Poor management cost billions, GAO says

WASHINGTON — The federal government lost billions of dollars this year because of poor management in virtually every major agency, the General Accounting Office concludes.

In a year-end report card that credits the administration with good intentions but poor follow-through, the GAO found significant breakdowns in weapons procurement, Social Security administration, property management and almost every other governmental-function-involving large sums of

money. Although each department has pledged improvements, the GAO said, "the major problems so far remain largely unchanged."

"Widespread and often longstanding weaknesses and breakdowns in agency internal controls continue to result in wasteful spending, poor management and losses involving billions of dollars of federal funds," Charles A. Bowsher, comptroller general and head of the GAO, wrote in a letter presiding over the report to Congress. "The weaknesses have also made outright fraud more feasible."

The GAO, Congress' investigative arm,

examined 23 agencies that together spend more than 95 percent of the federal budget. It found that none of them has fully implemented the Federal Managers' Financial Integrity Act of 1982, which was meant to improve internal financial controls in federal bureaucracies and bring some consistency to the 427 separate accounting systems that they use. (The Defense Department alone uses 150.)

The Office of Management and Budget, which is responsible for implementing the act, responded to the GAO report by claiming "considerable progress" in implementation. Joseph R. Wright Jr., deputy OMB

director, said that improving financial management is a top administration objective but cautioned that the GAO's calls for closer monitoring of agency progress could backfire.

"We are concerned that complying with the GAO recommendations would impose an audit-oriented approach, require much more detailed testing and result in cumbersome reporting and even more paper work," Wright said in a Nov. 25 letter to Bowsher.

Many of the problems cited in the GAO report have been reported previously, either by the GAO or by inspectors general. Taken together, they portray a system with such

poor controls that it often cannot tell how much money is slipping away.

The Treasury Department's computer systems are vulnerable to accidental or intentional misuse, the GAO found. The result is "continued potential for fraudulent diversion of electronic funds transfers totaling billions of dollars."

The Veterans Administration wastes millions of dollars by failing to control medically unnecessary admissions, according to the 71-page report. In addition, the VA maintains such poor watch over drug supplies that "it was very difficult to determine

Idaho prison filled

BOISE — The Idaho prison system has surpassed the maximum number of inmates set earlier this year by the Board of Corrections and has imposed a waiting list for accepting prisoners from county jails.

Corrections Director Al Murphy said county sheriffs throughout the state were notified Thursday that the penitentiary system will no longer accept prisoners unless prior arrangements are made.

County officials who want to transfer an inmate to the state prison system will have to contact Ralph Newberg, who will oversee a waiting list for admitting prisoners.

Inmates will be admitted only after beds are made available by the release of other state prisoners — with two exceptions. Murphy said the prison will continue to accept death-row inmates and inmates who have escaped from county jails.

Murphy said he has held a telephone conference last week and voted against changing the 1,300 cap they imposed in October. Their next meeting is scheduled for Jan. 17.

Sen. Roger Fairchild, a Fruitland Republican who heads the Senate Judiciary and Rules Committee, said he thought the refusal to accept most county prisoners was premature.

Any action should have come after the Idaho Legislature had a chance to consider a proposal for a new state prison, Fairchild said.

He predicted the cap would be struck down by a district judge.

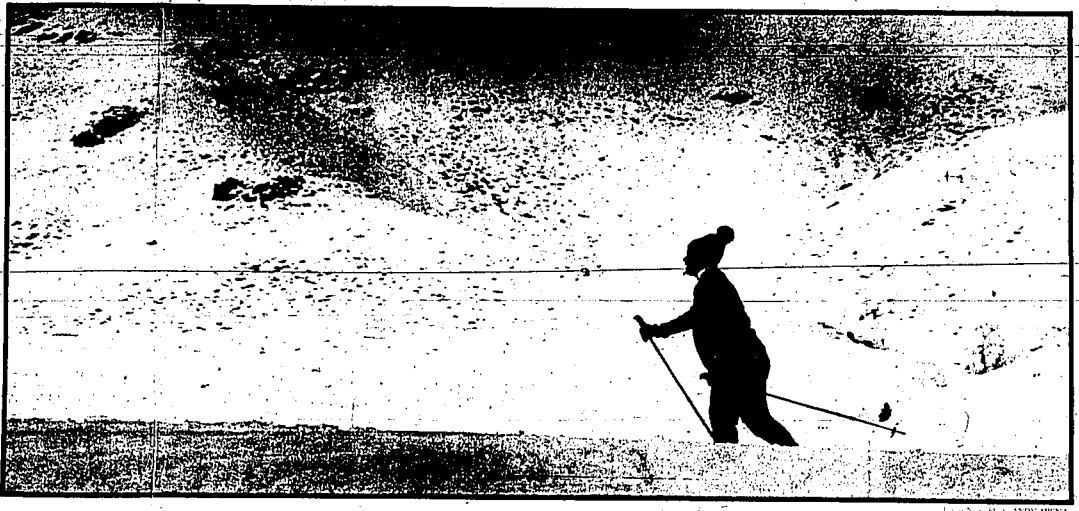
But Murphy said a prison cap recently was upheld in Virginia by a federal judge.

"When the cap was imposed, 'I said it was a publicity stunt,'" Fairchild said. "Now I guess they want to show us they're man enough not to back down."

Board member Wendell Miller, Idaho Falls, said if the board rescinded the cap, "we wouldn't have any place to put them (inmates)."

Murphy said the cap was reached late Christmas Eve. As of Thursday, there were 1,303 prisoners in the system.

Results reaffirm smoking hazards for babies as well as mothers

Test may unmask carcinogens in tobacco smoke

WASHINGTON — A new test demonstrating the link between smoking and genetic damage raises hopes for finding the components of cigarette smoke that cause cancer, scientists said Thursday.

The research involves radioactive testing of the placentas discharged after birth from women who had smoked during pregnancy. In the short term, the results appear to reaffirm the longstanding assumption that smoking is potentially hazardous to babies as well as their mothers.

It should eventually be possible to identify such a cancer-inducing chemical or chemicals, "maybe in a year, maybe three to five years," Randerath said.

And that would raise the possibility of blocking or removing such chemicals, "but that's far-fetched for now," he said in a telephone interview.

Mrs. Randerath said that while the key link between smoking and genetic damage has only been suspected, the new test provides "a direct demonstration" of such a tie.

That is important since the onset of cancer is thought to involve damage to DNA, as shown by the fact that many known cancer-causing chemicals produce certain changes — chemical addition products, or adducts — in experimental animals.

The new test shows "for the first time that cigarette smoke is associated with... a specific chemical-fault-in-DNA-of smokers that is absent in the DNA of non-smokers," Randerath said.

The trick now is to match the damage-revealing adduct they found in nearly all the tested women smokers to some chemical or mixture of chemicals in cigarette smoke.

The scientists have failed in early tests to find such a match. But they said that could merely mean the particular adduct they found is formed only in human or placental tissue or that it results from a smoke component not yet tested.

In the meantime, they said, finding a smoking-related adduct consistently showing DNA damage gives a crucial starting point for further research.

The new report, published in today's edition of the Journal of Science, was submitted by researchers from the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons and the University of North Carolina Medical School in addition to Baylor.

It said cigarette smoking has been well-established as "the major single known cause" of cancer deaths in the United States. And it added that tobacco smoke contains many substances that animal tests have shown cause cancer.

"But it is not clear which of the several thousand components of this complex mixture are responsible for human carcinogenesis," the report said.

As for the pregnant women themselves — and their offspring — the report said a separate recent study had indicated a relationship between DNA adducts in the placentas of animals exposed to various cancer-causing chemicals and adducts in many other organs in those animals.

Such findings, the researchers said, suggest that adducts found in smokers' placentas "will also be found in other maternal and fetal tissues and may be associated with initiation of malignancy or other adverse effects in the mother or her progeny."

Andrus plans final swing around state

Hold off announcing

BOISE — Former Idaho governor Cecil Andrus says he plans a final swing around Idaho before he commits himself to running for the governor's job again next year, but he's looking more and more like a candidate.

Andrus announced Thursday he has hired Marc Johnson, producer of public affairs television programs for Idaho's public broadcast system, to join his campaign, as news secretary.

Johnson will work through Citizens for Idaho, a political action committee formed in 1984 to support Democratic candidates.

Andrus is looking into the possibility of running for the Democratic nomination in next May's primary election. He probably will be matched against Lt. Gov. David Leroy, the only announced Republican candidate for governor.

Andrus said Thursday he's 97

percent certain he will be the Democratic candidate next year. But he wants to make one final swing around the state before "I leap into those really deep waters."

Andrus said his pre-campaign work indicates all the necessary elements for a successful campaign appear to be there, and it appears he will be able to raise the money needed.

He's been talking about a \$1 million campaign, he said Thursday, that still appears to be a realistic figure, although he personally finds the amount "obscene."

"I want to do the state in my own fashion," he said. "I want to test the political winds and my personal barometers to make up my mind," he said.

Former aide Larry Melrotto directs Citizens for Idaho, and Andrus has hired Sal Celeski and his Impact company of Boise for campaign work. Melrotto, who was a special assistant to Andrus when he was governor, went with Andrus to

the Interior Department when Andrus became Interior secretary under President Jimmy Carter.

Melrotto served as an assistant secretary for policy, budget and administration.

Johnson has been producer of "Idaho Reports" public affairs programs originated at KAID-TV in Boise. During legislative sessions, Johnson has produced and directed nightly telecasts from the Capitol on legislative action.

"He is very well-known to the people of Idaho, and is politically astute. He knows the state and the issues," said Andrus.

Johnson is expected to resign from the television station late next month to join Andrus on his swing around the state.

The former governor said he isn't ready to announce when he will formally launch his campaign.

