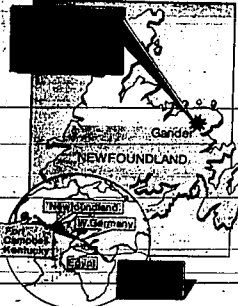

258 U.S. soldiers die in jet crash

GANDER, Newfoundland — A DC-8 charter carrying U.S. soldiers returning from the Middle East crashed on takeoff and exploded Thursday near Gander International Airport, killing all 258 aboard and scattering gifts and weapons across snow-covered woods.

Tragedy shatters yule fete

FORT CAMPBELL, Ky. — A homecoming celebration Thursday for 250 soldiers was shattered by the crash of a chartered DC-8 jet in Canada, leaving friends and relatives hoping that their loved one was on another flight.

"Right now, the assets of Fort Campbell are geared for one thing, helping the families," said Maj. James Gleisberg, a public information officer at the base.

No next-of-kin had been officially notified, he said, because a roster of the victims had not been compiled. Once that is done, it could take up two days to notify all families, he said.

By midday more than 200 people crowded a gymnasium where a gala welcome had been planned for the members of the 3rd Battalion, 502nd Infantry of the 101st Airborne Division, Air Assault.

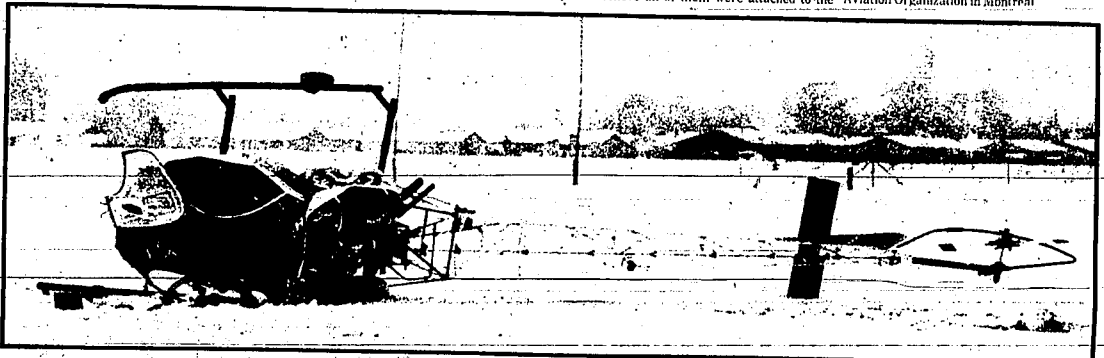
Through its history of combat in World War II and Vietnam, the division had never suffered more deaths in one day, military historians said.

All flags on the base, which straddles the Tennessee-Kentucky line, were ordered to half-staff. The governors of the states extended their sympathies to the families, and ordered all government flags lowered.

Some relatives, Gleisberg said, hoped their loved ones had missed the fatal flight because another detachment of the unit is scheduled to return next week.

Crash wrecks helicopter, 2 ranchers walk away

KIMBERLY — Two well-known area ranchers, Peter Link, 43, of Hansen, and Dan Kinsey, 39, of Kimberly, were able to walk away from a crash that demolished Link's helicopter late Thursday afternoon, southeast of Kimberly.

Link, who was piloting the craft, was hospitalized "with multiple fractures of one arm, and face and head lacerations. Hospital officials said Thursday night that he was in fair condition and undergoing surgery.

"I'm sure Kinsey had to help Link. He is in pretty rough shape," Munn said. "He (Link)

was lucky he could get over the open field before they went down." Kersey said from his home Thursday night that he felt very lucky to have escaped without injury although he was shaken up. He said he had quite a while to contemplate his fate and he thought about not surviving as he watched the ground coming at him at a good rate of speed.

"We hit the ground awfully hard; Peter did a hell of a job flying that helicopter," Kersey said. He said when the power died, Link quickly pulled the craft around and maneuvered away from powerlines below them. Kersey, who pilots fixed wing aircraft, credited Link's skill in reaching an open field with saving their lives. He said his friend was in "pretty bad shape" and took a tremendous shock from the impact.

Munn said the helicopter took off about 4 p.m. from a hangar on the property of Jack Wright, north of Kimberly, where Link stored the craft.

"He got out about a mile south of Kimberly and lost power in the engines," Munn said. "He managed to get past the power lines and over the center of the field on the Dan Shewmaker place before it went down. He apparently lost all control when the power went out. In my opinion, it's a total loss."

The sheriff said he had not talked to the pilot, but apparently Link knew he was going down for several minutes before the helicopter crashed. It lost the rotor, the blade and the glass cover when it hit the ground.

The Twin Falls Sheriff's office received a report of the crash late Thursday afternoon. Pete Lazaros, owner of AVI Inc., an aviation business at the Twin Falls-Sun Valley Regional Airport, said Link asked him to help get the helicopter started Thursday afternoon.

Link went to the hangar on a light cart and he and Larry Speakes started the helicopter. After working for a short time, they were heated up the engine and although it was very cold and difficult to start, they managed to start it.

get it going. Lazaros said Link wanted to take Kinsey for a ride. "When we got it started, I loaded up my battery cart and came back to my shop. A little later I heard the helicopter had crashed," Lazaros added.

He was unable to say what might have caused the crash, adding it's hard to determine if the cold temperatures had anything to do with it.

The helicopter, a Bell model 47-G, was an excellent machine, Lazaros said, adding it was a three-seat, turbo-charged craft and had a lot of power. Link used it in his farming and ranching operations, Lazaros said.

Munn said he had no idea the value of the helicopter. "The crash was reported to the Federal Aviation Administration, which may make a further investigation. Many people were left in the field Thursday night and their insurance company can move it, Munn said.

Stopgap funding measure zips through; White House pushes tax overhaul revival

Reagan signs debt measure

WASHINGTON — Congress, unable to agree on a multi-billion dollar funding measure for the full fiscal year, whisked through a stopgap bill Thursday needed to avert many federal agencies' shutdown.

At the same time, administration officials reported progress in their efforts to forge Republican lawmakers into approving proposals for major overhaul of the tax

laws — the top item on President Reagan's second-term domestic agenda. Even so, clearly in sight, House and Senate Rep. Richard Gephardt, D-Mo., told negotiators also made headway on a compromise long-term farm bill, and labor on a measure to cut federal deficits by as much as \$80 billion over the next three years.

Senate negotiators voted 8-2 to accept an administration proposal for a major farm bill, beginning annual production control programs by mandatory production controls designed to control supply and force prices upward. But the vote would be the only advisory and would not actually trigger such a program.

A compromise bailout for the Farm Credit System also was on a short list of year-end legislation. In other action taken during the day, the Senate confirmed former Indiana Gov. Otis Bowen as secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services.

WASHINGTON — President Reagan signed legislation Thursday raising the national debt limit above \$2 trillion and mandating an end to federal budget deficits by fiscal 1991.

"The tough work of controlling federal spending still lies ahead," the president said in a statement accompanying the signing.

