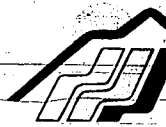

## Grateful nation remembers others

Observance of Thanksgiving Day launches Americans into holiday season

Space shuttle astronauts feasted on irradated turkey. New Yorkers gathered in a cold rain to watch the annual Thanksgiving Day parade and comic strips mixed humor with grim reminders of famine as families drew their chairs up to tables Thursday to count their blessings for another year.

Across the nation, it was a day to remember others, from flood victims in West Virginia to starving children in Ethiopia. "Daddy" Bruce Randolph whipped up barbecue for 100,000 in Denver, where part of East-34th Street officially took on his name, while 40 needy families in El Paso, Texas, feasted on turkey, dressing and other staples delivered by retired mailman Raul Natividad and his brother, Joe.

"If you don't have any place to go or you can afford only a burger and fries for a Thanksgiving dinner, then come on down," was the call of Houston businessman J. David Moeller, who rounded up 100 turkeys to throw a free dinner in front of City Hall.

"I've got a lot to be thankful for," said Richard Dallara, a Garberville, Calif., man who lived for four days with a mechanical heart before getting a human organ Oct. 29. "Sometimes I wake up in the morning and I just cry because it's so good to be alive."

Dallara, who was released from a San Francisco hospital to spend a few hours with his family, received word Tuesday that his body appeared to be rejecting the new heart.

Clowns and stars sloshed down rainy Broadway in New York City for the 59th annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, shrugging off the wet for the enjoyment of millions of children.

"It's cold. It's raining. But at least it's Thanksgiving," said Bill Classen, one of the Macy's actresses who inflated the parade's trademark helium-filled balloons. "It could be worse."

Kernell the Frog sprang a few leaks, forcing workers to lift his dragging green feet from the pavement. And 72-foot-tall Betty Boop, this year's new arrival, peeped into an apartment and tipped precariously toward a traffic island as 40 workers struggled to keep her under control.

New Yorkers tuned to the radio instead of television heard WOR talk show host John Travolta read some of the comic strips that carried a reminder of hunger on the day of plenty. From "Dick Tracy" to "Doonesbury," nearly 200 strips joined in.

President Reagan spent the day at his mountain retreat in California with his brother and three of his four children.

## Hundreds dine in park across from White House

WASHINGTON — Hundreds of the capital city's hungry and homeless lined up in a chilly rain across the street from the White House on Thursday for a free Thanksgiving dinner designed "to send the message that all is not right with everybody."

The Lafayette Park dinner was sponsored by the Center for Creative Non-Violence, a private group that champions the poor and homeless.

Mitch Snyder, leader of the CCNV, estimated that 1,000 to 2,000 people would eat

the traditional dinner of turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetables and pumpkin pie.

"We've done this every year since 1978 and every year we get more people," said Snyder, speaking in the basement of St. John's Church across the street from the park. The food was prepared there by volunteers.

Louis Bolnott, who said he lives at a local shelter for the homeless, said he was happy for the dinner. "I got a lot to be thankful for because a lot of people don't even have this," he said.

Jan Wilson, a widow, said she had come to

the dinner from her small apartment in the city's Northeast section because "I'm all alone and nobody should be alone today. My daughter's up in New York and my son, I don't know where he is. I haven't seen him in a long time."

The dinner had been publicized earlier in the week by being featured in the "Doonesbury" comic strip.

All the food and help was donated, Snyder said. "We had about 300 people come in just this morning," he said. "Some brought turkeys, people brought all kinds of food, and a lot just stayed to help."

Holding the dinner in a spot with the White

House as a backdrop was done on purpose, he said.

"This city, this spot in front of the president's house, is the center of the western world," he explained. "We want to send the message that all is not right with everybody."

"We don't want to ruin anybody's holiday with this reminder of the hungry," he said. "We just don't believe you can have a real holiday unless you can include everybody."

The day was chilly and overcast, with temperatures in the mid-40s. And a cold rain began falling as the diners queued up in two lines curving around the statue of Andrew Jackson that sits in the middle of the park.

## Vet in shack continues fast for POW-MIA cause

KENT, Wash. — If Gino Casanova's thoughts drift, whether from hunger or the bitter cold, he has only to look at his mall to remind him of why he's spending two months in a bamboo hut in the middle of a snow pasture.

One letter is addressed: "Vet in Bamboo Cage, Kent, Washington." Another, from Louisville, Ky.: "Starving Veterans for Missing POWs."

"See? See how they address their mail to me," said the former Marine, holding a handwritten note in his eight-foot-square hut, which he entered for a 61-day stay on Oct. 16.

Horns sounded outside as passing motorists responded to a sign asking them to honk in support of missing Americans.

The veteran of two tours in Vietnam has vowed to go without food until Dec. 16 — each day representing one Washington state resident still missing in action in Southeast Asia — to publicize the plight of the 200 to 300 American soldiers and fliers he believes remain imprisoned. He drinks only water with lime juice.

Casanova, 34, a divorced father of an 8-year-old girl, is an organizer of West Coast Veterans, which promotes the cause of prisoners of war and those missing in action.

He said the group began circulating petitions a year ago asking the government to increase its efforts to gain return of Americans in Southeast Asia, including recruiting the help of allies to put economic pressure on Vietnam and Laos.

"Interest was minimal," he said, until he took to his bed in the bamboo hut, which symbolizes cages used to hold American POWs in Vietnam.

"I wish we'd thought of it 10 years ago," he said.

"I want to get some kind of movement going, as the protesters did in the '60s to end the

war," he said. "It's just up to the people to bring them all home."

Casanova said the petitions have been circulated up and down the West Coast and as far east as Illinois. "We want 4 million signatures," he said, adding that he plans to organize rallies and marches after his fast ends.

Sen. Slade Gorton, R-Wash., stopped by Wednesday and told Casanova he would carry his petitions to the White House. But he also said President Reagan, who is to visit Seattle on Monday, probably will decline Casanova's invitation to visit his hut.

## Expect few arms control advances, adviser says

WASHINGTON — A senior arms control adviser to President Reagan warns against too much post-summit expectation that an agreement on nuclear weapons is attainable soon, even though both Washington and Moscow agreed to accelerate their talks.

Rather than progress, Gen. Edward Rowny, who was a member of the U.S. summit delegation, suggested there might be a post-summit stand-off over Reagan's "Star Wars" proposal, with each side waiting for the other to make the next move.

He said the United States already has a fair proposal on the table at the Geneva arms talks and that the next move should be up to the Soviets. The fourth round of the talks, which have been in a stalemate, open in mid-January.

But Rowny said he sees no indication that the Soviets are ready to back off their demand that the Reagan administration drop the "Star Wars" shield against nuclear armament to get a comprehensive arms control agreement.

"We went to great lengths to try to condition people that they shouldn't expect much" from the summit on arms control, Rowny said in an interview. But he said expectations appear to be rising anyway that an accord might be ready for the second summit with Mikhail Gorbachev next year.

"I hope that the expectations will also be higher on regional issues and other issues, but so far I've been disappointed that not much of that is catching on with the public," he added in the interview Wednesday.

Rowny said the Nov. 19-21 Geneva summit was useful for arms control because

## Red cells from lab safe, effective

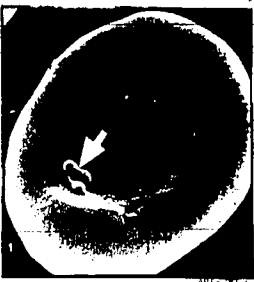
LOS ANGELES — Artificial red blood cells made of tiny capsules of hemoglobin, the oxygen carrier in rat blood, proved safe and effective in rats and someday may help save human patients, a researcher says.

The synthetic cells don't duplicate all the functions of real red blood cells but do mimic their ability to carry oxygen to the body's vital organs and tissues, said pharmaceutical chemist C. Anthony Hunt, author of a study published today in the Journal Science.

Human testing of the new blood cell substitutes is at least two years away, he said in a telephone interview from the University of California at San Francisco.

Researchers say the artificial red blood cells differ from Fluosol, another experimental oxygen carrier that has been tested on humans since 1979 but has yet to gain government approval. Fluosol is based on an oily liquid rather than encapsulated hemoglobin.

Hunt said that if the cells can be approved and mass-produced, paramedics might in-

ject them into severely injured people who lost large quantities of blood.

The blood substitute also could be used to get oxygen to cancer cells deep within solid tumors, making them more responsive to radiation therapy or chemotherapy, he ad-

The man-made cells are one-twelfth the size of real red blood cells, so they can squeeze through partially blocked arteries, Hunt said. Blockage of the coronary arteries can cause heart attacks, while blockage of arteries supplying the brain causes strokes.

Hunt and his colleagues were concerned the blood substitute blood might prompt the formation of artery-blocking clots, so they tested the cells to see if they damaged rats' lungs, brains, livers, spleens, hearts and kidneys.

At one day, one week and 30 days after half the rats' blood was replaced with transfusions of artificial blood cells, the only damage the researchers found was comparable to that caused by transfusions with real blood.

Because the study showed the substitute blood cells are safe and effective in rats, it "is a very important step" toward their eventual use in humans, said Ljubomir Djordjevic, a senior scientist at Chicago's Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center.

The artificial cells created by Hunt and his colleagues are bubbles of fat that encapsulate hemoglobin.



# Weather goes to extremes

Rain dampened Thanksgiving Day throughout much of the East and snow piled up in New England and the Western mountains, while November's record cold wave continued with 32 below zero at International Falls, Minn.

But parts of the Southeast continued to bask in unseasonably warm weather.

Heavy rain on saturated ground made streams flood in parts of Pennsylvania and West Virginia, where floods earlier in the month caused widespread destruction.

Travelers' advisories warning of slippery roads for snow or freezing rain were posted from New England into northeastern Pennsylvania and southern Michigan, central Missouri, northwestern Arkansas, Colorado's mountains, parts of Oregon and the mountains of Northern California and Nevada.

Thanksgiving Day lows were between 10 below zero and 20 below zero from Montana to northern Minnesota. Havre, Mont., hit a record low of 26 degrees below zero, and the National Weather Service calculated the wind chill factor at around 70 below zero.

The "nation's icebox," International Falls, along the Canadian border in Minnesota's North Woods, hit a low of 32 below zero. The previous record for the date was only 21 below, set in 1978.

