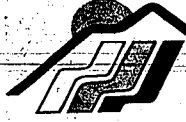

Voyager reaches Uranus

PASADENA, Calif. — Voyager 2 has discovered Uranus emits weak radio signals suggesting it has a magnetic field that could reveal the length of a day on the planet and whether it has a molten rocky core, scientists said Thursday.

If you want to know how long a day is on Uranus, you have to measure the magnetic field. It's the way we will know how rapidly the planet is rotating," said Ed Stone, Voyager project scientist at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

In addition, the existence of a magnetic field means Uranus must have flowing, electrically conductive material in its interior, which is hidden by the planet's thick atmosphere, he said.

Voyager 2, which explored Jupiter in 1979 and Saturn in 1981, makes its closest approach to Uranus at the planet's five major moons today — the most distant objects ever visited by a spacecraft from Earth.

Project manager Dick Liska said the spacecraft will pass within about 50,600 miles of the planet at 5:51 seconds after 10:56 a.m. MST.

The space probe already has discovered nine new moons orbiting Uranus, raising the total of known moons to 14, as well as clouds and winds swirling around the solar system's third-largest planet, the seventh from the sun.

Warning sends oil prices tumbling

NEW YORK — Oil prices slid for the sixth straight day Thursday, plunging severely after Saudi Arabia's oil minister warned that the recent free-fall could lead to world economic chaos, then recovering some of the lost ground.

The turbulence Thursday began in Europe when Ahmed Zaki Yamani, the Saudi minister, told an interviewer that Great Britain and the non-OPEC producing nations must cooperate with the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries in limiting production to control prices.

Otherwise, "there will be no limitation to the downward price spiral which may bring crude prices to less than \$15 a barrel, with adverse and dangerous consequences for the whole world economy," he

was quoted as telling OPEC's official news agency. At the end of trading Thursday, Brent North Sea crude for delivery in February was selling at \$18.30 a barrel, up from a morning low of \$17.70 but down from Wednesday's late price of \$19.90 a barrel. A barrel is the equivalent of 42 gallons.

West Texas Intermediate, the top U.S. crude, closed at \$19.82 a barrel for March delivery after opening at \$18.75 on the New York Mercantile Exchange. On Wednesday it closed at \$20.35.

While the price for immediate delivery was lower, Thursday contracts for April through August delivery sold between \$19.82 and \$20.50 a barrel, indicating that the market is not yet betting on a fall beyond present levels.

February contract prices for gasoline and heating oil were down sharply.

Yamani's comments came just one day after the oil market had shown signs of settling at levels near \$20 a barrel. Since late November, prices have dropped more than one-third to the lowest point in six years.

After opening sharply down, prices edged up slowly in New York. "What the day tells us is, yes in fact, there may be a floor to this whole thing," said Peter Beutel, analyst with Tudor Wolff Futures Inc., "People just said, 'Maybe Europe as depressed demand for heating oil.'"

Producing nations, determined to hang on to their share of the market, have been pumping more oil than the world needs. They hope the in-

evitable price fall will encourage other producers to cooperate in restraining production.

Despite Yamani's warning, Britain reiterated that it would not cut production. And in Quito, Ecuador announced that beginning Feb. 1,

that it would sell as much oil as possible at market prices, formally abandoning higher, fixed rates.

The glut of petroleum has resulted partly from conservation and fuel switching that have undermined the price of oil since the 1970s, when an oil price explosion led to double-digit inflation, economic stagnation and

in much of America — and as depressed demand for heating oil. OPEC announced in December that its members would seek a "fair share" of the world-oil market even if it meant cutting prices.

Tests show flu virus is Type B

TWIN FALLS — It may be of little comfort to those who are sick, but health department officials Thursday said the flu virus that is sweeping Magic Valley as Type B influenza, the less severe form of influenza.

A health nurse also said Thursday that fewer adults have caught the flu, possibly because they have built up a natural immunity to influenza. But whether the current outbreak could have been avoided by giving all children flu shots last fall, "may or may not have worked."

Nurse Cheryl Becker, with the South Central Health District, said Thursday that the strain of influenza that is sending students across the area to bed is definitely Type B, the less severe form — for which there is no medication.

Becker said results from the state lab in Boise came back Thursday. "We have another batch of tests to come in, and it may be we have a combination of both, but right now it's Type B," she said.

Health officials wanted to identify the type of influenza that has closed several area schools and pushed.

U.S. plans air maneuvers

WASHINGTON — In a show of resolve, the United States has ordered its two aircraft battle groups in the Mediterranean Sea southward toward Libya and notified civilian air traffic officials there the carriers will be conducting flight operations over the next week.

Pentagon sources said Thursday the moves in no way presaged any type of military attack on Libya and that all operations would be conducted in international airspace and waters.

One official added, however, that the exercise was intended to demonstrate the United States would not be intimidated by an increased Soviet naval presence in the region, nor by Libyan leader Col. Moammar Khadafy's decision to place his own

military forces on alert and to pledge continuing support for Palestinian terrorists.

"It's asserting the right to passage in international airspace, with plenty of notice to everyone in advance of our peaceful intent," one source said.

Through diplomatic channels, meanwhile, the United States told the Soviets the situation was tough and urged care be taken, said a U.S. official who insisted on anonymity.

Another source said the flight operations had been approved earlier in the week by the National Security Council "as a warning that we're not forgetting these terrorist attacks. We know what Khadafy has done and we want him to know we're prepared to respond."

A White House official denied reports that the exercise was a deliberate provocation of Khadafy.

EPA bans asbestos use as health hazard

WASHINGTON — The government moved Thursday for the first time to ban deadly asbestos, a widely-used substance that officials say causes up to 12,000 cancer cases annually in the United States.

Under a two-phased attack, the Environmental Protection Agency proposed an "immediate" ban in five product categories, mostly in construction area. Over the next decade, EPA said, it wants to cleanse the environment of all products containing the known carcinogen.

The decision, attacked by an industry group as "unwarranted," culminated more than six years of regulatory soul-searching within the government and months of fighting between EPA and the Office of Management and Budget.

EPA Administrator Lee M. Thomas said human health — not monetary cost — was EPA's foremost concern.

Thomas said it would take about a year for the agency to complete public hearings and administrative review of the proposed asbestos rule, which has been in the works since late 1979.

The ban, when fully implemented, will let it float for while and maybe have a hearing on it, Antone said after the meeting.

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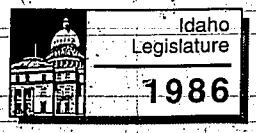
Local income tax to support schools given consideration

BOISE — Local property tax support for schools would be eliminated and replaced with a statewide local income tax if the Legislature passes a plan submitted to the House, Revenue and Taxation Committee Thursday.

Rep. Raymond Parks, R-Blackfoot, who introduced the bill to the committee, said the shift would make school support fairer because income is a better barometer of the ability to pay taxes than is property ownership.

Parks also said the change would make it easier for schools to get override levies passed.

the committee, said the measure will likely be assigned back to his committee; but he buildings and maintenance projects.

Parks said override levies around the state are not being accepted because people feel property taxes are already too high. He said farmers and other landowners who support education are voting against overrides because they are financially strapped.

With the tax load shifted from the land-value property tax to a tax on debt, Parks levies will have better luck, said Parks. The plan neither adds new money to schools nor takes it away, he said.

Former House Speaker Allan Larsen at the meeting and spoke in favor of the measure. He congratulated the committee for voting to further consider the bill at the end of the meeting.

**Schools did a fine job**

In my first ever letter to the editor I would like to give three cheers for the people who wrote in supporting the O'Leary School in its efforts to maintain discipline.

"The Box," as one writer suggested, may be a temptress in a tempo. However, when a parent starts to institute a lawsuit against the school district for such disciplinary treatment of his 15-year-old child (he's no toddler), I think it should be in the news. After all, we are not entitled to all the good laughs engendered by such ridiculous maneuvers — albeit the school district officials probably do not regard it a humorous.

One person criticized the school's action asking, "What other secret methods does the school system employ that the taxpayers and parents are totally unaware of?" Obviously, he is just a taxpayer-parent who did not know what goes on at school couldn't possibly have any communication whatsoever with their children. I also wonder if he expects the school board to make decisions to such an extent as to check disciplinary methods? Teachers are there primarily to teach, not to substitute parents. Probably the most available commodity on a 24-hour basis is alcohol; we sell it in "filling stations," along with gasoline, at prices lower than soft drinks with absolutely no control once the product leaves the retail outlet, and with no consistent effort to enforce the age limit.

According to the Harris and Gallup polls, one-third of American families acknowledge the disease of alcoholism, and the producers and sellers are asking for more. We mandate certain inoculations as a condition of education, but have no backbone to protect them from the disease they are most likely to contract: alcoholism or chemical dependency.

Reliable sources put our toll at 540,000 early terminations from alcohol and tobacco at a cost of \$200 billion each and every year.

The first step to recovery, as made available by Alcoholics Anonymous, says, "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol and that our lives had become unmanageable," and the costs that we ignore are certainly a manifestation of unmanageability.

The proposition put forth by the producers and sellers last year before the Joint Finance Committee on the 21-year-old law told us that if we eliminate four percent of the consumers (given a 50-year drinking history) the result would be a 30 percent drop in revenue. Just how many young people are using or just how accurate these figures are may be open to question, but if they are true, we are facing a lost generation.

Our children have no power base or any truly concerned group willing to go the last mile in the face of the present hysteria of mismanagement and inviolated policies. They have been an audience to the erosion of their rights and opportunities under the guise of economics, but they also see that certain "sacred cows" suffer little or no impact.

They engage in illegal use of legal and illegal substances, along with sexual activities that can be emotionally and physically destructive

while waiting for adult intervention that never comes. The adults cop out on "peer pressure" which, in reality, is the absence of parental pressure, and the bottom line is the young people feel that no one cares.

This coupled with the "high risk" group that comes from alcoholic backgrounds presents a severely depressing stage for young people and it does not attract the attention it deserves.

One bright spot is Jack Kenney's efforts to involve legislators as spokesmen and women in their communities as Legislators Against Drug (and alcohol) Abuse. This group deserves all the support available.

