WASHINGTON — President Reagan's plan for sending \$100 million in military aid to Nicaragua bogged down Thursday as several key members of Congress objected to harsh White House rhetoric aimed at opponents and two more House panels opposed the request.

against the measure and the House Armed Services Committee approved it. Two more House panels had voted against it Wednesday.

Sen. Nancy Kassebaum, R-Kan., a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, complained that attacks on the patriotism of opponents was "highly offensive" and announced she would oppose Reagan's package "as it is now formulated."

Meanwhile, in the House, Rep. Dave McCurdy, D-Okla., a principal swing vote in sending non-lethal aid to the rebels last year, said "the tactics by the administration are backfiring. The level of rhetoric, the shrillness of attack, has lost them votes."

Rep. Michael Barnes, D-Mid., chairman of the House Foreign Affairs subcommittee on Western Hemisphere Affairs, said the administration is "using red-baiting tactics like we haven't seen in this city since Spiro Agnew was vice president."

But Rep. Henry Hyde, R-Ill., said both sides had used "harsh rhetoric" and said that he and other Reagan backers were not questioning "the unyielding patriotism" of the opponents.

Regardless of committee actions, special rules governing the handling of the request require that the president's proposal be sent to the full House and Senate. Those floor votes are expected in two weeks.

Late Thursday, Reagan, preparing to meet with two dozen House Republicans, told reporters "we've got a long way to go" and said he will "make a televised address, probably within two weeks, seeking public support."

Asked whether he believed those who voted against his plan were supporting communism, Reagan replied, "If so, in-"

In an interview Thursday, Secretary of State George P. Shultz refused to rule out sending troops to Nicaragua if Congress rejects Reagan's request. Although Shultz said the administration has no plan to use force, he said "it's never a good idea to foreclose yourself entirely from things. It's just not a smart way to proceed."

House Republican Whip Trent Lott, of Mississippi and a delegation of GOP congressmen met with Reagan to discuss how to marshal votes for the aid package. Lott said Reagan promised to provide details on negotiating efforts with the Sandinistas.

Competition issue swirling around bill

TWIN FALLS — To vote, or not to vote over future transfer or sale of the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center — that's the hotly contested issue over a bill pending in the Senate. But it is not the only one.

Also at issue is whether a county-owned facility should compete head-to-head with private enterprise.

The debate centers around House Bill 579, which would allow county-owned hospitals to be transferred to non-profit, locally owned corporations without a local vote. The bill passed the House last week by a 53-25 vote and is pending in the Senate Health and Welfare Committee.

The proposed bill is being promoted and supported by Magic Valley Regional Medical Center and the Twin Falls County Commissioners. It is being opposed by two local businesses, the Idaho Home Health and Hospice and Twin Falls Clinic, both private, for-profit health care companies, and State Rep. Dean Sorenson, R-Boise, who is also a physician.

Under current Idaho law, lease or sale of a county-owned hospital is not valid without an election. Gary Thietten, owner of Idaho Home Health and Hospice, this week began circulating petitions that said voters should decide the fate of county-owned hospitals.

The Twin Falls County Commissioners defended the proposed bill, saying voters will still decide if the hospital is actually sold. "Even if this bill passes, we would take it to a referendum if we sold the hospital," said Commissioner Ann Cover.

But Sorenson contends the sole purpose of the bill is to by-pass local voters.

"When it was presented, the statement of purpose of the bill said it was to transfer control to a locally formed corporation without a referendum," Sorenson said on Thursday. "If that was the intent, why did they write it in the cover? They're just playing with words."

And Sorenson said even if the hospital is not sold, it could be transferred for 99 years, with the non-profit corporation having "total control of assets." It might as well be sold, he said.

Also, the bill specifically states that the section of Idaho Code "with respect to the sale and disposition of real and personal property owned by the county, shall not apply to transactions covered by... this section."

Commissioner Judy Felton said on Thursday that commissioners should not have to put it to a vote because they were not asking voters for more money, nor would the county be responsible for debts incurred by the non-profit corporation.

"But if the county wants to get out of the health-care business, why doesn't it just sell MVRMC outright, rather than trying to change the law?"

"I don't think we could sell it and pay off the debt because no one wants to buy it right now," said Commissioner Marvin Hempleman. "This bill just gives us more flexibility to stay afloat."

Under the proposed bill, the hospital could be transferred to a non-profit corporation, which then could enter into money-making ventures, such as joint-ventures with doctors.

Detractors, such as Thietten, say government-owned facilities have no business competing with private enterprise.

"If the county could do this, then why couldn't the city buy five or six service stations and compete against the tax base of the community?" said Thietten, who tangled with MVRMC when it established a home-health care service in competition with his.

Cover said the county-owned hospital has always competed with private enterprise.

Compromise sales tax plan stalls again

BOISE — Senate Republicans Thursday narrowly approved a compromise temporary sales tax increase, but the eight-week drive to raise the \$20 million deficit and ease next year's looming budget problems stalled, at least for the moment, in the House.

After the compromise sped through the Senate with exactly the number of votes needed, House Republican leaders fell five votes short of the two-thirds majority needed to put the plan to a final legislative vote immediately.

Republican Floor Leader Jack Kennevel of Boise, still confident the 48 votes needed for final passage are available, said he would try again today to force an immediate vote on the bill, blaming Thursday's "failure" to muster two-thirds on illnesses that saw a number of GOP members absent.

Should the attempt fail again, the compromise will still come to a final vote on Monday.

"We didn't please everyone," admitted Linden Bateman of Idaho Falls, the chairman of the majority Republican caucus in the House. "Almost no one liked all the features of the bill, but it was the best we could do. I'm convinced it's the going-home bill."

Senate Republican leaders had little trouble pushing the proposal through within hours of the time a special negotiating committee

hammered it out. But the vote was still only 22-20, identical to the one earlier in the week that saw the Democrats joined by six Republicans against a temporary penny sales tax hike. Those Republicans were Roger Fairchild of Falland, Jerry Thorne of Nampa, Reed Budge of Soda Springs, Dana Watkins of Idaho Falls, David Little of Emmett and Atwell Parry of Melba.

The Democratic minority disagreed that it was the best that could be done, continuing their call for broad-based tax reform while the handful of Republican opponents have been reminding their colleagues of the party's 1984 campaign pledge to oppose all tax increases.

Republican leaders in both Houses, who pressed the compromise to their members during closed party meetings early in the day, countered that the temporary nature of the tax increase kept faith with the party's commitment to keep taxes as low as possible.

Long-time envoy familiar with U.S.

WASHINGTON — In his 23 years as the Kremlin's envoy in Washington, Anatoly Dobrynin was well-known to American presidents and secretaries of state, and he knew this country well.

But the question was: Did he make a difference in U.S.-Soviet relations?

Ambassadors generally follow strict guidelines, set for them in their capitols. This is especially true in the tight Soviet system.

And yet, the departing Dobrynin appeared to have a strong rapport with a succession of American leaders. He had easy access particularly to Henry Kissinger when he was secretary of state. Together, they bypassed the routine diplomatic channels to plot the twists and turns in U.S.-Soviet relations.

He had a direct telephone line from his desk to the secretary of state's office.

Symbolically, Dobrynin was the only ambassador permitted to park in the State Department garage.

Also symbolically, Alexander Haig said his first job as secretary of state was to become secretary of state in 1981. The point, Haig subsequently wrote in his memoirs, was to protest the fact that U.S. ambassadors in Moscow were "being kept in sterile isolation" while Dobrynin was "being showered with privileges in Washington."

Haig also undoubtedly wanted to register the tougher line the conser-

ative Reagan administration would take toward the Soviet Union.

But Dobrynin remained an essential link in the chain between Washington and Moscow. His knowledge of the way the U.S. system works was valuable to Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, who is relatively inexperienced in foreign affairs.

He can now bring the insights to the Soviet leader on a daily basis as a member of the Communist Party secretariat, which administers day-

Images of Halley's icy core delight scientists

MOSCOW — A Soviet spacecraft passing the Jumbo tail of Halley's comet Thursday sent back computer-enhanced images of a fiery red-brown center surrounded by three wide bands of yellow and blue.

The pictures provided the closest look at a comet and were the first views of its icy core.

The crowded control room at Moscow's Institute for Space

Research erupted in applause when the pictures arrived, nine minutes after the spacecraft approached to within 5,270 miles of the colored circles. The computer-enhanced colors may not be what the human eye would see.

"It is a triumph. It is truly a triumph," said Fred Whipple of the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observ-atory in Cambridge, Mass., one of more than 100 foreign scientists monitoring the mission. "It's the first time in history we have had this sort of imaging system this

ing reddish-brown center, believed close to a comet. Whipple hypothesized in 1950 that comets had "solid cores" in what became known as the "dirty snowball" theory.

When asked whether he thought the images from Vega 1 supported his theory, he replied, "I think so."

Vega 1 is the first of five probes scheduled to fly by the comet in the next eight days. Data from the missions will take months to analyze and are expected to provide an un-

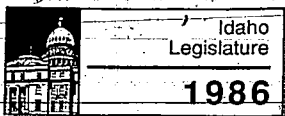

# Milk standards measure moves ahead

BOISE — Plans to mandate the addition of dried milk solids to Idaho milk ran into opposition in the Senate Agricultural Affairs Committee Thursday.

But despite the first testimony against the plan since it was introduced in the House and passed, the committee approved the measure and sent it to the full Senate.

A pair of small-scale milk processors from the Boise area told the committee that the cost of buying Grade A dried milk and the machinery to plant it would be harder on them than it would be on larger milk processors.

John Patten, a dairyman who processes his herd's milk in his own small plant, said the added cost of machinery and materials will make it hard for him to turn a profit on his small operation.

He said there are only about 10 small processors such as him in Idaho.

Idaho Dairyman's Association lobbyist Vicki Patterson-Nielsen told the committee that the dairy industry is pushing for the new non-fat milk solids standards to make low-fat milk taste and sell better and to help do away with some of the surplus milk that plagues the dairy industry. By adding the dried milk, the dairymen hope to

improve the taste and nutritional value of milk. She said the cost of adding dried milk to lowfat milk will vary from about 7 to 12 cents. Patten said the cost would be closer to 16 cents per gallon, particularly for small processors who will not be able to buy dried milk in large quantities.

Kimberly dairyman Lewis Eilers told the committee the use of dried Grade A milk would develop new markets for the product other than the government.

He said carbonated beverages and stomach medicines are sold for their calcium content and the dairy industry should compete by increasing the calcium content of commercially sold milk.

The committee voted to send the bill to the full Senate, where Patten said he will be lobbying against the bill.

He said small producers do not have a lobbyist in Boise and only found out about the bill last week, after it had already passed the House.

## Refund time reduction clears Senate

## Fair board claim bill faces House modification

BOISE — The House Local Government Committee on Thursday voted to modify a bill that would have blocked county commissioners from reviewing expense account claims of county fair board members.

The bill was proposed by members of the Ada County Fair Board

because their fair runs without county funds and Fair Board members feel there is no need for county commissioners to review spending of dollars they don't dole out.

But the bill would also have allowed county fair boards that do draw on county coffers to manage their expense accounts without any review by county commissioners.

Rep. Emerson Smock, R-Boise,

who brought the bill to the committee, said the bill was intended to free up members of the self-supporting fair boards.

After county commissioners testified against the bill and said fair boards need close watching by county commissioners, Smock accepted the suggestion of Rep. James Stojcheff, D-Sandpoint, that the bill be amended to allow only self-supporting fair boards to manage their expense accounts unhindered.