But from hearings for NATO foreign military aid to negotiations on Capitol Hill over dairy price support, there were signs that the trouble already had begun.

House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr., D-Mass., called the unprecedented budget plan "a take and a fraud" — adding it would hurt defense while "it murders the poor of the nation." Soon after Reagan signed the measure, Rep. Mike Synar, D-Okla., filed bill in U.S. District Court challenging the constitutionality of provision for automatic spending cuts.

Farm bill negotiators plow through grain provisions

WASHINGTON — Bypassed by an agreement on a multi-billion dollar funding measure for the full fiscal year, whisked through a stopgap bill Thursday needed to avert many federal agencies' shutdown.

Site Control efforts continue.

MURPHY (AP) — Although rebuffed by the 3rd District Court in their efforts to regulate the site's only hazardous waste site, Owyhee County officials have not dropped their campaign to bring the EnviroSafe Services of Idaho facility under local control. Prosecuting Attorney Clayton Andersen said the county will file an appeal within the week of Judge George Reinhardt's decision voiding the county's two-year-old inspection and waste-fee ordinance. In ruling on the challenge filed by EnviroSafe 15 months ago, Reinhardt effectively held that adoption of a state hazardous waste management law preempted local regulation in that area. Handling in the balance is an estimated \$500,000 in waste disposal fees collected by the county from EnviroSafe since the ordinance took effect in January 1984 and the interest earned on that money over the past two years.

Leavitt said likely to kill again

BLACKFOOT (AP) — A psychologist has testified that convicted murderer Richard Leavitt will likely kill again if he is allowed to return to society. Idaho Falls psychologist David Groberg, the only witness at Thursday's sentencing hearing before 7th District Judge H. Reynolds George, said Leavitt has "an intermittent explosive personality disorder that causes uncontrollable rage." After examining the 29-year-old man, Groberg said Leavitt was "a dangerous person and should not be allowed back in society because he's liable to commit the same acts he's committed before."

Walters reappointed chief judge

BOISE (AP) — Idaho Supreme Court Chief Justice Charles Donaldson has reappointed Judge Jesse R. Walters to a third two-year term as chief judge of the Court of Appeals. Judge Walters has worked diligently to make the Court of Appeals an effective and respected institution of our judiciary, Donaldson said in a prepared statement accompanying the announcement Thursday. "Most recently, he has led the Court of Appeals in a successful effort to reduce appellate delay." Walters, 47, has served as chief judge of the Court of Appeals since its inception in 1982. He previously was a judge in the 4th Judicial District, and had been administrative judge in the district.

Nampa mayor defendant in suit

CALDWELL (AP) — Nampa Mayor Winston Goering has been named as a defendant in a damage suit filed by the parents of an Elmore County child injured at a water slide partly owned by Goering. The suit filed in 3rd District Court in Caldwell by Dennis and Donna Smith seeks \$80,000 in damages plus compensation for past and future medical expenses incurred by their 13-year-old child. Also named as defendants were Goering's wife Margaret, and William and Anke Hall, co-owners of the recreational facility.

Idaho boy to have treatment

DETROIT (AP) — The parents of a 9-year-old cancer-stricken boy who had sought treatment for him in Mexico have agreed to allow an Ann Arbor hospital to administer conventional medicine, officials said Thursday. Wayne County Juvenile Court Referee Patricia Campbell approved releases Thursday allowing Brian Lanphar to receive chemotherapy and other treatment for leukemia at the University of Michigan's Mott Children's Hospital. The boy's parents, Bill and Susan Lanphar, had been named in legal actions in both Idaho and Detroit seeking to force conventional treatment for the sick child.

Bonneville County quits liability pool

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Apparently concerned over prospects that the plan may fail has prompted Bonneville County to pull out of the Idaho Association of Counties' self-insurance liability pool. Commissioner Cliff Long said the association provided the county with inadequate information on the so-called "pool" and he believed it would be too great a risk to cancel the pool. Long said the county's current policy, set to expire next March 31, has a good chance of being renewed in the spring and at a cheaper rate than the association has quoted. The county commission invoked a provision of the agreement it signed last month with the Association of Counties giving it up to 30 days to drop out of the pool. With the move, Bonneville County becomes one of only five counties not part of the new pool program.

developed on short notice to fill the void created when major liability insurers decided to terminate their coverage in Idaho several months ago. Only court action has resulted in coverage continuing through the end of this month. Except for Ada County, which has obtained coverage similar to that offered by the pool, the other counties, like Bonneville, have policies that run into the spring and those officials said they intend to re-assess membership in the pool at that time. The Association of Idaho Cities is also setting up a liability insurance pool to provide coverage for other units of local government. Long said that if Bonneville dropped its current coverage to join the pool, it runs the risk of paying a penalty and higher premiums if it is ultimately forced to seek private insurance coverage in the future. He also complained that while the pool is supposed to be in place by Jan. 1, the county association has yet to provide firm estimates of the premium cost. "We had no cost figures, so we decided to go with what we've got," he said.

PUC to hear cogeneration rate rebuttal

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Public Utilities Commission will hear a rebuttal from Idaho Power Co. Monday on how much the company should pay for power produced by cogenerators. Idaho Power has asked in two earlier hearings that it be allowed to pay 1.4 cents per kilowatt hour for electricity generated by independent producers. The company is required to purchase independently produced power under the 1978 National Energy Act, which also requires the PUC to set the rates.

When Idaho Power applied for the decrease last January, the rate for new 35-year contracts was 6.2 cents for each kilowatt hour delivered. The commission has temporarily lowered the rate to 4.42 cents per kilowatt hour. Commission staff members have recommended the company pay 5.3 cents per kilowatt hour for 35-year contracts. They argue that the company can provide electricity through 1994 and cogeneration will offset the need for a new coal-fired plant.

Indictment names computer firm

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — The Paradyne Corp., eight of the computer company's present or former officials and one Social Security official were indicted Thursday on charges they conspired to win a \$15-million contract with the Social Security Administration.

The 14-count, 45-page indictment alleged conspiracy to defraud, bribery, false statements, perjury and obstruction of justice to win the five-year-old contract to computerize Social Security's field offices.

The contract was the largest ever awarded by Social Security.

Prosecutors accused Paradyne of faking a computer demonstration during the bidding process by showing equipment that was neither fully developed nor Paradyne's. When Paradyne couldn't develop the computer in time for the demonstration, it used one manufactured by another company but presented it as its own, the prosecutors said.

U.S. Attorney Robert Merkle said the indictment alleges that company didn't have the equipment it

Static shortens Sakharov's call

NEWTON, Mass. (AP) — Static cut short a telephone call Thursday between dissident Soviet physicist Andrei Sakharov and his wife, Yelena Bonner, when she tried to tell him he was being filmed by hidden cameras, her daughter said.

Her daughter, Tatyana Yankelevich, contended the interruption was deliberate.

Mrs. Yankelevich said the two reassured each other about their health during their first conversation since Mrs. Bonner left the Soviet Union to seek treatment of heart and eye ailments in the West.