"I don't want to tie down a date. I'm sure the people of Idaho don't need politicians beating on their

WASHINGTON — Investigations of federal college student aid and other Department of Education programs during a recent six-month period have recovered more than \$11.8 million in misused taxpayer dollars, the department reported Thursday.

The department's inspector general, who is responsible for monitoring for fraud, waste and abuse in department programs, said that the \$11.8 million was recovered from 17 million in investigations.

Cut-rate financing offers ignite new round of car sales war

DETROIT (AP) — General Motors Corp. opened a new round of auto pricing competition Thursday by announcing 7.9 percent financing on some cars and trucks, and Ford Motor Co. quickly followed with the same incentives.

GM, the No. 1 automaker and industry price leader, announced it would offer financing on roughly 40 percent of its cars. Ford announced a four-hour later that it would offer 7.9 percent financing on about 40 percent of its cars.

"Essentially, it is a competitive response to help us maintain our sales momentum," said John Seig, spokesman for No. 2 Ford.

GM sparked a cut-rate loan and rebate war in August and September, doubling domestic auto sales overnight. However, the automaker lost market share during the pricing war with other domestic automakers.

GM has been losing market share to Ford and Chrysler Corp. for more than a year. Its dealers have a 110-day backlog of unsold cars

compared with the desired level of 60 days, said Arvid Jouppi, an auto industry analyst in Detroit.

"The consumer has again indicated that he or she will not pay the current prices," Jouppi said. "The consumer is dictating to the manufacturer (the future of the market)."

"I think it means we're going to have this kind of marketing irregularities for the rest of the model year."

In the most recent sales reporting period, the first 10 days of December, GM reported up,

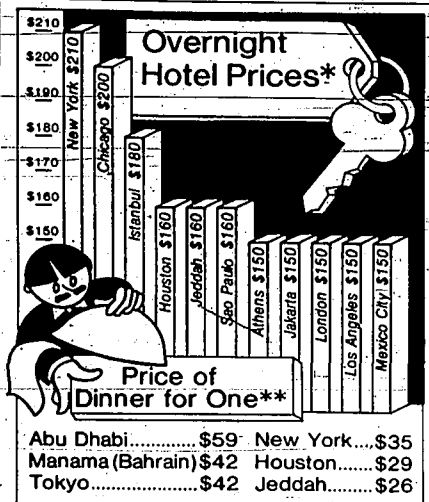
a 10.2 percent decline in sales from the same period in 1984, while Ford sales were down 18.1 percent and Chrysler sales were off 11.4 percent.

Chrysler, the No. 3 domestic automaker, has no plans to replace its current incentive program, which features 8.6 percent financing and rebates of \$500 to \$1,000 on some cars, said Chrysler spokesman B.F. Mullins.

"Nothing is planned; GM's just catching up," he said.

Both Ford and GM said the 7.9 percent rates would be offered on deliveries taken from existing inventories through Feb. 22.

"We expect this highly attractive 7.9 percent financing, together with the good stocks dealers have of most new 1986 GM cars and light trucks, to give GM a fast sales start in the New Year," said James G. Vorhes, vice president in charge of GM customer sales and service staff, said in a statement.

Researchers isolate growth gene in fly

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — Yale University biologists say they have discovered a gene that guides protein building in fruit flies and hope it will help them learn more about cell growth in humans.

Spyros — Artavanis-Tsakonas, associate professor of biology at Yale, said the fruit-fly gene produces a protein important to cell development with striking similarities to a substance known as Epidermal Growth Factor, or EGF, found in humans and mice.

EGF in humans and mice is composed of small protein molecules that stimulate cell growth and cell differentiation, much like hormones.

Artavanis-Tsakonas said in a statement released today. Scientists remain uncertain about how the process works, but studying the protein in fruit flies may provide answers, he said.

"Discovery of an EGF-like protein in a relatively simple organism such as the fruit fly has two important implications," Artavanis-Tsakonas said.

"First, it indicates that EGF must be an essential genetic building block because it has been carried almost intact from a common ancestor through eons of evolution into higher life forms."

"But more important, we now

have numerous avenues of research open to us to discover more about EGF and how it influences cell growth, thanks to the fruit fly's tremendous experimental assets."

Artavanis-Tsakonas presented his findings last week at the Pasteur Institute in Paris and is publishing results of his studies in the Dec. 30 issue of Cell magazine.

A harmless species of fruit fly called *Drosophila melanogaster* has interested biologists for decades, Artavanis-Tsakonas said. The insect is easy to keep alive in a laboratory and reproduces rapidly, qualities that make it an excellent research subject for scientists studying inheritance, he said.

Genetic mutations can be introduced easily into the fruit fly by exposing it to radiation, while its distinct genetic banding patterns enable scientists to "easily" locate specific genes on chromosome segments, Artavanis-Tsakonas said.

Artavanis-Tsakonas said he and his research team have focused for four years on the "Notch" gene, which determines which cells in the developing fly embryo become nervous system cells and which become skin cells.

Damaging the Notch gene can cause a cell destined to become skin tissue to become neural tissue, he said.

Hormonal treatment aids some

CHICAGO (AP) — A synthetic hormone appears to help delay or prevent a recurrence of breast cancer in some women who have had surgery for the disease, and without side effects associated with chemotherapy, a new study says.

But for breast cancer sufferers who have not reached menopause and therefore are not candidates for the hormone treatment, chemotherapy should be considered standard care even though it can cause nausea, vomiting, fatigue, hair loss, and a low white blood cell count, the study concluded.

Most of the 20,000 to 30,000 post-menopausal women develop breast cancer annually would be likely candidates for successful treatment with the synthetic hormone tamoxifen, said Allen Lichter, who participated in the study and is chairman of the Department of Radiation Therapy at the University of Michigan.

The study said the treatment does not work at all on pre-menopausal women.

"The conclusions, published in today's Journal of the American Medical Association, resulted from a review of breast cancer research and data at a conference sponsored by the National Institutes of Health in September.

"We've taken a small but significant step in helping women with breast cancer," said Lichter. "But there is a tremendous amount of work to be done."

He said the hormonal treatment has been successful in treating certain cases of breast cancer that has spread to the lymph nodes beneath the armpits.

"For breast cancer that has spread to the lymph nodes of pre-menopausal women, chemotherapy has been demonstrated as an effective means of helping prevent recurrence and of reducing deaths from the disease."

"Adjuvant (post-surgery) chemotherapy can now be considered standard care for these patients," the study said.

However, the benefits must be weighed against the side effects, which can be severe but can be lessened through treatment, the study said.

In 1985, breast cancer will have been diagnosed in about 120,000 women, both pre- and post-menopausal, the study said.

The data were reviewed and evaluated by a panel led by Dr. John H. Gilek of the University of Pennsylvania.

Poll says taxpayers have confidence in IRS

WASHINGTON (AP) — As income tax time draws near again, a newspaper's poll says that most taxpayers have confidence in the Internal Revenue Service to handle returns accurately but think tax forms are unnecessarily difficult.

The poll, conducted Dec. 5-11 by USA Today, surveyed 1,002 adults selected at random across the country. It was to be published in today's edition.

By a margin of 73 percent to 24 percent, taxpayers in the survey agreed the IRS processes tax returns quickly and accurately. By even higher margins, they expressed confidence in the ability of IRS to handle returns and inquiries promptly.

And 82 percent even think the expanded use by the IRS of new computers last year made the service more efficient, despite the fact that

millions of Americans had delays of several months in getting refund checks because of problems in switching to the new system.

Two of every three people surveyed thought the tax forms are unnecessarily difficult to understand and 66 percent said people who cheat on their taxes do so partly because the system is unclear.

The poll had a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percent.

Former Miami police officers arrested on cocaine charges

MIAMI (AP) — Two former Miami police officers were arrested Thursday and charged with stealing part of a half-ton cocaine seizure, bringing to 11 the number of officers arrested or relieved of duty this year in an internal probe of police corruption.

The two men arrested Thursday had been fired from the force earlier this year after they refused to take a test to determine whether they used drugs, Chief Clarence Dickson told reporters.

Nine other city police officers have been arrested or relieved of duty in 1985 following allegations ranging from drug use to stealing money from the police evidence safe.

Dickson said internal investigations of the 500-member force were ongoing, with the help of Profes-

sional Review and Investigative Detail (PRIDE), a group of 10 veteran officers formed last October to augment regular internal affairs officers.

"I think most of the damage has been done. They've gone underground. But we're going to dig them out," Dickson said of corruption. "There is less going on now because of the heat that is going on."

Dickson said the two men were arrested Thursday after department investigators found evidence that some 150 pounds of cocaine were missing from a 1,000-pound shipment.

On May 31, police seized 850 pounds from a boat docked at a Miami River marina, Dickson said. Police investigators soon began receiving in-

formation that "a significant part" of the shipment — another 150 pounds — was missing, Dickson said.

He declined to give further details of the case.

Former officers Felix A. Beruvides, 28, and Armando Lopez, 24, were charged with conspiracy to traffic cocaine, armed trafficking in cocaine, armed burglary and grand theft. The men, arrested at their homes, were in custody Thursday at the Metro-Dade County jail.

Beruvides, a five-year patrol veteran, was fired from the force in August after a citizen reported seeing him taking drugs at a local restaurant, said police spokesman Officer Reginald Roundtree. Roundtree said the firing came when Beruvides refused to take a urinalysis test following the citizen's complaint.

FBI role questioned in probe of Chicago parking contracts

CHICAGO (AP) — At least two aldermen were wined and dined by a notorious con man who apparently worked for the FBI in an Abscam-style probe into the awarding of lucrative city contracts, according to published reports.

