## Minorities

### Racial strife rare in 'predominately white' region

**TWIN FALLS** — Despite some diversity in ethnic heritage, south-central Idaho does not have large populations of racial, ethnic or religious groups that have typically been recognized as America's minorities.

Statistically, it would be difficult to find many regions in the United States characterized more by a white, Anglo-Saxon and Protestant composition than the Magic Valley.

The percentage of black, American Indian and Asian residents in this eight-county region falls well below the state and national averages.

Only Hispanics in the Magic Valley have a population percentage

larger than the state or national figures. This relatively high percentage of Hispanics causes the area's percentage of minority members to exceed the state level by nearly 25 percent.

But compared with the demographic composition of the U.S. population, neither the Magic Valley nor Idaho is a melting pot of traditional minority cultures.

The proportion of blacks, Indians, Hispanics and Asians in the total U.S. population is more than two-and-a-half times greater than in the Magic Valley and is almost three-and-a-half times greater than in Idaho.

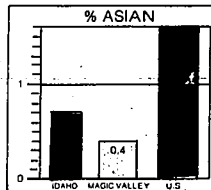
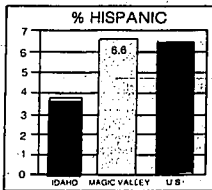
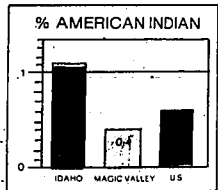
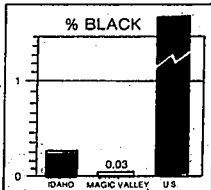
But in the Magic Valley, the lack of traditional minorities should not necessarily be construed as breeding racial or religious intolerance. In employment, there is little evidence that incidents of religious or racial discrimination are widespread in the area, reports Marilyn Shuler, the director of the Idaho Human Rights Commission.

To the contrary, in some respects the valley's record on discrimination is enviable. In a one-year period, from July 1982 to June 1983, the commission received 250 formal complaints alleging discrimination by Idaho employers on the basis of national origin, Shuler says.

The Magic Valley's share of those complaints was disproportionately low. The eight-county area contains 14 percent of the state work force, but its share of those complaints was only 5 percent, she says.

In cases of employment discrimination based on religion, however, the Magic Valley record may be less clear, she says. Of 15 cases alleging religious discrimination in Idaho, the three Magic Valley cases accounted for 20 percent.

## Helped the Third World U.S. rescinds UNESCO aid

**WASHINGTON** — With President Reagan's approval, the State Department Thursday formally announced U.S. withdrawal at the end of 1984 from UNESCO because of its "hostility toward the basic institutions of a free society."

State Department spokesman Alan Romberg read a prepared statement that said the decision was made after a six-month policy review of U.S. membership in the Paris-based U.N. Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

"Now, at the conclusion of that review, we have concluded that continued U.S. participation in UNESCO does not serve the interests of the United States," the statement said.

"The decision to withdraw was made by President Reagan on the recommendation of" Secretary of State George Shultz, the statement said. "That recommendation was based upon our experience that UNESCO has extraneously politicized virtually every subject it deals with; has exhibited hostility toward the basic institutions of a free society, especially the free market and the free press; and has demonstrated unrestrained budgetary expansion."

The United States and other western countries particularly oppose UNESCO proposals for a New World Information Order, developed in response to objections from Third World nations about reporting from developing countries.

The western opposition centers on authority the plan would give governments to control the press, particularly in those states that have government-owned news agencies. The proposal calls for an international licensing system for journalists, controlled by UNESCO and member governments.

Asked if the withdrawal means the United States no longer is interested in the United Nations, Romberg replied, "That would be an incorrect conclusion." The decision to withdraw from UNESCO is not unprecedented.

In 1977, during the Carter administration, the United States withdrew from the U.N. International Labor Organization because it was "too politicized," but rejoined in 1980 after reforms were carried out.

## Phone utility gets breakup rate hike

**BOISE (UPI)** — The Idaho Public Utilities Commission granted Mountain Bell Co. an interim 3 percent, \$3.84 million rate boost Thursday to cover expected losses from the Jan. 1 breakup of American Telephone and Telegraph Co.

The action will increase rates for nearly all customers between 29 cents and 38 cents per month for one-party residential service, effective Sunday.

The increase is part of the utility's request for a total 12 percent, \$16.5 million hike.

Commissioners said the interim hike is only enough to allow the utility to make up losses resulting from the federally ordered divestiture. Other issues raised in the pending case will require more scrutiny, commissioners said.

The panel also noted it does not

normally award interim rate hikes.

"However, we are faced with unique circumstances in this case," the order said. "Mountain Bell is being separated from its parent corporation as the result of a lawsuit before a federal district court judge."

The hike will provide Mountain Bell with \$1 million for lost phone set and switchboard equipment rentals that AT&T will no longer have to pay after Jan. 1, spokeswoman Dana Howard said.

The company will use \$2.6 million of the hike to compensate for a change in capital costs under the divestiture, she said.

Another \$194,000 will be distributed to 14 other phone companies in the state, which receive revenues whenever Mountain Bell is awarded a rate boost.

## Drifting snow, winds mean driving hazards

## Pool plans could violate health codes

**TWIN FALLS** — Mayor Chris Talkington and City Manager Tom Courtney are concerned that preliminary plans for Twin Falls' new municipal pool may violate state health codes.

They also say the plans, developed by a Boise architectural firm, may not offer the most economical construction options.

"I don't think, in my experience, I have seen a case where we have hired a professional and had as many problems," Talkington told a Thursday work session of the City Council.

The special session was called specifically to address the pool issue.

Courtney told council members that concerns over the plans — developed by the firm of Gile-Armstrong — have prompted the city to seek an informal review from a Chicago-based YMCA official who specializes in pool construction.

Courtney said he would meet with the YMCA official in Twin Falls on Jan. 6, and he urged council members to attend the meeting.

Contacted after the meeting, Don Hutchinson, one of three Gile-Armstrong architects involved in the pool's design, said the plans do comply with

state codes and that costs for the pool complex are not out of line.

The city already has paid Gile-Armstrong slightly less than half of the \$30,000 fee stipulated in its contract with the city. That contract calls for the Boise firm to develop preliminary design plans, draw up final plans and supervise construction of the \$750,000 project.

According to Courtney, the preliminary plans appear to violate state health and safety codes in the following three areas:

• They fail to provide state-mandated depth levels for one of the three swimming areas

## Jesse Jackson heads to Syria to free U.S. pilot

**NEW YORK** — Presidential candidate Jesse Jackson began his journey to Syria Thursday, calling it a "mission of faith" and saying he hopes to bring home captured U.S. airman Robert Goodman Jr.

Jackson, traveling without administration backing, stopped first in New York and met privately at the airport with Lt. Goodman's mother, Marilyn Goodman. He also was to join up with several ministers accompanying him on the trip, then fly to Frankfurt, West Germany, before arriving in Damascus Friday evening.

Also in the party was a physician Jackson hopes will be permitted to examine Goodman

and Jackson's two sons, Jesse Jr., 18, and Jonathan, 17.

Syrian Ambassador Rafic Joueifat accompanied Jackson to National Airport. Asked if Goodman will be released to Jackson during the trip, the ambassador said "I hope so."

Jackson said he will be greeted by U.S. ambassador Robert Paganelli when he arrives in Damascus.

He also said he had been given "virtual assurance" he would be able to meet with Syrian President Hafiz Assad to make a personal appeal for Goodman's release.

Goodman, 27, of Virginia Beach, Va., a black bombardier navigator for the Navy, was shot down Dec. 4 during a U.S. bombing raid over Syrian-held territory in Lebanon. He is the only

U.S. prisoner of the Lebanese conflict.

Jackson said the length of his stay in Syria is "a bit open-ended," but he will remain for "a sufficient time to make the moral appeal."

"And if we're very fortunate ... we will bring in the New Year right, with something all of us can celebrate about," he said.

"I certainly hope to bring Lt. Goodman back," Jackson said. "We hope to see President Assad, religious leaders, Lt. Goodman ... we hope to gain his release."

"I would hope that on this pilgrimage, this mission of faith, that we will deal with the humanitarian aspect of this and rise above the political fray," Jackson said.

"Those that have the will to pray, that know the worth of praying and fasting, will share with

us the great spiritual discipline as we make this journey to Damascus."

