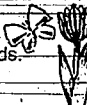

Stivers won't run for another term



SPEAKER TOM STIVERS Cites personal reasons

BOISE — Idaho House Speaker Tom Stivers announced Thursday that he will not seek re-election.

Stivers told KBCI-TV in Boise that his decision was based on personal reasons, and not on criticism for some stands he has taken in the Idaho Legislature. The comments were made during the taping of the station's interaction program.

Legislative sources confirmed that Stivers would not seek re-election.

Stivers said he had spent enough time in government. He had won re-election, Stivers said he would have turned 70 in office, and said he preferred to step down now.

Stivers, who has sparked controversy during his 4-year tenure as House Speaker, said his decision was not based on criticism of his job in the Legislature.

He said his wife had encouraged him not to seek re-election in 1984, and said he agreed then to step down after one more term.

Stivers said he would back Celia Polking, 28, a school teacher in Buhl, for his District 23 seat, which he has held 12 years.

Rep. Jeff Stoker, R-Twin Falls, has filed for Stivers' seat. Stoker represents District 25.

Stivers was often at the center of controversy during his tenure as House Speaker.

He removed two members from the House Education Committee. That later sparked a confrontation in the House when Rep. Lyman Gene Winchester referred to the members of his own party as "queer lovers" during a debate on a bill that would have prohibited teachers from presenting homosexuality as an acceptable lifestyle.

Stivers refused to ask Winchester for an apology, saying he didn't want the matter aired in the press. On the last day of the session, Stivers said he hadn't clearly understood what Winchester said because of noise in the chamber.

During the last session, he threatened to remove Rep. Kathleen Gurnsey, R-Boise, from the House Appropriations Committee unless she went along with an education funding proposal.

Stivers also locked horns with Division of Public Works Administrator Brian Chase, accusing him of breaking the law by establishing a day-care center in two state buildings without legislative or other approval.

Chase said Stivers was trying to slur the administration of democratic Gov. John Evans.

Reactions to decision from GOP, critics vary

TWIN FALLS — House Speaker Tom Stivers' decision not to seek re-election after serving 12 long — and somewhat controversial — years in the Legislature drew varied reactions Thursday from his fellow Republicans and critics.

Terry Gilbert, regional director of the Idaho Education Association, who-butted heads with Stivers over education, said: "I wish him well in his retirement from political office and I hope that means Idaho education will progress and flourish. I have one other comment and that's, 'Goodbye Tom.'"

Gilbert referred to a letter Stivers wrote to a teacher who said she was going to leave Idaho because of lack of funding for education. Stivers told the woman simply, "Goodbye."

Gilbert interpreted Stivers' retirement from the Legislature as a sign of things to come.

"I do hope the Republican Party will achieve a moderation that will be attractive to teachers to join and work within the party structure. Maybe it's a symbol of the growth within the party to moderation," he said.

As it was, the politics of some GOP members and leadership turned people off, Gilbert said.

Gilbert said his main criticism of Stivers, who had great potential for progress, was his choice not to exert leadership to help Idaho progress economically or educationally.

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Cecil Andrus, who predicted Wednesday in Twin Falls that Republican leadership in the Idaho Legislature would not be back, said, "I guess I can stand by what I said yesterday. What I said yesterday is true today."

Andrus said he agreed with the people of Idaho who are sending a message, loud and clear, that a change in that leadership is absolutely necessary.

"This may clear the way for a bipartisan representation from the people on both sides of the ballot, and one that can get Idaho going the right way. I think that is the goal of this second-class citizen role the state is playing."

Rep. Jeff Stoker, R-Twin Falls, who announced this week that he would seek Stivers' District 23 seat, said he was "totally surprised" about the announcement. And he isn't changing his mind about running for the position, Stoker said. In fact, he probably will be challenged by Celia Polking, a Buhl school teacher, who Stivers said he would back for his old seat.

Stoker said criticism of Stivers' actions in the recent legislative session must have had some influence on, or at least confirmed, Stivers' decision not to seek re-election, despite Stivers' claim that his reasons were personal.

"His (Stivers') timing was good. He steps out a winner. What can you say?" Stoker said.

Stoker, an attorney, said he

Idaho prison tightens up on security

BOISE — Immediate security changes were ordered Thursday at the Idaho State Penitentiary in the wake of the escape of convicted slayer Claude Dallas four nights earlier.