Prosecutor requested

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attorney General Edwin Meese III was formally asked by the House Judiciary Committee on Thursday to seek a special prosecutor to investigate under the Ethics in Government Act possible wrongdoing by Reagan administration officials in a dispute over "Superfund" documents.

Committee Chairman Peter W. Rodino, D-N.J., wrote Meese that a special prosecutor "officially called live up to them fully."

An independent counsel is the law requires Meese to determine especially in this case, "whether he should conduct a preliminary inquiry."

Actress Anne Baxter dies

NEW YORK (AP) — Anne Baxter, who played a two-faced schemer in "All About Eve" and won an Academy Award as a pitiable drunk in "The Razor's Edge," died Thursday of a cerebral hemorrhage. She was 62 and had been acting on stage, screen and television for 49 years.

Miss Baxter had been starring in the weekly television series, "Hotel." The show's producer, Aaron Spelling, said earlier this week that she would not be replaced.

The actress collapsed Dec. 4 while walking on Madison Avenue and was admitted to Lenox Hill Hospital, where she died at 10:50 a.m. Thursday without ever regaining consciousness, her lawyer, Henry A. Perles, announced.

Miss Baxter, whose home was in Easton, Conn., is survived by three daughters.

No funeral was planned. Memorial services will be held in New York and Los Angeles at times to be announced, Perles said.

Pilgrims throng to shrine

MEXICO CITY (AP) — They came on their knees, in rickety buses, in processions marching to tattered trumpets — tens of thousands of pilgrims gathering to renew their faith where the Virgin is said to have appeared to a peasant 400 years ago.

The Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Dec. 12, is special every year in this predominantly Roman Catholic country, but this one has extra meaning. Many of the supplicants prayed to Mexico's patron saint for friends or relatives among the 7,000 people killed in September's great earthquake.

There was a festival atmosphere at the Basilica of Guadalupe on the city's north side despite the somber nature of some of the prayers.

Contadora halts peace talks

CARTAGENA, Colombia (AP) — The Contadora group has suspended negotiations on a peace agreement for Central America for five months at Nicaragua's request, Colombia's foreign minister said Saturday.

Nicaragua officially proposed the suspension on grounds that new governments which take office in Guatemala and Honduras in January and in Costa Rica in April could change policy toward the negotiations, the Colombia foreign minister, Augusto Ramirez Ocampo, told The Associated Press.

Hijack suspect faces court

VALLETTA, Malta (AP) — A Palestinian believed to be the sole surviving hijacker of the Egyptian jetliner left his hospital bed Thursday and was charged in court with causing the deaths of two passengers, an American and an Israeli.

A Maltese court arraigned Omar Mohammed Ali Rezaq on 16 charges. Rezaq, looking pale and wearing a dark suit, stood while police superintendent Charles Bonello read the charges. They were translated from Maltese into Arabic for Rezaq, who pleaded innocent.

Shultz warns NATO of cuts

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — The foreign ministers adopted a cooperation agreement on weapons procurement in an effort to cut costs.

Secretary of State George P. Shultz told NATO allies Thursday they may get less financial help with their military programs because of pressure to cut up to \$20 billion from the U.S. defense budget.

Alliance officials have espoused the "label" for years of sharing weapons systems, which would save money by avoiding duplication in design and production.

Shultz told the alliance's 15 other foreign ministers at a closed first session of their annual year-end meeting that defense spending will undergo special scrutiny because of the budget deficit, conference sources said.

The ideal has made made little headway against pressure from national armaments industries and the preference of military officers for weapons made in their own countries.

An elated John Robinson stood against a stone wall in the bowels of Candlestick Park last Monday night trying to explain what his Los Angeles Rams had just done. They had defeated San Francisco 49ers after an awful beating in New Orleans the previous week that Robinson called "the most shocking of my career."

"You can't explain New Orleans," he said. "It's just something that happened. How do you explain the Dallas game?"

Retail sales in modest November rebound

WASHINGTON—Retail sales rebounded slightly in November from their record fall the month before, but the modest 1.1 percent increase still left doubts among many analysts about just how good a Christmas merchants can expect this year.

The Commerce Department reported Thursday that sales climbed to \$115.9 billion last month, an increase of \$1.9 billion over the depressed October level.

Sales had fallen 4.2 percent in October, the biggest monthly decline on record, as car sales plummeted by 17.2 percent after dealers stopped most of the cut-rate financing incentives which had spurred a frenzy of car buying in August and September.

In November, auto sales rose a slight 0.9 percent to a seasonally adjusted monthly figure of \$24.8 billion, for a total of \$257.7 billion in cars sold during September.

Without autos, total retail sales rose 1.2 percent last month, the best gain since a 2 percent April increase.

Gains in the non-auto category were led by a 1.3 percent increase in department store sales, following a weaker 0.3 percent October rise.

Sales were also up 2.3 percent at restaurants and bars and 1.4 percent at grocery stores, but they fell 0.5 percent at furniture stores and 0.4 percent at electronics.

With Americans holding a record amount of personal debt, many analysts have expressed fears that consumer spending will show little strength in the months ahead. Since consumer spending accounts for almost two-thirds of overall economic activity, these analysts believe the economy as a whole will be lackluster in coming months.

However, the Reagan administration said the November sales gain was pointing to the stronger economic growth it believes is on the horizon.

"Nearly every category of the economy continues its strong performance," said a presidential spokesman Larry Speakes. "We look forward to second-half growth in the gross national product in the 5 percent range and we expect 1986 GDP growth of 4 percent."

While the economy grew at a 4.3 percent rate in the third quarter, many analysts are looking for growth in coming months to be only about half that pace, in large part because of expected weak consumer spending.

"We are getting an increasing amount of evidence that the consumer is not going to be driving the economy in coming months," said Sandra Shaber, senior economist at Chase Econometrics, a private forecasting firm. "We are in for a period of fairly anemic growth in consumer spending."

Consumers are likely to benefit from the sluggish sales as retailers discount inventory before Christmas, analysts said. Ms. Shaber said this

price-cutting was "already taking place," but she said the discounts were likely to be smaller than last year because retailers have kept inventories lower.

She predicted that Christmas sales, after discounting for inflation, would rise by about 4 percent this year from the 1984 level. This would be down from the 5 percent gain recorded last year and the 7 percent increase in 1983.

While some of the country's giant retail chains are reporting brisker-than-expected "sales" since Thanksgiving, many analysts said the weak economic growth this year and record-high consumer debt burden would likely hold sales gains back.

"I think the consumer will continue spending but it may be sluggish for awhile," he said.

GE labels RCA purchase 'strategic fit'

NEW YORK (AP)—General Electric Co.'s proposed \$9.2-billion purchase of RCA Corp. represents "an excellent strategic fit," but it is too early to say whether GE will sell off any RCA assets, GE's chairman said Thursday.

However, John F. Welch Jr. said he did not expect the merger to run afoul of federal antitrust rules that would force GE to sell assets in order to win government approval of the deal.

"We have all the confidence in the world that this merger violates no guidelines and will in fact be approved in a speedy and effective manner," Welch said at a news conference.