Other record lows for the date included 16 below at Bangor, Me., 17 at Duluth, Minn., 24 below at Great Falls, Mont., and 16 below at Kalispell, Mont., and Rapid City, S.D. Havre's low broke a record that had stood since 1936, while Fargo, N.D., hit 24 below to tie a record on the books since 1939.

Spokane, Wash., hit record lows in the last 111 days, the weather service said, but Thursday's low of 12 below missed the record for the date, set in 1936, by one degree.

By contrast, high temperature records for the date included 77 at Raleigh, N.C., 71 at Roanoke, Va., and 81 at Savannah, Ga. And Wilmington, N.C., tied its record of 80.

The snow that spread into New England brought ski slopes to life but snarled traffic and dozens of cars slid off highways. "It's been busy so far," said state police dispatcher Brannie Pinkham. "But we've been lucky — no major accidents."

And in Augusta, Maine, the snow

was not enough to deter about two dozen people eager to run off their turkey dinners ahead of time, as they trotted around the north end of the city for the annual Gaspard Gobbler Road Race.

In the Northwest, numerous road closures were reported in Washington state after the second storm in a week left up to 12 inches of snow in the northwestern part of the state.

Interstate 90, the state's main east-west route, had to be closed for four hours Wednesday.

The 17.4 inches of snow so far this month at the Seattle-Tacoma airport has already broken this century's November record of 13.7 inches, the weather service said.

But elsewhere, small stream flooding was reported in parts of West Virginia and southwestern Pennsylvania after heavy rain fell on already saturated ground.

More than 2 inches of rain fell on parts of West Virginia in 24 hours, on top of more than 7 inches that fell in the previous 24-hour period and forced about 700 people to evacuate in the northern part of the state.

Much of the state was hit hard three weeks ago by flooding that killed at least 38 people and caused at least \$90 million in damage statewide.

In southern West Virginia, Beckley reached a record of 5.6 inches of rain for the month of November.

Some people also had to leave their homes in southern Pennsylvania, where Pittsburgh's rainfall for the month reached 10.6 inches, the previous record one-month total of 10.25 inches set in June 1951, the weather service said.

Officials of eastern Ohio's Belmont County asked the National Guard for help as crews worked Thursday to clear a highway blocked by mudslides for more than two days.

The slides forced some families to evacuate when the mud washed down between Shadyside and Pawlath Point.

In the South, thunderstorms during the night ripped a four-story section of wall from a 12-story office building at Nashville, Tenn., but authorities said they didn't know if it was struck by a tornado, lightning or strong wind.

## Victim makes final flight

VALLETTA, Malta (AP) — Scarlett Marie Fiegenkamp's body was put on a plane Thursday for her final trip home. A terrorist shot her in the head because she was an American, and she became the first victim of a hijacking that took 59 lives.

U.S. Ambassador Gary Matthews presided at a brief ceremony beside the British Airways jet.

It was a blustery day on this Mediterranean island.

"It's very saddening to think that terrorists have brought the world to this stage of things," Matthews said before the body was put aboard. "It also shows that being absolutely firm with them is an absolute necessity. In that respect, Malta showed they could stand up, be counted and be firm."

### Market chain patrons trade turkeys

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — Worried customers flocked to Poodtown stores in New Jersey and New York on Thursday to hoard turkeys after the supermarket chain recalled a batch of birds suspected of containing a high level of bacteria. Poodtown ordered the recall after two customers complained of food poisoning from turkeys. "There is a higher than acceptable bacteria count in certain birds that can be identified by a strong pungent odor," said Marvin Reichenstein, a spokesman for Twin County Grocers Inc. of Edison.

### Committee improves tax reform proposal

As President Reagan's tax-reform bill moves slowly through Congress, the modifications so far have improved it.

The House Ways and Means Committee finished work last weekend, and while it made a number of significant changes, none of them really challenges the basic outline of the bill as Reagan proposed it last May.

Yet now the White House treats it as an open question whether Reagan will grant the Ways and Means version even the minimal support necessary to put it before the Senate.

Like the president's original proposal, the Ways and Means revision lifts the tax threshold above the poverty level of income. Some 6 million people who earn very little would no longer have to pay income taxes on it, an adjustment that is doubly urgent because of the rising burden of payroll taxes on these people.

In another contribution to fairness, the Ways and Means Committee has also been less generous to the people at the top of the income scale than Reagan's bill was.

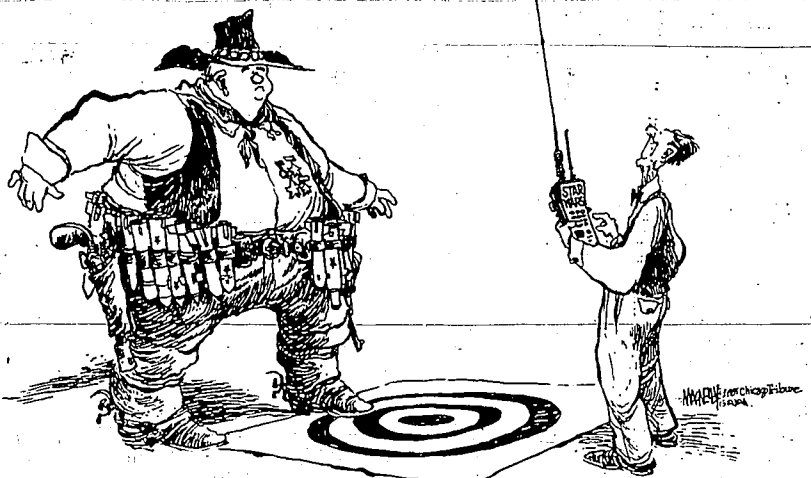
In one of its few conspicuous departures from Reagan's bill, Ways and Means would retain full deductibility of state and local taxes. That doesn't have much to do with fairness, but it will greatly ease the financing of public education, a national responsibility that takes precedence over most of the things that the federal budget supports.

The central political issue in this bill, and its chief purpose, is to reduce individuals' taxes by reducing the rates, and to swing that burden onto corporations by abolishing some of their present breaks.

As they consider the implications, corporations' opposition to the bill is steadily increasing. The White House blames it on the Ways and Means changes.

But the Ways and Means bill does not greatly depart from the model that Reagan proposed six months ago. It is more progressive in its impact on rich and poor, but not fundamentally different in its balance between private individuals and business.

## Eventually, Congress must pass a realistic farm program

The House Agriculture Committee began working last week on a bill to save the Farm Credit System, the nation's largest source of loan money for farmers. The system, composed of hundreds of member-owned cooperatives, is on the verge of collapse because America's troubled family farmers increasingly have been unable to pay back their loans.

Meanwhile, the Senate has just finished its version of the 1985 farm bill, which will set the nation's agriculture policies for the next four years. The House passed its version of that bill before it took up the farm credit question.

The timing of the two efforts is ironic and instructive: in effect, one body of Congress is developing a farm policy for the next four years, while the other body is trying to rescue farmers from the policies of the last four. This is a signal that Congress has been forced to develop farm policy under the Reagan administration.

Some people think that we in Congress spend too much time worrying about farmers and their many problems. But family farmers don't have lots of problems; they

have one problem that causes most of their other ills — their income is too low. That's why they're defaulting on their loans and going out of business.

For five years the administration has driven down farm income with a "free-market" policy, ignoring the fact that unfair foreign trade practices, government subsidization of imports and a tax code that benefits investors who use farming as nothing more than a tax shelter have made a mockery of the term free market.

The administration says that its farm policy saves money. But now we're seeing that driving down farm income by letting farmers fend for themselves costs more than it saves.

The collapsing Farm Credit System is just the first of the costs. During the third quarter of 1985, the system reported losses of \$522 million. Further losses of at least \$6 billion are expected in the next few years. And a recent Chase Econometrics study

showed that without federal assistance the system could default.

A default would affect everyone. The Farm Credit System is about the same size as the nation's third-largest bank. According to the Chase study, a Farm Credit System default would drive up private interest rates by three percentage points, cause the loss of 1 million housing starts in the next two years, cost 1.5 million jobs in 1987 and increase the deficit by anywhere between \$53 billion and \$265 billion.

We who represent selling farm families understand that the problem of low farm income has many causes and that we need to deal with them one at a time — with a sensible farm policy, a realistic attitude toward our trading partners, comprehensive tax reform and non-nonsense deficit cutting. But that's not what we have done.

The House's version of the 1985 farm bill is a case in point. We could have passed a bill that would have raised income for small wheat and corn farmers — without busting the budget, encouraging overproduction or giving huge government subsidies to those who don't need them. Instead we passed a

bill that continues the bad policies of the last five years.

Family farmers rely heavily on federal farm programs to help determine the prices that they receive for their crops. When prices are high, their incomes are high; when prices fall, so do their incomes.

The farm bill just passed by the House will mean low prices for wheat and corn farmers, who make up the bulk of the farm families in trouble.

So, more of them will default on their loans. The banks that made the loans will suffer right along with the farmers and, eventually, with the rest of the public.

To prevent that, Congress has to deal with the farm credit crisis. The Farm Credit System has requested a \$6 billion bail-out. Meanwhile, the administration has proposed restructuring the system, but refuses to guarantee the system's survival. If the system collapses, we will all pay for it through unemployment benefits, welfare payments and lost tax revenues: an estimated 88,300 farms would face foreclosure.

Neither option addresses the real issue —

that we will have to pass more legislation to raise prices and increase farm income.

How much would higher farm prices cost consumers? If the House had agreed to give wheat farmers the price increase that they wanted (about \$1.75 per bushel), it would have increased the price of a 51 loaf of bread by 2 cents. That's not entirely inconsequential. But it is without a doubt the cheapest and the most humane alternative.

Keeping American family farmers in business is the best way to maintain America's ability to produce the best possible food at the lowest possible price.

The administration says that it can cut the deficit and food prices by slashing agriculture programs. But the real cost of this policy is much higher than the administration thinks it is. A good farm bill would have cost a lot less. Eventually we will have to have one.

## Regan's comment on women underscored old stereotype

Women left out of summit

**BOSTON** — By now the embers of the fireside summit have cooled and everyone has recovered from Geneva jet lag. But I'm afraid it's going to take a good deal longer to recover from Geneva time warp.

The meetings between the leaders of the East and West looked for all the world like a 19th-century dinner party.

The men had retired to one drawing room to determine the fate of the Earth, while the women were sequestered in another determining the fate of fashion.