Searchers continued to scour northern Nevada's desert areas, looking for the 36-year-old trapper, but reported little more than a number of dead ends.

Gov. John Evans continued his criticism of the prison administration Thursday, saying that prison officials should have known that Dallas was an escape risk, and should not have allowed Dallas the freedom of a medium security classification.

Dallas was convicted in 1982 of the 1981 slayings of two Idaho Fish and Game Department conservation officers as they tried to arrest him for poaching. He wasn't caught until 16 months after the killings.

"He was an obvious escape risk," the governor told a Boise news conference. "It's obvious that we weren't taking proper care to see that he didn't escape."

He ordered a meeting with Corrections Director Al Murphy, Robert Anderson, Post Falls, chairman of the Board of Corrections, joined in a telephone conference call.

Prison officials said Dallas, who obviously had help from someone on the outside, cut through two fences to escape. The inmate left a visiting area to return to his cell Sunday night but then disappeared.

Bloodhounds and other tips led searchers into the northern Nevada desert near Paradise Valley, where Dallas was captured in 1982. But officers reported no progress in the five-day-old search.

Evans said after the meeting with Murphy that the prison will make immediate security changes, as a result of the investigation into the Dallas escape.

Sharp wire, called "razor wire" will encircle the administration building and visitor's center. And a trench or channel will be dug, so inmates returning to cells from the visitor center will have to stay in the channel. They will not be allowed to go into areas of the prison "yard" where visibility is limited, the governor said.

Murphy said it was a "positive meeting," and he told the governor that the prison's classification system would not rank Dallas as a high escape risk.

Both the governor and Murphy said a basic problem is overcrowding at the prison, and Murphy said there are not enough high-security cells for everyone.

The state is planning a new \$8 million maximum security.

Evans vetoes hurry-up easing of water rules

BOISE — Gov. John Evans has vetoed legislation passed hurriedly by the Idaho Legislature attempting to loosen water quality regulations involving timber harvest.

Evans vetoed the bill on Thursday. It was the first full veto of legislation passed by the 1986 session which adjourned last week. The governor and various sportsmen's groups told a news conference here the measure could have resulted in serious damage to water quality and possible loss of trout spawning areas.

Evans also said he received word Thursday that the federal Environmental Protection Agency wouldn't have allowed the "water quality" decline under the bill, and would have imposed federal rules to supersede the proposed new law.

"There almost certainly would have been an acceleration in the decline of water quality," prime trout spawning areas said Ron Mitchell, representing the Idaho Sportsmen's Coalition.

The much-revised legislation slipped through the Idaho Legislature in

a hurry last month. Evans said legislators apparently thought they were acting to ease some of the litigation among delays involved in forest management plans.

Steve Ahrens, lobbyist for Boise Cascade Corp., and Todd Maddock, lobbyist for Potlatch Corp., convinced Chairman Rep. Vard Chaburn, R-Abnott, to introduce, print and send the legislation through the House Resources and Conservation Committee without a hearing, although related legislation had been discussed earlier.

"It was passed by the House within four days, and sailed through the entire Senate process in about nine days after that."

Evans refused to call it "special interest" legislation. He said the timber industry spokesmen were attempting to solve a legitimate problem, over the definition of "serious injury" to water quality caused by logging operations.

"Idahoans — will not — tolerate anything less than a total commitment."

Known woman terrorist on TWA plane

Reagan rules out no bombing suspects

WASHINGTON — President Reagan said Thursday he has not ruled out anyone, including Libyan leader Moammar Khadafy, as responsible for the bombing that killed four Americans on a TWA flight to Athens.

"Neither the United States nor the world community can cease our efforts to bring to justice those who perpetrate and support such actions," Reagan said in a statement issued through his spokesman, Larry Speakes.

"Although a group calling itself the Arab Revolutionary Cells has claimed responsibility, we have not ruled out any terrorist group, organization, movement or individual as a potential suspect," said the statement, read to reporters near the president's California ranch.

Government and private experts in Washington said they knew little about the Arab Revolutionary Cells.

"The president condemns the attack on innocent air travelers as a barbaric act of wanton international terrorism ... (and) directed that all agencies of the government join the govern-

ments of Italy, Greece and Egypt to determine the facts in this incident," Speakes said.