**Say no to state lottery**

From time to time someone from state tells us that Idaho needs a lottery. It is always being touted everywhere as a solution for money problems in state government. Recently the state of Louisiana has received much publicity as proponents there continue to push for a state lottery and casino gambling. Their illustrious governor, who has a soft place in his heart for gambling, is expected to push hard for the change this year. I was reading some information in a denomination's publication from Louisiana and think it is appropriate for Idahoans to consider when local politicians tell us we need a lottery.

The information relates to Missouri which is its second year of their state lottery. The first year Missouri spent in the gambling business generated zero revenue from the lottery. They expect the current year's total ticket sales to be \$39 million and none of those dollars will reach state coffers except through sales tax and income tax. Absolutely no revenue was realized in Missouri's first lottery year. Mike Morris says we are "after the 'show me' folks changed their constitution" that in other states it has taken total lottery ticket sales of \$800 million or more per year to provide the 19 percent in revenues needed to pay for the administrative costs of running a lottery.

Never mind that the lottery is based upon greed and a desire to get something for nothing and a very regressive form of revenue generation (meaning those who least can afford it spend the most on it) here are some figures that show that it just doesn't always generate revenue like the lottery industry would like us to think.

**Consider quality first**

It is refreshing to have a member of the Idaho Legislature, Rep. R. L. Davis of Rexburg, display common sense, show a bit of thinking, and ask reasonable questions before getting on the tax-raising wagon.

The most attention in the state budget is rightly on education. Three areas long overdue for serious investigation are: kindergarten, state Board of Education and athletics.

The true value of kindergarten can only be determined several grades later, possibly 5th or 6th grade, by identical tests — of both groups. School officials are afraid to test because they are afraid the results would be embarrassing. Child-care centers under the school system should reduce total grade school one year or three years high school. If a student hasn't learned to read, write and speak correctly in eight years, high school will show little improvement.

The state Board of Education in Boise, I suspect, is guilty of far too much "administration" such as rigidity of accreditation, and much more which should be left to the local board, pep and bunting as they are, but that can be eventually overcome. The quality of the product should be the overriding consideration.

Post-summit speeches urged

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Democratic Leader Robert C. Byrd proposed Thursday that President Reagan and Soviet Leader Mikhail Gorbachev address Congress after their summit meeting this year. But the White House said it was too early to make such plans.

In a speech to the Senate, Byrd suggested that Gorbachev be invited to address a joint session on the condition that Reagan speak the same day, and the Soviet Union agree to carry his speech on Soviet television during prime time. No Soviet leader has ever addressed Congress, Byrd noted. Byrd said he had raised the idea with Reagan, and the president was receptive.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes, however, said he had not heard anything about the idea until Byrd brought it up in his speech.

U.S. holds talks on S. Yemen

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reagan administration, after exhibiting little public interest in the fighting in Marxist-run South Yemen, disclosed Thursday it has held direct discussions with the Soviet Union about the civil war in the Middle East country.

State Department spokesman Bernard Kabib also said for the first time since fighting broke out in South Yemen on Jan. 13 that the outcome may have an impact on U.S. strategic interests.

On Thursday, Kabib said, "I think there have been discussions with the Soviet Union and I think it is the U.S. view there should be no such military intervention." He did not say where or when the subject was raised with the Soviets or what response was given.

Lugar set to lead delegation

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard Lugar, R-Ind., is ready to head an official delegation of American observers to the Philippines, despite a decision of a House election-preparations there, a source said Thursday.

Lugar, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, will announce Friday morning that he would agree to head the delegation, barring some unforeseen last-minute problem, said a congressional source who asked not to be identified.

Fidelio Castro, the acting foreign minister of the Philippines, will deliver a formal invitation to Reagan today from Marcos to send a delegation. The source said President Reagan will formally announce a delegation later in the day.

The White House has been urging Lugar and Rep. Dante Fascell, D-Fla., chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, to jointly chair a delegation of about 20 official observers to the Feb. 7 election.

Baker PAC put under limits

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Election Commission, in a strict interpretation of pre-presidential campaign spending rules, told former Sen. Howard Baker Thursday that federal limits apply to certain expenditures by his political action committee.

The law restricts Baker's multi-candidate committee, the Republican Majority Fund, from funding such things as state steering committees that would, among other things, urge a Baker candidacy and become an official campaign organization if he became a candidate; the FEC decision said.

But the steering committee would have to stop short of actual campaign activity or run the risk of triggering a Baker candidacy, which under federal law, occurs when \$5,000 is spent for a candidacy, the FEC said.

U.S. upbeat on exchanges

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Soviet Union and the United States moving quickly to begin a broad range of cultural exchanges, should have programs under way this year, Reagan administration officials said Thursday.

Charles Z. Wick, the head of the U.S. Information Agency, said he was optimistic about the future of the exchange program after his just concluded nine-day trip to the Soviet Union.

The exchange agreement was signed by President Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev Nov. 21 at the conclusion of the summit meeting in Geneva, Switzerland.

Tank truck touches off blast

JACKSONVILLE, Ill. (AP) — A fire in a propane tank truck touched off an explosion Thursday at a fuel storage yard, critically injuring the driver, and the yard's manager jumped into the blazing vehicle and drove away before it could ignite other tanks.

The 2,500-gallon tanker erupted in flames at the Empire Gas Co. shortly after noon MST. The fire spread quickly to a loading dock and several smaller tanks before it was contained two hours later. The sparsely populated area around the plant was evacuated for three hours.

McAuliffe set for launch

CAPT. CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Schoolteacher Christa McAuliffe arrived here Thursday for her week-long flight aboard the Challenger and said she hopes "everyone tunes in... to watch the teacher teaching from space."

She and her six crewmates, flew here from the astronaut training base in Houston, arriving a few hours after Challenger's countdown began for a flight that will mark the space shuttle's first use of a new launch pad.

The 25th shuttle mission is scheduled to start at 9:36 a.m. EST (7:36 a.m. MST) Sunday from pad 39B, a second launch facility that will give the program greater flexibility in a year-crammed-with-record 15 flights.

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House approves limit on check holding

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House passed a bill Thursday to limit the time banks can hold deposited checks and thus curtail what a chief spokesman called an "outrageous policy" that allows banks to profit from the so-called float.

The House measure, passed 282-11, would force financial institutions to give customers access to their money under a set timetable — in some cases quicker than they do now.

The legislation now goes to the Senate where it is likely to be held up until much later in the congressional session that opened this week.

Senate Banking Chairman Jake Garn, R-Utah, wants to include the House proposal in a larger package dealing with several facets of the financial industry.

House Banking Committee Chairman Fernand J. St Germain, D-R.I., chief proponent of the check hold bill, told his colleagues banks now play "the float" game with customers' money to earn billions of dollars through interest and fees on checks inadvertently bounced by depositors.

"Millions of hard-working Americans carry their paychecks down to the bank every week in anticipation that they can use the funds to buy groceries, pay the rent, buy clothes and other necessities," said St Germain.

"In all too many cases, depositors don't have access to the money they have earned. It is tied up by banking policies — check hold policies — that say the customer has to wait days, and days, and sometimes, weeks and weeks, before the bank says the money is available," he said.

Before giving final approval to the bill, the House passed by voice vote — after first defeating a similar proposal — an amendment that would permit bankers to hold a check longer than the timetable if they suspect the check may not clear because of fraud or bankruptcy.

Bankers would be given two days to notify the depositor if they refused to clear the check. St Germain opposed the so-called "good faith"

amendment, saying it would give bank tellers authority to reject withdrawals "if you are from the wrong side of the tracks, speak with a foreign accent or have a racialist bias."

"Anyway, he said, it is not needed because more than 99 percent of all checks written are paid the first time through the collection process and half the 350 million checks returned unpaid each year go through the second time.

Mike Caddell-Feagan, a staff attorney with the U.S. Public Interest Research Group, said he was disappointed by the weakening amendment, although he said the overall bill does represent a step forward for most consumers.

The banking industry has said in congressional hearings that the purpose of holding customer checks was not to reap interest or fees on the "float" created by those funds, but rather to protect them from check "kiters" and bad checks.

VA director said to be ready to resign

WASHINGTON (AP) — Harry N. Walters, head of the Veterans Administration for the last three years, plans to resign soon, government sources said Thursday.

Selective Service Director Thomas K. Turnage, 62, a retired Army general, was expected to be named as Walters' successor.

Walters, 49, a former West Point football star, told a reporter it would be inappropriate for him to comment, but added: "For the last six months to a year it's been no secret that I intended to step down as administrator of the VA. I'm looking to leave government. That's not a duty of a secret."

The report came from sources in government and close to the VA who spoke only on condition they not be identified.

A phone call to Turnage was transferred to his chief of staff, Col. Jim DeWiro, who said, "I can't make a comment."

He did add, however, that Selective Service employees "have heard the same rumor."

Rep. C.V. "Sonny" Montgomery, D-Miss., chairman of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, said he was informed by the White House that Turnage would be nominated for the post, a job which requires Senate confirmation. Montgomery said he discussed the new job with Turnage.

"He's an excellent choice," Montgomery said. "I've worked with him as director of Selective Service. He'll be a credit to the agency."

WASHINGTON (AP) — House Democrats indicated Thursday they will try to make President Reagan take his share of the heat this year in the struggle to reach a \$14 billion deficit target set by a new balanced-budget law.

As the budget-cutting parade begins, the president deserves to be the grand marshal, House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr., D-Mass., said Thursday. The speaker made his comments at the election-year jockeying began on the fiscal 1987 budget recommendations Reagan will submit to Congress Feb. 4.

Administration officials have indicated that the president's budget for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1 would contain about \$90 billion in cuts to meet the deficit target of the so-called Gramm-Rudman law. Those savings would be achieved through reducing or eliminating a

variety of government programs, imposing user fees for some government services or selling off some government assets.

Some in Congress say it may take up to \$80 billion in cuts to meet the target.

Legislators already have said that the president's intention to recommend such moves, while continuing his military buildup but refusing to back any tax increases, will get almost no support in Congress.