Alderman Perry Hutchinson said he was offered a free trip to Las Vegas, Nev., by the reputed con man, whom he believed represented a company interested in a multimillion-dollar contract. Hutchinson said FBI agents told him they recorded his conversations with the man.

Bob Long, spokesman for the FBI's Chicago office, refused Thursday to confirm or deny the existence of an investigation. U.S. Attorney Anton Valukas also would not comment.

Hutchinson characterized the operation as "Abscam-style," a 1970s investigation in which FBI agents posed as associates of a sleek

seeking special favors from congressmen.

Hutchinson and alderman Wallace Davis alleged the investigation was a politically motivated attempt to set up Mayor Harold Washington's administration and his supporters in the City Council.

"(FBI agents) said they had FBI informants or government witnesses who set up some kind of Abscam sting for the black aldermen and ... Washington's administration," said Hutchinson, a supporter of Washington, who is a Democrat and Chicago's first black mayor.

"I think he (the alleged con man) was sent there to do something — to try and embarrass this administration," said Davis. "... You mean to tell me that if the government is corrupt, it's only black folks who are corrupt?"

At least one other alderman, Clifford Kelly, said he has been interviewed by FBI agents and another.

Marian Humes, said she was a target of the investigation and has hired an attorney to represent her.

But Alderman Danny Davis, one of Washington's floor leaders in the City Council, said, "I haven't been able to discern any trend in that direction."

According to the Chicago Tribune and Chicago Sun-Times, the investigation centers around a multimillion-dollar contract to collect delinquent parking tickets awarded to Datacom Systems Corp. after a heated battle in the City Council last year. Datacom's main competitor for the contract was Systematic Recovery Service Inc.

According to the Tribune, Michael Raymond, arrested previously in several securities schemes and a government informant in at least one other undercover operation, posed as a representative of Systematic Recovery.

Lund's chances slim for enduring illness

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — A week after becoming the first woman to receive an artificial heart implant, Mary Lund has shown little improvement and doctors said Thursday her chances of survival remained less than 50 percent.

Mrs. Lund, 40, remained in a light coma at Abbott Northwestern Hospital, where she was listed in "critical but stable condition," said Dr. Frederick Gobel, a spokesman for the implant team.

"Her neurological state since Wednesday is unchanged," Gobel said in a statement.

Mrs. Lund, who on Dec. 18 underwent an emergency operation after her heart was

destroyed by what doctors believe was a rare virus, was to undergo an electroencephalogram test to check on her brain function, Gobel said.

"Her condition appears to suggest the neurological deficit is reversible," he said.

Mrs. Lund, of Kensington, also underwent dialysis treatment for a fifth day Thursday to help her kidneys dispose of waste products and remove fluids from her body.

Although Mrs. Lund's kidneys have not improved as quickly as hoped since being weakened by her massive heart failure, doctors said none of her organs appeared to have been damaged irreversibly.

Flaming jet inspires panic

CHICAGO (AP) — Two passengers who saw flames shoot out of the engine of a DC-10 preparing to take off opened the jetliner's emergency exit and slid down an escape chute, a United Airlines spokesman said Thursday.

"The passengers overreacted and yelled 'Fire!'" said Joseph Hopkins, 37, who was on the plane. "The important thing was that no one was injured."

The flight, which originated in San Diego and was heading to Boston from Chicago, had 150 passengers.

Flames shot 15 feet into the air as the pilot revved up the engine for takeoff from O'Hare International Airport in a malfunction the airline called "looming" and which Hopkins compared to a car backfiring.

"It was unusual, but it certainly didn't warrant evacuation," said Hopkins.

168 die in crashes

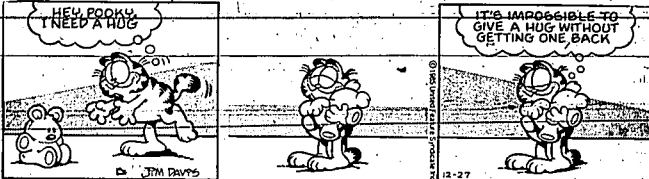

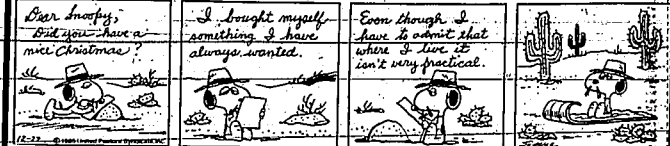

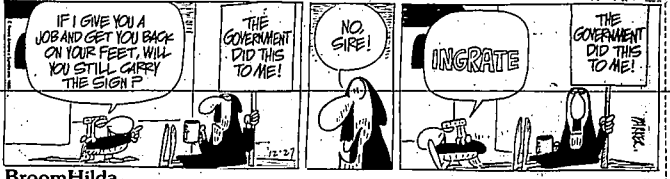

Zulu/Pondo fighting kills 53

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Fierce clashes between Zulu and Pondo tribesmen armed with shotguns and clubs left at least 53 black men dead near Durban, police said Thursday.

Meanwhile, police reported six black men had died in renewed outbreaks of political violence in 11 urban areas since Wednesday night.

Red Cross workers trucked 149 Zulu and one Pondo refugee from the Christmas Eve fighting between Zulus, members of South Africa's largest tribe, and Pondos, to a hall at the relief organization's headquarters in Durban.

Conflicting reports from the refugees said the fighting between 2,000 Zulus and 3,000 Pondos was triggered by a fight over a woman married to a member of the rival tribe, or disputes over land.

But some analysts say the underlying cause is

pressure for jobs among the increasing black population in South Africa.

Zulu refugee Colleen Gwala said hundreds of Zulus lined the north bank of the Umbogintwini River on the Umbumbulu tribal reservation, chanting, singing and calling out for the Pondos to come across and fight.

"They (the Zulus) then crossed the river" and fought into Wednesday, said Mrs. Gwala. "A lot of people have been killed and injured—trucks more than 53."

In Durban, police spokesman Lt. Bob Sanker said at least 53 people were dead and eight were known injured, but he said many more could be injured. He said the reservation, about 25 miles from Durban, was calm Thursday under heavy police patrol.

At least 92 blacks have been killed since Nov.

20 in tribal fighting in Natal province, where the homeland of the 6 million Zulus is located.

The Pondos, a subgroup of the second largest tribe, the Xhosa-speaking people, have been migrating for a decade from their nominally independent Transkei homeland to the Zulus' Kwa-Zulu homeland to seek work in Durban.

Kwa-Zulu has refused to accept independence under the white-led government's apartheid policy, which reserves 87 percent of South Africa for 6-million whites and divides the rest into 10 homelands for 24 million blacks.

Kwa-Zulu and Transkei are separated by a 31-mile-wide strip of white territory.

Lawrence Schlemmer, head of Natal University's social sciences department, said Thursday that Pondo migration had increased in recent years, although there were no accurate figures.

Mexican relics now in thieves' hands

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Thieves stole 140 ancient gold, jade and stone relics of the Aztec, Maya and other Indian civilizations from the National Museum of Anthropology and History when it was closed for Christmas, officials said Thursday.

A cultural official said that "the biggest plundering" of Mexico's archaeological heritage and said it was probably linked to the international trade in smuggled artifacts.

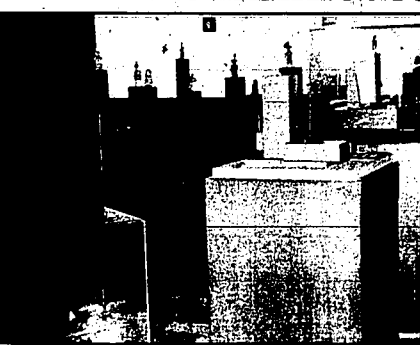
Among the objects listed as missing from seven showcases were almost all those on display from the sacred reservoir at the Mayan city of Chichen-Itza in the Yucatan peninsula, several Mayan and Aztec Palenque ruins in southern Mexico and priceless golden objects from the Mixtec Indians.

The exhibition halls of the museum, which opened in November 1964 in Chapultepec Park, are arranged in a U-shape around a large plaza topped by a massive, circular canopy that lowers above the roof and allows in air and light.

Details of how the robbers got in were not known, but speculation Thursday was that they had not entered from the roof, which is believed to be dotted with alarms, but rather from ground level. The outer grounds of the museum are separated only by trees and low fences from a main street and the park.

Malte Gardner, who was allowed inside the museum to take photographs for The Associated Press, said it appeared the thieves knew exactly what they were after and took almost everything inside the targeted display cases.

The Attorney General's Office said eight guards from the night shift were being interrogated, although they were not considered suspects.

Afternoon editions of the newspaper Excelsior reported Thursday that Mexico was seeking information from other countries where archaeological artifacts had been stolen.

Enrique Florescano, director of the National Institute of Anthropology and History, told reporters that officials had thought security was adequate at the museum, which is one of the city's major tourist attractions.

"Today, we proved in a terrible way that these measures were insufficient," he told a news conference Wednesday night.

There was no immediate estimate of the value of the stolen objects.

The showcases that housed the missing artifacts were located in the Maya, Mexica and Oaxaca exhibition

Etna's rumble still shakes nervous Sicily

CATANIA, Sicily (AP) — Lava stopped spewing Thursday from Mount Etna, but security forces remained on alert as earthquakes continued around Europe's most active volcano, officials said.

After a team of scientists inspected Mount Etna by helicopter, the Civil Defense Ministry released a statement saying that the lava had stopped pouring down the southeast side of the volcano early Thursday.

But three tremors rattled the area, the statement added. The most serious, measuring 4 on the Richter scale, struck at 3:34 a.m. State-run RAI television said the tremor sent hundreds of people fleeing from their homes.

The civil defense statement said the quakes caused only minor damage to some buildings, and said government inspectors were checking the buildings to determine if anyone should be evacuated.