In Los Angeles with President Reagan, Deputy White House Press Secretary Larry Speakes made clear Jackson is not representing the U.S. government.

"He will be going as a private citizen and has no official standing," Speakes said, adding that the U.S. embassy in Damascus will cooperate with Jackson.

A senior administration official, who requested anonymity, said Reagan refused to accept telephone calls from Jackson to discuss the trip because the United States does not want to "put any official imprimatur on any individual ... we didn't want to send any confusing signals to Syria."

## Idaho prepares firing squad

**BOISE** (UPI) — Idaho's corrections director says a firing squad will practice next month to prepare for the unlikely event that murderer Lacey Sivak is executed as scheduled on Jan. 31.

"I don't think there's a chance it will come down," Al Murphy said Thursday. "I wouldn't expect an execution in Idaho for 12 or 18 months — but that doesn't mean we can't practice and be ready."

"Firing squads have proven to be a lot cleaner and a lot faster forms of execution," said Murphy, who had experience with lethal injections while a prison warden in Oklahoma.

## Princess Caroline remarries

**MONTE CARLO** (UPI) — Princess Caroline of Monaco married Italian businessman Stefano Casiraghi Thursday in a low-key ceremony. Then, in a scene that might have come from an opera, the couple waded happily from a window to an applauding crowd outside the royal palace.

The pink castle looked like a fairy tale with its crenelated towers, rows of ancient cannons and guards in black jackets and blue trousers.

The palace drew a royal veil over Caroline's second wedding, a civil ceremony that did not have the blessing of the Vatican because she has not received a Roman Catholic annulment of her 1978-80 marriage to French financier Philippe Junot.

## Andropov absent from summit

**MOSCOW** (UPI) — With ailing President Yuri Andropov's seat still empty, the Soviet parliament Thursday concluded a subdued year-end session by adopting the Kremlin's 1984 budget and condemning "American militarism."

Though Andropov sent New Year's greetings to the 1,500 delegates at the Supreme Soviet, he did not explain his failure to appear or his 133-day absence from public view.

## Payment made in Morrow case

**LOS ANGELES** (UPI) — Two daughters of Vit Morrow won a settlement Thursday of their lawsuit against Warner Bros. studios and others involved in the 1982 helicopter crash that killed the actor and two children on a movie set.

Attorney Robert Irmas said Carrie Morrow, 22, and Jennifer Jason Lee, 24, accepted the out-of-court settlement of their suit claiming negligence and wrongful death against Warner Bros., director John Landis, helicopter pilot Dorcay Wings and others involved in filming of "The Twilight Zone" movie.

He said the terms of the settlement were confidential, but sources said the two girls had agreed to pay the women \$850,000. Warner Bros., which made the settlement without any admission of wrongdoing, refused comment.

counted for 20 percent of the state total.

But Shuler says the small number of total cases in this category doesn't provide conclusive evidence that the type of discrimination is any greater in the Magic Valley than in other Idaho locations.

Members of minority groups in Idaho also may be at a disadvantage because they are so visible in the state's homogeneous population, she says.

"It puts you under a spotlight. Because whether you want it or not, people are looking at you," she says.

Shuler says that in a largely white population, the behavior in which white persons engage is seen as just behavior by individuals. But in the same largely white population, the behavior of a minority-group member is seen as representative of the entire group. That, in turn, can contribute to stereotyped perceptions, which can ferment prejudice.

Shuler says she is aware of individuals who have located in Idaho because of the small minority population. But she says there is no evidence to suggest this motive for relocation is widespread.

"But it should concern us because it is a possibility," she says.

In the northern Idaho town of Hayden Lake, the Church of Jesus Christ Christian-Aryan Nations has headquartered its organization, in part because of the state's low proportion of minorities to the total population.

The Idaho Human Rights Commission last year successfully sponsored legislation aimed at curbing malicious harassment on the basis of race, religion, national origin or sex.

The legislation was opposed by the Aryan Nations group, whose members, it was alleged, had engaged in practices of harassing members of minority groups. The group has sponsored activities, including book burnings, in the Magic Valley since 1980.

But Shuler says groups like the Aryan Nations are not the only ones that threaten the well being of members of minority groups and of the community as a whole.

"The people who are not as extreme, who don't wish members of minority groups any harm, but just view them as inferior — they're the more dangerous."

"They teach their children (those beliefs). Those kinds of things are probably more pervasive," Shuler says. "That is the type of racism we should be focusing our attention on."

Courtesy also said he was worried that the plan called for an extensive wind screen — to be set up around the edges of the complex — to be located 40 feet from the pool. This would be too far away to properly protect the pool area from cold winds, he said.

Courtesy said that professionals in the field of wind-screen design say the screen needs to be placed as close to the pool as possible in order to be effective.

Again, Hutchinson differs, saying the proposed screen will provide the necessary protection.

Councilman John Peterson said the city needs some outside review of the preliminary plans before moving ahead further.

Representatives of the firm were not present at Thursday's council session.

In the meantime, council asked Courtesy to request that Cities of Armstrong slow down or put a temporary halt to the firm's preparation of the final building plans.

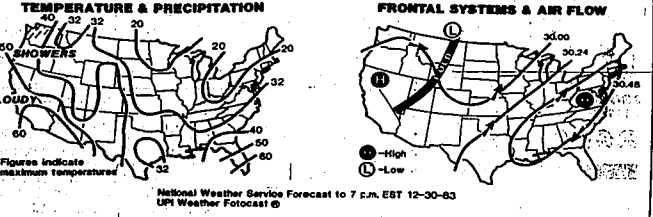

**Cassia, Prairie, Halley, Wood River Valley:**  
Winter storm warnings are in effect of snow, with new snowfall of 2 to 4 inches in the valleys and 6 or more inches in the mountains, are expected. Gusty winds will cause blowing and drifting. There is a chance of freezing rain in the lower elevation valleys. Highs near 30, with lows of 15 to 20. Decreasing snow tonight. Partly cloudy and a few snow showers on Saturday. Highs in the 20s.

Some gusty winds also will create areas of blowing and drifting snow.

As warmer Pacific air filters into Idaho, a chance of freezing rain will develop in the west valleys.

Temperatures around the state at mid-afternoon on Thursday were cool, under cloudy skies. The low western valleys had readings in the 20s near 30. At the higher elevations, the teens were the rule. The state's warmest mark was 31 degrees at Lewiston, after a low Thursday morning of 28 below zero at Stanley.

The extended forecast for the Magic Valley and southern Idaho for Sunday through Tuesday calls for partial clearing on New Year's Day, starting a mild January thaw. However, there will be increasing chances of more rain and snow Monday and Tuesday. Highs will warm from the upper 20s and low 30s on Sunday to the upper 30s and low 40s by Tuesday. Overnight lows will increase from the teens on Sunday to the 20s by Tuesday.

Elsewhere in the nation on Thursday, the warmest temperature reported was 87 degrees at West Kendall, Fla., and the coldest was 23 below zero at Worland, Wyo.

# Soviets push for Mideast troop pullout

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — Lebanese President Amin Gemayel met Thursday with the U.S. and Soviet ambassadors and the Russian envoy reportedly said Western peacekeepers should leave Lebanon "because they have been doing nothing."

The top-level meetings occurred as members of Lebanon's warring religious factions met for the second day against a backdrop of new skirmishes in and around Beirut.

Lebanese television had no official comment in its report on President Amin Gemayel's meeting with U.S. Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew, but state-run Beirut radio quoted Soviet Ambassador Alexander Soldatov as calling for all Israeli and Western forces to leave the country.

"Israel should withdraw from Lebanon without any conditions," the radio said. Soldatov told Foreign Minister Fita Salam

"As for the multinational forces, they should withdraw with Israel because they have been doing nothing," Soldatov was quoted.

No mention was made of Syria, which occupies most of northern and eastern Lebanon with an estimated 40,000 troops using Soviet arms.

Israeli forces control southern Lebanon and about 5,800 U.S., French, Italian and British peace-keeping troops are based in the Beirut area.

New fighting erupted on two fronts Thursday, with Lebanese army units coming under fire in the Shouf mountains overlooking Beirut and gunmen clashing in the capital's southern suburbs, Beirut radio said.

