## Reagan sends Soviets his arms control offer

WASHINGTON — President Reagan announced Thursday he was making a new nuclear weapons limitation proposal to the Soviet Union and would request the current round of negotiations in Geneva be extended to consider it.

In a nationally televised statement, Reagan said the latest Soviet offer "unfortunately fell considerably short" in certain areas. But, he said, there were also positive "seeds" for an agreement and that he had built on them with the new U.S. offer.

Significantly, he called both sides' proposals "milestones" in the quest for reductions of nuclear weapons. "I believe progress is indeed possible if the Soviet leadership is willing to match our own commitment to a better relationship," Reagan said.

Just before his announcement, Reagan

### 'Star Wars' not for trade, Weinberger declares

WASHINGTON — There is no U.S. offer to give up our strategic defense system that the United States would not give away its exchange for a verifiable arms control pact with the Soviet Union calling for deep cuts at equal levels, Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger said Thursday.

But he said the "Star Wars" missile defense system is definitely not included

and that to trade it away would amount to a mutual suicide pact.

"I wouldn't want to give up strategic defenses in any circumstances," Weinberger told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

Weinberger spent more than two hours defending Star Wars research, complaining of congressional cuts in its budget, and sending out critics who portray the Defense Department as an opponent of arms control.

"We have no intention to block or attempt to oppose arms reduction methods," Weinberger said, adding, "we certainly have no opposition to arms reduction."

But he said defense officials do believe that some past agreements have led not to reductions, but to an expansion of arms by the Soviet Union.

"We can't delude ourselves into thinking that any agreement is a good agreement," he said.

"It is my hope that our new proposal would enable both our nations to start moving away from ever-larger arsenals," the president said.

The Soviet proposal, in a letter to Reagan from Gorbachev last month, and the U.S. response are designed to make headway in the slow-moving negotiations before the two leaders meet at the summit in the Swiss city Nov. 19-20.

"Arms control is a result," Reagan said. "First you've got to eliminate the suspicions and paranoia between us." He called the U.S. proposal serious and detailed.

The new U.S. proposal was also sent directly to Gorbachev and is "part of a process of interaction that we hope will lead somewhere," Secretary of State George P. Shultz said later at a news conference.

But he also stressed U.S. concerns over human rights and regional conflicts, and

## Farm credit setup 'strong'

WASHINGTON — Calling the financially ailing Farm Credit System "one of the strongest financial institutions in the country," a top administration credit official predicted Thursday it would return to profitability by 1987.

Frank Naylor, undersecretary of agriculture for credit programs, declined to promise any federal financial help for the nation's largest farm lender, saying the system must first use its own resources to weather its current problems.

Naylor's comments brought disbeliever from some members of the House Agriculture Committee, who only a day before had been told the system would need a \$5 billion to \$6 billion federal bailout to remain afloat.

White House spokesman Bill Hart said Thursday night that President Reagan had accepted recommendations of a Cabinet group that had been studying the farm credit problem.

The recommendations, according to Hart, call for legislation that would permit the system to use its \$5.5-billion in reserve funds to shore up member banks, and would grant the Farm Credit Administration greater regulatory powers, including the authority to manage bad loans.

But the president has not decided whether direct federal cash or borrowing authority at the Treasury is needed. "We are assessing the need for federal financial assistance but only if Congress is willing to

legislate the accompanying restructuring," Hart said.

Earlier, Agriculture Secretary John Block emphasized to reporters, "The president hasn't closed the door on anything."

"We're not going to leave them high and dry," Block said of the lending system and its 1 million farm- or borrower-owned branches.

On Wednesday, both regulators and lobbyists for the 37-bank national system had said it would take federal loans of \$5 billion to \$6 billion to see it through the next few years of anticipated financial hardship on the nation's farms.

But Naylor said the requested bailout money was really "a cushion" to allow for possible errors in the system's assessment of how bad its future problems will be. If financial conditions on the farm remain as anticipated, "the system may not need such a bailout," he said.

"The system does have sufficient earned surplus...to deal with the problems we face over the next several years," Naylor told members of the House Agriculture Committee.

Currently, it's one of the strongest financial institutions in the country.

The cooperatively-owned system, which raises loan money by selling bonds to investors, is made up of a network of local associations making operating and mortgage loans to farmers and loans to farm cooperatives. It uses no federal money, but enjoys "agency status," the perception among investors that its bonds are federally backed, even though they are not.

## Young inmates of Idaho prison describe repeated assaults

BOISE — Despite the institution's efforts to beef up security at the Idaho State Penitentiary, young inmates testified Thursday they've been the victims of rapes, assaults and stabbings recently.

State prison officials disputed the stories. U.S. District Judge Harold Ryan is conducting a hearing on whether the state is complying with his order to improve conditions at the state prison, south of Boise.

Dean Schwartzmiller, an inmate serving as attorney for other inmates, presented several inmates, all under the age of 25, who told Judge Ryan they have been the victims of attacks and assaults in the last few months.

Schwartzmiller is attempting to prove that overcrowding at the state prison is so severe that guards and other correctional officers can't prevent violent attacks on inmates.

Inmate Thomas Driskell, 20, testified that in August, someone came into his cell in the No. 3 cellblock and stabbed him seven times. Fearing retaliation, he didn't report it until hours later.

"When asked about his wounds," he said, "They were not very serious but they hurt a lot."

In response to a question from Schwartzmiller, Driskell said he was not a violent person.

But a different story emerged under

cross-examination by Deputy Attorney General Robert Gates.

Driskell said he sustained the wounds in a fight with another inmate. And Driskell admitted he slugged another inmate in a fight at the state prison at Cottonwood, Gates also prodded him to admit he was convicted of aggravated assault in Canyon County.

"Driskell said he got into trouble 'on the outside' because of drinking problems but was not violent in prison because there's nothing to drink."

He also acknowledged he didn't tell prison officials who stabbed him, for fear of being termed a "rat" by other inmates.

"Then they'd come after me with a bigger knife," he said.

Inmate Keith Edson, 22, serving time for grand theft auto, said he was raped a couple of times while being held in a close security cellblock.

Ralph Pierce, deputy warden, in response to a question from Schwartzmiller, said

## Speaker denounces China ties, advocates trading with Taiwan

TWIN FALLS — Idaho House Speaker Tom Stivers says Gov. John Evans should not be soliciting trade relations with Red China.

Stivers has just returned from Taiwan, where he was cementing a sister-state relationship with officials last week while a delegation of officials from the Shanxi province of Red China were in Idaho celebrating the sister state agreement Evans has pursued.

Stivers said he is less belligerent about the state's confidence the state is backing up their form of government. Object to it," Stivers said in an interview Thursday afternoon. "It doesn't seem to me we need to do business with them until they come into the community of nations."

Evans' aide Jean Terra said the United States has pursued improved relations with Red China since

Richard Nixon was president. "There's nothing political in the sister state relationship. It's in complete accordance with our national foreign policy," she said. "As an example, she pointed out that Washington, D.C., and Peking (the capital of Mainland China) are sister cities."

Stivers, however, advocates developing a market for U.S. cheese in Taiwan.

Stivers says the cheese market will be hard to develop in Taiwan, since not much cheese is eaten there, but as a give-away might help sell it. "This country's awash with cheese," Stivers said. "We should load a ship up full of cheese, haul it out to them, give it away, and get 'em in the habit of eating cheese. Then, by God, we can sell cheese."

Though he is less belligerent about the potato market, the Twin Falls Republican says it is there. Rice consumption in Taiwan has declined by 20 percent, while potato consumption has increased, he said.

## High levels of radon may threaten millions

ATLANTA — Federal health officials said Thursday that millions of Americans may be exposed to per indoor exposure, and about 1 percent higher than recommended levels of cent had levels above the higher, radon, a naturally occurring stricter levels for people regularly radioactive gas blamed for as many as 20,000 lung cancer deaths each year.

The radon problem first attracted national attention last December when an engineer with a company building the Linerick Nuclear Power Plant near Philadelphia was found to have been exposed to extremely high levels of radiation — not from his work, but from the air in his home, which sat on an area of natural uranium deposits.

A subsequent survey of more than 2,000 nearby houses found more than 40 percent had radon levels above the Environmental Protection Agency's recommended guidelines for indoor exposure, and about 1 percent higher than recommended levels of cent had levels above the higher, radon, a naturally occurring radioactive gas blamed for as many as 20,000 lung cancer deaths each year.

When inhaled along with dust, radon byproducts can settle in the lungs and damage tissue. Previous studies have confirmed the link between lung cancer and radon, increasing with longer exposure and higher radon levels.

"A sizeable percentage of houses across the United States — maybe a couple of percent or so — could be above the federal guidelines," said Dr. Matthew Zack, a researcher with the Atlanta-based CDC.

# Balanced budget-plan negotiations collapse; showdown vote set today

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressional negotiations on a Senate-passed balanced-budget plan collapsed Thursday night, setting up a showdown vote today in the House on the proposal to force a balanced budget by 1991.

The wrangling has tied up action on necessary legislation to restore the government's borrowing authority, which has served as the legislative vehicle for the budget plan.

"I think we have come to the conclusion to amicably agree to disagree," said Sen. Bob Packwood,

chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and chairman of the negotiations on the Senate plan to force a balanced budget by 1991.

