# Resort-town tax clears final hurdle

BOISE — Legislation allowing resort com-munities to establish broad-based local sales taxes cleared its last major hurdle Thursday, when the Senate passed the measure, 29-5.

And once again, officials and individuals from the resort communities in the Wood River Valley were given much of the credit for the bill's success.

In support of the legislation, Sen. Gail Bray, D-Boise, read from a letter by Ketchum lodge owner Robert Lynn, who urged passage of the legislation. Lynn said that a broad-based sales

tax would allow a reduction in the so-called "bed and booze" tax that currently is lavied in Ketchum and Sur Valley.

The House approved the bill, 47-21, on Feb. 21. At that time, it carried a 25,000 population cap, to allow Cocear d'Alente toqualify.

The bill would allow specific exemptions for precific items. That provision was included to

specific items. That provision was included to allow seilers of automobiles or other "big-ticket items" to remain competitive with other such businesses located nearby, but outside a city's boundaries.

Storm's rage Rescuers search for victims in tornadoes' paths Storm Batters Northeast

CLINTON, N.C.—Rescue workers dredged ponds and searched faltened buildings Thursday for additional victims of tornadoes that killed at least 60 people in the Carolinas, let hundreds injured or homeless and oaused "intilions and millions" of dollars in damage. "Too many homes to count were damaged by at least a dozen twisters that struck late Wednesday afternoon and evening, blowing down trees and power lines that closed roads and highways. It was the deadliest series of tornadoes to strike the United States this decade. "This is the worst natural disaster we've had in a hundred years in North Carolina," Said Gev. James Hunt, who toured the area by helicopter. He said there had been "millions and millions" of damage in his state. Hundreds of National Guard officers and state police sealed off the towns of Maxson and Red Springs, N.C. to guard against looters in the two communities that were without electricity.

In neighboring South Carolina, 'four people were arrested for looting in Beanetsville, where seeue creases earched Thursday through a flattened shopping center in a county where seeue people died, looking for more missing shoppers.

## Swan Falls plan requires payment for water

BOISE — Drastically altered legislation addressing the Swan Falls water-rights controversy squeaked through the-daho Senate and headed for an uncertain fate in the House. The bill, approved 18-17 Thursday, sels up a mechanism by which power producers' water rights on the Snake can be acquired by other users, like Irrigators.

can be acquired by other users, like irrigators. But as changed in the Senate, it sharply limits the amount of water producers' — requires payment up froat — and limits the amount of revenant that can be developed. When the bill originally passed the House, it flatly asserted as state policy that power producers' use of water on the Saake River and its tributaries comes second to other uses. That policy is called subordination, a practice which requires no compensation.

Subordination was seen as a way to reverse the effects of the high court ruling, and the bill as originally drafted would have guaranteed subordination of a power right unless it would have hurt power production. The bill passed Thursday makes acquiring a power company's water-right less' certain, more complex, and with a price tag attached.

Under the bill, a person who wants to use a hydropower right can apply to the state.

After a review, the state can acquire that right under eminent domain, and place it in a state water bank. After the applicant pays for the water right, he can then begin to use it.

Opponents have said that process is not really subordination, but condemnation, a procedure already

available.

Earlier this session, a subordina-tion bill endorsed by G v. John Evans

fears that it will freeze all new development.

While opponents of licensing have charged it would open the door to government interference, supporters say licensing that carries authority to conduct background checks on opera-

tors will cut down on child abuse.

The bill acted on Thursday requires counties to conduct criminal and mental health background checks on operators before granting alleans. It applies only to day care facilities carring for five or more children. Opponents claim that the majority of I daho children in day care are in day care homes, which would not be covered by the bill. They say those

those children, because of their young age and lower visibility, run a greater risk of being abused.

The House bill replaced stringent Senate-passed legislation that applied to all day care facilities, including homes caring for fewer than five children.

### Idaho should have some day-care laws

A horror story in a California day-care center has tyen new impetus to legislation now before the Idaho enate that would take the first steps in the state's istory to adequately monitor and license day-care Senate that would take the first steps in the state's history to adequately monitor and license day-care operations.

We think the bill should be passed, although in our opinion, it may not go far enough.

The bill would require counties to do criminal and

mental-health background checks on operators before a license is granted. It covers facilities that handle more than five children but focuses more directly on the qualifications and suitability of the individuals who

That approach seems reasonable. In the California

run them.

That approach seems reasonable. In the California case, for example, children were being molested at a center that held a license, but the state had no background information on the employees.

The Idaho proposal addresses that point. Its sponsor, Rep. Donna Scott, R-Twin Falls, says the measure would address "the source of the problem" of child abuse in day-care centers.

The measure, however, did not go as far in some ways as a Senate proposal by Sen. John Barker, R-Buhl, which would have applied to all day-care centers, not just those with more than five children, and which would have given licensing authority to the state Department of Health and Welfare.

The differences between the two bills may have made each unacceptable to the other chamber, with the result that no day-care legislation will emerge from this legislative session.

That would be unfortunate, in our view. Idaho remains the only state in the nation that has no licensing whatsoever in the day-care area.


Still, if the Legislature can't agree on which approach is better, it has perhaps laid the foundation for a licensing measure in the 1985 session. An interim study committee, working, with input from parental-groups, child-protection organizations and day-care center operators, ought to be able to comerup with a measure that applies the right amount of regulation without going to far, or putting the authority in the wrong place.

Scott is right when she makes the point that some responsibility must rest with the parents of the children who attend the centers.

If parents take an active interest in the centers, if they watch closely for signs of problems, and if they are courageous in calling problems to the attention of child-protection organizations, day-care regulation will be improved, but not heavy-handed.

Both Barker and Scott's bills have raised the consciousness of the Legislature on an important and long-neglected subject. We hope the issue is revived next year if it cannot be passed this time around.

LOS ANGELES — Zigzagging through 35 states and 41 of the nation's largest cities, the route for the Olympic torch relay has been announced, with organizers saying the event fell far short of the 530 million goal for youth sports.

Only 4,00 of the planned 10,000 kilometers have been spoasored at \$3,000 akilometer, but organizers said they were "very pleased" with the results and said it would be "an emotionally moving event." The torch will pass through Twin Falls on June 30.

"The route will take the flame through every possible environment in the United States. It will also go to more than 1,000 small communities," said olee Fishman, torch relay director for the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee.



After the flame is electronically transmitted to New York City from Athens, Greece, on May 8, the three-month relay will begin May 23, on its way to Los Angeles and the July 20 Opening Ceremonies.