RCA Chairman Thornton F. Bradshaw, meanwhile, said he would step down once the merger was completed, probably in late 1985, but that he would remain a GE consultant for three years.

And the New York Stock Exchange said it launched an investigation into the surge in the price and trading of RCA's stock prior to the merger announcement Wednesday night. RCA's stock soared \$10.37 a share to \$63.50 Wednesday.

In late trading Thursday, however, RCA's stock skidded \$4.12 to a share to \$59.37, it continued heavy

trading as some investors apparently decided to take profits rather than wait for the merger to be completed in a year. GE's stock was off 25 cents at \$67.62.

The NYSE routinely reviews the trading of stocks involved in subsequent merger proposals in an attempt to find out whether any of the trading stemmed from actions such as trading on "inside information," or the use of information about a company not available to the public. Such trading is a federal crime.

In-citing the RCA surge—the exchange said it was "concerned about this kind of market activity" and that once its review was finished, it might take disciplinary action itself

or turn its findings over to the Securities and Exchange Commission.

The proposed merger calls for GE to pay \$65.50 cash for each of RCA's 94.4 million shares. It would be the largest non-oll corporate marriage in U.S. history and produce a company with annual revenue of \$40 billion.

The deal was approved by both companies' directors, but remains subject to approval by RCA's stockholders and regulators, including the Federal Communications Commission, which must approve the transfer of broadcast licenses.

'Nutcracker' brings Christmas dream to life

American Festival Ballet, kids perform

TWIN FALLS — On its way to becoming an annual tradition in the Magic Valley, the American Festival Ballet's performance of "The Nutcracker" will be performed in the College of Southern Idaho Fine Arts Auditorium Dec. 18 at 8 p.m.

Sponsored by the Twin Falls Bank & Trust and the downtown Business Improvement District, the holiday favorite will include 37 young Magic Valley dancers who have been rehearsing under the direction of Beverly Hackney.

"The Nutcracker" is a familiar and tender story of a dreamed-about first love and its fragile blossoming. Clara, the young teenage daughter of Frau and Herr Silverhaus, is introduced to a dashing young cadet, a friend of her brother, at her family's Christmas party.

The handsome boy, who has secretly admired Clara from afar, brings her a bouquet of winter roses, then invites Clara to dance. They lead their young friends in a merry march.

Clara's godfather — a man of mysterious powers — arrives at the party with fabulous life-sized dolls to amuse the guests. And for Clara, his favorite goddaughter, he presents a special gift — a beautiful nutcracker.

The nutcracker, which gets broken, then mended, becomes the fulcrum of the ballet when later the guests are gone. Clara rises from bed and hops to the living room to fetch it.

From this point in the story until the last scene, the audience is taken into a dreamscape filled with surrealistic figures and delightful fantasy featuring the Nutcracker Prince, the Sugar Plum Fairy and the sinister Evil Rat King.

Dancing the dual roles of Clara and the Sugar Plum Fairy will be Monica Mudgett, an accomplished singer, actress and dancer who has also performed with the Cincinnati and San Diego Opera companies, and has played in musical comedies including "Oklahoma" and "Music Man" for the Starlight Opera Productions of San Diego.

Performing with Mudgett will be her husband, Duncan Vere Schute, who is the principal male dancer for the American Festival Ballet. Schute, the son of an American diplomatic consul, was born in Europe and began his dance training in Italy, where he met and worked with Rudolf Nureyev. Nureyev later coached Schute in his first major role in "Swan Lake" for the Norwegian Opera Ballet.

"I was extremely fortunate to have Nureyev take me to some of his rehearsals and to have him become a family friend," says Schute. "His work and coaching have become especially helpful to me in developing my partnering work for pas de deux. I consider him of the new-old school of partnering that brings the male dancer out of the shadow of the ballerina, and yet keeps the male attentive to the needs of the female dancer."

Upon leaving the Norwegian Opera Ballet, Schute joined the Ballet de la Jeunesse in Montreal and then returned to the U.S. to work with the San Diego Ballet. There he met and married Mudgett, and together they have performed many of the world's classic pas de deux roles, including those from "Le Corsaire," "Swan Lake," "Spring Waters," "Midsummer Night's Dream," and "The Nutcracker."

Adding strong credentials to the American Festival

Ballet is artistic director Marius Zirra. A native of Rumania, Zirra became artistic director of the company in May 1984. His background has been in teaching, performing and choreographing throughout Europe and on tour to four continents.

Having begun his career by studying in the Soviet Union under master teacher Alexander Pashkin, Zirra himself is now considered a master teacher. Before emigrating to the U.S. in 1976, Zirra was ballet master of the Bucharest Ballet, then rose to artistic director of the Brasov Ballet and the Isztet Ballet in Rumania, and the Klagenfurt Ballet in Austria. He was also Ballet Master for the Rumanian Gymnastics Team in Bucharest.

"The element of surprise is important for ballet," he says. "Ballet must not be just pretty to look at. It must be something the audience remembers, thinks about, even argues about. Then they will want to come back. Communication is what art is all about."

"My greatest pleasure," says Zirra, "is in bringing

life to new audiences through dance, and to share my dreams with dancers."

Locally, Beverly Hackney has been working with 37 Magic Valley youth who were chosen by audition out of approximately 100 eager dancers. She says the participants this year will have the benefit of an afternoon rehearsal with Zirra, then a full-dress rehearsal with the entire troupe — a luxury they didn't have last season.

Hackney points out that working with professionals is a fine opportunity for the youngsters, who range in age from five to 15. "I think it helps them become a little more serious about what they're doing. It helps to develop confidence and poise, and it sharpens their minds because they know they're on stage with professionals," she says.

'Ol' Blue Eyes turns 70 at the top

Looking back, probably over his shoulder, singing in his inimitable style, Frank Sinatra could insist that more often than not it was a very good year. There are a pair of them now, turbulent and rewarding, yet no one has come along to wrest away his title as the padrone of American popular song — the greatest singer and interpreter in the history of that vast reservoir of sophistication defined by such names as Porter, Rodgers, Berlin, Van Heusen; Mercer, Cahn, Kern and the Gershwins.

Still 'king of the hill'

An amount of fractious biography can undercut the remarkable artistry that has consumed Francis Albert Sinatra for the past half-century. He would be the first to say that he has had his share of "compatriots." But if we judge him by his art — which is as good a standard as any, and the one he would prefer — then Sinatra, who turned 70 Thursday, remains the master, the king of the hill, the top of the heap, as sensitive to the nuances of a lyric today as he was in his youth.

Sinatra's musical instincts, in sharp contrast to his social skills, have always been astounding. When you come down to it, he doesn't just interpret his best songs; he assumes them, absorbs their implications, seeks out the universal in lyrics to an astounding array of craftsmen, personalizes them and hands them back renewed. Sinatra never needed to write songs, he just needed to find them to inhabit. When he was finished they were his. So were audiences around the world,

who rightly perceive him as one of the most powerful entertainers of the last five decades, one whose influence has extended well beyond his music.