The bill was opposed in Thursday's committee hearing by two members of the Ada County Board of Commissioners.

One, Doyle Miner, said county fair board members are too insulated from the electorate and ought to be watched by elected officials like himself.

"We heard that there are some very nice trips being taken," Miner said.

But Rep. Robert Fry, R-Horseshoe Bend, said the county commissioners are dissatisfied with more than simple expense accounts.

This bill is like going after a bull with a fly-swatter," he said. Smock said the Ada County Fair is the only self-supporting fair in the state that he knows of.

## Change in truck taxes heads for full Senate

BOISE — After several weeks of hearings and disputes over highway use statistics, the Senate Transportation Committee on Thursday released a bill to amend Idaho's truck taxes.

The bill, which will allow truckers to shift from a weight-and-mileage-based tax to an annual fee, is now headed for the amending process and further discussion by the full Senate.

After hearing assurances from the proponents of the bill that the change would not mean a loss of funding for the state's highways system, the bill moved ahead.

The amendments discussed Thursday would increase the proposed fees charged to commercial carriers. The changes were proposed to ensure that highway revenues do not suffer when the truck tax is changed.

For example, the annual fee originally proposed for an 80,000-pound commercial carrier was \$1,623. Under the amendments, that fee would be increased to \$1,721.

Idaho Motor Transport Association lobbyist Bill Roden told the committee his group would accept an increase in commercial trucker fees in the future if the new flat fee system is enacted and the highways bank accounts dwindled.

Sen. Ron Belletsbacher, D-Grangeville, said the bill would shift the load for truck taxes to Idaho

truckers from out-of-state truckers. Sen. Larry Anderson, R-Twin Falls, voted for an unsuccessful motion to hold the bill in the committee, and then told the committee he will support the bill on the floor of the Senate, if amendments are added to adjust commercial trucking fees annually by a factor tied to the change in the Gross National Product (GNP, an indicator of American economic activity).

## Dallas turns down offer of settlement

BOISE (AP) — Claude Dallas Jr. has rejected an offer on an out-of-court settlement of a federal lawsuit, contending prison and law enforcement officials entrapped him in an alleged 1983 escape attempt.

Dallas is serving a 30-year prison term for voluntary manslaughter in the 1981 shooting deaths of two Idaho Department of Fish and Game conservation officers.

In October 1983, Dallas and inmate Steve Burk were found in an unauthorized area of the prison. After a hearing, the prison's classification committee ordered Dallas moved from medium security to close custody, where he had fewer privileges. He spent 10 days in disciplinary detention.

## State files answer to Creech's claims

BOISE (AP) — Condemned murderer Thomas Eugene Creech should never have been allowed to petition federal court for a stay of his scheduled Feb. 3 execution, Solicitor General Lynn Thomas said in court documents.

U.S. District Judge Harold Ryan began reviewing a box of evidence on Thursday supporting Thomas' response to the petition granted by Ryan Jan. 31.

Creech, 36, was scheduled to die by lethal injection on Feb. 3 for the 1981 slaying of fellow prison inmate David Jensen.

# House moves toward action to settle tangled water rights

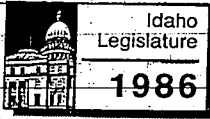
BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House has unanimously approved legislation moving the state's role over to a massive effort at sorting out southern Idaho water rights.

By a count of 79-0 on Thursday, the House approved and sent to the Senate a bill setting up procedures for court adjudication of Snake River water rights.

"For irrigators, this may be the most important bill we've ever had here," said Rep. Ward Chaburn, R-Albion. He's the Legislature's senior member, serving his 30th year. Rep. Reed Hansen, R-Idaho Falls, called it the "entering step" in one of the largest attempts ever made in this country at getting court rulings on water rights.

The entire Snake River drainage will be covered, from where the river enters the state from Wyoming in central Idaho, to where it becomes the Idaho-Oregon border starting at Parma in western Idaho.

After the debate, Chaburn said it isn't clear yet how many water rights are involved. But he said it could be 100,000. The legislation is part of the end to disputes over water rights triggered by an Idaho Supreme Court decision. The court ruled that Idaho Power



Co. owns water rights at its Swan Falls Dam in southwestern Idaho that take precedence over upstream use.

Farm interests argued the decision could mean no more water would be available for farm development upstream from Swan Falls Dam, south of Boise. Adjudication of water rights is part of the agreement reached between the utility and the state.

Original estimates were that it could take more than 10 years, and \$25 million to \$30 million, for all the court work necessary to decide all the water rights.

Chaburn said the legislation approved Thursday could cut the cost to a few million dollars, and get the work done in a few years. The state and federal government also have been negotiating with the

Shoshone-Bannock Tribes in eastern Idaho over water rights.

The bill approved Thursday sanctions those negotiations, which Chaburn said could save years in the process of sorting out water rights.

Rep. Larry EchoHawk, D-Pocatello, an attorney for the tribes, called the agreement a "historic thing," because water right determination in other states has required costly court battles.

"Most states have litigated; in Idaho we have sat down at the negotiating table to resolve our differences," said EchoHawk.

EchoHawk said so far, three formal negotiating sessions have been held. "We're keeping our fingers crossed, and hope we can find a responsible way to deal with a real difficult problem," he said.

Chaburn said the Idaho adjudication process is one of the largest ever attempted in the United States, was probably the largest ever held in the Western United States and certainly was the largest court process ever launched in Idaho.

"We can save millions of dollars and years through this process" of negotiation, Chaburn said.

## House set to debate tax credits

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House will debate again whether parents who send their children to private or church schools should receive credits against state taxes for part of the cost.

The House Revenue and Taxation Committee on Thursday voted 9-8 to send the proposal to the House floor for a vote after hearing two days of testimony.

The bill would grant parents \$300 in tax credits for children enrolled in elementary school, and \$600 for students in high school.

Similar legislation, sponsored by Rep. J.F. "Chad" Chaband, R-Idaho Falls, was debated by the House last session. When it appeared the measure was headed to defeat, Chaband withdrew it last year.

The bill will be put up for amendment to specify that it applies only to "nonpublic" schools.



## Senate panel is leery of education gifts bill

BOISE (AP) — Legislation giving Idaho income taxpayers the opportunity to earmark their refunds for public education has been sent to the full Senate for a final legislative vote.

But members of the Senate Education Committee, when they endorsed the House-approved plan Thursday without dissent, warned that it should not be viewed as a substitution for continued, and increasing, state aid to public schools.

"I see it as very little money where we should have more," Sen. Lynn Tominga, R-Paul, said, and Lewiston Democrat Bruce Sweeney added, "I wouldn't want people to think this is a substitute for adequate funding for education. Sometimes these things are perceived as a substitute, a solution to the problem. I don't think this is a solution."

In addition, the committee endorsed another House-passed bill re-

quiring the appointment of two noneducators to the State Textbook Selection Committee.

That measure, sponsored by Rep. Jerry Cullen, R-Jerome, and overwhelmingly approved by the House, was prompted by complaints from some parents that the current committee composed of people involved in the school system has approved the use of objectionable material in schools. Among the books criticized were "Twists" by John Steinbeck and J.D. Salinger.

Cullen said the point of requiring two noneducators on the 18-member panel was to offer a perspective on textbooks from outside the school system. The bill was revived in the House after being held last year when the Board of Education rejected a request that it voluntarily comply with the proposal.

The income tax checkoff for public schools would be added to the four already on the state tax return.

## House panel OKs nomination bill

BOISE (AP) — One Democrat called it a "lock out" bill, but a House committee has approved legislation allowing political parties to nominate major candidates at party conventions.

The vote was 7-3 on Thursday as the House Local Government Committee voted to send the Republican Party-backed bill to the House floor for a vote.

Ada County GOP Chairman Robie Russell and Dave Pearson, executive

director of the state party, testified before the committee. They said the legislation is endorsed by the Republican Party.

If a party elects to use the process, to get on the primary election ballot, a candidate must get 20 percent of the votes from delegates to the party convention. A candidate getting at least 10 percent of the votes from delegates can qualify as an unendorsed candidate. Idaho had a similar system in the

early 1970s, but abandoned it in favor of "open" primary elections a few years later.

"This is the old party hack bill," said Rep. James Stolcheff, D-Sandpoint, who voted against the bill. Also opposing it were Rep. Paul Keeton, D-Lewiston, and Rep. Hilde Kellogg, R-Post Falls.

"Who is going to play God and weed out the candidates in political parties?" asked Stolcheff.

## New lottery bill advances

BOISE (AP) — Another lottery bill is headed to the Idaho House for a vote.

The House State Affairs Committee on Thursday voted unanimously to send a new bill to the floor for a vote, one which could clear the way for Idaho to have a state-run lottery.

There was little debate and no opposing votes as the measure cleared the committee. It's a slightly amended version of legislation defeated last month when it failed to receive two-thirds approval in the House after clearing the Senate.

The newest proposal would ask voters in the next general election whether they want to amend the Idaho Constitution to authorize state-run lotteries. The new bill specifically bans casino-type gambling, but leaves it up to the Legislature whether nonprofit organizations such as churches could run bingo games and raffles.

Some House members said that the new version, allowing charitable bingo and raffles, could pick up about five votes over the earlier version.

**Artist O'Keeffe dies at age 98**

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) — Georgia O'Keeffe, whose colorful abstracts and clearly defined paintings of flowers and bones made her a leading figure in contemporary American art, died Thursday.

She was 98. Miss O'Keeffe was brought to St. Vincent Hospital in Santa Fe in mid-morning and died at 12:20 p.m. MST, said hospital spokesman Charles Cullen. He had no other details on her death.

She moved to Santa Fe last summer from Abiquiu. She received the Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor, in 1977 and was one of the first recipients of the National Medal of the Arts.

Some of her lush close-ups of flowers were considered erotic. Some critics considered her work only decorative.

**Senators reject 1987 budget**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Budget Committee rejected President Reagan's fiscal 1987 budget Thursday, agreeing that his formula for domestic spending cuts, a continued military buildup and no general tax increases will fail to meet a required \$144 billion deficit target.

The vote was 16-6 against with president's plan, with only six of the panel's 12 Republicans voting in favor of it. As the vote, White House budget director James C. Miller III issued a statement saying Congress always modifies what the president proposes.

Sen. Pete V. Domenici, R-N.M., the committee chairman, set the mostly symbolic vote in an apparent effort to avoid prolonged partisan wrangling over the president's spending plan, which has attracted virtually no support on Capitol Hill. He voted in favor of the budget, however.

**Marcos' tab worries Air Force**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The family and associates of former Philippines President Ferdinand Marcos have run up a tab of more than \$39,000 at Air Force base stores, raising fears within the service that the debt will never be paid, Pentagon sources said Thursday.

The issue is becoming sensitive within the Air Force, the sources said, because the base exchanges are self-supporting and their profits are used to support morale, welfare and recreational programs for active-duty personnel.

"The exchange system isn't something that runs on money appropriated from Congress," said one Pentagon official who demanded anonymity.

"And the State Department isn't telling us anything about payment of this debt. If it's not paid, it's our people on Guam and Hawaii that turn out the losers," the official added.

**Symms casts lone vote opposing bullet ban**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted 97-1 Thursday for a bill that would ban "manufacture and importation" of armor-piercing bullets unless they are used for legitimate sporting purposes.

Long sought by police organizations, the bill goes to a House-Senate conference. The House passed a version last year that would extend the ban to stocks on dealers' shelves.

The Senate measure would ban armor-piercing ammunition made of

seven specified metals. The sole opponent was Sen. Steven D. Symms, R-Idaho, who said the bill would not ban all armor-piercing bullets, but would violate Americans' constitutional right to keep and bear arms.