Khadafy has disavowed the fatal bombing Wednesday of the TWA Boeing 727, and the attack was blamed "variously on two terrorists, Abu Nidal and Abu Moussa, as well as the Arab Revolutionary Cells," an obscure Palestinian group that telephoned a Western news agency in Beirut to claim responsibility.

Speakes, however, said: "We do not know yet who was responsible. But in view of Khadafy's past record his denial by themselves mean nothing."

Investigators in Greece, Italy and Egypt have determined that a known terrorist was aboard the plane before the explosion. And in Beirut, Palestinian sources in Beirut said Abu Nidal had used the "Arabic Arab" Revolutionary Cells in previous terrorist attacks.

Although both Khadafy and Abu Nidal proclaimed a new wave of terrorism in retaliation for U.S. Navy clashes with Libyan forces last week, Undersecretary of State for Political Affairs Michael Armacost said he doubted the encounter triggered the latest terrorist attack.

According to intelligence reports, Armacost said, "Planning for terrorist activities predated

any activity associated with the exercises."

In Cairo, the chief of airport security, Maj. Gen. Hosni Farag, told the state-run daily newspaper al-Ahram that a Lebanese woman using the name May Elias Mansur, age about 30, boarded the TWA flight for Athens there.

The woman, a known terrorist, may have put plastic explosives under seat 10F and left the plane before it left for Rome and exploded enroute back to Athens, said Greek and Italian police.

"It is certain that a suspect person, who is on file as a terrorist, got on in Cairo and got off in Athens, occupying in the airplane the exact seat where the explosion occurred," Italian Interior Minister Luigi Scalfaro told reporters in Rome.

State Department spokesman Bernard Kalb said that U.S. officials were aware of the reports but would have no comment.

A Washington expert on terrorism, Robert Kupperman, said the Arab Revolutionary Cells appeared linked with Khadafy and Abu Nidal.

"I think that Libya certainly provided support for the group in the past. But I don't think that Khadafy ordered this attack," said Kupperman, of the Georgetown University-Center for Strategic and International Studies.

Anti-apartheid clash leads to 90 arrests

BERKELEY, Calif. — Anti-apartheid demonstrators hurled boulders, rocks and eggs at police officers Thursday in a clash that led to 90 arrests, 29 injuries and destruction of a shantytown on the University of California campus.

Two men were arrested for allegedly possessing firebombs after police received a threat that California Hall would be burned down, and charred paper was found stuffed in the gas tanks of three university cars, authorities reported.

About 1,000 people later gathered at a peace rally to hear protest leaders call for a student strike Monday and vow to rebuild the shantytown that

has been torn down twice by university police.

The conflict began before dawn when police placed dozens of demonstrators into buses to be taken to Alameda County's Santa Rita jail, said university spokesman Ray Colvig. Hundreds of other protesters surrounded the buses, preventing them from moving.

About 8:30 a.m. MST, police in riot gear cleared a path through the crowd. Fighting broke out as demonstrators hurled bottles, rocks and eggs and blocked buses by hurling trash cans and setting up makeshift barricades and sitting in the way.

Eleven protesters and 18 police officers suffered minor injuries that included cuts, bruises and sprains, said university spokesman Tom Debelly.

PUC staff calls for power rate cut

BOISE (AP) — Idaho Public Utilities Commission staff members are recommending that Idaho Power Co. be ordered to lower its rates instead of being granted the pending \$84.2 million rate increase request.

In a recommendation handed down Thursday, staff members Alyson Anderson suggested that commissioners reduce Idaho Power's rates by \$2.6 million.

Larry Taylor, Idaho Power Co. information director, said he hadn't seen a copy of the recommendation and couldn't make specific comments.

"But he said he had been told that the staff would recommend a rate decrease. Based on what we've heard, I can't realize how they could come up with those numbers."

The testimony of staff members will be presented at a public hearing on April 10 in Twin Falls. A rebuttal hearing is scheduled for May 21 in Boise.

The company applied last September for the 27.4 percent rate hike, the largest ever sought by a regulated utility operating in Idaho.

The company is asking \$37.5 million to cover costs

of the Valmy II coal-fired plant in northern Nevada. But staff member Stephanie Miller is recommending that a third of the company's investment in Valmy II not be allowed, according to the recommendation.

Idaho Power knew before Valmy II was completed that the 125-megawatt share wouldn't be needed in the foreseeable future, Miller said. But the company didn't present any evidence to show it considered any other action other than completing the plant and adding the costs to its rate base, she said.