"On the basis of past experience, with the eruptive behavior, the next two or three days are considered crucial," the statement said.

Giuseppe Luongo, a volcanologist, told RAI television there was reason to be concerned.

"We have not seen a reduction in the seismic activity. Therefore it is possible that another event of the same energy could happen," he said, referring to the strong quake that hit Wednesday.

Gorbachev speech book printed

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union has published leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev's first book of speeches, praised by the Communist Party daily Pravda as a definitive statement on his plans to revitalize the Soviet economy.

The first edition had a press run of 300,000. It is not certain how many copies went on sale in Moscow, but the capital's main political bookstore had none of the \$1.10 volumes left Thursday.

Soviet leaders traditionally publish collections of their speeches and writings, which are considered

London police storm flat, free girl

LONDON (AP) — Police rescued a 4-year-old girl Thursday when they stormed a West London apartment and shot the man who had been holding her hostage for 29 hours after stabbing her mother to death on Christmas Day.

Officers, hurling stun grenades and firing shots, forced their way in to the third-floor apartment of a public housing complex in Northolt after a man with a carving knife threatened to stab the girl, Scotland Yard said.

The girl, identified as Carlene Charles, was in satisfactory condition in a hospital Thursday night with stab wounds to her neck and arm.

An officer who spoke on condition he not be identified said the man had been holding the girl hostage since Wednesday morning, when her mother, Jackie Charles, 27, died of stab wounds. Earlier, a 6-year-old girl was rescued unharmed from the apartment.

Police commander Brian Sparks told a news conference a police marksman fired three shots at the man, who was hit twice, in the shoulder and the back of the head. He underwent a brain scan Thursday night but a hospital spokesman said there was "no immediate danger to his life."

The man, about 30 years old, was placed under arrest at the hospital but Scotland Yard said he had not yet been charged.

Beloved London 'Clippies' clipped

LONDON (AP) — In the latest move to drag Britain into line with the rest of Europe, London is getting rid of its bus conductors.

And why not, the outsider may ask: Britain has survived the demise of the shilling and the paper one-pound note, started to adapt to liters and kilograms and learned to live without an empire. Surely there is life after OPOs, as the modern O-Person-Operated buses are known.

But in a society instinctively suspicious of change, the demise of the bus conductor is not going unchallenged.

The uniformed "clippies" — so-nicknamed from the days their red double-decker juggernauts have long been a fixture on the London landscape, and their job extends well beyond collecting fares.

They help the elderly and disabled on and off the bus, find a seat for a pregnant woman, wake a snoring passenger when it's time to get off, or just sit and chat with the regular commuters if things aren't busy.

They may not fit into a balance sheet, but as anyone who has traveled on a London bus knows, the conductors add a human touch to a streamlined, computerized, corporate Britain. And the tourists surely love them.

"I suppose you could say we're losing a bit of tradition, but unfortunately tradition doesn't pay the bills," said Roland Clausen, 38, spokesman for London Regional Transport's bus division.

LRT wants to raise its annual operating costs of \$256 million for the next three years. But opponents of OPOs say they will make things worse and end up costing the taxpayer more.

"We're not traditionalists. We would support any innovative change," said Duncan Milligan,

spokesman for Capital, a pressure group whose battle against the one-operator buses is highlighted by catchy full-page newspaper ads.

Our objections are for purely practical reasons," he said in an interview. "Not only does it slow down buses, it actually costs more."

He pointed to an Oxford University study saying passengers favored conductors by 5:1 ratio.

The arguments against OPOs are that their journeys are up to 15 percent slower because the driver can't drive while collecting fares; that it makes travel harder for the elderly and disabled; that it drives away passengers and makes them use their cars, adding to congestion; and that the money saved by doing away with conductors will be canceled out by the dollar money they will have to receive.

On buses with conductors, passengers board through a capacious rear platform door. On OPOs they file one by one through an automatic door. On conductor buses travelers wait for the "clippie" to collect the fares, which vary according to distance traveled. On OPOs they pay the driver, and if one passenger doesn't have the exact fare, he keeps the others waiting.

The rimbale can jump aboard a conductor bus at a traffic light, and passengers can pour out through the door at stops instead of singly.

The conductors' union is also resisting the change, along with two consumer watchdog groups representing the passengers.

Clausen-Thue said in an interview that conductors would be retained as drivers or for other tasks, and nobody would be fired.

Milligan agreed that Europe manages fine with OPOs, but attributed this to the widespread use of single fares and season tickets.

Bomb rocks Tel Aviv

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) — A bomb exploded Thursday in a trash can outside a fast-food restaurant across the street from City Hall, shattering glass and sending one restaurant patron to the hospital, police said.

Police were searching for a blond man seen running from the scene with a yellow bag, said an officer who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Ambulances and police cars with their lights flashing converged on the Burger Ranch restaurant, located across the street from the 12-story City Hall. A dozen police officers searched the area and kept onlookers away.

The bomb, placed in an orange plastic trash can just outside one of

the restaurant's picture windows, exploded shortly before 9 a.m. (9 a.m. MST) and blew the trash can into small pieces.

Two days earlier, a bomb was found concealed in a loaf of bread at a Tel Aviv bus stop and was safely defused.

The dissident Abu Mousa faction of Yasser Arafat's mainstream Fatah guerrilla group, which is part of the Palestine Liberation Organization, issued a statement in Damascus, Syria, claiming responsibility for the bomb.

Two other bombs were found and safely dismantled in towns close to Tel Aviv on Monday, and three other devices have exploded in the city since June, wounding two people.

Crew safe in U.S. jet crash

SPANGDAHEM AIR BASE, West Germany (AP) — A U.S. Air Force F-4 fighter jet crashed while taking off on a routine training mission Thursday.

The pilot, Capt. Thomas R. Spicer, 27, of Longmont, Colo., and the weapons system operator, Capt. George D. Wiggam, of Sedgwick,

Kan. Wiggam's age was not given. Both are assigned to the 52nd Tactical Fighter Wing based here.

The men suffered minor abrasions and were taken to the nearby Bitburg Air Base hospital for observation, the communicative said.

There was no immediate explanation for the crash. The Air Force said it has launched an investigation.

Ex-queen charged with harassment

SALT LAKE CITY — Former beauty queen Joyce McKinney, accused in 1977 of kidnapping and raping a Mormon missionary in Britain, goes to trial Feb. 5 on charges she shadowed the same man here, her attorney says.

McKinney made international headlines when she was charged in London with kidnapping Kirk Anderson, then 21, handcuffing him to a bed with fur-lined manacles and forcing him to have sex with her for three days.

The Asheville, N.C., native and 1973 Miss Wyoming-USA denied the kidnap and rape charges, but skipped bail before trial. British authorities have declined to extradite her.

McKinney had been scheduled for trial Dec. 4 in 5th Circuit Court on charges of disturbing

the peace and giving false information to police. However, Judge Michael Hutchings granted a continuance — another in a string stretching over a year and half — when her attorney, Ronald Yengle, withdrew from the case.

D. Gilbert Athay, the third lawyer to represent McKinney on the charges, said Thursday she was confident his client has "an excellent case."

"I just don't think what she's charged with is a criminal act," he said. "The city's going to have a very difficult time proving their case."

Yengle, who succeeded attorney James Barber when he quit, indicated a disagreement with McKinney over his desire to press the case led to his withdrawal, and that she was "concerned about coming to Utah."

DUI evaluators tested by the holiday season

TWIN FALLS — At no other time of the year will the state DUI law get put more to the test than during the holidays.

And while the newer law demands a stricter punishment, compared to previous DUI statutes, a little-known part of the law also addresses the possibility of treatment for the driver.

According to the law, anyone pleading guilty to or found guilty of driving under the influence must undergo an evaluation by a licensed individual to determine the defendant's need for treatment or education about alcohol and drug abuse, says Roberta Crockett, substance abuse specialist with the state Department of Health and Welfare. The reports of the evaluators then are used by judges in sentencing.

The Health and Welfare Department certifies and

monitors evaluators and makes sure judges are satisfied with them, she says.

To become certified by the state as an evaluator, an individual must have a college degree in alcohol studies, social work, psychology or a related social science or have two years experience conducting evaluations for alcohol and drug dependency. Certification tests are given three times a year by the state.

"Diagnosing a drunken driver takes skill, as some people tend to deny any drinking problem; so evaluators

have to sift through the facts, Crockett says.

An evaluator also needs to understand the effects of alcohol in the body and to compare the results from the blood-alcohol test with what the defendant says about the incident, she adds. Evaluators must follow minimum requirements when submitting reports to the court. For example, reviews must include how the use of alcohol is affecting a defendant's work and family life and whether there were any prior offenses.

In their recommendations to the court, evaluators

must recognize whether or not the defendant needs an intensive treatment program or just education about what drinking can do to them.

In the Magic Valley, the state has certified three people to write evaluations for the court. Compared to the population and DUI offenses in the eight counties of the Magic Valley, there should be more evaluators, Crockett says. Altogether, there are 75 certified evaluators in the state. Physicians, however, are certified to act as evaluators.

The three state-certified evaluators in the Magic Valley are Dennis McDermott of Twin Falls, Sam Giles of Halley and Anita Jones of Burley.

A DUI defendant has the option of deciding who he or she wants to conduct the evaluation. They also are responsible for paying for the report, which may cost \$25-\$325, Crockett says.