There also has been little enthusiasm for plans to sell off government assets such as the Tennessee Valley Authority to private interests.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said there have been no decisions on specific items the administration would seek to put on the auction block.

Asked how big a part of the new budget such

sales would be, Speakes said, "I can't rate it in any way, (but) it would be an important part."

On Capitol Hill, O'Neill said, "It's an admission that you're in pretty bad shape when you have to sell the garage to pay the mortgage."

Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole, R-Kan., said any plan to sell assets "depends on what the assets."

Meanwhile, in a challenge to Reagan, O'Neill said, "If he wants his budget program to carry off for year 1987, he needs to get out there and stump for it."

"He needs to explain the budget cuts and tell the American people why they are necessary," O'Neill added. "He needs to put his leadership on the line and tell his Republican supporters that these budget cuts are an essential part of the Reagan program."

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# Uncovered Memphis Belle may move

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — The Air Force is threatening to repossess the Memphis Belle, a famed World War II Flying Fortress that was once a movie star but is now in danger of turning into junk.

To be honest with you, if I was losing my job, I'd be jumping up and down because the Memphis Belle is sitting out in the weather," Col. Richard Uppstrom, director of the Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio, said Wednesday. "I'd come down there with my big helicopter and a hook and try to back up here."

The Boeing B-17 bomber, named for a pilot's Memphis girlfriend, has been exposed to the sun, rain and vandals for almost 40 years.

The Belle was the first American bomber to complete 25 missions over enemy territory in Europe in 1942 and 1943. Afterward, the Belle and its crew returned to the United States for a bond-selling tour.

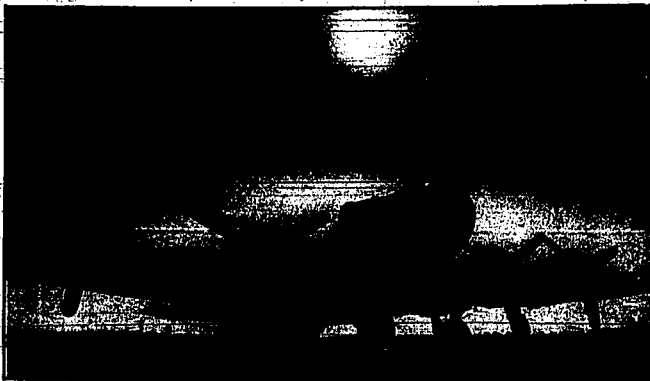
A wartime movie, "The Memphis Belle," depicted the bomber's missions over Germany and occupied France.

The B-17 was brought to Memphis as a war memorial in 1946. For more than 25 years, it sat on a concrete pedestal in front of a National Guard armory where it was virtually stippled by vandals.

In 1978, the Belle was moved to Albert International Airport. The Memphis Belle Memorial Association began restoring the plane with the help of the Tennessee Air National Guard and vocational school students.

The Belle's restoration is 90 percent complete, but attempts to raise \$110,000 to build a shelter for the plane have been unsuccessful.

The Air Force retains ownership of

the plane, according to Uppstrom.

The colonel has given the association until the first week in March to show progress on the building. Otherwise, the Air Force will take it back.

"The place for the Belle is in Memphis," Uppstrom said. "But if the people of Memphis aren't interested in it, then we have an obligation to it. This is only one of two B-17s with a combat record that are still around."

Association Chairman John Emerson

said he hopes to meet with potential donors within the next few weeks. He said he already has promises of donated labor and concrete, but the group will have to purchase structural steel and other materials.

"Maybe Col. Uppstrom's letter will get some people interested," Emerson said.

The association hopes the Belle will eventually be the focal point for a museum, said Emerson.

"That plane exemplifies a lot of people who gave their lives for this country," he said. "It would be a shame to let it rot away."

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## Witch doctors try to cure naturalist

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) — Amazon witch doctors performed rituals over a noted Brazilian naturalist Thursday, trying to cure him of a fatal liver disease he attributes to touching a poisonous toad 10 years ago.

They walked around Augusto Ruschi's bed for an hour, blowing cigar smoke toward him and making voodoo-like passes with their hands over his stomach, his friend Rogério Medeiros said in a telephone interview.

He said they also planned to use a jungle root called atorokon, but when or how was not clear.

One of the Indian witch doctors, Chief Raoni of the Tukukarrame tribe, told President Jose Sarney earlier that, by touching the poisonous animal, "Ruschi has become a toad himself." He had asked Sarney's permission to intervene.

Raoni, who like many chiefs wears an ornamental wooden disk that extends his lower lip, told the president he had a dream in which he saw Ruschi struggling to stay afloat in a lagoon full of toads. He added, however, "That could be a good sign. He can still escape from the lagoon and live on land as a normal person."

Ruschi, 70, is a defender of Brazilian wildlife and has catalogued 90 percent of this country's known species of birds and plants. He featured in a recent newspaper interview: "When I die I want hummingbirds to carry me to God's kingdom."

He lay on a bed in his father-in-law's apartment Thursday as Raoni

and Sapaim, another witch doctor from the tribe, moved over him for an hour, rested and then started again, Medeiros said. Journalists were not allowed into the apartment.

The naturalist said the inadvertent contact with the jungle toad caused his liver gradually to cease functioning, and doctors had told him death was imminent.

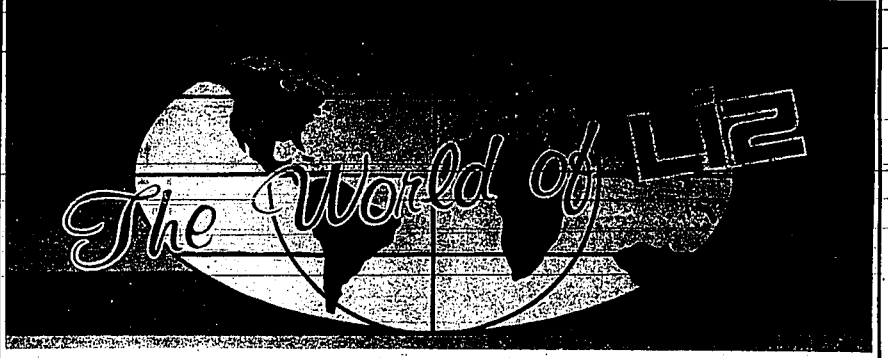
Medeiros said Thursday: "Professor Ruschi's liver is 95 percent affected. Cure by traditional method has been abandoned. The professor feels the millennia-old knowledge of the Indians might save him."

The witch doctors will continue their ritual until Saturday in the Rio apartment and then, if necessary, for several more days or weeks at Ruschi's home in Espirito Santo state, 300 miles northeast of here, Medeiros said.

Chief Raoni heard of Ruschi's ailment and on Tuesday sought out President Sarney in Brasilia, the nation's inland capital, to volunteer his and Sapaim's services in trying to save the naturalist. The approximately 4,000 Tukukarrame live in the state of Mato Grosso, about 1,400 miles northwest of Rio.

The government flew the two witch doctors to Rio on Wednesday. Ruschi grew up in largely rural Espirito Santo and has spent most of his life in Brazil's remote areas. He said he was aware that the toad was a poisonous species known as dendrobata and he was "careless in getting too close to it."

He said he has suffered pain, nausea, hemorrhages and weakness ever since.



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## Soviet threats aside, ABC plans miniseries

NEW YORK (AP) — "Amerika," ABC's controversial miniseries that had its production start delayed in the wake of budget considerations and criticism from the Soviet Union, will begin shooting after all, ABC announced Wednesday.

Brandon Stoddard, president of ABC Entertainment, said in a statement that the "decision to produce 'Amerika' was an easy one. 'Amerika' is a powerful program about freedom and responsibility and the American character." He said, despite the delay, ABC never stopped believing in the program's concept.

The script for the 12-hour miniseries has been approved, production will start in two months and the film is scheduled to be broadcast in the spring of 1987, ABC said.

"Good for them," said Secretary of Education William Bennett, who had criticized the production's delay and had called for a boycott of ABC.

Whatever the reason for the delay, I think every American will be pleased that ABC is making its own decision.

The film, which will dramatize life in the Soviet Union 10 years after a bipolar Soviet takeover, had become a political football in recent months. The Soviets protested ABC's taking the production to the U.S. news staffer in Moscow, insisting that ABC's news operations in the Soviet Union might be jeopardized if ABC Entertainment

went ahead with the project.

Then two weeks ago, Stoddard said ABC had postponed the start of production because of the project's serious financial problems, but added that the Soviet objections would play a role in the final decision on "Amerika." Stoddard said he was aware of budget problems on the project in November, before learning of Soviet complaints over the film's deceptions.

On Wednesday, in a statement that seemed to obliquely refer to the controversy, ABC said the project would get under way. John B. Sias, president of ABC Television, said the decision was made by ABC's entertainment division, "supported by top management and with the full understanding of what pressures this decision might bring to other areas of our company."

One area apparently was news, which had relayed the Soviet complaints to entertainment executives, causing the impression to some that ABC News was putting pressure on the entertainment division. David Burke, an ABC News vice president, said last week that the news division was merely acting as a messenger, but in the future, would not get involved and, instead, would instruct Soviet officials to go through the appropriate diplomatic channels.

Burke did not return phone calls from The Associated Press Wednesday. But last week, he said ABC News had no position on "Amerika." "We can live with whatever they do on 'Amerika,'" he said.

# Marcos blasts questions of war record

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — President Ferdinand E. Marcos said Thursday he will ignore the "crazy individuals" who question the war record on which he built his political career.

He made the comment in a campaign speech to a crowd that included many World War II veterans, after The New York Times published an article citing U.S. Army investigations that found his claims of leading guerrillas against the Japanese to be "fraudulent."

In its Thursday editions, the Times cited 400 pages of Army reports on Marcos' military career. The reports said "Ang Mag Maharlika, the guerrilla group he says he led, never existed as a fighting organization and was not controlled adequately because of the desertion of its commanding officer" — Marcos.

The president, now 68 years old, is said here to have won 28, 32 or 33 medals, depending on the Philippine government report accepted. He is described here as the most decorated soldier of the war and claims more honors than Gen. Douglas MacArthur, who directed the Allied war in the Pacific.