Meanwhile, the House Judiciary crime subcommittee unanimously approved a compromise gun control bill and sent it to the full Judiciary Committee. It would permit interstate sales of rifles and shotguns, but leave in effect a current ban on

cross-state handgun sales.

The measure was fashioned at a time House members are under pressure from the National Rifle Association and allied groups to ease restrictions. In the 1960s federal gun control laws were passed

control laws. Rep. William J. Hughes, D-N.J., crime subcommittee chairman, said he hoped the subcommittee would

promise passed Thursday would head off the discharge petition, which needs about 20 more signatures to be successful.

The law enforcement groups and gun control advocates bitterly opposed inclusion of handguns in the interstate sales provision, arguing the language would make it easier for criminals to obtain guns.

**CDC studies toxic shock, flu connection**

ATLANTA (AP) — As many as six people in Minnesota contracted toxic shock syndrome after getting the flu during this year's heavy flu season, and a federal health agency is studying 14 other cases for signs of toxic shock.

Two teen-age boys in Minnesota were diagnosed with toxic shock last month after they had the flu, and one died, the national Centers for Disease Control said Thursday. Another four possible toxic shock cases were identified in the wake of the first two, and one of those patients also has died.

The link between flu and toxic shock "has never been reported before," said Dr. Carol Ciesielski, a CDC researcher. "It appears to be quite rare, although it's not entirely surprising."

In light of the Minnesota illnesses, the CDC is studying 14 "unusual" cases of abnormally low post-flu blood pressure to see if any patients show signs of toxic shock. Ms. Ciesielski said.

Toxic shock is caused by toxin-producing bacteria known as staphylococcus aureus. A form of pneumonia caused by the same bacteria has been seen in weakened flu patients before, she said.

Toxic shock and other bacterial diseases can occur as bacteria attack the cells lining the respiratory tract, which have been damaged by flu, Ms. Ciesielski explained.

**Fletcher pick for NASA job**

WASHINGTON (AP) — James C. Fletcher, who ran NASA during Apollo missions to the moon and helped give birth to the shuttle program, was picked by President Reagan on Thursday for a second tour of duty as head of the nation's space agency.

Fletcher, a physicist and expert on space and missile technology, had said publicly he was reluctant to take the job that he left in 1977, but that it would be difficult to refuse the president.

The decision was halted by Sen. Slade Gorton, R-Wash., chairman of the Senate space subcommittee, as "the best choice for this post."

Fletcher, who lives in the Washington suburb of McLean, Va., could not be reached for comment on the announcement. His wife, reached by telephone, said he was traveling on business and would return Saturday. She declined to say where he had gone.

# Sparks fly at SPC-sponsored liability debate

**TWIN FALLS** — Doctor, lawyer and insurance agent debated Thursday over a topic of mutual concern — liability insurance — and each placed some of the blame for problems on the others' feet.

Retired Dr. physician J.R. Kircher, Twin Falls attorney Mark Stubbs and Twin Falls insurance agent Steve Berg fired verbal bullets at each other during the debate, which was sponsored by the Sawtooth Press Club.

Kircher, who said previously his medical liability insurance premiums rose from \$1,000 to \$13,000 in 10 years, told the gathering he

was concerned with liability insurance problems as a whole — not just when related to medicine. The liability crisis, which means higher prices for coverage and scarcity of insurance for some, touched everything from schools to ski resorts, he added.

"There's a long list of examples to illustrate the liability crisis. You can't name any segment of society that hasn't been hit," Kircher said.

One source of problems, he said, was that insurance companies are prone to settle the nuisance claims, and juries make. He said the companies should settle legitimate claims before going to court.

He added that the "deep pocket" syndrome is dominant in lawsuits,

As a result, if someone else was 80 percent liable but didn't have any insurance, "you can dip into my pockets."

"The public is another source of the problem, because individuals file claims and sit on juries making awards, he added. The legal system lacks discipline

for lawyers who bring frivolous suits, Kircher claimed. Lawyers are fighting changes in the system, but haven't said what would happen if changes were made, he added.

Stubbs, a member of the Idaho Trial Lawyers Association who is leading a statewide fight against changes in the tort system, said the

system works. A tort denotes the existence of a hurt, and the tort system is a way to obtain compensation for the hurt, Stubbs said.

"The system also makes it possible for a person in Twin Falls to sue large companies over negligence in a design, he added.

"That's what causes us to have safe products," Stubbs said. Changes in the tort system ultimately would hurt the victims, he added.

Insurance companies claim large jury awards, frivolous cases, "floral judges and hungry lawyers" are justification for higher premiums, Stubbs said. But, he wanted to see some statistics to help up their

claims. "In one fell swoop," the companies have attempted to make up for investment losses "by doubling and tripling premiums, Stubbs charged.

"It's proposed legislation—the companies will be required to report about their finances, he added. "Let's see what kind of profit insurance companies are making," Stubbs said.

Doctors didn't escape Stubbs' barbs, as he reported that 1 percent of doctors were responsible for 30 percent of malpractice claims.

Stubbs also laid blame on the news media for distorting the issue by reporting the filing of big-money cases and not the outcome of cases. See DEBATE on Page A8

### Adamson hits Hansen bid as 'hogwash'

POCATELLO — Connie Hansen is wrong if she thinks she can divorce herself from her husband's legal problems, and any thought of her benefiting from the possibility that he will be jailed is "hogwash," fellow GOP candidate Dan Adamson said.

The Jerome attorney, one of six candidates for the Republican nomination for the 2nd Congressional District seat held by Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, leveled a scathing attack on Hansen's candidacy on Thursday.

The U.S. Supreme Court on Monday refused to hear former Congressman George Hansen's appeal of a four-count felony conviction on charges he falsified financial-disclosure forms submitted to the U.S. House of Representatives.

That opened the door for the Justice Department to seek an order to carry out the 18-month prison sentence and \$30,000 fine imposed by U.S. District Judge Joyce Hens Green in 1984.

"When Connie Hansen says she's going to get the sympathy vote, that's just pure hogwash," said Adamson, who lost a close primary race to George Hansen in 1984.

"Connie Hansen is as much a part of the problem as George Hansen," Adamson said he was "appalled" at an offer made by state Rep. J.F.

"Chad" Chadband, R-Idaho Falls, to write a letter to President Reagan asking him to pardon Hansen. Chadband is also a 2nd District hopeful.

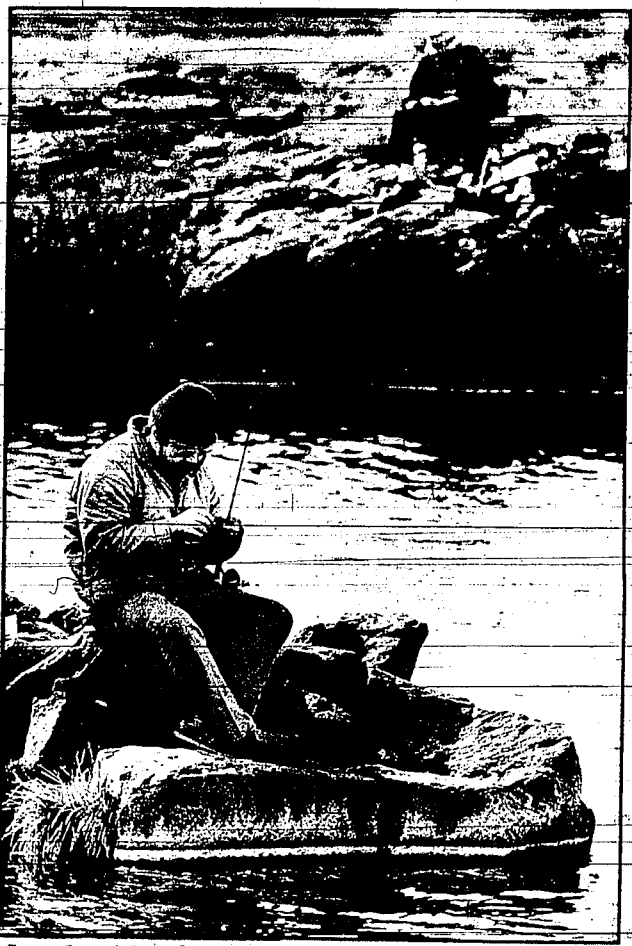
"His U.S. appeal rights have been finalized, and he is a convicted felon," Adamson said. "It's over now. For heaven's sake, can't Idaho go on and get away from the Hansens?"

Idaho Falls broadcaster Mel Richardson, another 2nd District GOP candidate, said he felt Hansen was unjustly prosecuted because the Ethics in Government Act under which he was convicted was never intended to carry criminal penalties.

Adamson said such talk "makes me want to throw up."

"I can't believe it, the garbage printed by the other candidates," Adamson said.

### Area farmers backing Evans on moratorium

**TWIN FALLS** — Magic Valley borrowers, a group of 150 area farmers and ranchers, is supporting Gov. John Evans' bid for emergency power to declare a moratorium on farm foreclosures.

The group, representing farm borrowers, is pressing the Idaho Legislature to give Evans standby authority to call a "one-year" moratorium on foreclosures and to extend it for a second year, if necessary.

Evans last week said, in a nationally televised interview, that he

intends to seek the authority to halt foreclosures. However, no legislation has been introduced for action.

Walt Mueller, Twin Falls farmer and president of Magic Valley Borrowers, said the forced sales are depressing land and equipment prices. "The equity of both the lenders and borrowers is jeopardized," he said.

### Petition targets hospital transfer

**Health contractor doubts bill's effect**

**TWIN FALLS** — A Twin Falls man in the health business began circulating petitions this week to fight a proposed bill that would allow Magic Valley Regional Medical Center to compete head-to-head with him.

Gary Thietten, owner of Idaho Home Health and Hospice, said on Tuesday he had collected at least 100 signatures of downtown merchants all opposed to House Bill 579, which would allow county-owned hospitals to be transferred or sold to non-profit corporations without a local vote.

"I've been all down Main Street, and gone to three-fourths of the businesses, and every single business has signed," said Thietten, who plans on testifying against the bill next Tuesday before the Senate Health and Welfare Committee.

Thietten said he had covered the north side of Main and most of the south side up to Shoshone Street. But a random check of six downtown businesses turned up only one merchant who had not signed.

"I signed reluctantly because I'm concerned about turning over control of the hospital without a vote," said Earl Faulkner, owner of The Parlor. "I don't think few people should run our hospital. We've got millions of dollars tied up out there."

Judi Baxter, owner of Judi's Inc. Bookstore, said she had not been contacted and would not sign. She was. Her husband is Larry Baxter, director of the MVRMC Foundation, which raises money for the hospital.

Tom Ashenbrenner, owner of Price Hardware, said he had not seen Thietten or the petition, and said he would not sign. His mother, Marge Ashenbrenner, is secretary of the MVRMC board.

"I think people should be allowed to vote, but I have not seen the petition," Ashenbrenner said on Tuesday. "And I would decline to sign the petition."

### Congress delivers farm bill revisions

**WASHINGTON** — Congress has delivered its package of farm bill repairs to the president's desk after fighting over provisions for the past three weeks.

The \$5 billion measure will resupply with cash to continue buying up surpluses and to make crop support loans to farmers.

However, it also attempts to neutralize provisions in the 1985 Farm Bill that farm groups say could

devastate some markets and drop farmers' incomes. The bill, which emerged from the Senate on Wednesday night, won quick, lopsided support in the House on Thursday. The vote was 283-97, said Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, in an interview.