If someone can't afford the required evaluation, they

U.S. 93 deer kills prompt warnings

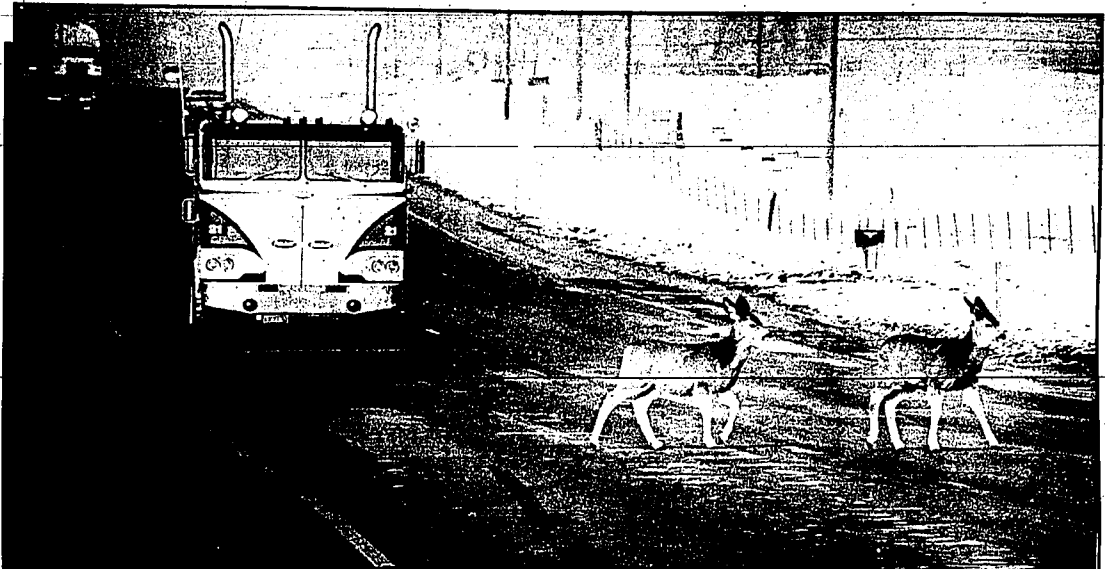

TWIN FALLS — Deer and automobiles do not mix very well.

With several deer kills a day occurring on U.S. Highway 93, between Interstate 84 and the Perrine Bridge, the Idaho Department of Fish and Game has asked the Department of Transportation to put up advisory signs encouraging motorists to drive at 45 mph, instead of the posted 55.

According to Idaho State Police Lt. Bob Wright, the advisory signs are posted from the bridge to a point 2 to 3 miles north of the interstate highway.

While Fish and Game Department officers have been keeping track of deer kills, they have not had time to compile their figures. Dale Turpinseed with the department's office in Jerome, however, said that there have been over 200 deer killed on the interstate, from the Hansen Bridge to a point 2 miles beyond US-93.

"People aren't slowing down," Turpinseed said, "especially at night." Turpinseed said he has come down US-93 at night and had other drivers roar past him at 65 miles an hour or more, even though there were deer on both sides of the road.

"It can be a real fatal situation. If they are hit just right it can be fatal for not just the deer, but the driver as well," Turpinseed said. In past years, he added, he has seen accidents where the deer passed through a car's windshield and out the back window — killing the driver in the process.

He said, "I am blinded by the bright headlights on cars and trucks. While they may be on the side of the road when a car approaches, they

could become frightened or suddenly join other members of their herd —

and right into the path of an oncoming car.

Slowing down gives motorists a

better chance of avoiding a possible collision with deer. It won't, unfortunately, eliminate the problem.

"Even if they drive 40, they're still going to hit some. There's no way to prevent it," Turpinseed said.

"One second they're on the berm and another they're between your headlights."

Sledding accident kills boy, hurts girl

MOUNTAIN HOME — A Christmas Day outing turned into tragedy for the Jim Maas family of Boise when 10-year-old Jimmy Maas was killed and his 9-year-old sister, Kim, was critically injured.

Elmore County Sheriff Larry Olson said Thursday that a sledding accident occurred at about 3:30 p.m. Wednesday on the Grouse Creek Road, near Featherville, when a sled carrying the two children and an adult crashed into a pickup truck.

Olson said the two children were on a sled with Bart Bybee, 22, of Boise, which was traveling down the snow-packed surface of a logging road about a mile above Paradise Resort.

The sled, traveling at "a good rate of speed," went around a corner and met a pickup truck coming up the road. The truck, Olson said, was driven by Kevin Drake, 27, of Featherville. Drake pulled to the side and almost off the road in an attempt to avoid the sled, Olson said. However, "the sled struck the left rear wheel of the pickup, killing the boy and critically injuring his sister."

Olson said both suffered head injuries, while Bybee was treated for minor injuries and released. A helicopter was sent to the scene and the injured were transported by air to St. Alphonsus Hospital in Boise. Kim Maas remained in critical condition in the intensive care unit at the hospital.

Olson said the children's father was in the area when the accident occurred.

RICHFIELD — The Richfield School Board has approved a professional development program to increase the students' self-concept, improve school-community relations and upgrade the performance and interpersonal relations of the district staff.

Superintendent A. Jay Jones said board members will join with the administration and a professional development committee in administering the six objectives of the program:

- Increase teachers' abilities to teach and grow.
- Increase administrators' abilities to lead, motivate and communicate with students, faculty and community.
- Increase the trustees' effectiveness in making decisions related to district policy.
- Support staff members to more effectively do their job.
- Assist faculty to develop constructive public relations.
- Help finance teacher development.

Jones said the plan sets up evaluation and reward systems for profes-

sional growth. Each teacher will be evaluated yearly on the basis of a minimum of three administrative classroom visits, walkthrough classroom visits, pre-conferences with teachers and administrative post-conferences.

He said staff members will be rewarded by a three-part incentive system that will increase salaries for additional training, professional growth and university classes.

The trustees also said they are committed to providing developmental opportunities to school district personnel. Professional development will now be available to all employees in the school district as well as to substitute teachers.

Jones said these activities will be provided at a time when staff members are available and will generally be held within the school district.

District officials plan to spend more money to finance staff activities. According to the adopted plan, "an additional financial effort in professional development will improve the effectiveness of instruction" in the district.

Shoshone board spells out snow removal plan

SHOSHONE — The Shoshone School Board recently clarified district and state rules governing snow removal on private roads after receiving a letter from a patron concerned with hazards facing children who have long walks home from the school bus stop.

The discussion was prompted by a recent highway district decision not to plow private roads. However, Superintendent Tim Adsett said a moratorium has been put on the deci-

sion, and the highway district will continue plowing some private roads.

Adsett said the patron was worried about children getting dropped off after school during bad weather with a long walk ahead of them down an unplowed, private lane to get to the nearest safe drop-off point where they could call home if the weather is severe and a private road is not plowed or if the driver believes it would be unsafe to take the bus on

an unplowed road.

Adsett explained that state law does not require school buses to travel on private roads, but requires routes to be established so that no bus stop is more than 1/4 mile from the intersection of the driveway of the pupil's home and the nearest public road.

According to state law, if the student lives within 1/4 mile of the nearest pick-up point, it is the responsibility of the parent to get the student to the bus stop, Adsett said.

When a pupil lives more than 1/4 miles from

a bus stop or school, and the child is transported by private vehicle to the school or to the bus stop, the local board may pay travel costs in lieu of transportation to the parent, he said.

However, the trustees decided to continue their current policy of picking up children at the safest point possible, whether on private or public roads, as long as the roads are plowed and maintained.

If a private lane is not plowed, the district will invoke the state code limitations, board members decided.

Retailers report sales mixed from holiday shopping time

The nation's major retailers rang up widely mixed sales during the crucial Christmas season, which was six days shorter this year, but sales on the last three shopping days were exceptionally strong, analysts said Thursday.

Meanwhile, many Americans who did not have to work Thursday were taking advantage of post-Christmas markdowns and exchanging merchandise. But in some places, business was so slow as usual because of the weather, which was a factor in the mid-week - for the first time in 11 years - and severe weather gripped several regions.

"We had a very strong season and are feeling very positive about it," said Charles Seif, a vice president of Wal-Mart Stores Inc., a major department chain based in Bentonville, Ark.

December sales at Wal-Mart, the nation's seventh largest retailer, will be up more than 30 percent over a year ago, Seif said. Sales at stores open more than a year will be up about a third of that, he said.

Sears, Roebuck & Co., the largest department store in the country, however, was unsure it would report any kind of gain over last Christmas.

"We're encouraged, by the strong finish," said spokesman Ernie Arms. "It's still touch and go whether our sales for the total period will be slightly higher or slightly lower than last year."

Barbara Palazzolo, a spokeswoman for K mart in Troy, Mich., said: "After-Christmas sales today are excellent, like Christmas wrapping paper and cards. Even though it is cold out, there is much activity in the stores."

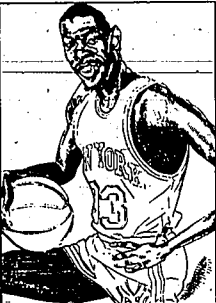

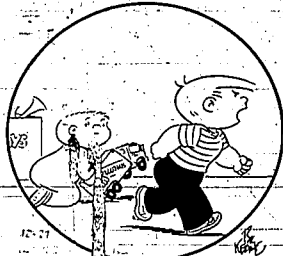

Lorentz honored as the documentary master

LOS ANGELES — During the Depression, a unique marriage of government and art produced a string of movies that remain classics of the documentary film.

Most of the figures of that New Deal period are dead. However, Pare Lorentz, the man who made "The Plow That Broke the Plains," "The River" and other memorable works, remains hale and active as he approaches 80.

He recently came to Los Angeles from his Westchester, N.Y., home to receive the Award for Career Achievement from the International Documentary Association.

The honor was the latest of many that have been given to Lorentz, whose movies are required study in film schools throughout the world. Along with the great Robert Flaherty ("Nanook of the North," "Taboo"), Lorentz is credited with raising the documentary film to the status of art.

