House rejects Contra aid package

WASHINGTON — A sharply divided House, on a 222-210 vote Thursday, defeated President Reagan's plan to send \$100 million in military aid to Nicaraguan rebels.

The dramatic setback followed two weeks of intense personal lobbying by the president.

Presidential spokesman Larry Spokes said the administration will not abandon the fight. "We're gaining converts, and the next battle will bring us victory," he said.

"Again and again until this battle is won, until freedom is given the chance that it deserves in Nicaragua"

"The American people have begun to awaken to the danger emerging on their doorstep," he said. "And one day in the not too distant future that awareness will come home to the House of Representatives."

The vote followed two days of often bitter debate that ended with O'Neill saying Reagan's plan "takes us further down the road to a situation where our troops will be involved."

House Minority Leader Bob Michel, R-Ill., responded to O'Neill: "Today, you're wrong, you're wrong, you're wrong... A month from now

will be too late because the communists are already mobilizing for an offensive."

Although the House vote represented a defeat for Reagan's Nicaraguan policy, O'Neill apparently won some last-minute votes by promising a new round of votes on alternative aid proposals on April 15. Reagan is considered likely to win some aid for the rebels at that time.

Sixteen Republicans joined 206 Democrats in opposing Reagan's proposal. Forty-six Democrats, many from southern states, and 164 Republicans voted for the aid.

House Majority Whip Thomas Foley, D-Wash., said Reagan's defeat "shows Congress resented attempts by the administration to question the patriotism of aid opponents. That was scandalous. That was unfortunate and classically ineffective."

Despite losing vote, Reagan advances

WASHINGTON — President Reagan lost a battle in the House of Representatives Thursday, but in the long run his crusade for U.S. military aid to Nicaraguan rebels appears to have advanced.

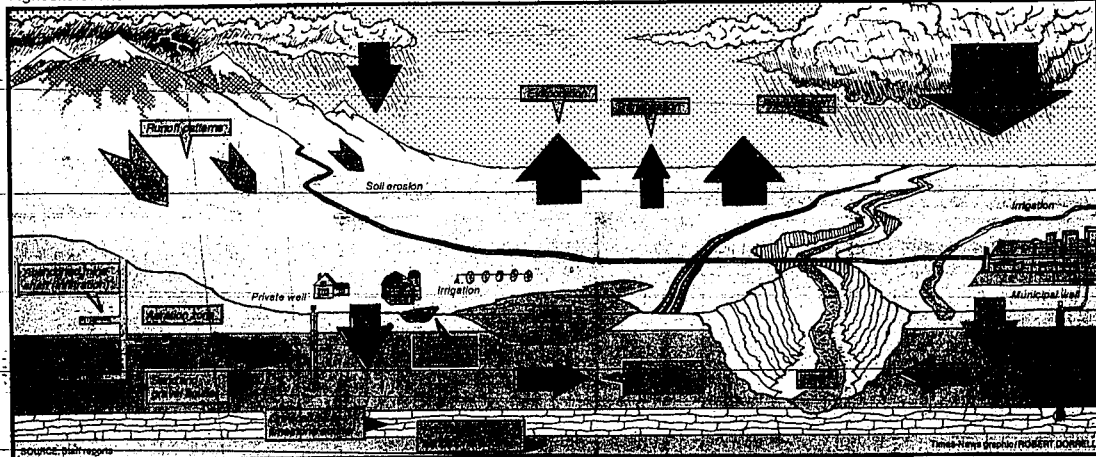
Amid the polarized and partisan debate over aid to the Contras, the outlines of a new consensus could be faintly discerned.

TWIN FALLS — Groundwater contamination by pesticides has been detected with disturbing frequency in the United States during the past five years.

Officials from the Suffolk County Department of Health Services and the State University of New York's School of Medicine at Stony Brook have suggested the contamination may be linked to nerve damage in area residents. As a result, the pesticide, which is widely used in Idaho on potatoes, has been banned in Long Island. Problems have also been detected with Temik contamination of groundwater in California, Wisconsin and Florida.

"When I got my degree in agricultural engineering 20 years ago at Iowa State University, everyone knew that agricultural chemicals were degraded, volatilized, or tied up in the soil," said Bill Mullen, head of the EPA's Groundwater Program for the Pacific Northwest. "They were not a problem for groundwater."

agricultural chemicals on surface waters — rivers and lakes — groundwater contamination may become an issue of even greater concern. From 1950 to 1980, the nation's use of groundwater jumped from 30 billion gallons per day to more than 90 billion gallons per day. While much of the increase has been in agricultural irrigation, Mullen says, it is increasing importance for domestic needs. In Idaho, groundwater provides more than 90 percent of the state's drinking water.

"We defined a list of 15 potential contaminants and pesticides came out about in the middle," said Cheryl Brower of the state's Division of Environment. "That's based more on just a lack of information than anything else," she said of the ranking. The ranking was done as part of a study by the U.S. Geological Survey. See GROUNDWATER on Page A2

3 more capsules tamper victims

WASHINGTON — The Food and Drug Administration said Thursday that packages of three major consumer drugs — the capsule versions of Contac, Diatrac and Teltrin — have been tampered with and the manufacturer is warning consumers nationwide not to use the products.

"As of this moment, our lab findings confirm some tampering with packages, but we have no evidence of poisoning of any kind," FDA spokesman Bruce Brown said.

The FDA said SmithKline Beckman Corp., of Philadelphia, manufacturer of the drugs, is asking all retailers to halt sales of the products, and consumers who have purchased the drugs since March 15 should not use them.

Brown said the tampering took the form of physically altered packages — plastic blisters over capsules that were opened, price stickers that were moved, ingredients in the capsules that were not part of the normal recipe.

However, he said, investigators found no cyanide or rat poison, substances mentioned in threats to consumers nationwide. Foreign ingredients in the capsules were not poisonous, he said.

Brown said the threats originated in an anonymous telephone call to news media beginning on Wednesday. The first day's calls contended that packages containing doctored capsules had been delivered to stores in Houston and Orlando, Fla.

More calls received Thursday added Chicago and St. Louis to the list, he said.

Although the threats were limited to those cities, he said, the company's warning was addressed to consumers nationwide.

He said the threats may be linked with a grudge against the company, but constitute extortion under federal law.

Reagan signs critical changes in 1985 farm bill into law

WASHINGTON — President Reagan has signed into law a package of changes to last year's farm bill, the Food Security Act of 1985, the White House announced Thursday.

Among the changes is a provision designed to prevent a damaging shift of production from wheat, corn and other government-subsidized crops into smaller, unsubsidized crops, such as dry edible beans, Idaho's congressmen said Thursday.

The changes approved by Congress also authorized the administration to advance farmers part of their 1986 crop price support loans when they sign up for the programs.

But Reagan said he will not implement the advances because Congress "which had been tied up for days on the specific wording finally adopted language making those loan advances completely discretionary."

"The program is ill advised and unnecessary, and my administration will not use its discretion to implement it," he said in a statement.

Farmers are signing up for 1986 crop programs now. Normally, price support loans are available at harvest, but Congress allowed advances of part of the money now to help farmers through spring planting.

Reagan's signature Thursday apparently heads off a crisis for growers of many commodities that do not have government support programs.

The original version of the farm bill allowed farmers raising wheat, corn and other government-supported crops to earn subsidies in a new way. On part of their land, they could substitute unsupported crops, such as dry beans, potatoes, peas, onions and lentils.

However, commodity groups quickly protested that the provision would trigger a disaster in their small markets. Farmers would switch large acreages from wheat and corn and swamp their markets with unnecessary production. Prices would fall drastically, they said.

Prices in bean markets dropped 33 or more per hundredweight in the short few weeks while the change was being considered, Harold Wilson of Beakon Bean Co., a Gooding spokesman for the Western Bean Dealers Association, told a congressional subcommittee.

This new package prevents farmers from receiving government income support payments for growing the unsubsidized crops. Exceptions are for farmers who concluded sale contracts for their crops before late February when the bill was written. A few relatively obscure industrial crops also are exempted.

"This is clearly good news for Idaho farmers," said Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, architect of the bill in the Senate. "Had the president not taken swift action on this measure, many of our farmers would have faced the threat of having their markets devastated."

Republicans, Democrats each win one for state's farmers

BOISE — Senate Democrats and Republicans on the Agricultural Affairs Committee traded one for one today by passing a pair of bills designed to help Idaho's troubled farmers.

House Bill 590, sponsored by GOP gubernatorial candidate David Leroy, passed on a unanimous roll-call vote.

Senate Bill 1384, one piece of a five-part Democratic farm bill package, passed 63-3, with three Republicans helping the committee's three Democrats pass the bill.

"The first would allow banks and individuals to make limited operating loans to

farmers without paying income taxes on the interest income. Tax revenue losses were estimated at \$3 million-\$9 million.

The second bill would link the state with the federal government in an interest rate "buy down" program that would reduce in-

terest rates for farmers so that they can more easily turn a profit. The estimated cost of the plan is \$3 million.

Senate Democratic Caucus Chairman Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey, said the passage of the Democrats' bill to set up a program to "buy down" farm loan interest rates is one of the biggest Democratic wins of this legislative session.

He said he wouldn't have given the bill more than a 10-1 chance of passage six weeks ago.

Still, he said, the bill will face an uphill battle on the Senate floor and more of the same in the House. But Peavey said he is not writing off passage by the House. "There's more of a fluid situation in the Republican

caucus in the House... they don't vote as a block."

Peavey said there may have been an implied tradeoff between the parties on the two farm bills, but he didn't know of any specific deal.

Sen. Lynn Tomlinaga, R-Paul, spoke against the Democrats' bill, saying the interest rate program will not help enough farmers and shuts out farmers who do not borrow money from the Farmers Home Administration.

Sen. Dwight Horsch, D-Aberdeen, said that if the Legislature can approve millions of dollars in state spending for renovations to libraries and other state buildings, there ought to be money in the budget to help

farmers. "I personally think when there is a need... the wisdom lies in the JFAC (budget) committee to find the money,"

Horsch said. Committee Chairman Sen. Skip Smyser, R-Parma, said he thought that argument swayed some Republicans on the committee to support the bill.

Smyser said passage of the bill by the full Senate will be difficult but is possible for the Democrats. "It hits the immediate need, that one had real appeal," Smyser said.

A second part of the Democratic farm package, which would establish a loan program for starting farmers, was given a reprieve. It will be amended and then voted on.

Deregulation bill passed by Senate

BOISE (AP) — Deregulation of Idaho's telecommunications industry through what both sides have labeled one of the most-radical approaches considered by any state in the nation has cleared the Idaho Senate.

By a lopsided 29-13 vote late Thursday, the Senate endorsed the plan, backed by both Mountain Bell Telephone and organized labor, and sent it to the House, where its fate remained clouded as the legislature moved toward what could be its final week.

"This is a bill that authorizes the orderly transition from a regulated telecommunications industry to an industry which provides a competitive market environment," Sen. Herb Carlson, R-Eagle, the bill's sponsor, told his colleagues in labeling the vote "an historic moment."

Under the measure, revised from an original version to include what industry officials said were greater protections for telephone consumers, Mountain Bell and any other company can free itself from 70 years of state regulation upon show-

ing that the move will not damage universal service and is in the public interest.

Bill officials contend they need deregulation to compete with long-distance and other telecommunications companies that have moved in on its territory in the wake of the nationwide ordered break up of the nationwide Bell system.

But critics have warned that deregulation signals skyrocketing telephone bills and will spell the end of universal service.

