## Grasshopper fight brings federal funds

WASHINGTON — The federal government will help farmers in Idaho and 15 other Western states get a jump on crop-eating grasshoppers this year.

U.S. Secretary of Agriculture John Block promised Tuesday to field a estimated \$10 million campaign to help prevent a plague of the insects during late spring and early summer.

"Today we're announcing a program of spraying to control grasshoppers on as many as 9 million acres, but probably we will be able to limit it to 5 million where the problem is really serious," he said.

He also said the government will bear the entire cost of spraying insecticide on publicly owned land, while contributing half of the cost for state-owned land and one-third the cost for private lands.

Only \$1 million originally was set aside to stop any infestations of grasshoppers in the West. But Western legislators have been pressuring Block since January to prepare for an anticipated recurrence of the grasshoppers.

Idaho Senators Jim McClure and Steve Symms have been leading the

lobbying effort in the past few weeks, as reports of high concentrations of just-hatched insects started arriving in Washington. Some have counted more than 300 grasshoppers in a square yard. Federal officials consider eight grasshoppers in the same area enough to damage crops.

"We didn't know for sure it would be this serious because the weather has so much to do with it, but it's been dry in the West and just warm enough that the grasshoppers have done well," Block said at a press conference outside the Capitol on Thursday.

Block acted after McClure and Symms assured him Tuesday that they had enough support in the Senate to pay back any money diverted to fight the grasshoppers.

McClure said quick action was necessary. "I know how difficult it is to find dollars not, but it's not difficult to find grasshoppers now," he told Block at the announcement.

Symms also welcomed Block's action, saying it could halt the insects in their tracks before they invade farmers' crops, as happened last summer.

"If we get out there timely, the \$10 million is going to shorten the lives of

## Farm budget given unexpected boost

WASHINGTON (AP) — Seeking to round up farm-state support for its budget-cutting efforts, the House administration has offered to institute a new agricultural export subsidy and to restore about \$1.1 billion to the farm budget over the next three years, Senate sources said Thursday.

Under the export plan, the United States would give away government-owned grain or other commodities as bonuses to exporters or to foreign purchasers of American farm goods.

The program, similar to one tentatively approved by a House subcommittee Wednesday, would be designed to help restore U.S. farm exports to levels of several years ago before the strong dollar and high price supports made American goods less competitive overseas.

The offers were made Wednesday and Thursday in efforts to increase support for a budget blueprint among farm-state Republicans and two conservative Democrats, said the sources, who spoke only on condition they not be identified.

Sen. Edward Zorinsky of Nebraska,

the ranking Democrat on the Senate Agriculture Committee, said he was "leaning very heavily" toward voting for the new plan being worked out by Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole, R-Kan., in part because of the restored money for farming.

The administration also agreed to boost by some \$500 million its spending for soil and water conservation programs and to restore the \$600 million it previously had proposed to cut from federal crop insurance, the sources said.

In addition, the administration offered to provide \$240 million to help buy down interest rates for the most financially strapped farmers, thus giving back a total of \$1.14 billion in proposed cuts, said the sources.

The \$240 million would be used to reduce interest rates by two percentage points if the lender would agree to absorb the cost of an additional two-point cut, for a total of a four-point reduction. The interest rate buy-down is similar to one in a farm credit aid bill vetoed by President Reagan March 6.

## Cutting out the firewood

### South Hills to be off-limits to woodcutters this year

TWIN FALLS — Sawtooth National Forest officials this year are placing most of the South Hills off-limits to firewood cutters and are boosting firewood fees substantially. Twin Falls District Ranger Jerry Davis Thursday announced the new rules Thursday, saying the actions are necessary to clear out stands of diseased and aged trees.

Firewood cutters this year will be able to take wood from only about 10 percent of the 310,000-acre Cassia Division south of Hansen, he said.

Two large areas will be opened and developed for woodcutters — a 24,000-acre zone southwest of Deadline Ridge in the western part of the South Hills and a 9,000-acre tract about 10 miles west of Oakley in the eastern part.

The rest of the Cassia Division will be closed to public

woodcutting. The only exceptions will be areas opened to people holding special commercial or small wood lot permits, said forester John Bell.

Firewood also will cost more. The price of the initial permit will remain at \$10 and still will entitle cutters to two cords of wood. However, the price of each additional cord of wood will double to \$5 from the current \$2.50.

"In past years, the cost of administering the firewood program in the South Hills has exceeded the revenues generated from firewood permit sales," Davis said.

The higher price also is being imposed in other sections of the Sawtooth National Forest, except for two areas. The exceptions are the Fairfield district and the Sawtooth National Recreation Area north of Galena Summit, both of which get little woodcutting now, forest officials said.

The current maximum of 10

## Disease, overmaturity in stands force forest closure

TWIN FALLS — From a distance, the stands of pine and fir in the South Hills look green and healthy. But, up close, many are ailing — and getting worse, foresters from Sawtooth National Forest say.

The condition of the trees is a main reason for changing the firewood cutting system in the 310,000-acre forest south of Hansen.

"By cutting down areas of diseased and overmature trees and restricting cuttings to these areas, we will be able to regenerate the areas with young, healthy trees," says Twin Falls District Ranger Jerry Davis.

Close to half of the South Hills is blanketed by three types of trees — lodgepole pine, subalpine fir and aspen.

Examinations by expert foresters from 1980 to the present

## Reagan lashes Soviets while visiting Portugal

LISBON, Portugal (AP) — President Reagan, his 10-day European odyssey almost over, lashed out at Soviet and Nicaraguan leaders Thursday and expressed hope for a time when totalitarian rule "is only a sad and distant memory."

Reagan rejected charges by Soviet chief Mikhail Gorbachev that the United States is "the forward edge of the war menace to mankind." Asked

what he thought about Gorbachev's statement, Reagan replied, "What I usually think of him... Who is he to talk."

Training his fire on Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega, Reagan said the leftist Sandinista government was "interfering with democracy in the Americas."