Uncertainty about the bill hampered farmers-and government officials as the formal sign-off government price support programs began on Thursday.

Officials for the U.S. Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service in Idaho said the agency was

taking applications, but was not approving them until the bill becomes law.

Congressional sources said President Ronald Reagan could make a decision on signing the bill into law as early as today.

Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, who was an architect of the farm bill fix-up in the Senate, declared the bill a "victory" for farmers who grow an array of unsubsidized, minor crops. The measure forbids farmers of subsidized crops — such as wheat, barley, corn, rice and cotton — from collecting government supports for

raising the minor crops. The original bill had allowed growers to substitute dry edible beans, potatoes, popcorn, onions, alfalfa seed and other crops for their subsidized crops on some acreage without affecting support payments.

Lobbyists for those commodities protested that the shift in production would inundate the smaller markets and depress prices. "The bottom line is that Idaho farmers will not have the carpet yanked from under them," Symms said. "Idaho bean farmers

### Officials doubt claim Indians, killed in crash, were robbed

**TWIN FALLS** — Local law enforcement officials say they have no evidence to support a claim that money was taken from the bodies or from the possessions of six Fort Hill Indians who died in a Nov. 29 traffic accident on U.S. Highway 59, south of Twin Falls.

A copyrighted story in the Sho-Ban News, a paper published weekly on Thursdays in Fort Hill, states that an investigator for the tribal attorney's office found that about \$600 was missing from the six, who died at the scene of the two-vehicle crash. She said her

investigation indicated the money disappeared sometime between the when the accident occurred and when the victims' possessions were turned over to their families. The article, written by Dave Archuleta, says that Julie Nagashoah conducted the three-month-long investigation, and determined that the six victims had cashed checks and borrowed money prior to leaving Fort Hill. Together, she said, they would have been carrying about \$600. Instead, local officers found only \$75 among the group's possessions.

I arrived at the scene. I numbered them according to the bodies, and put all of the wallets into one purse."

Wood said he took the purses and contents to Reynolds Funeral Chapel and that he "had a passenger" that night, "so he was never alone with the personal possessions."

There were about five or more officers and funeral home staff members (present) when we went through the wallets and purses. We were basically searching for identification at that time. But we counted the money together," Wood said.

Both Wood and Lt. Bob Wright of the Idaho State Police said they were first told there should have been up to a half-million dollars in the vehicle, and the amount has gradually decreased as reports changed. Wright said ISP officers handle traffic problems and did not investigate reports of the missing cash because

that is not their assignment. Twin Falls County Sheriff James Munn said he was never requested to investigate a theft of money.

She said a state highway snow plow operator was at the port at the time and went to the scene. He told Nagashoah four or five cars had stopped at the scene when he arrived. Wright said the plow operator remained at the scene to assist until officers arrived and kept his lights on the involved vehicles. Wood said he found \$50 in the trouser pocket of one victim and \$20 in another victim's pocket and \$3 in his wallet. Wood said three of the victims were ejected from

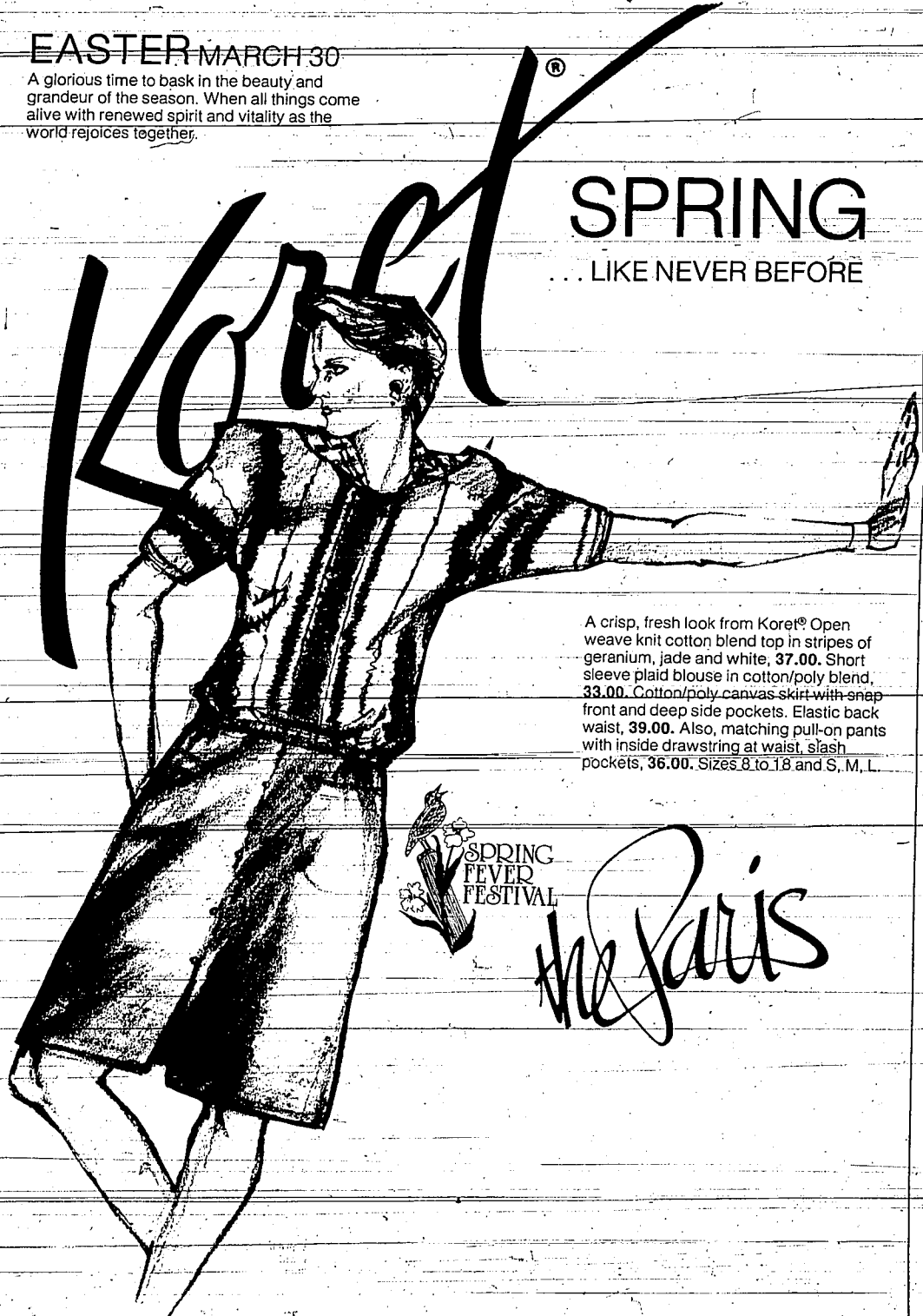

Rates ease, stocks turn up

NEW YORK (AP) - Signs of new downward pressure on worldwide interest rates helped the stock market post its first clear-cut gain of the week Thursday. Securities industry and regional telephone issues turned in some of the best showings. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials rose 9.94 points to 1,696.50. Volume on the New York Stock Exchange came to 158.99 million shares, up from 154.56 million Wednesday.

West Germany's central bank announced a reduction of its discount rate from 4 percent to 3.5 percent. There were reports that the Bank of Japan might also lower its key interest rate before the week's end. Analysts said these developments prompted expectations of further declines in U.S. interest rates as well. The Federal Reserve's discount rate, which it sets on loans to private financial institutions, stands at 7.5 percent. The Fed has been reluctant to lower it, apparently because it wants to keep the dollar relatively steady in foreign exchange.

But lower interest rates abroad would presumably give the Fed more leeway to reduce its rate without subjecting the dollar to much strain. In the credit markets Thursday, rates on short-term Treasury bills declined 7/8 to 9 7/8 percent, or hundreds of a percentage point. Gains in the prices of long-term government bonds, which move in the opposite direction from interest rates, were spotty near the end of a volatile day. America's Home tumbled 3 1/2 to 19 1/2 in active trading. Late Wednesday, the company said it will omit its dividend, and expects a substantial loss for the first quarter as a result of falling oil prices. Another energy issue, Exxon fell 1/4 to 52 1/2; Chevron 3/8 to 85 1/4; Atlantic Richfield 1/2 to 51 1/4; and Occidental Petroleum 1/8 to 24 1/2. In the securities industry group, Merrill Lynch rose 2 to 42 1/2; Phibro common 1 1/2 to 51 1/2; E.F. Hutton 1 1/4 to 42 1/2; and PaineWebber 1/4 to 42 1/2.

No bailout needed for troubled banks

WASHINGTON (AP) - The problem - a two-tier plan to ease Reagan administration said Thursday - the much-publicized problems of farm banks are holdovers from foreclosures, not defensible, and are currently manageable under the available aid programs, and do not warrant a new congressional bailout. "In spite of their present problems, agricultural bank capital is still reasonably strong," said Charles O. Sestness, an assistant secretary of the treasury for farm and domestic finance. As a group, farm banks have stronger capital positions than the banking industry as a whole, he told the Senate Banking Committee. Sestness noted that the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation continues to fund the problem, and that the problem is concentrated primarily in the Midwest and Great Plains. He said clearly we have ways to maintain credit in rural towns and principal payments over 10 to 20 years. The remainder of the debt would be called "Tier 2" and would carry an interest rate of 3 percent with payments on the principal. As a portfolio work on some kind of aid legislation for commercial farm banks soon, Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., promised to bring the measure before the full Senate as early as possible. He said it might be a form of the measure introduced by Sen. Alan Dixon, D-Ill., which would allow banks to write off loan losses over a long period of time, perhaps 20 years, rather than absorb the losses totally within the year they are experienced. The American Farm-Bureau Federation, meanwhile, proposed its own legislative remedy to the debt.

February retail sales remain sluggish

By The Associated Press The nation's major retailers Thursday reported generally weak sales for February, the first month of their fiscal year. K Mart Corp., the second-largest retailer, said its sales rose 1.4 percent. Third-place J.C. Penney Co. posted a 7.4 percent sales gain. No. 4 Federated Department Stores Inc. said its sales climbed 5.1 percent. Wal-Mart Stores Inc., the seventh largest, said

its sales jumped 42 percent; but sales for stores open more than a year rose a modest 19 percent. May Department Stores Co., No. 9, said its sales rose 8.8 percent. Spending was adversely affected by Americans' high levels of installment debt, said Jeffrey Feiner, a retail analyst with Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc. That prevents consumers from buying big ticket goods and affects lower and middle income consumers most.

With the exception of one or two, they were slow. They have pretty much maintained the status quo in the previous months, said Jeffrey Edelman, an analyst with Dean Witter Reynolds Inc. "It mirrors the sluggishness we've seen in the economy," Edelman said. Penney reported a better increase than it has recent months and that Wal-Mart is expected to achieve large gains through store expansion. However Feiner added, "Too much should not be made out of February."

# AIDS virus discovered in females

BOSTON (AP) — The AIDS virus has been discovered for the first time in women's genital secretions. Increasing the evidence that the lethal disease can be spread sexually from women to men, researchers say.

Nearly all AIDS victims in the United States have gotten the disease through male homosexual intercourse or sharing hypodermic needles. Occasionally the disease is spread sexually from men to women, but experts disagree over whether the reverse is possible.

Now, researchers in Boston and San Francisco have published separate reports in the latest issue of the British journal *Lancet* describing isolation of the virus in the secretions of eight women.

"They would certainly support the belief that female to male transmission of the virus can occur," said Dr. Harold Jaffe of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control.

Despite the new evidence, experts are still unsure just how easily AIDS could be transmitted during heterosexual intercourse.