The required team uniform for the summit was a pin-striped suit. Both sides even wore the same old school tie.

There was only one woman among the chief negotiators, Rozanne Ridgway, the undersecretary of state, but she hardly surfaced. Indeed the only female voice I heard in three days was that of a translator.

The chief summit tour guide baccho to those wonderful yesteryears was, of course, Donald Regan. He appeared in a starring role as the late George Apley of the White House.

Regan closed the doors to the drawing room with his now-famous line that women "are not going to understand throwweights or what is happening in Afghanistan or what is happening in human rights." Even Phyllis Schlafly hoped he was misquoted.

My own benign inclination is to accept the apology Regan uttered on Sunday. He suffers

from repeated relapses of a genetic disease: testosterone poisoning.

Besides, a friend tells me that his rough polling of men in his locker room showed that the overwhelming majority of them defined "throwweights" in football terminology. It's probably what got Regan Theisman in trouble.

It is best to think of Regan's throwweights as just one of a series of summit throwbacks.

The media was barely more up-to-date. They viewed the meetings through a 1950s lens, especially the TV lens.

All over town, reporters went back on the late, unlamented, "wife beat." The media came up with endless tales of the "style wars" and the "tea summit" between Raisa Gorbachev and Nancy Reagan.

The wife beat was re-created in large part out of the desperation of 3,000 reporters in search of a story. But it enhanced the time warp.

Women were not officially heard at the summit, so they were seen. And seen. And seen. Women had no public role, so they were

covered in their private role.

Every item in each wardrobe was scrutinized. Reporters who actually do know about the MX and SS had to start from scratch learning about deerskin sleeves.

Some in the media were relieved and somewhat resentful at the detente of the couture battle, but it was left to Nancy Reagan of all people to call the wardrobe coverage "a little silly."

The irony is a familiar one: When women appear in public life today wrapped in power, we think less about the shape of their dresses. When they make a splash as co-workers, the spotlight is more on work than on wives. We saw that update in the 1984 election when Geraldine Ferraro's presence took some of the heat off Joan Mondale. And we saw it in reel reversal last week.

The ultimate sidebar on the female place at the summit was the report that Nancy offered, and Raisa accepted, almond tea. It was indeed the teatotal of their role in negotiations.

But this retrospectacle on the international stage of women also featured a favorite old myth about the "real power" of women. Both Raisa and Nancy were described repeatedly as highly influential with their husbands.

Nancy, we were told to an article of faith, was the crucial force behind nudging Regan up the summit. It was her desire that he

leave a legacy of peace.

I don't discount the wifely influence. I have no idea what it is or isn't. But I do see the ancient pattern to this thinking.

The more remote women are from the inner circle of policy-making, the more we attribute to them mystical or occult powers over the insiders. The less they actually speak in the chambers, the more we believe in the persuasive language of a coddled pillow talk.

They are, we say, the power behind the throne or the devil in the kitchen. Indeed women are so powerful by marriage, powers-in-law, they barely need any of the heady stuff in their own right.

It is said that the summit is one of the last bastions of an all-male world. With apologies to Donald Regan, those of us who already have won the dice above, indeed women are right and responsibility to be equal among the planners for peace.

It is not too much to ask that between now and Summit II women move from their seppuku drawing room to the negotiating table.

Until then I am grateful for this trip abroad. But from one point of view, the fresh start looked awfully old-fashioned.

# Astronauts set for spacewalk

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — Atlantis' astronauts, celebrating Thanksgiving with a feast of irradiated turkey and frozen vegetables, flawlessly launched an uninsured satellite from their spacecraft Thursday and prepared for a two-day spacewalking construction job.

The RCA Satcom K-2, the most powerful domestic communications satellite ever built, spun out of Atlantis' cargo bay precisely as planned at 2:57 p.m. MST and 45 minutes later rocketed itself toward its permanent orbit 22,300 miles above the Earth.

"When it went out, there was a bigger boom," he said, referring to the thump of springs that eject the satellite.

Launch of the final satellite on Atlantis clears the way for two six-hour space walks by Ross and Sherwood Spring today and Sunday. They are to test the complex techniques of assembling large structures in orbit by hand.

Mission Control awoke the crew of six men and one woman with a recording of "America, The Beautiful" and then relayed a message from Kathleen Shaw, wife of mission commander Shaw.

"Your families on Earth," said the message, "wish their loved ones aboard Atlantis a happy Thanksgiving."

## Reagans given airborne greeting

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (AP) — With a lucky break from the weather, President Reagan and his family got a Thanksgiving greeting from the sky as they gathered for a traditional turkey feast at his mountaintop ranch north of here.

Climbed to 4,000 feet above sea level to meet federal regulations for flying over the presidential hideaway, and then circled the ranch for about 10 minutes.

## Mrs. Bonner gets passport for Italy, U.S.

NEWTON, Mass. (AP) — Soviet dissident Yelena Bonner told her family Thursday that she has received a passport allowing her to travel Monday to Italy and then to the United States for medical treatment.

In a telephone call from Moscow to family members in Massachusetts, Mrs. Bonner, wife of Nobel Peace Prize winner Andrei Sakharov, said she first was given a passport with Italy stated as her destination, but "she refused to take it," said her daughter, Tatiana Yankelevich.

## Wind shear training due

DALLAS (AP) — The federal government will spend \$14 million to train pilots to avoid wind shear, the storm-effect that investigators think caused a Delta Air Lines crash that killed 137 people.

Delta Flight 191 crashed after encountering wind shear, an abrupt change in wind direction and velocity, as it approached Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport during an Aug. 2 storm.

The 19-day-old Palestinian baby was brought by her mother to the hospital in the West Bank town of Jenin about two weeks ago for treatment, said an area police spokesman Ovadia Zorea.

A doctor who treated the child declared her dead after several hours and ordered the body placed in the mortuary, but when family members went to the hospital the

following morning the baby was found to be alive. Zorea said. Medical staff tried to revive her, but she finally died after about two hours, he said.

Zorea said the incident only came to light after the child's mother complained to police earlier this week, 12 days after the death.

He said a committee of inquiry had been set up by the Israel's civil administration in the occupied West Bank. Police "are examining the matter from the point of view of the negligence of the doctor, which can be a criminal offense," Zorea said.

## Travel care urged

### Sheriff says roads will be treacherous

TWIN FALLS — Magic Valley travelers will contend with slippery roads and poor visibility on this Thanksgiving weekend, the heaviest holiday travel weekend of the year.

"Drive slow and start early," the Twin Falls County Sheriff's office cautioned Thursday night.

Idaho State Police said the National Weather Service was reporting one to four-inch snow flurries on area roads.

Police said widespread caution would be the order of the day and urged motorists not to spoil their holiday by taking unnecessary risks.

According to the American Automobile Association (AAA), the number of Americans on the road this Thanksgiving weekend will jump 20 percent above last year's. About 29 million people, roughly 12 percent of the U.S. population, were expected to take to the roads this weekend.

In the West, about 6 million people were expected to travel on this opening weekend of the holiday season, the AAA said. The bulk of those travelers were expected to be in the coastal areas, while about 1.4 million were expected to be traveling in the mountain states.

Gas prices stayed nearly level in southern Idaho this year. The average gas price was 1.264 dollars per gallon at this time last year, while gas prices inched up to 1.289 dollars per gallon this year.

Nationwide gas prices averaged 1.256 dollars per gallon, nearly three cents higher than at this time last year.

Idaho motorists are not expected to have any trouble finding gas this weekend. An AAA survey said over 60 stations will be open 24 hours in Boise, Nampa, Caldwell, Welter, Mountain Home, Bliss, Twin Falls, Burley, American Falls, Pocatello, McCammon, and Idaho Falls.

## Area taxes higher

### County costs for insurance pace increase

TWIN FALLS — The skyrocketing costs of liability insurance for cities, school districts and Twin Falls County were reflected this year in generally higher taxes throughout the county.

The city of Murtaugh, for example, increased its tax levy by 64 percent this year over the 1984 level, mostly because of higher insurance premiums.

Murtaugh City Clerk Jeannine Bennett reported that the city budgeted \$5,000 to buy liability insurance in the 1985-86 fiscal year, compared with an insurance bill of \$900 the previous fiscal year.

While cities are restricted by law to a maximum 5-percent annual increase in taxes to fund their overall operating budget, they aren't restricted by that amount when it comes to generating tax revenue to pay for insurance.

The levy for the city of Twin Falls jumped about 7 percent this year over 1984 and part of the reason was insurance. City Finance Director Rick Thompson reported the city budgeted about \$241,000 for insurance in 1985, compared with \$173,000 it paid the previous year for coverage on law enforcement, city vehicles, "slip and fall" claims and other aspects of city operation.

The increased city levy also mirrors a hike in the city budget and an increase in the costs of firefighters' retirement.

The city of Buhl budgeted about \$33,000 to purchase insurance this fiscal year. That's almost double the amount budgeted last year. The 11 percent increase in the city's tax levy partly reflects those insurance costs.

In Filer, City Clerk Frances Wells said the city anticipates spending \$25,000 in the 1985-86 fiscal year on insurance, which is almost 100 percent more than last year's levy. Hansen City Clerk Darlene Miller said the city designated about \$11,000 for coverage this year. It spent \$5,000 last year.

The city of Kimberly expects its insurance rates to triple this year over the \$10,000 it paid for insurance in 1984. Again, the larger insurance bill is reflected in the 19 percent increase in the city's tax levy, compared to last year.

Ironically, some of the cities in the county and elsewhere in the state may lose their insurance after the end of the year when their policies are canceled by a major carrier.

The story of increased insurance rates continues in Twin Falls County, where the commissioners budgeted \$110,000 this year to buy the coverage. Last year, the county spent about \$4,000 on the same items.

Although school districts in the county also reported inflated insurance premiums this year, in most cases there were no larger-than-levies to pay for those increases, according to district superintendents.

## Downtown holiday festivities prepared

TWIN FALLS — Santa Claus, the Nutcracker and discount Christmas movies will return to downtown Twin Falls this year, but merchants also have a few new events to pull from their Christmas stockings.

Friday will be the start of the commercial season, with Mr. and Mrs. Santa Claus arriving in Twin Falls at noon. They'll be letting the reindeer rest up for the big night, making their way downtown in a horse-drawn, antique sleigh or carriage, as dictated by the weather.