## Dole tries to nail down military, COLA budget reductions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole struggled on Thursday to nail down final details of a revised budget that would cancel next year's Social Security cost of living increase and sharply pare President Reagan's defense buildup as part of a three-year plan to cut spending by \$300 billion.

Administration officials said Reagan had agreed to the proposal, despite the change in defense spending and the resurrection of numerous domestic programs he had proposed killing, including the Job Corps, Urban Development Action Grants and the federal subsidy for Amtrak.

There would be no tax increases in the proposal, which Dole said would cut spending by as much as \$56 billion next year alone. In all, the plan was designed to reduce federal defi-

cits in half over three years, to roughly \$100 billion.

Dole said the chances were "50-50" he could win approval for the revised blueprint within hours, but Democratic Sen. Lawton Chiles of Florida, an opponent, said the GOP leader was still "horse-trading." GOP aides also said the final pieces of the deficit-reduction puzzle had not yet fallen into place.

GOP efforts to find Democratic support for their plan were focused on Sen. Edward Zorinsky of Nebraska, a former Republican who told reporters he was undecided. "I have never been known to vote on a partisan basis," Zorinsky said, adding he didn't know of any other Democrat who were likely to support the GOP proposal.

Dole's efforts to assemble a majority for his new budget were conducted in the privacy of his own office, while inside the Senate chamber, there was a rapid-fire series of votes on proposals to restore funds for a variety of domestic programs.

A proposal by Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., to maintain funding for Amtrak was approved, 53-41, a result that GOP aides said assured the rail subsidy would survive in the package Dole was assembling.

But a move by Sen. James Sasser, D-Tenn.,

to restore more than \$10 billion for a variety of programs, such as HUD's Appalachian Regional Commission and Tennessee Valley Authority economic development programs was tabled, and thus killed, 52-41.

In a third vote, a plan by several senators to freeze spending across-the-board, including defense, was defeated, 70-27.

The Dole package would still call for cancellation of about a dozen programs over three years, such as revenue sharing and Small Business Administration direct loans.

On defense, Reagan began the year by proposing an after-inflation adjustment of 6 percent for 1986. His first compromise came earlier this spring, when he agreed to accept a 3 percent after-inflation hike in a compromise with Dole, and said that was as far as he would go. And when the Senate voted last week to hold the rise constant with inflation, Reagan denounced that as an "irresponsible act."

Even so, White House spokesman Larry Speakes said the president was supporting the proposal, and added that Chief of Staff Donald Regan was telephoning wavering senators on its behalf.

Vice President George Bush also cut short a trip to Arizona to return to Washington in case his vote were needed to break a tie.



# Survey finds whites, women own top cancer survival rates

ATLANTA (AP) — A new eight-year survey has found that survival rates are highest, for the most part, in whites and women.

The National Cancer Institute analyzed more than 100,000 cancer cases diagnosed between 1973 and 1979 in several ethnic groups and followed them through 1981 in cities and states adding up to 10 percent of the nation's population.

NCI's survey, reported Thursday in the Morbidity and Mortality Report of the National Centers for Disease Control, found that survival rates for white women exceeded those for their male counterparts for each major cancer type except urinary bladder

cancer. Similarly, black women as a rule survived most cancers more often than black men.

Survival was defined as living five years after diagnosis. Lynn Heits, a researcher with the Maryland-based NCI, said scientists aren't sure why women survive cancer more than men do.

"I don't think anyone has the answer to that," she said. "Some studies may indicate that women come in sooner for diagnosis and treatment."

Among men, survival rates were higher for whites than blacks in cancers of the rectum, prostate,

bladder and thyroid. White women outlived their black counterparts in cancers of the bladder, breast and uterus.

Among all groups, survival rates were highest for cancer of the thyroid, which 91 percent of all patients survive. Prognosis was worst, regardless of race or sex, for cancers of the esophagus, liver and pancreas — each of which had a survival rate of less than 9 percent.

"The effect of socioeconomic status on cancer patient survival may partially explain these racial differences," said the report of the Atlanta-based CDC.

# Pollution count mixed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Peak concentrations of a key element of smog increased by about 12 percent in 1984 as the economy came out of a recession in hot, dry, clear weather, the Environmental Protection Agency said Thursday.

Most other indicators of air pollution, however, continued the improving trends of recent years, the agency said in its annual report on the subject.

Fifty-five of the 80 largest metropolitan areas in the country failed to meet federal standards for ozone concentrations in 1984, the report said.

## Dotson asks governor to end his 'nightmare'

CHICAGO (AP) — The woman who accused Gary Dotson of rape told Gov. James R. Thompson on Thursday that "the whole thing was a big lie," and Dotson appealed to the governor to free him from the "nightmare" of imprisonment for a crime he didn't commit.

Cathleen Crowell Webb, in four hours of testimony before an emergency hearing of the Illinois Prisoner Review Board, said she wanted "simply to tell the truth about a deception that sent an innocent man to jail for six years."

The hearing will continue Friday. Witnesses expected to testify include Mrs. Webb's foster parents, Dotson's attorney, a polygraph examiner who recently tested Mrs. Webb and Dotson, and two Cook County prosecutors.

Mrs. Webb spoke firmly but so quickly that at one point Thompson asked her to slow down.

"The car and clothing used to implicate Mr. Dotson (were) never found because (they) never existed," testified Mrs. Webb, referring to her previous description of the car in which she said she had been raped and of the torn clothing of her alleged assailant.

She said under questioning that she could not recall many details,

including what she told police at the time, what she was asked by the doctor who examined her, or how she got a bump on the head the doctor had testified he found.

Dotson, who appeared before the board earlier in the day, said "From the day of my arrest ... I told anybody who would listen I was not guilty" of raping Mrs. Webb.

Dotson, free on bond after spending six years in prison, spoke haltingly and frequently sipped water during more than two hours of testimony.

The "nightmare doesn't seem to end," Dotson said, but "I don't know what else I could do or should have done to prove that I was not with Cathy Webb on July 9, 1977," the night of the alleged rape.

Thompson, who called the board into session to consider Dotson's case, chose for the first time in his eight years as governor to preside over one of its hearings. He said "the Illinois justice system is being examined by the world."