The shooting occurred as members of the country's warring Moslem and Christian factions met at a neutral location in Beirut to try to strengthen Lebanon's latest cease-fire. No details were released on the talks.

# Las Vegas policemen smash Thai drug ring

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) — Two Las Vegas policemen posing as drug dealers smashed a drug ring believed to have smuggled \$50 million of heroin into the United States from Southeast

Asia's Golden Triangle, police said Thursday.

Thai authorities would not identify the two American policemen but said their daring undercover work in

Chiang Mai province, 375 miles north of Bangkok, led to the arrest Dec. 21 of accused drug kingpin Kowit Manakul, 32, and Sakol Foo-Anan, 24, his alleged accomplice.

The two suspects were among 10 people indicted by a U.S. federal grand jury this week for involvement in a narcotics ring believed to have smuggled \$50 million worth of heroin.

# Junta leaders face charges

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (UPI) — Argentina's new civilian government arraigned two former military presidents Thursday on charges of mass murder, kidnapping and torture in court-martial proceedings against nine former junta members.

Among those to be arraigned Friday was former President Leopoldo Galtieri, mastermind of the abortive Falkland Islands invasion last year.

Ex-President Jorge Videla, the retired army commander who led the coup d'etat in 1976 against former President Isabel Peron, was the first

to be arraigned by the Supreme Military Tribunal.

He was followed by his friend and successor, ex-president and retired army Cmdr. Roberto Viola, and then by former navy Cmdr. Armando Lambruschini and ex-Air Force chief Omar Ruben Graffigna.

President Raul Alfonsin, the first civilian president in 1/4 years, signed a decree charging the former junta members with carrying out an anti-terrorist operation in which "thousands of persons were illegally kidnapped, tortured or killed."

# Salvadoran troops deployed

The Salvadoran army deployed 20,000 troops across the country Thursday in an unprecedented display of force against the nation's leftist guerrillas, military officials said.

In another development, the army claimed the leadership of El Salvador's largest leftist rebel group condemned seven guerrilla commanders to death for "treason" against the top command.

The army deployment, the first since

time in the 4-year-old civil war that so many troops have been sent into action at one time, encompassed 11 of the country's 14 provinces and involved 80 percent of the army's 25,000 soldiers, a Defense Ministry spokesman said.

# County stiffens dump watch

BOISE (UPI) — Owyhee County commissioners, dissatisfied with state and federal regulation, have adopted an ordinance requiring that a hazardous waste dump pay monthly fees and disclose classified business information.

Commissioners approved the ordinance Wednesday night. It will become effective Jan. 4 and it is printed in a local newspaper. Prosecutor Clayton Andersen said Thursday.

Under the new law, dump-operator EnviroSAFE Services of Idaho would be levied one-cent per pound of waste it receives at its Grand View and Bruneau sites. Payments would be due the first of every month beginning in February.

The money will be used for local inspections, emergency equipment

and clean-up costs, when the company closes the sites, Andersen said during an interview in Boise.

He said the funds also could be used to compensate landowners if they are damaged by the waste dumps.

Another provision requires EnviroSAFE to file monthly reports with commissioners that outline the origin, type and amount of waste received and truck routes used for delivery.

The company, which has already turned over some information to the county, is allowed to keep other data secret under federal confidentiality laws regarding business practices.

The information would be placed on file in the commissioners' office so the public may have access, the ordinance says.

EnviroSAFE Manager Rick Morton

said he has not seen the ordinance and can not comment on it.

Andersen said local officials passed the act because they are frustrated with state and government regulation and want to exercise more control over the remote waste sites.

"The county looked at the problem and looked at what had to be done," Andersen said. "If we always have to depend on the state or federal government, we're not doing our job."

The ordinance details a series of concerns surrounding the two EnviroSAFE dumps, including possible environmental and health hazards to residents and employees.

An introduction to the new law says Owyhee County questions the decision by state officials to allow continued dumping of industrial toxins in ESI burial pits.

# Nuke truck has wreck, no danger

LOWELL (UPI) — A semi-truck carrying low-level radioactive waste overturned Thursday on a snow-covered Idaho highway, but no environmental contamination was apparent, police said.

Idaho State Police troopers at the scene reported the truck and trailer flipped over and landed in a ditch along the winding highway, but the trailer remained intact and there was little fear of waste leakage.

The accident site was cordoned off until the truck could be uprighted and towed to Kooskia, Idaho, where an inspection team from a Washington nuclear installation was to examine the vehicle and its contents.

The accident occurred Thursday morning on U.S. 12 about 26 miles east of the northern Idaho town of Lowell, officers said.

Sgt. Mark Fosbury of the ISP Lewiston District said the vehicle, carrying uranium waste, was apparently bound for the Hanford Nuclear Reservation in Richland, Wash., when it overturned and landed in a ditch along the slippery road.

# State pursues water battle

BOISE (UPI) — Attorney General Jim Jones said Thursday his top priority for the 1984 legislative session will be to obtain three staff people to handle litigation stemming from the Swan Falls water-rights dispute.

Jones also said his office would ask lawmakers to reconstitute a state consumer protection division, to refine Idaho's fledgling drunken driving law and to reform the parole system.

And the Legislature would be asked to pass laws allowing judges to order compensation for crime victims and permitting victims to testify at sentencing hearings, he said.

"Our No. 1 priority is a supplemental and regular request for three people to handle Swan Falls litigation," Jones told a news conference.

He said the state is currently involved in three Swan Falls court proceedings.

The first stems from a state Supreme Court ruling a year ago upholding Idaho Power Co.'s technical right to 8,400 cubic feet of water at its Swan Falls Dam on the Snake River, the Republican said.

The high court has remanded to a district judge the question of whether the utility abandoned its rights by failing to assert them in the face of continued development of water systems along the Snake drainage, he said.

Jones said the second case involves a suit filed by Idaho Power Co. last spring against thousands of upstream water users.

A third suit was lodged in November by two eastern Idaho families challenging the 1983 Legislature's directive urging Gov. John Evans to negotiate a contract with the utility to protect upstream users.

## Bitter cold weather slated for encore

By United Press International

Winter's bitter cold sting returned Thursday, blasting the northern Plains with a low of minus 30 and reaching again into the weather-weary South. Forecasters predicted the month would end up the coldest December ever on many cities' record books.

At least 437 people in 44 states have died since the freeze took hold. Among them were 200 victims of exposure and 111 people killed in weather-related traffic accidents.

As freezing rain scrambled traffic nationwide, residents of Utah's Salt Lake Valley saw their first sunshine in 46 days.

Thunderstorms slowed emergency

harvesting of frost-damaged Florida oranges and officials feared a new cold wave would make their \$190 million losses grow.

"We certainly are concerned about the potential for another freeze, but we'll just have to wait and see how severe it will be," said Citrus Mutual spokesman Earl Wells.

A hard freeze was forecast for

southern Alabama and northwest Florida.

Violent thunderstorms raced through the South before dawn and turned streets and bridges into sheets of ice as temperatures fell. In Louisiana, all the bridges over Lake Ponchartrain were closed for several hours.

## House fires kill at least 18 people nationwide

Fires took a growing toll around the nation with at least 18 persons, including two children of a top Rockefeller executive in New York and four children and their babysitter in Philadelphia, reported dead Thursday.

Two children and a workman died in a fire Wednesday night at the New York town house of Thomas Barry, president of Rockefeller and Co. Inc. A third child and the babysitter who died with him in her arms were severely injured.

New York police identified the victims as Ryan Barry, 4, his sister

Hannah, 8, and Kevin Corcoran, 28, a workman who with another man was using a blow torch in an area where paints and paint thinners were stored.

Babysitter Maryanne Wallinger, 19, was critically burned as she fled from the flames with 8-month-old Oliver Barry. Both were hospitalized

with burns.

Police said Barry and his wife, Patricia, returned from dinner to find firefighters battling the flames.

Shaw said he yelled, "You aren't leaving me here. Get me back on a ship now. I'm going to live."

## Drummer's death accidental

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — President

Reagan expressed his sorrow Thursday at the death of Beach Boys drummer Dennis Wilson, who drowned in a swimming accident near the Southern California surf he helped make world famous.

The president and first lady invited the rock group to perform as the White House lawn last summer after Interior Secretary James Watt banned them from the Fourth of July performance on the Washington Mall.