"I'm sorry that the conference failed to agree," said Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, R-Ill., chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, who led the House bargainers.

House leaders have already conceded that some form of the balanced budget plan will pass the House.

Today, Democrats will offer one plan while Republicans offer their version of the Senate package.

Democrats also said they would

offer legislation increasing the government's borrowing authority for one week to provide more time to work out the differences on the budget plan.

But Senate Republican leaders said they would not agree to such a move, keeping up the pressure for action on the budget plan.

Treasury Department officials have warned that if the debt limit, which allows the government to borrow to pay its bills, is not increased by then, they will have to redeem billions of dollars held by the Social Security trust fund.

## Former official facing charges

WASHINGTON (AP) — A former assistant Navy secretary was indicted Thursday on charges of concealing the fact that he took job-hunting trips paid for by General Dynamics Corp., while he was still a government official.

The Justice Department said a two-count indictment was returned in federal court in Alexandria, Va., against George A. Sawyer, 55, who held his Navy post from June 23, 1981 until June 25, 1983.

## Trade deficit hits peak

WASHINGTON (AP) — The country's foreign-trade deficit soared to 37 percent higher than the August all-time high of \$15.5 billion in September while the government's total as imports surged to a record high of \$33.3 billion. The increase was mainly due to a 54.8 percent jump in shipments of Japanese cars and a 17.6 percent increase in oil shipments.

The barely perceptible 0.1 percent advance in the Index of Leading Indicators in September, coupled with the drop in factory orders, left many private economists concerned about the durability of the current recovery.

## Sailor sought to stay

WASHINGTON (AP) — The interpreter who first interviewed Soviet seaman Miroslav Medvid said Thursday the Border Patrol returned him to the Russian ship after she told agents the man had indicated he wanted to defect to the United States.

The interpreter, Irene Paduch, told The Associated Press: "When I asked him why he jumped ship, he said, 'Because I want to live in an honest country.'"

Mrs. Paduch, a New York interpreter who speaks Ukrainian and provides interpretations to the Immigration and Naturalization Service on a contract basis, said that during the nearly hour-

long telephone interview with Medvid, she concluded that he did not understand the use of the word "asylum" and thought that meant he might be institutionalized.

Duke Austin, a spokesman for the Immigration Service, said Mrs. Paduch's statements conflicted with sworn statements made by Border Patrol officials and that the INS was looking into the matter in an attempt to resolve the conflict.

The Border Patrol clearly understood her to say (after talking to Medvid) that he did not want asylum, but that he did not want to go back to the ship," Austin said.

## Shuttle crew goes sledding

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — Challenger's astronauts endured jolting, carnival-like rides on a sled rolling on 12-foot rails inside their orbiting laboratory Thursday in an experiment to learn why people get sick in space.

None of the four test subjects reported getting sick and NASA flight director Chuck Knorr said all eight crew members were healthy, but experiments designed to confuse and upset the inner ear balance mechanism did take a toll.

Mission commander Henry Hartfield reported the record-sized crew was settling in "comfortably aboard Challenger."

## EPA doubles fluoride limit

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Environmental Protection Agency on Thursday roughly doubled the recommended limit of fluoride in drinking water and took steps to make that concentration a mandatory maximum for the nation's water systems.

The action does not necessarily mean more fluoride in anybody's water. The agency changed its standards to settle a lawsuit brought by South Carolina, which did not want to act against communities with naturally high concentrations of fluoride.

Thursday's action changes the "recommended maximum contaminant level" from 1.4 to 2.4 parts per million, depending on average temperature, to a flat 3 ppm. This standard is supposed to represent the level that presents no risk to public health and is merely advisory on the states.



# Idaho Briefly

## Radar center funding passes

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved an amendment to a military construction bill that earmarks \$9 million for building a sophisticated radar-operations center at Mountain Home Air Force Base.

The amendment for the over-the-horizon backscatter radar system goes to the full U.S. Senate for consideration. Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, sponsored the amendment to the Military Construction Appropriations Bill for fiscal year 1986. The U.S. House passed a military construction bill that set aside \$8.3 million for construction of the new radar system in Idaho.

## Leroy criticizes proposal

BOISE (AP) — Oregon Sen. Robert Packwood is playing "Oregon politics with Idaho's future," says Lt. Gov. David Leroy.

In a statement from his Boise office Thursday, Leroy criticized Packwood's effort to expand wilderness areas in the Hells Canyon stretch of the Snake River, the border between Idaho and Oregon.

Leroy, a candidate for the Republican Governor nomination, is in the Middle East on a trade and goodwill mission. He was in Saudi Arabia on Thursday.

Changing wilderness designations along the Snake, said Leroy, could jeopardize Idaho's control over upstream water.

## Detective serving jail term

COLEUR DALENE (AP) — A Los Angeles police detective who admitted breaking Idaho game laws is serving a five-day jail sentence.

Steven L. Morgan, 40, of Buena Park, Calif., pleaded guilty to illegal possession of an Idaho resident hunting license, and to illegal possession of a deer. Morgan's wife, Irene, 38, pleaded guilty to identical charges.

Morgan was sentenced to 30 days in jail, with 24 days suspended, and fined \$1,000. Magistrate Paul McCabe suspended Mrs. Morgan's 30-day jail sentence and fined her \$400.

## Salmon veteran off on trip

BOISE (AP) — William R. Rector of Salmon, a Vietnam veteran, leaves Idaho this weekend for an all-expenses-paid trip to Florida to commemorate Disabled Veterans Week.

Rector, an Army veteran who lost his right arm in Vietnam 14 years ago, will be the guest of a North Miami Beach American Legion post. Each year it asks a different state to choose a veteran for the vacation.

Attorney General Jim Jones will present a state flag to Rector today. The flag will be given to the Miami American Legion post.

## Evans wants earlier help for farmers

BOISE (AP) — Gov. John Evans says farmers need immediate help with financial problems.

But that assistance should come before farmers are foreclosed, not after, and any assistance programs should benefit farmers and not just lenders.

Evans and other members of the Agricultural Committee of the National Governors' Association have endorsed a statement on federal agricultural credit assistance.

"It was presented to the House Agricultural Committee on Thursday on behalf of the association by Gov. Terry Branstad of Iowa."

The statement concluded that immediate action is essential, with the following recommendations:

- Assistance should benefit farmers and not just lenders.

- Assistance should help farmers before they are foreclosed.

- Lock-and-key titles to the land should remain with the farmer.

The statement also proposes interest rate buydowns, and recommends "a policy of forbearance" to avoid foreclosures where possible.

Evans has proposed a farm foreclosure review board for Idaho.

Evans said some credit assistance is needed for farmers and the farm credit system in the short-run while efforts are being made to reduce the value of the dollar and lower interest rates.

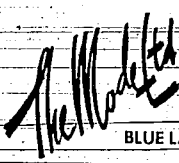

REDWOOD CITY, Calif. (AP) — A former mill worker was convicted Thursday of abducting a young hitchhiker at knife-point and holding her in bondage for seven years as his sex slave.

Cameron Hooker was convicted of 10 of 11 felonies: one count of kidnapping, six counts of rape and three counts of sex-related acts. He was acquitted on one rape count.

The 31-year-old Hooker, who faces up to 75 years in prison, appeared in court as the verdict was announced.

Judge Clarence Knight set bail at \$5 million and sentencing for Nov. 22.

The San Mateo County Superior Court jury deliberated for three days, considering more than 130 items of evidence, including sexual-bondage equipment made by Hooker and love letters written by the woman to Hooker while she was staying with Hooker and his wife, rituals.

The prosecution said the woman believed she would be killed if she escaped.

After the verdict, Knight told the jury he agreed with the decision, then criticized key defense witnesses.

Donald T. Lunde, a Stanford University psychiatry professor who testified the only credible reason the woman did not leave Hooker was because she fell in love with the fellow.

"Praise the Lord, I'm glad we got justice," the 28-year-old victim told prosecutor Christine McGuire when the attorney telephoned her with the news.

Ms. McGuire said the woman then criticized key defense witnesses.

The defense claimed the woman fell in love with Hooker and was a willing participant in the bondage because she fell in love with the fellow.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Humphrey, the misguided humpback whale who has spent three weeks frolicking in inland California waters, made a dash in the right direction Thursday but turned around and again wandered aimlessly, officials said.

Scientists, meanwhile, decided to renew the practice of making noise to coax the 15-ton, 30-foot-long whale back into the Pacific Ocean.

The unpredictable whale traveled at least 14 miles down the freshwater Sacramento River for three hours, reaching an inlet about 25 miles from San Francisco Bay. But it then turned around in late afternoon.

### No decision for spy case jury

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The judge in the Richard W. Miller spy case worried that jurors deliberating for a minority may be deciding a deadlock, suggested Thursday that he might instruct them to return a partial verdict if necessary.

But defense attorneys, summoned to the courtroom along with prosecutors, protested vehemently against any interruption of the jury's closed-door talks.

The longer the jury deliberates, the more chance there is that not all of the jury is in total unity," said U.S. District Judge David Kenyon, who called the meeting with lawyers to discuss the jury's progress.

# Radicals to keep Americans



**BAALBEK, Lebanon (AP)** — The leader of a radical Shiite Muslim group says there's no hope of five Americans and four Frenchmen kidnapped in Lebanon being released.