Mrs. Webb, formerly of suburban Homewood, testified in 1979 that she was raped by Dotson, who was then convicted of rape and aggravated kidnapping, and sentenced to 25 to 50 years in prison.

## Officers arrested on burglary

MILAN, Mich. (AP) — Three of this farm town's 12 police officers and one ex-officer have been arrested on burglary charges and the police chief said Thursday his department's credibility is suffering.

"I know this is going to be talking all of us," chief Chip Snider said, one day after the state attorney general announced the charges on Wednesday. "In the minds of the public, it's not three officers, it's the Milan police force."

The former sergeant and three senior patrolmen turned themselves in to state police Wednesday and were

charged with a total of 36 counts, including conspiracy to break and enter, breaking and entering an occupied building, larceny from a building and conspiracy.

The four are accused of burglarizing four businesses between 1982 and 1983 in the community of about 6,400 people 50 miles west of Detroit, Snider said.

Sgt. Phil Tommelen, 39, had resigned from the force last year. Patrolmen Ron Hall, 32; David Whitelaw, 30; and Peter Campbell, 29, were suspended effective Thursday.

## Weather ranges to extremes in various regions

WASHINGTON (AP) — While the East Coast struggles with drought, many Midwestern and Far West states are reporting unusually wet conditions, the U.S. Geological Survey reported Thursday.

Four record-low streamflows were recorded in Connecticut and other record lows were noted in New Jersey, Massachusetts, Georgia and North and South Carolina.

Missouri, New Mexico, Utah and Oregon averaged near record-high flows for April.

"Record or near-record low streamflows — including some of the lowest April flows in nearly 50 years of record — were reported all along the East Coast from Maine to Florida in April," the survey said in its monthly summary of water conditions.

The Pomperaug River at Southbury, Conn., for example, averaged only 38.4 million gallons per day, a record low at 76 percent below normal. By contrast, government water experts reported that "many streams in Michigan, Colorado,

The combination of wet and dry conditions resulted in the total flow of the nation's three biggest rivers — the Mississippi, St. Lawrence and Columbia — averaging just over 1 billion gallons a day in April, 12 percent above normal for the month. The three drain about half of the 48 coterminous states.

## 75-year-old fails with mercy-killing defense

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP) — A 75-year-old man who used a mercy killing defense was convicted of first-degree murder Thursday for shooting his ailing wife, and a judge sentenced him to life in prison.

Roswell Gilbert had testified that he shot his wife Emily, 73, out of compassion because of her suffering from progressive senility and a bone disease.

Judge Thomas Coker Jr. immediately sentenced Gilbert to life in prison, with a 25-year minimum, mandatory term. Because the state waived the death penalty, Coker noted Florida law allows no other punishment for first-degree murder.

"He's numb right now," said defense lawyer Harry Gulkin, adding he would appeal. Gilbert's bond was revoked after the verdict and he was taken to jail pending a Friday hearing to determine whether he could be released pending appeals.

Witnesses testified that Mrs. Gilbert had longed for and begged for death.

Gilbert sat stoically as his only child, Martha Moran, burst into tears when the verdict was read after five hours of deliberation.

"They killed my father," Mrs. Moran wept.

The jury, which recommended leniency, also could have returned lesser verdicts of 2nd-degree murder or manslaughter.

Mrs. Gilbert, 73, who was killed March 4 in their apartment, suffered senility from brain degeneration caused by Alzheimer's disease and from osteoporosis, a painful bone disintegration.

Gilbert was indicted on first-degree murder after he admitted shooting his wife twice in the head with a pistol.

Supporters of Gilbert said the conviction and sentence will aid their cause to legalize mercy killing.

"I think the sheer shock of the harshness of this sentence will provoke thought and action," said Derek Humphry, founder of the Hemlock Society, a pro-euthanasia lobby, in 1977 in England mixed a lethal potion for his wife of 22 years to end her suffering from cancer.

Lawyer Joe Varon begged jurors in closing arguments earlier Thursday to ignore laws and set legal precedent with an acquittal.

"There is no law to fit this situation," Varon told jurors, two of them grey-haired women. "She was sick. There was no hope. She was wracked in pain."

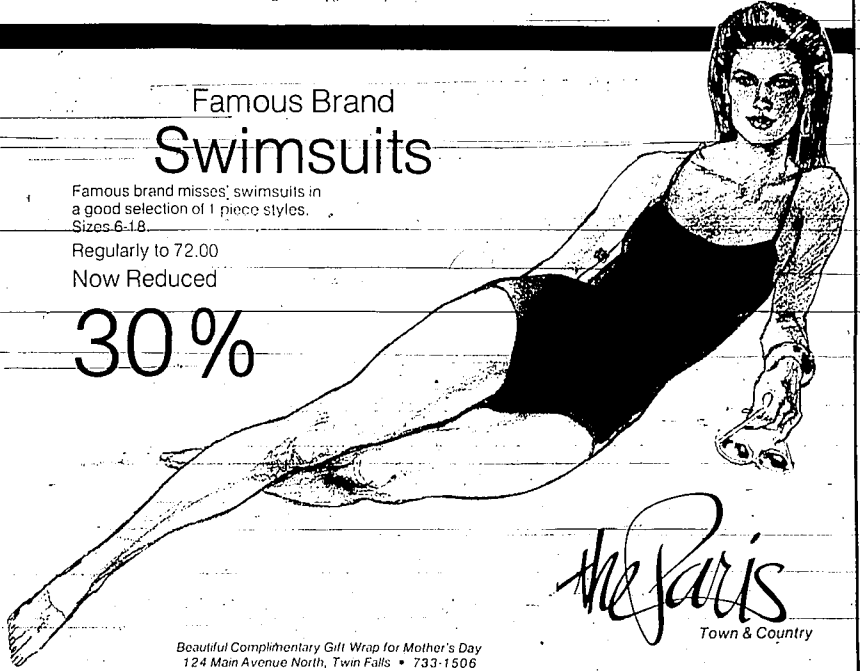

## Schroeder to get more tests

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Artificial heart patient William Schroeder's body is absorbing blood that washed over his brain tissue, causing a stroke, but more tests are needed to give doctors a better idea of his condition, a hospital spokeswoman said Thursday.