For adults, the Downtown Business Improvement District has a decorations-lighting ceremony planned for 6:30 p.m. Friday. The display at the Main Avenue and Shoshone Street intersection will be lighted for the first time then.

Spectators will be invited to warm themselves with hot chocolate, hot cider or coffee that evening and throughout the Christmas holiday season in the old First National Bank Building.

Downtown merchants have arranged for live Christmas music, ranging from chamber music to children caroling at various times throughout the Christmas season in the bank building hospitality house. A juried art show called "Art in the English Tradition" featuring Idaho painters, potters and weavers will be on display.

The hospitality house will be open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. most days. But on the days that downtown will be open special hours, the house will also be open.

Fridays until Christmas many downtown

stores will be open until 8 p.m., and merchants are being urged to remain open from noon to 4 p.m. on Sundays.

Participating downtown stores will be selling 50-cent tickets that will admit one child to Saturday and Sunday Grated matinees while their parents shop. Christmas movies are also planned for Dec. 23 and 24.

Tickets to "The Nutcracker," performed by the American Festival Ballet and 29 area children, will go on sale Tuesday at any Twin Falls Bank and Trust office, Judi's Books, Venzon's Jewelers, the Homestead and Kitchen Magic. The 8 p.m. performance on Dec. 19 will cost \$7.50 for adults and \$5 for children and senior citizens.

## Potential waste-problems exceed state's four designated sites

## Next five years of Superfund important to Idaho

TWIN FALLS — When the House of Representatives returns from its Thanksgiving recess, it is expected to consider legislation reauthorizing the Superfund program for another five years.

Enacted in 1980, the federal Superfund program, part of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, or CERCLA, is by many accounts only just beginning.

While Superfund may not seem to be a critical issue in Idaho, which has only four designated Superfund cleanup sites, that is a sizeable number for a state with a total pop-

ulation smaller than many mid-sized eastern cities. Also, the state's sensitivity to damage, and its dependence on groundwater for drinking water supplies, makes its toxic waste problem much more severe than its size might suggest.

In addition to the four listed sites, there are 110 hazardous waste sites currently under investigation in the state as possible candidates for a Superfund cleanup. According to staff members from the state's Division of Environment, there may also be several hundred additional sites which have yet to be discovered or officially investigated.

While there are currently just over 500 hundred sites slated for cleanup on the National Priorities List, the

EPA has predicted that number could rise to 2,000. The Office of Technology Assessment, however, suggests that number may be even higher, with possibly 10,000 sites or more requiring cleanup by Superfund.

According to a reports released in March by the OTA, only 20 percent of the 538 sites listed at that time had received any remedial cleanup attention, even though about \$1 billion of the program's \$1.6 billion five-year funding had been spent.

Furthermore, the OTA report said cleanups tended to be "impermanent" since initial cleanups emphasize removing wastes to land disposal. Those disposal sites may in turn, according to the OTA, become

Superfund sites themselves because of the wastes being taken to them by other Superfund "cleanups."

In addition to reauthorizing the program, Congress has also been wrestling with questions of both how much funding should be given to the program and how that funding should be raised.

One thing seems sure: funding will be higher as the program enters its second five years.

The Senate has already passed a bill of its own which would generate \$7.5 billion in revenues for the Superfund program. In the House, a bill being considered by the Ways and Means Committee would generate \$10 billion for Superfund. The question in the House, however, seems to

be who will pay for the fund.

Two of the bills before the House, including the Ways and Means bill, would raise additional revenues for Superfund by increasing taxes on chemical and oil feedstocks and a tax on companies disposing of toxic waste. A third bill, however, would provide the largest share of funds from general tax revenues instead of increased taxes on petroleum and chemical companies. At the same time, it also contains a discretionary "Superfund Surcharge Tax" which could increase the amount of funds paid by "polluters" or the generators of toxic waste. That third bill would also propose lower funding levels closer to those already approved by the Senate.

# Public ambulance district talk set

SHOSHONE — A public meeting to discuss a proposed Lincoln County ambulance district will be held Tuesday at 7 p.m. in the courthouse.

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioners received petitions in October with 96 signatures requesting the forming of a taxing district to finance an ambulance.

County Clerk Dana Sturgeon said only 50 signatures were necessary to request the hearing.

The county currently has a contract with St. Benedict's Family Medical Center in Jerome for a Shoshone-based ambulance.

Sturgeon said the subsidy, plus

other necessary equipment and insurance expenses, amounts to approximately \$50,000 per year for the ambulance service.

The county is facing the loss of revenue sharing funds in the next fiscal year, she said, and since the county is not required by state law to operate an ambulance the county may have to cut the service in order to meet other mandatory obligations.

"The commission feels a moral obligation to have a Shoshone based ambulance," she said, adding the ambulance district is one way to pay for such a service.

Lincoln County has no hospital, and only one doctor to serve its 3,800 people and trauma cases must be transported out of the county.

Records show the current ambulance made 53 trips between June 1 and Oct. 1 to transport trauma, accident and medical cases. Only 11 of the victims were non-county residents.

The county also provides a small subsidy for Quick Response Units in Richfield and Dietrich. The units are operated by volunteer technicians and are prohibited by state law from transporting victims except in the most extreme situations.

"The ambulance district question does not require an election, but the commission needs to know if Lincoln County residents want an ambulance, Sturgeon said.

The district would levy a tax against all taxable property in the county for ambulance service.

**Experts back maternity allowances**

**NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP)** — Employers should give parents of newborns six-month leaves of absence with partial pay to prevent lasting damage to their families, a Yale University committee of family experts said Tuesday.

Parents are stressed, alienated and unhappy in trying to balance the demands of work and babies, said Edward Zigler, director of the Yale Bush Center in Child Development and Social Policy.

"Women are literally splitting themselves in two," trying to work and care for children, said T. Berry Brazelton of Harvard, a well-known pediatrician and author.

Zigler and Brazelton were among the experts in child development, education, social policy, business, and sociology who spent two years studying the question of maternity leaves.

Six months with an infant would allow the parent staying at home to bond with the baby who in turn would start developing a sense of trust, Brazelton said. If the child does not gain this, the stage is set for an "emotional" of problems in later life, Zigler said.

The committee also recommended that employers look for other ways of assisting parents of newborns and newly adopted infants, including implementing flexible work schedules, reduced work hours, job sharing and child-care information and referral services.

The panel proposed granting leaves at least six months long, with 75 percent pay for three months. The estimated \$1.5 billion cost of the leaves could be paid from an insurance fund into which employers and employees would contribute, the committee said.

The group urged the federal government to require such insurance, but said employers should grant the leaves in the meantime.

**New drug answer for rare ailment**

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Touting the success of the "orphan drug" program, the government said Tuesday it has approved a new drug that is unlikely to ever turn a profit but may save the lives of about 100 people suffering from a rare ailment called Wilson's disease.

Health and Human Services Secretary Margaret M. Heckler announced approval of a drug called Cuprid, produced by Merck Sharp & Dohme, as an orphan drug — one with too small a market for commercial development, but still needed for a specific disease.

**How long is too long for a holiday visit?**

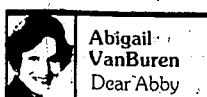

# Idaho Briefly

## Madison potato crop disaster

REXBURG (AP) — The Madison County Commissioners have declared the county a disaster area and will seek assistance for the estimated 217 potato farmers affected by early frost. The disaster declaration will be forwarded to Gov. John V. Evans as a request for agricultural disaster aid. According to figures contained in the letter of declaration, six farmers suffered a total loss on this year's potato crop while another 27 farmers suffered a 50- to 59-percent loss. An estimated 150 farmers had a 30- to 39-percent loss, and 67 suffered 20 percent or less. There are about 750 owner operated farms in Madison County. The commissioners said in the letter the loss figures are only estimates.

## Pend Oreille winter level up

SANDPOINT (AP) — Lake Pend Oreille will be about 3 feet higher this winter than its normal level, officials at the Albion Falls Dam have announced.

Drawdown of the lake to its winter level was completed this week, said Bob Schloss, operations manager for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The lake elevation will be about 2,054 feet for the remainder of the winter, he said.

Normally, the lake is drafted from a summer level of 2,062 feet to about 2,051 feet for the winter. The higher level will be maintained this winter because of a rainy autumn and a low power demand, Schloss said.

The change in operations is not expected to affect fish populations, he said.

## Bonner officials to buy landfill

SANDPOINT (AP) — Bonner County commissioners have reached a tentative agreement to purchase a landfill north of Sandpoint. The purchase price of \$198,000 for the Colburn landfill is about \$70,000 less than the amount considered one month ago by the commissioners.

Deputy County Attorney Jim Hunt said a recent survey revealed nearly seven acres of the 31.5 acre site owned by Ron May already have been used for dumping. "That's why there's a reduction," he said.

May apparently thought more unused land was available, Hunt said.

Formal acceptance of the purchase terms will be completed soon, Hunt said. The county and May have agreed on terms of the agreement, he said.

## Lava mayoral vote rechecked

LAVA HOT SPRINGS (AP) — Election Judges are recounting the votes cast in the Nov. 5 Lava Hot Springs mayoral election at the request of incumbent Leno Seppi, who lost by one vote to a write-in candidate.

The mayoral votes will be recounted at 10 a.m. Monday at Lava Hot Springs city offices. The original election judges will tally the ballots, supervised by Deputy Attorney General Robie Russell.

Seppi said he filed for the recount about 10 days ago.

Seppi, the only mayoral candidate who's name appeared on the ballot, received 69 votes, while write-in candidate Bruce E. Hansen drew 70. About 180 votes were tallied, representing 58.5 percent of the town's registered electorate.

Seppi said he filed for the recount about 10 days ago after finding inconsistencies in the vote count.

## Appeals court affirms jail term

BOISE (AP) — A special panel of the Idaho Court of Appeals has upheld the 60-day jail sentence of a Boise man who injured a state representative in an auto accident.

Acting Appeals Justice Robert Huntley wrote in the opinion that Dennis Kelly Christensen's sentence was "well under the statutory maximum" and that 4th District Judge Alan Schwartzman had not abused his sentencing discretion.

Christensen, 25, was convicted in March of aggravated driving under the influence of alcohol, under a 1983 law that made DUI a felony when someone in a drunken-driving accident is injured and receives "great bodily harm."