Until Kuwait frees 17 extremists convicted of bombings.

"I wish the demands of the kidnapers could be met and all the Americans freed," said Hussein Musawi, leader of the pro-Iranian Islamic Amal, a splinter group of the main Amal movement.

But he said that Islamic Jihad, or Islamic Holy War, the group of Shiite fundamentalists believed to hold the U.S. and French hostages, "will not release them until the 17 people held prisoner in Kuwait are freed."

Release of the 17, most of them Shites, has been Islamic Jihad's main demand since it began kidnapping Westerners in January 1984.

Kuwait refuses to release the men jailed for bombing the U.S. and French embassies in December 1983.

Islamic Jihad claimed on Oct. 4 that it had killed a sixth American hostage, U.S. diplomat William Buckley, in revenge for Israel's air strike against Palestinian guerrillas in Tunis. But Buckley's body has not been found, and American officials have said they cannot confirm the claim.

Musawi said in an interview Wednesday that he was not involved in the kidnappings or in Islamic Jihad. But his group shares some of the militant anti-American philosophy of the shadowy extremists and has similar links with ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's revolutionary Iran.

"I'm against the kidnapping of innocent people," he said in his heavily

guarded home in Baalbek, an ancient Roman town in the Syrian-controlled Bekaa Valley of east-Lebanon.

U.S. and Israeli officials have accused Musawi of involvement in the 1983 suicide bombings of U.S. Marine and French paratroop bases in Beirut in which nearly 300 servicemen were killed. Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility for the bombings, and Musawi has denied any connection with them.

## Kin of missing Guatemalans lock selves inside cathedral

**GUATEMALA CITY (AP)** — About 150 relatives of missing people locked over the Metropolitan Cathedral on Thursday, locked themselves inside and vowed to stay there until the military government accounts for their loved ones.

Nineño de Garcia, founder of the

organization, Mutual Support (for relatives of the missing), was in the cathedral in the center of the city, asked the few other people inside to join. They then locked the massive Roman Catholic wooden doors.

## USSR works to create own 'Star Wars'

**LONDON (AP)** — The Soviet Union has increased the number of strategic nuclear warheads by 27 percent in the past three years and is actively researching strategic defense technologies, popularly known as Star Wars, a prestigious research institute said Friday.

The Soviet Union has a substantial edge over the United States in the number of ground- and submarine-launched missile warheads and in their overall destructive capacity, the report said.

The International Institute for Strategic Studies said that with the exception of the superpowers, military budgets are generally showing slow or no growth and in a number of cases budgets are actually declining.

The Independent Institute, which is financed by Western foundations, membership fees and sales of its publications, said in its 1985-1986 Military Balance publication that there was roughly a 10 percent rise in the number of U.S. strategic warheads over the past three years and a 37 percent increase in Soviet warheads.

The U.S. figure went from 9,268 to 10,174 warheads and the Soviet figure from about 7,300 to 9,387 warheads. The Soviets hold an approximate 1.29:1 edge over the United States in deployed land- and submarine-based missile warheads, and a 2.39:1 margin in megatonnage.

## Broader role Soviets' goal

**TEL AVIV, Israel (AP)** — The Soviet Union and its East bloc satellites are moving toward diplomatic ties with Israel in an apparent effort to expand their role in the Middle East, Israeli officials said Thursday.

The Soviet moves come at a time when there is intense diplomatic activity in advance of the Soviet-American summit and the stragings of a Jordanian-Israeli peace initiative.

Israel radio said reports had reached Jerusalem that Jordan and Egypt had been urging the Soviet Union to establish ties with Israel. The New York Times said Washington would convey an Israeli message to the Kremlin that the only way the Soviets could join the peace talks would be to restore diplomatic ties severed in 1967.

A Foreign Ministry official who spoke on condition of anonymity said he could not confirm the report.

## Farm price index swings up

WASHINGTON (AP) — Prices farmers get for raw products rose 1.7 percent in October, the first increase in the monthly index in 15 months, the Agriculture Department said Thursday.

But even with the increase, the farm commodity price index was 11 percent below its 1982 level and still was one of the lowest recorded in seven years, according to department records.

The report said higher prices for cattle, hogs, milk, turkeys and cotton were mostly responsible for the October increase. Lower prices for broilers, corn, grapefruit and soybeans partly offset the gains for the other items.

The last winter but dropped steadily until January, fell in September and rising in October, he said.

Meanwhile, prices farmers paid in October to meet expenses were unchanged from September but were down 0.6 percent from a year ago. Lower prices were reported for feed and fertilizer, but those were offset by higher prices for feeder livestock and higher living.

## INN confronts mayor about petition delay

**BURLEY** — Frustrated Idaho Neighbors Network members confronted Mayor Chuck Shaddock Thursday morning at City Hall seeking a response from the city to an INN petition which has been under review for two weeks by City Attorney Bill Parsons.

The INN, unhappy about the city's policy on deposits and termination of utility service during the winter, submitted its third initiative petition Oct. 15 after two other petitions were denied by Parsons for "deficiencies" in signatures and form. INN members need an approved document before they can begin a petition drive that would, if successful, force a special election on the city's utility policy.

INN member Kim Anderson, who is also a candidate for City Council, said the INN has received "no response of any kind from the city administration or anyone else connected with City Hall" on its petition.

Parsons is required to respond within 10 days from the date the document is filed, Anderson said.

If the INN does not receive a response from the city by 5 p.m. today, Anderson said, the group may begin legal actions against the city.

The INN's proposed initiative would lower utility deposits, stop winter shut-offs and require the city to give both written and oral notices of intended shut-offs to clients.

Shaddock said he had "no knowledge of what was going on," because he had "no correspondence from either side about the matter until the INN called to inform me of a problem yesterday (Tuesday)."

Shaddock said Parsons has been out of town working on a trial and has not notified him of the status of the situation. "I can't put words in the attorney's mouth," he said.

Although allowing the mayor one more day to contact Parsons, INN members were still somewhat dissatisfied by the mayor's answers.

"We are upset with the city attorney. He is in violation of his own ordinance, an ordinance he wrote himself," said Anderson, referring to the ordinance requiring the city to respond to petitioners within 10 days.

"However, the mayor stood up for Parsons' actions."

"Mr. Parsons is a good attorney," Shaddock said. "I only wish somebody had contacted me sooner to tell me about this problem. After what has happened through, I don't like being held up by technicalities."

Roger Sherman of the INN complained that "we (the INN) have been asked to be sticklers about the legal issues in our petition. After what has happened through, I don't like being held up by technicalities."

An important result of any additional delay by the city could require the INN to solicit more signatures for their petition. The number of signatures needed to validate a petition depends upon the number of registered voters in the last regularly scheduled city election.

Registration in Burley appears to have increased significantly in the last regular election. If the petition is not approved before city elections next Tuesday, the INN will more than likely need to seek a larger number of signatures.

If there is no response from city officials by today's deadline, Anderson said the INN will start a sit-in, although we don't want to have to take it to the courts."

## Merc strike settled

*Effort ongoing to start union*

**HAILEY** — A formal agreement between The Merc Department Store and Food Center and seven employees who went on strike in August has been settled to the satisfaction of the National Labor Relations Board.

NLRB attorney Terry Jensen said this week from Seattle that "everything has been settled," and his office is in the process of distributing checks to the employees for back pay due them from Aug. 10 to Sept. 28.

The case is "done, finished and put to bed," Jensen said, adding he did not anticipate any further problems.

The settlement comes 11 weeks after nine grocery clerks formed an informal union and walked off their jobs Aug. 8 to protest low wages and poor working conditions. Seven of the employees filed formal charges against the Merc on Aug. 22 with the assistance of the United Food and Commercial Workers Union of Boise.

Five of the seven women returned to work after the Merc sent letters offering to reinstate their positions Sept. 28.

Under terms of the settlement, Jensen said the Merc agreed to post notice for 60 days, reaffirming employee rights and essentially addressing items from the employees' complaint. This posting will inform employees of their rights to unionize or not.

Also included in the settlement is agreement to award payback and fringe benefits. The total monetary amount of the award is \$3,955.48, Jensen said.

UFCW Union representative Wayne Larsen said his union will attempt to "try to get those people under contract so they can enjoy the benefits of the union."

"The settlement agreement put them back to work," Larsen said, but noted there had been no increase in wages for the five women who returned to work.

Larsen said efforts are ongoing to organize a union in the Hailey branch of the Merc.

At this point, Jensen said, the NLRB is out of the picture "unless new charges are filed or unless something goes wrong in complying with this settlement."

## Burley business drop concerns candidates

**BURLEY** — Key issues in the upcoming election in Burley are the economy of downtown where many buildings sit empty, low police salaries and a utility discount that was canceled last April.

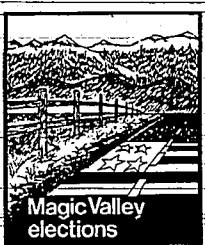
These issues were the main topics at a candidate forum sponsored by the Idaho Neighbors Network Tuesday.

Candidates differed on their plans to improve the economic situation in downtown Burley. Mayoral candidate Ken Frank, a councilman and car salesman, said a campaign to get residents to support local businesses by buying at home would be the best way of helping the downtown.

Incumbent Mayor Chuck Shaddock said attracting tourists into the city would give the economy a much-needed boost.