The only tests performed so far were a pair of CAT scan X-rays, which showed bleeding in the brain Monday and no new bleeding Tuesday.

The cause and source of the bleeding has not yet been determined, Humana Hospital, Audubon spokeswoman Donna Hazle said after speaking with implant surgeon William C. DeVries.

Schroeder, 53, remained in Audubon's coronary care unit in critical but stable condition Thursday, his 166th day with a mechanical pump.

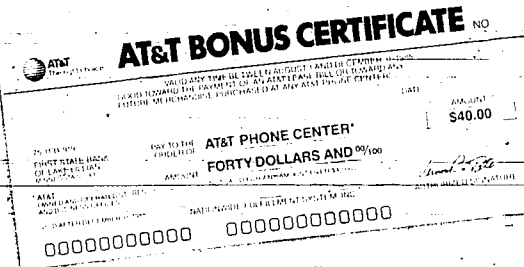
The bleeding didn't cause a buildup of pressure in the brain, which could lead to more damage, Ms. Hazle said. Asked what happened to the blood she said, "The body is absorbing it."

Schroeder appeared better than he did the day before, though he was not talking, said Ms. Hazle, Audubon's director of public relations.

There was more activity in Schroeder's right limbs Thursday and he was aware of activities around him, Ms. Hazle said.

Neurological tests to be done "at appropriate intervals" will include CAT scans, or computer-enhanced X-rays of the brain, and EEGs, or electroencephalograms, which monitor brain-wave activity, she said.

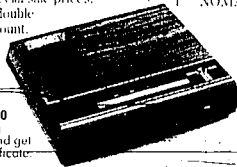

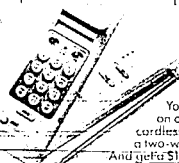

## Famed writer Michener gets big welcome home

DOYLESTOWN, Pa. (AP) — James A. Michener has received a welcome home quite unlike what he had imagined in his autobiographical novel 36 years ago, as residents rolled out the red carpet.

In his 1949 "The Fires of Spring," the main character, David Harper, returned to Doylestown with "less than a dollar in his pocket (and) a borrowed suit."

"I was a boy growing up here, a few citizens predicted that I would end up in the county jail," Michener said. "I never expected to be here under these terms, and I am delighted."

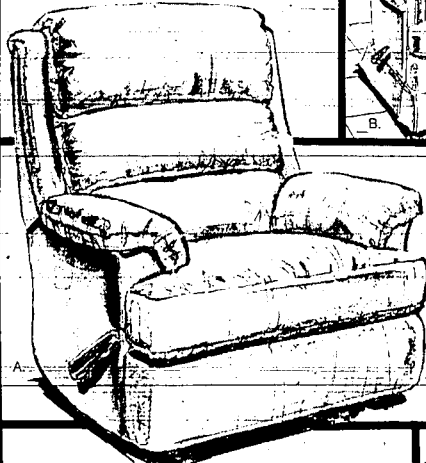
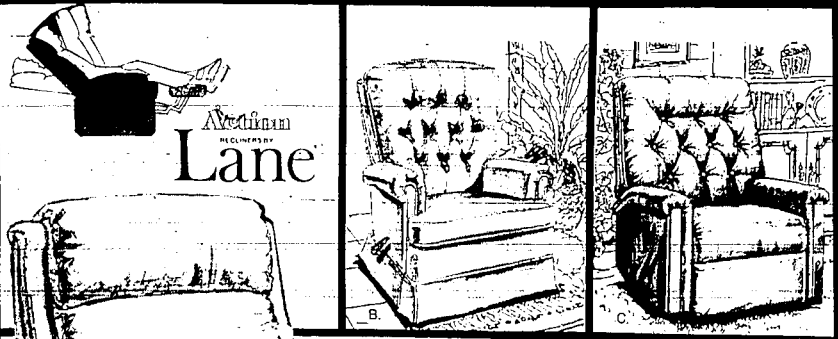

**College's extension well-used**

MOSCOW (AP) — The University of Idaho's Cooperative Extension Service, providing advice and assistance on everything from farming to food preparation, is used more widely than similar programs in other states, university researchers say.

Statewide, 45 percent of all Idahoans personally receive assistance or information from the service, according to a study conducted by John Carlson, a professor of rural sociology in the Moscow college's Agricultural Economics Department.

The percentage was even greater for those directly involved in agriculture. Carlson said his study showed 67 percent of the farm and ranch population had used extension services.

Corinne Howe, associate extension professor, focused on northern Idaho's Benewah, Kootenai, Bonner and Boundary counties. Her results also found that 48 percent of all residents and 75 percent of the agricultural segment had used extension programs during the preceding year.

"We're reaching a higher percentage of farmers than any other group, and that's our target audience," she said.

A recent national survey found that 27 percent of all households questioned had used local cooperative extension service or contacted an extension agent. In the 13 Western states, the figure was 24 percent.

Ms. Howe said the unusually high use of extension programs in Idaho may be due to its more rural nature.

Carlson's analysis showed that throughout the state, farmers and those with higher educations tended to use extension services more than others, and women used them more than men.

**Inmates penalized to stabbing**

BOISE (AP) — Two Idaho Penitentiary inmates who admitted stabbing a third prisoner last fall have been sentenced to serve five more years in prison.

Fourth District Judge Alan Schwartzman on Wednesday ordered Gary Garzee, 31, and Brent Barron, 22, to begin serving the sentences after their current prison terms are finished, Ada County Deputy Prosecutor Mike Henderson said.

At an earlier hearing, Garzee and Barron said they stabbed Leonard Lloyd Reinke on Nov. 14 after he made "idle threats" to hurt them. They were accused of stabbing Reinke a dozen times in the head, neck and back with homemade metal weapons in a prison exercise yard.