Wilson, 39, drowned Wednesday

and junk" from a boat slip at Marina Del Rey. Investigators said he had been drinking for several hours with friends on a nearby sailboat before he dove into the 58-degree water and never returned to the surface.

An autopsy Thursday listed the cause of death as an accidental drowning. Coroner's spokesman Bill Gold said the results of tests to determine if Wilson was drunk were expected in about a week, while tissue and blood analysis to detect any drugs could take weeks.

## U.S. hunger report leaked

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Dr.

George Graham, a member of the President's Task Force on Food Assistance, said Thursday obesity is more of a problem among America's poor than hunger.

"I think what people are now calling hunger is having less income. That's

stretching things a bit," Graham said. "The biggest problem among the poor is obesity — not hunger."

He said obesity among the poor — while it is not a problem of malnutrition — represents a more serious health threat than hunger, especially among women.

## Toxic gas sent to 60,000

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (UPI) —

Officials said Thursday that "human error" at a utility plant operating only one day might have sent toxic gas to the homes of 60,000 customers, triggering an evacuation warning that was largely ignored.

About 50,000 residents of Lompoc and Vandenberg Air Force Base, northwest of Santa Barbara, and 10,000 utility customers in the neighboring Santa Ynez Valley were advised to evacuate Wednesday evening after it was discovered hydrogen sulfide had leaked into natural gas lines running from the New Los Flores

Canyon treatment plant. The plant is supposed to remove the substance before natural gas is distributed to customers.

"This problem never appeared during initial testing," Ina Rosenberg, a spokeswoman for Southern California Gas Co., said. "We're suspecting the possibility of human error. The facility itself is fully capable of doing what it was supposed to do."

She said the plant would remain closed — and customers would be served through alternative facilities — pending investigations by the utility and state officials.

## Presbyterians meet via television

Some 2,000 Presbyterians, scattered in congregations from Coon Rapids, Pa., and Alma, Mich., to Upland, Calif., and Stillwater, Okla., and 30 other locations, met together earlier this month by staying at home. They met by means of a satellite teleconference, an effort by church officials to more fully involve church members in the formation of church policy on particular issues.  
One of the standard criticisms leveled against mainline Protestant churches in the last decade is that too often, the positions they take on sensitive public and political issues are formulated by a group of professional staff members who have little or nothing to do with the average church member.  
The conference, described by church officials as a "modern-day, transcontinental town meeting," was an effort to meet that criticism.

"People often complain that (Presbyterian) General Assembly social policy does not reflect the views of church members," says the Rev. Dean H. Lewis, the staff director for the 3.2 million-member denomination's Advisory Council on Church and Society. The General Assembly is the church's highest decision-making body.  
"This teleconference will give Presbyterians an opportunity to have a say in one of the most complex, urgent and controversial issues we face as a church and as a nation," Lewis said.

The conference was the first such attempt to use "participatory television" as an aid to involve more persons in church-wide policy-making, he says.  
The topic for the conference was economic justice, and its purpose was to help the advisory council formulate recommendations about economic

policy, which will be presented to the General Assembly in 1985. The committee is expected to present an interim report, based, in part, on comments made during the conference, at the 1984 General Assembly.  
Under the town-meeting framework, several panels of experts, headed by former U.S. Secretary of Labor Ray Marshall, a Presbyterian leader from Austin, Texas, made presentations of economic policy from a studio in Atlanta.  
Participants, gathered in churches across the nation, then spent the next two hours discussing the presentations and formulating questions for the panelists.  
A final two hours was spent by panelists responding to the 35 questions phoned in to Atlanta.

Market off to strong start, rally fizzles as session ends

NEW YORK (UPI) — The stock market got off to a fast start Thursday on hopes for lower interest rates but wound up with mixed results in fairly active trading on the point-to-last day of 1983.

Analysts said averages were distorted by traditional year-end activities of portfolio adjusting and tax selling. There was no real trend in the surprisingly active session.

The Dow Jones industrial average, up five points at the outset after rising 0.5 Wednesday, shed 8.05 to 1,260.18. The Dow is up 213.82 for the year going into the final session Friday.

The Dow Jones transportation average rose 3.63 to 591.69 but the Dow utility average lost 0.87 to 131.79.

The New York Stock Exchange index lost 0.20 to 56.03. The average share decreased eight cents.

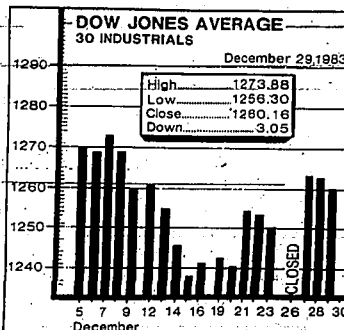
Standard & Poor's 500-stock index shed 0.49 to 169.66. Advances edged declines 845-796 among the 2,066 issues traded.

Big Board volume totaled 85,560,000 shares, up a bit from the 85,660,000 traded Wednesday.

The New York Stock Exchange index lost 0.20 to 56.03. The average share decreased eight cents.

The American Telephone & Telegraph when-issued stock was the second most active issue, up 1/4 to 17 1/2. AT&T "old" stock was third, up 1/4 to 61 1/2.

Economic indicators off slightly

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The government's sensitive leading economic indicators dipped 0.4 percent in November, the first slip in 15 months as the economy reacts to a slower growth rate.

The manufacturing index, the Commerce Department said Thursday.

A separate report showed the nation's trade performance continues to be at odds with the general business recovery, pulling up a \$2.3 billion deficit through November and assuring a record deficit of about \$70 billion the year.

November's \$7.4 billion trade deficit was the second worst on record, an improvement only compared with October, the month in which the nation spent \$8.97 billion more outside its borders than it earned.

A solid year of recovery gave economists in mid-1983 the confidence to view the government's leading indicators as a mid-course correction rather than an ominous turning point.

In Los Angeles, White House Deputy Press Secretary Larry Speakes said Thursday that this small decline is economically significant, but monthly decline is common during a recovery period.

He said the country is "settling into a long-term economic growth," and the recovery is "on target."

The Federal Reserve Board chairman Paul Volcker the drop may not have been a disappointment, as recently as Wednesday, in a West Coast speech, he repeated his intention to deliberately slow the rate of economic growth so prices will resist inflation.

"Despite the November setback the trend of the leading index is still upward," Commerce Secretary Malcolm Baldrige said, in a statement prepared by top department analysts.

"At this stage of the economic expansion, occasional dips normally begin to appear in the leading index." The 14 months of improvement, broken by November's decline, compared with 17 months of uninterrupted gains after the last big recession in the mid 1970s.

Earlier in the month the department's so-called flash projection of the gross national product pointed to a sharply slower growth already under way in the fourth quarter.

With a rate of near 4 percent considered necessary to reduce unemployment, the department said the economy was running at a 4.5 percent annual rate of expansion.

Earlier in the year the GNP pace peaked at 5.7 percent from April through June.

## Kachina exhibit opens at Herrett Museum

**TWIN FALLS** — "Kachinas are like angels," says Hopi Indian artist Richard Joshua, who claims the kachina spirits are more than 2,000 years old.

"They came here as messengers — they came to help people out. When they left, they told the Hopi people to represent them," he says.

Herrett Museum Director Jim Woods explains that the name kachina represents three aspects: the kachina spirit that is invisible, kachina dancers who wear costumes and perform precisely controlled dances and kachina dolls that were given to Hopi girls as symbols to represent what the kachinas look like.

Woods is putting together an exhibition of Joshua's carved wooden dolls and paintings that interprets the Hopi concept of the kachinas — the spirits of all invisible forces of life.

A reception will be held at the museum, located on the College of Southern Idaho campus at 7 p.m. Tuesday. The kachinas will be on exhibit in the art gallery through Feb. 9.

Woods says physical evidence of the dolls dates back only some 200 years. Made of perishable cottonwood tree wood, they haven't survived the ravages of time the way art of stone or clay has, he says.

The old ones are very simple compared to these," he says showing off six large dolls that are about two feet in height and 18 or 19 smaller ones that will be used in the exhibition.

He says Joshua carves the legs and

arms in separate units before attaching them to the body with dowels. A newcast and glass wood putty is then applied to the seams to give the illusion of a solid form, Woods explains.

Joshua, a CSI sophomore, began carving the dolls in 1968 shortly after returning home to Fredonia, Ariz. from an army tour in Vietnam. "I didn't stay in the city, but headed straight for the Hopi Reservation."