Lorentz paused during the round of events here to reminisce about his years with the government. Born in Clarksburg, W. Va., he went to New York City in 1925 to

become a part of the literary ferment. His interests leaned toward motion pictures, and he wrote about them for Vanity Fair, McCall's and other magazines.

After the 1932 election of Franklin D. Roosevelt, Lorentz produced a photographic book, "The Roosevelt Year." That led to the position of filmmaker for the farm relief-Resettlement Administration, an operation Roosevelt initiated to enlighten the public about the problems of land conservation.

Lorentz had never made a movie. However, he had studied film as a critic for 10 years and was aided in his first project by such filmmakers as King Vidor.

His first movie was "The Plow That Broke the Plains," a work that poetically dealt with how overcultivation of American farmland created the Dust Bowl.

"It tells the story of the plains and it tells it with some emotional value — an emotion that springs out of the soil itself," Lorentz once wrote in McCall's.

Our heroine is the grass. The sun and the wind are players as are the actual farmers living in the plain country. It is a melodrama of nature: The tragedy of turning

grass into dust. Lorentz combined stunning photography and music by Virgil Thomson in the film.

Though Lorentz had a friend in President Roosevelt, he was always in danger of sabotage by the government bureaucracy.

"The president loved movies," Lorentz recalled. "After his affliction (polio) limited his mobility, he looked at newspapers to keep himself informed of what was going on in the world. He had a profound interest in cameras of all kinds."

With Roosevelt's encouragement and with the help of Hollywood friends such as Vidor, "The Plow That Broke the Plains" was widely seen in movie theaters.

But when Lorentz tried to make "The River," a film about the ravages of water on the nation's land, he was suddenly dropped from the payroll. He managed to complete the project and presented it to Roosevelt at a midnight screening at the president's home in Hyde Park, N.Y.

"The president had already seen Sonja Henie in 'Thin Ice,' and only he and the ... help were present when 'The River' was screened," Lorentz recalled in an interview.

NEW YORK (AP) — "Hell-High," a movie about skiing after being taken to a mountain top by helicopter, has won the 12th annual International Ski Film Festival grand prize here.

The film, showing the adventure of skiing in deep powder, was shot in the Canadian Rockies.

Second place in the festival went to "Apocalypse 2 — The Challenge," a fantasy in which a team of good guys "fights" a team of bad guys on the slopes of the French Alps.

Third prize went to an instructional film, "Mogul Skiing: Foundation for Technique," and fourth prize to "Dreams of Glory," a racing and competition film about the 1985 Alpine World Cup Championships.

Winning films are shown at ski clubs, resorts and equipment shows.

Journalist profiles politics of busing

BOSTON — When Sen. Edward M. Kennedy tried to address a crowd opposed to school busing on City Hall Plaza in the fall of 1974, he was pelted with vegetables and forced to take shelter in the nearby federal building named for his late brother, John.

That image of a popular liberal Democrat being vilified in the political center of his home turf prompted journalist J. Anthony Lukas to take a closer look at the passions and politics of court-ordered school desegregation.

After 7 1/2 years of research and 550 hours of taped interviews, the result is the best-selling "Common Ground: A Turbulent Decade in the Lives of Three American Families," winner of the 1985 American Book Award for nonfiction.



Lukas, 52, a Harvard graduate and former New York Times reporter, provides a close study of Boston's school desegregation struggle, examining the changing face of urban America and suggesting why the white working class has been defecting from the Democratic Party.

"There are two powerful values in American life, among others — equality and community — and they are in tension with each other," Lukas said in a recent interview.

Many opponents of busing, he argues, were not fighting against blacks so much as they were fighting for their neighborhoods — their schools, taverns, churches and friends.

"That's something that a lot of American liberals, who shuttle between Harvard Square and Georgetown and San Francisco and Chicago, have lost. I think it's a very powerful value," he said.

"What I'm saying in the book is not that we shift our emphasis from equality to community. But we have to recognize that this is an essential tension in American life and we have to find some equilibrium between two values.

"We have to find the kind of equality which is not so mathematical that it doesn't allow people to

Powerful values are in tension — have a sense of community. And we have to find a sense of community which is not so exclusive that it doesn't show people of different race or creed out.

Through his research, Lukas learned that he really didn't know the city. Like other travelers on the Boston-New York shuttle, he believed Boston was "a warm, genteel, intellectual, tolerant, open — a sweet-tempered city."

But in the neighborhoods, divided by Boston's many physical and social barriers, he found a city that was racially tense and politically intense, as intolerant in some ways as its Puritan founders of the 17th century.

That intolerance stiffened after a federal judge, ruling in a suit filed by black parents, found Boston schools unconstitutionally segregated and essentially took over the school system. The court-ordered school busing across the city started in 1975 and exempted the suburbs, a decision that triggered violent resistance and "white flight."

"Common Ground" tells the busing story through detailed and sympathetic portraits of three families who experienced the Boston busing crisis of the mid-1970s from very different vantage points.

NBC's 'The Cosby Show' brings legitimacy back to sitcom genre

If 1985 will be remembered as the year NBC rebounded to the top in the networks-ratings race, then it has been "The Cosby Show" that served as the prime propellant for the peacock network.

Is there any doubt about the popularity of "The Cosby Show"? The episode that aired on Dec. 5 was the second-highest rated regular episode of a weekly series in TV history. Its 36.2 rating meant that 36.2 percent of all TV sets in the United States were tuned in, or 53 percent of all viewers. That comes out to be about 65 million viewers. The two-year-old series has been the top-rated show for almost every week of the TV season.

The highest-rated weekly episode was the Jan. 23, 1981 edition of "Dallas," which drew a rating of 36.4.

The popularity of "The Cosby Show" has revived the sitcom, a genre that many critics claimed to be on the verge of extinction at the end of the 1983-84 season, when not one sitcom placed in the final top 10 Nielsen ratings.

It's a sitcom that relies on family foibles for its humor, an '80s version of "Father Knows Best." The success of "The Cosby Show" has especially rekindled an interest in that kind of sitcom. "Family Ties," the series that follows "Cosby" on NBC's Thursday night schedule, often has been rated No. 2, and two ABC domestic sitcoms, "Who's the Boss?" and Alan Thicke's "Growing Pains," have also become ratings

Perhaps the success of the shows has been abetted by the more conservative mood of the '80s. In the age of Ronald Reagan, sexually transmitted diseases and commitment, the swinging single shenanigans of "Three's Company" just don't make it anymore. The striving, middle-class family is again the role model that's in vogue and the Huxtables — a doctor husband and a lawyer wife living in a tiny Brooklyn Heights brownstone — fit the bill.

Of course, it's axiomatic by now that the popularity of the all-black "Cosby Show" has transcended race.

What we're dealing with here is a fine ensemble cast, led by the laid-back, occasionally perplexed Cosby as Dr. Heathcliff Huxtable, and Phylicia Ayers-AlLEN as his patient lawyer wife Claire. Let's face it, the kids — Malcolm Jamal-Warner (Theo), Keshia Knight Pulliam (Rudy), Tempsett Bledsoe (Vanessa) and Lisa Bonet (Denise) — are adorable.

Together, the cast exudes a chemistry that is absent from the other two black-oriented sitcoms that were created to cash in on the popularity of "Cosby," — "227" and "Charlie and Company."

CBN news comes from Christian viewpoint beginning in January

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. — James R. Whelan says he lost his job as founding editor and publisher of the Washington Times because its owner, the Rev. Sun Myung Moon's Unification Church, tried to impose its beliefs on the newspaper.

Whelan has no fears he will run into a similar problem with his latest employer, the Rev. Pat Robertson's Christian Broadcasting Network.

"I'm explicitly comfortable with a Christian organization because I happen to be one of them," he said. "Praise the Lord."

Since becoming managing director of CBN News in February, Whelan has been planning a half-hour daily television news program, which will start in a month, on Jan. 27, at 8 p.m. MST.

"CBN News Tonight" will present news from a Christian perspective to the cable channel's 27.3 million homes, which receive a mixture of Westerns, game shows, situation comedies and Robertson's "The 700 Club," an interview show.

"We're not going to try to convert anybody," Whelan said. "But we are going to say that we, in our labors, will bring to you a system of values. That system of values is the word of God as conveyed to us through scriptures."

Whelan's boss could be a major news topic if he decides to seek the Republican nomination for president in 1988.

"It would be an interesting test of steady nerves. But no, we don't see a real problem," Whelan said. "If he were unscrupulous it would be different, but he's not, he's principled."

As host of "The 700 Club," Robertson gives directions on the news features run during the 90-minute program. If he runs for president, he would leave the show, Whelan said.

Whelan criticized the networks for presenting a liberal view of the news, but said he didn't believe "CBN News" would be biased to the right.

"We would strive for a kind of fairness," he said. "It's not that we're going to create a new kind of imbalance."

A CBS spokesman rejected Whelan's charges. "Those are criticisms that are not new, but I think they're unjustifiable and I think you have to consider as we always do the point of view of those

making the criticisms," said George Schweitzer, vice president of communications for the CBS Broadcast Group.

"Everyone who watches television news brings their own set of values to it," Schweitzer said. "CBN is guided by a particular set of their own viewpoints and guidelines. I'm sure there are people who would be interested in seeing that."

"On most issues, network news coverage is remarkably fair and balanced," said Michael Robinson, a political science professor who heads the Media Analysis Project at George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

Robinson said he watched 20 to 30 hours of television news a week, including Robertson's show.

"The agenda for network evening news is not ideological, it's sensational. The agenda for CBN is ideological," Robinson said.

How would "CBN News" be different?

