



## U.S. faces 'Super Bowl' cash crisis

WASHINGTON — Unless Congress ends its impasse over the federal spending this week, the U.S. gov-ernment faces a Super Bowl of bureaucratic snafus on Friday, the likes of which the country has never

seen.
For the first time in its history, the government may default on its financial obligations — bouncing millions of federal checks.
In addition, much of the federal—

government could be shut down, sending a half-million or more

"nonessential" workers home on an unscheduled holiday and closing government offices from Washington to Anchorage.

The country is being brought to the brink of this double doomsday because of continued wrangling over federal fifancies.

While Congress has until midnight Thursday to reach a resolution of the Impasse, officials are reluctantly beginning to make contingency plans

The two problems — a government utdown and a default — will re-ire separate congressional solu-

tions.
The shutdown can be averted if Congress passes a stop-gap appropriations bill to fund government agencies pass the expiration of the current temporary spending bill midnight Thursday.

An appropriations bill gives the government the legal power to spend money but it needs an increase in the borrowing limit to raise the money to spend since it will have ex-hausted its financial reserves by

A government shutdown would be nothing new. It has happened twice during the Regan administration. The first one in November 1981 cost an estimated 856 million in lost time

and paperwork.

The second one occurred just over a year ago on Oct. 4, 1984, when 500,000 employees out of a civilian

work force of 2.9 million were sent home.

Both times the administration claimed it had no choice but to send all employees considered "monessential" home since it did not have the authority to pay them.

Both shutdowns had little impact on the public. The mail got delivered on time, air traffic controllers stayed at their post, the milliary continued to defend the country and many other offices stayed one with reduced staffs.

However, a default, which has never occurred before, could have far-ranging implications.

The Treasury Department says that as of Friday the government's coffers will be completely empty.
Unless Congress grants the authority to borrow more money, Treasury Secretary James A. Baker Ill said he will be forced to notify the Feder af Reserve Board and the mattor's banks that federal checks can no longer be hopored.

Since the government issues 600—million.checks a year-that leaves a lot of rubber to bounce.





WASHINGTON (AP) — Former Indiana Gov. Otts R. Bowen, In ne to become the next secretary of health and human services, lands to inherit a department facing major budget, personnel and

policy problems.

If confirmed by the Senate as President Reagan's choice to succeed HHS Secretary Margaret M. Heckler, Bowen would take the reins of a department with a \$330-billion budget and 140,000 employees.

Mayors in President Reagan's own party are among those critical of the administration on urban policy, arguing that after four years of talk about "New Federalism," the administration is turning its back on the cities.

"You're setting the municipalities of this country afloat," said George Volnovich, Cleveland's Republican mayor who recounted the message he delivered to White House aides recently.

Maj. Mark Smith-of-Fayetteville, N.C., a former POW who retired in May said Saturday that the evidence he will present in court 'is conclusive and will be devastating.

The suit, filed on Sept. 4 in Fayetteville, seeks an order to compel President Reagan to demand the return of living-American POWs-in-Southeast-Asia "and to use such means, not amounting to acts of war, as are necessary and proper" to secure their release.

#### Drop in child abuse recorded

CHICAGO (AP) — A decade of heightened public awareness has led to a sharp drop in severe violence toward children, according to a study to be presented at a conference on child abuse that opened Sunday.

While 3.6 percent of all children between the ages of 3 and 17 were severely abused in two-parent families in 1975, only 1.9 percent of that age group were similarly victimized this year, according to researchers at the University of Rhode Island and the University of New Hampshire.

#### Gandhi: Arms race can end

CLEVELAND (AP) — Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi says he wants "true (riendship" with Pakistan, with whom India has fought three wars, but is concerned about an arms race, according to an interview published Sunday.

The United States has increased military aid to Pakistan, large-ty because of the Soviet Hurat-in-neighboring-Afghanistan-Indiahas received arms from the Soviet Union, although it has aligned itself with neither the Soviet Union or the United States.;

"I hope that there will be a start. I did get the feeling in the U.S. and in Moscow that both countries do want peace," he said.





### American veterans regaining respect

Veterans have been part of this nation since its

Veterans have been part of this nation since its founding.

For most of that 210-year span, the American who served the nation in wartime was accorded honor and respect by his fellow citizens.

During their times and in their communities, the men who lought in the two wars for independence-from-Britain, a-war-with-Mexico, the-Indian-campaigns, and the Civil War were highly regarded and were a center of attention at almost every civic celebration, particularly those in conjunction with patriotic national-holidays.

Too often the trauma and the hell of war were

Too often the trauma and the hell of war\_were Too often the trauma and the hell of war were overlooked, or were spoken of only by those who had experienced them and could converse of them with a handful of others who understood. And with the passage of the decades and the turn of a century, the term "veteran" was generally applied to a graybeard wearing a Grand Army of the Republic badge.

Then came a time in the course of events when, as

Then came a time in the course of events when, as a result of a protracted, unpopular and inconclusive war. in -Vielnam,—making-known-that—one—was—a veteran of one of the United States' wars in the 20th century was likely to produce scorn and rejection rather than respect. Veterans and patriotism, it seemed, were not held in high regard by many.