His war record is so important to Marcos that he talks about it in nearly every interview and speech, and in 1982 closed down a newspaper that printed articles challenging it.

He says he suffered five war wounds and tells war stories in his campaign speeches for the Feb. 7 election, in which he is opposed by Corazon Aquino, widow of assassinated opposition leader Benigno Aquino.

A Filipino editor, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said Thursday: "It is his most sensitive issue, the one that really hurts him as a man."

Marcos blamed his opponents for The New York Times article. "Those who collaborated with the enemy have no right to question the role of the country's guerrillas during the war," he said.

After his usual reference to the five wounds, he told the campaign crowd: "My opponents now say that Marcos is not a genuine guerrilla. That he did not really fight."

"I don't know where they get such foolishness. You who ones fought under me, you be the ones to answer these crazy individuals, especially the foreign press."

He said he will ignore his detractors because "they are all going crazy."

Journalist Bonifacio Gilgado wrote in the *We Forum* series that led to its closure that Marcos got all but six of his medals well after the war. "I while he was a powerful senator preparing to run for the presidency and one in 1972 as president."

Gilgado quoted several former Filipino military officers as denying that Marcos performed heroic deeds or was wounded.

## 38 perish in fire at Indian hotel

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Jane Rosser opened her hotel room door, choked in the smoky, unlit hallway, then closed the door shut and thought about survival.

"I told myself that if I didn't act, I would be dead in three minutes from the smoke," said Miss Rosser, a native of Newton, Mass., who works for the U.S. relief agency CARE in Bangkok, Thailand.

The American woman was among the fortunate to escape the fire early Thursday at the Siddharth Continental Hotel that left at least 38 people dead, including an unidentified American and two diplomats — one from West Germany and another from Argentina.

Thirty-eight others were injured, including an American identified only as Richard Arnold and CARE worker Christopher Roessel, 47, of Alexandria, Va., who was hospitalized in serious condition for smoke inhalation.

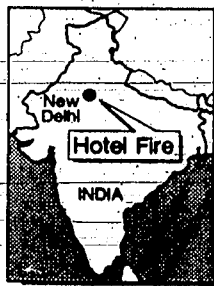
Miss Rosser was one of eight Americans known to be staying at the hotel, which is located near the airport. The U.S. Embassy said six of the eight Americans worked for CARE. The embassy said it had no further information.

Like most guests who were interviewed, Miss Rosser said she never heard a fire alarm. She also complained about a power blackout in the five-star hotel and slow and chaotic rescue operations.

She said she woke up at 2:05 a.m., about 20 minutes after hotel officials said the fire started on the ground floor. She said she smelled smoke, and opened her door but couldn't see inches in front of her face. She dressed hurriedly but then all the hotel lights went out, she said.

She said she tried to open her window, but it was jammed. She tried to smash it open with a chair, but without success.

"I opened the door and screamed, 'Help! Where's the stair?'"



## Aquino calls Marcos 'liar'

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Opposition candidate Corazon Aquino told a cheering crowd at Manila's top government-owned hotel Thursday that President Ferdinand E. Marcos was a chronic liar, a dying dictator and an overgrown child.

"May the better woman win," Mrs. Aquino said in her sharpest political attack yet on Marcos. The presidential campaign, where the two candidates have heated up considerably in recent days, is in its final two weeks before the Feb. 7 election.

In the same Manila Hotel ballroom where Marcos' ruling party nominated him at a lavish convention a month ago and which is frequented by Cabinet ministers, about 1,500 Philippine business and civic leaders gave Mrs. Aquino three standing ovations and chanted her name like campaign partisans.

## U.S. Mideast envoy, Israeli leader confer

LONDON (AP) — U.S. Mideast envoy Richard Murphy met Thursday with Prime Minister Shimon Peres of Israel and was expected to wrap up a round of shuttle diplomacy that has stirred some interest in the Arab world about arranging a Mideast peace conference.

An Israeli official who spoke on condition of anonymity said Murphy and Peres conferred for 45 minutes and planned a fourth session that was expected to be the last in the current round of talks.

An indirect dialogue between Peres and Jordan's King Hussein has been under way for a week via both Murphy and Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.

Mrs. Thatcher announced Thursday that she would visit Israel before the end of the summer. She would be the first British prime minister to visit the Jewish state.

Chadli Klibi, secretary-general of the Arab League, signaled that the 21-nation group was interested in a Mideast peace conference, which Peres agreed to in a policy speech Wednesday.

But Klibi criticized what he said was American bias against the Palestinians and called for a clearer definition of what Israel and the United States had in mind.

"We, the member states of the Arab League, really think that it is desirable that an international conference be held to open a peace process in the Middle East," Klibi said in the Hague, the Dutch seat of government where Peres began his current three-nation European tour.

"The essential element thing is to find out what each of us considers a peace process," he added.

Yasser Arafat's mainstream faction of the Palestine Liberation Organization, in a statement distributed in London, rejected the U.S.-Israeli initiative, saying: "We must remind the world that peace and negotiation over the bodies of the victims of aggression is both unobtainable and undesirable."

No details have been disclosed of the substance of the Murphy-Peres talks.

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## Tribal violence breaks out

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Bantu and Zulu tribesmen fought each other with home-made guns, spears and clubs Thursday in rural Natal province, killing at least 30 people and wounding 30, police said.

Up to 500 people were arrested. The tribal violence was the latest outbreak in a long-term feud over land rights that has resulted in more than 100 deaths since November.

Many attacks were burned down by fleeing residents who preferred to destroy their homes than leave them to be confiscated or destroyed, residents and reporters who visited the scene said.

A police spokesman in Durban, who spoke on condition he not be identified, said Thursday night that the death toll, earlier put at 16, had risen to 30.

# Female police chief has rocky term

PORTLAND, Ore. — In the year since she took over as the first woman chief of a big-city police department, Penny Harrington has weathered "one crisis after another" from budget cuts to a death in police custody, but she says she is confident about mixed reviews of her performance.

"I wouldn't change my decisions," she made said the 44-year-old chief who was promoted to the post last Jan. 24 after 22 years on the Portland force.

There have been high points during the year: a move of her life in the works, and the woman who filed more than 40 complaints of sex discrimination during her police career was

named one of Ms. magazine's "Women of the Year."

But mostly she's dealt with problems.

"It was really one crisis after another for Penny," said Mayor Bud Clark. "That she handled each crisis without creating another crisis testifies to her abilities."

The mayor describes her performance as "wonderful," but the head of the police union characterizes it as "lousy."

Sam Peters, president of the Portland Police Association and the chief's most vocal critic, said Harrington has created a crisis of confidence.

"When she first started I was one of the guys who cheered the loudest," Peters said. "Now morale has gotten so bad I don't know if it can be turned around."

Peters said that when about 480 officers were

polled about Harrington's performance, 90 percent responded negatively.

The chief admits morale has suffered, but says it's because her administration often was preoccupied with crisis management and community relations while trying to find new ways to handle internal problems.

"We didn't have time to build our organization and our credibility before we were hit right in the face with problems we didn't ask for," Harrington said. "And we kept on getting hit."

The union president said the problem is that Harrington hasn't demonstrated that she backs her officers.

A sore point between the chief and her officers is her early decision to eliminate the divisions dealing with intelligence, drugs and vice.

# Surgery helps correct birth defect

SEATTLE (AP) — At age 18, Stephen Bounds, who recently moved north from California, figures he has undergone surgery 25 to 30 times.

Amanda Curtis of Sedro Woolley has had nearly that many operations. She is 4 years old.

Both have Apert Syndrome, a genetic defect that causes severe deformation of the bones in the hands, feet and skull.

Dr. Sterling Claren, director of the orthopedic program at the division of congenital defects at Children's Orthopedic Hospital, said the condition occurs about once in every 25,000 births. The division, also known as the birth-defects center, is studying nine people with the condition in the Pacific Northwest and knows of six others, Claren said.

"It's a genetic problem that leads to a biochemical one in the formation of specific bones in the body — the small bones in the hands and feet, the shoulder blades and the bones in the skull that separate the face from the brain," he said.

"Everything else happens because of the malformation of those bones."

The syndrome is caused by a spontaneous mutation that occurs at the time of conception but does not express itself until later in the embryo's development, Claren said.

Bounds' mother, Debra Williams, said that after his birth, doctors did not hold out much hope for his survival. He was first diagnosed as

hydrocephalic, blind, deaf and retarded.

But surgery has since been able to help. Bounds had a craniotomy to remove a portion of the skull and relieve pressure on his brain, Williams said.

Apert Syndrome babies are born with no soft spot on their skull because the skull plates are fused and with bones of the hands and feet fused.

"But he and his brother, Harry, to the disappointment of their mother, decided there still was something special about the annual golf outing and that they wanted to remain part of it. They will serve as cohosts of the first AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, beginning next Thursday, the tournament which they believe will carry on the Crosby tradition.

## Cowboy poet ropes words

ROGERSON — If your conception of a poet is one of a wan fellow with pencil-neck and limp wrist who hums mantras six hours a day, then you haven't met Rogerson's Owen Barton.

A tall, rangy cowboy who still rides tall in the saddle across his Diamond A spread, Barton's robust physique and wind-tanned complexion belie his 71 years. He breathes, thinks and talks of things—cowboys—but more importantly to posterity, Barton is a recorder of cowboy ways. And his pen has earned him a fine reputation with folklorists who chose him as a participant in the first Cowboy Poetry Gathering held last year in Elko, Nev.

The gathering was a hit, reaching a national recognition with stories appearing in major publications such as People magazine, and assuring that a second gathering would be held this year. And again this year, Barton has been chosen to share his poetry with cowboys from 11 states as well as a public that appears to hunger for this truly American art form.

Barton's roots grow deep in America's West. His grandfather set out across the plains to Utah in the mid-1800s and his father pioneered a ranch near Carey. Barton himself, as a young man with his wife, Irene, scratched out his own outfit in the Little Wood River basin before trekking to the Nevada-Idaho line to build

the Diamond A into an efficient cattle operation.

What makes this cowboy different from most is his ability to round up words into tight units, like calves in a corral. In his book, "Saddle Talk," Barton brings to light his own life, often tongue-in-cheek, but always in poetry rich and dynamic.