Whelan said the three major networks give equal weight to statements by spokesmen from the Soviet Union as they do to spokesmen from the United States. "CBN News," he said, would point out that the Soviet Union is a totalitarian state and that its spokesmen are just saying what they are told by the Kremlin.

"You could certainly make clear that this person is an official spokesman of a system that does not permit dissent," he said.

Whelan said that if CBN presented a special on abortion, it would begin with a statement that abortion is morally wrong. But if the network covered a Senate hearing on abortion, it would include spokesmen for both sides of the issue.

"We make a distinction between good and evil," he said. "That does not mean that we would twist, distort or corrupt what somebody who didn't agree with us said."

CBN will about double its daily news with the addition of the half-hour program, which will originate in Washington and be anchored by Robert Hughes, a journalist from South Bend, Ind.

It now produces feature stories during "The 700 Club," news headlines throughout the day and a few news specials. It has interviewed President Reagan and Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole, has sent a news crew to Turkey to report on the search for Noah's Ark and has reported extensively on the Middle East, Whelan said.

It operates bureaus in Jerusalem and Beirut and eventually will open bureaus in London, New York and Los Angeles, Whelan said.

A ratings flop everywhere else, Cavett casts lot with cable TV

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. — Dick Cavett was reminiscing about his various tenures as a talk show host:

"I think Judy Garland made her last television appearance on my morning show. Those shows were all erased. I remember my first show in prime-time—Candice Bergen arrived in a tuxedo. It was stunning. Liza Minnelli was on the show, too.

"Lester Maddox, the former governor of Georgia who went into the fried chicken business, walked off one show after a fight with Truman Capote. Capote then said, he'd tried the governor's chicken and it wasn't finger-licking good.

"George Plimpton never lets me forget the time he did a trapeze act on my show. He came in with a trapeze rig and he was going to show me how to do it. What he didn't know was that I was a jock. I'd been a gymnast. He was telling me to be very careful. I did a pullover — I pulled myself up at the far end of the swing. It astonished him and the audience."

Unfortunately, Cavett didn't astonish the audience enough, although he mesmerized the critics and attracted a corps of dedicated fans.

No one can say that Cavett didn't have a chance. He had a morning talk show, a late-night talk show, and a prime-time talk show, all on ABC, a summer variety show on CBS, and a prime-time talk show on public television. None captured enough of an audience to stay on the air.

Now he has a talk show on the USA Network on cable.

Cavett is charming and witty and a delight to watch. But somewhere along the line he got tagged as an "intellectual" whose programs were

thought-provoking. As Tim Brooks and Earle Marsh point out in "The Complete Directory to Prime Time Network TV Shows," the audience just didn't want to be provoked.

"I don't know where people got the notion that I'm an intellectual," said Cavett on a recent visit here. "They started calling me that from the beginning. I've never understood it."

Like Johnny Carson, Cavett grew up in Nebraska and was a teen-age magician. He won a scholarship to Yale University in 1954.

He was working as a copy boy at Time magazine when he met Jack Paar in a hallway at NBC and offered Paar an opening monologue for "The Tonight Show." He was soon working for Paar and went on to write for Johnny Carson, Groucho Marx, Merv Griffin and others. It was Woody Allen who encouraged him to make the switch to comedian.

In 1968 ABC signed him for a morning show, which led to a late-night show opposite Carson. That show fi-

nally expired in 1975. His PBS show ran from 1977 to 1982. At the same time he began his PBS show he was on Broadway in "Otherwise Engaged."

He played himself as a talk show host in the movie "Health" and later did several specials for Home Box Office.

His current show is the first of its kind for the USA Network, which also cablecasts an original situation comedy called "Check It Out," starring Don Adams.

Mark Harmon of 'St. Elsewhere' bids farewell to hospital series

BOSTON — "St. Elsewhere," NBC's brainy and bittersweet series about a chaotic Boston hospital will kill off its most handsome doctor, but don't expect his end to come in a sappy-tear-jerker.

For the past four seasons, the show has proven it's too gritty and smart for sentimental departures. Dr. Wendy Armstrong (Kim Miyori), a headstrong intern, sank into anorexic depression and then took her own life with a dose of pills. Peter White (Terence Knox), a resident-turned-rapist, was shot to death by an avenging nurse.

Viewers can look forward to another unsettling farewell Feb. 5 when Bobby Caldwell, a womanizing plastic surgeon played by Mark Harmon, makes his exit. Harmon, who also stars in a series of plain-talking Coors beer commercials, is leaving the show to appear in movies and act on Broadway.

His character on "St. Elsewhere" has spent the season bouncing from one bizarre sexual encounter to another, slowly losing his mind in the process.

The producers of "St. Elsewhere" have said that Caldwell would contract AIDS from a heterosexual liaison, but said his life would be ended by something other than the deadly illness.

Caldwell doesn't die "in the terms of a hospital bed, a la 'Brian's Song,'" Harmon said, referring to the movie about the cancer death of football player Brian Piccolo.

"It's a stretch in a different direction for my character and a different way that it's handled by the writers," Harmon said. "It will shock and amaze everyone watching. That's the way they do it on 'St. Elsewhere.'"

The Wednesday night show is one of the most unconventional on television, mixing gentle humor with the dark side of the human drama.

Taking its cue from the stark realism of "Hill Street Blues," "St. Elsewhere" has depicted the crucifixion of a drunken bag man, a series of rapes, and the mastectomy and subsequent divorce of a middle-aged nurse.

Recently, Caldwell was slashed across the face with a razor after making love with cocaine addict.

"I thank God for the opportunity

to work on "St. Elsewhere," Harmon said in an interview. "I think, No. 1, 'St. Elsewhere' is entertaining. It's a very rare hour of programming that can make you laugh and cry in the same hour. 'St. Elsewhere' does that.

"But I also don't think the writers

are assuming they can cure cancer. If the writers and creators of our show can make the audience think a little bit, I think that's all they're really setting out to do."

Harmon, 34, said his last scenes as Caldwell were among the most emotionally draining he's ever performed.

"It was a hard three weeks," he said. "I had a hard time just leaving it at the studio. The night I finished I came home and ran 20 miles."

Harmon, the son of legendary football star Tom Harmon, began his acting career at the University of California at Los Angeles. But in those days he was better known for his performance as the star quarterback of a winning football team.

He landed his first movie role in "Comes a Horseman" with Jane Fonda and later won an Emmy nomination for best supporting actor for his part in ABC's "Eleanor and Franklin: The White House Years."

In 1981, Harmon joined the ensemble cast of "St. Elsewhere" to play a doctor who had given up his lucrative private practice for the excitement of a big city hospital.

Novelist Vidal writes screenplay for military academy TV drama

BURBANK, Calif. — Novelist Gore Vidal swore he would never write for television again, but here he was, attaching his words come to life on the set of the NBC's "Dress Gray."

The four-hour miniseries, based on a novel by Lucian K. Truscott IV, is a murder mystery set in a military academy at the time of the Vietnam War. It stars Hal Holbrook and Bridges, Alec Baldwin, Eddie Albert, Alexis Smith, Patrick Swayze and Susan Hess. It will be broadcast later this season.

"I retired from television in 1960," Vidal said. "I had two plays on Broadway at the time. I always thought I'd come back, to live TV at it, but it died shortly thereafter. So that ended my television career."

"In 1964 I did what I thought was my last Hollywood film, 'The Best Man,' which was based on my play. I was writing a novel and said that was a good time to stop writing for the Hollywood studios. Then in 1979 a producer asked me to do 'Dress Gray.' I said no, for all the reasons I've said."

Vidal read the book, which was set at West Point (the name was changed to U.S. Grant Military Academy for the miniseries).

"I was born at West Point," he said, "and my father and an uncle and two stepbrothers were all graduates." He added that his father and uncle were football players at West Point. His father was an instructor there and one of the first Army aviators. "When he got out of the Army he helped found three airlines," Vidal said. "I was in the Army from 1943-46 but I couldn't get into West Point or Officer Candidate School because of my eyes."

"So, I was never able to use all this material. Suddenly, Truscott's book raised all kinds of feelings about the Army: West Point is something that never gets out of your blood. You're always a member of the family."

Vidal originally wrote it as a feature film, but it never got made and the screenplay went on the shelf. There it lay until Warner Bros. Television decided to expand it into a miniseries.

"They asked me if I'd expand it and to my surprise I said yes," he said.

The story is about the death of a

cadet, and there is strong evidence he was raped and murdered. The dead cadet's sister and another cadet, who is her boyfriend, turn sleuth to solve the mystery.

"Truscott grasps the paranoia of the cadets," said Vidal. "The war was a threat. And if an officer is coming down on you, as an officer does in the story, you can become paranoid. You don't know who's after you and what reports are being filed... it's Kafka time. The whole theme is in the gray area. There are all kinds of moral gray areas. It's quite a serious piece."

"I hadn't intended to return to television after 25 years, but this got me back. But I shall not return."

Vidal's novelized version of Abraham Lincoln's White House years, "Lincoln," has been sold to NBC. He said the network is having trouble with the casting. "I want James Taylor, the singer, to play Lincoln," he said. "He looks just like Lincoln."

Another book, "Burr," based on the life of Aaron Burr, is being turned into a six-hour miniseries by screenwriter Robert Bolt.

Vidal, who divides his time between a home in the Hollywood Hills and one in Italy, said he had recently completed a theatrical screenplay for producer Ray Stark about Libby Holman, the torch singer who shot her husband. Debra Winger will star.

Vidal currently is working on the book "Manifest Destiny," which covers the period 1898-1919.

"That book will tell how America got this way," he said. "If the American schools know how to teach history I wouldn't feel the obligation to write these books."