## Double drug trial scheduled

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Two juries will sit together in one courtroom next week as the drug trials of Potlatch's former police chief and his son take place simultaneously.

The rare dual-jury procedure apparently has never been used in Kootenai County, and the Idaho Supreme Court decided its first appeal on such a case last month.

Judge Watt Prather told attorneys involved in the case Monday that he will enter a written order splitting the now-combined trials, while providing for two sets of 12 jurors.

## Causa USA invites clergy to seminar

BOISE (AP) — Causa USA, the political arm of the Rev. Sun Myung Moon's Unification Church, has invited two clergymen from the Boise area to a two-day seminar on God vs. communism.

The seminar will be conducted today and Saturday in Boise. Tonight, Jose Ferrate, Causa's representative in Nampa, will speak on "Liberation theology: mixing Communist principles and Christian principles."

Jim Coney, the Unification Church's state director, said he expects approximately 12 clergymen to show up for the seminar. He said controversy surrounding Causa in the media creates a "certain reluctance on the part of people to participate."

No one showed up for a Causa prayer breakfast Tuesday in Boise, Coney said.

Earlier this year, Causa flew several Idaho legislators to anti-communism seminars across the country. Since then some legislators, including Rep. Robert Forrey, R-Nampa, have conducted workshops for Causa.

Some political leaders have criticized the lawmakers' involvement with Causa, saying that they may become beholden to Moon or his followers.

Coney said invitations were sent to clergy from all denominations. He said no legislators were invited to the Boise seminar, which is similar to those that Idaho legislators attended in other states.

"The Causa seminars are primarily for clergy," Coney said. "Clergy must see that communism is religion, Coney said."

# Potlatch workers return amid doubts

LEWISTON (AP) — Wage gains who were laid off by the Potlatch Corp. in August at Northern Idaho plants will return to work because of a union vote approving a pay cut, but the future of unemployed salaried workers is in question.

Potlatch spokesman Todd Maddock said Wednesday he's unsure whether about 100 salaried employees who worked at the Lewiston sawmill and the Jaype plywood plant will return to jobs.

"Right now I would say the picture is clouded," Maddock said.

Several salaried employees will not return because their positions have been eliminated, he said. Those positions include community affairs representatives.

Salaried workers who may be rehired include managers and accountants, he said.

Northern Idaho members of the International Woodworkers of America approved last week a supplemental agreement to the union's contract with Potlatch that will cut workers' hourly wages by \$1.75. The agreement was announced Tuesday.

About 700 mill workers will return to work in January at plants in Lewiston, St. Maries and Coeur d'Alene, while about 650 Potlatch and contract woodworkers will return to timber lands in Northern Idaho.

The agreement is expected to save Potlatch about \$11 million annually.

# Evans asks for waste restriction region

BOISE (AP) — Gov. John Evans is asking six other Western governors to join him in seeking federal legislation to allow the seven states, acting jointly, to restrict or ban the shipment of hazardous waste into their region.

"The time is drawing near when out-of-region waste will no longer be tolerated by Idahoans," Evans said in letters mailed this week.

Evans said that he was "greatly concerned" about Idaho becoming the nation's dumping ground for polychlorinated biphenyl or PCB, a synthetic compound that has been linked to cancer.

The EnviroSAFE Services Inc. hazardous-waste disposal site near Grand View is one of the few in the country that accepts PCBs in concentrations of up to 55 parts per million, Evans said.

Pat Costello, Evans' senior assistant and legal counsel, said the governor wants Congress to authorize states to come up with regional hazardous-waste plans.

He said Evans then wants the

seven states in the Northwest Compact — Idaho, Oregon, Washington, Utah, Montana, Alaska and Hawaii — to agree to restrict or ban the shipment of hazardous wastes from other states into the region. Evans said he would like the agreement approved by Congress.

Costello said Washington, Oregon and Idaho made a similar agreement in 1981 covering low-level radioactive wastes and hazardous wastes. But Congress only allowed agreements

covering low-level radioactive before Congress. Costello said. In his letter, Evans asked the other six governors to have their representatives support his idea when the Northwest Compact Committee meets in Portland on Dec. 5.

Legislation making Washington the regional repository for low-level radioactive wastes still is pending.

# Hofmann still top bombings suspect

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The purported discovery of the McLellan Collection of historical Mormon papers only bolsters police contention that the prime suspect in a pair of fatal bombings in a Texas family, the Deseret News says.

The collection has been the focal point of the investigation into two Oct. 15 bombings that killed documents collector Steven Christensen, 31, and Kathy Sheets, 59, wife of former Christensen associate J. Gary Sheets.

Police have identified Mark W. Hofmann, a rare documents dealer who had done business with Christensen, as their prime suspect in the bombings. Hofmann, 31, was seriously injured Oct. 16 when a third bomb blew up his car.

No charges have been filed in the case.

Earlier Thursday, The Salt Lake Tribune reported it may have located the 150-year-old papers in the possession of a Texas family which said it had owned them for a century.

"If they are the McLellan papers and if the statements (of the owner) made to the media are true, it just proves our point that Hofmann never had the papers," a police official, who requested anonymity told the Deseret News, an evening paper.

Much of the investigation has centered on Hofmann's efforts to sell the McLellan collection to various buyers, including Mormon officials. However, police said they found no evidence Hofmann possessed the documents and it appeared a papyrus purchased from an Eastern dealer was being shown to potential buyers under the claim that it was part of the collection.

William McLellan was an early Mormon apostle who left the church a bitter opponent of the faith's founder, Joseph Smith.

He can't have it both ways," Salt Lake coin dealer Alvin Rust gave Hofmann more than \$150,000 to purchase the collection.

The Tribune said it had not been substantiated that the documents it located in Texas are the same as those referred to by Hofmann. The owner, who said he had placed the papers in a safe deposit box to protect his family, said he had never heard of Hofmann and was unaware of any dealers contacting other family members.

In addition, several of Hofmann's associates have said he told them the Mormon Church obtained the McLellan collection before Sept. 1.

But church officials say they don't have the documents, that they told Hofmann they would not buy them but would accept them as a gift, and that Hugh Pinnock of the church's First Quorum of the Seventy helped Hofmann obtain a \$185,000 loan so he could purchase the collection.

However, KSL-TV has reported that Jones Pinnock offered to provide a jet and an armored car to bring the collection to Utah, but Hofmann declined the offer.

According to the journal, Christensen and Hofmann met with Pinnock on June 28, the same day he helped arrange the loan, and told him that two anti-Mormons also were trying to obtain the documents.

On another matter, one of Hofmann's attorneys admits his client may have obtained two dynamite blasting caps earlier this year.

Brad Rich said it was his understanding that Hofmann and an associate, Shannon Patrick Flynn, had discussed the idea of building a bomb.

Flynn's attorney said his client did obtain two blasting caps earlier this year, but declined to say what Flynn did with them.

Attorneys for both men said the blasting caps had nothing to do with the fatal bombings. The attorneys also have said polygraph tests in denying both men were truthful in denying involvement in the slayings.

Hofmann took one buyer to New York to buy the documents and even showed him shipping receipts, the police official told the Deseret News. "He then told another buyer the documents

**Philippine court nixes mistrial**

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — The Philippine Supreme Court on Thursday dismissed a plea for mistrial in the assassination of opposition leader Benigno Aquino, clearing the way for a lower court to release its verdict on murder charges against the armed forces commander and 25 other men.

The high tribunal voted 9-2 to dismiss the petition and to lift its earlier order temporarily restraining the trial court from announcing its decision. Government critics have said they anticipate a mass acquittal of armed forces chief Gen. Fabian Ver and his co-defendants.

The three-judge court which tried the assassination case was to meet Friday to decide when to release its verdict. The judges had said they had a unanimous verdict but would not disclose it.

Declaration of a mistrial would have required a new trial.

**Troops may have started fire**

VALLETTA, Malta (AP) — The fire that swept through a hijacked Egyptian jet probably was started by explosive charges Egyptian commandos used to blast their way in, not by grenades hurled by the hijackers, a source close to the Maltese investigation said Thursday.

Geneva time spokesman Paul Mifsud would not comment on the cause of the fire aboard the Boeing 737. Egyptian soldiers stormed it Sunday evening and 50 people died during the raid.

Mifsud said he was authorized to say only that autopsy reports indicated "most of the passengers died from smoke inhalation."

Gunmen seized the plane Saturday on a flight from Athens, Greece, to Cairo and ordered it to land on this Mediterranean island. They shot five people before the assault, killing one — Scarlett Marie Roggenkamp, an American.

**Rockets fired at oil refineries**

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Rockets were fired at two heavily guarded oil-from-coal refineries Thursday in what officials see as a new wave of guerrilla attacks that began with land mine explosions earlier this week.

Authorities reported between four and six explosions and said the rockets missed their targets but did not say how many were fired. Government forces searching for the attackers said they killed three black men near the border with Swaziland, about 50 miles away.

At the time of the rocket attack, security forces were looking for more land mines on remote farm roads in the north, near the border with Zimbabwe. Since Tuesday, mines planted in the area have killed one man and wounded seven.

**Indians accuse Union Carbide**

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Indian officials on Thursday officially accused Union Carbide Corp. of responsibility for the Bhopal gas leak that killed 2,000 people, saying its pesticide plant was defective, corroded, leaking and unsafe.

The Madhya Pradesh state government said Union Carbide knowingly constructed a badly designed pesticide factory to handle "dangerously large" quantities of toxic methyl isocyanate. In addition to those killed in the Dec. 3 leak, the world's worst industrial accident, hospitals said they treated 60,000 gas victims. State and federal officials said the gas leak physically affected 200,000 people.

The statement blaming the leak on Union Carbide was the first that Indian officials filed with the inquiry by Justice N.K. Singh, which was set up Dec. 6, 1984. The statement said Union Carbide must bear full moral responsibility and legal liability for the leak of 40 tons of methyl isocyanate.

**Irish Senate approves accord**

DUBLIN, Ireland (AP) — The Irish Senate approved the Anglo-Irish agreement Thursday, clearing the last hurdle for the accord that gives Ireland an unprecedented consulting role in governing Northern Ireland.

The untelevised upper house voted 37-16 for the agreement, with three members absent. One member of the opposition Flanna Fiail party broke ranks and voted for the accord, while one member of the Labor Party, junior partner in the ruling coalition, voted against it.