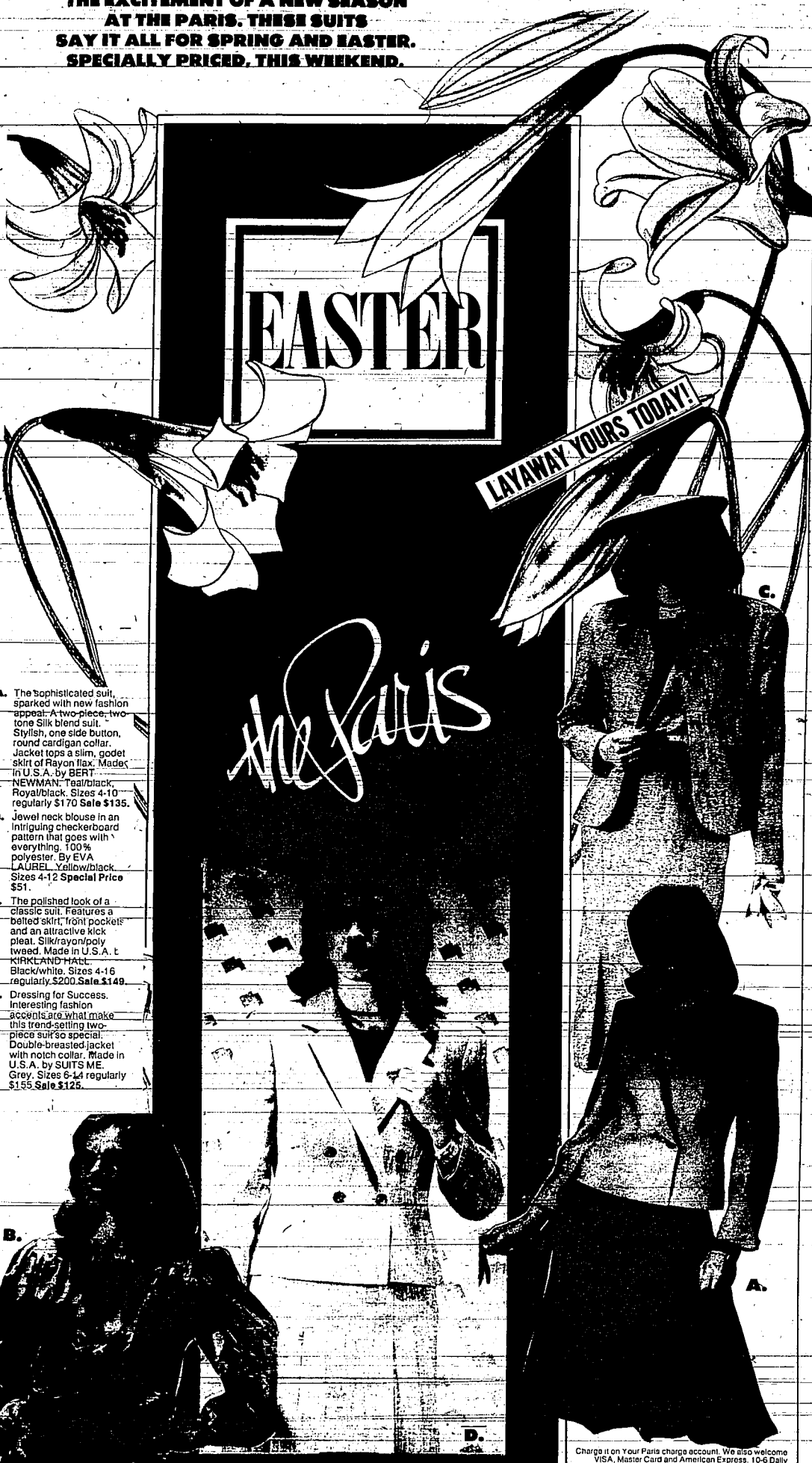
Levy said the virus is present in only small amounts in female genital secretions and a man's risk of infection is probably slight.

# African virus may be a link

NEW YORK (AP) — An African virus that causes an AIDS-like illness in pigs may have been present in some American AIDS patients and could be a contributing cause of human AIDS infections, according to a new study.

Evidence of infection with African swine fever virus, or ASFV, was found in nine of 21 American AIDS patients tested, and in only one of 16 healthy Americans, according to a study to be published Saturday in the *Lancet*, a British medical journal.

## Big Sky Last-minute 3-pointer lifts Wildcats over BSU

RENO, Nev. — Boise State didn't go down without a fight.  
It took a last-second, off-balance 21-foot jump shot by senior guard Alan Campbell Thursday to give Weber State a 79-76 victory over the Broncos in the first round of the Coors Big Sky Conference Basketball Tournament.

"It was a great, great play by Campbell," said Boise State Coach Bobby Dye. "But I would much rather have had him shoot from out there than have Weber get an inside shot."

The Broncos were down by 18 points with 41 minutes and 49 seconds left in the game. But freshman guard Chris Childs poured in seven of his team-high 18 points to lead a 27-point Boise State surge that cut the Wildcats' advantage to 64-59.  
Weber State increased its lead to 70-61 with 4:26 remaining when Dale Baum hit a 13-footer. The Broncos battled back to 72-69 on three layups by Roland Smith, who scored seven of his nine points in the second half.  
Weber's 6-foot-6 junior forward Walt Tyler, who led all scorers with 23 points, hit a short jumper from the baseline with 1:39 remaining to give the Wildcats a five-point cushion. But Childs single-handedly brought Boise State back, scoring seven points with less than a minute to go.  
Childs hit a three-point goal with



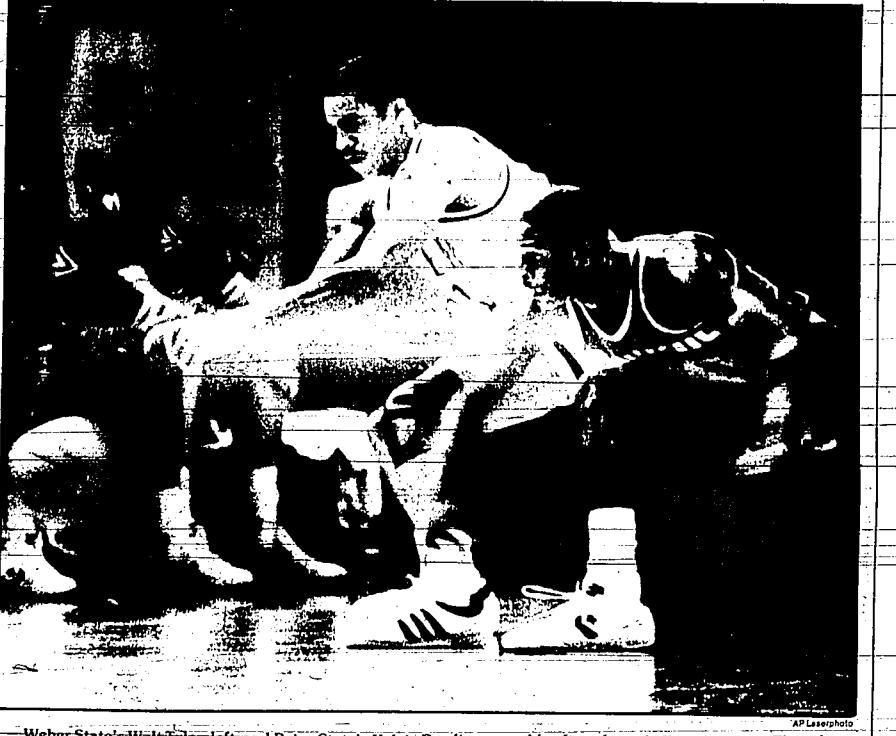

RENO, Nev. — An upset it wasn't.  
The University of Idaho stayed with Montana for 37 minutes Thursday before losing 68-60 in the opening round of the Coors Big Sky Conference Basketball Tournament.

The victory of the Grizzlies, the Big Sky's regular-season co-champions, into a semifinal game here tonight at 8 p.m. MST against Weber State, which beat Boise State 79-76 in another first-round game Thursday. Top-seeded Northern Arizona, which had a first-

round bye, was scheduled to meet the winner of Thursday's late Nevada-Reno-Montana State game in the other semifinal here tonight at 10 p.m. MST.  
Idaho Coach Bill Trumbo was proud of his team's effort.

Montana rallied to regain the lead 46-41 with 15 minutes and 58

seconds remaining on baskets by John Boyd, Larry Krystkowiak and Larry McBride.  
The Grizzlies never trailed again in the game.  
"Idaho is a credit to our conference," said Montana Coach Mike Montgomery. "Finishing last in the league and making us work as hard as we had all season is quite an accomplishment."  
McBride led Montana with 16 points on 6-for-18 shooting from the field. The Vandals double-teamed Krystkowiak, the conference's leading rebounder and No. 2 scorer, and that left McBride open.  
"What happens a lot of the time is when they double," and

sometimes triple-team Krystkowiak can get some easy baskets," said McBride, a 6-foot-10 senior. "That happened tonight in the first half."

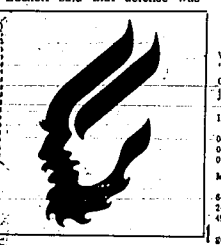

"That's a matter within the trial court's discretion," he said. Considering that Horejs has only been a full-time professional since 1979, impressive friends have been made in achieving that goal. During a tour of China in October 1983, Gov. John Evans presented a John Horejs oil painting to a top Chinese government official. In the fall of 1984, Evans' daughter, Laine, visited American countries and presented Idaho landscapes by Horejs to officials there.

A number of Idaho corporations have acquired Horejs' work for their permanent collections. They include: Sunshine Mining Company, Morrison-Knudsen, Pocatello Regional Medical Center, Jones Food Distributors, Idaho First National Bank and Ore-Ida Foods. Moreover, 500 private collectors throughout seven Western states own his paintings.

In some respects, Horejs' success comes from the idea that an artist must live and train in an Eastern culture zone, or grow only from the roots of exotic. He was born and reared in Twin Falls, where he graduated from Twin Falls Senior High School in 1967. Elaine, too, is a TFHS graduate, class of 1973.

Horejs served on an LDS mission in France for two years, living in Bourdeaux, Brest and Paris, then returned as a pre-med student at Brigham Young University. "At that point," he remembers, pointing out that next he checked out the possibility of becoming an architect.

"I didn't like all the engineering and math that went with that, so I checked into interior designing, took some art classes and have been at it ever since," he says.

Horejs' credits his aunt from Gooding-Barbara Murphy, with getting him started in oil painting, his current forte. Since his first painting sold for \$35 during a show on the Twin Falls downtown mall 12 years ago, Horejs has continued his self-education — a profitable one. His paintings now sell from \$250 to \$3,000 each.

Formally, he has studied with the late artists Oat Moller and Sergio Bongart, but only for short workshops. Yet, Horejs doesn't play

down the importance of learning from established artists. It was through those workshops that he was able to develop the loose, broad brush strokes that have become his style.

Perhaps more importantly, Horejs remembers that he had become downbeat about his own work prior to studying with Bongart. "I was about ready to quit. I went to Sergio's workshop, came home and told Elaine, 'We're never going to talk negative again.'"

Since then, Horejs notes that he's even carried that attitude over into his own teaching style. "I always tell students the positive elements and how to improve from there," he says.

Horejs began teaching eight years ago, then, because of time pressures, quit the routine two years ago. Now, he puts on an occasional workshop. "I earned more from teaching than anything else," he says, "because when you teach you have to know what you're talking about."