His other historical novels about the United States are "Burr," "Lincoln," "1876," and "Washington, D.C." "That takes us from the beginning to Camelot. Washington, D.C. was the first book. I had no intention of going back in time. But my half-sisters are descendants of Burr, and I got interested."

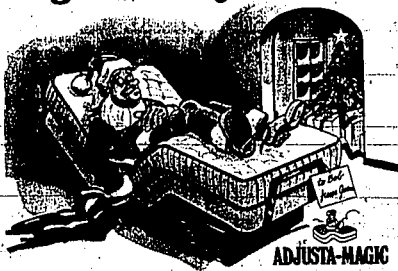



BBC producer says Britons like U.S. cop shows and soap operas

NEW YORK — Britain exports its literary classics to U.S. television, and America sends back its popularity hits, overloaded with sex and violence. The head of drama for the British Broadcasting Corp. considers it a fair exchange.

"There's clearly room for different dramas that aspire to different things," said Jonathan Powell. "What we find most satisfying are 'Dallas,' 'Miami Vice' and 'Hill

Street Blues.' I think 'Miami Vice' is terrific. We just don't make cop shows like that in England."

"The type of programming the two nations import speaks volumes about their cultural notions of each other, the gaps in their programming mixes and their distinctly different TV heritages."

Powell said Britain has its own prime-time soap operas, but they tend to follow people in small communities and lack the larger-than-life qualities of "Dallas" and "Dynasty." Consequently, British audiences enjoy gawking at the resplendent excesses of the Carringtons and Ewings.

"Maybe we do want to watch things that conform with our preconceptions of each other's cultures," said Powell. "We make 'Upstairs, Downstairs,' you make 'Dallas,' which is really a cultural fairy tale." Both programs look at class distinctions, Powell noted, but the American series places its greatest emphasis on money.

Britain also has its share of cops-and-robber series — "our own 'Kojaks,'" Powell says — but they're not nearly as violent. "British TV is not as pacy as American TV," he added.

For the most part, U.S. imports from Britain are costume dramas, historical pieces, mysteries and literary classics that generally wind up on public television.

"In the States, you get a crazy, nostalgic view of England, but the TV product doesn't convey a picture of England as she really is," said Powell.

The differences in tastes and styles go beyond contemporary images; they go back to the drama

traditions of the two countries. British television has its roots in the theater, while the direct descendant of American TV is the Hollywood movie studio.

"That difference in origin tells a great deal about our approach and yours to television dramatization," said Powell, who is responsible for 250 hours a year of drama programming for the BBC.

Two of those programs, for which Powell also was executive producer, had recent exposure in America. "Bleak House," the eight-hour series based on Charles Dickens' classic book, has its sixth installment Sunday night on PBS' "Masterpiece Theatre." Last fall, "Tender Is the Night," a six-hour adaptation of F. Scott Fitzgerald's novel, was on pay-cable's Showtime, which also co-financed the venture.

"With production costs escalating, co-productions are becoming more the rule. Powell said BBC's artistic control is retained by maintaining greater than a 50-percent stake. One longtime investor, Mobil Corp., the underwriter for "Masterpiece Theatre" and "Mystery!" on PBS, "doesn't make us make concessions to the U.S. audiences, so we don't end up with something that lands in the middle of the Atlantic," Powell said.

When ABC, CBS and NBC do miniseries, they believe that big names attract the largest audiences. Hence, ABC's "North and South" had cameos from Elizabeth Taylor, Gene Kelly, Johnny Cash and other celebrities.

"Tender Is the Night" relied on well-known American actors, including Peter Strauss, Mary Steenburgen and Edward Asner.

traditions of the two countries. British television has its roots in the theater, while the direct descendant of American TV is the Hollywood movie studio.

"That difference in origin tells a great deal about our approach and yours to television dramatization," said Powell, who is responsible for two hours a year of drama programming for the BBC.

Two of those programs, for which Powell also was executive producer, had recent exposure in America. "Bleak House," the eight-hour series based on Charles Dickens' classic book, has its sixth installment Sunday night on PBS' "Masterpiece Theatre." Last fall, "Tender Is the Night," a six-hour adaptation of F. Scott Fitzgerald's novel, was on pay-cable's Showtime, which also co-financed the venture.

With production costs escalating, co-productions are becoming more the rule. Powell said BBC's artistic control is retained by maintaining greater than a 50 percent stake. One longtime investor, Mobil Corp., the underwriter for "Masterpiece Theatre" and "Mystery!" on PBS, "doesn't make us make concessions to the U.S. audiences, so we don't end up with something that lands in the middle of the Atlantic," Powell said.

When ABC, CBS and NBC do miniseries, they believe that big names attract the largest audiences. Hence, ABC's "North and South" had cameo from Elizabeth Taylor, Gene Kelly, Johnny Cash and other celebrities.

"Tender Is the Night" relied on well-known American actors, including Peter Strauss, Mary Steenburgen and Edward Asner.

'Sesame Street' talks adoption

NEW YORK — Another human is joining the cast of Muppets, people and grouches on public television's "Sesame Street," but he's the first one younger than the program's typical viewer.

As Big Bird might say in his squeaky voice: His name is Miles. He's 1-year-old. And he's adopted. . . What's adopted?

The award-winning series' target audience of pre-schoolers met Miles on Christmas Day, a one-hour episode scheduled for Christmas. So children could watch it with their parents and discuss it, said Dorey

Singer, the show's executive producer. "The emphasis is on the family relationships that develop," not adoption.

Extensive research was done with child development specialists who warned the producers that delving too deeply into the reasons for adoption might frighten young children, so there is no reference in Miles' biological parents.

His on-screen "parents" are Gordon (Roscoe Orman) and Susan (Loretta Long). In real life, Miles was born to Orman and his wife, Sharon, last December.

On Tuesday's episode, Gordon simply will tell Big Bird: "There are children who need to be loved and

cared for, and Miles is one of those children. And Susan and I want a child to take care of and love, so we're adopting Miles, which means he's going to be our son, and we're going to be his parents."

"For how long?" Big Bird asks. "Forever," answers Gordon. "Once you adopt a baby, he's yours forever."

After the Ormans had their baby, Debra Spinney, whose husband, Carol, plays Big Bird and Oscar the Grouch, made the suggestion to have Miles join the cast. "I thought it was a terrific idea," said Singer. "We wanted to be as honest and real as possible, and we felt it would be

hokey to make Susan pregnant. We also felt adoption was an important issue."

The adoption will allow "Sesame Street" to explore other issues, relationships and parenting concerns. Viewers will follow the changes Miles causes in the household of two working parents and be able to see both in parenting roles.

The issue of sibling rivalry will be raised when Big Bird and friends, concerned they'll be forgotten in the fuss over the new arrival, are assured by Gordon that there's enough love for everybody.

In its 17 years of educating and entertaining, "Sesame Street" often has touched on significant issues, always attempting to communicate them in non-threatening ways.

• After Will Lee, who played Mr. Hooper, died several years ago, feelings about his death were incorporated into the show.

• The subject of pregnancy was raised by Buffy Sainte-Marie, the folk singer, who later nursed her baby on "Sesame Street."

• The issue of child abuse was indirectly handled earlier this season when Big Bird's best friend, the once-imaginary Mr. Snuffleupagus, came out of the darkness and was seen by the human characters. Phil Donahue, his ever-present microphone in hand, was there to help record the historic moment.

"The issue of child abuse was at the back of our minds," Singer said. "We've always been aware of it."

about ending the long-running existential gag of whether Mr. Snuffleupagus was real or not. "In this day and age, it's especially important that children can talk to their parents and be believed. We don't want to discourage children from talking about anything."

The writers, and some viewers, also had grown tired of the joke of this huge, lumbering elephant-like animal never making contact with the cast. "Maybe there was some frustration," said Singer. "Now we'll see more of him and see how he interacts with the characters."

The frustration probably was felt most by parents watching "Sesame Street" with their kids. Through humor and celebrity cameos, the producers constantly are trying to amuse adults and keep older siblings

from changing the channel.

This season, there will be guest appearances from "The Cosby Show" kids, Tony Danza of "Who's the Boss?" and classical violinist Itzhak Perlman. The animation, which Singer said is an effective teaching tool, and the filmed segments also can be enjoyed by older audiences.

This two-tiered approach obviously works. According to A.C. Nielsen Co. figures for the 1984-85 TV season, some portion of "Sesame Street" was viewed on a weekly basis by approximately 10 million homes and monthly by 20 million, nearly one-fourth of all TV households.

And 20 percent of the weekly audience comes from adult-only households, said Dr. Keith Mielke, vice president of the Children's Television Workshop.

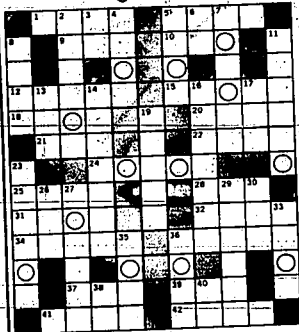

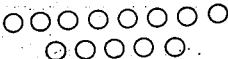

CBS signs four-year, \$43 million TV pact with NBA

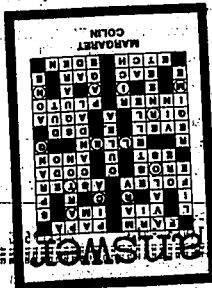

CBS Sports reportedly will pay an average of \$43 million annually over the four years of its new contract with the National Basketball Association, announced last Friday. The previous three-year contract

called for a flat \$22 million a year. But CBS isn't calling the new pact a 95-percent increase, preferring to point out it's amortizing the costs over a full seven years. CBS' exclusive negotiating period for renewal ran out Oct. 31. The NBA

formally extended it and then recently contacted ABC Sports to see if that network would match it. It didn't.

The contract also gives CBS the option of a prime-time broadcast of a conference playoff final.