"I just needed rest," he says. There, his uncle taught him the art of kachina doll carving.

He says it only took him one summer to grasp the art. Woods adds that Joshua is a natural artist.

"He has a different sense of color than the Hopi people," Woods says. "Some of his color is very bright and culturally influenced. It even affects what he does in art class at school. I'm sure it comes from the influence of Southwestern native people."

Woods has seen the artist since 1975. An employee of Norman Herrett's at the time, Woods says that Herrett provided Joshua with 90 basement studio and paid him a wage while he carved dolls for the museum when it was still on Kimberly Road.

Joshua, now in Twin Falls at the time, also sold paintings to the public.

Joshua says it takes him about one week to carve and decorate a complete doll. A simple one takes about 30 hours. Boldly colored with acrylic paint, the dolls are dressed out with leather, yarn and felt.

"Each one stands for something," he says, listing the numerous models that are a tribal legacy.

Pointing to a painting of the Giant

## New Year's resolutions to help the arts flourish in 1984

**NEW YORK** — New Year's is the traditional time to evaluate the past and make resolutions designed for a better year ahead. From an almost endless list of needs, the following six points deserve a special effort on the part of everyone interested in the cultural life of America. If we were to build on only these about suggestions, 1985 would arrive with the arts flourishing in each land with more force and impact than ever before.

**GOVERNMENT.** When Jimmy Carter became president, I wrote a column proposing the establishment of a Cabinet-level Department of Culture. While the place generated substantial interest, the arts today remain without appropriate representation in

our national government.

When receiving this year's "Gold Baton Award" from the American Symphony Orchestra League for "distinguished service to music and the arts having significance beyond the community in which it originates," composer-conductor Mervyn Gould called for the establishment of Cabinet-level representation for the arts.

In his remarks, Gould said the arts "should no longer be orphaned or fostered or stop-children or token ornaments outside our social-political structure, but part of it."

The new agency, Gould continued, should "not be a naming action, but a recognition of our art."

What was important six years ago is more urgent today. It is unlikely the present government will understand or act positively, but it is good to have artists like Merton Gould

take up the battle.

**EDUCATION.** It is too late to save several generations of poorly educated children, but the current interest in and concern for quality in education at all levels must be reflected in progress for the arts as well as the so-called "basics." Actually, what is more basic or essential than the development of sensitivity, the power of concentration and a love of beauty without which living is mere existence?

The arts must not only be restored to earlier levels offered when I was young, but must be greatly improved and enhanced, particularly on the grade and high school levels. The arts are not frills, and so long as we allow short-sighted political leaders and educators to treat them as such, there will be no long-range hope for the arts or civilization as

we could make it.

**ADVENTURE.** It is education's task to open new vistas to the who are learning, but education is a continuing task, and audiences for concerts, dance, theater and our art and history museums must become more curious about that which they do not know.

We must open our minds and hearts to the unfamiliar achievements of man past and present, and train our eyes and ears to be alert and excited by the unfamiliar. Easy listening and viewing is essentially passive, and we need to be completely absorbed and involved if art is to have its fullest effect.

**RESPECT FOR ACHIEVEMENT.** It is good and proper that we have such events as the Kennedy Center Awards, Academy Awards and Emmy Awards, but we must recognize achievement in the arts on a

day-to-day basis.

Our poets might not actually lead us into a world of beauty and peace, but their ideas and the visions of our painters, choreographers and composers — must play an increasing role if we are to develop signs of hope in a world of despair.

**SUPPORT.** Financial support is significant, and must come first from individuals who truly care, corporations and foundations, and government at every level. Support, however, must also include dedicated attendance at worthy events, and thoughtful participation in the almost boundless riches of the performing and visual arts available today. Funding to the general public must be modified if we are to avoid making the arts the playground of the rich and elite.

Warrior Orge Kachina, he says. "The orge teaches little children to behave themselves," then adds that it's like being children that the orge man will get them if they aren't good. Other dolls represent guardians, hunters, clowns and virtually all positions in life. Woods says there are several involved different kachinas and that Joshua can make 30 to 35 of the different ones. He says even though there can be artistic variations in the

dolls, the helmet worn is a standard and is considered sacred according to customs. Though most of Joshua's hand-carved dolls have been for the museum, he has sold some 30 paintings of Kachinas since moving to Twin Falls. "One went to Gov. Evans," he proudly says, adding that the governor even visited him once when he was a patient in the veteran's hospital in Boise. Woods expects about 200 visitors

# '1984' not quite as book predicts

TWIN FALLS — For those of us growing up in the post World War II era, the year 1984 has stood out as a foreboding signpost of the worst of all futures.

Eric Blair, better known by the pen name George Orwell, painted a bleak picture of mankind in his novel "1984." In his book, mankind as we know it was non-existent. People were stripped of their individual consciousness and subject to unrelenting propaganda, existing constantly under the chilling eye of Big Brother.

He fantasized the world in a permanent state of war — not a nuclear holocaust, just one crisis after another broadcast by state-owned newspapers and television to justify long work hours and economic shortages.

Orwell's protagonist, Winston Smith, lives in Oceania, one of three interchangeable world powers where the individual human being has suffered assassination by government and where The Ministry of Truth rewrites history with its ever-chattering typewriters, while shredding old truths so as not to contradict the new ones.

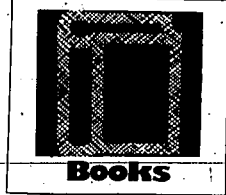
Two-way television viewers continuously monitor citizens, suppressing not only political resistance, but seeking out any independent feeling or, God forbid, acts of individualism.

Newspeak, a numbing form of doubletalk, has reduced language to no more than a tool of government and the public is further doped by fiction machines that manufacture novels and songs of a superlative variety.

The official "Party" slogan is: "Who controls the past controls the future. Who controls the present controls the past." Simply put, propaganda becomes truth.

Love, sexuality and the family have all been crushed under a snowdrift of technocratic obsession with conformity.

In this foreboding world, where tyranny, dehumanization, fear and hopeless poverty reign, Big Brother's hatchet man explains to Winston Smith, "Power is not a means; it is an end. Power is tearing human minds to pieces and putting them together

again in new shapes of your own choosing.

Orwell's book was not entirely a case of supreme imagination. He had to look no further than Josef Stalin's political purges that condemned to death 10 million of his own countrymen, women and children, and the subsequent Soviet recasting of history.

Hitler provided a fine example, also, with the horrible efficiency of his death camps and the oily smoothness of his propaganda machine. The Fuehrer's love affair with propaganda is well expounded upon in his autobiography, Mein Kampf. But that was then and now is now.

Now is 1984. The book "1984" is supposed to have an Earth geopolitically sliced into three antagonistic countries, Oceania, Eastasia and Eurasia, each having total control of its own perimeters.

Yet, the real 1984 has only two superpowers — but are not quite superpowers — but are not quite superpowers. Each, if anything, exhibits less direct leverage with smaller countries than during the years immediately following the second world war.

Moscow's dream of being the center of a monolithic Communist bloc has turned into a bitter nightmare with China, Albania and Yugoslavia stubbornly going their own way. And, for our part, one would have to be living in fairyland to not recognize that Western Europe and Japan now rival the United States economically while strongly holding themselves as separate and sovereign entities.

in Burma, he became an anti-communist and anti-imperialist who manifested his hatred of totalitarian rule by first writing "Animal Farm" then "1984".

"1984" as described by Orwell has not arrived in 1984, but he never claimed it would. The time is not important. The event is, he wrote. "I do not believe that the kind of society I describe necessarily will arrive, but I believe, allowing, of course, for the fact that the book is a satire, that something resembling it could arrive."

War! — Yes!

Orwell predicted nasty protracted wars at all places and all times propagated by the three superpowers to keep their citizens in a martial state of disarray. As it turns out, he simply used a favorite human pastime to satirize our deadly folly, much in the same way directed famous English satirist, Jonathan Swift, poked fun at the idiocies of his time.

He may have been wrong about the number, ideologies and likelihoods of superpowers, but he was right. No single year since 1945 has been free of the awful scourge that has claimed some 30 million lives in less than three decades.

Some 40 wars are presently involving a fourth of our planet's nations. Human blood is flowing in Afghanistan, Lebanon, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Kampuchea, the African Continent — ad nauseam.