He has sung often enough about the end of an affair, but this is one love match that continues; it's true that the hobbysevers, his first fans, tended to celebrate mass hysteria rather than real musical accomplishment. But, like the Beatles, Sinatra grew into his art. And for the most part, he's maintained the faith, singing well and singing long, working in and sustaining a gloried idiom whose history and worth have been virtually denied by the tyranny of youth marketing.

As time goes by, new generations

may have a hard time understanding what the fuss is all about. They tend to read about one Sinatra, the public boor and bully who has become a permanent news item, when they should be listening to another Sinatra, the classic singer who gave words worth-it's fascinating that in recent years artists as disparate as Linda Ronstadt, Kirtie Kanawa and Barry Manilow have all paid homage with clumsy repetitions of Sinatra's Capitol Records-era sound, assuming the protective charisma without ever touching his style of approaching his charisma.

Of course, how we remember Sinatra has a lot to do with our vantage point in time and the importance we place on art over personality. Those who came to Sinatra in his two periods of grace — the last days with Dorsey and the subsequent solo career in the '40s or the triumphant renewal in the mid-'50s and early '60s — don't see the current Sinatra, tuxedo-clad, graying, thicker in body than he is in voice. They look at him and see the bow-tied, hollow-cheeked youngster, a bony baritone engulfed in wide-shouldered suits; or the savant singer with the rufal con snapper that pushed back, he loosened,

trench coat slung over the shoulder, an embodiment of the romantic cynic.

And in that trick of cultural memory so basic to nostalgia and so important to art, what we see is what we hear — The Voice, forever young. We are enveloped in Sinatra's natural, conversational manner, his masterful phrasing, his evocation of uncluttered emotions, all of it getting under our skin. All the dissonance of Sinatra's life can be resolved in that voice, contact dissolves doubts. He was a great communicator before you know who, and now when we see him, it's with all those contradictory strings attached and pulled.

What's been most astounding is Sinatra's artistic survival. We don't expect athletes to last into middle age, but we expect singers not only to go on forever, but to reinvent themselves constantly in contemporary contexts.

The length of Sinatra's career has forced him into many reinventions, and he's made painful accommodations at times. But all in all, he managed to remain remarkably constant in the rapidly changing environment of popular music.

"Asked to define his own popularity, he says, 'Sometimes I grapple with that. I think, though, that it's because I've never competed with anyone but myself. I had no model but when I had one, I was copying. I'm always working on something I haven't done before.'"

"Obviously, that daring-to-seek attitude has always been with the Merv Griffin Show. By age five, he says his interest in magic had fully emerged and he had already begun to develop his skills. By age ten, after studying the adult psychology section of the Caldwell, N.J., literary, he began booking himself in community events, banquets and parties while continuing to hone his performing skills.

Later, setting aside his youthful career, Kreskin entered Seton Hall University to pursue a degree in psychology. But before reaching that degree, he was booked on the Merv Griffin Show. He has since returned to Seton Hall to receive an honorary doctorate of letters.

Kreskin does admit to suffering from one Achilles' heel, and that is the portion of his show where he must find his check which is always hidden somewhere on the premises. If he fails to find the check, his fee is forfeited. That has happened to him nine times.

"No one's talking to me during that 'find-it' time," he says. "I have to find it on my own. It's like I'm being drawn." Kreskin notes that it is a very trying part of his show in which he has had to locate his check in places as exotic as under a toupee, in a man's wooden leg and in the stuffing of a turkey.

"I came back from New Zealand unpaid," he says. "That one cost me \$51,000. It's nerve wracking. I've learned that if I ever fall again that part of my show will be dropped."

Even though he is best known as an entertainer, Kreskin doesn't shy from controversy. Concerning psychiatry, he says, "I don't think we know that much about human behavior. Everyday, I have greater respect for the human mind and less and less for psychiatry. I think we've been unfair to used car salesmen. I put psychiatrists several levels under them."

Nationally, he has taken a stand against hypnotism, claiming there is no evidence of any kind of hypnotic trance or state. Further, his testimony as an expert witness has discredited testimony given by declarants under hypnosis.

"During the second half of my show in Twin Falls, I'm going to show that people can be influenced

without being in a hypnotic trance," he says, adding that he will influence people without saying anything. Tickets, \$6.50 adults, \$3.25 children, are available at Pennywise Drug Pharmacy or by calling American Cancer Society area director Kathy Williams at 734-4416, or any ACS volunteer. According to Williams — if advance demand warrants, an earlier show will be scheduled prior to the confirmed one at 8 p.m. Proceeds will benefit the American Cancer Society.

So the movie plods along by explaining how Santa's red suit was born—"Green's just not his color," suggests Santa Claus. The Wife, how the list of who's naughty and

vice came to be, and so forth. The reindeer are able to fly, for example, after they're fed with whatever glitter director Jeannot Szwarc hasn't already splashed on the screen (and there can't be much left).

The story then meanders along, as Santa gets stressed out and names

an assistant, Patch (Dudley Moore), who turns the North Pole into an assembly line. Apparently, someone forgot to leave "In Search of Excellence" under his tree, because soon enough the Pole is turning out defective toys. Santa gives Patch his pink slip, but it seems that pink's not his color, because he decides to ditch the Pole and look for a new job. Fully an hour into the movie, the plot-kicks in: Patch ties in with an unscrupulous toy manufacturer (John Lithgow), and Santa Claus: The Consumer Group must come to the rescue.

The script, by David and Leslie Newman), in other words, is a kind of miracle of botched construction, although that's not the worst thing about it: Instead of trying to get inside the Christmas myth, the Newmans just tard the story with scraps of contemporary life and call

it "updated." The \$30 million that producers Alexander and Ilya Salkind—reputedly invested in the movie was presumably spent on the fleets of planes that used to tow "Santa Claus" signs over Cannes, advertising the "coming spectacle," because it certainly doesn't show in the production. The aerial photography that provides the backdrop for Santa's flying sleigh, for example, looks awfully like it's been recycled from the Salkinds' "Superman" series.

Moore has become a kind of toy himself, and one on nobody's Christmas list. Even the usually reliable Lithgow isn't any good in the central role in his characterization of a tycoon seems to be sucking elaborately on a large cigar. "The people don't want to wait a year for you—they want a sequel," he thunders. On no they don't.

'Better Off Dead' sees adolescence from inside

BETTER OFF DEAD (PG). When a teen-ager, love is a comedy of errors, an itching in your heart that you just cannot scratch. This goofy adolescent angst is what fuels "Better Off Dead," an inventive, odd-ball gem that takes the teen-comedy genre of the endangered species list. Marking the debut of

25-year-old writer-director Savage Steve Holland, the movie shows off a nutty visual imagination that lovingly re-creates all of the worst traumas of teen life.