BOISE (AP) — College of Idaho President Arthur DeRosier has been named to fill a vacant position on the Idaho Commission for Pardons and Parole.

DeRosier, 54, fills a slot left open earlier this year when the Idaho Senate refused to confirm the reappointment of Elbie Kiser of Boise on grounds she had been too lenient to violent criminals.

The state Board of Correction had interviewed seven people for the post left open when Senate President Pro Tem James Ritsch of Boise and Sen. Roger Fairchild, R-Fruitland, derailed Ms. Kiser's nomination.

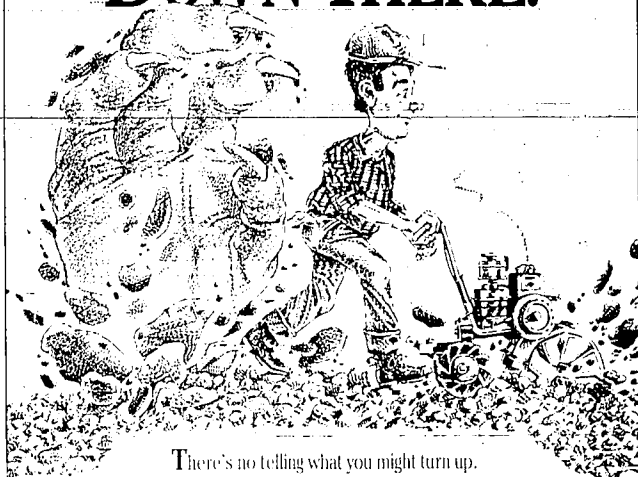

# 'Mountain man' backs son in testimony

VIRGINIA CITY, Mont. (AP) — "Mountain man" Don Nichols testified Thursday he could not recall his son taking an active role in helping him kidnap a wealthy woman athlete and insisted he would never lie to protect him.

Nichols, testifying in the trial of his son Dan, denied or said he could not recall occasions when the 20-year-old played an active role in the abduction of U.S. biathlon team member Karl Swenson last July.

"I wouldn't make up a story for him," Nichols, 54, said. "Lying just don't work."

The two men are charged with kidnapping the 23-year-old Bozeman woman and killing a would-be rescuer.

Both have admitted they kidnapped Miss Swenson as part of a plan to find female companionship in the mountain wilderness of southwestern Montana.

The younger Nichols is also accused of wounding Miss Swenson, who was chained to a tree, when searchers approached their wilderness camp the

following day.

He and his father are charged with deliberate homicide in the shooting of Alan Goldstein. The father, who is scheduled to stand trial later, testified he shot Goldstein, who brandished a handgun and ordered Nichols to drop a rifle.

The defense has contended Dan Nichols was so enraptured by his father that he had little choice but to accept Don Nichols' disgust with society and to adopt his father's lifestyle.

Under questioning by state prosecutor Marc Raecicot, Nichols said he would die, but not lie, for his son.

Nichols contradicted his son's testimony Wednesday several times, denying that Dan bought the rope used to bind Miss Swenson after her capture or helping tie her wrists.

Nichols also said he could not recall Dan telling him, "Yeah, let's keep her" when they first confronted Miss Swenson while she jogged along a mountain trail near Big Sky.

However, he added, "Dan tried to help me out.

He knew what I wanted. He knew what my plan was."

Despite Miss Swenson's testimony, Nichols said his son threatened to shoot any searchers.

He also denied telling her the only way he could keep Dan in the mountains was to "get him a girl."

"The girl was for both of us," he said, adding that the fact Miss Swenson was attractive was not the major reason they kidnapped her.

"She wasn't ugly," Nichols acknowledged. "Naturally, you don't want someone who turns you off."

He described his son as being "bewildered" at the time but also "excited because he thought she was a pretty girl."

—Miss Swenson, he said, appeared to be a "runaway girl" who would not soon be missed.

Nichols told state prosecutor Marc Raecicot he knew the abduction was against the law.

"But what you think is wrong I don't care," he said matter-of-factly. "I don't care what you think. I won't do anything that's unnaturally wrong."

## Contract murderer released

CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) — A woman convicted of hiring a man to kill her husband 11 years after he shot her in the abdomen and killed their unborn child was ordered released from prison Thursday by the Nevada Pardons Board.

Dona McCurley's release after almost 10 years in prison was applauded by co-workers at the hearing. Mrs. McCurley, who holds an daytime outside job with the Nevada Purchasing Division, cried and said, "Thank you. Thank you very much."

Mrs. McCurley, 42, was convicted of first-degree murder for paying a friend, Ron Hummel, to kill her husband, Ted McCurley, in 1975. She was first sentenced to a life term without parole, but the Pardons Board eased that to life with possible parole in 1979.

Hummel also was convicted of murder and is still in prison.

The woman said her husband continued to abuse her after the 1961 shooting, which killed her unborn child, adding that he would often point guns at her and pull the trigger without telling her the weapons weren't loaded.

Deputy Clark County District Attorney Don Wadsworth recommended against release. He said Mrs. McCurley arranged for a contract murder, provided a gun and made payments to Hummel.

But Supreme Court Justice Tom Steffen, a Pardons Board member, said the woman had been "terribly abused" and he could see how pressures would "build up and build up" in her case.

Steffen also noted Mrs. McCurley has worked days for the state for four years while living in a minimum-custody cottage outside prison walls without any disciplinary problems.

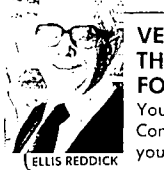

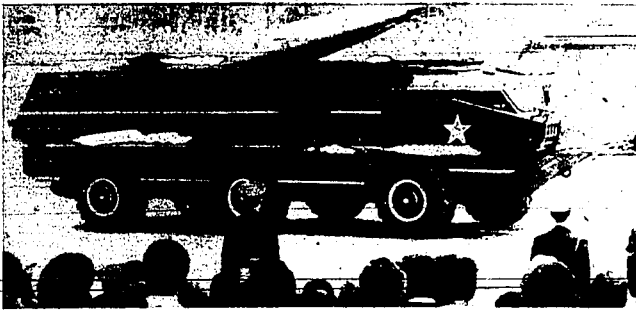

## Young soldiers join veterans in Moscow Victory Day fete

MOSCOW (AP) — Old and new paraded for Victory Day on Thursday — medal-bedecked veterans and the multiple-rocket launchers of World War II, young soldiers and weapons of the nuclear age — to commemorate the defeat of Nazi Germany.

