

Health insurance debated

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The administration opened debate in the House Thursday on its national health insurance plan and ran into opposition from union leaders who want to broaden the proposal and some congressmen who want to hardow it. The hearing before two health subcommittees marked the opening round of House discussions on the issue this year. The Senate Finance Committee is working on a separate health proposal tending largely toward protection against the costs of catastrophic liness.

The House hearing was exploratory, with IEW Secretary Patricla Harris voicing administration policy, AFL-ClO President Lane Kirkland and United—Auto-Workers-President-Douglas-Fraser-backed—amore expensive plan offered by Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., and sponsored in lite itoluse by Rep.—Henry Waxman, D-Calif.—About 23 million Americans have no health insurance, and 41 million more lack protection against huge medical bills.

President Carter would gradually phase in a-comprehensive-health-plan-with-a-goal-of-universal-coverage. The first phase would protect American workers and their families from medical expenses above \$2,500 annually and provide free care for mothers and their infants.

Opponents say the phase d approach is misguided. "Since only one phase of a comprehensive program is proposed," said Fraser, "the administration's plan would self-destruct unless future Congresses enacted additional phases."

There have been reports across the country that automobiles parked, alon dry leaves burst into flames in the last several weeks because of the converters' high heat, officials said.

And in Hartford, Conn., three cruising patrol cars burst into flames last spring when the hot converters corroded metal floorboard plates and ignified interior carpeting, police officials there said Thursday.

Although no injuries were reported in the fires, consumer auto safety advacates promptly called for lougher federal safety requirements and renewed investigations of possible hazards from using the devices.



School board shows discrimination

In the Minidoka schools, it appears the drop-out-prone children of migrant workers

drop-out-prone children of migrant workers have extra reason to drop out.

Last week the school board was offered a program paid for entirely by a grant to help young, potential drop-outs, but the board didn't take the Migrant Education Resource Center up on the offer:

School officials had identified 12 such students, and, but distinged their secrets:

school officials had identified 12 such sti-dents and had obtained their parents; permission. MERC director Stan Patterson says in Minico schools about 50 migrant children are usually enrolled in the lower grades but only one or two attend high school.

The program was a chance to try to stop that devastating drop-out pattern.

Instead, several board members made comments about the program not applying to

Board member Hai Stevenson-said, "They

have to be labeled migrant. We have our own kids. We can't get federal funds for them." The project would have identified potential drop-outs among minority students and provided special services, such as living skills

classes.
Since last week's meeting, it has been learned that a modified program applicable to a broader range of students has been found and will probably meet with the board's

But by failing to accept the original program, the Minidoka School Board forgot that its purpose is to educate all students.

One school trustee said that not enough was known about the proposal and that it was sprung on the board only that night. If that were the problem, the trustees should have asked for more information and more time.

Instead, the chance to help a youngster stay in school was turned down hecause of how his parents make a living, and one can't help wondering if it wasn't also because of his

cthnic origin and the color of his skin.

One board member knows better, and realizes if even one student can be prevented from dropping out or can advance just a little further in his education, the program is worthwhile.

Jim Brown, who couldn't get a second on his motion to accept the program, said, "I'm in favor of anything that will help the kids, no

matter what their color or background."

Unlike Brown, some of the people who run
the school district do not consider some
students "as one of us."

The school board has thus set a poor example for the generations of youngsters growing up in the district and being taught he lessons of democracy.

At their next meeting, the modified program should be accepted.

But more importantly, the board members should show what they are made of and admit they made a mistake by excluding a group of people from what is supposed to be a demo-eratic society.

Kuhn says no more penalties for Martin

NEW YORK (UPI) — Baseball commissioner Bowie Kuhn, after investigating thoroughly the Minnesota bar room brawl incident involving Billy Martin, Thursday refused to impose any further penalties on the former New York Yankees' manager but warned him that any future such conduct would result in severe disciplinary action.

While many had speculated that Martin might be suspended from baseball by the commissioner for his bar room fight with marshmallow salesman Joseph Cooper in Bloomington, Minn. last month, Kuhn said Martin's beling dismissed as manager of the Yankees was a severe enough penalty under the circumstances. However, in a personal letter to Martin, Kuhn said he would not hesitate to Impose harsh personal letter to Martin, Kunn Sand he would not hesitate to Impose harsh penalties if such incidents occurred in

penalties if such incidents occus and the future.

Martin, who was fired by Yankees' principal owner George Steinbrenner tast month after his involvement to a bar room fight in Bloomington, Minn, met with Kuhn earlier this month to present his side of the story. The commissioner's decision indicates he did hold Martin entirely to blame for the incident.

