In California's Sierra Nevada, two massive rocksildes shut Interstate 80 and a mudsilde blocked an Amtrak passenger train with about 800 people aboard. Heavy snow and wind caused avalanches that closed several other highways in the mountains of the West.

More than a fool of rain had fallen at some-points since the Pacilic storms began last week, up to 8 feet of snow had-fallen-n-some mountains, and wind exceeded hurricane force, with gusts to 100 mph in the Sierra Nevada-and-stronger in Colorado. No more Tylenol capsules, maker says

NEW BRUNSWICK, N.J. — The maker of Tylenol announced Monday it will no longer produce over-the-counter medication in capsules, nine days after evanide-contaminated eapsules killed woman and more than three years after they killed seven people in Illinois.

"We feel the company can no gnoger guarantee the safety of these capsules," James E. Burke, chairman of Johnson & Johnson, said.

The announcement came as a team of investigators went, to Pennsylvanja to trace the path of the Tylenol capsules taken by a woman who died in suburban New York (1yon Peb.).

Frank Young, commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, said the agency respects' the company's decision.
"This is a matter of Johnson & Johnson's own business judgment and represents a responsible action under fough circumstances," he said. "The agency did not direct or pressure Johnson & Johnson to take this action."
However, it would be "premature" for the rest of the industry to follow suit, Young said, noting that various types of capsules have certain advantages, such as a time-release capability. He said FDA and industry officials will meet in the next few days to "discuss what technological changes might be possible to respond effectively to this problem."

laccoca has right to express his anger

Lee Iacocca, chairman of the Chrysler Corp., has never been one to hide his light under a bushel or take kindly to criticism.

This past week, after four years of work on the Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island restoration project, lacocca was dismissed from his post as chairman of a citizen's commission advising the Secretary of the Interior on this work. He doesn't like the rebuff one bit, and his response has been heated enough to light Lady Liberty's torch all the way from Detroit.

Like most Americans whose ancestors entered the United States through Ellis Island, Iacocca has a special feeling for the national monument and gladly accepted an appointment in May 1982, to head the restoration commission. When it became clear that this advisory commission was prohibited by law from raising funds from the public for the project, a separate foundation was set up for that purpose. At the request of William Clark, who was then secretary of the Interior, Iacocca also took on the chairmanship of the foundation. the Interior, Iaco

Now — and the timing of this decision is unclear — the present secretary, Donald Hodel, has decided that there is a conflict of interest in lacocca's holding both posts, and without asking the chairman to choose between the two, has fired him from the more prestigious position.

What is this conflict, anyway? What's so improper about giving the man who has raised \$233 million for the project some say in how that money is spent? Secretary Hodel says that the potential conflict was brought to his attention when two other people who served on both bodies were told by the commission's counsel that such a conflict exists, but Iacocca says he disagrees with this view. The commission charter, in fact, specifically requires at least one_cross membership, and Iacocca clearly wants to fill that role.

There are undoubtedly plenty of reasons why people in Washington want Iacocca out of the limelight, but "conflict of interest" is not high on that list.

He's irascible and has been known to rub people the He's trascible and has been known to rub people the wrong way. He strongly disagrees with a proposal to allow commercial development on Ellis Island and has run into opposition in the Interior Department on that matter. And it is rumored that he harbors political ambitions that would not be popular with retential proporate. potential opponents,

In spite of all this, though, the Reagan administration-chose him for both the commission and the foundation jobs and kept him in these positions for years. To kick him out now, just as his work is coming to fruition, is shabby treatment. Iacocca has a right to be angry on both counts.



BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Vielnam's official radio charged Monday that Chinese troops heavily shelled six northern Vietnamese provinces in January and February, killing or wounding 20 people.

The Voice of Vietnam, monitored in Bangkok, claimed that 19,000 artillery and mortar rounds were fired into Quang Ninh, Cao Bang, Lang Son, Hoang Lien Son, Lai Chau and Ha Tuyen provinces from Jan. 11 to Feb. 9.

"It was a serious act," the broad-cast said.

Vietnam and China regularly ac-cuse each other of border attacks. The reports cannot be independently verified, but observers believe many are exaggerated.

China staged a brief but bloody in-cursion into Vietnam in 1979, after Hanoi invaded Peking's-ally,-Cam-bodia. The Chinese troops withdrew but Peking has warned that it may give its southern neighbor a "second lesson."