"You're letting a tiger out of the cage," Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey, warned his colleagues. "And those who play with uncaged tigers get eaten alive."

In an attempt to try to ease opposition to the bill, the industry agreed to impose a cap on rate increases for basic residential service during the initial five years of deregulation. But opponents claimed that cap of \$2 a month per year will not protect many of the small businessmen who rely heavily on telephone service.

Three area senators ask for divine pardon

BOISE — Three Magic Valley senators have signed their names to a petition asking Almighty God and President Reagan to pardon George Hansen.

The petition is being circulated by James King, a recent entrant into the Republican gubernatorial race.

Sens. Larry Anderson, R-Twin Falls, Denton Darrington, R-Declo, and Lynn Tomlinaga, R-Paul, were three of the four senators who had signed the petition Thursday morning.

The wording of the petition asks "Almighty God and you Mr. President" to pardon Idaho's embattled former congressman.

Anderson said he signed the petition in support of a pardon for Hansen because there are other violators of the Ethics in Government Act who have not been prosecuted.

"Tomlinaga said, 'The main thing is I feel like it was not the

intention of Congress for congressman Hansen to go to jail.'"

He said large fines levied against Hansen would be appropriate, but not jail.

Darrington said, "I don't think he should go to jail for it."

King said he had the idea at 4 a.m. Thursday and is looking for a way to help Hansen in his battle to stay out of jail. Time is running short for Hansen, so he needs help quickly, King said.

"Everybody's a prima donna," King said of his inability to get any senator or member of the House "to carry the petition around for him.

King said he is not circulating the petition to win support for his bid for the governor's office. But he did say the petition may win him some friends. "The way you make friends is to be one," he said.

King billed himself as "God Almighty & the People's Choice," in a press release he circulated earlier this week.

One-university bills put to rest until 1987

BOISE — Time ran out Thursday on legislative proposals to reorganize Idaho's university system.

Senate Bills 1335 and 1336 got their last hearing of the 1986 legislative session in the Senate Education Committee Thursday morning, but the committee opted to let both bills rest for resurrection in next year's session.

By either creating a one-university system similar to California's or granting overall responsibility to a chancellor of higher education, the bills aimed at streamlining Idaho higher education.

Committee Chairman Sen. Terry Sverdsten, R-Cataldo, said Idaho's four-year schools need to cooperate more than they do and he hopes debate over the proposals will continue next year.

Propped by criticism of college accrediting authorities who have said the statewide university system is not governed as well as the individual schools, the proposed unification of the university system is seen by proponents as a way to

save money and improve education. Sen. Laird Holt, R-Kimberly, said Thursday afternoon that the proposals might be studied this summer by a committee that is also looking at Idaho's junior colleges.

Former board of education member Bob Montgomery told the committee Thursday that even if legislation to unify the university system passes, change would come slowly. "I would be surprised to see any change in this century," Montgomery said.

Under a one-university or chancellor system, he said, the budgeting and purchasing departments of the state's four-year schools could be consolidated, saving money. But because each school will protect itself from cuts, those changes will be politically hard to make.

Cap on credit card interest effectively killed

BOISE (AP) — In a move supporters said effectively killed the bill, the Idaho Senate has voted to send legislation capping the interest rate that can be charged on revolving credit card balances back to committee.

By a vote of 26-16 Thursday, the Senate refused the request of sponsor Roger Fairchild, R-Fruitland, to reorganize the bill for technical modifications on the floor to clarify

its meaning. The measure, capping credit card interest rates at 8 percentage points above the federal discount rate, had won tentative approval in the chamber on a day earlier on an unrecorded 24-13 standing vote.

Fairchild, conceding that the cap was targeted at the banking industry with which he has a personal feud over his own business loans, claimed bankers had broken faith

with the people when three years ago they promised to hold credit card interest rates at reasonable levels in return for deregulation of consumer credit user fees.

Since then, however, general interest rates have plunged but credit card interest has remained between 18, percent and 21 percent, what Fairchild labeled as "unfair usury" on the estimated \$150 million in consumer credit in the state.

Chances approach to remedy situation

As sure as the crocus and the robin, school override elections are rapidly becoming another sign of spring.

School districts, forced into ever-tightening financial straits, are turning to these special property tax levies to stay afloat. Some districts are new at the override game, while others have depended on the tax for so long they would sink without it.

Unlike the flowers and birds of the season, however, overrides are dreaded by school officials and taxpayers alike. Spring has become a time for educators to nervously wear out pencils and erasers trying to keep budgets balanced, while taxpayers agonize over whether they can afford to dig a little deeper again next year.

The root of the problem, of course, is underfunding of schools at the state level. The problems have been around for years, but legislators consistently refuse to tackle the school funding formula, consolidation of small districts and genuine tax reform. Until these complex and controversial issues are resolved, the cycle of dependence on overrides will continue and even grow.

Instead, the Legislature prefers to spend its valuable time quibbling over such inanities as who among our honorable representatives is a "queer lover" or relaxing restaurants of the burden of providing spittoons for their customers.

Taxpayers have two chances this spring to remedy the school funding situation. • Vote to approve override levies to help beleaguered schools get through another year. The money will help make up for what the state is not supplying this year. As tempting as it may be to vote "no" to register a complaint against higher taxes, an override election is not the place to do it.

• Register your feelings at the ballot box in the primary election in May and the general election in November. Many lawmakers will be facing re-election this year and if you don't like what's happening to school budgets these days, that's one way to assure a change.

Thatcher exacts tribute from Labor Party, Alliance rivals

LONDON — Perhaps a droll Providence, casting around for some new chastening lesson for mankind, contrived the career of Margaret Thatcher. Illustrate how little festing safely there is in success. American Republicans should be taking notes.

The Labor Party, like the Democratic Party, is showing signs of having learned something from the experience of the public occasionally wants things from a socialist party, but rarely wants socialism, or even for socialism to be defined.

Shortly before joining the 1970s exodus from Labor, a former Member of Parliament recalled advice he once received. When any argument about policy becomes too confused or contentious, just say, "We must have a socialist housing (or medical, or education, or whatever) policy." But do not be specific. A major figure in the great 1940s Labor government said socialism is whatever Labor governments do. But it is what Labor governments have said they were going to do that has caused alarm.

Today, however, Labor is expelling extremists, showing aggressive lack of interest in the traditional talk about nationalizing the "commanding heights" of the economy, and speaking of socialism as a vague ethical impulse. Labor's leader, Neil Kinnock, is a socialist who would rather be prime minister than be ideologically pure. He has the thing that saves socialists from

socialism: ambition.

He does talk obligatory rot about unilateral disarmament, but that passion is necessary for his domestic tranquillity, his wife being eager to ban the bomb. However, even feminism has muddled socialism's ideological waters by challenging the traditional understanding of socialism as (in one analyst's words) "male, manual and muscular."

Labor's new temperateness is a tribute to its rivals, Thatcher and the Liberal Social Democrat Alliance.

Thatcher has (to use the jargon the Left likes) given the proletariat false consciousness. She has tempted them onto the path to petit bourgeois consumerism. They want to own things — houses, cars — more than they want additional collective purchases of welfare-state benefits. They think more in terms of personal satisfactions than social equality.

Kinnock is respecting this reality. And the Alliance, to which some important Laborites defected, is poised to benefit from a recur-

rence of Labor's usual out-of-power reflex toward rhetorical radicalism.

Thatcher once said she aimed at "killing socialism." A measure of her success is the increasing plausibility of Labor as a party of government. There is an analogous danger for Republicans in Reagan's success in shifting America's political center, and with it the Democratic Party, rightward.

Considered as a party man, Reagan is the most important Republican since McKinley. He has changed, at least through two elections, the composition of the party by his ability to draw blue-collar and ethnic voters. Thatcher has changed the tone and, to some extent, the composition of her party through two elections. As one analyst puts it, she decided that, after generations of collectivism, the conservative mission is not to conserve what is best in British society but to change what is worst. The party's ethos is no longer that of the big businessman with a social conscience, but of the small businessman with social grievances such as inflation, unions, welfare-ism, taxation.

Kinnock is prospering by being militantly nice. The leaders of the Alliance have elevated affability and professional reasonableness to the status of political philosophy. They have decided the country is weary of Thatcher: sharp words and sharp edges.

It is said that for centuries Britain has

sought unity in manners rather than ideas. Thatcher, who describes herself as a "conviction politician," takes ideas seriously, and in a divisive manner.

She is divisive in that she correctly thinks that some polarization is a consequence of leadership. In this she resembles Reagan. The resemblance ends abruptly with the matter of personal morality.

I know of no episode of Reagan being rude to a colleague. There are many stories of Thatcher's wounding tartness. She is a workaholic and is weary, and fatigue does not give anyone a less jagged disposition.

Her forcefulness has increased what a former colleague calls "the grovel count" among her current colleagues, many of whom complain that she is brusque, peremptory and given to lecturing. But these traits have always been as conspicuous and as politically successful as Reagan's charm. Charm, however, wears better during a second term.

A former close associate says, "She is the only person I know who I have never heard say, 'I wonder whether . . .'" Perhaps today she wonders whether, in the natural rhythm of democracy, victories revitalize the vanquished, and whether character traits that produce highly personal victories also produce powerful reactions against them.

Church may provide Mary Ann Sorrentino lots of company

PROVIDENCE, R.I. — If you ask Mary Ann Sorrentino what her religion is, she will still answer, "Catholic."

Like her parents and their parents before them, she was born, raised, and educated in the Catholic Church.

"For an Italian-American woman, this is part of who I am," says the 42-year-old woman. "So when you announce to me — zap — you're not Catholic anymore, it's almost laughable. It's like saying you're not Italian anymore."

But that in fact is what has happened. Mary Ann Sorrentino, the executive director of Planned Parenthood for Rhode Island has been excommunicated or, rather, "self-excommunicated" for her work supporting abortion.

The story began last May, 48 hours before her daughter Louisa's baptism, when the priest called her family in for an interrogation. He insisted that the 15-year-old girl disavow her mother's pro-choice stand before she could be confirmed. At the same scolding interview, the priest informed Mary Ann that she was no longer a Catholic.

Then, in January, a priest announced this excommunication publicly, in a radio broadcast advertised in the Providence Journal this way: "Can Rhode Island's leading advocate of abortion rights really be a Catholic?" The answer, listeners were told, was no. Mary Ann Sorrentino had violated a canon of church law which states that, "A person who procures a completed abortion incurs an automatic excommunication."

Today, wearing her notoriety with humor and a well-honed sense of irony, Sorrentino says, "Until then, I didn't even know that each of us had this self-destruct mechanism."

But if, in fact, Mary Ann Sorrentino self-destructed, if any "accomplice" to abortion is automatically out, it would appear that she has a lot of company. "If you take every Catholic woman who ever gave another

woman \$10 to help get an abortion, every husband who knew, every doctor, every nurse, every politician who voted for choice . . . well, there's a lot of self-excommunicants in my church."

Sorrentino was not unaware of the church hierarchy's attitude toward her job or toward those who are publicly seen as pro-choice and Catholic. "I knew I was not doing the bishop's favorite work," she admits. She had watched the hierarchy come down on another Italian woman, Geraldine Ferraro. But it only gradually became clear to her and others how far church conservatives are willing to go to "purify" the church of dissent.

The crackdown on dissent about the abortion issue has been felt by those who signed two newspaper ads talking about the "diversity of opinion" about abortion among Catholics. It has been felt by theologians such as Marquette University's Dan Maguire, who had lectures at four Catholic universities canceled. (Only one, Boston College, invited him back.) It has been regularly in the banners held at rallies, like the one in

California: "Real Catholics Don't Support Baby Killing."