City Council hopeful Clay Handy, vice president of Handy Trucklines, outlined a plan that included offering subsidies in the form of reduced property taxes and a cut in utility rates.

"If we can attract new businesses to downtown Burley," he suggested razing downtown buildings after they had stood empty for two or more years.



The question of low police salaries was named by council candidate Dave Gibbons, lab director at Cassia Memorial Hospital, as a top priority item. He said that a survey of police salaries within a 20-mile radius should be taken and that Burley should have a salary schedule within 25 percent of other cities.

"We are in competition with the large cities, too," he said.

Councilwoman Frances McDonald, who is running for a second term, said that police salary increases should be set at a dollar amount instead of a percentage. McDonald, along with every council candidate who spoke

at the forum, was in full agreement that police salaries are too low.

Handy said that an increase in council pay from \$200 to \$300 per month brought the amount to one-third of what policemen are paid.

"That's not justice," said Handy. "The city is not taking care of the professions."

Mayor candidate Joe Peters, a former mayor of Burley during the 1960s, said the termination of a 10 percent discount on early payment of utility bills cut into the buying power of residents. He said the utility deposit requirement was too high and would discourage new business.

"A new business would need a \$5,000 deposit to get the power turned on," said Peters.

Council candidate Terry Barnes, owner-manager of Mini-Cassia Denture center, promised to try getting the 10 percent discount on early utility payments reinstated.

All candidates running for city office were present at the forum. There are three in the mayor race and 10 council hopefuls.

Other candidates at the forum were incumbent Councilman Roy Land, Kim Anderson, Vaughn Egan, David Gibbons, LaVern Jackson, Robert Kulhanek, and Wendell Murray.

## Innovative answers to poor growth forecast seem lacking

**TWIN FALLS** — The city of Twin Falls has acquired an enviable reputation around the state for meeting business head-on and finding new solutions, but the City Council candidates who win the Nov. 5 election may face the city's toughest challenge in recent decades.

The city is faced with a sluggish agricultural economy that does not bode well for growth and tough decisions on how to pay for the costly repairing and replacing of city facilities with modest budget increases.

In addition, the federal government is expected to abolish the federal revenue sharing program which has automatically granted the city as much as \$100,000 a year, with no stipulations on how it is to be spent.

Few would dispute that the city

has been in a stronger financial position than many Idaho cities, and, perhaps not coincidentally, city

leaders have taken more chances and made more sweeping changes.

J-U-B Engineers, hired to develop long-range plans for the city, reports that Twin Falls provides more service with less money than the other nine largest cities in the state. And the city has confined its revenue-sharing spending to capital improvement programs, rather than using it to pay employee salaries as other cities have done or to cover the cost of airport operations as Twin Falls County has done.

Already, the city has seen a purge of city departments following the passage of the 1 Percent Initiative. When the initiative was passed in 1979, the city employed 255 employees. Today 153 workers are on city payrolls.

Part of the decrease comes from two new programs approved in the last year by the City Council, both firsts for any city in the state.

The city has trimmed the number

of police and firefighters by consolidating administration and by cross-training employees to perform both jobs. City officials estimate the program is saving nearly \$100,000 a year.

Some candidates for council dispute both that figure and whether service remains at the same level.

The council has also made Twin Falls the first city in the state to contract operation of the city sewage treatment plant to a private firm. City Manager Tom Courtney figured that better management of the plant by a national firm would result in savings of \$46,000 this year.

Not surprisingly, council members are considering contracting out additional services next year. It's an idea that most candidates approve of.

"I believe that private enterprise has proven over and over that they can get a particular job done cheaper and more effectively than government-operated manage-

ment," says candidate Jim Vickers.

"Competitive bidding by private enterprise can be very cost effective," candidate Bobby Bopp agrees.

Mayor Emory Peterson, council member Mary McClosky, candidate Ernie Vazquez and candidate Rick Carr have all spoken in favor of considering turning more city services over to private businesses.

Services most often mentioned for consideration include surveying done by the engineering department, street maintenance, street sweeping and park maintenance.

Two candidates are more cautious, however. Donald McMurrian advises more time to insure that private operation of the city sewage treatment plant is a success.

Fred Higgins maintains that any service vital to the operation of the city should be under the supervision of city government and managed and operated by employees of the city. "Private business is in the

business to make a profit," he says.

Beyond the contracting of city services, most council candidates seem to have few concrete ideas about how to meet fiscal difficulties.

Mayor Peterson, however, has proposed that the city sell off water shares, since drinking water no longer comes from the Snake River. If the move proves legal, the city could earn more in interest from the sale of the shares than it makes leasing them now, Peterson hopes.

Petersen is also looking forward to settlement of a suit against the virologist, after improvements at the city sewage treatment plant proved ineffective. However, other council members have warned that much of that money may be needed for expenses such as legal fees, paying off a loan and paying private companies for their investments in the plant.

Bopp takes perhaps one of the most realistic views of long-range

## Test drive of new downtown parking system starts Nov. 6

**TWIN FALLS** — The Twin Falls Business Improvement District will establish two-hour, free parking in the downtown area Nov. 6 to increase convenience to customers shopping downtown.

"It is for the customers to have easier parking," said Chris Valence of the BID. "It will also get the employees out of the parking lots so the customers will have more space."

Two members of the BID felt that the change will have a much-needed impact on the downtown area.

"I think it will have a positive effect for both the customers and the merchants," said Joe Cilek, chair-man of the BID parking committee.

Customers will have their tires chalked upon entering the parking lots. Violations will be kept to a minimum, with the customer being

issued a warning upon the first violation and a \$1 fine on a second violation.

Chronic violators will face stiffer fines, however. The sixth offense in a month will result in a \$25 fine, a rule established to discourage downtown employees from parking in lots reserved for customers.

The only downtown parking lot that will have validated parking will

## Elko, Twin Falls counties share jail crises

**TWIN FALLS** — Sheriff James C. Miller of Elko County, Nev., and Sheriff James Mann of Twin Falls County have a jail in common.

Both are facing critical jail facility needs and sit on the brink of legal action that could close their jails.

Miller, who is in Twin Falls Tuesday, was looking into a lawsuit brought against Twin Falls County by Attorney Greg Fuller on behalf of inmates in Twin Falls.

Miller was planning to present some of the facts from the suit to a public meeting in Jackpot later Tuesday. The meeting is one of several planned in Elko County to seek

public support and inform the public on an upcoming jail bond election.

Miller said the Twin Falls County suit illustrates clearly what can happen if counties are not able to meet accepted standards for housing prisoners.

"We are just about in the same situation," he said. "ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union) is planning to file a petition to close our jail if we do not do something to replace it."

If said if closed, Elko County would have to transport prisoners at least 120 miles, as Winnemucca has the closest jail. That would cost around \$25 a day per prisoner, he said.

Residents of Elko County will vote

Nov. 5 on a \$1.6 million bond issue to build a jail.

The proposed jail could house 50 prisoners, but it is designed so that with outdoor recreation facilities and an indoor exercise room, the capacity can be expanded to accommodate up to 100 if needed in the future, he said. Miller said the daily population for the Elko jail is currently 36.

This is the second attempt in Elko County to fund a jail facility. In 1982, voters turned down a \$5.4 million bond issue for essentially the same size jail. Since then the plan has been revised to cut down cost without loss of space.

Hill's property adjoins the Amalgamated property.

The defense is expected to end its case today.

# Court: clients not liable for attorney's action

**BOISE** (AP) — The sins of an attorney should not be visited upon the head of his client, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

The court Thursday unanimously overturned a 5th District Court decision in a lawsuit brought over \$300,000 in unpaid farm loans and sent the case back to District Court.

In a key portion of the decision, the court held that because the attorney, Roy Richard, and Carol Gneiting did not file a response to an amended complaint in time, the Gneittings should not have to suffer a default judgment against them.

The Southern Idaho Production Credit Association filed suit the Gooding County, against the Gneittings and the couple filed a response. Later, the credit association filed an amended complaint, changing only the amount requested.

The Gneittings filed for bankruptcy court records show. When the bankruptcy court lifted a stay order, the association won a default judgment in June, 1984, when the Gneittings' attorney did not file a response to the amended lawsuit.

Nine days later, the Gneittings tried to get 5th District Judge Phillip Becker to set aside the default judgment, but Becker declined and the Gneittings appealed to the Supreme Court.

The court said the case is "doubtful in the extreme," but in Idaho the policy is to grant a re-opening of a case in doubtful instances.

"It is further the policy of this court to prefer adjudication upon merits rather than adjudication upon default," the court said.

The Supreme Court sent the case back to District Court and directed the filing of an immediate answer to the amended complaint.

A favorable vote there could help in gaining support for a new jail in Twin Falls County.

"What people don't realize," Munn said, "is that by far we have to meet certain requirements. Some of our citizens say that jail inmates don't deserve anything better than the existing jail accommodations. They don't think that it could ever be their own son or grandson who gets picked up and held in jail for some reason."

"We also have to think about those people held in jail that may not be guilty of a crime," Miller said. "Anybody who goes out to a Christmas or New Year's party and has one drink too many is a potential jail inmate. They wouldn't want a climate throwing up in their face in the middle of the night because they had shared a crowded facility."

city finances, and suggests considering more uses for the council has already considered starting a user fee to cover the cost of street sweeping.