Miller recommended that Idaho Power be allowed to earn a return of only \$103 million of its \$154 million investment in Valmy II until the company needs the plant to serve its customers during normal water years.

She also recommended that \$17 million of Idaho Power's investment in the Boardman plant be excluded from the rate base. She said the company didn't tell the commission of negative aspects associated with the plant.

Snow, tornadoes spread over plains

An intense storm Thursday brought tornadoes to Nebraska, heavy snow to Colorado and Wyoming, and severe thunderstorms to Texas.

A twister blew a car off Highway 40 near Miller, Neb., and into a cornfield. The woman who was driving was thrown clear of the car and was in fair condition at a hospital in Kearney. The tornado caused an estimated \$150,000 in damage to farm buildings and machinery, authorities said.

Five tornadoes were sighted near North Platte, Neb., causing minor damage, officials said.

In Marlow, Okla., lightning struck an oil storage area, hitting a tank containing 400 gallons of natural gas. The resulting explosion and fire destroyed the tank and an oil tank nearby, containing 210 gallons of crude, authorities said. No one was injured.

Snowfall amounts included more than 3 feet at Casper Mountain, Wyo., 26 inches near Fort Collins, Colo., 9 inches in Denver, and 8 inches or more in western Nebraska.

Travelers' advisories were in effect for the mountains of Colorado and the border areas of north-central and eastern New Mexico.

Travelers and livestock advisories were posted for the Black Hills of South Dakota as well as central and northeast Wyoming. Livestock advisories were in effect for southwest Wyoming, South Dakota, central Nebraska and northwest Kansas.

Wind gusts of more than 60 mph were clocked at Fort Carson, Fort Collins, La Plata and Pueblo, Colo.

Large hail bombarded north-central Texas, golf-ball-size near Burk Burnett, quarter-size near Holy Day, nickel-size at Iowa Park and Rocky Point, and dime-size near Wichita Falls and Manfkins.

Man kills landlord, holes up

CHICAGO (AP) — A heavily armed man who was months behind in his rent shot and killed his landlord and a police officer Thursday, then took an elderly neighbor hostage and barricaded himself in an apartment, authorities said.

More than 50 police officers surrounded the wood-frame, two-story building on Chicago's North Side where the gunman was barricaded.

Police sharpshooters took up positions on the roofs of nearby buildings and a police negotiator was sent to talk with the gunman, described as "a huge male 300 pounds, aged 30-35," said Police Superintendent Fred Rice.

The incident began about 3 p.m. when the landlord, identified as Leslie Shearer, came to collect money from his tenant, who apparently was three or four months behind in rent payments, Rice said.

IRS says Cohn owes millions

NEW YORK (AP) — Roy M. Cohn, the lawyer who rose to fame at the side of the late Sen. Joseph McCarthy, owes nearly \$7 million in back taxes, interest and penalties, the federal government charged Thursday.

The Justice Department, at the request of the Internal Revenue Service, filed civil suits against Cohn in New York City and in Bridgeport, Conn., to satisfy part of the debt by seizing a New York townhouse and a Greenwich home that Cohn allegedly owns through dummy companies.

Cohn has acknowledged owing \$1.75 million in taxes dating back to 1959, according to the government's court papers, but despite a series of agreements with the IRS since 1978 he has paid little of the debt. He has not conceded any liability for the interest and penalties.

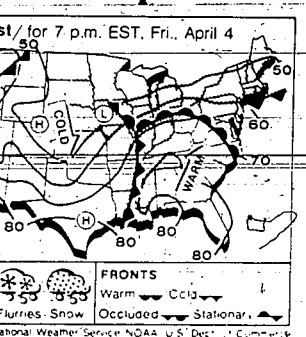

realized he would have faced a formidable opponent in the May 27 primary if Silvers had decided to try for another term.

"He (Silvers) is an able campaigner and politician," Stoker said. "I thought I had a very good chance to win. Given the public perception of Silvers, he would have a hard time getting re-elected."

As for Stoker's services in the House, Silvers said he was surprised at Silvers' decision to be as tactful as such, but he is a capable individual, whatever you say about him."

Silvers' daughter, Susan Waters of Twin Falls had no comment. Her husband, Deskin, said his father-in-law told Susan of his decision just minutes before leaving for Boise to announce it. There was no family discussion beforehand, he added.