Britain's House of Commons approved the pact Wednesday night by a 473-47 vote.

**Peres hedges on Navy analyst's spying**

JERUSALEM (AP) — Prime Minister Shimon Peres stonewalled when asked on Thursday about the case of a U.S. Navy analyst arrested on charges of selling classified documents to Israel.

"I am not willing to go into details," Peres said in an interview on Israel television. "We must investigate the affair thoroughly, not implicitly."

A Foreign Ministry official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said Israel was "fully cooperating" with the United States on the case. U.S. officials in Washington claimed the opposite.

The Israeli official confirmed that two Israeli diplomats had been recalled from the United States, and a source identified them as science attachés.

Recall appeared to put them beyond the reach of American investigators. There were increasing signs of a strain between the Reagan administration and its main ally in the Middle East over the investigation of Jonathan J. Pollard, 31, a counter-terrorism specialist, and his wife, Ann Henderson-Pollard.

The source who spoke on condition that he not be identified by name or position, said the attachés may return to the United States to face questioning by U.S. authorities.

He named them as Yosef Yagur, science attaché at the consulate general in New York, and Ilan Ravid, deputy science attaché in the Washington embassy. He linked both diplomats to the case and said Pollard was in touch with Ravid just Thursday. The FBI arrested Pollard last Thursday.

Al Hamlshmar and Maariv, two Israeli newspapers, also named Ravid as Pollard's contact.

**Report: Accused Soviet spy exits Venezuela**

LONDON (AP) — Venezuela's ambassador said Thursday that a former embassy counselor, reported by a Caracas newspaper to have been arrested as a Soviet spy, has left the diplomatic service and returned home.

However, the former diplomat, Kaldone Nwehdet, denied in an interview in another Caracas newspaper that he was a spy and said he had not been fired or placed under arrest.

Ambassador Jose Luis Saleado told The Associated Press that Nwehdet returned to Venezuela early in October. "We have notified the (British) Foreign Office that he is no longer in the service."

A British Foreign Office spokesman said: "We are not saying anything about this."

The Caracas newspaper El Universal reported Wednesday without attribution that Nwehdet had been arrested in Caracas on charges of spying for the Soviet Union.

The report said security agents were sent to London to question other embassy officials.

**U.S. businessman released in China**

PERING (AP) — An American businessman was freed Thursday after serving five months of an 18-month prison term for allegedly causing a hotel fire that killed 10 people in the northeastern city of Harbin last April.

Richard S. Ondrik, 34, said in a telephone interview after his release that the authorities had informed him at 6:30 a.m. Thursday that he was to be released hours later.

Ondrik, originally from Kokomo, Ind., said his immediate plan was to travel to Hawaii to spend time his parents, Anthony and Louise Ondrik of Honolulu.

## 'The Diviners' casts a glow of rural warmth

TWIN FALLS — A touch of human warmth is on tap when the College of Southern Idaho Drama Department takes to the stage at CSI's Fine Arts Auditorium Dec. 5, 6 and 7 to present "The Diviners."

The play, written by James Leonard, is a compelling story of a mentally afflicted boy who is befriended by a former itinerant preacher. The intrigue of the boy's secret and the town's demands creates fascinating theater.

And, for Magic Valley viewers, this presentation offers an opportunity to witness the results of seasoned directing at the hands of T. Leonard Rowley, professor of theater arts at Weber State College in Ogden, Utah.

Rowley, who is an avid actor, has found a temporary home at CSI where he has been putting on a series of workshops for youth, and where he has been working steadfastly at honing "The Diviners" to stage sharpness for next weekend's performances.

Rowley earned both his bachelor and master's degrees at Brigham Young University, and his doctorate from the University of Minnesota.

He served 12 years as department chairman and managing director of Weber State Theatre, and he founded the Golden Spike Repertory Company, a semi-professional group which does a summer season of musical comedy.

From 1969 to 1970, he worked aboard a floating university studying theater in 15 countries. Moreover, Rowley has toured Europe with the International Exchange School and has been on a USO tour. He has also done tours of Hawaii, Egypt, Israel and Jamaica.

Before taking a sabbatical to come to Twin Falls, Rowley has directed more than 100 productions, including classical, period pieces, avant-garde, musical comedy and original scripts. He has also acted in a variety of roles and has taught most undergraduate courses in theater.

On "The Diviners," Rowley says, "I like it because it's full of wonderfully rich characters. The value is in the characterization. It's full of wonderful, Hoosier characters from backwoods Indiana."

Rowley points out that the play is based on actual experience and that the playwright, James Leonard, developed the script with a group of college students in Indiana before competing and winning local and regional competitions of the America College Theatre Festival. The play, only some four years old, has been presented at the Kennedy Center and in New York City.

"When I read the script, I fell in love with the characters," Rowley says, adding, "They're like the people I grew up with. They're farmers and they have no pretense about them."

He notes that Magic Valley audiences should be able to quickly understand the characters in the play because of that lack of pretense, both in the

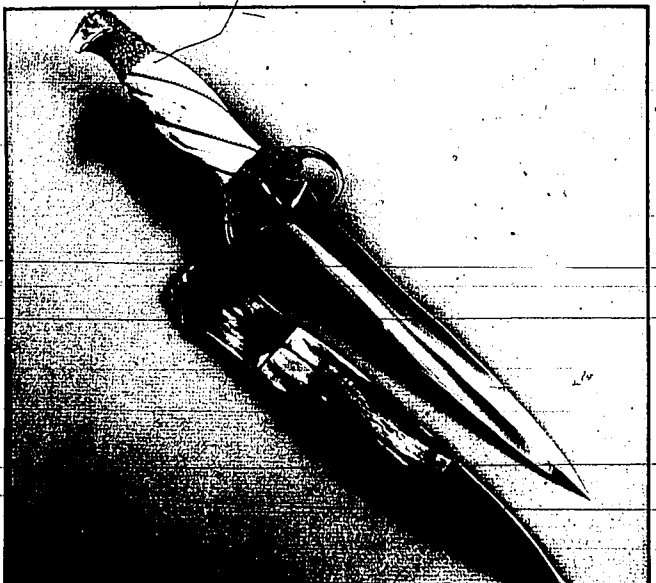
New to the gallery this winter are meticulously hand-crafted knives by Barr Quarton, which range from small boot knives to hunting knives with ivory and antler handles.

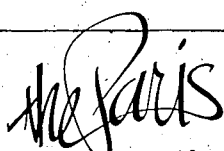

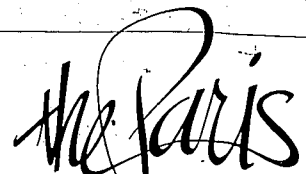

# Fingerpicker plays guitar at academy

TWIN FALLS — Chris Proctor, winner of the U.S. National Fingerpicking Championship in 1982, will perform at the Renaissance Academy of the Arts Dec. 8 at 3 p.m.

Proctor occupies a prominent place in the current guitar revolution which has incurred a crossover and expansion of the boundaries separating classical, jazz and folk.

Moreover, the last decade has seen a new style of playing, one which seems to draw from each earlier category without limit, and which has produced in a very short time remarkable innovations in how the instrument is played and in what is played upon it. Included are new right- and left-hand techniques, new ways of tuning the strings, a new repertoire and an exuberant compositional flair, all of which were either not allowed or were undiscovered by the earlier approaches to the instrument.

This willingness to explore and innovate is the essence of the modern fingerstyle guitarist. Examples can

be found in Proctor's performances and recordings which include an original tribute to the ragtime and blues roots of folk music; a selection of Irish ensemble melodies arranged for solo guitar, and a taste of modernity with unusual meters and extended jazz harmonies.

Proctor also plays high-energy 12-string guitar music and a collection of melodic tune poems inspired by his cross-country travels.

Proctor grew up in Salt Lake City and graduated with a degree in philosophy from the University of Utah in 1973. After a year in VISTA, he moved to Ketchikan to work and ski. It was during his time in the Wood River Valley that he began to play guitar seriously.

The guitarist's performing career blossomed throughout the West, and he soon began recording on the Kicking Mule label. In 1981, he entered the National Fingerpicking Championship in Wintfield, Kan., finishing fourth. The next year he swept to first place.

# Music videos are the 1980s springboard to major films

In the '60s and '70s, someone wanting to be a film director usually went to film school to learn the craft. That was the path taken by such moviemakers as Francis Ford Coppola (UCLA), Martin Scorsese (NYU) and George Lucas (USC). Even Steven Spielberg briefly attended film courses at California State University at Long Beach.

While film school is still an important channel into the movie industry, in recent years another option has opened up for some aspiring filmmakers: music videos. And, because of the popularity of videos, especially among young people, film studios have been signing some of the better video directors for feature motion pictures.

Major studios and independent production companies are constantly looking for hit material. And with the advent of MTV and other music shows — and the critical acclaim of certain video directors — they are trying to tailor-make films to suit

the tastes of a young audience which already spends from two to six hours a day watching music videos.

"Kids today are chewing up visual imagery like a Waring blender," says Paul Justman, who went from directing J. Geils Band's "Centerfold" and "Freeze-Frame" and Diana Ross' "Muscle" to the upcoming youth-oriented film "Gimme an F" for 20th Century-Fox.

"Because rock videos depend on constantly changing images, music directors are able to move these kids with energy. And the studios have seen this. Also, studios in some cases are more willing to give video directors a start — and usually on relatively low-budget projects — because we're already used to working under the budget gun. We've worked under a system of making it fast and making it inexpensive."

However, if last year's "Electric Dreams," or other more recent movie projects directed by video veterans are any indication, the box office fulfillment of this MTV connection will take time to develop.

"Electric Dreams," directed by Steve Barron (Madonna, Michael Jackson, Human League and Eddy Grant) was billed as a "fairly late about computers." From MGM/UA.

It ran into lukewarm reviews and an even cooler reception at the box office. Critics tended to agree that while it showed sparks of Barron's creative video style, overall it was contrived and couldn't hold up for the length of an entire film.

Robinson's "Roadhouse" (Atlantic Releasing Co.) seemed nearly nonexistent during its regional release (though its \$1 million budget made it a considerably less risky proposition than "Electric Dreams," which ran up costs of \$7.5 million).