The artist says he has tried many mediums — water, sculpture, oil and acrylic — but has narrowed it down to oil. "You can get a texture on the surface you can't get with anything else," he explains. "There are three things that make a painting good: composition, color balance and surface quality," he says, noting that, for him, oil serves the purpose best.

Most satisfying to the artist is that his paintings look like his own, not an imitation of somebody else. "I use my own subject matter, my own colors and I don't need to copy anybody," he says, pointing out that he has long since cancelled all art magazines.

Part of Horejs' style comes from serendipitous happenings. A dropped painting during Twin Falls Art in the Park one year smeared some of his detailed trees and taught him that trees in the distance should be soft and muted, not detailed. An accidental mixing of orange and blue led him to his present color theory.

Horejs has also developed some rules that could prove strong advice for all artists: "You have to be a good businessman. Business is an art in itself. You have to paint what you love. Anything you paint is redundant; it's all been painted before — but not the way I do it!"

**Alabama nominated for country music awards**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hank Williams Jr. and the band Alabama received four nominations each in the Academy of Country Music awards competition including entertainer and album of the year selections, officials said Wednesday.

Lee Greenwald, Ricky Skaggs and George Strait were also nominated in several categories, including entertainer of the year for the 21st annual presentations of the "Hat" trophies, which are shaped like a Stetson.

Winners will be announced April 14 during a nationally televised program on NBC-TV.

Five nominees in each award category were selected by the 2,800 members of the academy.

Considering that Horejs has only been a full-time professional since 1979, impressive inroads have been made in achieving that goal. During a tour of China in October 1983, Gov. John Evans presented a John Horejs oil painting to a top Chinese government official. In the fall of 1984, Evans toured several Latin American countries and presented Idaho landscapes by Horejs to officials there.

"A number of Idaho corporations have acquired Horejs' work for their permanent collections. They include: Sunshine Mining Company, Morrison-Knudsen, Pocatello Regional Medical Center, Jones Food Distributors, Idaho First National Bank and Ore-Ida Foods. Moreover, 58 private collectors throughout seven Western states own his paintings.

In some respects, Horejs' success pokes fun at the idea that an artist must live and train in an Eastern city. Horejs, 58, was born and reared in Twin Falls where he graduated from Twin Falls Senior High School in 1967. Elaine, too, is a TFHS graduate, class of 1973.

Horejs served on an LDS mission in France for two years, living in Bourdeaux, Brest and Paris, then returned as a pre-med student at Brigham Young University. "At that point I wanted to be a psychiatrist," he remembers, noting that next he checked out the possibility of becoming an architect.

"I didn't like all the engineering math that went with that, so I checked into interior designing. I took some art classes and have been in it ever since," he says.

Horejs credits his aunt from Gooding, Barbara Murphy, with getting him started in oil painting, his current forte. Since his first painting sold for \$35 during a show on the Twin Falls downtown mall 12 years ago, Horejs has continued his self-education for a profitable one. His paintings now sell from \$250 to \$3,000 each.

Formally, he has studied with the late artists Olat Moller and Sergal Bongart, but only for short workshops. Yet, Horejs doesn't play

down the importance of learning from established artists. It was through those workshops that he was able to develop the loose, broad brush strokes that have become his style.

Perhaps more importantly, Horejs remembers that he had become doubtful about his own work prior to studying with Bongart. "I was about ready to quit. I went to Sergal's workshop, came home and told Elaine, 'We're never going to talk negative again.'"

Since then, Horejs notes that he's even carried that attitude over into his own teaching style. "I always tell students the positive elements and how to improve from them," he says.

Horejs began teaching eight years ago, then, because of time pressures, quit the routine two years ago. Now, he puts on an occasional workshop. "I learned more from teaching than anything else," he says, "because when you teach you have to know what you're talking about."

The artist says he has tried many mediums—water, sculpture, oil and acrylic—but has narrowed it down to oil. "You can get a texture on the surface you can't get with anything else," he explains. "There are three things that make a painting good: composition, color balance and surface quality," he says, noting that, for him, oil serves the purpose best.

Most satisfying to the artist is that his paintings look like his own, not an imitation of somebody else's. "I use my own subject matter, my own colors and I don't need to copy anybody," he says, pointing out that he has long since cancelled all art magazines.

Part of Horejs' style comes from serendipitous happenings. A dropped painting during Twin Falls' Art in the Park one year smeared some of his detailed trees and taught him that trees in the distance should be soft and not detailed. An accidental mixing of orange and blue led him to his present color theory. Horejs has also developed some rules that could prove strong advice for all artists: "You have to be a good businessman. Business is an art in itself. You have to paint what you love. Anything you paint is redundant; it's all been painted before—but not the way I do it!"

# Alabama nominated for country music awards

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hank Williams Jr. and the band Alabama received four nominations each in the Academy of Country Music awards competition including entertainer and album of the year selections, officials said Wednesday.

Lee Greenwood, Ricky Skaggs and George Strait were also nominated in seasonal categories, including entertainer of the year for the 21st annual presentations of the "Hot" trophies, which are shaped like a Stetson.

Winners will be announced April 14 during a nationally televised program on NBC-TV. Five nominees in each award category were selected by the 2,600 members of the academy.

Nominated for best album were "10-Hour Work" by Alabama, "Five-O" by Williams, "Does Ft. Worth Ever Cross Your Mind?" by Strait, "Why Not Me?" by the mother-daughter duo The Judds, and "Highways" by the quartet of Willie Nelson, Johnny Cash, Waylon Jennings and Kris Kristofferson.

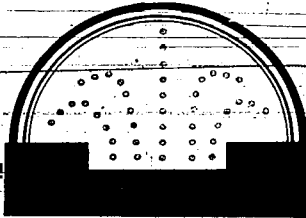

# Oregon beach treasures in photo exhibit at CSI

TWIN FALLS — The College of Southern Idaho's Sunspot Gallery will feature the work of photographer Dianne Kornberg of Portland, Ore., Feb. 28 to March 28. The exhibit features nine large black-and-white images, all printed to introduce hints of reddish brown light into the prints.

The photographs, delicate studio constructions made from objects found along coastal beaches, estuaries, and inland waters, are the work of an inspired beachcomber. The "magnum series," as she titles them, were begun at Camp Magruder on the Oregon Coast in June, 1984, while Kornberg was teaching a photo workshop.

"I've become a gatherer of the form and jetsam often overlooked for its non-conformity with the commonplace beautiful," Kornberg says. "I'm interested in the recurring structure in nature — a barnacle-encrusted shell like a moonscape; an asteroid spinning in the void; grains of sand; the stars."

Wesley Wada of the CSI art department says of Kornberg's photographs, "They have a very sensual quality. That's what strikes me about them; the serendipity of being able to find such objects and present them."

Kornberg, an art professor at Linfield College in McMinnville, Ore., is fascinated by these aquatic castoffs found in the boundary zones between land and sea, civilization and nature. The images take on

a stark totemic quality as objects once living or useful become symbolic echoes of their past.

An example is her "Crab Mask," which is described by Wada as having a "theatrical quality." "It's costume like. I expect to see in a Greek play," he says.

Another, "Kelp Crab," gives the viewer the impression of looking down upon a mountain range with lakes, rivers and a giant crustacean guardian protecting it all.

Yet, Wada points out that each viewer might see something different. "What you see in it is what you bring to it," he says.

Kornberg explains: "I'm fascinated by the sensual qualities of a still moist piece of seaweed cradling a round, bleached, dry shell; itself in the death-grip of a gnarled root. I photograph the tracks, the remnants of the inhabitants of another time frame. I collect objects that are a record of something that passes unnoticed."

In the last five years Kornberg has shown her photography in over two dozen exhibitions in the United States and Japan. She has taught at several Portland area schools and as a workshop assistant at the Friends of Photography Workshops in Carmel, Calif.

Viewing hours are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday. The Sunspot Gallery is located on the second floor of the Taylor Administration Building.

**THE BEST OF TIMES (PG-13)** — This is both a lip-smacking tale of all-American wish-fulfillment, and a witty satire of its dangers. We watch Jack Dundee (Robin Williams), obsessed with the long bomb he once dropped (destroying his high school's hope of making an endless losing streak). To talk his fellow alumni, including star-gone-to-seed Kurt Russell, into replaying the crucial game, Ron Shelton's script has a wickedly tight grip on the absurdities and dynamics of small-town America — where teenage athletes are gladiators of local honor, and their elders are has-beens or never-wases. As the central pair, Williams and Russell could not be better.

**THE COLOR PURPLE (PG-13)** — This time out, director Steven Spielberg has chosen to put an antic disposition on and his almost every decision has been disastrous. He has prettified Alice Walker's novel, made its comic scenes slapstick, and

has tipped over the book's crucial relationship. But whatever the faults of the director's artistic choices, he has collected a near-perfect cast: Whoopi Goldberg's compelling, incandescent Celie, Margaret Avery's electrifying, changeable Shug Avery, and Oprah Winfrey's indomitable, unforgettable Sofia.

**DOWN AND OUT IN BEVERLY HILLS (R)** — Co-writer-director-producer Paul Marzinsky's deft and affectionate pinning of some butterflies in his own yard, the preposterously rich Whiteman family (Richard Dreyfuss, Bette Midler, Margaret Avery) electrifying, changeable Shug Avery, and Oprah Winfrey's indomitable, unforgettable Sofia.

**MURPHY'S ROMANCE (R)** — A contemporary Western romance — a June-November courtship comedy that is also a moral fable about making the right choices: bright and earthy and solid, just like his stars, Sally Field and James Garner. Martin Ritt blends them cannily: Garner's super-relaxed style, his maverick-ability, plays wonderfully against Field, who gives what is undoubtedly her sexiest performance. It seems like we are getting the real Ritt here, the real Field and Garner — and, even if we are not, they are a delightful group to spend an evening with: warm, funny, the salt of the earth.

**101 DALMATIANS (G)** — This 25-year-old film looks newer, fresher and brighter than many more-recent animated features. The solidly constructed story centers on the search for a batch of stolen Dalmatian puppies that must be rescued before they're turned into fur coats. "Cruella DeVil," a redoubtable mixture of evil and comedy dominates the picture, but all the characters

are interesting and well-animated. A well-structured film that the entire family can attend to.

**OUT OF AFRICA (PG)** — Because we are in a well-defined, faintly magical, perfectly appointed past where a level of intelligence is prized in this film, what is its problem? Casting, mostly, and a sense of place: Meryl Streep, as Isak Dinesen, may convince us utterly that she is in love with Africa, but our views of it are a little too stately to really feel the place. And Robert Redford's Denis Finch Hutton is a real center. Streep can pretty nearly do anything in the film — except that she cannot provide all the heat in a love affair when Redford is not giving much to his role.

**'House' dethrones comedy**

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** — "House" haunted "Down and Out in Beverly Hills" over the weekend, stripping the comedy from its four-week reign as No. 1 in the box office scramble. New World's ghoulish "House" was followed to the top by another newcomer, "Pretty in Pink."

"House," starring William Katt as a writer who moves into a house already occupied by plenty of ghosts and goblins, debuted on 1,440 screens and raked in \$6.4 million to unseat "Down and Out," which had held the top spot for four weeks running.

"Down and Out" from Touchstone tumbled down to third place, with a gross of \$4.2 million.

"Pretty in Pink," a tale of teenage romance from Paramount, took in \$6.1 million at 827 theaters. The John Hughes production stars Molly

Ringwald, Harry Dean Stanton and Andrew McCarthy.