The issue is abortion, but at a deeper level the central issue is one of "real Catholics." Can you disagree with the church and still belong to a "real Catholic"? Can you disagree with abortion? Can you, like the beleaguered moral theologian Charles Curran of Catholic University, disagree on birth control? Can you disagree on divorce?

To conservatives, it is a matter of order: The Church, Obey It or Leave It. The rules are clear, they say, and if you cannot follow them, you are not a member. You are, in effect, an outlaw. People have no right to call themselves Catholic if they oppose what the bishops teach.

Sorrentino doesn't see it that way. "People say, if you don't like the rules, why don't you switch to another church? The same people. If you asked them whether you should leave an unhappy marriage, would they tell you to stay and try to work things out?"

To theologian Dan Maguire, "The church is not a Kiwanis Club or the National Football League where you play by the rules or

leave. There is another concept of the church as group of believers who are struggling together and with others to discern the will of God. We recognize that this is a change process. We may miss the signals. But in a more humble, questioning church, we don't throw people out."

Mary Ann Sorrentino was thrown out. Now Judge Brown, the president of the American Life League, has asked the Roman Catholic Church to throw out Eleanor Smeal, the head of the National Organization for Women.

I doubt that the Catholic Church has the taste for mass excommunication, even mass "self-excommunication." There are enough Catholics who have "fallen away." But these are increasingly tense times for those who believe in the Catholic Church and in free choice.

In Rhode Island, 68 percent of the citizens call themselves Catholic. So do 68 percent of the women who choose abortions.

Blood boils as House passes drinking bill

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House of Representatives voted Thursday to raise the state's legal drinking age from 18 to 21, with members divided whether they were doing it for moral, economic or highway safety reasons.

"Idaho shouldn't be the bar room of the Northwest," said Rep. Dean Sorensen, R-Boise, a physician. He won a 32-31 vote for legislation raising the legal drinking age effective Sept. 1.

The action, which came shortly after the noon recess, resulted in some ruffled tempers, with Rep. Harold Reid, D-Craigmont, stargazing in displeasure.

Reid alleged that House Speaker Tom Stivers violated protocol by forcing a final vote on the drinking bill before Democrats reached the House floor after a party caucus.

Reid, a farmer serving his 26th year in the Idaho Legislature, bluntly warned Stivers of retaliation if he attempted to violate the rights of any legislator in the future. Stivers did not respond.

Before the final vote, representatives from university towns tried to amend the bill, arguing that school would be in session before the legal drinking age changed, and it would cause much confusion.

They lost a 45-36 vote, and after the noon recess, the House quickly

passed the measure and sent it to the Senate.

Some House members argued Idaho should raise the legal drinking age because the state could lose \$13.5 million in highway funds if it does not go along with a federal mandate on the drinking age.

But Sorensen said the proposal should stand on its own. He said there was a sharp increase in drunken driving arrests among teen-agers when the legal age for drinking was lowered in 19 in the 1970s.

Studies show there would be a decrease in alcohol-related highway deaths among young drivers with higher drinking age, Sorensen said.

Other members argued that the move would keep teen-agers from drinking. "Alcohol is the single most highly abused substance in America and the world," said Rep. L. Ed. Brown, R-Pocatello.

"This is the right bill at the right time, a message that needs to be said," said Brown.

Rep. Chris Hooper, R-Boise, said the Legislature was "selling its integrity" by abandoning the rights of certain citizens to keep their funds.

Rep. Patricia McDermott, D-Pocatello, said it "strains credulity" to change the drinking laws in the middle of a three-day holiday, since Sept. 1 is Labor Day.

Budget writers vote to freeze Health and Welfare funding

BOISE (AP) — Legislative budget writers, still conserving limited general-tax receipts as much as possible, voted on Thursday to effectively freeze 1987 spending for the massive Health and Welfare Department at this year's level.

The bill, the last one standing between the committee and a decision on politically sensitive state aid packages for public and higher education, sets general tax spending for the agency at just over \$71.7 million for the year that begins July 1. That is less than \$300,000 more than this year and all but ignores the potential for drastic reductions in federal money that account for more than half of the agency's overall spending authority of \$226 million.

The committee's conservative majority rejected requests for some \$2.2 million in general state funds, which would have been matched by



nearly \$5 million in federal money, to cover rising demand for benefits under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children and the Medicaid programs.

The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee, moving toward possible completion of its work by Friday, also rejected Democratic Gov. John Evans' request for more than \$200,000 to hire additional child protection workers to help cope with the rising number of child-abuse cases being reported throughout the state.

"Sometime we have to face the reality that the state is not big enough to do all these federal programs," Rep. Mack Neibaur, R-Paul, said.

The action on the Health and Welfare budget, which claims about 12 percent of all state general tax spending, left the committee with only about \$40 million to underwrite the state's share of educational expenditures.

Unless lawmakers find some way to come up with more uncommitted general revenue for next year, the panel will have little choice but to draft a public school support bill of about \$12 million to \$13 million and a higher education proposal of around \$91 million.

Both levels are well below what education officials say are needed to halt further deterioration of the state's educational system.

Fish and Game, timber team up

BOISE (AP) — Officials of Idaho's beleaguered timber industry and the state Department of Fish and Game have signed what both sides called historic joint recommendations on the management of national forest land in the state.

Jerry Conley, director of the Department of Fish and Game, said the agreements signed at a Boise news conference Thursday heralded a move away from the days of "mutual tolerance" between wildlife and timber interests and into a new period of mutual support.

"We see this as a new beginning for the two industries as far as our ability to work together and get things done," Conley said. "By signing these agreements, we're pledging our efforts to assuring that Idaho can have both timber production and quality hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation opportunities."

Joe Hinson, executive director of the Idaho Forest Industries Council,

said the recommendations on U.S. Forest Service draft management plans were examples of how both the timber industry and wildlife could benefit.

The agreements include general recommendations on national forest management in Idaho, as well as specific recommendations on draft plans already issued by the Forest Service for the Panhandle and Clearwater national forests.

Other specific recommendations will be made as the Forest Service issues draft management plans on the remaining Idaho forests, including the Boise and Payette, Conley and Hinson said.

Shelter fire kills 2 men

STAR (AP) — Two elderly men were killed and a woman was injured early Thursday morning when a fire swept through a single-story shelter home east of Star, officials said.

Joe Smith, 80, and Sam Bieroth, 64, formerly of Twin Falls, died in the blaze, Ada County Sheriff's Capt. Tom Taylor said. Marilyn McCain, 48, an attendant at the small home, was injured breaking out a window in an attempt to get the men out of the room they shared.

Ada County Coroner Erwin Sonnenberg said both Smith and Bieroth died of smoke inhalation.

Tracy Raynor, deputy chief of the Star Fire Department, said Ms. McCain and handyman Bill Duffy, 29, managed to escape from the flames.

More than a dozen firefighters arrived on the scene just before 2 a.m. The cause of the fire was still under investigation.

Shuttle rocket part identified

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Rocket specialists Thursday identified a 500-pound piece of Challenger's debris as part of the right booster rocket, sources reported, but it was not known if it contains the joint believed to have caused the shuttle explosion.

The broken 4-by-5-foot part was brought into port along with two larger booster pieces Wednesday night by the salvage ship Stena Workhorse.

Even before the wreckage was unloaded, experts began studying the smaller piece to try to learn if it was part of the left or right booster rocket.

They transported it to a hangar for a more thorough examination, and sources who requested anonymity said that it had been identified as part of the aft section of the right solid-fuel rocket.

House approves CCC funds

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House passed and sent to President Reagan Thursday a compromise bill to provide an additional \$5 billion this year to the Commodity Credit Corporation for crop price support programs.

The bill, passed 352-71, would allow the CCC to resume making loans and other payments to farmers.

The CCC ran out of cash on March 5. It has continued accepting applications for the crop programs, but has been unable to write checks because of the lack of money.

With the \$5 billion, CCC spending during the current fiscal year would reach \$19.6 billion. However, according to congressional estimates the agency would still need an additional \$2.4 billion to carry its operations through the end of the fiscal year on Sept. 30.

The bill also includes language saying the Reagan administration should spend the full \$1.7 billion authorized for loans by the Farmers Home Administration, and that additional loans should be made available if needed.

FMHA loans are used to help farmers finance the planting of their crops.

New York OKs gay rights bill

NEW YORK (AP) — The City Council approved a gay rights bill on Thursday, 15 years after a similar bill was first introduced in the early days of the homosexual rights movement.

The bill would prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation in housing, employment or public accommodation. Similar bills have become law in 50 other cities, 12 counties and in Wisconsin.

A gay rights bill was first proposed in New York in 1971, but was largely ignored. Another bill had reached the full council only once before, in 1974, when it lost 22-19.

Five times afterward, over several years, a gay rights bill was defeated in committee.

This year, with the election of some new council members and the addition of careful phrasing that says the bill is not meant to "promote" homosexuality, the campaigning intensified.

Month-long G.E. strike ends

LYNN, Mass. (AP) — Union members striking three General Electric Co. plants voted overwhelmingly Thursday to end a month-long walkout by 7,400 employees that had halted work on more than \$1 billion in military contracts.

"I feel good. It's just and fair settlement," said Paul Sullivan, a negotiator for Local 201 of the International Union of Electronic, Electrical, Technical, Salaried and Machine Workers.

Many of the striking employees were expected to return to work Friday.

Sullivan estimated that 90 percent of the approximately 4,000 union members at a brief outdoor rally approved the pact in a show of hands.

Teachers offered sweet deal

UPPER MARLBORO, Md. (AP) — Teachers needing jobs will find a free month's rent, cheaper car loans and discounts at local restaurants if they apply to the Prince George's County schools in suburban Washington by Aug. 1, say officials trying desperately to fill 400 positions.

The unusual offer was the brainchild of local business leaders who have been working with the school system the last two years under the philosophy that good schools mean good business.

"The school system is the heart of the community," said Winfield Kelly, president of the Advisory Council for Business and Industry, which organized the program. "If it is strong and healthy than everyone else in the community will benefit."

He predicts that if the program works, "some of the brightest and most gifted teachers in the Northeast will be coming here."

Deficit-reduction plan gains House OK

WASHINGTON (AP) — A weary House ended a three-month-old argument with the Senate Thursday night and gave final congressional approval to a \$10-billion deficit-reduction package that makes permanent the 16-cent-a-pack federal tax on cigarettes.

The bill also would withhold certain federal highway money from states, such as Idaho, that have a drinking age of less than 21.

The complicated measure, approved on a 230-154 vote, also clears the way for the government to distribute about \$2 billion of offshore oil revenues to the states, and it includes a provision allowing tobacco farmers to write off nearly \$1 billion in past losses.

The measure is now headed to the White House for President Reagan's expected signature. The amended version of the measure the House accepted was passed by the Senate on a voice vote last week.

The action Thursday night was a reversal for the House, which earlier this week had rejected the Senate version of the measure.

However, after last-ditch negotiations with the Senate failed to produce agreement, House members decided to end the squabble that dates back to last Dec. 19.

"Enough is enough," said Rep. Lynn Martin, R-Ill.

Noting that White House officials had said the president would not accept any other version of the legislation, Rep. John Breaux, D-La., said, "I can feel the cold muzzle of that veto gun against my head." His home state stood to lose the most under the offshore oil provisions if the measure died.

The Senate last week modified an earlier House version of the bill to include a new formula work-

ed out with the administration of how to split royalties and revenues with coastal states from offshore oil and gas exploration.