# Light-beam art inspires films

LOS ANGELES — A gallery at Temporary Contemporary is bare save a square of ghostly electric blue light hanging in a corner. At first it looks like a glowing window opening on a summer's day that is, ultimately, bright even in southern California. Then it transmogrifies and appears as a hovering cube that might be a high-tech Lucite light fixture, except that it clearly has no real physical substance and is thus most likely a celestial pod that will momentarily materialize as an angel of the Lord.

In the next gallery a tall slit of white light runs from floor to ceiling touching a corner. It creates the impression that the wall is sliding aside, hangar-fashion and that soon an airstrip will be revealed, supporting an invisible spacecraft belonging to benign extra-terrestrials who will whisk us away to a better world to the accompaniment of galactic music.

They are astonishing works by any

measure—these light-beam pieces by James Turrell, but what is liable to most surprise the casually cultivated art amateur is that they date from 1967.

At 42, James Turrell is a legendary figure. Most devotees have read that he has received a MacArthur Foundation "genius grant," flies his own airplane and spends the shank of his time working at an extinct volcano in Arizona — Roden Crater — that he is slowly transforming into an artwork. Models and photos on view suggest the dimensions and general demeanor of pyramidal temples in Giza or Yucatan—blended with a more stark, more atavistic character suggesting a lunar Stonehenge.

Along with Robert Irwin, Doug Wheeler and others, Turrell ranks as a pathfinder in what has come to be known as "California Light and Space Art," a highly original artistic formulation that locates the art experience in perception and phenomenological nature. Wise people believe this innovation represents California's best shot at contemporary immortality.

Viewers are also liable to feel something already has been lost by allowing 18 years to pass between local museum exhibitions of Turrell's art. For one thing, the times have to some extent overtaken Turrell, so that the work does not appear quite as fresh as of yore. Limitations of science fiction and movie special effects nibble away at its edges and it requires a slight effort of mind to remember that it was the research and development done by Turrell and others that set the stage for its popular dilution and not vice-versa.

The other problem is that the exhibition muddles about and blurs the essence of this art. That essence is purity. This was amply clear in an exhibition at Manhattan's Whitney Museum a few years back.

Even though the Turrell exhibition is, I think, a clouded demonstration of the artist's aesthetic, it certainly offers ample proof that this kind of art belongs here on significant and permanent view.

# CNN will tap into Soviet satellite

WASHINGTON — Cable News Network has been granted permission to routinely receive transmissions of Soviet television pictures direct from the Soviet satellite system, a Federal Communications Commission official has announced. The permit is subject to instant cancellation without hearing any

time "such revocation is in the public or national interest," a statement from the FCC said.

John M. Coles, of the commission's international facilities division said he did not think the government would use the instant revocation clause to censor reports.

"This is not related to content or programming," he said. CNN has obtained permission from

time to time to receive special events coverage from the Soviet Union, including last year's telecasts of the "Friendship Games," which the Soviets set up when they withdrew from the 1984 Olympics.

The license, which Coles said is the first one allowing routine reception from Soviet satellites, expires in six months. However, CNN can apply for renewal.

# Ono's involvement in TV movie makes 'John and Yoko' realistic

On Monday, Dec. 2, the ballad of John and Yoko becomes an extended video.

Such is the premise of "John and Yoko: A Love Story," starring Mark McGann as John Lennon and Kim Miyori as his wife, avant-garde artist Yoko Ono. The two-hour NBC movie depicts the couple's curious marriage, from their chance introduction at a London boutique in 1966 to the murder of Lennon in 1980.

"The film is remarkably accurate," says Elliot Mintz, a family friend who served as a consultant for "A Love Story." "McGann's mannerisms are uncanny. The way he smokes, the way he talks — when I closed my eyes and listened, it was almost like being there with John again."

Accuracy has been highly touted in this project. Since Lennon was murdered, dozens of books have purported to tell what the former Beatle was really like. Some have been superb, others sleazy and exploitive. So Miss Ono, concerned that the first movie about the couple should be tasteful and honest, sifted through more than a dozen offers before agreeing to work with Carson Productions, producers of "A Love Story."

"Yoko wanted to be in a position to choose the people she was working with," says Mintz. "By participating she felt she could guarantee quality."

With Miss Ono involved, one might expect "A Love Story" to be a tribute, a polite portrait of the artist. Not so. The problems of the couple's public life are here — Lennon's 1968 drug bust, their protests for peace, the scorn for Yoko's art, and the feeling that she broke up the Beatles. And so are the private difficulties — their year of separation, Yoko's two miscarriages, Lennon's tangles with immigration officials and the FBI, and his decisions to leave rock and roll and then to return to it.

"Yoko encouraged the producers to show those things," says Mintz. "This movie is not an airbrushed venture. She wanted to make sure nothing was glossed over."

Some things are neglected, because, as Mintz explains, the Lennon's lives were ones of constant, intense activity. But he feels "A Love

Story" captures the spirit of their marriage, especially the five years following the birth of their son Sean in 1975, when they spent most of the time in virtual seclusion at their New York apartment compound.

"John's wit is missing, but you get a feeling for the flavor of life at the Dakota," Mintz says. "You see John's style of househusbandry. Some of it, anyway. There's a bit from a mock nightclub called the Club Dakota, and a moment where

John's character sings to his son — those scenes are eerily accurate."

And Mintz thinks that "A Love Story" is aptly titled, because the most distinctive feature of life with the Lennons was the couple's love for each other. "If there was one thing you noticed about them, it was the intense romanticism that they shared. The vision of them as an idyllic couple is not exaggerated," he insists. "They were like high-school sweethearts."

**A.** Dylan Thomas was interested in far more than the violent aspects of this story, which derives from the real-life activities of Burke and Hare, two corrupt men who supplied freshly murdered bodies to an anatomy professor for scientific purposes. Thomas was drawn to the tale because it dramatized the age-old question of whether the end justifies the means. This notorious pair's exploits served as a springboard for other movies, novels and plays; among them "The Body Snatcher," a horror film classic co-starring Boris Karloff and Bela Lugosi. Coincidentally, that film was taken from a story written by yet another literary great — Robert Louis Stevenson.

**Q.** You recently mentioned Liz Taylor's interest in race horses and

said she was at the Breeder's Cup party and at the big race. We watched the race on TV and never caught a glimpse of her. — K.B.

# Unheralded CBS movie shocks pundits, wins week for network

NEW YORK — CBS won a week it didn't expect to win when an unheralded movie knocked the stuffing out of "Mussolini" on NBC and "The Ewoks" on ABC. But NBC's "The Cosby Show" stayed on top of the ratings with the biggest audience for a regular series episode in nearly five years.

CBS took its second week of the 1985-86 prime-time season, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. A rousing performance on Sunday night made the difference as "60 Minutes" scored its best rating in two years, ranking third, and "Murder, She Wrote" was fourth.

Those showings nicely set up the first installment of "Doubletake," which confounded the experts by blunting the first part of the seven-hour "Mussolini: The Untold Story" and George Lucas' "The Ewoks: Battle for Endor."

Analysts at all three networks had forecast that "Doubletake" would finish third in the Sunday battle, but the CBS film, ranked 13th, while "Ewoks" was 25th and "Mussolini," 27th.

"We were pleasantly surprised. We hadn't projected a win, but a lot of it had to do with Sunday night," said Mike Eisenberg, CBS' research director.

For the week of Nov. 18-24, CBS averaged an 18.0 rating to NBC's 17.8 and ABC's 14.7. After nine weeks of the season, NBC leads with a 17.9 to CBS' 17.0 and ABC's 16.3. A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million homes with television.

Analysts were split on the impact of President Reagan's post-summit speech in prime time last Thursday. Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice president for research projects, said the address, which pre-empted "Night Court" and pushed some of "Hill Street Blues" out of prime time, robbed NBC of a victory.

"The president really hurt us," said Jaffe. Without the speech, NBC probably would have won, said Marvin Mord, ABC's vice president for marketing and research services.

Eisenberg disagreed, noting that "NBC had a better Thursday night than I normally does."

According to NBC, Robert

McFarland, NBC's Washington bureau chief, recently pointed out to administration officials that the president was making most of his speeches on Thursday night.

Since "The Cosby Show" went on the air in September 1984, four of Reagan's prime-time appearances were on Thursday, including the last two, while four were on Tuesday and three on Wednesday.

"The president knows what's going on," said Eisenberg. "He's going for the nights where the biggest audiences are. Last year we saw Wednesday night speeches when 'Dynasty' was so popular. Reagan always has known how to play to the audience."

Last week, "The Cosby Show" continued its record-setting performance. It had a 35.3 rating and 51 share (percentage of homes with sets on that were tuned in.) The rating, which translates into 30.3 million homes, was the highest for a series in its regular time slot since a "Dallas" episode in January 1981.

NBC's "Family Ties" maintained most of "The Cosby" audience and had a 32.4 rating. Next in the ratings was "60 Minutes," with a 27.2, and "Murder, She Wrote," with a 25.0. Then came NBC's "Miami Vice," NBC's "Golden Girls," part two of CBS' "Kane & Abel," ABC's "Dynasty," ABC's "Dynasty II: The Colbys" and CBS' "Dallas."

Although still popular, "Dynasty" and "Dallas," which finished one-two in 1984-85, have lost some audience this season. Mord said the dip on "Dynasty" was caused by bolstering the characters who would be spun off to "Dynasty II: The Colbys."

"Some favorite characters were not getting as much air time," said Mord, who added that he was pleased by the sampling of "Dynasty II" in its introduction last week.

Although the critically rejected "Mussolini" faltered in the ratings, the "Kane & Abel" miniseries was a success, but not as popular as ABC's "North and South" earlier this month. Part two of "Kane & Abel" was seventh and part three was 12th last week.

With only two days left in the November sweeps, analysts gave NBC a probable victory. During the sweeps months of November, February and May, ratings for local stations are measured, so the networks

often provide special programming to bolster the performances of their affiliated stations.

"It appears NBC's regular series will carry them through the sweeps," said Mord.

Last week's bottom five shows, in descending order, were: NBC's "Punky Brewster," ABC's Summit analysis, ABC's "Hollywood Beat," ABC's "Shadow Chasers" and ABC's just-canceled "Our Family Honor" in 60th place.

# 'Love Boat' skipper looks back on 9 seasons of smooth sailing

LOS ANGELES — For years, ABC's "The Love Boat" has been everywhere. It's welcomed aboard nearly every aging star in Hollywood and anchored ABC's successful Saturday night schedule.