On the subject of growth, most council candidates have exhibited plenty of enthusiasm, particularly for new, environmentally sound businesses, but few new ideas.

Most candidates say the city should work closely with the Greater Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce to attract new businesses. Petersen and Carr also mention the importance of economic incentives, possibly by extending sewer lines in the hopes that those costs would eventually be recovered in the form of taxes.

Candidates also discuss the importance of "quality of life," several pointing to the council's three failed attempts to raise the money for a city swimming pool.

It is evident, however, that if the city is going to play an active role, despite the depressed economy, in promoting the 2-percent annual growth limits, the majority of residents say they want candidates are going to have to come up with some more innovative ideas.

# Bid awarded for wastewater treatment plant

**HAILEY** — After nearly two months, a bid has been awarded for improvements to the Riverside Wastewater Treatment Plant.

During a special meeting with city engineer Scott Bybee, the city council awarded the contract to low bidder Ross Enterprises of Jerome for a total construction cost of \$152,217. Only one other bid had been received, which was from W. R. Henderson of Rexburg for \$228,216.

Total costs for the project, including engineering and contingency fees, are \$176,384, 75 percent of which will be funded by the state and the remainder by the city.

Sealed bids were opened Sept. 5, but Bybee said the award had been held up pending approval from the Idaho State Department of Health, which is administering a grant for the project.

The project will add aeration equipment at the Riverside plant to replace old inefficient equipment. Improvements will increase plant efficiency and decrease plant maintenance problems.

"The aeration equipment will increase plant efficiency and correct the icing problem," Bybee told council members. The city currently faces the problem of shafts and impellers freezing in extremely cold weather.

Water and Sewer Department Supervisor Dan James advised this project will not raise user fees and has already been figured into the Operations and Maintenance budget.

The council accepted Bybee's suggestion to hold off from making improvements to raise the height of a surrounding roadway to defer flooding from the Big Wood River. The council agreed they could purchase materials and do the work with city employees at a greater savings than placing this component with the grant.

Snooping reveals lies about man's past

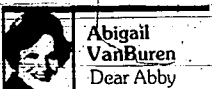

# Couples sue Safeway for injuries

TWIN FALLS — Two separate lawsuits were recently filed against Safeway Stores Inc. in which the plaintiffs claim they slipped and fell. Roland and Marjorie Autenrieth of Jerome County Monday filed a \$100,000 lawsuit against Safeway Stores Inc.

The couple claims Roland Autenrieth slipped on produce in the store in Jerome July 7, 1984. As a result of the fall Autenrieth sustained severe injuries to his left ankle and hip—the suit alleges.

Safeway was negligent because it failed to maintain non-skid floors, the couple claims.

The plaintiffs, represented by John J. Heizer of Jerome, have asked for damages and attorney's fees.

In an unrelated case, Robert J. and Lottie O. Schuck, no address available, filed a \$125,000 lawsuit Oct. 22. The couple claims that Robert Schuck slipped and fell on water near the ice cream cooler in the Safeway Store in the Lynwood Shopping Center in Twin Falls April

Schuck sustained neck, back, leg and shoulder injuries, the complaint alleges.

The couple accuses the store of negligence and seeks \$125,000 damages, attorney fees, cost of the suit and any other special damages that would be proven at the trial.

The couple is represented by L. Jay Mitchell of Twin Falls.

Safeway Stores Inc. has not yet filed an answer to the separate complaints.

Reds give Rose 3-year, million-dollar contract

CINCINNATI (AP) — The Cincinnati Reds have signed Player-manager Pete Rose, who last season became baseball's most prolific hitter, to a three-year contract worth \$1 million — not so much as salary, but to reward him for what he has done.
Rose's manager Marge Schott announced Thursday.

Last season Rose, 41, broke Ty Cobb's career hit record of 1,991 in his first full season as Reds' player-manager. He directed the club to a 1985 season record of 89-73 and a second-place finish in the National League West. The 19-year improvement from the Reds' 1984 record of 70-92 was the best in the major leagues.

"I'm more excited about 1986 than I was about 1985, and you all know how excited I was about 1985," Rose told a news conference to announce his signing. "We got the thing going in the right direction — both on the field and off the field."

Schott and Rose said the negotiations for Rose's new contract were amiable and were wrapped up in a five-hour session last week. Reuben Katz, Rose's lawyer, attended the news conference and praised Schott's "upbeat approach" in the negotiations.

Rose said his old \$225,000 contract expired Thursday. He said his new contract does not depend on the number of fans the Reds draw, and does not require him to play any certain number of games.

"I'll play whenever I think I can help the ballclub," Rose said. "How long do I intend on playing? As long as I can do the job."

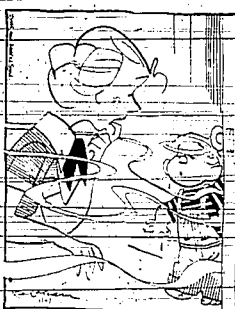

If a slam depends upon correctly choosing between two finesses, how does one decide? The toss of a coin might do it. Using some common sense rates to get better results. The top four heart honors go on the first trick and trumps are drawn in two rounds. A finesse is available in either minor suit, which, if successful, will assure the contract. (The losing heart is discarded.) If unsuccessful, the slam goes down.

one quickly. How should South choose?

Considered separately, either finesse is a 50-50 chance. West is just as likely to have the king in one minor as in the other. However, since North and South have nine cards in diamonds and only three in clubs, there is a reasonable chance to find a singleton diamond king somewhere.

Before trying any finesse, South should lead his diamond jack through West and go up with the ace when West fails to cover. Luckily East's king drops and the rest is routine.

What if East had not dropped the diamond king? The club finesse still remains at a 50-50 possibility, increasing South's total chance of success to more than the even odds that a simple finesse offers.

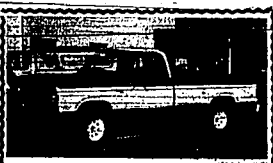

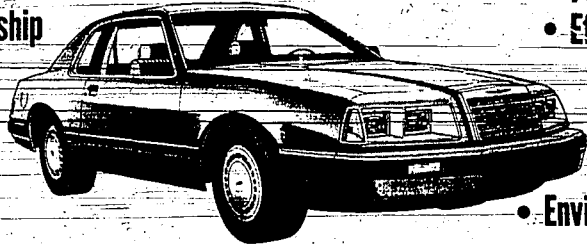

## Idaho play set for TFHS

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls High School drama department will present "Still the Mountain Wind," a down-home play by the late Idaho writer, David Lane Wright, on Nov. 4 and 5 at 8 p.m. in the TFHS cafeteria.

According to director Richard Call, "it is a play that should bring enjoyment to local viewers in that it concerns growing up on an Idaho farm. It's the true story of the playwright's childhood." Call says, referring to Wright who was born in Bennington in 1929.

Call says his father, who is past director of the theater department at UBU, knew Wright personally and advised him on transition, mood and movement when the author was writing "Still the Mountain Wind."

Call is in love with the play, which was in high school. Call says, adding, "I always wanted the opportunity to produce it because it does have such profound emotion in it. It really captures a young boy's attitude of growing up in Idaho."

Wright, whose unpublished letters, poems, stories, journals and novels are housed in the Special Collections Library at USU, had poetry published in the Golden Quill Anthology, National Anthology of Poetry and Poetry-Public quarterly. His fiction appeared in the Humanist, Muttiny, Arizona Quarterly and Best Articles and Short Stories.

Though Wright spent most of his life in the Air Force, he continually honed his skills as a writer. His verse in "Still the Mountain Wind" shows the richness of word-crafting he developed after years of literary work. One example is the following description:

"The Japanese lanterns, red and orange, shining over the Silver Pond. And the moon threading each ripple, right to the water's edge. Deep and clear, the Silver Pond, the moss buried, swaying underneath, like hair."

Call says that, with the exception of the roles of mother and father, the play will have different casts each night. ## Guitarist gives context to concerts

Neill Archer Roan explains music to audience — 'I invite them to listen'

TWIN FALLS — In cooperation with the Western States Arts Foundation and Idaho Commission on the Arts through the Intermountain West Presenters Consortium, the Renaissance Academy of the Arts will present classical guitarist Neill Archer Roan Saturday at 8 p.m.

Following an evening of Spanish food and festivities at the academy, Roan will present a mixed repertoire of music including ragtime, Spanish, South American and classical masterpieces.

The musician, hailed as one of the finest classical guitarists of his generation, will offer a preview of the performance at the fountain in the Blue Lakes Mall today at 4 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Roan has been enthusiastically received in London's Wigmore Hall, New York City's Carnegie Hall, in the National Theatre of Costa Rica and numerous other concert halls around the world.

In addition to the guitarist's solo work, he has appeared with the Omaha Symphony, the Chicago String Ensemble, the Nebraska Chamber Orchestra, Houston's Clear Lake Symphony and the Oklahoma City Chamber Orchestra.

Yet, in spite of the major performances, it is the closeness of small audiences that he most likes to talk about. "I feel like the luckiest person in the world," he says while reminiscing about journeys to the northern tip of Alaska to perform for Eskimo villagers.

"I've played, for Central American Indians and in Louisiana in Texas," he says. "No one can pay me enough money to give me that experience. That's what life is all about."