The Senate version that the House accepted also drops a provision that would have given governors more clout in dealing with the federal government on offshore leases.

Liberal Democrats in the House opposed another change made by the Senate that dropped a change in welfare law that would have extended coverage in all states under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program to low-income families that have two unemployed parents. Most states now limit such coverage to families with only one parent in the home.

As for the federal cigarette tax, the legislator makes it permanent at 16 cents a pack. The levy dropped to 8 cents last Saturday because of the impasse.

Marcos papers detail regime's corruption

WASHINGTON (AP) — The papers that Ferdinand Marcos brought with him to the United States are only a partial "encyclopedia of corruption" involving the deposed Philippine president but provide clues to unraveling his widespread financial empire, Rep. Stephen Solarz, D-N.Y., said Thursday.

The papers released to the public contain a variety of information, much of it fragmentary and lacking context, about the complicated financial dealings of Marcos and his wife, Imelda.

One of the more interesting documents, dated in 1975, confirmed what had long been rumored in Manila and officially denied — that Marcos wanted Imelda to succeed him as the nation's leader.

Solarz said the more than 2,000 pages of documents — made public by the subcommittee, he heads — provide insight into a variety of business kickbacks, real estate deals, and bank accounts.

Meanwhile, administration sources said Thursday night that Marcos was to leave Hawaii on an Air Force plane, with a resort area in western Panama as his destination, and that the departure was to come within the next 24 to 48 hours.

While there is much information in the documents, the papers don't have a comprehensive listing of Marcos' net worth, which has been estimated as high as \$10 billion, said Solarz.

Faubus, Adams launch political bids

Orval E. Faubus, who served as governor of Arkansas longer than anyone else, announced Thursday he would seek a seventh term by trying to unseat Gov. Bill Clinton, a fellow Democrat.

In Seattle, former Transportation Secretary Brock Adams, a Democrat, launched his bid for the seat held by Republican Sen. Slade Gorton.

Faubus, who left office in 1966, is perhaps best known for his use of National Guard troops 30 years ago to try to preserve school segregation.

"Some say I have an uphill battle in this race I am entering," said Faubus, 76, who had a second cardiac pacemaker implanted in 1980. "I am used to the uphill struggle. I am ready and willing. If the rank and file people will help me, we'll make it."

Faubus served as governor from 1955 until 1967, then ran unsuccessfully in 1970 and 1974.

Faubus lost the governor's race in 1970 to Dale Bumpers, who is seeking a third term in the U.S. Senate this year, and again in 1974 to David Fryer, who is serving his second term in the U.S. Senate.

It was Sept. 2, 1957, when Faubus

ordered the Arkansas National Guard to keep blacks out of Little Rock's Central High School after the 8th-U.S.-Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the school board's desegregation plan in a 1955 suit filed by blacks.

Nine black students, who came to

be known as the Little Rock Nine, were refused admittance Sept. 3. President Dwight D. Eisenhower then sent the 101st Airborne Division to Little Rock, federalized the state National Guard, and on Sept. 26, the Little Rock Nine entered Central to start classes.

Asked whether the 1957 crisis would be an issue in 1986, Faubus said, "That's nearly 30 years ago."

He said that all of Arkansas' citizens, "rich and poor, country and city, black and white and whomever," need to be concerned with "the benefit of ourselves and the progress of our state."

Faubus said he expected to spend up to \$400,000 in the race.

Clinton, who has served three two-year terms, has announced his intention to seek another term this year, the state's first four-year term for governor this century, because of a constitutional change approved in 1984.

Faubus was a Democrat through his 12 years in office, but he was named to head the Department of Veterans Affairs in Republican Gov. Frank White's administration in 1981.

In Washington state, Adams began his campaign to try to win back the Senate seat for the Democrats by attacking Gorton as ineffective.

"I feel there is a great underlying current that says, 'What did he do?'" Adams, a former congressman, said of the incumbent.

Adams, 59, has been practicing law in international trade since he quit as former President Jimmy Carter's transportation secretary in 1979.

Governor urges quick action against acid rain

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress was urged Thursday to take advantage of the Reagan administration's recognition of the acid rain problem and move quickly to limit sulfur dioxide and harmful emissions from coal-fired boilers.

"The administration, rather than

being the excuse for inaction by Congress, has really said that the ball is in Congress' court," said New Hampshire Gov. John Sununu, vice chairman of the Alliance for Acid Rain Control.

Sununu made the statement at a hearing by the House Energy and

Commerce fossil and synthetic fuels subcommittee into the development of technology to reduce the amount of sulphur dioxide released from U.S. power plants and factories.

The hearing came a day after President Reagan, after meeting with Canadian Prime Minister Brian

Mulroney, committed the government and U.S. industries to a joint five-year, \$5 billion effort to find ways to burn coal more cleanly.

"The Reagan-Mulroney summit will be a real stimulus to action on acid-rain legislation," Sununu said.

Prejudice, low turnout blamed for vote result

CHICAGO (AP) — Everything from ethnic prejudice to low voter turnout was blamed Thursday for the surprising primary victory that made a supporter of ultra-conservative Lyndon LaRouche the Democratic Party's candidate for Illinois lieutenant governor in the fall election.

"We underestimated the activity of the LaRouche people," said veteran Chicago Alderman Roman Pucinski, 66, whose daughter, Aurelia, narrowly trailed another LaRouche candidate in the race for the Democratic secretary of state nomination, with all but a handful of votes counted.

"They've been at this business a long time," said Pucinski. In the contest for the Democratic nomination for lieutenant governor, LaRouche supporter Mark Fairchild defeated state Sen. George E. Sangmeister, the handpicked candidate of the Democratic nominee for governor, Adlai E. Stevenson, according to unofficial returns.

In the secretary of state's race, LaRouche supporter Janice A. Hart led Ms. Pucinski — by about 15,000 votes with 99 percent of the returns counted.

Pucinski said other reasons for the strong showing of the LaRouche candidates included a tight voter turnout, which magnified the impact of the LaRouche vote, and a prejudice in favor of Anglo-sounding names — such as Hart.

He also raised the possibility that numbers of Republican voters had voted in the Democratic primary in an effort to defeat Democrats who

would have been stronger candidates in the fall elections.

"There is some evidence that the Republicans had penetrated our ranks and tried to embarrass Adlai by knocking off Sangmeister," said Pucinski.

In Illinois, candidates for governor and lieutenant governor run as a ticket in the general election, and voters cast a single vote to elect both. Stevenson already has said he does not want to run with Fairchild, and will consider conducting a third-party bid instead.

At a press conference Wednesday, Stevenson said his party and the news media share the blame for the LaRouche candidates' success.

"Because we as a party and you in the news media assumed too much knowledge, and failed to take to two non-races with the appropriate seriousness, we now find ourselves faced with a possibility that radical, fringe candidate may fill the lieutenant governor's and secretary of state's slots in the Democratic ballot," Stevenson said.

Unofficial returns showed Fairchild only narrowly defeated Sangmeister in Chicago, where the regular Democratic Party is especially strong, but ran farther ahead in central and Southern Illinois counties, where voters tend to be more conservative. Overall, he received 52 percent of the vote to Sangmeister's 46 percent.

Shultz begins trip to tighten European ties

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State George P. Shultz, on a 10-day European visit that begins Friday, will try to strengthen ties to Greece and Turkey and spur their commitment to U.S. bases deemed vital to the security of the Mediterranean region, State Department planners said.

It will be Shultz's first trip to those countries since he took office in 1982 and will give the prime ministers in Athens and Ankara opportunities to request more assistance and trade benefits from the United States as a condition for settling the base issues.

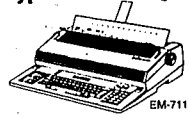
"Basing is a complicated matter; a lot of bucks involved and so we'd like to be sure we know where we stand and can plan ahead accordingly," said one of several U.S. officials who briefed reporters on condition of anonymity.

Shultz planned first to meet French leaders in Paris on Friday for a report on how they are coping with the unprecedented problem of trying to form a new government that will include conservative opponents of Socialist President Francois Mitterrand.

He will finish his tour on Easter Sunday in Rome after an audience with Pope John Paul II.

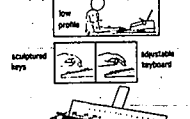

Corrections director pleads for better prison

Murphy, Gooding officials let go of private prison hopes

GOODING — Idaho Department of Corrections Director Al Murphy said Thursday that he had given up hope of a private prison locating in Gooding, and top city officials agreed.

The city has been discussing and working for the past 2½ years on the idea of selling the 31-year-old state tuberculosis hospital building to a private corrections firm to generate jobs and tax dollars.

Gooding Mayor Gene Heller said the problem was that the prison companies "wanted the chicken before the egg." They insisted on Western states guaranteeing they would send prisoners to a private facility, rather than doing their own marketing, he said.

When planning for the facility first began, prison directors in 13 regional states agreed that they needed a prison for protective custody inmates or those that must be protected from their fellow prisoners, said Murphy.

The number of protective-custody prisoners each state had was small, making them expensive to house, so

the project seemed ideal for a private company that could make cost savings by housing them all together, Murphy said.

But since state prison administrators approved the concept of a regional protective-custody prison two years ago, they have become discouraged by the lack of progress on the plan, he said. He compared the prison officials' discouragement to that of Gooding residents, who have been told by private firms several times in the last two years that plans for a private facility were all but final.

Gooding Chamber of Commerce President Kim Vaughn said that regional states had started work on other solutions to ease overcrowding. Several states have changed prison administrators since officials first gave the plan their blessing.

A bill that recently passed the Senate has further complicated the private prison issue, Murphy said. Senate Bill 1381 would prevent prisoners from providing goods and services in competition with private industry, he said.

That would eliminate the practice

Tight budget pushes many prisoners free

TWIN FALLS — Idaho Department of Corrections Director Al Murphy Thursday called for Idahoans to get tough on criminals, even if it affected their pocketbooks.

He spoke at the Twin Falls Optimists meeting, taking a break from a legislative lobbying effort for money to start building a new state prison facility to ease overcrowding at the state penitentiary in Boise.

He has seen "an amazing transition" in the Legislature's attitude from last year to this year, he said. Last year the Senate in particular was calling parole officials too liberal and calling for an end to "good time" provisions that automatically shorten sentences.

"This year it's started dawning on them that will cost money," he said. "Now they are asking why the parole committee is being too hard on keeping them in."

Some legislators are calling for more work release for non-violent offenders, and for a full release of first-time, non-violent offenders, he said. He called both proposals unrealistic.

A check of current prison records showed only six in the state who are first-time, non-violent offenders, he said. All six had sexually assaulted children, he said.

The state code delineates which crimes are violent and non-violent. About 40 percent of prisoners incarcerated are serving time for non-violent crimes including sexual assaults, drug dealings and some types of burglaries. Often they are serving time for their 10th or

Childhood diseases rise as immunization program falters

TWIN FALLS — Negative press and the current insurance crisis are creating a double burden for Idaho's immunization program, and as a result, childhood diseases are again on the increase, a state health official said Wednesday.

Robert Medlin, state Immunization Program coordinator, told the South Central District Health Department Board that "negative media stories" focusing on the potential hazards of DTP vaccinations —

diphtheria, typhoid and pertussis — have "scared the general public to death."

"The media has concentrated on the negative aspects, such as brain damage," Medlin said. While there are some risks, the percentage is very low, he said.

"You have to feel for the parents whose child is affected," he said. But parents also need to consider the risks of the disease.

In the 1950s, 700 cases of whooping cough were recorded in Idaho. With education and immunization, the number dropped to less than 10 cases between 1979-80.