Thousands packed Red Square in a chill wind and heard Defense Minister Sergei Sokolov pledge retribution on any aggressor, but appeal for "trust, cooperation and mutual understanding" among nations.

At a reception later, Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev said the world's problems can be resolved only through "a patient and constructive dialogue."

The sun broke through for the parade past the Kremlin on the 40th anniversary of V-E Day — It was May 9 in Moscow when the Nazis surrendered — included several pieces of military hardware new to Red Square parades, among them unarmed nuclear weapons.

A great cheer of nostalgia rose from the crowd at the appearance of the vintage truck-mounted launchers whose bargages of Katyusha rockets became the scourge of the German invaders in what is known here as the Great Patriotic War.

Red Army veterans, partisan and underground fighters, members of Polish and Czechoslovak divisions formed by the Soviets marched behind their wartime battle flags.

Gorbachev, who was 14 years old when the war ended, led members of the ruling Politburo onto Lenin's mausoleum to view the parade that climaxed a nationwide celebration.

Of the major NATO allies, only the United States and West Germany did not send their ambassadors to the parade. U.S. Ambassador Arthur Hartman stayed away because of the shooting of an American military officer by a Soviet sentry in East Germany last month.

## Beirut fighting persists

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Christian and Muslim militiamen unleashed artillery barrages Thursday all along the Green Line dividing Beirut, and militia street fighters opened fire on each other's strongpoints.

The new fighting swept away a cease-fire that had been declared Tuesday night but never fully observed.

President Amin Gemayel, a Christian, was reported under mounting Syrian pressure to get tough with militants defying efforts to end the fighting.

The artillery bombardment followed a night of clashes by the light of parachute flares.

The rival militias exchanged rocket-propelled grenade, 100mm recoilless rifle and machine-gun fire from strongpoints in shell-blasted buildings along the three-mile-long line that divides Beirut into Christian and Muslim sectors. Army commanders and the "security committee" made up of military officers and representatives of the three main militias sought to build a lasting cease-fire and to reopen the major museum crossing on the Green Line.

"But they appeared powerless to halt the fighting. And an attempt to reopen the important gateway failed when gunmen on both sides started shooting at bulldozers sent to flatten earthworks thrown up by the militias.

There was no major news word on casualties in Thursday's fighting. But at least 77 people have been killed and more than 400 wounded since April 28.

Usually well-informed sources denied a report from Abu Dhabi that Gemayel was expected to resign shortly and hand over power to a 16-year-old military government headed by Gen. Michel Aoun, the army commander.

Official sources in Beirut said that Syrian leaders have demanded Gemayel get rid of hard-line Christian militia commander Samir Geagea, who has defied Gemayel's efforts to end Lebanon's 10-year-old civil war.

Reliable sources in Damascus confirmed that President Hafez Assad of Syria "is determined that Gemayel oust Geagea "one way or another" to restore reconciliation efforts in Lebanon.

Geagea seized control of Christian forces on March 12 to protest Gemayel's pro-Syrian policies.

## Roof falls on pool; 13 perish

UNTER, Switzerland (AP) — A concrete and steel roof collapsed on a public swimming pool in a Zurich suburb Thursday, covering it "like a lid" and killing at least 13 people, a police spokesman said.

At least five injured swimmers were pulled from the pool, and rescue workers used jackhammers to break through the concrete slab in search of people trapped beneath it.

About 40 people were either in the 25-meter pool or on the deck beside it, when the roof caved in at 8:40 p.m., said Zurich state police spokesman Robert Tziesler, who described the scene as "catastrophic."

It was unclear how many people were trapped under the slab. The identities and ages of the known victims were not immediately released.

Rescue workers drained some water from the pool, then used jackhammers and their bare hands to dig at least one hole through the slab, enabling divers to enter the pool and search for survivors and bodies.

Workers at the scene said children and members of a local swim club were among those trapped.

Dozens of rescue workers and medical personnel were deployed, along with ambulances and three rescue helicopters.



# Pope may endure unpleasant trip

AMSTERDAM, Netherlands (AP) — John Paul II, the first pope to visit the Netherlands, will find a rebellion in the church. Protestant Catholics, centuries old, and one-third of the nation's police deployed to protect him from political extremists. His visit, which begins Saturday, has been widely criticized and satirized. Death threats have been made against him.

The authorities of one town said anyone carrying an insulting banner or shouting an insulting remark will be arrested. Large elements of the liberal-minded Dutch Catholic church are in open rebellion against what they claim are John Paul's attempts to make them follow more conservative policies. They are using the visit to publicize their conflict with the church leadership.

Holland has experienced four centuries of hostility between Catholics and Protestants that was born in the war of independence from 1568 to 1648, which finally ousted the Spanish overlords. The Protestant majority identified Roman Catholicism with Spanish oppression for much of that time, and church hierarchy was barred from functioning in the Netherlands until 1853.

Roman Catholics number 5.6 million in the Netherlands, roughly 40 percent of the population. About 10,000 police officers,

one-third of the nation's force, will be assigned to the five-day, seven-city tour, according to the Dutch Interior Ministry, which is coordinating security efforts. "Just" — military spokesman Victor Hofius said special security units, several of them traveling by helicopter, will guard the pope and handle any riots by opponents of the visit.

John Paul was shot and seriously wounded May 13, 1981, in an assassination attempt in St. Peter's Square in the Vatican. Known political activists will be under surveillance to foil attempts to disrupt the Netherlands visit, according to an Interior Ministry official, who spoke on condition he not be identified.

Those include squatters and extremists who form a mobile protest army specializing in military sabotage and disrupting major public events.