Roan says he also likes to work with students, and that he believes in a different philosophy than most teachers. He believes in a continuum of learning.

"Some see it as a closed system," he says. "There is a lot of subjective thought about learning and talent. But I believe that everybody is a precious resource." He says he doesn't believe in the "I'm just a beginner" or "I'm just an intermediate student" type of thought.

According to the guitar master, any stage of an artist's career is

developmental. "I hope it's more difficult for me now than ever before," he says, adding, "It becomes a stronger challenge to apply more of myself to develop."

He points to three stages in growth. "What we know, what we don't know and what we don't know what we don't know. The last stage opens up more and more possibilities for learning," he says. "We are always working on the edge of what we don't know what we don't know. It's very humbling."

Roan says he has a real appreciation for possibilities, noting that it's difficult for him to stay in the creative process, but that's where the challenge is. "Recreating a piece is more fun," he says of live performance. "The instant that it takes place, everybody in the room shares it. Then it's gone."

Knowing that philosophy is part of Roan's strength, and it's what leads him to his unusual style of setting context for the audience by speaking to them about the composers and what to listen for in his interpretation of a musical piece. "That way, they are more responsible for what they hear," he says. "It adds to their quality of perception to be really engaged in it."

"I have a notion that most people are turned off to classical music concerts because their experience is passive. I invite them to listen. I want their whole being to be involved," he says.

Referring to himself as "off the wall" and "outrageous," and becoming more outrageous all the time, Roan says he began the habit of talking to the audience from an early age. "I had a professional career 12 years ago. That's just what I decided I wanted to do," he says. "I wanted a rapport with the audience."

Pointing out that most music performers are stiff and uncomfortable when talking to an audience, the guitarist disputes that music should say it all.

"That's hogwash," he says. "According to academy director Rick Strickland, the pre-concert buffet is sold out, however, seating is still available for the 8 p.m. concert. Tickets, \$3 general admission, \$3 students and senior citizens, can be obtained by calling 734-0719."

# Rabbitt to play Minidome Nov. 8

POCATELLO — No matter what the weather may be like outside the Minidome next Friday night, the temperature inside should be absolutely torpid when Eddie Rabbitt begins his rollicking, libido-raising performance at 8 p.m.

Rabbitt, who shot to the top of the country/western charts as Best New Artist of the Year in 1977, has blown a trail through the music world with a chain of hits in both country and pop. Typical of the way he is perceived is a recent review after a Dallas-Texas performance:

"Eddie Rabbitt, darkly gorgeous in a simple black shirt open almost to his rhinestone-belt buckle, black curls and beard framing his faint face, had the women in the audience shrieking before he sang a note. But when he did start to sing, they shut up and paid attention."

Yet, glorious as reviews like that are, and as common as they have become, Rabbitt is no overnight sensation — and he certainly wasn't born on a Nashville stage. Ironically, the country singer began life in Brooklyn, N.Y., and grew up in East Orange, N.J., where his father was a refrigeration engineer.

Rabbitt, remembering back to when he was 12 years old, attributes his career to his scoutmaster. "One of our hikes he 'pulled' out a guitar and started playing some Johnny Cash and Bob Wills tunes," Rabbitt says. "It was my first time to hear a guitar up close and I was fascinated. I asked him if he would teach me to play, and that was the start. But I only learned two chords before Tony (the scoutmaster) moved out of town, and from there I was on my own."

In 1968, after some high school talent contests and a brief stint of professional playing in an East Orange nightclub, Rabbitt arrived in Nashville on a Greyhound bus with \$1,000 in his pocket, no contacts,

contracts or even a place to stay. While soaking in the bathtub of a small downtown hotel, Rabbitt, inspired by the decor of the place, wrote "Working My Way Up To The Bottom." — pitched it a few days later to record producers and got his first cut.

"Boy, this is gonna be easy," he remembers saying to himself. "But, it wasn't easy. I soon found Nashville is where all the best musicians in the world gather, and I was in competition with every one of them."

For the next several months, Rabbitt spent his days collecting rejection slips, and his nights hanging out in Music City bars with other struggling songwriters, including Kris Kristofferson.

But, with persistence, the breaks did come to him. Now he holds some two dozen major awards for songs that include "Driving My Life Away" and "I Love A Rainy Night."

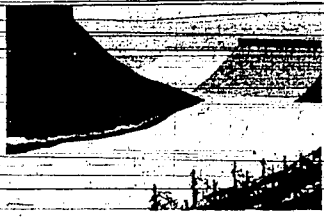
Williams, an assistant to the administrative assistant to Senator Steve Symms, has been ballroom dancing since 1980, and danced by invitation at President Reagan's second In-

# Glenn Close scores double play in 'Jagged Edge,' 'Maxie' roles

LOS ANGELES — The ever-astonishing Glenn Close executes a dazzling double play this month, appearing on the nation's screens as three characters in two movies.

In "Maxie," she portrays Jan, a very proper wife, and Maxie, the raucous 1920s flapper who invades Jan's body. In "Jagged Edge," she is a corporate lawyer who defends Jeff Bridges on charges of murdering his wife.

Sure, Glenn Close seems capable of any acting role, but can she sing and dance?

Yes, in "Barnum" on Broadway, also in "Rox" by Richard Rodgers," she said. She is a lyric soprano who has twice sung "The Star Spangled Banner" before baseball games at New York's Shea Stadium. Not many Tony winners and Academy Award nominees can make that statement.

The Oscar and Glenn Close have been romancing ever since her film debut as Robin Williams' mother in "The World According to Garp."

She was again nominated for the supporting actress award for her role as the friend who served as hostess for the reunion in "The Big Chill" and as Robert Redford's youthful sweetheart in "The Natural."

No longer a supporting player, she is a full-fledged

star in "Maxie" and "Jagged Edge." "I don't see myself as a star," the actress observed during a visit from New York. "I think of stars in terms of Gary Cooper and Clark Gable, actors who were not totally different in every role. I enjoy getting into the same skin as the characters I play. I like a role when the audience doesn't realize who I am."

In an interview Miss Close looked like Maxie, with her blonde hair askew and her dress a riot of color. However, she talked like Jan, the level-headed character in "Maxie."

And although she seems capable of portraying any age, she is 36 years old.

"I'm a late starter," she said. "I didn't go to college until I was 22. After high school I got a guitar and traveled around. It was a valuable experience in a certain way. I went to college — William and Mary — feeling stupid and eager to learn. I think some kids go to college too soon, not realizing how valuable it is. To me learning was like water on the desert. If I ever had a child, I would advise him or her to take a few years off after high school."

Glenn Close is her real name; taken from her godmother, a close-family friend. The family is Yankee, dating back to colonial times in Greenwich, Conn. They are not staid, the Closees. Her doctor father left a comfortable practice to run a clinic in the Belgian Congo (now Zaire) for 16 years.

# 'Marie': gripping docudrama

chicanery, and helped bring them down — this is an exciting, engrossing thoughtfully written docudrama. It has a burningly committed performance by Sissy Spacek as Marie, a wily and well-judged one by Jeff Daniels as one of the miscraints, and a surprisingly deft self-impersonation by Marie's real-life lawyer, Fred Thompson.

REMO WILLIAMS (PG-13). Slambang action-adventure sent up with bright, funny dialogue and a knockout performance — by an unrecognizable Joel Grey as a deceptively tall Korean martial arts master who trains secret agent Fred Ward (in the title role). Based on "The Destroyers" series. With J.A. Preston, Kate Mulgrew.







# Miniseries offers entertainment, history lesson all in one package

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the publication of "Gone with the Wind," that mammoth publishing success that taught most of us most of what we think we know about the Civil War era.

But "GWTW" is a romance novel first and history second. Its historical perspective is from Scarlett O'Hara's prewar southern point of view.

And the 1939 movie is even more idealized: Author Margaret Mitchell herself complained to MGM's legendary Louis B. Mayer that the majestic white mansions he and David Selznick showed in Scarlett's backwater section of Georgia existed only in myth.

Enter author John Jakes, a meticulous history teacher (who has, to his credit, a nine-volume saga "Kent Family Chronicles," 250 years of American history disguised as a family story). His Civil War-era saga, "North and South," also a best-seller, is history first and fiction second.

So, too, is the ABC miniseries, airing this week in six parts: The program can be seen Sunday, Nov. 3; Tuesday, Nov. 5; Wednesday, Nov. 6; Thursday, Nov. 7; Saturday, Nov. 9 and Sunday, Nov. 10.

Unlike previous miniseries concerning the Civil War, the bogus "Beulah Land" and the superficial "The Blue and the Gray," Jakes' "North and South" takes a leisurely 12 hours to detail all those issues, actions and sectional tensions that culminated in the Civil War.

In "North and South" — both the book and the miniseries — Jakes intends to teach readers and viewers about the Civil War was "the explosion of a long fuse that had been burning for almost 30 years." And Jakes describes the fuse, made up of many strands: Each has been researched and laid out textbook style.

Jakes balances the conflicting carefully: A South Carolina farmer's son, Orry Main (Patrick

Swayze) attends West Point in the 1840s and becomes best friends with George Hazard (James Read), the Pennsylvania-born son of an iron foundry owner. Twenty years later, they part ways, and their pain symbolizes that of friends and families split everywhere in the divided nation.

George's sister, Virginia Hazard (Kristie Alley), is a fiery abolitionist who eventually assists John Brown on his bloody raids.