But since 1983, after reports on serious

side effects of immunizations in some cases, the number of children immunized has dropped from 85 percent to 70 percent, while outbreaks of whooping cough and measles have risen, said Medlin. To prevent the spread of disease, at least 90 percent of the population needs to be immunized, he said.

In 1985, 30 cases of whooping cough were reported in the state, and 17 cases have been reported so far this year.

Of those 17 cases, three-fourths were infants less than three years old, and half were hospitalized for more than four days, Medlin said.

"What do you tell a parent who hasn't immunized their child out of fear, and then the child gets sick from the disease and is hospitalized?" he questioned. "Parents need to consider all the facts, and then make a decision."

The other factor affecting the state's immunization program is the skyrocketing cost of vaccines. Lawsuits, high damage awards, and the rising cost of insurance mean manufacturers are increasing costs, said Medlin.

"In 1976, the budget was \$75,000 for immunizations, and most went to buy vaccines," said Medlin. "In 1986, the budget will

be \$450,000."

Within the last month, for example, the cost for the polio vaccine has doubled, going from 25 cents to \$1.60 a dose, he said. A dose of DTP that used to cost 15 cents in 1980, now costs \$3.50.

Within the next three to five years, we may have difficulty even buying vaccines," he said.

While costs to the state are climbing, parents do not have to pay more for shots their children receive through the health department. The cost is \$3 per visit per child, health department officials said.

Quality of water judged good, but by no standards

TWIN FALLS — Water quality is "generally good" in Idaho, state officials say, but they are making an assessment by noting that laws requiring the monitoring of state water are out of date.

The only chemicals still in use in the state which trigger monitoring programs are the herbicide 2,4-D and the insecticide Temik. Idaho drinking water standards require the state to test municipal water supplies at least once every five years for pesticide contaminants, Cheryl Brower of the Idaho Division of Environment in Boise says.

"What's lacking is standards," she says. "Four of the six chemicals which are required to be monitored for are banned for crop use."

"It doesn't make any sense to test for things that aren't used anymore. We don't have standards for the other chemicals. We look to the feds for guidelines, but what's lacking are standards," Brower says.

Although the possibility of pesticides showing up in drinking water is a concern, state officials do not see pesticides in surface water — rivers and lakes — as a problem.

"My impression is that there just isn't any drastic environmental ef-

fect of pesticide contamination in surface water)," says Steve Bauer of the Division of Environment's Water Quality Bureau.

Some of those, such as the Rock Creek Rural Clean Water Program and other studies of Vineyard Creek and Cedar Draw, are being done locally.

Those studies look primarily at sediment, bacteria and nutrients in the stream, Bauer says. The state has also done some intensive monitoring for pesticides in those

Blaine County passes school override levy

HAILEY — Blaine County residents approved a \$1.6 million override levy Thursday, the eighth such override they have funded in as many years.

The measure was passed by a 58 percent yes-vote, with 1,659 ballots cast in favor of the override and 769 votes against it.

Superintendent David Noonan said the override insures that funds will be available to meet the district's annual operating budget. The override accounts for just under 30 percent of the total budget.

"This means we'll be up and running for another year," Noonan said with a sigh of relief late Thursday night.

"I'm very pleased with the support the community has shown," he said.

Water turnout was smaller this year, with 338 fewer voters casting ballots than in 1985.

Last year's \$1.6 million override was carried by 62 percent of the vote.

Noonan said the voting trend was typical of past years, with strong support shown in Ketchum and Sun Valley in north Blaine County and opposite communities from Bellevue and the southern portion of the county.

However, voters in Carey did cast more ballots in support of the override than against it.

Here's how each community voted: Bellevue — 103 in favor, 234 against; Carey — 106 in favor, 96 against; Hailey — 392 in favor, 297 against; Ketchum — 398 in favor, 122 against; and Sun Valley — 41 in favor, 20 against.

The override funds will be used for operating expenses, for the district, including teacher's salaries, textbooks, supplies and utilities.

School district files suit against teachers

TWIN FALLS — Nine Twin Falls School teachers who two weeks ago lost a lawsuit against the Twin Falls School District may have to pay for their failure.

Boise attorney Phillip Oberrecht, who represents the School District, has filed a claim for \$5,821.65 in attorney fees against the nine teachers.

— Susan Piller, Eileenore Burkhardt, Jackie Rohweder, Carol Bearup, Al Rohweder, Bill Jacobson, Jennifer Ingram, Kathy Stover and Galen Guess — and their attorney,

Greg Fuller.

In an affidavit filed this week in 5th District Court, Oberrecht requested the fees on the grounds that the teachers' suit was "frivolous, unreasonable or without foundation."

Fuller could not be reached for comment. However, his office filed an objection to the request on Wednesday, and an April 21 hearing has been set.

The teachers filed suit in January 1985 against the district after the district reduced employee health insurance benefits in December 1984. The suit also sought damages

against the district for bad-faith bargaining and breach of contract.

However, in a March 3 hearing, 5th District Court Judge Daniel Huributt dismissed their suit, saying the insurance issue was decided in a similar case filed against the district by the Twin Falls Education Association.

Huributt also ruled the claims of bad-faith bargaining and breach of contract were groundless. The plaintiffs had claimed TFEA did not legally represent all teachers, while also claiming the district had breached the contract negotiated by TFEA.

Hazelton council plans to change billing charges for refuse collection

HAZELTON — Business people in Hazelton can expect a change in their billing rates for garbage collection as soon as the Hazelton City Council writes and approves a resolution changing the rates.

Currently, all businesses are charged a minimum of \$8 per month whether they have the normal pick up once a week or several times per week.

Councilman Allan White proposed a resolution increasing the rates for those requiring more than the normal once-a-week pick up. The minimum business charge will remain at \$8 per month for the once-a-week pick up, but more frequent users of the service will be charged an additional \$2 for each pick up.

The council agreed that residents who haul their own trash will not be charged. Residential rates will remain at \$4 per month for once-a-week service.

Hagerman told to speak up for grant

HAGERMAN — Citizens of Hagerman with water problems must speak out if the city is to have a good chance of getting a block grant.

That was the advice of Joe Herring, executive director of the Region IV Development Association, to the Hagerman City Council Tuesday. The city is applying for an estimated \$720,000 grant to upgrade its water system. The grants will be awarded in April.

However, at the first of two public hearings held during the council meeting, no one showed up to testify about the city's water situation.

Herring and J-U-B Engineers Bill Block and David Goerger were at the hearing to gather public opinion on the grant application they are preparing for the city.

Mayor Merle Owsley said numerous city residents have problems with sand and gravel in their water lines, but they are reluctant to attend hearings and complain about it.

"We've been up and down the street here, trying to get people to

come (to the hearing)," Owsley said, expressing disappointment at the lack of turn-out.

Councilwoman Gloria Jarzwick said she recently had to replace her water heater and a toilet because they were ruined by sand and gravel from water lines.

City Clerk Rhonda Wickham said later that city water lines all "dead end" and cannot be flushed out as they fill with sand. Most of the sand and gravel, she said, enters the lines from the springs from which the water is piped.

If rebuilt, Wickham explained, the lines would loop and could be opened to be washed out.

Also, she said, low pressure problems would be solved because the looped lines could handle more water pressure than the dead-end line system.

The city can apply for up to \$350,000. If the city does get a grant,

Owsley said, the water system would be upgraded with new pipelines and fire hydrants.

Herring said written comments about water problems can be submitted for the next public hearing, set for April during the next council meeting. All statements, especially those from business owners, written or oral, will help Hagerman's chance of winning a grant, he said.

Owsley said he and the council members will actively seek public testimony for the next hearing.

"We'll have people here if we have to bring them in arm and arm," he said.

In other business:

- The council granted a request from Cindy Elliot to use the city park for a benefit dinner, auction and evening dance. Proceeds will go to the family of Jim Bright, a custom-farmer-who has health problems and is unable to work. The fund-raiser will be held all day April

starting at 10 a.m.

Anyone with items to donate for the auction may call Elliot at 352-4602.

- In compliance with a request from the state health and welfare department, the council voted to have city water tested to measure chemicals in the water. The tests, due every three years, have not been done for three years, Wickham said.
- The council decided to vote for Thorleif Rangen and Paul Borchard in the March 31 election of board members for the Lower Snake River Aquifer Recharge District. The city of Hagerman and other members of the recharge district each have one ballot.

Bids sought on rooms at Declo grade school

BURLEY — New classrooms will be built at Declo Elementary School in an effort to bring the school up to state accreditation requirements.

A call for bids was made last week by the Cassia County School Board. Bids will be opened at the next board meeting on April 16 for the 5,000 sq. ft. addition.

Superintendent Norman Hurst told the board the \$160,000 project would be funded with approximately \$105,000 in bond refunding monies on a 13-year-old bond with the remainder to come from plant facilities funds.

The addition will add four classrooms and two smaller rooms to the existing building. It will be used for fifth- and sixth-grade students.

Hurst estimated construction time at four months which would have the rooms ready for use this fall.

Included in the proposal is an alternate plan for two fewer classrooms.

"Although only two classrooms are needed at this time, we will need the other two eventually, and they would be much less expensive to build now," said Hurst.

CSI's Trenkle wary of 32-4 'Blazers

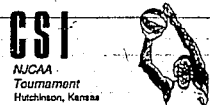

HUTCHINSON, Kan. — When the College of Southern Idaho collides with Vincennes University Community College of Vincennes, Ind., tonight at 6 p.m. MST, two of the best junior college programs historically in the nation will be playing.

They keep power points at the National Junior College Athletic Association finals, awarded on the basis of eight for first, seven for second and so on. On that basis, Vincennes currently is the all-time fourth-best junior college basketball team, while CSI is tied for 10th.

A CSI championship in this tournament could lift the Eagles into seventh place on the all-time list. Tonight's semifinal game also pits teams that have walked off the floor on the losing end of the scoreboard only once this season.

Vincennes comes in at 32-4, but it was forced to forfeit three of those games on paper after winning them easily on the court. CSI, on the other hand, can come out of this with the

school's best-ever record.

After two games of meeting physically aggressive teams, CSI would like a patsy. The Trailblazers aren't, but they don't appear as physical as Moberly Area Community College, which the Eagles beat in the quarterfinals, or Copiah-Lincoln Community College, CSI's first-round victim.

But it's also a matter of degree. "They are talented, with only one loss all year," a hoarse CSI Coach Fred Trenkle pointed out Thursday. "They can be physical and they have good quickness and a good bench. I know some of our fans are going to call this our easiest game, but Vincennes is a national contender and we'll have to play well and play smart to beat them."

Most of the physical part of the Vincennes game is 6-foot-6 forward Jeff Huffman, who played at the University of Utah last year. Huffman has a little built with long arms and good jumping ability. He averages 13.1 points and nine rebounds-per-game from Coach Dan Sparks, himself a former Weber

State star.

The only other sizable Trailblazer is 6-7 Cal Foster, who averages nine points and five rebounds.

Guards are 6-0 sophomore Terry Smith, who averages 12.3 points per game, and 6-0 sophomore Jeff Gher, who averages four points. Vincennes has a Greg Boyd look-and-play-alike in 6-5 sophomore Ed Lowdown, who averages 16 points per game — virtually all on long shots. He probably is leading the tournament in field goal accuracy in two games.

The Trailblazers back those starters liberally from a good bench, including 6-7 Antone Gallistaw (7.0 points and 4.0 rebounds), 6-4 Reggie Kirk (6.7 points) and 6-6 Reubin Tipton (6.7 points).