William Lanting of Hollister, a Republican, said he agrees that the time has come for Silvers to step down.

"It takes a smart man to know when to quit, and I think this is the time for him (Silvers) to quit. I think he should get out," Lanting said.

The former Twin Falls County legislator was critical of some of Silvers' actions and said he believed the decorum of the House of Representatives to deteriorate and let "things get out of control — a situation I hate to see."

Let's say that he did things different, Lanting added.

Specifically, Lanting criticized Silvers for saying the sales tax increase is temporary, when he must know it is not temporary, and said that Silvers' way to handle these situations than by threatening Kitty Gurnsey with her job on the Appropriations Committee, as he did recently.

With Silvers and some of his supporters gone, Lanting said, there would be a few more moderate attitudes in the House.

Steve Antone, R-Rupert, said he had no comment because he hadn't heard about Silvers' announcement.

"I don't think he's backing down because of a challenge by Stoker," Stuber added.

"Stivers has been a good legislator," Stuber said. "You can't get elected House speaker unless you get the mutual respect of everyone in the House."

Even so, only the bad things about Silvers and didn't see his ability to get things accomplished, Stuber said. "He's done his stint in public service," he added.

Another former House speaker, Ralph Olmstead of Twin Falls, who served as Silvers' predecessor, said Silvers needs to be complimented for his long term as a legislator and also as speaker of the House.

"He is to be complimented for being elected based on his philosophical principles, both as a legislator and as House speaker," Olmstead said, "when his position was well known by the electorate and by his colleagues. They knew he could be depended on, even under severe pressures, to follow those philosophical directions."

Olmstead avoided talking about whether or not he agreed with Silvers' philosophy, saying, "Anyone who puts in that kind of dedication to the public for six terms or more, is going beyond and above the call of duty."

Olmstead said he had been aware for some time that Silvers did not plan to seek re-election this year.

While Lanting said he could see a chance for Antone as House speaker, Olmstead said: "It wasn't my turn when I became speaker. That isn't the way the office is earned. It is a wide-open field and not based on seniority or important assignments an individual may have held. It's based on leadership abilities."

Lloyd Walker, a Twin Falls attorney and former state Democratic Party leader, agreed that Silvers is due recognition for his lengthy service in the Idaho Legislature, but he said leadership in both the House and Senate slipped in this year's legislative session.

"I only hope that Risch (James Risch, president pro tem of the Senate) will follow Stivers. This would certainly put the Republican party leadership more in touch with a growing Idaho. I would hope to see a younger, more moderate person as House speaker — one more in tune to business and urban concerns of the state. Eastern Idaho and rural Idaho have dominated much too long."

Walker said he feels Kitty Gurnsey, a Boise Republican, would be a good choice for the speaker's post.

Several individuals contacted for comment on Silvers' Thursday announcement said they have heard rumors that if Secretary of State Pete Cenarrusa should decide to step down, Silvers might be considering a run for that position.

Silvers did not return phone calls from The Times-News at the Boise motel where he was staying Thursday night.

Folkings and state Rep. Donna Scott, R-Twin Falls, were also unavailable for comment Thursday night.

prison, but it won't be ready for nearly a year.

Murphy said the prison has less than 200 tight-security cells. The prison, south of Boise, now holds 110 murderers, 30 people in for manslaughter, 243 sex offenders, 22 inmates who have escaped, and more than 220 other inmates who have been convicted of violent crimes in the past.

ment by our state agencies to maintain the quality of our waterways," the governor said.

But he ordered the Department of Health and Welfare and the Department of Lands on Thursday to work with all concerned groups and have a new definition of "serious injury" ready by the middle of September.

Evans and Mitchell also objected to the fact the legislation attempted to shift responsibility for monitoring water quality from Health and Welfare to the Lands agency.

Both said Health and Welfare has personnel trained to monitor water quality. Lands does not, and the Legislature refused a request for more money for that purpose.

Mitchell said sportsmen groups tried to tell legislators that HB71 would cause serious problems, but got little response.

"In effect, the governor is bailing out sportsmen," said Mitchell. "We would have been in extremely deep trouble" if the bill had been allowed to become law, he said.

The governor's office announced that Evans signed another environmental measure and law. It declares polluters as hazardous waste, which poses restrictions on transportation and disposal of the materials.