Now a change in the American viewpoint has restored the nation's veterans to a piace of respectamong their fellow citizens. This change would seem to be a-result-of-the healing process generated by-the establishment of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C. — another debt owed to those who served in and fought during that most unpopular conflict.

flict.

For the past 30 years or so, calendars have designated Nov. 11 as Veterans Day. But for three decades or so prior to that, it was celebrated as Armistice Day—the anniversary of Nov. 11, 1918, when an armistice was signed, ending the lighting in France during World War I.

The men of the Meuse Argonne and the Manne and St. Miliel rightly considered the day theirs, and

during World War I.

The men of the Meuse-Argonne and the Marne and St. Miniel rightly considered the day theirs, and marked it each year with considerable enthusiasm and pageantry. But a quarter century or so later, the veterans of Guadalcanal, Anzio, Leyte, Bastogne, and Schweinfurt — among hundreds of land, sea and air battles and skirmishes of World War II — were on hand as well. And by the early 1950s another war — Korea — had-added still another group of-veterans to the nation's roster of those who had served.

For that matter, there were still a fair number of men on hand at that time who had participated in the Spanish-American War of 1898 and some related "small wars" early in the 1900s.

So the November day when the fighting in-France-ended at 11 a.m. became a day when recognition would be extended to all-the-veterans of all the nation's wars. And the celebrations and observances expanded to include them.

And as the disdain of the American veteran by his fellow clitzens is replaced by acceptance and—recognition—witness the recent move to establish-a memorial in Washington, D.C., to the veterans of Korea — another Nov. 11 arrives.

Celebrate: "Las Armistice Day-if you will—Observeit as Veterans Day. But, citizens of the Magic Valley, take advantage of it as an opportunity to stand with all of the veterans, of this nation's wars, and salute them in appreciation for their sacrifices which have made possible the preservation of this Republic.

## Visit to American cemetery in England ends daughter's long search for peace

My father saved tags from bombs.
I imagine they littered the floor of the Flying-Frentess, and he picked one up each time he lettthe plane: On one side were printed instructions about when to remove the pins from the bombs, and on the blank side, he wrote a few details of each mission he flew.

The first said, "Nine flak holes in ship, "My Gal 11. "Th July, 1941, Leipzig, Germany," After mis-sion No. 13. he added the comment. "Roughest yet." The next reads, "alh Sept., 1944, Deputy wing lead, Ludwigshaven, Ger Lust 2 engines over target. Came home on deck." He was given

the Distinguished Flying Cross for that one. As-navigator of the B-17 with two engines and all in-struments except the pilot's compass knocked out, he guided them safely back to their base in England. The progression of the tags continues, "Il Sept. 44. Meresburg, Ger.; Low group lead. Shot up by: flak on Ithine." The tags are just part of the contents of a big carton of old war memorabilia that! Before we lett. I called the American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) to ask details about the cemetery. The ABMC oversees 33 cemeteries and monuments in foreign countries that include, from both World Wars, the graves of more than 12,000 deard, and names of 33,000 milsing, yet the woman on the phone had the particulars on my father within seconds.

"He's buried in row Diplot-grave 65," she said, "but there will be someone at the cemetery to show you to the grave." She told me the hours they were open and gave me clear directions to reach the place. "We II send you a pampilet with more information today," she added. And they did.

We landed at Heathrow early on a Sunday morning and decided to drive straight up to Cambridge. It was a damp, partly cloudy day, unseasonably warm for England in September As we drove through the countryside, I read what the complety. bout the cemetery

On 30 acres of land donated by Cambridge University, it's the only American World War II emeters in the British Isles. We went back to my father's headstone, where spread my raincoal on the damp grass and sat by the grave, wondering what, exactly, I'd come ooking for and whether I'd found it.

A cemetery is a place where we confront our dead and try to interact with them. The place itself and the people who keep it are conduits of a symbolic communication between the living and the dead. The staff and surroundings say to the dead, "You did a good job, It was worth doing, We thank you for your sacrifice. We miss you. We hope your soul is at peace. We honor your memory."

The message the living receive from the sensitive attitude of the staff is, "You've suffered a terrible loss. We're sorry." And the implications of the verdant surroundings are, "You're allive and growing on a base of surfifice and accomplishment of those who are dead." Those messages were as much as I could hope to gain on this visit.

What more I really wanted was a clue that my father would have been pleased with me. Never having seen myself reflected in his eyes, I longed to ask important questions any daughter would like to have answered by her dad.

"Are you proud of me? Have I done a good job? Do you (hink I'm pretty? What are your ambittions-for-me? How am I doing?" Silent-questions, met by silence.

Waiting for the nurse to come with the pain shot is rapidly becoming a thing of the past. Doctors say a three-year study of a device that lets nospital patients administer small amounts of painkiller to themselves as they need it shows the machine is ready for general

University anesthesiologist involved in the study.

With the patient-controlled analgesia (PCA) with the patient can send painkiller into his intravenous tube by pushing a button similar to a nurse call button. The university's prescription bandes not apply to noncosmetic uses of the lenses, which might still be prescribed to hold medication on a pallents eye, or for use by a patient who can't manage the maintenance required for daily-wear lenses.

The American Academy of Ophthalmology last summer warned that extended wear lenses have 'unjointening when there is inadequate patient instruction, lack of patient compliance, and insufficient, professional supervision...