"We have to hone up our perimeter defense, not let them swing the ball from side to side," said Trenkle, who team is ranked fifth in the country. "They want that perimeter offense and like to take it inside when they are reversing movement outside. We want the pressure — out there; so they won't have time to look inside for the big

guards.

"Offensively, we worked out Thursday against a sort of man-to-man defense and a double-team on the ball," Trenkle continued. "We're trying to get the ball past the double-team and inside quickly."

"Our keys are still the same," Trenkle said. "Joey Johnson has been great in both games, especially early. Erick Newbman has been steady as usual — great inside defense and rebounding. Boyd came back with a strong game against Moberly after a couple of weaker moments in the first game. He got two big rebounds for us late against Moberly and put one back. Jeff Rekeweg was super Wednesday (against Moberly) with nine points and good defense. (Chris) Blocker had foul problems — not all of his own making — but he's got 22 points and is leading us in assists."

"That thing that has turned both games has been our depth," Trenkle said. "Keith Jackson was outstanding Wednesday and Mike Miller has performed — well — in fact, everyone seems to peak just when we're

needing a boost and we've played very smart basketball."

Tournament notes:
One thing to protect in the middle of a big showing at the national junior college tournament is your coach.

Trenkle got his first offer after the Moberly game Wednesday night. "It was an assistant job at a Big Eight school — I'm not going to say which one — but a pretty good money," Trenkle confirmed.

But what Trenkle understands is that another season or two like this one at CSI and he's a candidate to replace the Big Eight head coach who's looking for help right now.

In its continuing wooing of Blocker, Marquette University has had assistant Coach Rick Carr camped here as he was at the Region 18 tournament and at about half of CSI's home games.

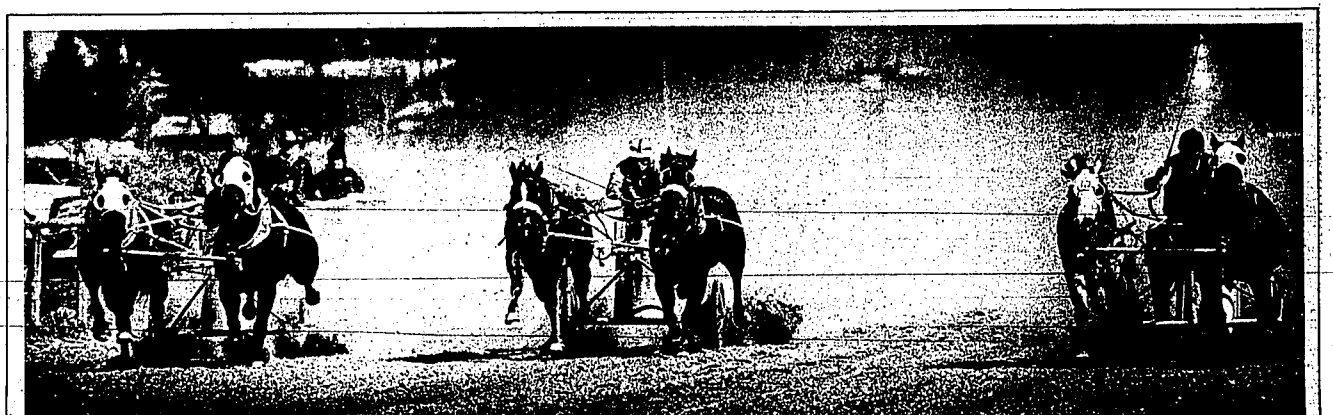

Chariots of ice

Wintertime sport of cutter and chariot racing heats up in the Magic Valley

TWIN FALLS — Chariots of fire they are not, rumbling along through the frozen pastures and paddocks of the Intermountain West from Thanksgiving through Easter.

Still, the horseman's slack-season sport of cutter and chariot racing is heating up in the Magic Valley.

Some 20 competitors representing five Magic Valley racing associations are entered in the 22nd Annual World Cutter and Chariot Racing Championships to be held this weekend and next at the Bonrock County Fairgrounds in Pocatello.

Area associations are headquartered in Glenns Ferry, Bliss, Richfield, Jerome and Primm. Most groups have from 16 to 25 teams competing, although one Utah

association has entered as many as 168 in preliminary events.

Qualifying for the world championships is no small task. The top four teams from each association are eligible. All first-place winners are entered in the first division of the world finals, while second-place winners go into the second division and so forth through four divisions. The first-place winner in Division I is declared world champion.

Although formats vary a bit from association-to-association, all-run under state and world rules. Qualifiers position themselves in the top four teams to represent their areas through a series of races inside and outside of their associations. The racing season runs from Dec. 1 through the final week of March.

Races in the world event proceed at the rate of one every eight to 10 minutes and pit winners against

winner and losers against losers. After a grueling four-day schedule that may mean as many as 40 races on the 440-yard track, the final teams in each division, one still undefeated and the others with one loss each, race for their respective titles.

A total of 35 associations were entered last year, but the financial crunch that has afflicted agriculture has taken its toll. Art's Lost River Association, unable to field the required 12 teams, folded this year, resulting in a slight decrease in numbers for the 1986 event.

But the ranks of chariot racers is expanding to new areas despite a less-than-favorable economy. Ted Uhrig of Halley, and current president of the Snake River Association, has raced in a number of places over the years — but that may change soon.

"There are a lot of things to put together," says Uhrig. "But right now we have signatures from 20 interested people in the Halley-Sun Valley area and will get together at Pocatello to discuss forming a new association up there."

Buhl's George Juker, who will be running in the third division this year in Pocatello, has been active in chariot racing for 15 years. "A friend introduced me to it and the next thing I knew, I was doing it," he says.

Juker finished third in the 1977 world championships and set a world record time of 22.23 seconds in preliminary race. "We came back the final day and fell out of the gate," Juker explains. Trailing by four lengths early, Juker's team made a boys coming up but finished the third-place trophy.

Losing by inches to previous year's Champ Ray Alvey in 1984-85,

Juker registered a second-place finish in the second division of world competition with the same horses, then 12 and 13 years old. Juker said that team to J.P. Robinson who competes out of Wyoming.

"That guy's going in the second division this year," says Juker with a smile.

According to the participants, the largest out-of-pocket expenses are travel costs. Feeding, preparation and training time are all considerations, but are offset somewhat by the family-participation nature of chariot racing. Oftentimes, the horses are already a part of the family farm. Cut-down heavy steel barrels have been replaced by lighter-gauge steel or fiberglass bodies to field chariots which now weighing 60 to 100 pounds. Usually of the home-made variety, these represent a relatively small cost.

A state competition, held the last week in February, precedes the world championships but has no bearing on those races as no seedings are involved. Competitors are required to participate, however, with those same teams at the higher level.

"You can move up any horse that qualified below you," says Wendell Johnson of the Snake River Association in Richfield. "To avoid problems, teams are identified on report forms submitted to the register-of-merit secretary of the American Quarter Horse Association."

Johnson was a pioneer in the racing association that got its start in the Richfield area in 1956. Orin field, now retired and living in Paul, introduced the activity after moving from Thayne, Wyo., where the sport originated as a winter

Boitano stuns Soviet, wins world skate title

GENEVA, Switzerland (AP) — American Brian Boitano combined aerodynamics and Hollywood flourishes in a jazzy, prize-winning long program to unseat the defending champion, Alexander Fadeev of the Soviet Union, and snatch the men's World Figure Skating crown Thursday.

Boitano, 22, of Sunnyside, Calif., in fourth place entered the finals, jumping and jitterbugging his way into the hearts of spectators and judges alike as he executed one perfect move after another in a dramatic program to Gershwin and the blues.

Second was Canadian Brian Orser, who despite a tumble on one triple axel jump and faltering out of another in an otherwise fast and action-packed routine, wound up with the same 5.4 total factored placements as Boitano. But Boitano cleaned up with six of the nine top scores in the long program to win it all.

In third was Fadeev, who sputtered out in the long program, faltering on three triple jumps

'Crossroads' leads directly to the heart of the blues

HOLLYWOOD — The urgent, overwhelming reason to go without delay to "Crossroads" is Joe Seneca as Blind Dog Patton, "possibly the finest blues harmonica man to come out of Mississippi." You are probably not going to get acting any better than this if you want until you are as old as... well, as old as Blind Dog himself, and he is 80.

"Of course, if you are a blues fan, you might get to hear the love and care that Ray Cooder has taken with "Crossroads" music, so that the tortured-sounding voice of the legendary Robert Johnson is done proper justice, or to hear Delta bluesman Frank Frost and The Wonders, or Sonny Terry, John "Juke" Logan, or Seneca, or the amazing Cooder himself.

"Crossroads" means a leap of faith to swallow it whole, to buy its Faustlike premise of a musician's pact with the devil played against the realism of a contemporary road movie, but director Walter Hill lays out reasons enough to make us want to make that leap.

The first is the pungency of newcomer John Fusco's script, which resists every chance to smother the scrappy Blind Dog, incarcerated for shooting another bluesman decades ago under his real name, Willie Brown. Fusco makes young, Long Island-raised Eugene Martone (Ralph Macchio) a pretty hard pill to swallow at first, too, this cocky contemporary road movie, but director Walter Hill lays out reasons enough to make us want to make that leap.

Like the rug or not, Willie is as eager to get out of this hospital-jail as Eugene is to get what the old man alone knows: Robert Johnson's unrecorded last song. With it, this downy classicist hopes to make his name in the blues world. And so, with a promise

of the song once they reach Willie's native ground, Eugene manages to spring the irascible musician from his locked facility. The two head west on Mississippi and a desolate crossroads where Willie, like Robert Johnson before him, sold his soul to the devil for a little piece of fame.

"Crossroads" look is the second of its strong points: sepiatic sections of the '20s blending almost imperceptibly with muted footage of the present. Cinematographer John Bailey steers resolutely away from over-theatricalness (this is not, in other words, the South of "The Color Purple") to strike a bleak, haunting tone, echoed by the spare eloquence of Jack Collis' production designs.

The heart of the film, of course, must be an exchange between man and boy, and our sense that Eugene has been allowed to feel, however glancingly, the pain that fuels the blues. Seneca and Macchio play this developing relationship delicately and well; the writing and direction never let Willie turn into a crusty but lovable curmudgeon; he is too finely and principled about his music for that, which is exactly as he should be. And Eugene has something of a problem with hubris, which takes time to conquer. For the pain of love, we add an abused young runaway, Frances (Janet Geary), detouring however probably from her target destination of Los Angeles to travel with them.

At one point, they are ousted as vagrants by two deputies and, finally, by a towering sheriff. What is not about the scene is how it plays against expectation: These three larcenous bullies are all black. Surveying them, Willie says, "Cap'n, things seem changed in this county. Then again, they seem sorta the same." The "Cap'n" is the brilliance of the line, because it sounds the way you would address a chain gang boss.

Next, Frances, Willie and Eugene hit a little Mississippi town whose color line runs down the middle of its dusty street as implacably as it did when Willie was last there 40 years ago. At this point, "Crossroads" really lifts into orbit.

'Gung Ho' a culture clash bash

East is east, west is west and Ron Howard's "Gung Ho" is a cutesy culture-clash comedy movie about the meeting of the twain. You could call it "The Japanese Are Coming: The Japanese Are Coming," except they have been here for a while.

"Gung Ho" does not fill the laugh quota of Howard's "Splash," or even "Night Shift," for that matter, so it may be seen as a disappointment. But it keeps intact the director's friendly, Opie-esque reputation and his title as prince of the Hollywood lightweight.