"The Color Purple" from Warner Bros. dropped a notch from third place to fourth in the ratings, collecting \$3.6 million at 1,109 theaters and stretching its 11-week gross earnings to \$64.4 million.

"Hannah and Her Sisters" the Woody-Allen-film-from-Orion-starring Michael Caine, Mia Farrow and Barbara Hershey, expanded to 418 theaters and grossed \$3.5 million to bring its limited release four-week total to \$8.9 million. It moved to fifth place from No. 10 last week.

"Wildcats" dropped from second to sixth place, grossing \$3.2 million at 1,062 theaters and bringing its three-week total to \$15.1 million.

**PG-13 Rating Introduced**

# Hepburn joins stars in 'Spence' tribute

NEW YORK (AP) — Katharine Hepburn, Frank Sinatra and other stars and friends of the late actor Spencer Tracy rememored at a Broadway tribute Monday about the man they knew as "Spence."

Miss Hepburn and Sinatra stood on stage at the packed, 1,655-seat Majestic Theater along with actors Sidney Poitier and Robert Wagner and director Stanley Kramer during the tribute, a benefit for the American Academy of Dramatic Arts.

Tracy's daughter, Susie, stood next to Miss Hepburn as she accepted a lifetime achievement award on her father's behalf from Wagner.

Miss Hepburn introduced a documentary about Tracy that she migrates that is to be shown on public television. She said it had been researched by Susie Tracy. "She even came across her father's diary, which is quite extraordinary," said Miss Hepburn, who was the actor's longtime companion. She starred in nine films with Tracy, from "Woman of the Year" in 1942 to "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?" in 1967.

Tracy died in 1967, shortly after completing the Kramer film "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?" with Miss Hepburn and Poitier.

Tracy won two Academy Awards for acting: "Captains Courageous" in 1937 and "Boys Town" in 1938.

Wagner, who served as master of ceremonies, referred to Tracy as "my old friend, my mentor and the man I thought of as a second father."

Kramer recalled that Tracy was a tough guy who "had a facade — he didn't want to get into the sticky side of any relationship or talk."

"I loved him," said Kramer.

Poitier called Tracy "a man whose eyes fired his passion, a bright man, well-read . . . an intellectual."

Tracy began his career in 1930 and made 74 films.

His widow, Louise Treadwell Tracy, died in November 1983 at the age of 87. They were married in 1923 and separated after about 10 years, but never divorced. Besides Susie, they had two other children, John and Louise.

# Murder at a military academy: NBC airs a whodunnit in 2 parts

Old soldiers don't die. They lie. That's the premise of "Dress Gray," the two-part miniseries airing Sunday and Monday on NBC.

It concerns the death and possible murder of a homosexual cadet at a prestigious military academy and the cover-up by the academy commandant that follows. The drama is set in 1968, a time of intense anti-military feeling because of the Vietnam War.

Based on the best seller by Lucian K. Truscott IV, "Dress Gray" was originally intended to be released as a feature film in the early '80s. This TV-version was written by Gore Vidal ("Burr," "Lincoln").

In an age of born-again military-hero worship, it's almost refreshing to see a film that portends a portrayal of the dark side of military life. But that isn't exactly the purpose, says director Glenn Jordan ("Hearings," "Mass Appeal").

"The film is not anti-military," explains Jordan. "It's anti-people who use institutions, who feel more important than the institution they represent and bend and distort that institution to their own purposes."

Truscott's book, says Jordan, was vehemently opposed to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, where it was set. But that crucial aspect is sidestepped totally in the miniseries by shifting the locale to the fictitious U.S. Grant Military Academy (actually filmed at the New Mexico Military Institute in

Roswell, N.M.). "Changing locations gave us more freedom in the story," says Jordan, adding that the producers of "Dress Gray" "never asked for any cooperation" from West Point.

The cast includes Alec Baldwin as First Classman Slight, Patrick Cassidy as Cadet David Hand, on whose murder the drama pivots; Hal Holbrook as Gen. Charles Hedges, the military-academy commandant who covers up the murder; Lloyd Bridges as the academy superintendent

Major Gen. Axel Rylander; Eddie Albert as an aristocratic Southern judge; the murdered cadet's father; and Susan Hess as the boy's sister.

The miniseries also marked Vidal's return to TV after a 25-year hiatus. During the 1950s, he authored scripts for such "Golden Age of TV" productions as "Playhouse 90" and "General Electric Theater." The subject of the movie seemed to fit Vidal's background; his father, uncle and two stepbrothers were all graduates of West Point. Vidal himself was refused admittance to the USMA because of poor eyesight.

"People must realize something about the military," says Vidal. "Once you're involved with it, it never lets go. Like it or not, once you belong to that family you're there. They may not like you, but you're there. It's like the priesthood in a way. Once you sign on, it's for life. And that's what 'Dress Gray' is really about. A crisis hits the school and the first response is to close ranks. That's one of the most important themes in the story."

**Q.** What's become of one of my favorite character actresses — and characters — Hermione Gingold? Is she still around and kicking? — R.S.

**A.** Happily, both. Hermione, who's approaching 90, is a very familiar figure in her East Side Manhattan neighborhood, where she frequently

can be spotted carefully walking along the street, often accompanied by a younger fellow. She's still alert, witty and plugged into various local activities. As one example, when fire engines clang by outside her high-rise apartment, Hermione's sure to rush to the street in bathrobe and slippers, her hair in curlers, to check out the commotion first hand. She explains that as a longtime area resident, she's always vitally interested in everything going on around her.

**Q.** I enjoyed Kevin Bacon's fantastic — dance sequences in "Footloose," even though I later read that many of them were really performed by a professional dancer-double. Still, I think Kevin

demonstrates a definite feel for the dance. Does he get a chance to dance again — in his new movie "Quicksilver"? — D.B.

**A.** Kevin doesn't actually dance in "Quicksilver," in which he plays a down-on-his-luck stock market whiz who takes a job as a bike messenger. However, he was required to train rigorously for one scene in the film with pretty Whitney Kershaw, who portrays his ballerina girlfriend. For this sequence, famed choreographer Grover Dale devised an informal ballet pas-de-deux between Kevin and Whitney, with the young actor himself performing the graceful "dance" routines on his bicycle.

**Q.** Is veteran actor Joseph Cotten, who starred in so many movies with the late Orson Welles, still alive? — L.B.

**A.** Cotten, who'll be 81 this May, is a Hollywood survivor. Unlike his close friend Orson Welles, Cotten's career continued to climb after the two co-starred in the classic "Citizen Kane" in 1941. About a year or so ago Cotten suffered a stroke. He was nursed back to health by his actress-wife, Patricia Medina. I met the couple not long ago at a Hollywood charity benefit. He looked fine and spoke almost perfectly — despite the stroke — in those characteristic pearly tones.

# A self-described swine on show, Aniston's an all-around nice guy

It's kind of amusing how many of TV's most reprehensible tyrants are frequently the most charming gentlemen around.

John Aniston (Victor Kiriakos on "Days of Our Lives") is no exception. A courteous, well-traveled workaholic, John smokes long brown cigarettes while discussing his career, hobbies and favorite spots in the world.

Originally from suburban Philadelphia, John grew up in the restaurant business. After moving to New York City to act in the soaps, he found himself on "Search for Tomorrow." However, he worked only two days a week, and there was no place within walking distance from the studio for lunch.

"Freelancing, guest-starring, and working only some of the time makes me crazy. Even though I hated the restaurant business, it seemed like a good idea at the time, so I opened 'The Fives' on West 57th Street. Because there was nothing in the neighborhood, we did well right away, a couple of hundred lunches a day. Evenings were harder. We had to draw in crowds from out of the area, doing a disco or cabaret night.

"But it's a tough way to make a living. I'd get home by 3 a.m., and would have no time for anything else. After six months, I had to get a manager. There were other things to do."

Buying a country home was one of the priorities. "We couldn't decide where to buy. My wife wanted a house in the mountains, I wanted a place on the beach. We compromised with a house on the lake, so I could sail. I'm hell on wheels with my Sunfish. I was on a bigger boat that capsized once, too. The house has worked out beautifully. It's an hour from New York, and 20 minutes from the Great Gorge ski resort."

"Now we live in the Hollywood Hills. It's not in the canyons, but more of a no man's land. It's five minutes to the studio, but no one will deliver pizza there," says John, laughing.

Dining out at L.A.'s better restaurants is another favorite activity for John, who is a food connoisseur. Greek food is a preferred cuisine, although John likes everything, occasionally. His family comes from Greece, and many relatives still live

there.

"Greece is a lot like Las Vegas, in one way. It is one of the few places in the world that is everything you'd expect it to be. I spent a year living over there, in one of those ubiquitous concrete homes that they have. Even the nicest homes look very much alike, and the emphasis is on the entry way. It is a sign of status."

John's character, Victor, is in the center of the action, doing heinous things. John doesn't mind at all that his character is so bad, because he'd rather play anything but good guys.

"When I was on 'Search for Tomorrow,' my character was accused of murder by his stepbrother. He replied, 'You don't know me at all. I'm a scoundrel, not a swine.' Now, my character is definitely a swine, not a scoundrel."

## 'Explorer' to feature two area filmmakers

SUN VALLEY — Two local filmmakers will be featured on a special presentation of "National Geographic Explorer" this week.

"Backstage at the Beaver Pond" is the first 15-minute segment of Explorer to be aired on WTBS Monday at 6:05 p.m. and Saturday, March 15 at 7:05 a.m.

Jim Dutcher, along with his wife, Eill, and associate producer Peter Bricca, has been working for a year-and-a-half to create a one-hour wildlife documentary for National Geographic.

The staff of National Geographic has been monitoring the film's progress and was impressed with the quality of the production, so much so that they sent their own film crews to Ketchum last August to produce this segment about the Dutchers.

"Backstage at the Beaver Pond" provides an insight into what is involved in capturing wildlife behavior

on film, particularly that of a beaver family.

The Wood River Valley last received national attention as the site for Clint Eastwood's feature film, "Pale Rider."

"Secrets of a Mountain Pond" also contains scenery which may be recognizable to people familiar with the area since most of the film was shot on location here.

The National Geographic segment shows the film crew at work in the mountains surrounding Sun Valley and also reveals a subtle message conveyed in the film.

"The pond is a private place," Dutcher said. "Only by waiting long hours does the mystery become revealed."

He said that after people view his film, "Secrets of a Mountain Pond," they will become aware of the environment.

"When a beaver is killed, others suffer from its loss," he said. "Hopefully, the film creates a caring attitude."

# NBC's Thursday, CBS' Sunday series dominate numbers battle

NEW YORK — NBC beat CBS by one-tenth of a point in last week's ratings, as prime-time television continued to be dominated by "The Cosby Show" and its NBC run-innates on Thursday and the CBS tandem of "60 Minutes" and "Murder, She Wrote" on Sunday.

According to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co., NBC's four Thursday sitcoms all cracked the Top 10 last week, as did CBS' two Sunday series and the follow-up TV movie "Outrage."

The top-ranked "Cosby Show" had a 39.0 rating, its series high, and the best performance for a series episode since the "Who Shot J.R.?" resolution program on "Dallas" recorded a 53.3 in 1980. The "Cosby" rating was the highest for a sitcom since "All in the Family" registered 40.0 in 1972.

"Cosby's" appeal boosted the debut of Jack Klugman's new series, "You Agahn?," which had widespread negative reviews but followed "Cosby" on the schedule and ranked second with a 34.6 rating. "Cheers" was third on NBC's Thursday lineup and in last week's rank-

ings with a series-high 26.0 rating.