The technology available in real-life 1984 actually reduces the barrier to Orwell to a basement workshop with a ludicrous hodge-podge assembly of bulky microphones, black and white televisions and manual typewriters.

Not only did his "1984" have no computers, but surveillance satellites, laser sensors, lie-detecting tests, handwriting and voice analyses, genetic screening and subliminal electronic messages would have been pure Buck Rogers to the author.

So with mankind being constantly and forever brutalized by war and with such sophisticated technology available it seems that Big Brother must be the ultimate winner. He probably would be if weren't for so many Little Brothers.

As an example, Igor Reichlin, a Soviet Journalist turned American Journalist, has authored an article about the double edge of technology and how the Soviets have tried to deoptimize the vastness of their empire with shortwave receivers only to have the possessors of those receivers turn them to Western broadcasts.

The idea of how the authorities try to stop this pernicious practice by jamming the airwaves and leaving out components of the citizens radios that will receive the higher frequencies of Western broadcasts.

The citizens simply buy the left out components and wire their sets themselves, the journalist writes. The article indicates that tens of millions of Soviet citizens listen to the Voice of America and Radio Liberty every week, suggesting the total dismantling of man's tree will may be an impossible task for any government.

## PBS airs legislative issues

**TWIN FALLS:** Idaho Reports, Idaho's only statewide public affairs program, will begin originating from the state capitol, next Thursday on PBS at 6:30 p.m.

The show is in preparation for the 1984 Legislative Session, which begins when a special presentation, Gov. John Evans' state of the state address will be broadcast live.

More than ever in the past, this year's legislative coverage will move out of the statehouse. As Marc Johnson says, "The Legislature is a dynamic process. It doesn't just take place inside the state capitol building. So what we will try to do is reflect how the debate is being heard and felt by those who will be affected."

Key decisions made in the next three months will have a long term impact on Idahoans and Idaho Reports will be there — covering the Legislature more thoroughly and consistently than ever before.

"For example," Johnson continues, "when the Legislature debates a bill to raise the legal drinking age, we will try to find out how a 19-year-old college student feels about that, or how a tavern owner feels. We'll report what the lawmakers are doing, but we'll also try and reflect how their decisions affect the constituents."

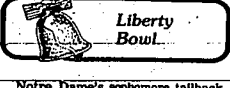

## Notre Dame outlasts Boston College 19-18

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI) — Blair Kiel set out to prove in Thursday night's Liberty Bowl he could play in the same league with Boston College's Doug Flutie and the Notre Dame quarterback came through, leading the Irish to a 19-18 victory.



Kiel, a senior who lost his job early in Notre Dame's disappointing 6-5 regular season, was given another chance by coach Gerry Faust in the final game of his college career. He responded by directing three first-half touchdown drives, including a 14-yard scoring toss to Alvin Miller.

"I feel really great with this victory," said Kiel, who completed 11-of-19 passes for 151 yards. "Tonight is a starting point for the '84 season. I'm so glad for Coach Faust. He came under a lot of heat, but he's worked hard and never gave up on us. He deserves this victory more than anyone else."

The Irish captain, said the frigid 12-degree temperature did not affect the Notre Dame game plan.

"It was cold but it didn't affect us that much," he said. "We had the same game plan whether it was 70 degrees or zero."

Notre Dame, which reluctantly accepted the bowl bid after closing the regular season with three losses, finished its third year under the embattled Faust with a 7-5 record. The 12th-ranked Eagles, a three-point favorite, got three touchdowns from scores from an earlier game. Quarterback Flutie, but a final threat ended when Flutie's fourth-down pass from the Notre Dame 35-yard line fell incomplete with 1:04 to play.

Notre Dame's sophomore tailback Allen Pinkett scored on runs of 1 and 3 yards for the other Irish touchdowns. Junior fullback Chris Smith picked up 104 yards in 18 carries.

The Boston College touchdowns came on Flutie passes of 17 yards to Brian Brennan, 28 yards to Gerard Phelan and "three yards" to Scott Gieselman.

Flutie completed 16-of-37 passes for 287 yards.

Boston College, 9-3, took the opening kickoff and drove 63 yards with Flutie hitting Brennan on a 17-yard pass just inside the end zone with only 2:53 gone. Brian Waldron's extra point try was blocked.

Notre Dame came right back with an 87-yard drive with Pinkett diving 1 yard for the score and Mike Johnston kicking the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

Notre Dame defensive end Mike Golc blocked a Boston College punt on the Eagles' 6-yard line early in the second quarter. Kiel hit Miller on a slant across the middle from 14 yards for a 13-0 lead. The extra point attempt was blocked.

Notre Dame then took over on its 47-yard line after forcing the Eagles to punt and Kiel led another scoring drive from scores earned with Pinkett's 3-yard run around right end for a 19-0 lead with 8:19 left in the first half. The extra point attempt was again blocked.

Flutie hit Bob Blestek with a 42-yard pass to the Notre Dame 27 and, three plays later, connected with Phelan from 28 yards out. His two-point conversion pass was incomplete, leaving the Eagles trailing 19-12 at the half.

Flutie, voted the game's outstanding player, capped an 85-yard drive with a 3-yard pass to Gieselman to cut the lead to 19-18 with 7:20 left in the third quarter, but again his two-point conversion pass failed.

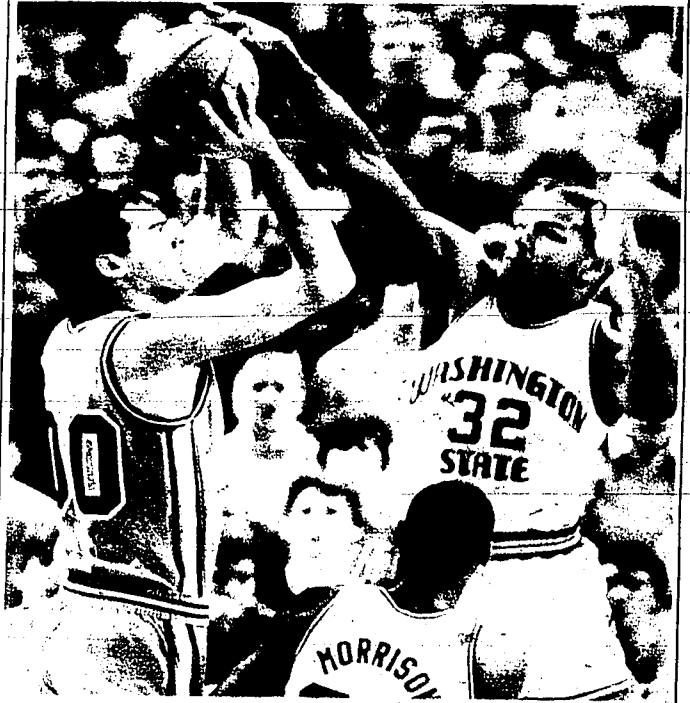

## Chenoweth assumes reins as Elkhorn director of golf

ELKHORN — A homegrown professional, Jim Chenoweth, has assumed the title of director of golf for the Elkhorn Club Hotel and Condominiums of Sun Valley.

Chenoweth, who started his professional career with initiation of play at the Blackfoot Golf Course in the mid-1960s, assumes the role left by Tom Sanderson, who has held the position since the resort course opened.

Chenoweth said his major efforts will be bent toward increasing play at Elkhorn, showcasing what he called one of the premier courses in the west.

"We are originating two this summer," Chenoweth said Thursday. "And Idaho Tournament of Champions to which all the major amateur tournament champions, men and club champions will be invited. That will be played Oct. 6. We also are starting the Western Seniors Amateur Championship and will seek entrants from all over the western states."

"In the short while I've been here, we've added nine tournaments to our schedule for next season but we are retaining the ones associated with Elkhorn like Harlan Killbuck's Danny Thompson Memorial tournament and others," he said. He said he hoped to keep the course prominent among junior golfers.

A difference under Chenoweth's reign at Elkhorn will provide the elite two-day pro-am and the possible return of the Idaho Open to that course. He also is a member of the PGA for 25 years, resigned from that organization, which sanctions both the Idaho open and the pro-am.

Chenoweth is a native of Pocatello and graduated in 1964 from Idaho State College. He was a professional that summer, playing with the Idaho Falls Russetts in

the Pioneer Baseball League, but then switched to golf and got in on the manual labor of putting the final touches on the new Blackfoot nine-hole course.