COMMANDO (R). With blimps the size of watermelons and shoulders broad enough to bridge a small river, Col. John "Marine" Matrix (Arnold Schwarzenegger) looks like a Marvel Comics hero sprung to life. He is the Incredible Hollywood Hulk, and a perfect fit for this slam-bang adventure fantasy. Full of spectacular stunts and shoot-outs, it is a gory crowd pleaser, directed with jolting efficiency by low-budget veteran Mark L. Lester. It is also the beneficiary of the spunky presence of

Race Dawn Chong. It is also the kind of movie that does not need a director; it needs a munitions expert. There is nothing even vaguely

heroic (much less believable) about Paul Kersey (Charles Bronson), our architect turned avenging angel, for the third time. He is a sad, pathetic soul whose grisly public executions only put his friends in mortal danger and provoke more rapes, murder and

ROCKY IV (PG). Elephantine vacuousness is the shape of the new "Rocky," which is bigger, squishier, slower, more preposterous and infinitely emptier than the earlier three. Filled with contempt for everything Russian, and centering around a match between Rocky and a blond Soviet giant pumped with steroids, the film flip-flops at the last second, allowing hope for change in individuals of the two countries, while saying in its other 98 percent that the Soviets are simplistic animals worthy only of our contempt.

SANTA CLAUS: THE MOVIE (PG). A multimillion-dollar fairale, in the spirit of the old Disney classics, that tries to persuade us of the reality of Santa Claus, his elves and the North Pole

and, thanks to screenwriter David Newman, very nearly does. (He has a harder time convincing us about Manhattan, the U.S. Senate and modern TV.) John Lithgow (as a sneeringly evil toy manufacturer) and Dudley Moore (a go-getting elf) are good, but director Jeannot Szwarc's approach is too flat and functional to imbue the movie with wonder.

TO LIVE AND DIE IN L.A. (R). A terse, blistering cop movie of chic trappings and devilish grace. This is William Friedkin's return to the mean streets; and, making it, he seems reborn, matching "The French Connection's" thrills and at times in the wrong-way car chase) surpassing them. Perhaps a bit shallow, lurid or overly bloody, the movie's saving graces are its formidable professionalism, its avoidance of even disguised sentimentality and the top-notch camerawork and editing by Robby Muller and Bud Smith.

'Rocky IV' tops box office summit

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Ronald Reagan and Mikhail Gorbachev are long gone from Geneva, but the superpowers are set to meet on the big screen with Sylvester Stallone's "Rocky IV" at the top of the box office summit.

With the Chevy Chase-Dan Aykroyd comedy "Spies Like Us" at No. 2 and the Miltos Bryslikos-A Gregory Hines drama "White Nights" at No. 3, the top films this past weekend are set against the backdrop of U.S.-Soviet relations. The latest "Rocky," pitting Rocky Balboa against a hulking Russian boxer, grossed \$11.2 million over the weekend to increase its two-week total to \$48.1 million. "Spies Like Us," which sends Chase and Aykroyd into the Soviet Union as a couple of bumbling spies, brought in \$8.6 million on its debut. "White Nights," about a Soviet defector who finds himself trapped in his homeland and the Soviet Union, grossed \$4.5 million for a total of \$6 million in its third week. "Santa-Claus—The Movie" was fourth at \$3.1 million, and "Young Sherlock Holmes" debuted in fifth place with \$2.5 million. "One Magic Christmas" and "King Solomon's Mines" rounded out the weekend leaders.

Playboy to appear in Turkey

ISTANBUL, Turkey (AP) — Playboy will begin publishing "Playboy Turkey" next week, the first edition of the magazine to be distributed in an Islamic country, said chief editor Ali Saydam.

Although the American version of Playboy was banned in this country in the late 1960s on the grounds that it was pornographic, the Supreme Court ruled a decade later that nudity was not pornography.

"Although 98 percent of Turkey's 32 million people are Moslem, the Turkish state is secular and has completely Western laws. This is the most important assurance for us in our venture," said Saydam, 39.

Saydam told The Associated Press that 150,000 copies of the magazine's first edition have been published and would be on news stands by Dec. 20. The price of the magazine is equivalent to \$2.66.

Saydam estimated normal circulation will be around 70,000 to 80,000, about 30,000 of which would be sold in West Germany and other European countries with large Turkish populations.

Playboy Turkey is the fifth monthly to start in the men's magazine market here, which until recently had been served only by Erkekce (Manly) and Bravo, with a combined circulation of around 200,000.

At the end of November, the powerful Hurriyet group launched the Turkish version of Italian Playmen, and Milliyet came out with Godde Kadim (Favorite Woman).

PBS features Friedrich's 'Falstaff'

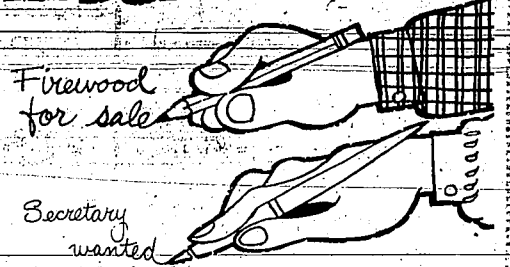

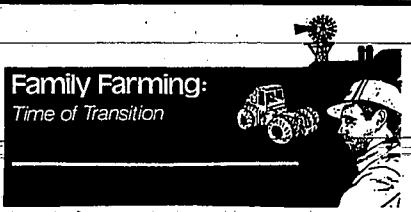

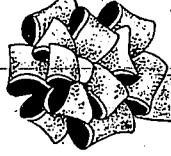

Hip, offbeat detective comedy finally makes a winner of ABC

By ANDREW J. EDELSTEIN

ABC has a new and much-needed bit series. It's the quirky detective comedy called "Moonlighting."

The show has revived the faltering career of Cybill Shepherd and established a taciturn former bartender named Bruce Willis as a tabloid cover boy.

On the surface, "Moonlighting" seems like all those other male-female detective team shows. Just another "Remington Steele" and "Scarecrow and Mrs. King" or so it seemed. Both parties are attractive and there's always a hint of romance flashing between them. But there is much more going on.

Maddie Hayes (Miss Shepherd) is a former wealthy model who was swindled by her crooked business manager. Among the only investments left was a detective agency run by a wisecracking guy named David Addison (Willis). David asks Maddie to join him and thus their unholy alliance was formed.

"Moonlighting" had a six-episode run last spring and received some credible reviews. Its audience increased during the summer reruns, setting the stage for its addition to ABC's fall schedule. Since September, the series has con-

sistently defeated its competition, the CBS movie and NBC's faltering action-adventure series "Riptide."

Miss Shepherd, who was given up for lost following a promising start in the early '70s, has let her latent comedic talents bloom. In "Moonlighting," she tries to make Maddie appear like a no-nonsense executive, but ends up being more like a parody of same. She often scolds David the way a school teacher might chide Beaver Cleaver.

Meanwhile, David Addison is one of TV's more offbeat creations. He is a fast-talking welsenhelmer with a penchant for old Motown songs who

appears to be about 33 but who tends to act more like a 15-year-old.

In one episode, appalled by his behavior, which includes him leading the entire office staff in dancing the limbo, Maddie makes a bet with him that he can't act mature for a week. "Shake," she says, extending her hand. David takes her literally and gyrates his body.