Targets of these groups have ranged from Dutch and NATO military installations to squatter evictions carried out by police in major cities. There were pitched battles in the streets of Amsterdam during the coronation of Queen Beatrix in 1983. Amsterdam is not on John Paul's itinerary, but archdiocesan spokesman said that because other cities have larger Catholic communities. Death-threat posters against began to appear last month.

# Brazil's congress restores popular vote

BRASILIA, Brazil (AP) — Congress voted Thursday to restore direct elections for president and to give the vote to millions of the illiterate.

The last popular presidential vote was held in 1960. Millions of Brazilians demonstrated in the streets last year for direct presidential elections, but the military regime that had been in power since 1964 would not allow them.

Brazil this year got its first civilian leader in 21 years, but he was chosen by an electoral college. The highly popular Tancredino Neves, 75, was the man chosen Jan. 15 but he died April 21 without taking office.

Jose Sarney, his vice president and now the president, promised to carry out Neves' campaign program, the major points of which are covered in the new amendment.

Senators and representatives worked out details of a complicated elections amendment to the constitution in a nine-hour session that lasted until 4

a.m. The final, combined vote by both houses of Congress was 484 to 0, with nine abstentions.

A constitutional assembly now will be called to determine when the people will vote for president. The amendment also makes it easier to create new political parties, including, presumably, now-illegal communist groups.

The new law also calls for elections Nov. 15 for mayors in state capitals — Brazil's major cities, such as Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Belo Horizonte and Recife — and in towns that the military regime had arbitrarily declared "security zones." Those mayors currently are appointed.

"There was yesterday, and there's today, and today is totally different. Today we have an absolutely free political system," Rep. Joao Gilberto, the sponsor of the election bill, said Thursday on nationwide television.

The new law gives the vote to millions of illiterates. This is expected to increase greatly the

number of registered voters in Brazil, a nation of 134 million people. Sixty million currently are registered.

Another provision would give congressional representation to the federal district of Brasilia, which has more than 1 million inhabitants. "This was a victory because it culminates all these years of fighting for direct elections," Sen. Fernando Henrique Cardoso, the government leader in Congress, declared Thursday.

During its two decades of rule, the military permitted direct voting for most lower offices. This year it voluntarily yielded power to a civilian administration, but insisted that the president and vice president be chosen indirectly in an electoral college.

Direct presidential voting became a popular and emotional issue in Brazil last year after Argentina shed its military rule and elected civilian Raul Alfonsin as president.

# South African rioting erupts

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — More rioting broke out Thursday as black townships with five blacks killed. The outlawed African National Congress said the nine-month "people's onslaught" has seriously undermined the white-minority government.

In another development, an autopsy report Thursday revealed that a prominent black union activist died of a brain hemorrhage hours after his release from police detention.

The Chemical Workers Industrial Union said regional leader Andries Radtsele was not taken to a hospital until eight hours after he was seen nearly unconscious in police custody Saturday. Union officials said he had been assaulted. Radtsele died Monday, three days after he was held

without charge.

Police said two blacks were killed in Soweto, the vast black township outside Johannesburg. The victims were identified as a young girl run down by a car that went out of control under a hail of rocks, and a man killed when police fired on a crowd with bird shot and rubber bullets.

In Duduza township east of Johannesburg, a 19-year-old woman died inside a home set afire by rioters throwing gasoline bombs, a police spokesman said. A black man was stoned to death in Thabong township in Orange Free State, he added.

A white soldier was killed in a collision between two army vehicles on riot duty east of Johannesburg, and a black man wounded in rioting in Soweto on Wednesday died Thursday in a hospital.

# Ethiopian illness threat rises

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia (AP) — More than 35,000 famine victims were reported flooding back to a feeding camp that expelled them last week, and one relief official said Thursday there were fears an epidemic might break out at the camp.

"If ever there were a situation for a life-threatening epidemic disease, this is it," said Tony Atkins, director for the U.S.-based charity, World Vision International. "It is a very precarious situation."

Atkins told a news conference there were not enough doctors, nurses, or nutritionists at Ibmec, 250 miles north of Addis Ababa, where World Vision, the Irish charity Concern, and the Ethiopian Orthodox church helped feed the drought victims.

There is no shortage of food at Ibmec but basic camp facilities are lacking, he stressed. Atkins returned to Addis

Ababa on Thursday from a trip to the camp and said, "We are not prepared to deal with what is happening."

Atkins said 35,118 had trekked back to Ibmec by dusk Wednesday. There is a health hazard because of insufficient sanitation and because most of those returning are sleeping in the open, he said.

International relief workers initially reported that 56,000 famine victims had been forced out of Ibmec April 28-30 and that some of the camp's makeshift huts were burned.

But U.N. Assistant Secretary-General Kurt Jansson on Monday said that number was based on a month-old camp census and that many peasants had left voluntarily two weeks before the mass evictions. He put the number expelled from the camp at 32,000.

Three dance students and three piano students also were awarded scholarships to the CSI Summer Music Camp. The dancers are: Amy Green, first place; Amy Boyd, second place.

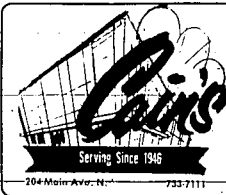

# 'Chinatown' sequel is declared 'dead'

HOLLYWOOD — When the phone rang Monday in Robert Towne's office at Laird International Studios in nearby Culver City, the half-dozen crew members gathered in the white-walled office quickly fell silent. Jack Nicholson was calling from New York and, judging from Towne's troubled expression, the group knew "Two Jakes" was in trouble. Flashing the thumbs down sign, Towne announced, "The picture is dead."

The news that Paramount Pictures had, at least, temporarily pulled the plug on the film caught industry insiders off guard.

On paper, this looked like the perfect project: a sure thing in a business where there are no sure things. Jack Nicholson had agreed to revive the role of Los Angeles private investigator Jake Gittes.

"Chinatown" screenwriter Robert Towne scripted the sequel and was signed to direct. Rounding out this gifted trio was 55-year-old co-producer Robert Evans, who would co-star as the other Jake; real estate tycoon Jake Berman, Gittes' nemesis.