"This has been a nice run," said Gavin MacLeod, who stars as the skipper. "I'm grateful to the show. Nine years of steady work, seeing the world. It's awesome when you see the unemployment among actors."

It sounds as though he's giving a eulogy, but MacLeod says he's not thinking about a funeral, despite very low ratings for "The Love Boat" this season. It had been a ratings winner for much of its life that began in September 1977, but it ranks 54th after eight weeks of the 1985-86 season.

"We got an early start filming this season because of the cruise to Portugal, Spain and Egypt," he said. The show completed production for the year in early November. "That was a great pleasure because Jean Stapleton and Valerie Harper were along. (Harper and MacLeod starred together on the old "Mary Tyler Moore Show.") I haven't seen Valerie since Rhoda's wedding. We took a steamer up the Nile to Luxor and Karmak.

"There were so many ruins. We

had to pinch ourselves. In Hollywood we're so used to seeing fake things on the back lots. We had to keep reminding ourselves that this was 5,000 years before Christ. We've been so many places: Australia, Fiji, Japan, Hong Kong, China, Scandinavia, Russia, France, Italy, Turkey, Germany. You know one place we haven't gone? Hawaii."

"The Love Boat" has changed the face of the cruise business. The popularity of cruises has increased enormously since the show began. It made tours look enormously appealing. Every show has a happy ending, and the food and the scenery are displayed as attractively as possible.

"I think when life gets heavy, people look for an escape," said MacLeod. "We're an escape. We have happy endings. You don't see many of those around. I think it gives people a vicarious adventure. We're also very much like a travelogue."

MacLeod went to "The Love Boat" from "The Mary Tyler Moore Show" with virtually no time to catch his breath. He spent seven years on that classic show as news writer Murray Slaughter. Every regular member of the cast from "Mary" appeared on "The Love Boat" except Miss Moore and Ed

Asner.

Until "The Mary Tyler Moore Show," MacLeod was an unknown character actor. He was in such movies as "Operation Petticoat," "The Sand Pebbles," and "Kelly's Heroes." He played Happy for two seasons of "McHale's Navy" and had guest roles on "The Untouchables" and "Hawaii Five-0."

It was Miss Moore's show that allowed people to put the name and face together. He earned a reputation as a good comic actor. But MacLeod had never played a romantic role before. So, he was in his mid-40s when love began to bloom on "The Love Boat." Not every week, of course. The captain has to run the ship once in a while. But often enough to make it interesting.

"It's great," he said. "I tried to do a softshoe with Ginger Rogers. How many people get to do that? That's right in my book of memories. I've played with some of the great old stars. I've had romances. If I had one wish it's that this could happen to every actor."

"After playing character roles for many years it's a big adjustment. I fell into it. It was like a reward for all those years of knocking around. It's nice. They have an average-looking guy with me and people can relate to that."

Walters' got 51 percent of the anti-interview vote, followed by CBS' Mike Wallace, at 20 percent, ABC's Sam Donaldson (13) and ABC's Ted Koppel (11).

Female viewers polled chose "Magnum P.I.'s" Tom Selleck as the sexiest man on TV, with 38 percent of the vote. Don Johnson of "Miami Vice" got 14 percent to finish second.

Linda Evans of "Dynasty" with 16 percent of the vote, was named sexiest woman on TV, followed by "Dynasty's" Joan Collins (11), "Moonlighting's" Cybill Shepherd (7), "Dallas' Victoria Principal (6) and "Dynasty's" Heather Locklear (4).

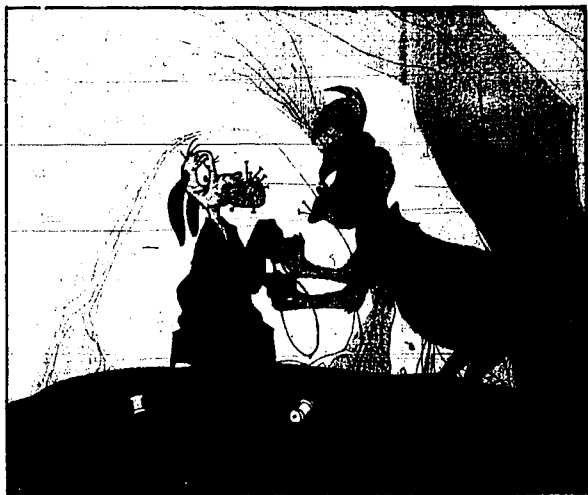

## NBC signs unlikely team: Boy George will join Mr. T

WASHINGTON — From our One Step Forward, Two Steps Back file: NBC's faltering "The A-Team" has signed Boy George for a February episode in which he promises to sing a couple of numbers.

"The A-Team" has slipped from sixth place last season to 17th place so far this fall but showed a revival recently when wrestler Hulk Hogan made an appearance, apparently suggesting the guest-star route was the one to take.

And still poking around our One Step Forward, Two Steps back file: ABC will bring back "The Fall Guy" — which did absolutely nothing for the Thursday schedule earlier this fall — to do absolutely nothing for the Saturday schedule as of Nov. 30,

replacing "Hollywood Beat" in the 8 p.m. time slot.

"Beat" reportedly will remain in production.

It is more and more evident that NBC's new magazine show, "American Almanac," will not make an appearance as a weekly show in January after all and that March is a more likely target.

NBC News president Larry Grossman said last week that "we're looking for a terrific time slot" and that after discussions with NBC Entertainment president Brandon Tartikoff "it will all depend on other program switches" that won't show up until after the first of the year.

The one-hour program has made monthly appearances since August on different nights and is due to air Saturday at 10 p.m.



# Raymond Burr is back in court with the return of 'Perry Mason'

HOLLYWOOD — "Here, take this, would you?" Raymond Burr asked, holding out a tissue box.

But as his visitor reached for it, the burly actor abruptly let go, allowing the box to fall to the floor.

In a bit of histrionics worthy of Perry Mason, the quintessential TV lawyer he portrayed for nine years, Burr was demonstrating why he would not consider doing another television series.

"If you're giving something to someone, unless you hand it over all the way, you're not really giving it to them," he said.

And at 68, the former star of "Perry Mason" and "Ironside" says he does not have the strength to give as much as a series demands.

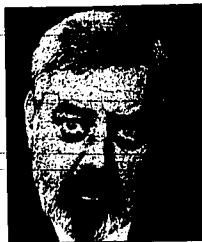
"I'm in the best health I've been in 20 years, but I don't think I'd be alive after three years (of a series)," he said during a recent visit here. "I'm serious. If you want to be a success, you've got to lead the other people around."

That is not to say, however, that he would not play Perry Mason again. In fact, he has. Burr is reunited with Barbara Hale, who played Della Street, the lawyer's loyal secretary, in "The Return of Perry Mason," a two-hour TV movie that NBC plans to broadcast Dec. 1.

"I had always wanted to do a two-hour 'Perry Mason,'" Burr said. "It gave us an opportunity to do all sorts of things we'd never been able to do before. We had to capsule so much in an hour; we never did one of Erle's (Stanley Gardner) books properly. He filled them with multiple clues and wandering pathways. We had to throw out a lot of that, and we couldn't do the sort of character delineation that we would have liked."

The movie, coming 19 years after the series ended its run on CBS, finds Mason as an appellate court judge who is called back to the other side of the bench when Della is accused of murdering the wealthy industrialist for whom she has been working. Mason discovers there are eight other people who had a motive for killing the man. His investigation leads, naturally, to a courtroom confession by the guilty party.

Aiding in the detective work is Paul Drake Jr., son of Mason's former personal gumshoe, who is said to have passed on (William

Hopper, who played Drake in the original series, died in 1970). The younger Drake is portrayed by William Katt, the former star of "The Greatest American Hero" and the real-life son of Hale.

Burr, grown heavy and gray but still possessing that distinctive, commanding voice, said he thoroughly enjoyed making the film, which was shot in his native Canada earlier this year. He deemed the script by co-executive producer Dean Hargrove "masterful" — it's just like one of Erle's books," and said the production team was first-rate. But he was especially delighted to work with Hale again.

"I tell you, when you have as much affection as I do for Barbara ...

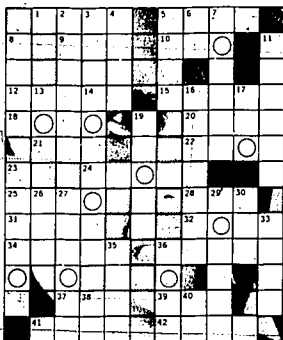

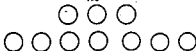

Well, you don't often get a chance to knock off 20 years of your life," he said. "It was just like we'd finished working the day before and started right up again. It was that easy."

During the long run of "Perry Mason," Burr and Hale often whiled away the time plotting practical jokes, and Burr said his reputation preceded him to the Canadian location for the new film. So he came up with a twist.

"I kept everyone on pins and needles until the last moment of the last scene of the last day. I let everybody's imagination run wild with what might happen," he said. And? "My big practical joke on this one was that I did nothing!"

"Perry Mason" ran on CBS from 1957 to 1966 and has been running in syndication ever since, testament to its status as television's most successful lawyer series. Burr overcame being too closely identified with the character by quickly segueing to "Ironside," where he played a wheelchair-bound police detective from 1967 to 1975.

But "Perry Mason" lived on, and not always to acclaim. Over the years, many attorneys have blasted it for giving the public a faulty view of what happens in a courtroom, conditioning future jurors to expect that someone would break down on the witness stand and confess to the crime, an act that rarely happens.

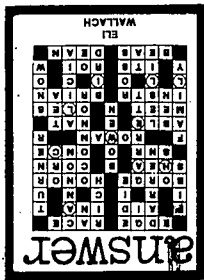
Burr dismisses much of the criticism as grandstanding by publicity-hungry lawyers. "I'm not particularly unhappy with anything we did on 'Mason,'" he said, "because every bit of it was within the framework of what could happen in a court in the county of Los Angeles or the state of California."

He noted that Gardner had been a lawyer himself, and added that when Gardner was not available to advise on a legal procedure or courtroom machination, Burr would consult with a group of six judges he knew. "If even one of them said yes, that was something he would allow in his courtroom, we went ahead and did it," the actor said.

On balance, he said, he believes "Perry Mason" and TV's other

lawyers have had a much more positive than negative impact by educating the public about the legal process and creating interest in the legal profession.