The main setting for "Gung Ho" is a failed automobile factory in the dying industrial town of Hadleyville, Pa. A Japanese company, Assan Motors, has purchased the plant, but when the Japanese management team tries to enforce its rigid work disciplines on unionized factory employees, the resistance is swift and, it seems, final. Calisthenics before morning coffee? Sayonara, suckers.

It is up to Hunt Stevenson (Michael Keaton), former jack-hammer to mediate between his grumbling co-workers and the Japanese management team. While the Americans mock the foreign traditions of their new bosses, the Far Easterners deride their hosts as selfish inattentives more concerned with six-packs and personalized license plates than clocking a productive eight hours work.

Stellar performances lift 'Purple'

TWIN FALLS — Following are capsule reviews of movies currently playing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times reviews.

THE COLOR PURPLE (PG-13). This time out, director Steven Spielberg has chosen to put an antic disposition on and his almost every decision has been disastrous: He made Alice Walker's novel, made his comic scenes slapstick, and has lipped over the book's crucial relationship. But whatever the faults of the director's artistic choices, he has collected a near-perfect cast: Whoopi Goldberg's compelling, incandescent Celie, Margaret Avery's electrifying, changeable Shug Avery and Oprah Winfrey's indomitable, ungrateful Sofia.

DOWN AND OUT IN BEVERLY HILLS (R). Co-writer-director-producer Paul Mazursky's delirious and affectionate paean of vomit butterflies in his own yard, the preposterous rich Whiteman family (Richard Dreyfuss, Bette Midler) hard at work at the meaning of life after taxes. Their lives are changed by Nick Nolte as a scrofulous bum who decides to end it all in their pool but stays to affect every member of the family. If the film makers had

not pulled the rug out from under the Nolte character, the picture would have a sturdier closing, but there is enormous fun to be had and two especially fine performances, by Nolte and Dreyfuss, to anchor the work.

MURPHY'S ROMANCE (R). A contemporary Western romance, a June-November courtship comedy that is also a moral fable about making the right choices: bright, ardent and solid, just like its stars, Sally Field and James Garner. Star Ritt blends Garner's super-relaxed style, his maverick affability, plays wonderfully against Field, who gives what is undoubtedly her sexiest performance. It seems like we are getting the real Ritt here, the real Field and Garner — and, even if we are not, they are a delightful group to spend an evening with: warm, funny, the salt of the earth.

OUT OF AFRICA (PG). Because we are in a well-dusted, faintly magical, perfectly appointed place where a level of intelligence is prized in this film, what is its problem? Casting, mostly, and a sense of place: Meryl Streep, as Isak

Dinesen, may convince us utterly that she is in love with Africa, but our views of it are a little too stately to really feel the place. And Robert Redford's Denis Finch Hatton is a real cipher. Streep can pretty nearly do anything in the film — except that she cannot provide all the heat in a love affair when Redford is not giving much to his role.

ROCKY IV (PG). Elephantine vacuousness is the shape of the new "Rocky," which is bigger, squishier, slower, more preposterous and infinitely emptier than the earlier three. Filled with contempt for everything Russian, and centering around a match between Rocky and a blond Soviet giant pumped with steroids, the film flip-flops at the last second, allowing hope for change in individuals of the two countries, while saying in its other 98 percent that the Soviets are simplistic animals worthy only of "com-tempt.

PG-13 Rating Introduced

Ron Howard's comedy rates top-earning debut of year

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Director Ron Howard's comedy "Gung Ho" topped all competitors over the weekend and became the year's best-earning opening film with a weekend gross of \$7.2 million.

The Paramount movie, shown on 1,150 screens, is about the chaos that results when a Japanese firm buys a Pennsylvania auto factory and installs new production methods. It stars Michael Keaton, George Wendt and Gedde Watanabe.

The previous best-gross debut in 1986 was \$6.1 million, by Tri-Star's "Iron Eagle" the weekend of Jan. 17-19.

In a rich weekend for Paramount studios, its "Pretty in Pink" was in second place, bringing in \$4.2 million at 1,117 theaters in its third week out and raising its gross to date to \$18 million.

"The Color Purple," nominated for 11 Academy Awards, moved back with a notch to claim third place with a weekend gross of \$3.7 million at 607 box offices. During its 13-week run, the Steven Spielberg film, released by Warner Bros., has grossed \$37.6 million.

Touchstone's "Down and Out in Beverly Hills" tumbled to fourth place, collecting \$2.8 million at 1,078 theaters and boosting its seven-week gross to \$43.4 million.

Orion's "Hannah and Her Sisters" remained in fifth place, raking in \$2.7 million at 696 screens and increasing its six-week take to \$17.2 million.

"House," a New World release, fell from second to sixth place, gathering only \$2.2 million at 1,340 theaters. During its three-week run, "House" has grossed \$14.6 million.

"Crossroads," a new movie from Columbia, began weakly at the No. 7 spot, grossing \$2.1 million at 882 theaters for a \$2,110 per-screen average. The movie features Ralph Macchio

CBS joins in on 'prequel' trend with 'Dallas: The Early Years'

By CONNIE PASSALACQUA

"Back to the Future" earned more than \$100 million doing it. And "Si. Elsewhere's" ratings jumped when they tried it. The recent trend of films and TV series going back in time to explore the roots of characters long beloved by their audiences has proven to be very popular.

But for most producers, writers and actors, bringing to life these sentimental journeys is far from easy money. There is a substantial challenge when established characters are brought to life by younger actors. Thus, the three-hour TV movie "prequel," "Dallas: The Early Years," airing at 7 p.m. Sunday on CBS, which traces the Ewing/Barnes family feud back to its beginnings in the 1930s, features young, unknown actors grappling with two uneasy tasks.

The actors must follow in both the footsteps of such legendary characters as J.R., Miss Ellie and Jock Ewing and then somehow emulate the actors who became TV superstars playing them.

Molly Hagen, a young and spirited actress who is making her first major Hollywood appearance in the pivotal role of Miss Ellie, insists that her performance was original. "I really didn't base Miss Ellie entirely on Barbara (Bel Geddes, who plays Miss Ellie) or Donna Reed (who played Miss Ellie for a season, while Miss Bel Geddes was ill). I focused only on playing the changes in her as a girl over the years (I played her)."

But she does admit that she used one aspect of today's portrayal by Miss Bel Geddes as a guide.

"Ellie was wild at 15 and she got calmer as she got older. Barbara has taken all that in and today expresses it all through her eyes. She makes incredible judgments with those eyes. She lets whoever does her wrong dig their own graves just with one look."

While Miss Ellie is most often a supporting character in today's "Dallas," Miss Hagen explains that

her character is the focal point of the TV movie. "The movie really is a triangle love story between Miss Ellie, her future husband Jock (Dale Midkiff, played in the series by the late Jim Davis), and Digger Barnes (David Grant, played in the series by Keenan Wynn).

And whereas series fans have been led to believe from the first episode that the Ewing/Barnes feud was caused by disputed ownership of oil wells, Miss Hagen says that the TV movie does a comprehensive job in establishing and explaining the in-

tertwining romantic rivalry. "That part is kind of the soap opera behind the soap opera," she says.

Miss Hagen also says that making the TV movie at the real Southfork Ranch, outside of Dallas (where the series itself is partially taped), was a great help to her and the other young actors in getting into character.

"We saw the land being fought over. It made everything more real." She also says the expository nature of the TV movie makes the Ewing/Barnes saga more real-life than in its later soap opera format. "On 'Dallas,' you know which characters are good and bad. But no one is all good or all bad in the movie. By seeing their histories you get to know why they did what they did. You get to see why Digger became a drunk. You see that Jock wasn't a saint. And that Miss Ellie wasn't either."

Miss Hagen corrects herself on the one exception: J.R. (seen at age 15, played by Kevin Wixted). "Unfortunately, he was even an obnoxious creep then. But the movie shows it didn't come from anything I did. I was a good mother!"

Montana native survives quake, launches project to aid victims

Sometimes something so powerful and dramatic happens in your life you have no choice in the matter, and you are compelled to do something. Constance Towers, who plays Clarissa McCandless on "Capitol," was placed in such a situation.

While visiting with her husband, John Gavin, the American ambassador to Mexico, the earthquake struck. There was no way she could turn her back on the thousands of injured and orphaned children. So "Project Connie" was born.

"I'd been involved with helping at the Children's Hospital before, but this was something completely different. There were so many who needed help, and still do. Our function is to give medical and emotional assistance, so they can continue life with as few scars as possible."

With the help of plastic surgeons, UCLA's medical facility and the Red Cross, she has done a lot to lighten the burden for many of the homeless walls.

"We have two young families up here, where the head of the household is no older than 11 years old. We're not going to split them up after what they've been through. They need each other more than ever. One of the girls lost her eye during the quake; she's going to be getting an artificial one."

Constance's childhood was far from Mexico City.

"I was raised in Whitefish, Montana, a small town in the northwest corner of the state. My parents were wonderfully supportive. That's what I want these children to have. I brought up my own in the same fashion."

Her son obviously benefitted from Constance's beliefs. He has graduated pre-med from UCLA. Her daughter, an aerobics instructor, has aspirations to act. She has played the young Clarissa on "Capitol." Her two stepchildren are similarly motivated. One is currently at Stanford, the other graduated Phi Beta Kappa from there last year.

"No one ever told me what to do. All I've ever said is 'Find out what turns you on and go for it.' That's the only way to succeed."

Normally being the ambassador's wife is a full-time job. Constance, however, has found the time for a

successful acting career.

"Fortunately, there are planes that fly daily from Mexico City. I go down frequently, three times a week. When Vice President Bush came to stay, I flew down to do the preparatory work, came back, did my scenes, then went back down again. I wouldn't miss being on the show. I love to act."

She might have gotten more than she bargained for. Hobbies are luxuries she rarely has time for. Her work off-camera is inspiring, which more than makes up for the loss of personal time.

It's nice to see someone go far beyond their role, in making this world a better place for so many victims of a catastrophe.

HBO THE HITCHHIKER A detective

Viewers like comedies — even in repeat form — numbers show

NEW YORK — Comedies, including three repeat episodes, notched the first five slots in last week's Top 10. NBC had four of those sitcoms and gained an easy victory in the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings.

Figures released Tuesday showed that NBC won with an average prime-time rating of 17.4 to CBS' 15.7 and ABC's 14.2. After 25 weeks of the 30-week season, NBC has averaged a 17.8 rating to CBS' 16.9 and ABC's 15.0.

One ratings point equals 859,000 homes with television.

A first-run episode of NBC's "The Cosby Show" was the most-watched program, earning a 34.8 rating. Next came a repeat of NBC "Family Ties," with a 31.0, an original episode of NBC's "Cheers," with a 23.5, a rerun of NBC's "The Golden Girls," with a 22.8, and a repeat of ABC's "Who's the Boss?," which had a 22.7 rating.

The rest of the Top 10 included ABC's "Dynasty" in sixth, CBS' "60 Minutes" and ABC's sitcom "Growing Pains," which tied for seventh, the first part of CBS' miniseries "If Tomorrow Comes" and NBC's

"Miami Vice."

Among the next 10 programs were CBS' "Dallas," which tied for 14th with NBC's new comedy, "Valerie," and the second part of NBC's miniseries, "Dress Gray," which ranked 19th.

The two miniseries last week performed well, in part, because they didn't face major competition as had other multi-part productions this season. For example, the first episode of "If Tomorrow Comes" had a higher rating than both "Sins" and "Peter the Great," which went head to head last month.