"Not a single foot of film was shot, but they did get close. Studio executives raved about the script. Crew members, some of whom had worked on the original, raved about the sets. The first week's shooting was to begin April 30, had been mapped out to the last detail.

In the end, those who worked on the film say that "Two Jakes" was a victim of ego overdose. When director Towne finally decided Evans was not right for the Berman role, Paramount got nervous. "The main concern was that Bob Evans could not act his way out of a paper bag," said one executive who had helped shepherd the project. "Everyone was shocked it went this far."

In recent weeks, there were clues that the production was in trouble. More than 120 crew members have filed grievances with the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees charging they have not been paid for as much as two weeks work. Six Directors Guild of America members filed complaints as well. "As far as I know no one has been paid for the last two weeks," said IATSE spokesman Mac St. Johns. "This is very rare and it's outrageous."

The production has racked up a bundle of debt as well. According to a high-ranking production member, a number of suppliers have yet to be paid. More than \$50,000 is owed on

lumber, \$35,000 in paint and about \$100,000 is due to prop houses, according to one high-ranking crew member. All in all, he said, the production owes about \$1.5 million in pre-production costs.

A Paramount spokesman confirmed that the production has been postponed indefinitely and added, "Paramount has no further comment at this time." One studio executive said, "We're still straightening it all out here so we couldn't possibly comment."

What is clear is that a high-pitched debate between Towne on one side and Nicholson and Evans on the other was at least partially — but not wholly — responsible for Paramount's decision. Early on, Towne had written the Jake Berman part for Evans, a close friend for 20 years. Towne even included eccentricities exclusive to Evans in the script. In a scene where the three main characters are playing golf for \$1,000 a hole, Evans was portrayed humming at the tee, an Evans trademark. And even when Dustin Hoffman expressed an interest in the Berman role, Towne stuck by Evans.

But as the shoot date neared, Towne apparently got cold feet. The director shot several test scenes with Evans in makeup and it became clear to Towne that Evans was not his man. According to a crew member on the set, "Towne expressed concern daily over Evans' performance."

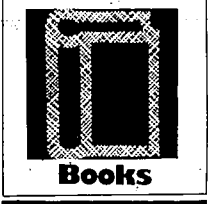

# New book tracks Nazism in America

"American Swastika" by Charles Higham reveals an unsavory dimension of our national character. Tracing the ignominious record of American collaboration with the Nazis from the 1930s to the present, Higham exposes the fact that luminaries such as Col. Charles Lindbergh, Allen Dulles of the CIA and auto magnate Henry Ford deliberately lent their support to the Third Reich.

Higham maintains that Nazi philosophy was openly espoused and propagated here until the outbreak of World War II. In fact, he shows that plots to assassinate President Roosevelt and replace him with an American Fuehrer were serious propositions for many in America's elite. For these people, collusion with the

Nazis was the lesser of two evils. Believing they faced a choice between right-wing Fascism or left-wing Communism, they embraced Nazism. During World War II, support went underground. Secret contracts be-

tween highly placed Nazi sympathizers and the German government continued. Higham writes that after the war, 280 suspected Nazi war criminals entered the United States — each with help from the State Department and the Immigration and Naturalization Service. The author tells how one Nazi spy master, Reinhard Gehlen, was hired by the Pentagon and CIA to head an espionage operation in Europe and allowed to employ former members of the Gestapo. Between 1946 and 1950, he was paid \$100 million American taxpayer dollars for his services.

As Higham points out, instances of moral blindness still abound. For example, Pope John Paul II recently appointed Adolf Hitler's personal banker, Hermann Abs, as head of a special Vatican banking council. We also learn that vast segments of the

American public are ignorant of growing Nazi activity and fail to question the aims of an openly anti-Semitic journal that refers to the Holocaust as a Jewish myth. "American Swastika" arrives at an opportune moment. As the social climate has changed, Americans have begun to examine the stark aftermath of World War II. Major American players of the period are dead and gone. A new generation can afford to contemplate realities that were too unpleasant for its parents and grandparents to even acknowledge.

Despite occasional lapses into esoterica, Higham's book uncovers the half-century-old American tradition of giving aid and comfort to the Nazi movement. Perhaps fresh and continued scrutiny of this kind will help bring a leathisome social disease under control once and for all.

# 'Outlaw' shows clash between old, new west

OUTLAW: THE TRUE STORY OF CLAUDE DALLAS by Jeff Long (Morrow, \$12.95) — If you're in the market for an insightful, captivating and coherent work of investigative journalism, this is it. Long details the personalities and events surrounding the 1981 murder of two Idaho Fish Game officers and the ensuing two-year, coast-to-coast manhunt for Ohio farm-boy-turned-buckaroo-outlaw, Claude Dallas. Long's narrative is spellbinding as he paints a layered portrait of life in today's American West, contrasting traditional values with contemporary realities. It's the stuff Hollywood would eat up. Dallas personifies the fading ideals and passions of the Old West, while his victims are the perfect symbols of the red-tape, by-the-book bureaucracy of 20th-Century law and order. As a result, Dallas' cold-blooded act and his defiance take on near-legendary

proportions. Long's fact-filled storytelling is to be commended. — MARTY LIEBEHMAN



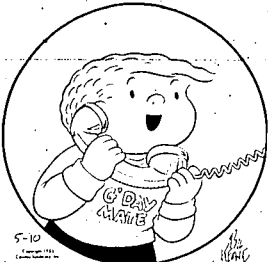

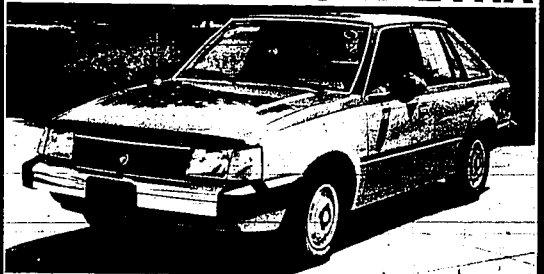