At Blackfoot he started the George VonElm Memorial tournament, still considered one of the top amateur competitions in southern Idaho. He also hosted the first Idaho Open, noting "that's something I'll never forget. We put 150 players around a nine-hole golf course."

For the past 20 years he has been a professional at the Brookside Golf Club in Reno and executive director of golf and promotions for the Del Webb Corporation in Las Vegas. While in those two Nevada cities, he was private tutor to a number of celebrities, including Jerry Lewis, Jimmy Dean, Don Adams, Milton Berle, Jan Murray, Harry James and many others.

He also has worked as a personal instructor to a number of top professional and was honored on the Mike Douglas Super Star television show as one of the country's top instructors.

Chenoweth also has produced and directed a syndicated television series called "Swinging With The Stars," kicking that off with a pilot that featured Bing Crosby and David Wayne. He also serves as advisor to Jerry Lewis for all Muscular Dystrophy golf tournaments.

Chenoweth spent last summer as the top instructor at the Mt. Snow Golf School in Vermont. He will become a year-round employee of the Elkhorn Club Hotel, involved in marketing and sales promotion during the non-golfing season.

"My reasons for taking this job are relatively simple," Chenoweth said, noting he liked being back in Idaho. "I lost my wife a short time ago and our three children are adults and taken care of. When they offered me this position, I thought it was a good chance to get back to Idaho."

## Dickerson named NFC player of year

NEW YORK (UPI) — Eric Dickerson, who set an NFL rookie rushing record and earned a runner's ultimate praise from O.J. Simpson in leading the Los Angeles Rams to the playoffs, Thursday was named runaway winner as UPI's 1983 NFL Player of the Year.

The former All-America from SMU received 40 votes from a panel of 56 pro football writers, four from each NFL city, to easily beat out Washington quarterback Joe Theismann, who will direct the Redskins Sunday against the Rams in a conference playoff semifinal.

Theismann was named on 12 ballots and Green Bay quarterback Lynn Dickey picked up the other four votes.

"Eric Dickerson is the best running back I've ever seen," says Simpson, a certain Hall of Famer who holds the NFL's single-season record of 2,093 yards in 1973. "I can't remember any back with more talent or potential than Eric, and that includes myself and Gale Sayers. Every time Dickerson touches the ball, he can go all the way."

Installed in a one-back offense, Dickerson set an NFL record with 380 carries during the regular season, gaining a league-high 1,808 yards to break George Rogers' record of 1,674 yards set in 1961. The second player selected in the draft, behind John Elway, Dickerson also caught 51 passes for 404 yards and scored 20

touchdowns overall.

In the Rams' stunning 24-17 upset of Dallas in Monday's NFC wild-card game, Dickerson ran for 99 yards against the conference's No. 2 defense against the rush. He turned his ankle late in the game but should be ready for the Redskins.

Dickerson became the first rookie to win the award since Otis Anderson of St. Louis in 1979. The last Rams player named was quarterback John Hadl in 1973.

"People expect me to gain 100 yards every week," says Dickerson, a 220-pound blend of speed and power. "I know when I was little and watched O.J. and he didn't get 100 yards I'd be disappointed. But you can't get 200 or 80 yards every time you play. You're going to have some bad days, just like a pitcher has bad days."

Theismann had few bad days as he led the Redskins to a 14-2 record and triggered the highest-scoring offense in NFL history. He earned the starting spot for the NFL's Top 100 Pro Bowl by completing 211 of his 374 passes for 3,714 yards and 29 touchdowns while throwing just 11 interceptions.

Dickey hit on 59.7 percent of his passes and led all quarterbacks in yardage (4,458) and TD passes (32). He also suffered a league-high 29 interceptions as the Packers finished 8-8.

## N.Y. may allow sports betting

NEW YORK (UPI) — Mayor Edward Koch called Thursday for the approval of legislation that would legalize professional sports betting in the state. Gov. Mario Cuomo has been considering such a plan for several months.

Sports betting legislation backed by Koch has died in Albany for the past six years, but the mayor said things may be different this year because Cuomo supports the concept.

"The governor has said that he's interested in supporting legislation that would legalize professional sports betting," Koch said. "Now that the governor is supporting such legislation, we think it has a good chance of

succeeding." In both proposals, betting would be confined to professional baseball, football, basketball and possibly hockey.

Cuomo is expected to make his decision in mid-January.

The proposal backed by Koch and the plan under consideration by the governor have important differences.

Koch wants OTB to run the sports betting operation, but OTB management is only an "option" in the governor's plan, Russert said. The governor is considering placing the operation in the hands of the state Division of the Lottery.

## Weather viewed as factor in today's Peach, Gator bowls

### Florida feels cold will favor Iowa Hawkeyes

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (UPI) — Iowa's Hayden Fry and Florida's Charley Pell both tried a little coaching psychology Thursday as they looked for an edge in Friday night's Gator Bowl game.

To hear Fry tell it, his 10th-ranked Hawkeyes haven't had a chance to prepare properly. Pell counters that the weather forecast calling for rain and sub-freezing game temperatures puts his 11th-ranked Gators at a decided disadvantage.

"We'll concede the advantage to Iowa because of the cold weather, and I will be cold," Pell said. "We just hope it will be a dry cold."

"We've got to be up front with our players and face the fact that we're going to be playing in cold weather. The forecast calls for the temperature to fall into the 30s during the game. Break out the heaters and get 'em warm."

Fry and Pell appeared at a joint news conference.



"You say you want things for this game to be as equal as possible," Fry gulped in an aside to Pell. "Tell you what, to keep it equal, we won't use heaters if you won't."

A Gator Bowl official said each team will have 10 stielne heaters.

"A good thing," Pell said. "If we didn't, we might have a lot of bonfires."

Fry said he was concerned about the fact that Iowa, which planned a heavy practice schedule in Florida because of being unable to work out in Iowa at this time of year, has run into consistently bad weather since coming South.

"We haven't gotten anywhere near the practice we had counted on," Fry said. "We may have set some sort of

record for lack of preparation for a bowl game. I know I have never gone into a game as concerned about lack of preparation as I am today."

"I don't not say I think we are going to lose. Just I don't know what to expect and we're not until we start playing the game."

"One thing for sure," Fry added. "Our players certainly should be rested and relaxed."

Fry pointed out that Iowa closed out its 9-3 season on Nov. 19, nearly six weeks ago, while Florida didn't end its 9-3 year until Dec. 3.

"It's got to be an advantage for Florida, they've been playing two weeks later than we did and then we being unable to get in the proper amount of preparation," Fry said.

"At least everyone we planned to use in the ballgame will be healthy."

"Actually, both teams have suffered a lack of practice time because of the weather," Pell said. "We'll both have to wait and see."

### Florida St. pits passing against N.C.'s running

ATLANTA (UPI) — Florida State Coach Bobby Bowen will send an untested sophomore quarterback against North Carolina's pair of 1,000-yard rushers Friday in a Peach Bowl battle that shows signs of an offensive shootout.

Bowen named seldom-used Eric Thomas to start his first game at quarterback, saying he needed more mobility with regular quarterback Kelly Lowery and fullback Cedric Jones sidelined with injuries. He teams with All-America tailback Greg Allen (1,334 yards).

The Tar Heels counter with a veteran attack led by senior quarterback Scott Stankavage and tailbacks Ethan Horton (1,107 yards) and Tyrone Anthony (1,063).

"They are strong where we've been very vulnerable the last couple of years," Bowen said. "They are going to take that ball and maul you."

"They come at you and don't give you a chance to get the ball back."



They use that big offensive line and two tailbacks to wear you down and in the fourth quarter they're got you."

Both teams suffered through disappointing seasons.

North Carolina, 6-3, won its first seven games and was ranked No. 3 nationally when it slumped into a three-game losing streak last dropped out of the Top 20. Florida State, 6-5, lost four close games but was then routed 59-14 by Florida in the regular-season finale.

"Neither team is lacking incentive, however."

"We want to get back in the Top 20," said the Tar Heels' Stankavage. "We've been in the Top 20 five straight years and that's important to us."

Bowden says the Seminoles' motivation is simple — to show a national television audience they are not as bad as they looked against Florida.