Through it all, the cowboy is still the cowboy, self-effacing and wondering what all the to-do is about. "I don't know how they got my name," Barton says when relating how he was picked by the steering committee for the first cowboy poetry gathering.

The poet remembers that a couple years ago he was approached on his ranch by Gary Stanton of the Institute of the American West. "He wanted to hear my poetry," Barton says, "so I recited some old classics." Stanton didn't want that, though, he wanted to inspect poetry composed by Barton himself.

Of cowboys writing poetry, Barton sees nothing out of place. To the contrary, he remembers tender, he was surprised at the way sheepherders could put words together. "When I was a kid there used to be a lot of those old guys who'd recite poetry," he says.

That stayed with him, and years later manifested itself during his long separations from his family when he was tending his cattle at a time when his wife was maintaining their other

## Rock and Roll Hall of Fame inducts 1st stars

Major recording firms join in project

NEW YORK (AP) — Elvis Presley, Chuck Berry and Buddy Holly were among the stars chosen for induction to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in its inaugural ceremonies Thursday. Also named were James Brown, Ray Charles, Sam Cooke, Pats Domino, the Everly Brothers, Jerry Lee Lewis and Little Richard.

At press time, more than 1,000 people were expected to attend a dinner ceremony at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel to inaugurate the Hall of Fame. Three of rock's "fathers," Mississippi Delta blues singer Robert Johnson, country and western singer Jimmie Rodgers, and blues pianist Jimmy Yancey were also to be inducted.

Two non-performers who played key roles in the birth of rock 'n' roll join the list: Sun Records founder Sam Phillips and broadcaster Alan Freed. Producer and talent scout Ahmet Ertegun was to receive a special lifetime achievement award.

The Hall of Fame, conceived by Atlantic Records Chairman Ahmet Ertegun, has yet to find a permanent home. Cities under

consideration include Chicago, Cleveland, Memphis, New Orleans, Philadelphia, New York and San Francisco.

Plans call for an annual ceremony with the Hall of Fame foundation's board nominating artists and winning the choice to each year.

To be inducted, a performer, whether alive or dead, must have been actively involved in music for at least 25 years.

The foundation plans to set up a permanent museum and archives with records, tapes, books, films, videos and other memorabilia open to researchers and fans.

Executives from Atlantic Records, Warner Brothers Records, CBS Records Group, RCA Records, EMI/Capitol, MCA, Polygram, Arista, A&M, Elektra, Asylum, Sire, Geffen and other labels are serving on the hall's board, along with representatives of Rolling Stone Magazine, MTV Network and Bill Graham Productions, said spokesman Bob Altshuler.

Ertegun said this is the first time major recording companies have joined in a project of this type.

## Live Aid concerts net \$82 million — audit

HOLLYWOOD — The international telecast of Live Aid rock concerts from Philadelphia and London last July 13 raised more than \$82 million for African famine victims, concert organizers reported Wednesday.

Including revenue from all of the Live Aid efforts orchestrated by British pop star Bob Geldof during 1985's first eight months, as well as the proceeds from a song recorded by the all-star band Band Aid, the total generated for African relief was reported to be \$82,127,000.

Besides the \$50,500,000 in telephoned pledges from the American and British rock fans who watched the all-day, all-star concerts on television, Live Aid broadcast rights, ticket sales and other revenue traceable directly to the July 13 events yielded \$14 million more.

The audit also included royalties from the sale of Band Aid's original

anti-famine anthem, "Do They Know It's Christmas?" That recording, alone, released in the United States

by Polygram, raised \$9,166,000, according to the audit, which was conducted by the accounting firms of Laventhol & Horwath in the United States and Sloy Hayward in Britain.

Rock fans who watched the July 13 telecast in 21 nations other than the United States and Britain were responsible for donating an additional \$17.4 million. The accounting results indicated that Geldof and his Band Aid Trust will ultimately be responsible for raising more than \$100 million last year, once an audit of the entire year's efforts are complete.

The audit of contributions and other income released Wednesday in London is only for income that the Band Aid Trust and its American counterpart, the Live Aid Foundation, received as of Aug. 31.

Since then, several other fund-raising spinoffs of the Live Aid concerts have raised even more.

# Warner dissects myths of female form

NEW YORK — Marina Warner loves the idea of a "strong" woman. Not the successful, female-athlete or Olympic athlete, but the armored Amazon.

"My son knows that I love them, and he's always pointing them out to me. He'll say, 'Mummy look, there's another one.' You know, some sort of woman flying through the air with wings on her feet," she said.

She laughs at herself for succumbing so easily to the seductive myths—she deftly dissects in her new book, "Monuments and Maidens: The Allegory of the Female Form" (Atheneum, \$25).

"On to the female body have been projected the fantasies and terrors and terrors of generations of men and through them of women, in order to conjure them into reality or exorcise them into oblivion," she writes.

more invisible it is, the more likely it is to be affecting you without your being able to control it."

The book continues her work on feminine mythology which began in 1976 with "Alone of All Her Sex: The Myth and Cult of the Virgin Mary" and continued in 1981 with "Joan of Arc: The Image of Female Heroism."

Throughout history, Warner said, women have represented the ideal "either... symbolizing wisdom or virtue, for instance... and have been ignored as individuals. Woman thus can be an emblem of liberty in a society where they have little freedom."

"Of course this is to some extent a social perception of the role of women and not an actual reality, because, of course, women always have had influence and some form of authority. It is just that they are not perceived to have it," she said.

"What is missing so much in female imagery is the voice of the subject."

Symbols are slippery and infinitely adaptable in Warner's exhaustive catalog, it seems that women have symbolized everything at one time or another.

The nude, for example, may symbolize purity or lust, witness or submission. A female vanquishing a male in medieval art may yet be a figure of weakness, drawing its power not from gender, but from

faith or virtue.

Born in 1946 in London, Warner lived in Egypt and Belgium before her father settled in Cambridge as proprietor of a bookshop. She earned a master of arts degree in modern languages from Oxford University, has published two novels and now lives in London with her husband, the painter John Dewe Mathews.

Warner says she became acutely conscious of how symbols affected her son Conrad, who is now 8.

"I used to try to sort of weed out his reading, but it's not a task you can perform. By that age it's coming from so many different directions that you simply can't control it," she said.

"I'm not at all a good mother from the point of view of not making him a sexist male. I have lots and lots of friends in the same position, and we are all failures in that regard."

Recalling a party where Conrad and his pals frisked and whooped like puppies while girls their age stared in grim contempt, Warner said there is no denying that men and women are different. But they are not, she hopes, inevitably "other" imply can't talk about men and women in those blanket terms," she said, although she laments that both men and women do.

"To know that you have managed to make a friend of a man who does not fear you — this is not a widespread phenomenon," she said.

# Iacocca book sets print record

NEW YORK (AP) — Chrysler Corp. Chairman Lee Iacocca's autobiography set a publishing record for general interest non-fiction books Thursday, with 2,610,000 copies in print, Bantam Books said.

The figure tops by 1,000 the previous record holder, "The Power of Positive Thinking" written by Norman Vincent Peale in 1952, said Bantam spokesman Stuart Applebaum.

The hardcover edition of "Iacocca: An Autobiography" entered its 51st printing this week, 15 months after it went on sale, Applebaum said.

Only two hardcover books have been more successful: "Gone With the Wind" by Margaret Mitchell, with 6,015,000 copies printed since 1936, and "Jonathan Livingston Seagull" by Richard Bach, with 4,107,500 copies since 1970, Applebaum said.

"I never thought the day would come when they'd be comparing me to Rhett Butler," Iacocca said in Bantam's statement.

Books like "The Bible," dictionaries and cookbooks have sold more copies, but Applebaum said they are listed as reference publications.

The sales figure for Iacocca's book represents distribution through booksellers in the United States and Canada since Oct. 15, 1984, and is exclusive of sales of book club, foreign and translation editions, Applebaum said.

# Would-be author seeks to prove McCoy was D.B. Cooper

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A would-be author has filed a Freedom of Information complaint seeking to obtain documents he hopes will prove that a Utah man convicted of hijacking the female body was the infamous D.B. Cooper.

Bernie D. Rhodes has asked the U.S. District Court to order the FBI to turn over records of Richard Floyd McCoy Jr., a convicted hijacker who was commanding a United Airlines flight near Grand Junction, Colo., by claiming he had a handgun and grenade. He forced the plane to land in San Francisco, where he received a \$500,000 ransom. McCoy was later arrested in Provo.

McCoy, a Mormon Sunday school teacher, was sentenced to 45 years

but escaped in August, 1984 from the federal prison in Lewisburg, Pa. He was killed in a shoot-out with FBI agents in Virginia on Nov. 9, 1974.

Rhodes was the chief federal probation officer in Utah at the time of McCoy's hijacking and prepared a presentence report on him. Rhodes

said he concluded that McCoy and D.B. Cooper, the fictitious name used by the man who hijacked a jetliner near Portland, Ore., and parachuted out of the plane with \$200,000 in ransom.

Cooper disappeared, but \$5,800 of the cash was found on a Columbia

river beach in southwestern Washington in February 1980.

The FBI has also discounted claims two weeks ago by Utah State Prison inmate David Westmoreland to be Cooper, saying its investigation had concluded the story was a fabrication.

# Montana publishers in cahoots

HELENA, Mont. (AP) — The shelves of your local bookstore may portray a fierce competition among those who publish books in Montana, but local publishers tend to collude rather than compete.

"In a little state like this, you can't be hitting each other over the head," says Ron Graetz, publisher of Montana Magazine and numerous books on the state.

Graetz has published the highly successful "Montana Geographic Series," which includes 10 titles in print and perhaps a few more to come. Yet one of Graetz's competitors in the Montana book market — Falcon Press owner Bill Schneider — wrote the Geographic Series book on the Yellowstone River.

There is plenty of cooperation between Montana publishers, Schneider says.

"We sell books for other Montana publishers and vice versa," says Schneider, whose firm distributes books, including Graetz's Geographic Series.

Falcon Press also has used Montana Magazine's facilities for setting ads and typesetting, while Montana Magazine has had occasion to use Falcon's equipment.