Orry's parents see nothing wrong with slavery, and their overseer loves to beat his slaves. Viewers

soon meet dozens of characters with dozens of conflicting outlooks.

There are also the obligatory glimpses of authentic characters, such as Abraham Lincoln (Hal Holbrook), Frederick Douglass (Robert Guillaume) and, even more briefly, Orry and George's West Point classmates Stonewall Jackson, George McClellan and Ulysses S. Grant.

"North and South" is American History 101 with illustrations. By its entertainment? Sure. There are lots of ditzy Southern belles (including former daytime soap stars Gene Francis and Terri Garber as Bret and Ashton Main, and an over-the-top Lesley-Ann Down as Madeline Fabray,) their across-the-Mason-Dixon-line romances, and even an interracial romance. Sword fights, brawling, slave beatings and other acts of violence get equal time.

The star here is not Scarlett O'Hara, nor Brett and Ashton Main, nor even Orry or George, but History itself, clad in all its painstakingly accurate glory. The fiction here is pure sugar coating, so viewers will have to decide whether a history lesson is sufficient to carry them through 12 long hours of viewing.

**Q.** We hear that Mickey Rooney hates to reveal his age. Since he's so candid about the rest of his life, what's the problem? — L.P.

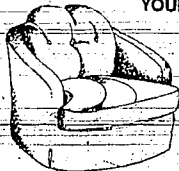

# Wood River filmmaker spotlighted

**KETCHUM**— Local film producer Jim Dutcher and the documentary about a beaver pond he is producing for National Geographic will be the lead story on this week's segment of "Outdoor Idaho," a regular feature on Idaho's Public Broadcasting System stations.

The half-hour program will be aired Saturday at 7:30 p.m. and again Monday at 10 p.m. on KAID, Channel 4 in the Magic Valley and Channel 10 in the Wood River Valley.

Dutcher's two-year film project, "The Secrets of a Mountain Pond," has been in the making since October of 1984 when Dutcher, associate producer Peter Brice and their crew constructed a studio north of Ketchum. The film revolves around the life on a mountain pond through the four seasons of the year, featuring a beaver family in the starring role.

The film is extraordinary in two aspects: it captures the birthing process of the beaver on film—a difficult task considering their dens are underwater—and National Geographic has accepted only one other film from independent filmmakers over the past 20 years.

The "Outdoor Idaho" segment features the filmmakers at work and details what is involved in a project of this size.

During the same program, Ketchum artist Ralph Harris is featured as being representative of Idaho artists displaying works in the upcoming Idaho Wildlife Art Show, to be held in Boise late in November. A wildlife and western painter, Harris also does illustrations for ski magazines.

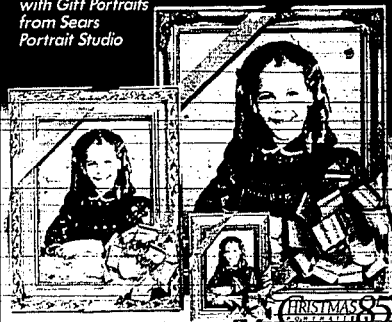

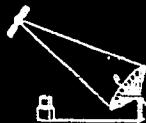

# Increased violence accompanies return of family fare to television

DENVER — The resounding successes of "The Cosby Show" and "Family Ties" suggest that television has returned to good old-fashioned, down-home family values. But there is a darker side to current programming trends, some critics contend.

Violence is on the rebound, and if that is not bad enough, one of TV's most admired heroes, Don Johnson of "Miami Vice," actually is seen smoking cigarettes on the tube, which was strictly forbidden for many seasons.

Television's allegedly positive and negative trends were addressed during a recent visit by Lynne Grasz, an executive of the Television Information Office. This agency, which acts as a liaison between the industry and its stations and the public, is supported by TV networks and stations and sometimes is accus-

ed of being an apologist for the industry. Grasz, however, acknowledges television's shortcomings as readily as she reviews its successes.

Although "Cosby" and "Family Ties" return us to the cherished old days of "The Waltons" and "Family," bullets and fistcuffs and cigarettes are increasingly observed on "Miami Vice" and "The Exterminator," two of the more violent series since "The Untouchables," perhaps the bloodiest series in TV history.

"I was concerned the first time I saw the major character smoking," Grasz confesses of "Miami Vice." "Certainly smoking is a social issue and not a television issue. However, if you see a role model smoking, it's television's responsibility to continue dialogue about the problem."

She notes that the smoking and gunshots on "Miami Vice" are more of an NBC problem than an industrywide concern, but she

suggests that viewers who disagree with the values depicted on "Miami Vice" or any other series can register objections with the appropriate network. "Networks are very responsive," she says, "and if enough concerned viewers write to NBC, the network may in fact change those (aspects of the series). It might be very positive if that would occur."

Five years ago, reputedly unwholesome scenes on TV would have attracted the ire of watchdog groups like the Boston-based Action for Children's Television, which even the networks concede were a positive influence on TV. But today, ACT is strangely silent and has yet to be heard from regarding accelerating violence.

"The industry was very responsive to those groups," says Grasz, "and the changes that have occurred may have lessened the impact of the groups."

# NBC sees chances improving for 24-hour cable news service

NEW YORK—The prospects for NBC providing a 24-hour cable news service have improved from a major long shot to "almost 50-50 and maybe a lot better," the president of NBC News said last week.

Speaking at a news conference with television reporters, Lawrence K. Grossman, president of NBC News, said letters seeking commitments from cable operators will go out soon. NBC has said it won't go ahead with the venture unless cable systems with at least 12.5 million subscribers commit to offering the service by Dec. 16.

Grossman said a 24-hour cable news operation would more fully utilize the facilities and personnel of NBC News here and abroad, as well as taking advantage of the local news gathering operations of the

network's more than 200 affiliated stations.

At the news conference, Grossman discounted the possibility of NBC getting into the cable-news field by acquiring a minority interest in Cable News Network, which owner Ted Turner has been shopping around. NBC would require full editorial control over such an operation, Grossman said.

However, a cable source said Monday night that Turner now might be willing to surrender editorial control to a minority partner.

"Turner and NBC have met and they may meet (Tuesday)," said the source who spoke on the condition that he not be identified. "He

(Turner) valued the company at \$600 million and was offering a third for \$200 million, 49 percent for \$300 million, and there is some sense that he would surrender editorial control even to a minority interest."

"Editorial control is in the hands of those who run the network, not those who own the network," said Arthur Sando, vice president for corporate communications at Turner Broadcasting System, which owns CNN. "While we are interested in finding a partner who would have a minority interest in the network, that sale would not affect editorial control of the network."

Sando declined comment on any possible upcoming Turner meetings with NBC.

A source at NBC, speaking on the condition of anonymity, said NBC is "in a listening mode" with Turner, but "we're simultaneously pursuing our own independent cable system."

Grossman said the time for a second all-news station was better now than in the early 1980s when ABC and Westinghouse failed with its CNN rival, Satellite News Channel, which eventually was sold to Turner.

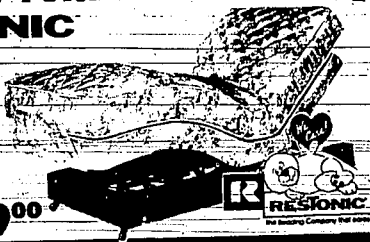

# Seven-game World Series gives ABC ratings victory

NEW YORK — The Kansas City Royals' comeback helped ABC to its first prime-time ratings victory this season, as the World Series placed five games in the Top 40 and even dumped "The Cosby Show" from its accustomed No. 1 ranking.

Figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. showed that Sunday's deciding seventh game, in which the Royals blanked the St. Louis Cardinals 11-0, ranked No. 1 with a 32.6 rating, the best-performing World Series broadcast since the seventh game of the 1982 series between Milwaukee and St. Louis.

With the World Series and "Monday Night Football" dominating ABC's schedule for six nights last week, the network had a 22.2 rating to NBC's 16.3 and CBS' 16.1. After five weeks of the 1985-86 season, NBC has averaged an 18.1 rating to CBS' 16.9 and ABC's 16.4.

A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million TV homes.

NBC's "The Cosby Show," No. 1 in each of the season's first four weeks, was a strong second with a 29.0 rating, followed by NBC's "Family Ties." Then came, in order, World Series Game 3, Game 5, Game 4 and Game 6. CBS took the next three spots in the Top 10, with "Dallas," "60 Minutes" and "Murder, She Wrote."

"We feel it was a good, solid performance for the World Series," said Marvin Mord, ABC's vice president of marketing and research services. "The Series brought the infrequent TV viewer back to prime time. That's the benefit of live events."

With Kansas City's Houdini act forcing the World Series to its limit and with all seven games in prime time for the first time, the World Series averaged a 25.3 rating, an increase of 10 percent over last year's San Diego-Detroit series, which went five games, two of which were played in the afternoon when viewing levels are lower. Last year's prime-time games averaged a 25.1 rating.

ABC had told advertisers it hoped to deliver an average rating of 25, and Mord said a performance

significantly lower would have meant commercial adjustments. ABC now estimates that 125 million watched some part of its World Series coverage.

Baseball's performance raised the three-network share of audience for the week of Oct. 21-27 to an 84 share (percentage of sets in use), the best that ABC, CBS and NBC have done since World Series week two years ago.

