augerican memployment and envy of Augerican prosperity. There are also subtle mixenceptions that come to the surface in an odd phrase; on assumption or a question. In a school visit, a 15 year old student explains to me that, "In America everything is done for the sake of business." Thear a report

from a geography lesson. "Afforma is in place with a lot of rich people where they huild missiles." Five or six times. I am told with absolute certainty that "American families are not close like our families." Once, after a long affection with a sophisticated, thoughtful teacher. I am startled to hear her sk about communism in America saying. "We know it's the second largest Communist Party in the world."

But the widest gap between image and self-image emerges one night in a home in Leningrad. New Jersey family he was visiting, he said to hem, "You know, I am a communist," "They said, "No, no, you are too jovial, foor nice." and he repeated it until at last, implishly and prayocatively, he said to them, "What do I have to do to make you believe me? Put a knife between my teeft?"

I suspect there are as many misconceptions as miles between the land of caves and the country of grates.

TWIN FALLS Residents along the south side of the Blue Lakes. Shopping Center are concerned about what they say is a deathrap in their neighborhood, and they say it is a baited trap because of its fascination for small children. The hazard that hus brought concern from neighbors is an open diversion gate on the Perrine Coulee where the coulee changes from an open channel through the headgate and then disappears under the park-

open channel through the headgate and then disappears under the park-ing for at the Blue Lakes Shopping Center. The structure is just east of Buchanan Street where it ends at the edge of the shopping center parking lot. It is directly behind the Nellie Hartley home. "It's only a matter of time," says one resident, "until a child falls in

and is swept away and drowned."
Hartley says youngsters from areas well behind the immediate-neighborhood play along the edges of the swift water and also on a

of the swift water and also on a -walkaway agross the top of the gates. Water from the coulee passes through a gate, creating a falls and an extremely swift current, llartley says. It then goes under the paved parking tot of the shopping center for the distance of at least half a city block before it exits through a large pipe-and again becomes an open stream south and west of the Turf Club on Fillmore Street. Jerry Hollman, who lives two

Club on Fillmore Street. Jerry Holman, who lives two doors south of the Hartley property on Buchanan Street, agrees the situation is extremely hazardous. "If a child feel in, it's hard to tell where it would come out. There may be blockages under the parking lot, or it could be the child would float to

the irrigation gate at the end of the parking lot," he theorized.

Both Holman and Hartley say they have no small children of their own, but both say they see dezens of children a day during summer months playing in the water.

"If I had some small children, I would be going after everyone in town to get it corrected," Hartley said.

"There have been two dops fished out of there, and If a dog can fall in. I'm sure a child could." She explained. "A small child wouldn't have a chance. I don't think many of the parents whose children play there have taken a close look at the situation and realize how dangerous tts."

TWIN FALLS — Immunization levels in the Magic Valley area are not even half those required to prevent the epidemic spread of communicable diseases, district health officials say.

Cheryl Juntunen, director of physical health officials say the health department's 1981 survey of parents of Magic Valley 2-year-olds showed that only 72 percent were fully immunized. In 1983, the same survey showed that only 74 percent of 2-year-olds were fully immunized. In Minidoka County, where a measles outbreak has hit the schools, the level for school-age children in 1983-84 was 80 percent. For 2-year-olds the level for school-age children in 1983-84 was 80 percent.