Graetz says he also will consult with Schneider. For example, while Falcon Press markets wall calendars with scenes of Montana, Graetz sells desk calendars.

Even with duplication—the Montana book market might flourish anyway, some writers say.

"Montanans have a voracious appetite for books about Montana," says Steve Woodruff, a reporter for the Missoulian who wrote a book with photographer Carl Davez on Montana's wilderness areas.

Woodruff says the Geographic Series and other guide books were well-established long before he and Davez began their book, but he did not fear a market glut.

Schneider also says there is more books per capita about Montana than one can find in any other state he's seen.

"I'm also ready to do a love scene," he continued. "I'm always divorced. Or at the service. Or married to the job. That's the kind of roles they like to cast me in."

Before "Iron Eagle," "Enemy Mine" was scarred by the critics. Gossett said he was not surprised, though he is proud of the work he did in the film.

"I didn't think it should have been clobbered as bad as it was," he said. "But, I kind of understand why that happened: It ("Enemy Mine") was kind of like two films. One was the relationship between the two characters (his and the Earthman, played by Dennis Quaid). The second evolved around the violence in the film.

"The problem was the director was stuck with the script, which was based on the story. I think the criticism was right in the sense that the violence wasn't necessary. The interesting part of the film is the relationship between the two characters."

In one sense, "Enemy Mine" presented Gossett with his most challenging role ever.

# Stage bubbly goes flat in film 'A Chorus Line'

TWIN FALLS — Following are capsule reviews of movies currently playing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the National Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

**A CHORUS LINE (PG-13)** — The film of the musical is here at last, and on his trip has gone on champagne to Champagne. In this stately and fairly lavish representation, directed by Richard Attenborough, what makes "Chorus Line" so material really is. If you were one of that legion who saw "Chorus Line" more than once in the theater, the film is enough to make you doubt your judgment.

**THE JEWEL OF THE NILE (PG)** — This sequel to last year's marvelously tongue-in-cheek adventure comedy "Romancing the Stone" has twice the action, twice the spectacle — and half the buoyancy and wit. The stars are back — Kathleen Turner as the fetchingly feisty paperback novelist, Michael Douglas as the handsome, philandering Jones. Danny DeVito as an Arizona Park Caliban. The movie's biggest lack may be the humanizing hand of "Stone's" late writer, Diane Thomas. Its biggest problem may be too many explosions, plane crashes and rampaging camels.

**OUT OF AFRICA (PG)** — Because we are in a well-defined, faintly magical, perfectly appointed past when a level of intelligence is prized in this film, what is its problem? Casting, mostly, and a sense of

place: Meryl Streep, as Isak Dinesen, may convince us utterly that she is in love with Africa, but our views of it are a little too stately and unreal to feel the place. And Robert Redford's Denis Finch Hutton is a stereotypical film flip-flops at the best. Streep can pretty nearly do anything in the film — except that she cannot provide all the heat in a love affair when Redford is not

giving much to his role. **ROCKY IV (PG)**: Elephantine vacuousness is the shape of the new "Rocky," which is bigger, squishier, slower, more preposterous and infinitely emptier than the earlier three. Only Baryshnikov's yearning dance of freedom and slavery, to a song by Russian dissident poet Vysnysky, is worthy of his talents.

**'Iron Eagle' debuts at top**  
HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "Iron Eagle," another in a series of military-theme movies about maverick Americans beating the odds, grossed \$8.1 million to take first place at the box office on its debut weekend.  
"The Color Purple," riding a wave of critical and word-of-mouth acclaim, jumped to second place in its fifth week of release, grossing \$5.7 million for a per-screen box office increase. The Warner Bros. release boasted a per-screen average of \$10.27. Last week it was No. 5.  
"Iron Eagle" stars Louis Gossett Jr. and Jason Gedrick in a tale about a retired fighter pilot and the son of a captured Air Force pilot who take matters—and a couple of F-16s—into their own hands to save the youth's father. "Iron Eagle" had a per-screen average of \$5.65.  
"Out of Africa" fell from first to third place on a gross of \$5.2 million, pushing "Jewel of the Nile" down one notch to fourth with a gross of \$4 million.  
"Rocky IV" slid from No. 2 to No. 5 with a gross of \$3.8 million while "A Nightmare on Elm Street 2: Freddy's Revenge" rose to sixth with \$3.3 million.  
"Spies Like Us" fell 20 percent from its previous week for the No. 7 spot with a weekend gross of \$2.9 million. Eighth place was taken by "Runaway Train," with the Cannon Films release grossing \$2.6 million.  
"Troll" began at No. 9 with \$2.5 million, while Disney's holiday release of "101 Dalmatians" rounded out the top 10 with \$1.8 million.

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# Redford cited for film contributions

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Actor Robert Redford was honored by Utah's top executive last Friday for his "significant contribution to the development of the film industry and the arts" in Utah.

Saying he was "delighted that Robert has chosen Utah as his home," Gov. Norm Bangerter presented the 47-year-old actor with a plaque lauding Redford for his "personal efforts and the programs of the Sundance Institute."

Redford established the institute, headquartered in Salt Lake City with other facilities at his Sundance ski resort in Provo Canyon, as an arts and production center for new filmmakers.

The institute and Utah Film Development Office are sponsoring the 1986 United States Film Festival, which opened Friday night.

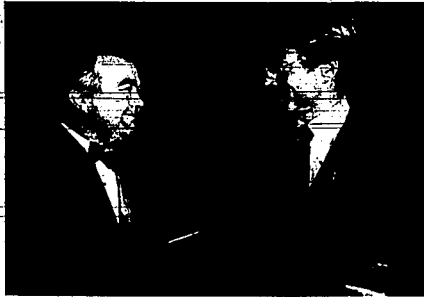
"My commitment to Utah goes back about 20 years," the actor told guests and members of the arts community at a black-tie reception at the governor's mansion.

# Conga propels Miami group to fame

HOLLYWOOD — The Miami Sound Machine has nothing to do with the TV show "Miami Vice." This red-hot pop-Latin band has never even been on the show, though lead singer Gloria Estefan hinted that she wouldn't turn down an invitation.

Also, the Sound Machine's big hit, "Conga," is not as many apparently assume, on the smash-hit "Miami Vice" soundtrack album. Still, people associate this band with "Miami Vice" all the time. The title is largely to blame. It really does sound like something concocted to capitalize on the fame of the "Miami Vice."

Estefan, 28, acknowledged that the erroneous association with "Miami Vice" has probably been a boost. "I'm not going to knock it," said Estefan, a Cuban who was raised in Miami. "Whatever helps get recognition and airplay is welcome. But we haven't played up the association. People do it naturally."

The Miami Sound Machine doesn't deserve the copycat tag. It was around long before the hip cop show. And this was no obscure Miami band either.

For the last four years, Miami Sound Machine has been enormously successful throughout Central and South America, performing in

Spanish. In some countries, the band plays to 30,000 to 40,000 people in stadiums. It's a favorite in Miami too. The band is so popular there that the mayor named a street after it — Miami Sound Machine Boulevard.

But in the United States outside Miami, the Sound Machine was unknown to the pop-music masses. Only American Hispanics who are familiar with the Latin market are familiar with the band.

But "Conga" has changed all that. "We now have a new career," she said. "We're on tour. We're going to try to make it in the mainstream pop market. We never tried it before because we were concentrating so much on the Latin countries. Our chances of making it here didn't seem to be very good. It seemed like

the American pop stations didn't want to play Latin pop. 'Conga' was a break that came out of nowhere."

Estefan is a bubbly, talkative brunette who, strangely, claimed to be painfully shy.

"Don't laugh. I really am shy," she said, seeming about as shy as Don Rickles. "I'm only talking so much because this is an interview. Otherwise, I'd shut up."

She speculated that her efforts to overcome shyness may have driven her into a show business career.

# Indoor Super Bowls are marked by a host of colorful grid records

The temperature won't be a factor. And neither will the wind. The sun shouldn't come into play, nor should the humidity, footing or even crowd noise.

Atmospheric elements will be controlled, regulated and modulated with the utmost sobriety on Sunday, in the New Orleans Superdome, where the Super Bowl brings its party indoors for the fourth time in 20 years.

Insane weather is now strictly reserved for conference championship bouts. Remember Riverfront Stadium in 1982, wind-chilled to 50 below? In those arctic conditions, the Cincinnati Bengals thrived like gnats while the hot-blooded San Diego Charger offense sputtered like a Ferrari starving for dry gas.

As for the Bengals, they were awarded a trip to frigid Michigan's Pontiac Silverdome, where in the third and most recent Dome Bowl they fell to the San Francisco 49ers, 24-21. **NEW INNKEEPER:** Actor Tony Curtis fell in love with Madras, India, when he was there recently to do the movie "The Last of Philip Banter." He's decided to buy the old Turkish embassy on the outskirts of the city and turn it into a hotel, keeping a large apartment for himself.

**Q. Is there any truth to the rumor that Irene Dunne had affairs with many of her Hollywood leading men, including Cary Grant? — I.P.**

A. I can't imagine what you're talking about. Dunne, who turned 81 on Dec. 20 and was honored about then by the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, had a relatively short movie career, lasting from 1930 until her early retirement in 1952. She did, however, receive five Oscar nominations in that time. Dunne married Dr. Francis Griffin, a New York dentist, in 1928, and the marriage lasted until his death in 1965. At no time was she ever once romantically linked to any other male, film star or otherwise. Irene did co-star opposite Grant in "My Favorite Wife," but the two were never lovers.

**Q. An obituary of Sam Spiegel, the producer of such great films as "Bridge over the River Kwai" and "Lawrence of Arabia," claims that he earlier produced pictures under the name S.P. Eagle and after the success of "On the Waterfront," he resumed his rightful name. Is that the way it happened? — R.W.**

A. Not exactly. Elia Kazan, director of the legendary "On the Waterfront," induced Spiegel to drop S.P. Eagle, the Anglicized break-down of his real last name, for that 1954 picture. Taking Kazan's advice, he appeared in the credits for it as Sam Spiegel — not afterward, as the obituary states.