The NFL Monday night match-up between Chicago and Green Bay Oct. 21 ranked 11th for the week with a 21.0 rating. That game, highlighted by the Bears' 325-pound William "The Refrigerator" Perry's powerful blocking and running near the goal line, was the highest-rated NFL broadcast this season. Through that game, ABC's seven Monday night NFL broadcasts averaged an 18.9 rating, an 18 percent increase over the 16.0 registered for the first seven games last year.

CBS' "Kate & Allie" tied "Monday

Night Football" for 11th place last week. NBC's "Cheers" was 13th, CBS' "Newhart" was 14th and NBC's "Miami Vice" and NBC's "The A-Team" tied for 15th, followed by CBS' "Scarecrow & Mrs. King" and a three-way tie for 18th with NBC's "Highway to Heaven," CBS' "Knots Landing" and the pre-game show for World Series Game 7.


The third installment of NBC News' "American Almanac," trying out the 8 o'clock Eastern time slot on Monday, ranked 63rd out of 66 prime-time shows with a 10.8 rating. Last week's bottom five, in descending order, were CBS' "Airwolf," "Almanac," CBS' "Stir Crazy," ABC's "Spenser: For Hire," and NBC's "Punky Brewster."

In the evening news competition, the "CBS Evening News" was first with a 12.1 rating. "NBC Nightly News" averaged a 10.6 and ABC's "World News Tonight," which had some pre-emptions on the West Coast for the World Series, had a 9.9.

Decision-time looms

# December might be when cable news' future decided

HOLLYWOOD — This December is special to both NBC News president Lawrence Grossman and Ted Turner, and not just because of the Yule holidays. It may be known then whether Turner and NBC will strike a deal for his Cable News Network or whether NBC News will start its own.

Grossman. He has told cable-TV operators that if NBC gets the commitments it needs from them by then, it would be prepared by June 1986 to start a 24-hour cable news operation akin to Turner's CNN.

Dec. 31 is D-Day for Turner. It is when his Atlanta-based Turner Broadcasting System must have its money package set if TBS is to proceed with his proposed purchase of MGM-UA Entertainment for roughly \$1 billion. If not, the deal could fall through.

Turner wants to sell 30 percent to 40 percent of CNN — one top analyst says the asking price places CNN's total value at \$600 million — to help ease the debt Turner Broadcast would take on in acquiring MGM-UA. But he wants CNN to retain full editorial control.

NBC wants to get into cable news, and is among "a number" of organizations to whom Turner has offered a minority interest in CNN, Grossman says. But NBC wants full editorial, programming and production control of any cable system it starts or buys "because NBC News cannot be a minority participant in a news service."

Still, to paraphrase Joan Rivers, can they talk? For that matter, have NBC emissaries, as rumored, already begun exploratory talks with CNN? Grossman won't say.

"I don't want to comment on that because I don't think there's any point in speculating," he says. "The only thing I can talk about is what we're doing." That, he adds, consists of "pursuing our own efforts, going full speed ahead."

He says the effort this week consists of letters that NBC is sending

to the nation's cable-TV operators. The epistles ask them for comment on an NBC cable news operation, when they would want it to begin, and include a draft of a commitment NBC would seek from them were it to start its own cable operation.

A knowledgeable industry source considers this the latest step in a corporate dance in which NBC and CNN are wary partners. The observer holds that NBC is playing for time to reduce Turner's asking price, aware that he needs money, and fast, for his proposed-MGM-UA deal.

On the other hand, the source says, Turner has what is known as "market presence" in that CNN, expected to turn a profit next year for the first time in its five-year history, is well-established and serves 32 million homes across the nation.

NBC sure would like all that, the source says, not to mention avoiding the major start-up costs it would face were it to open a second cable-news front.

Neither TBS spokesman Art Sando nor NBC's Grossman would comment on such talk.

Grossman, interviewed before a luncheon speech he made last week to delegates to the AFL-CIO convention in Anaheim, Calif., said he is mindful that past network attempts at cable have failed — among them the Satellite News Channel of ABC and Group W, CBS' cable entertainment venture, and a similar project by RCA, which owns NBC.

However, although he says NBC certainly would lose money for up to five years were it to proceed on its own with a cable news system, he insists that it could start the operation if cable-TV operators can come up with 13.9 million subscribers.

That, he adds, "works out to a \$20 million investment (by the operators) in addition to what we would put in," which would be \$50 million.

Were NBC's cable venture to commence, he says, it would operate apart from NBC News, be "a separate enterprise," with its own "substantial" staff.

A potentially sticky point is whether this staff — both technical and on-camera troops — would be non-union like that of CNN.

NBC News' reporters and anchors belong to the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists, and its news writers, camera crews and technicians to the National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians.

(The point was predictably raised

at Grossman's lunch-with-labor session in Anaheim. One NABET delegate asked him about reports that NBC's proposed cable news operation would primarily be run by lower-paid non-union workers. Grossman said he had not seen those reports, but that "there are no such plans at all" for that. "I am sure we will be facing negotiations and discussions with the work-force" should NBC start up a cable operation, he said. "But we have no intention of making any such determination as you describe.")

In his interview, the NBC News chief conceded that many feel Turner among them — that the market simply can't support two 24-hour cable news systems.

"There are a lot who believe that," he said. "But the response we've gotten from the cable industry so far is that they don't think there is room for two players. But the question is, can we convert that enthusiasm into a real commitment?"

# Mary Tyler Moore returns to TV as older, wiser version of 'Mary'

HOLLYWOOD — Mary Tyler Moore, in the role of newspaper "helpline" columnist Mary Brenner, was about to lose her cool. The venom seemed to well up inside her, threatened to blow her head off as James Farentino, playing Frank DeMarco, editor of the third-rate Chicago Post, did his best to bait her.

"You should really slap me around for that," Farentino said, edging his chin into Moore's swinging range.

"I'd like to," she said in a nervous quaver. "I'd like to sooo badly. I'd like to tear your ... and dig my ... into your ..."

She never does, of course. Not America's beloved Mary. Brushing back the coiffed hair, adjusting the smartly stylish business ensemble, the title character of "Mary," Moore's new sitcom now filming for a Dec. 11 premiere on CBS, quickly retracted her talons. "One of us still has some dignity," she concluded.

Anyone who was not a practicing ascetic in the '70s should have no trouble recognizing the character of Mary Brenner, a former fashion writer and divorcee. From the first few minutes of viewing at a recent rehearsal, it was clear that she is a slightly more worldly-wise version of TV producer Mary Richards, Moore's character on "The Mary Tyler Moore Show" from 1970 to 1977.

"It's going to be real evident right away that this is not the 'Mary Tyler Moore Show' of seven years ago," Moore, dressed in black leather pants and looking paper-clip-thin, said last Thursday, the day before filming the new series' second half-hour episode. "But the essence for me remains the same: I am that lady and she is me. The names are different now, but in essence the character is the same, having grown up, having spent some years away from the audience.

"It's hard for me to articulate how I've changed," Moore continued from the comfort of her trailer inside the MTM sound stage here — the same trailer and stage she called home for seven seasons. "I just know that I'm wiser.

The growth in Moore and the character she plays are simultaneously evident, each seem-

ing to hold up a mirror to the other. Two months away from her 48th birthday, divorced from former MTM Enterprises president and current NBC Chairman Grant Tinker and now in her third marriage, Moore still has the cool veneer of self-inflicted perfection. But, like Mary Brenner, she now at least lets her darker side show a bit.

"I'm getting better at that," she said. "Yesterday, the scenes were not playing as well as they are today, and I felt, 'Oh my God, it's not working; the whole thing is going to be a disaster.' And I felt myself not exhibiting this but holding it inside me. I knew that everyone else could sense that I was tense.

"We talked about it today around the table, and everybody said, 'Hey, let it show and it would make us more comfortable.' She never actually blew up, though. "No. But I talked about it, and that's a step in the right direction."

Moore seems a jumble of confidence and self-doubts. On the set, she is the well-composed pro. She adds her own touches to a scene, improving the laugh quotient with a new inflection or turn of the head. In her trailer, 20 steps away, she scrutinizes publicity photos to determine which can be released and which need retouching.

But only a week before her adrena-  
nalin had been at a "killer level." As "Mary's" debut episode was filmed before a live audience and Moore officially returned to series TV. "In my intellect, I know there is nothing to it, that it is an ensemble effort all the way down the line. But in my gut — and it's a quality that's been with me since my infancy — I guess I feel that I've got to do everything. Be everybody's mother, sister, best friend — whatever — and make it all happen.

"As a result, when something doesn't go well I take full responsibility; when something is a huge success, I say, 'Well, it wasn't me; I had nothing to do with it.' So it's ultimately a self-defeating character flaw.

If it is indeed a flaw, Moore continues to use it to comic advantage. Mary Brenner, like Mary Richards before her, is the voice of sanity surrounded by a coterie of comic characters. They range in realism from Farentino's DeMarco, who provides Mary with employment as well as

romance, to David Byrd as Tully, a legally blind copy editor at the Post. In between:

• Susan Wilcox, Brenner's good-natured pretty blond neighbor, a yuppie who wears ankle socks over her nylons. Played by former "Best of the West" star Carlene Watkins, Wilcox is a city planner by trade.