"If that doesn't motivate them, there is nothing I can do to motivate them," he said.

The Seminoles are a two-point favorite for the 3 p.m. EST contest — and that left Bowen bewildered.

"I don't understand it," he insisted. "If I knew how my quarterback was going to do then maybe I could, but I've got no idea there."

North Carolina Coach Dick Crum said he was not surprised to be the underdog after facing persistent criticism that the Tar Heels lost to the only three tough teams they faced.

"I thought we beat some pretty good football teams," he said. "I've got thinking about the schedule, tell you the truth, but I don't think people have a whole lot of respect for us."

## Tar Heels win ECAC crown

NEW YORK (UPI) — Saint Perkins scored 31 points and North Carolina shut down Chris Mullin of No. 7 St. John's in the second half Thursday night to give the No. 2 Tar Heels a 58-45 victory for the championship of the ECAC Holiday Festival.

In the consolation game, Iowa defeated Fordham 66-20.

St. John's, in falling to 8-1, led 26-24 at the half on the strength of intense defense and Mullin's 10 points on 7-of-13 shooting.

But in the second half, the Tar Heels disrupted the heart of the Redmen's offense. Thanks largely to the defensive work of Matt Doherty, Mullin had just two points, a pair of foul shots coming with 2:38 left and the issue decided.

**Sipe signed without physical**

AKRON, Ohio (UPI) — Quarterback Brian Sipe, who was forced to sit out several Cleveland Browns games with a sore arm, was not given a physical before he signed a lucrative, guaranteed contract with the U.S. Football League's New Jersey Generals. It was reported Thursday.

The Generals report to training camp in Orlando, Fla., on Jan. 21 and team spokesman Kevin MacConnell told the Akron Beacon Journal Sipe would receive his first physical then. He said that the Generals did not give the 34-year-old quarterback a physical at any time during his negotiations with the team.

"That's consistent with an owner who has yet to be in his first professional football game. They don't know how to operate," said Browns Coach Sam Rutigliano. "In this league (the NFL), if the money is guaranteed at all, it is guaranteed only if the player passes a physical examination first."

**Gruccis to present fireworks**

NEW YORK (UPI) — The Grucci family said Thursday it would put on a fireworks display at the Olympic Games in Los Angeles this summer, despite the destruction of its fireworks factory last month.

The family said it was honored by the Olympic invitation and hopes to build a new factory in Brookhaven Town on Long Island to replace the one destroyed by a series of explosions that killed two family members Nov. 26.

Donna Grucci Butler said the family had been "honored to have been invited to stage a show at the Los Angeles Olympics this summer."

**Wills hit with cocaine charge**

COMPTON, Calif. (UPI) — Former Los Angeles Dodgers All-Star Maury Wills was charged Thursday with felony possession of cocaine, but an auto theft charge was dropped because the car's owner, an ex-girlfriend, refused to prosecute, officials said.

Wills, 51, was arrested by Los Angeles Police officers Tuesday on the Harbor Freeway driving a car that had been reported stolen last April. The officers found a vial containing .06 gram of what they said was cocaine on the front seat.

Wills, the first major-league player to steal 100 bases in a season, was released on \$1,000 bail. He is scheduled to appear for arraignment on Jan. 6.

**Gamblers sign former pros**

HOUSTON (UPI) — Former Houston Oilers wide receiver Ken Burrough and ex-Tampa Bay Buccaneers linebacker Andy Hawkins

have signed to play in 1984 for the U.S. Football League's Houston Gamblers, the team announced Thursday.

Burrough, 35, the Oilers' all-time leader in reception yardage, retired from the NFL team before this past season. He last played in 1981 and spent the 1982 season on injured reserve.

**USF alum sues school paper**

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UPI) — A University of San Francisco alumnus who allegedly paid Chicago Bulls star Quentin Dailey, then a collegian, for work never done has filed an \$80 million libel suit against a student magazine that described him as "crooked."

J. Luis Zabala, of Alhambra, Calif., in a suit to be heard in Santa Clara County Superior Court on Jan. 11, claimed that an article in the spring 1983 edition of the University of Santa Clara's campus magazine libeled him, was malicious and was published with reckless disregard for the truth.

The Owl magazine article, headlined "The Student-Athlete Hoax," discussed Zabala's relationship with Dailey, the former University of San Francisco star.

**Johnson tops all-star ballots**

NEW YORK (UPI) — Magic Johnson of the Los Angeles Lakers dominates balloting for "Western Conference players" in the NBA All-Star Game, outpolling the next-closest player by more than 60,000 votes, the league said Thursday.

The game will be played Jan. 29 in Denver. Johnson has 351,286 votes so far, with balloting to continue through early January. Second is San Antonio guard George Gervin with 227,086 votes.

Other guards in the top five are Johnny Moore of San Antonio, Kyle Macy of Phoenix and Norm Nixon of San Diego. Alex English of the Denver Nuggets, who won the NBA scoring title last season and currently ranks fifth with 25.4 points per game, leads among forwards with 228,537 votes. He is followed by teammate Kiki Vandeweghe, Maurice Lucas of Phoenix, Larry Nance of Phoenix and Jamal Wilkes of Los Angeles.

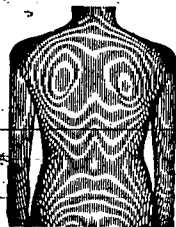

## THE ACES BOBBY WOLFF

Dear Mr. Wolff: I opened a hand with three-four card suits and 16 HCP. Partner responded in one of my four-card suits (spades). Was my hand worth more after the response or before? ANSWER: when you're fortunate enough to have four-card support in partner's suit, you should distribute points go into Invaluable, just like finding a nice Christmas present under the tree. In your case, Santa would count your hand good for 19 points: 16 HCP and three points for the singleton.

Dear Mr. Wolff: With a very poor hand and six or seven clubs, how does one get to play club partial after partner's two-trump bid? ANSWER: You don't. You settle for whatever lumps are in there for you at two no-trumps. I remember a partner who had agreed to use Stayman and Gerber getting into real trouble in a similar case. Three clubs elicited a major suit response and four clubs got an ace-showing response. I don't remember when the doubling started, but it wasn't a good result.

Dear Mr. Wolff: Does a two-over-one response by an unpassed hand guarantee that game will be reached? ANSWER: In some systems, yes. In most standard systems, no. Standard requirements for a two-over-one response are 10 HCP. These, added to a minimum opening of 13 points leaves the partnership short of game assets. Those who play two-over-one as game forcing increase the requirements on both sides of the table (i.e. no subgame openings and at least 12 HCP for a two-over-one).

Dear Mr. Wolff: What are opener's priorities for choosing a rebid after a one no-trump opening and a jump to three of a major by responder? ANSWER: Raise with three or more trumps and a normal opening. Bid three no-trump with only two trumps. Cue bid an ace in a lower-ranking suit with three or more trumps, a near maximum opening (17-18 HCP) and good control cards (aces and kings).

Dear Mr. Wolff: I know a player can correct a revoke, but I don't know when the correction period expires. Can you clarify, please? ANSWER: A revoke may be corrected before either member of the offending side plays to the succeeding trick. If the revoke is not caught in time, the trick remains as played and the offending side is subject to revoke penalties.

South didn't need a computer-to-solve-the-problems of his no-trump game. He needed only to count his tricks and then make a play that would win against any distribution.

With no entries and no good choice of leads, West hit upon the good shot of his spade 10. Since partner had the entries, why not try to establish what was sure to be East's long suit?

Carelessly South tricked dummy's queen at trick one. East won and returned his jack, which dummy refused, but it was already too late. Another spade knocked out the ace and when the diamond finesse lost, East scored six defensive tricks.

South should count "his winners and develop his plan before he plays to the first trick. He has two sets of A-K's in his own hand for four tricks and there are four or five tricks available from dummy's diamonds. Since this is enough to make his game, South should play the spade suit as safely as possible.

He wins the first spade with dummy's ace and leads a club to his king to take a diamond finesse. This loses to East's king but East cannot defeat the game by leading spades. If East clears the spades, South has an

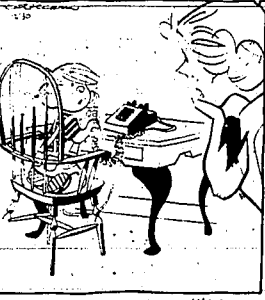