**Q. What ever became of Betty Hutton, the energetic-blonde bombshell who roared through so many Hollywood musicals of the late 1940s? — P.M.**

A. Betty is alive, better than ever and hates Hollywood. Let me explain. Hutton, 63, was a huge star of flicks over a 15-year period ending in 1967. Her most notable success was "The Greatest Show on Earth" directed by Cecil B. DeMille. Betty recently told me she made some \$91/2 million from her movies, but

lost it all. After her career flagged, she fought losing battles with drugs and alcohol. Finally, she wound up living in a convent in Providence, R.I., where she's been based for several years. Betty bounced back, went to college for her master's degree (which she just earned) and is now teaching. We'll get all the particulars in her upcoming autobiography, "Just Bet!," which Hutton is writing with the help of a Roman Catholic nun.

**Q. Our local newspaper's monthly trivia quiz posed a real trick question, asking readers the titles of two movies in which Bette Davis and Barbara Stanwyck appeared together. I can't think of even one, let alone two such films. Do you know? — G.E.**

A. Easy. Bette Davis and Barbara Stanwyck shared the screen in a 1930s version of Edna Ferber's beloved novel "So Big." During the following decade, each popped up in "Hollywood Canteen," an all-star movie glorifying the home-front war effort.

**Q. Anything to the story that Dan Aykroyd is virtually penniless because his assets have been poorly managed? — C.K.**

A. Dan's finances are pretty solid these days. He made a mint as co-star in the smash hit comedy "Ghostbusters," enjoying a percentage of the movie's huge boxoffice revenue. Also, Dan's asking price upfront is substantial. Aykroyd's finances are handled by his father, Peter Aykroyd, who quit his job as a Canadian government official (Dan was born in Ottawa, Canada's capital city) to devote his full-time efforts to managing his son's increasingly large fortune.

**Q. Cher's daughter Chastity is practically a grown woman, yet Cher still likes to hang out with very young men. Who's her latest romantic interest? — L.B.**

A. To 39-year-old Cher, age is more or less a state of mind rather than a physical fact of life. Even so, her tough schedule of strenuous weekly workouts has kept her in terrific shape, conditioned enough to appear in ads pushing health clubs. And listen. Cher is a firm believer that in terms of romance, younger is better. So her latest flamo is the somewhat younger actor Tom Cruise, who made such a big splash in the movie "Risky Business."

# NBC's 'Mafia Princess' shoots network to rebound ratings win

NEW YORK — NBC, after two consecutive second-place finishes, won the ratings last week when "Mafia Princess" gunned down two romance films in the significant Sunday night movie battle and "The Cosby Show" audience built to another record level, figures from the A.C. Nielsen Co. showed Tuesday.

NBC, with seven of the Top 10 shows, including its four Thursday night comedies, finished first for the week of Jan. 13-19 with an average rating of 18.4. CBS, dominating the early part of Sunday with its Top 10 hits, "Murder, She Wrote" and "60 Minutes," had a 17.9. ABC, with no series in the Top 10 and only three in the Top 20, averaged a 13.8.

After 17 weeks in the 30-week prime-time season, NBC leads with a 17.7 rating to CBS' 17.0 and ABC's 15.1. A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million homes with television.

"The Cosby Show" ranked first with its largest rating ever, a 38.5, which was the best performance for any regular series episode since "Dallas," "Who Shot J.R.," program in 1980. It also was the highest rated series comedy since "Three's Company" in 1979.

The record-breaking "Cosby" episode Thursday concluded with an unusual TV moment, as the Huxtable family silently gathered around the living room TV set to hear a speech by the Rev. Martin Luther King.

NBC's "Family Ties" was second in the ratings, followed by "Murder, She Wrote," "60 Minutes" and NBC's "Cheers." Next came "Mafia Princess," NBC's "Golden Girls," CBS' "Dallas," NBC's "Night Court" and NBC's "Miami Vice."

"The keys (to victory) were a blockbuster Thursday night, our continued domination of Saturday night with another powerful comedy block and an exceptionally high-rated Sunday movie," said Curt Block, an NBC vice president.

"Mafia Princess" blunted CBS' new Sunday night movie strategy that had proven so successful the week before when its TV movie beat repeat films on ABC and NBC. However, on Sunday, each network had a first-run, made-for-TV film;

and NBC's "Mafia Princess" surprised the network researchers and won the three-way competition.

"Mafia Princess," starring Tony Curtis as a Mafia kingpin and daytime soap star Susan Lucci as his daughter, had a 24.4 rating and ranked sixth. CBS' "Passion Flower," about a steamy Singapore film, ranked 27, while ABC's "Club Med," about sexual hijinks in a Mexican resort, was 42nd.

CBS researchers had forecast that "Passion Flower" would edge "Mafia Princess" with a 34 share (percentage of homes with their sets on that are tuned in) to 32 for the NBC movie. NBC's actual share was 37 to a 28 for "Passion Flower."

"Mafia Princess" also had to overcome CBS' big lead-in advantage with "Murder, She Wrote," which ranked third, while NBC's competing "Amazing Stories" was 40th and "Ahred Hitchcock Presents" was 38th.

"We had a tremendous edge in lead-in, but NBC had an established star in Tony Curtis and the soap opera queen," said Mike Eisenberg, CBS' research director. "Their title also pulled in viewers, and so did the movie's heavy promotion."

Eisenberg said lead-ins are important, but they don't mean as much today, in this era of remote-control TV devices. "Now, it doesn't take much effort to change channels," he said. "We're seeing that people are more selective and are making their

viewing decisions before the night begins."

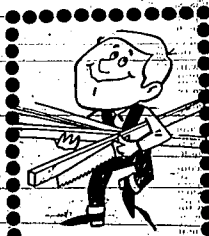
Eisenberg also noted that the three TV movies had raised network viewing to 88 percent on the sets in use for the second two hours of prime time Sunday night, an increase of nearly 10 share points from the week before.

"That means our own movies didn't chase people away. In fact, they brought them back in in rather large numbers," said Eisenberg.

ABC's top shows were "Who's the Boss?" in 15th and "Growing Pains" and "Dynasty," which tied for 17th. The new "Redd Foxx Show" began in 46th place.

The five lowest-rated shows, in descending order, were: ABC's "He's the Mayor" in 67th, NBC's "Punky Brewster," ABC's "Ripley's Believe It or Not," ABC's "The Fall Guy" and ABC's "Shadow Chasers."

In the evening news competition, the "CBS Evening News" was first with a 3.8 rating. "NBC Nightly News" averaged a 3.1, its closest finish to CBS since April 1982. ABC's "World News Tonight" had a 12.3.

# Restaurant chain to unveil Herb, but viewers may not even notice

NEW YORK (AP) — Herb, the missing character on which Burger King has based a \$40 million advertising campaign, is about to come in from the cold.

But some investment analysts who follow the fast-food-business say they wonder if the public will notice.

The nation's second-biggest hamburger chain has been looking for Herb, described as someone who had never tasted a Burger King hamburger. In an advertising campaign over the last two months.

Herb will be introduced formally in two 30-second commercials that the Miami-based company has purchased during the Super Bowl football game Sunday.

In advance of those commercials, Burger King had Herb make an appearance Tuesday on NBC's "Today" show and planned to answer questions from reporters Wednesday at a Burger King restaurant here.

"It will be important for the rest of the campaign that people know what he looks like," said Joyce Meyers, a company spokeswoman.

She declined to offer more details, however.

Advertising Age, a trade journal, is offering the person who spots him first in each of the eateries a cash prize of \$5,000, free lunches for everyone else and a chance to enter a \$1 million sweepstakes.

But some analysts questioned whether many consumers were interested.

"The campaign has been a flop, and the licensees have been unhappy with it," said Edward Tavlin, restaurant industry analyst in the Miami office of the investment firm Prescott, Ball & Turben.

He said it is unclear whether the fault was the concept or because it coincided with an advertising blitz by its bigger rival, McDonald's Corp., for what its newest hamburger — the McDLT.

McDonald's, based in Oak Brook, Ill., sells the new sandwich in a special package that permits it to keep the hot hamburger patty separate from the cool lettuce and tomato until the customer puts them together. It became available nationwide Nov. 4, shortly before the Herb campaign was launched.

The McDonald's McDLT campaign certainly isn't the only Burger King's. Under the name Donnie Dopa, the restaurant industry analyst for the investment firm Duff & Phelps in Chicago.

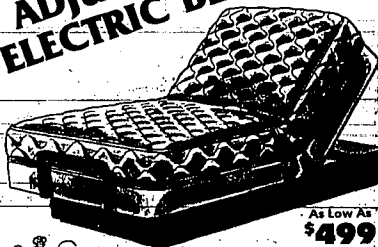
But Burger King said it is satisfied with the campaign because it has increased awareness of Burger King among customers who will now be more likely to think of it when deciding where to get a hamburger.

Harold Friedman, a senior vice president at the advertising agency J. Walter Thompson USA in New York, which created the Herb campaign, acknowledged last week that

the campaign was slow to catch on because of unexpectedly heavy competition from the new McDonald's ads.

The Herb campaign marked a sharp break for Burger King, which had grown accustomed to double-digit sales growth in recent years. Its ads drew direct comparisons with McDonald's in a campaign that was soon dubbed "Burger Wars."

# Falwell group buys TV network

LYNCHBURG, Va. (AP) — The Rev. Jerry Falwell's Old Time Gospel Hour has bought a satellite-television network and plans to broadcast religious programming 24 hours a day.

The non-profit organization has purchased the National Christian Network in Cocoa, Fla., and within a year will move the studio and equipment to Liberty University in Lynchburg, a Falwell spokesman, who refused to be identified, said Friday.

The new Liberty Broadcasting System will be similar to Jim Bakker's Praise The Lord and Ted Turner's Cable News Network, Falwell told the Lynchburg News and Daily Advance.

The leader of Moral Majority said he plans to produce a 90-minute daily, call-in magazine show, similar to his "Jerry Falwell Live" and the Rev. M.G. "Pat" Robertson's "The 700 Club."

The primary emphasis will be on daily chapel and weekly church services, athletic events and college courses, he said.