"While I recognize the possibility of certain provocations in the Bloomington' incitent; and while you, have explained your motivations and tactions in prior matters of this type; I think you will agree that the cumulative effect of these incidents tends to indicate you have not taken every "reasonable step to avoid a fight," Kuhn told Martin in his letter.

"You assured me at our meeting, however, that in the future, and not

withstanding possible provocation, you will take every measure to insure that this type of brawling, which places baseball and you personally-in-such an unfavorable light, will not happen again.

"Because I believe your intent to be sincere, and taking into consideration that you have been relieved of your dulies as Yankee manager, I am taking no action against you, other han to warn you that any repetition of this type of behavior on your part will

result in my exercising stern dis-ciplinary action against you, and I assure you I will not hesitate to do so."

Reached in his office in New Orleans, Martin's lawyer, Ed Sapir, said the commissioner's decision proved that Steinbrenner had overreacted in his firing of Martin.
"It proves to the whole world that George Steinbrenner was wrong and misled the public," said Sapir. "When I asked him if he would wait until the commissioner's investigation was complete before he fired Billy, he said 'no, because the commissioner will bam Billy from baseball like he did Willie Mays." 

Spurs fine Silas \$2,000 for 'no show'



New furnace shaves fuel demands 15 %

WASHINGTON (UP1) — A new oil furnace has been developed which can cut fuel use by more than 15 percent, saving homeowners perhaps \$110 a year, the Environmental Protection Agency said Wedhæsday.

The furnace, developed by Rockwell International, Canaga Park, Calif., under an EPA contract, operates with a small amount of air, thus reducing energy loss, and has a larger-than-normal heat transfer surface, the EPA said.

Stephen Galge, assistant EPA administrator for research, said the furnace was tested in six homes in Albany, N.Y., and Boston düring the pusit two winters.

conventional furnaces, each requiring about 800 gallons of oil per winter. The new EPA furnace cut fuel needs by an average of 120 gallons," Gage said.

With oil costing about 90 cents a gallon now, this 15 percent fuel re-duction would mean an annual saving of about \$110 for each home," he added of abo

EPA holds the patent on the furnace but will make it available royally-free flaghdusty, the agency said, it added that Rockwell "recently introduced the new technology to the furnace manufacturing industry." An EPA spokesman said no company has yet started to manufacture the furnace.

Dracula': Something to sink your .

Count Dracula has died a thousand_deaths - on stage, screen and television, in comics, novels and stories and still his lethal plamour

What is it about this infamous Prince of Darkness that continues to fascinate audiences everywhere?

For one thing, the notion of Vampires challenges our sensibilities. Intellectually, we know that the idea must be flonsense, yet when we see the tale unfold, we cannot help but wonder if such a grim possibility exists.

Whatever the reasons, the legend of Dracula lives!

On December 6, 7 and 8, the-1 CSI Drama Department will present the Crane Johnson version of the classic horror story in this particular ren-Dracula is spoken about more than he is seen. His few appearances, howey er, are quite sensational and will leave the audience shuddering in their seats.

Director Tony Mannen, CSI assistant professor of speech and draina, has set the Gothie tale in London about 1940. The central character in this version, which is very close to the original book by Bram Stoker, is actually Professor Yan Helsing, a noted Dutch metaphysicist and authority on vampires, When he is called to examine the ailing fiancee of his good friend Dr. Seward, his suspicions are immediately aroused by the two small pinpricks on her neck. The young woman seems to be suffering from anemia and horrifying nightmares.

Some time after. Dr. Seward Seceives an unexpected visit from his neighbor: Count-Dracula, Van Helsing is 'disturbed by Dracula's odd rantings. Once he learns of the Count's background and performs a small experiment, . the professor's suspicions are confirmed. The play now, becomes a battle between the two for the immortal soul of

Discussing the production with Tony Mannen, I asked that the problems he encountered. The various roles, he felt, are extremely challeng-ing to his actors. There is a great temptation to overdo "Dracula" or play it in a "campy" style. Mannen is treating the play as serious

'Dracula': Something to sink your

Count Dracula has died a thousand deaths - on stage, sereen and television, in comics, novels and stories and still his lethal glamour

.What is it about this infamous Prince of Darkness that continues to fascinate audiences everywhere?

For one thing, the notion of vampires challenges our sensibilities. Intellectually, we know that the idea must be nonsense, yet when we see the tale unfold, we cannot help but wonder if such a grim possibility exists

. Whatever the reasons, the legend of Dracula lives!

On December 6, 7 and 8, the CSf Drama Department will present the Crane Johnson version of the classic horror story In this particular rendition. Dragula_is_spoken. about more than he is seen His few appearances, however, are quite sensational and will leave the audience struddering in their seats.