"Cheers" followed by No. 8 "Night Court" and No. 21 "Hill Street Blues," all were helped by CBS' pre-emption of its regular programs, "Simon & Simon" and "Knots Landing," for a repeat of the movie, "Kojak: The Belarus File," which ranked 43rd out of 63 shows.

"Hill Street Blues" ranked 21st and had its best percentage of the 9 p.m. MST viewing audience in two years, 32 percent. The ABC competition, "20-20," also performed well, ranking 27th. Earlier, ABC's "Cobys," which ranked 26th, had its highest Thursday night rating.

On Sunday, it was CBS' turn to shine. "60 Minutes" tied for fifth with a 24.6 rating, followed by seventh-ranked "Murder, She Wrote." That lead-in benefited "Outrage," which ranked ninth. ABC's TV-movie competition, "Acceptable Risks," was 58th and NBC's repeat of the feature film, "48 HRS.," was 13th.

"48 HRS.," starring Eddie Murphy and Nick Nolte, had a 20.2 rating, just one-tenth of a point less than its first broadcast last November.

After Friday night, CBS and NBC were tied in last week's ratings, but NBC's weekend performance, led by No. 5 "Golden Girls" on Saturday,

provided the edge over CBS' poor Saturday and powerful Sunday. For the week of Feb. 24-March 2, NBC had an average prime-time rating of 17.4 to CBS' 17.3 and ABC's 13.5. ABC only had No. 14 "Dynasty" and No. 18 "Who's the Boss?" in the Top 20.

After 23 weeks of the 30-week prime-time season, NBC leads with a 17.9 rating to CBS' 17.0 and ABC's 15.1.

In the evening news competition, the "CBS Evening News" won for the 200th consecutive week. Dan Rather's broadcast, which emanated from farm country in the Midwest last week, had a 13.4 rating. Tom Brokaw's "NBC Nightly News," which came from New York and Washington, averaged a 12.6. ABC's "World News Tonight," with anchor Peter Jennings reporting from Moscow for the Soviet Party Congress, had an 11.6.

The previous week, "NBC Nightly News" was one-tenth of a point behind the "CBS Evening News." "That was an aberration," said Mike Eisenberg, CBS' research director, who acknowledged that in the past year NBC's newscast has gained audience, while ABC's and CBS' broadcasts have lost viewers.

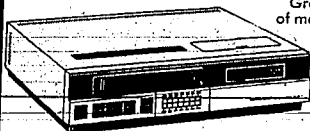

## C-SPAN will air Senate action

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gavel-to-gavel telecasts of Senate floor action will be carried by satellite to millions of cable-connected households across the nation for a trial period starting June 1, a network spokesman said.

Proceedings will be carried on Cable-Satellite Public Affairs Network, which has transmitted House action since 1979, spokeswoman Liz Bauer said.

The Senate last week approved the nationwide test of gavel-to-gavel radio and television broadcasts of its proceedings. The experiment ends July 15 but could be extended indefinitely.

Minority Leader Robert C. Byrd, D-W.Va., told reporters Friday he believes television is in the Senate to stay and that it would bring the nation's top legislative body "into the 20th century."

Under the plan, the television signal the Senate has allocated \$3.5 million to provide will be available to any network that wants to plug in. Networks other than C-SPAN usually confine what they show of House floor action to segments on regular news programs.

C-SPAN officials said the House is carried by its Galaxy I satellite hookup to 23 million U.S. households.

# 'Sweeps' period ends in 2-way tie

HOLLYWOOD — Bolstered by Joan Collins' miniseries "Sins" and closing-week Nielsen victories for "Blood & Orchids" and the Grammy Awards telecast, CBS has tied NBC in prime-time ratings averages for the key ratings "sweeps" period that began Jan. 30 and ended Wednesday.

"We're calling it a moral victory," a CBS spokesman said, partly in jest.

After six seasons as the prime-time ratings winner, CBS now is second to NBC in season-to-date ratings averages, but is given little chance of winning this season's race, even with the A.C. Nielsen results for the February sweeps.

Those audience estimates say CBS

and NBC wound up in a dead heat at the end of the four-week period, with each averaging a 17.8 rating and a 27 percent share of the national audience. ABC, which ended last season in third place and is still there, came out third in the February battle, averaging a 15 rating and a 23 percent audience share.

Each ratings point equals 659,000 homes.

The ratings sweeps, of which there are four a year, are periods when Nielsen measures the audience for every TV station in the country, not just those in the largest cities or that are network affiliates. The stations use the ratings reports to set prices for the air time that they hope to sell to advertisers.

CBS' tie with NBC during the just-completed race was in large

part due to two miniseries. Its "Sins" bested NBC's "Peter the Great" as February began, followed by a Sunday-Monday victory this week for CBS' "Blood & Orchids" against ABC's "Crossings."

Although knocked by some critics, CBS' telecast of Tuesday night's Grammy Awards show also greatly aided the network's cause. The three-hour show averaged a 20.3 rating, easily outpacing its closest competition, the closing night of "Crossings," which got a 17.4.

Despite CBS' sweeps-period tie with NBC, the Peacock Network still found something to crow about. A spokesman, considering the tie a shared victory, said it was the fourth sweeps victory in a row for NBC.

## Television producers sue ABC over its alleged 'double dipping'

LOS ANGELES — Studios and producers who provide more than 90 percent of prime-time TV programming filed a \$1.5 billion suit against the ABC network last week, saying they were cheated out of hundreds of millions of dollars.

Seven studios and six leading independent producers accused the network of "double-dipping" by trying to recover the federal tax credits allowed to the producers over 14 years.

A spokeswoman for ABC said the lawsuit was without merit.

The producers contend ABC unfairly told them since the 1970s that the producers would receive undisputed federal investment tax credits in return for accepting low television license fees. The network pays the fees to producers for rights to broadcast programs twice during a season.

But since 1982, ABC has been seeking in U.S. Claims Court to recover the same credits for itself, according to a statement from the Motion Picture Association of America.

The suit filed in Los Angeles Superior Court names Capital Cities-ABC Inc. as a defendant.

The producers claim ABC is violating contracts by claiming the tax credits for itself, and that producers

made deals that cost them hundreds of millions of dollars in fees sacrificed to anticipated tax credits. The producers did not specify how much money they allege was lost.

Producers have been allowed the tax credits over the years in question, but ABC is seeking to recover the credit for itself in claims court. The producers have joined the government's side in that Washington, D.C., action.

"What we're saying in this lawsuit is, 'You can't have it both ways,'" said Stuart Rabinowitz, an attorney representing the producers. "Over the years, ABC understood, the government understood, and we understood that we should get the tax credit, because the producers took the investment risk and had ownership of the product."

"We regret that the producers have apparently decided to file this suit, which is unfortunate and wholly without merit," said Patricia Matson, ABC vice-president for corporate relations. "We continue to be willing to discuss the range of issues between us and the producers in good faith."

The lawsuit comes at a time when networks have decided to refuse to give higher license fees to production companies for pilots. Rabinowitz denied the lawsuit was connected with the current negotiations over pilot fees.

The amount of money paid for television series has long been a matter of dispute between the networks and producers. Generally, producers made a series at a loss in the hope that it would later recover the money in syndication. However, changing conditions in the television syndication market are making it difficult now for the studios to recover their deficits.

The studios are Columbia Pictures Industries Inc., MGM-UA Entertainment Co., Paramount Pictures Corp., Twentieth Century Fox Film Corp., Universal City Studios Inc., Warner Bros. Inc., and Walt Disney Co. Independent producers are Aaron Spelling, Lorimar, MTM, Steve Cannell, Witt Thomas Harris and Carsey-Werner.

The studios and production companies say they produce 90 percent of the prime-time television entertainment programs.

ABC and CBS do not engage in such "double-dipping," the complaint alleges.

The suit seeks compensatory and punitive damages from the network and asks the court to rescind license agreements for television programs being broadcast. It also asks that other contracts be changed to award producers the fair market value of their programs.

Capital Cities completed a \$3.5 billion acquisition of ABC in January.

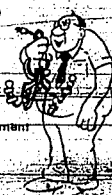

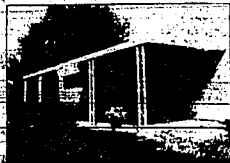

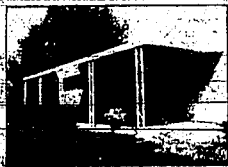

# Showtime plans to expand film list with pay-per-view channel

**HOLLYWOOD** — Pay-per-view, the cable industry's answer to home videocassettes, took another step forward last week. Viewer's Choice, a service offered by Showtime-The Movie Channel, announced that it will soon begin feeding via satellite a second channel of pay-per-view movies to cable-system operators, who will in turn offer them to cable homes for about \$4 to \$5 for a single viewing.

Viewer's Choice Channel 2 will be launched as early as next month, and no later than June, Scott Kurnit, executive vice president in charge of pay-per-view for Showtime, said.

The idea behind pay-per-view is that movie fans who currently run down to their local video store to rent cassettes would be willing to spend a few dollars more for the convenience of having the films

pipled into their home.

Unlike subscription-based pay-cable channels, the viewer pays each time a film is watched, rather than by the month, but a newer selection of films is available. Most major film studios allow channels such as Viewer's Choice to market their product about the same time the videocassette of the film becomes available, typically months before it will be seen on such monthly services as Showtime or Home Box Office.

Availability of a second satellite-fed channel allows Viewer's Choice to "give greater exposure to the top titles," Kurnit said. "Unlike a video store, the broadcast environment needs lots of exposure."

Viewer's Choice Channel 1, which Showtime put on satellite in November, currently repeats a single movie title throughout a given week, a play that the service found

increased viewing of "Flashdance" by 40 percent when it was offered two years ago. Viewer's Choice Channel 2, which is available in some areas by cassettes delivered to cable operators, will repeat some of those titles and will offer another 30 or so per year, Kurnit said.

Viewer's Choice is competing in the pay-per-view market with Request channel and The People's Choice. One stumbling block they all face is that pay-per-view only works where cable systems are addressable — that is, the system operator can send a signal to a specific home with the flick of a switch.

Viewer's Choice has contracts signed that make it available to a potential 800,000 addressable subscribers, Kurnit said. There are about 40 million cable homes in the United States, he said, of which about 7 million are addressable and 2.5 million are offered pay-per-view.

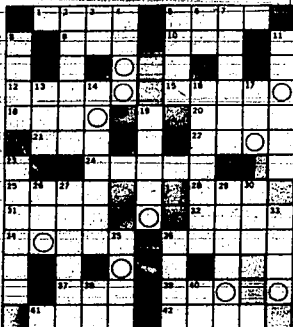

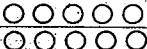

WASHINGTON — NBC has announced that it has scheduled "Bob Hope's Royal Command Performance from Sweden" for Wednesday, March 19.

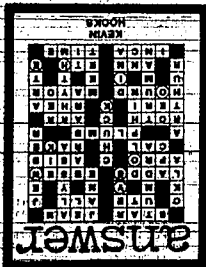
The network apparently got a go-

ahead from Swedish officials for tapings in Stockholm Tuesday and Wednesday, despite the assassination of Prime Minister Olof Palme in that city last week.

Proceeds from the March 4 Royal Gala, during which segments of the TV show were to be filmed, will go to the Children's International Summer Villages, an organization involving 92 nations.

NBC said that Hope and his wife Dolores are to be received at the Royal Palace by King Carl XVI Gustav and Queen Silvia.

In what could prove to be embarrassing to the network, NBC also announced that "in one of his sketches for the TV Special, Hope — as Olaf the Obnoxious — discovers America some 500 years before Columbus."