Very little is taken seriously on the show — especially the car chase, that staple of detective drama; and especially of ABC series: One episode had a car chase during a funeral procession; the funeral march was set to a disco beat. Another time, prior to the beginning of a chase sequence, David announced "this is the chase."

Car chases are — thankfully — a minor part of the show. In fact, there is more dialogue on the series than in any other prime-time series.

Each script runs about 90 pages instead of the typical 50 or 60 for a one-hour series. The show has taken risks; one memorable episode, a film-noir parody, was shot mostly in black-and-white and was introduced by the late Orson Welles.

"Moonlighting" is the season's "Miami Vice" — hip, stylized and still on the cutting edge.

Texas preacher's daughter lets hair down, lands role in drama

Robyn Bernard has chutzpah, charm and a wry sense of humor. As Terry Brock on "General Hospital," she has gone through several major character transformations. In her offstage life, many of those changes have been paralleled.

"When I first began working on 'G.H.'—I was supposed to be a New York City socialite," she laughs, letting her Texas drawl out. "Can you imagine that?" Later they gave Terry a Southern background. "Thank God, all I could do was elongate my vowels and hope."

Robyn has a very "Texas" background. Her father is a preacher, and the family recorded gospel albums in Houston. Sort of a "Gospel Osmond" family keeping the church as a focal point in their lives.

"We used to make Nativity scenes each Christmas that would win awards. All year, the family would bead costumes. We'd cover our lawn with sheets and soap shavings. All the figures were leftover mannequins from local stores. Tons of people would stop by and take a look," she pauses chuckling.

"Then one night there was this huge storm. The winds had been so bad, they tore the clothes off the Virgin Mary. There she was, with just a red slip, stripped to the waist! You know how realistic they make those dummies."

Not unlike many children who are raised in a strict religious family, Robyn let loose in college. "I was homecoming queen in high school. Miss Goody Two Shoes. If you're a preacher's daughter, you're supposed to be an example. When I got to college I didn't want to be just good, I also wanted to be popular. I sent articles about me to the school paper," she continued with a wry grin. "Isn't it terrible! But they published them. I didn't give my name as the author."

So instead of being the reverend's

prim little girl, she became a wild party animal at Baylor University.

"I was bitter about all the pressure that had been put upon me. So I walked the other side. I have to admit it didn't do much for my grades. So after a couple semesters I quit and went to Nashville."



'Cosby,' 'Monday Night Football' set records; NBC claims victory

NEW YORK — A record-high rating for "The Cosby Show" spurred NBC to another weekly victory, but the best-ever performance for "Monday Night Football" couldn't keep ABC out of third place again, figures from the A.C. Nielsen Co. showed Tuesday.

"The Cosby Show," this season's runaway top-rated series, topped itself with a 36.2 rating, the highest for any regular series episode since CBS' "Dallas" achieved a 36.4 in January 1981. A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million homes with television, and "The Cosby Show" was turned on in 31.1 million of those households, according to Nielsen.

The "Monday Night Football" game, in which the Miami Dolphins handed the Chicago Bears their first defeat of the season, drew a 29.6 rating, the highest in 16 seasons of prime-time football. The previous record was the 28.8 rating recorded by a Dallas-Washington game in 1978.

Ratings for "Monday Night Football" are up 20 percent over last year. Network researchers credit better match-ups and close games. But there may have been too much football Sunday when, after an afternoon of NFL games on CBS and NBC, ABC broadcast an additional prime-time game. The Pittsburgh-San Diego match-up finished 49th with a 13.2 rating.

Besides Cosby and the Bears' national hero, William "The Refrigerator" Perry, that old actor, Ronald Reagan, also proved himself a ratings draw as CBS' "All Star Party for Dutch Reagan" ranked ninth. President Reagan was nicknamed "Dutch" during his Hollywood movie days.

For the week of Dec. 2-8, NBC won for the seventh time in the 11-week-old prime-time season, recording an average rating of 16.9 to CBS' 16.3 and ABC's 14.4. Season to date, NBC has a 17.8 to CBS' 16.9 and ABC's 15.9.

NBC and CBS each had nine of the top 20 shows. ABC only had "Monday Night Football" and "Dynasty." In last week's Top 10, it was "The Cosby Show," NBC's "Family Ties," and "Monday Night Football,"

followed by CBS' "60 Minutes," NBC's "Cheers," NBC's "Miami Vice," "Dallas," ABC's "Dynasty," "All Star Party for Dutch Reagan" and NBC's "Highway to Heaven." "The Cosby Show" worked its magic on NBC's entire night. Each of the network's Thursday shows finished in the Top 20. In addition to "Family Ties" and "Cheers," "Night Court" was 11th, and "Hill Street Blues," 20th.

NBC won the week despite a poor performance by its three-hour movie, "John & Yoko: A Love Story," which ranked 48th with a 13.4 rating. The film's second and third hours competed against the Bears-Dolphins game.

"The movie was a disappointment," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice president for special projects. "The Beatles have never done well on TV. The only time they did well was on 'The Ed Sullivan Show' in the '60s when they really were the Beatles." Jaffe said the group's movie, "Yellow Submarine," also was a TV bomb.

Another music-filled film, CBS' "Copacabana," with original songs from Barry Manilow, fared even worse, finishing 53rd among 70 shows.

"Copacabana" was a real departure. It was a reprise of the '1940s musical," said Dave Poltrick, CBS' vice president for research. "Obviously, it did not capture the imagination of the American public. Traditionally, the network musicals were the variety shows, but they slowly disappeared as they continued to decline in performance. This was an attempt to try something different, and it didn't work."

The bottom five shows, in descending order, were the "CBS Saturday Night Movie" — "Victor Victoria," CBS' "George Burns Comedy Week," ABC's "Ripley's Believe It or Not," ABC's "Shadow Chasers" and ABC's "Our Family Honor."

In the evening news competition, the "CBS Evening News" was first with a 14.1 rating. "NBC Nightly News" had a 12.5 and ABC's "World News Tonight" averaged a 12.4.

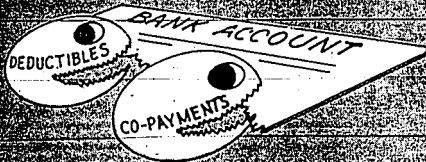

Like sand through the hourglass, 20 years have passed for 'Days'

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. — Like sand through the hourglass, 20 years have slipped by for the soap opera "Days of Our Lives," the enduring saga of the Horton family that is credited with turning around daytime ratings for NBC.

"Days of Our Lives" made its debut on Nov. 8, 1965. Lyndon Johnson was in the White House, NBC's "Bonanza" was the most popular television program, and the anti-Vietnam War movement was just gaining momentum.

The cast and crew of the daytime drama, some of whom have been aboard for all 20 years, put aside the accumulated love affairs, feuds, acrimony and intrigue to mark the occasion Friday with a Christmas party.

"I remember (producer) Ted Corday called me and said he had a show," said Macdonald Carey, who as Dr. Tom Horton is one of three performers to stay the distance. The others are Frances Reid, who plays his wife, and John Clarke, who plays his son.