Director Tony Mannen, CSI assistant professor of speech and drama, has set the Gothic . tale in London about 1940. The central character in this version, which is very close to the original book by Bram Stoker, is actually Professor Van Helsing, a noted Dutch metaphysicist and authority on vampires. When he is called to examine the ailing fiancee of his good friend Dr. Seward, his suspicions are immediately aroused by the two small pinpricks on her neck. The young woman seems to be suffering from anemia and horrifying

nightmares.
Some time after, Dr. Seward receives an unexpected visit from his neighbor Count Dracula. Van Helsing is disturbed by Dracille's odd rantings Once he carns of the Count's background and performs a small experiment, the professor's suspicions are confirmed. The play now becomes a battle between the two for the immortal soul of

the lovely Lucy.

Discussing the production with Tony Mannen, I asked what, problems he encountered. The various roles, he felt, are extremely challenging to his actors. There is a great temptation to overdo "Dracula" or play it in a or play it in a "campy" style. Mannen is trealing the play as serious

That obviously can be offensive. One of the most quoted critics, Lutheran minister Robert E.A. Lee, told one interviewer: "Sometimes religion is fair game if the satire is simply a social spoof of an institution. But in this case, it's out-and-out mockery of something

very sacred to many people."

demned" rating for "Brian," asserting "the final Crucifixion scene, with its clear parallels to the Gospel story, plays as a mock-ing parody of the cross and the redemption of Christ.

Nobody can discount the distaste any individual might feel for the Monty Python film, but "Brian" can be defended on more than just

freedom of expression grounds. My own theory about attempts to blend the sacred with the silly is that, in general, the funnier it is and the better the comedy point is made, the less justification for judging it crude or tasteless.

The closing seene in "Brian" of dozens being crucified but all singing cheerily about looking on the bright side of things isn't cleverly funny and therefore has a greater chance to be offensive.

Christians recall the Crucifixion and the Messiahship of Jesus as uniquely—significant—events—of Ist-century Palestine for their faith. At the same time, crucifixions -were- a - common - form -of punishment and there were many would-be messiahs and prophets These provide justifiable premises

Whether the Python clan intended or not, the film is a reminder of the brutality of that era. Though couched in comedy, three scenes - a stoning, the arena killing for sport and the crucifix-- represent countless examples of innocents falling prey to idiotic and unjust torture. The idlocy of it all approaches absurdi-ty, which after all is a key element

In each of those scenes in "Brian," the situation is reversed: The soldier organizing the stoning the arena wins over the gladiator and the men sentenced to crucifixion make light of it and in the end mock death. Such situation reversals are characteristic of comedy and, some might say, of re-

ABC welcomes new media technologies

Times service NEW YORK — ABC TV is en-tering the 30s with full confidence it—can hold—its compular the marketplace invaded by new communications ... technologies because of the network's long experience as a provider of entertainment and informational programming, according to Frederick S. Pierce, president of ABC Television :

He \predicted that advertising revenues in 1984 would double the record revenues of the current year, as a result of the growing demand by advertisers for television time, increases in viewing and inflation.

"There will be more competition, and the new media will be claiming some of our audience, but the size of the pie is growing. By that, I mean that people will be watching more television than ever before," Pierce said Wednesday in an interview with editors

and reporters of The New York risk, largely because of growing Times,

"The average viewing time per nousehold now," he said, "is at six hours and 44 minutes a day; and because of the energy problem and because of the energy problem and inflation, people are going to be spending more and more time before the set for entertainment, information and news. With gas, prices continuing to rise, people are going to stay home more. It's possible, too, that businesses will go to a four-day workweek to

conserve energy. The new technologies of cabletelevision. television, pay-television and playback devices will also contribute to the increase of television usage, according to Pierce. "Because they'll be offering the consumer greater program

He added that although ABC's revenues would be expanding, so would the amounts it spent for programming, as well as the dimensions of the programming competition.

In that regard, he spoke of ABC's recent record investment of \$225 million for the rights to televise the 1984 Summer Olympies from Los Angeles, more than double NBC-TV's investment four years ago in the rights for the 1980 Summer Games from Moscow.

Despite the view of some financial analysis that ABC could lose as much as \$40 million on the Olympics package, Pierce expressed confidence the 200 hours of coverage would realize \$400 million in advertising sales, an amount he said would make the broadcasts nicely profitable:

"The 1904 Olympics are a classic situation. They will be the first Summer Games to be played in the United States in modern broadcast history, some 50 years, and most of-the events will be televised live. Patriotism and national pride will figure Into it, and American industry and advertisers will want to