"When you don't force viewers to make a choice, everybody benefits in the long run," said Michael Elsenberg, CBS' research director. He said he expected the networks to more effectively avoid each other's major productions in the future.

NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff said recently that he wanted to program a miniseries every month next season, rather than stack them up in the sweeps months of February, May and November.

Last week, NBC won Monday, Thursday and Saturday, nights the network began with successful comedy blocks. As has been the case

with "The Cosby Show" repeats, reruns of "The Golden Girls" on Saturday also are performing as well as the original episodes.

"We've found that the numbers in sitcoms don't come down very much in repeats," said George Hooper, NBC's vice president for audience research.

Eisenberg noted that CBS' weak-performing movies and ABC's lower-rated series on Saturday paved the way for "The Golden Girls" to become the major new hit of the season. "We didn't help ourselves," Eisenberg said.

In other prime-time ratings developments, NBC's "Amazing Stories" moved to 6 p.m. last Sunday but did not perform as better than "Punky Brewster" normally does, finishing in 64th place. CBS' "People's Choice Awards" ranked 24th with a 17.4 rating, which was its lowest performance ever. The previous low was an 18.0 rating in 1982.

In the evening news competition, the "CBS Evening News" finished first with a 13.1 rating. The NBC Nightly News averaged 12.4, ABC's "World News Tonight" had a 12.0.

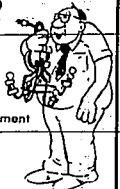

Bess Armstrong takes on failing soap opera in new NBC comedy

LOS ANGELES — Two years ago, when NBC gave the creators of "Cheers" the go-ahead for another series, they went looking for Bess Armstrong.

"They said they didn't know if they wanted to do another show," she said, "but if I was interested it would give them a way to go."

A month later, Glen and Les Charles and James Burrows came back with an idea about a woman who becomes the producer of a failing soap opera.

"It's a position of authority, which women seldom have in soap operas," said Miss Armstrong. "And they said they were going to be radical and have her married. She's not looking for Mr. Right. In a way, it's like the old 'Dick Van Dyke Show' in that it spans two arenas. You see me at the office and you see my husband only at home, which is different."

The result is "All Is Forgiven," a half-hour comedy series that will get a second special preview this Thursday following "Cheers," temporarily displacing "Night Court." On Saturday, March 29, it will begin its regular run for seven weeks following "Golden Girls." The show "227," which normally appears at that time, will return in the summer.

"All Is Forgiven" is the name of the soap opera Miss Armstrong is hired to resuscitate.

"In the office you have a lot of high-pressure people, eccentric people running around," said Miss Armstrong. "At home my husband tries to calm me down and at the office I try to calm the others down: One

character you never see is Mrs. Fontaine, the executive producer. You only hear her through the squawk box. She's very unorthodox in her hiring and firing of people.

"In the second episode my husband's daughter from a previous marriage comes to live with us. She brings a note of cynicism. She's Carla to my Diane (a reference to characters on 'Cheers'). I'm a product of the '60s and '70s, and she's a child of the '80s.

"The Charles brothers have a knack for turning up offbeat character actors," she added. "They're slightly off the nose of what you would expect. There are nine major principals in the show and two major areas. It's not easy. The first two episodes are really pilots that in-

troduce all the characters."

The show stars Terence Knox as her husband, Shawnee Smith as her teen-age stepdaughter, Carol Kane as the show's head writer, David Alan Grier as her assistant, Valerie Landsburg as her secretary, Bill Wiley as the inept director and Judith-Marie Bergan and Debi Richter as a couple of demanding actresses.

It's the second series for Miss Armstrong, who has appeared mostly in feature films and miniseries. She starred in the 1977-78 series "Our Own," then went on to play the sexy homewrecker in the movie "The Four Seasons." She was in the HBO special "Barefoot in the Park" and starred opposite Tom Selleck in "High Road to China." She appeared in the miniseries "Lace" and will be in the upcoming movie "Nothing in Common" with Tom Hanks and Jackie Gleason.

She grew up in Ruxton, Md., where her parents were teachers. At the Bryn Mawr School for Girls she studied classical violin, then went on to Brown University to major in Latin and theater.

Miss Armstrong has been under contract for "All Is Forgiven" since the fall of 1984. The series was to have gone on the air in September 1985 but was knocked out by the writers' strike. It finally went into production last September. She was tied up for a long time, but did get time off to make the movie "Nothing in Common."

At one point, she was working on the movie and the series at the same time. "Some days it was brain-damaging," she said. "But after months of enforced inactivity I couldn't complain."

Oscar show looks to lure viewers with a return to song and dance

LOS ANGELES — The Academy Awards as a television attraction has withered in the ratings in the past two years.

Viewers seem to be growing disenchanted with Hollywood's most cherished spectacle, and Oscar officials grapple with how to jazz it up.

Last year the Oscar show was too lean. In 1984 it was too long. This year the Academy of Motion Picture

Arts and Sciences will attempt to lure back the lost audience with big production numbers and bigger names.

Last year four producers tried to solve the ratings problem by committee, including the use of warning lights to keep acceptance speeches short. This year, the warning lights are being reconsidered and there's only one producer.

"There is a concern that it could stifle some great moments, like Sally Field's 'You like me!' acceptance speech last year," said Academy spokesman Bob Werden. He said producer Stanley Donen hasn't yet made a final decision.

In a 42-year career, Donen has produced or directed such song-and-dance movies as "Singing in the Rain," "The Pajama Game" and "Damn Yankees." Marty Pasetta returns for his 15th year as director.

The 58th annual Oscar presentations on Monday will be broadcast live from the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion of the Los Angeles Music Center beginning at 7 p.m. MST on ABC-TV (KIVI Boise, KPVI Pocatello and KTVX Salt Lake City).

In the past two years, the pro-

gram has been criticized for having far too much, such as the three-hour, 47-minute show in 1984, or far too little, such as the spare 1985 show. The latter was only a few minutes over its scheduled three hours, but sparse in entertainment.

"You're dealing with an established format, and there's really nothing you can do to change it," said Jack Haley, who produced the 1984 show. "I think the only answer is if everyone just walks out and says who the (winners) are."

But that would destroy the entertainment value of the show, he said: "You're virtually in a no-win situation."

For all its miscues and overtime, the 1984 show still did better than last year's, with 25.4 million households viewing, for a Nielsen rating of 30.3 and an audience share of 50. The 1985 show fell to 23.5 million households, with a rating of 27.7 and an audience share of 45. Compare those shows with 1983's 31.6 million households watching with a rating of 38.0 and a share of 59, and there seems to be a problem.

A rating measures the percentage of the nation's TV homes watching a

show. The Oscars also are fighting the overall decrease in viewership suffered by network television over the past few years because of competition from cable television and home videocassette recorders.

Pasetta and Donen have decided to return to more production numbers, with three or four song-and-dance routines to be added to the usual performances for the five nominated songs of the year.

They also will address a recent tendency among celebrities not to show up for the awards. One segment of this year's ceremony will feature an on-stage group introduction of 20 to 30 previous winners.

"We are doing that specifically to make a point about the attendance," Pasetta said.

"Another problem is that many of the nominees in recent years have been—first-or-second—timers, and don't have the recognition of more established stars," Pasetta said in an interview. And—the more established stars, unless nominated, have sometimes failed to show up.

This year's star list so far includes hosts Alan Alda, Jane Fonda and Robin Williams. Presenters include



Barbra Streisand, Audrey Hepburn, Bob Hope, Michael J. Fox, Sally Field, Whoopi Goldberg, Terri Garr, Norma Aleandro and Rebecca DeMornay.

What also makes a difference, Pasetta said, is who the nominated stars are. "Ultimately, if it's a good horse race, then it's a good year," he said.

The Academy sometimes has

made wrong decisions. The directors of the 1985 show had Anne Reiniking sing Grammy winner Phil Collins nominated song, "Against All Odds," instead of the British pop star. Critics said Miss Reiniking murdered the tune.

The producers had reasoned that they wanted someone associated with the movie industry to sing it. But the same logic didn't apply to Ray Parker Jr., who was allowed to perform his "Ghostbusters" on the same show.

There's been a change in thinking. This year, Collins turned down an invitation to sing "Separate Lives," one of the nominated songs from "White Nights," which he did as a duet with Marilyn Martin. It will be performed instead by writer Stephen Bishop. Lionel Richie will sing his "Say You, Say Me," from the same film.

Tata Vega, who sang "Miss Cella's Blues" on the sound track of "The Color Purple," will reprise her performance for the Oscar show, while Gregg Burge will repeat his dynamic rendition of "Surprise Surprise" from "A Chorus Line." Huey Lewis and the News will perform their "The Power of Love" from "Back to the Future."

Industry convention previews the shape of cable TV to come

DALLAS — Cable-TV users can say goodbye to dirt-cheap basic service rates and local access channels that give a forum to well-meaning citizens and self-proclaimed talk-show hosts.

They can say hello to stereo hookups, more free services and in-

creased availability of pay-per-view movies.

Those are the messages from the 35th National Cable Television Associations Convention and Exposition, which was held here last week with about 12,000 cable system operators and exhibitors in attendance.

The mood at the Dallas Convention Center is one of quiet optimism — very quiet — as the stagnating

cable industry eagerly awaits the lifting of federal regulation scheduled for year's end.

True to the convention theme of "More Choice — More Value," talk here centers on how owners of the cable systems that feed the estimated 40 million cable households can take advantage of deregulation.

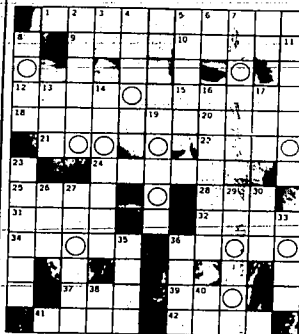

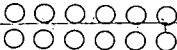

Their goal is to reshape cable with the viewer, and profits, in mind.

"There are lots of bells and whistles we currently have to make available as an industry that 80 percent of the consumers don't want," said Nicholas J. Nicholas Jr., executive vice president of Time Inc., one of the nation's largest cable operators and parent company of Home Box Office pay-cable service. Local access channels, which allow citizens to buy air time and rent production facilities at extremely low rates, are just the type of added plus that some cable operators had to offer to win government-mandated local approvals. Cable operators might discontinue such services once deregulation eliminates local constraints.

"Where there is no consumer demand, (a service) will go away," Nicholas said.

Meanwhile, basic service rates considered artificially low in many markets are expected to rise. Basic service typically includes such channels as MTV, Arts & Entertainment

and Cable News Network.

Cable operators insist that they will not be offering expensive, no-frills services. With videocassette rentals taking a big bite out of their business, cable systems are sharpening their competitive strategies.

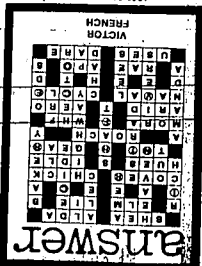
Denver-based Daniels & Associates, which manages cable systems serving 350,000 subscribers, recently began showing Houston Rockets and Astros games on basic service, at no extra charge to the cable subscriber. Company Executive Vice President Gerard Maglio said that his system also intends to provide customers with a full-service hookup, whereby the cable line feeds into the videocassette recorder and stereo as well as the TV set.

"More for the money" is how Maglio characterized his approach.

Pay-per-view is the most closely watched new type of service, in part because it is the only new type of service available, some say. But others consider this the most potent weapon against home video rentals, as it allows viewers a very similar

service: They pay a one-time fee of \$4 to \$5 to receive a hit movie that only recently premiered in theaters and will not be available on pay-cable services for several months.