"The advantage is through this network we'll bring a national constituency of several million supporters into a closer relationship with us to be able to attend some of our chapels," Falwell said.

The network, which is now linked to 5 million homes, carries six hours of Falwell's programs a week now. He plans to increase the programming to eight hours by June.

Falwell refused to say how much the network cost. "The network was in financial straits," he said.

The network will not sell commercial time, Falwell said.



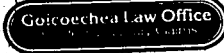

# 2 Murrow colleagues lukewarm about HBO docudrama 'Murrow'

NEW YORK — Douglas Edwards and Richard C. Hottelet, two of "Ed Murrow's boys," gave lukewarm reviews to the TV movie about their legendary leader, saying it captured the mannerisms but not the man.

"Murrow," the \$5 million docudrama being shown on Home Box Office this month, stars Daniel J. Travanti of "Hill Street Blues" as Edward R. Murrow, the CBS correspondent whose radio reports in World War II and TV news productions in the 1950s became basic blueprints for broadcast journalism.

Edwards, who worked in London with Murrow in the 1940s, said the characterization and script captured Murrow's high principles and integrity, but it missed his strength and larger-than-life qualities.

"Maybe no one could play him adequately," Edwards said. "It wasn't a disservice, but it wasn't satisfying. Travanti had some of the Murrow expressions and postures, but he did not have the commanding Murrow voice. Maybe Travanti figured he couldn't duplicate Murrow, so he underplayed him. He came out a weaker Murrow than Murrow was."

Hottelet, who served under Murrow as a radio war correspondent, said the HBO production only captured his on-air persona, including his ever-present cigarette and his tapping foot under the broadcast desk.

"He comes across as a passively interesting soap-opera Murrow, a man depicted exclusively as fighting the dragon," said Hottelet. "There was a lot more to him than that."

In one scene, Murrow objects, but only mildly, when a sponsor sacks a correspondent, allegedly for his liberal tendencies. Hottelet called that Murrow depiction "flabby. Was he a liberal or a wimp here? What are they trying to say?"

The comment underscores Hottelet's discomfort with the docudrama form. "We never know what's real and what isn't," he said.

Hottelet and Edwards said Murrow's wife, Janet, was laughably drawn. "That was real bad," said Hottelet. "She was a strong character in her own right and was involved in some of the things he was doing. But in the film she's only a pretty girl looking adoringly at her husband. She's not even a caricature."

this; she's a pleasant, affectionate nothing."

"Murrow," shot in London and New York and written by Ernest Kinoy ("Roots") from books, public records and interviews he conducted with Murrow's friends and colleagues, starts with Murrow's famed World War II reporting from the rooftops of London, then moves quickly to his work in the fledgling TV news business back home at CBS.

The film spends some time with Murrow's unflinching attack on Sen. Joseph McCarthy's communist witchhunts in 1954. Credible conflict is the essence of powerful drama, and the assault on McCarthy, perhaps Murrow's most courageous hour, could have been the film's central focus. Instead, "Murrow" stresses the run-ins Murrow had with corporate bottom-liners at CBS.

No one disputes the tension among journalism, entertainment and profits that existed in Murrow's time. Just as these elements form an un-

comfortable mix in broadcast news today. (Remember Phyllis George on the "CBS Morning News"?)

In a scenario that easily could have contemporary counterparts, CBS Chairman William S. Paley, played by Dabney Coleman, says Murrow's "See It Now" is an important broadcast, but explains that "simple mathematics" (ratings) have forced him to move it to an inferior time slot.

The biggest complaint from CBS News staffers, though, is how the film treats Frank Stanton, former president of CBS who is played by John McMartin. Although they acknowledge real frictions between Murrow and Stanton, they say that Stanton only comes across as a cliched corporate adversary, a depiction they say is unfair and not properly shaded.

In Stanton's first appearance, he starts jabbering about NBC's ratings and earnings. "That's a good point," says MURROW on Page 20.



# Night soaps might have peaked out

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Prime-time soap operas have peaked in popularity and CBS is not developing any new ones, a network executive said.

"Like all good things, they eventually come to an end," B. Donald Grant, president of CBS Entertainment, told a meeting of newspaper TV reporters recently.

The network's "Dallas," "Knots Landing" and "Falcon Crest" have slipped in the Nielsen ratings, as has ABC's "Dynasty." But Grant said this does not mean he has any immediate plans to cancel the shows.

"Television has its cycles. I think serials may have peaked. We didn't have any in development last year and we don't have any in development for this year," he said.

fee," Paley says, putting him down gently.

Some at CBS News have called Stanton "a hero," recalling how he risked going to jail for contempt of Congress when he defied a 1971 House Commerce Committee subpoena that sought outtakes from CBS' documentary, "The Selling of the Pentagon."

"Part of Stanton's job was to pay attention to money, but he was burning devoted to other things," said Edwards, the first anchor of the "CBS Evening News," who still does radio newscasts on CBS. "He also recognized the importance of the news division and Murrow. I think those points should have been made more strongly."

"They did a number on Stanton," said Hottel, CBS' U.N. correspondent for 25 years before he retired late last year to become a public af-

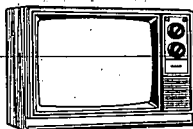

# Residents flock to taping of 'Hospital'

CHARLESTON, S.C. — The peaceful composure of historic Charleston's narrow streets was shattered by hundreds of shrieking soap opera fans last week as the popular daytime drama "General Hospital" started three days of taping.

About 350 fans, mostly teen-age girls, crowded behind police lines in the city's historic district trying to catch a glimpse of their favorite stars.

As the production crew taped outside a nearby home, screams went up as the crowd caught a glimpse of the stars. It surged forward, only to be ordered back to the sidewalk by police with bullhorns.

"I've never seen anything like this," he said. ABC spokesman Kim Rowley.

When "General Hospital" goes on location, the shooting locales and times are not publicized, she said. But because of Charleston's new film guidelines, such information was required to be made public beforehand.

# Roy Rogers, Dale Evans riding happy trails again on new show

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, the buckskin couple who rode blissfully together 'into many a sunset, are enjoying happy trails again on a new cable TV show.

The "king of the cowboys" and "queen of the West" are hosts of a 90-minute show every Saturday on The Nashville Network, "Happy Trails Theatre." It features Rogers' movies.

Each program opens and closes with Rogers and Evans sharing personal anecdotes about how each film was done. Rogers wears some of the custom-made Western wardrobe from his early movie roles.

"We enjoyed doing this," the 74-year-old Rogers said in a telephone interview from his museum-in-Victorville, Calif. "We remembered all the characters, but we had a synopsis of the script to refresh our memory. This brought back memories of Pat Brady, Andy Devine, Gabby Hayes, Smiley Burnette and all the sidekicks."

The 26 movies on the show include "My Pal Trigger" (Miss Evans' favorite because it showed the beauty of Rogers' famous horse), "Cowboy and the Senorita" (the first the couple ever made together) and "Under Western Stars," Rogers' favorite. This 1938 film was his first of 90 movies.

"I enjoyed making them all but the first one was the biggest thrill," Rogers said. "I felt—I was getting somewhere as we emerged from the Depression. I was making 75 bucks a week, which I thought was all the money in the world. When I hear about people gutting now over \$35,000 an episode, it makes me want to throw up."

"I remember it like it was yesterday," he said. "I was a young congressman fighting ranchers and farmers who needed water for irrigation. I was to put through a water bill."

Rogers believes the movies will be especially popular for those who first saw them as youngsters, when they saved their pennies to attend Saturday matinees. "They will bring back lots of memories for people from their 40s to 70s," he said.

On one of the cable shows, he tells how he found Trigger, the handsome horse, was leased to the studio for Rogers to use, and the public adored

the animal so much he decided to buy it for \$2,500. Trigger and Rogers were together throughout his movie and TV career although Trigger had some "doubles."

"He was '33 when he died in 1965; that was like being 115 for a human. I was a lucky cowboy," said Rogers.

The films shaped the Western prototype. However, Rogers said such movies saturated the big screen and television and eventually ran their course.

The police action shows of today are like Westerns were a few decades ago, he said. "How many ways can you wreck a car?" asked Rogers.

There are young singers today who could become a cowboy singer just like Rogers did when he was a young man named Leonard Slye from Cincinnati, he said.

"You could find the right young fellow — handsome, athletic, a good horseman — and he might make a series," said Rogers. "You could take any of those singers from Nashville — (Lee) Greenwood or

(Steve) Warner — and put them on a horse, teach them how to handle a gun and with the proper training they could do the same thing I did."

Rogers helped organize the Western singing group "Sons of the Pioneers" in 1932. The group is still famous for country-western tunes such as "Cool, Cool Water" and "Tumbling Tumbleweeds." Rogers was elected to the Country Music Hall of Fame as a tribute to his singing days with the group.

He left the group in 1937 to pursue his movie career. Before his acting career was over, he also made 101 half-hour TV shows. His last movie was "Mackintosh & T.J." in 1977.

"I never had lessons: I just played myself. I guess the good Lord just wanted me there," he said.

Rogers and his wife have recorded more than 400 songs and their newest album, "Many Happy Trails" was recorded last year in Nashville.

He makes a few personal appearances, singing Western songs.

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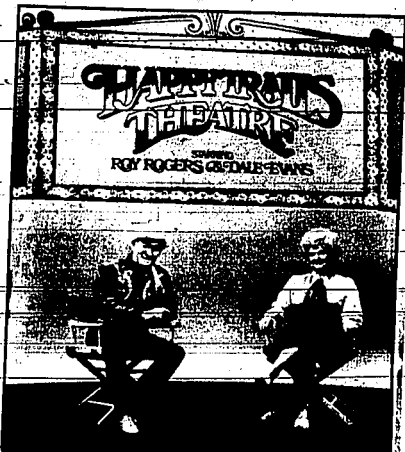

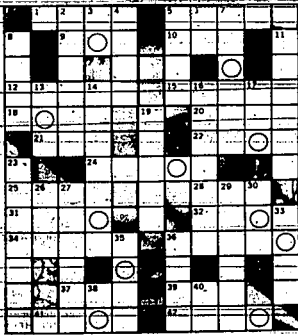

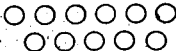