"I was out of work," Carey said. "I couldn't get any movies. Ted said, 'You may have to stay as much as 12 years.' I've stayed 20. It's great security when you have six children."

Al Rubin, supervising executive producer, said the success of the show pivots on romance, first and always.

"There's no question that the love story is the foundation of the show's existence," Rubin said. "Every time we get off the track, the audience is quick to let us know that they watch for the emotional stories."



Independents giving networks more static than cable television

ANAHEIM, Calif. — Media watchers who think cable TV is the biggest thorn in the sides of ABC, CBS and NBC, think again: It is the independent commercial stations that are poised to better their network counterparts.

Local network affiliates, meanwhile, will schedule so much of their own programming that they, too, will start to resemble independents.

Or so the Independents and the suppliers of their programs apparently think.

Greg Nathanson, outgoing vice president and programmer-at-independent Los Angeles station KTLA, and Richard Frank, president of Motion Pictures and Television for Walt Disney Pictures, described just such a scenario of network decline last week before an audience at the Western Cable Television Show here.

"This country will no longer have three networks; it will have five or six groups," Nathanson said, referring to the "owned-and-operated" stations normally

associated with the three major networks. Peering no more than five years into the future, Nathanson predicted that stations owned by Rupert Murdoch and those that will be in the Tribune group, pending the sale of KTLA, would compete on equal footing with the handful of stations that ABC, CBS and NBC each own outright.

Meanwhile, the three networks' affiliates "will knock unsuccessful affiliate shows off the air," Nathanson said, replacing them with programs of their own choosing.

If it does indeed happen, it "will come about by more and more product being made available to the local stations," said Frank, who made it clear that Disney and the other major studios are ready and willing to supply it.

Frank, tossing an unabashed compliment in the direction of NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff, seated at the opposite end of the dais, noted that while "it's great to sell a series order to a network... it's no longer essential to a studio for its lifeblood." Like Nathanson, Frank predicted that the networks would become mere "electronic program suppliers" that "will not schedule in the local markets."

Whether by coincidence or kind-ness, the California Cable Television Association, which sponsored the three-day trade show that ended Friday, found in Tartikoff a panelist not overly fearful at this time of affiliate desertion.

during the just-ended November ratings "sweeps" period — its first such win since 1974 — and it won the March sweeps as well.

"If you've got good programs — a 'Dynasty,' a '60 Minutes' or a 'Cosby' — you don't have any clearance problems," Tartikoff said, clearance being TV jargon for a station's committing to broadcasting a particular show.

Tartikoff said NBC's viewing levels are up 35 percent on Saturday night, a traditionally low viewing period. The other two networks are up on that night as well. The reason in both cases, he said, is the NBC show "The Golden Girls," which seemingly has put viewers back in the TV-viewing habit on that night.

With that line of reasoning, Tartikoff and his panelists were on fairly common ground — the notion that the delivery source is not nearly as important as the viewing material itself. "Viewers in all markets share common desire — they want good programs and they don't care where they get them," said Frank.

But it is the availability of those programs from so many sources that seems to be at the center of the entire television industry's concern. Those sources include pay-cable TV, represented on the panel by Jules Haimovitz, president of the enter-

tainment division of Viacom International, and home video cassettes, in the person of Troy Cooper, executive vice president of National Video.

Though the panel, titled "Home TV: Competition for Viewing Time," was conducted good-naturedly and was perhaps even low-key, the presence of the five speakers sharply illustrated the various forces tugging at the viewer.

The exception was Frank, who was introduced as "the man with all the marbles" — and perhaps for that reason, he was the most outspoken. He called pay-TV a "me-too, pale reflection of network TV" and exhorted its programmers to come up with something more creative.

None of this should have come as too much of a surprise to the cable industry. This was the third major gathering in two weeks during which the movie studios have made thinly veiled overtures to cable regarding the latter's need for their product, high-priced though it may be.

Only recently, at the Western Show's keynote session, Ted Turner, soon-to-be owner of MGM, told cable operators to sell more ads so they would have more revenue to invest in original programming.

At the recent Awards for Cable Excellence luncheon, Jack Valent, president of the Motion Picture Association of America, gave cable

programmers essentially the same message.

Frank, likewise, urged the cable audience to "take your money and invest in good programming."

If anyone would have to be characterized as "the enemy" on this particular panel, it would have been Cooper, whose videocassette industry has put the hardest-felt dent into all other forms of TV viewing.

But the videocassette business, he said, has somewhat larger concerns on its mind. "I'm not competing just for TV viewing hours but with leisure-time activities: sports, games, books hobbies," he said.

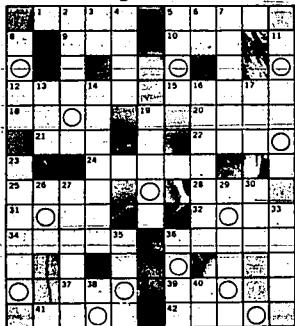

'Mary': Haven't we seen it before?

NEW YORK (AP) — "Who can turn the world on with a smile? Who can take a nothing-day and suddenly make it all seem worthwhile?"

From 1970 to 1977, the answer to those theme song questions was Mary Tyler Moore, and CBS is hoping to catch her magic all over again with her new comedy, "Mary." If that happens, the second-place network feels it might overtake NBC in the prime-time ratings race.

"Mary" is a sharply written comedy with a capable ensemble of actors. Miss Moore's Mary-Brenner is more confident, more chic, less naive and less smarmy than Mary Richards, and she's certainly no dizzy Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman. Again, Mary is the dependable hub around which the bent spokes of the world revolve.

The main reservation, and it's a serious one, is that the new show played it, too safe. Instead of a TV news producer, Miss Moore is a consumer-help columnist. She's still single, divorced, instead of unmarried, and there are no kids in sight. The locales are a newsroom filled

with loonies and a bachelor apartment with a neurotic, female friend next door.

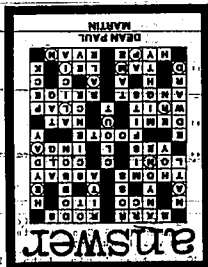
If that all sounds familiar, it is. It's as if the creators, Ken Levine and David Isaacs from "M-A-S-H" and "Cheers," felt locked into "Mare," as best-pal Rhoda used to say, and merely updated her for the 1980s. Despite some witty repartee and classy humor, there's the uneasy feeling that we've seen this before.

James Farentino, best known for dramatic roles on TV, perfectly plays the savvy, sassy, sexy managing editor. He and Mary immediately strike up a charged relationship that appears headed for "Item" status; much different from the one Mary Richards had with father-confessor Lou Grant (Ed Asner).

Other office characters include a legally blind copy editor (David Byrd) who isn't funny, the pompously fatuous drama critic (John Astin) who is broadly drawn, and a cynical, chain-smoking columnist (Katey Sagal), who is a great '70s and balloon-burster for Mary and her

rosy outlook: "You're not going to keep little stuffed Care Bears on your desk, are you?"

"Mary" has a lot going for it, but it must not play on old loyalties too long if the Mary from the 1970s is going "to make it after all" in 1985-86.