Partners are debris from aluminum processing. Officials said if not disposed of properly, the material can cause environmental damage. Discussion of the legislation centered on a proposal to incinerate polluters at a plant in Inkom.

Secretary visits, stumps for Symms

BOISE (AP) — U.S. Transportation Secretary Elizabeth Dole stumped in Boise for the re-election of Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, on Thursday, praising his Senate leadership on key transportation issues.

Symms, who faces a challenge for a second term in the Senate from Democratic Gov. John Evans, billed Mrs. Dole's visit as a chance for her to re-visit plans for the proposed Broadway-Binder freeway connector in Boise, which has received more than \$3 million in federal aid. Symms is chairman of a Senate transportation subcommittee.

Mrs. Dole, wife of Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole of Kansas, defended the Reagan administration's decision to withhold federal highway funds from states that do not raise their legal drinking age to 21 by October 1986.

Adamson starts jaunt

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — With the state primary less than two months away, Republican congressional hopeful Dan Adamson has begun his 320-mile walk across southern Idaho in a drive to separate himself from the crowded GOP field.

This is not a stunt, the former Jerome County prosecutor said as he began the trek Thursday from the Fremont County Courthouse steps. "I want to draw attention to the plight of farmers and businessmen here in Idaho."

Adamson, who lost a close 1984 primary race to then Republican incumbent George Hansen, said he hoped to talk with hundreds of voters as he passes through dozens of southern Idaho communities in the next 29 days on his way to the state Capitol in Boise.

Airline quits Pocatello

POCATELLO (AP) — Pioneer Airlines, which served Pocatello for only six months, announced Thursday it will discontinue its flights here April 11.

Pioneer's pullout, however, is not related to a recent financial squabble between the Denver-based commuter airline and the City of Pocatello on past-due payments, Pioneer President Charles DeMoney said.

"The termination is based simply on profit and loss. We were losing too much money to even think of keeping Pocatello on our route," DeMoney said.

Liquor option law now

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's counties soon will have the option of deciding if they want to allow liquor-by-the-drink sales on Sundays, Memorial Day and Thanksgiving.

Gov. John Evans on Thursday signed House Bill 708 into law. It is a measure which capped a session-long effort to raise the legal drinking age.

The Legislature eventually voted against that idea, but settled instead for a bill giving counties the option of allowing Sunday liquor sales and a 2 a.m. closing time.

Bergland raps power sale

GARDEN CITY (AP) — Calling the competitive sale of electricity generated by public power projects "a bad idea whose time should never come," former Agriculture Secretary Bob Bergland urged vigilance against Reagan administration proposals toward balancing the federal budget.

"Public power should remain in the public domain for the public interest," Bergland said. "It is one of those basic tenets that is not negotiable and is not for sale."

Bergland spoke in Garden City on Thursday to representatives of rural electric cooperatives, public power systems, farm and labor interests and senior citizens groups at the Western States Water and Power Conference.

Tax refunds to speed up

BOISE (AP) — From now on, the state of Idaho will have to pay interest if it doesn't make state income tax refunds within 60 days of the time a return is filed.

Gov. John Evans has signed legislation calling for interest-on-refunds not made within 60 days. It goes into effect next year. Present state law allows the state Tax Commission 120 days to process tax returns and send out refund checks.

Saudi asks for asylum

POCATELLO (AP) — A Saudi citizen who until recently lived in Pocatello has filed for political asylum in the U.S., saying a return to his native country could mean death.

Nabiel Yusef Al-Sheikh, 25, was transferred to Denver, Colo., for a deportation hearing after Immigration and Naturalization Service agents detained him here on Feb. 20 for having overstayed his visa.

The Saudi Educational Mission in Washington asked the American government to take action because the man's family requested help in arranging his return to Saudi Arabia.

Al-Sheikh is married to Pocatello resident Jodie Al-Sheikh, 24, an American citizen.

Because he has embraced Western culture and does not adhere to requirements of Saudi Arabia's Muslim religion, Al-Sheikh said he could face execution if he returned.

Convicts must earn time off prison terms

BOISE (AP) — Inmates at the Idaho State Penitentiary soon will not receive automatic "good time" off their sentences.

It will have to be earned, according to legislation signed late last year by the governor on Thursday.

Gov. John Evans signed a package of several bills designed to standardize and toughen the state's criminal sentencing laws.

But he vetoed a related bill, giving Idaho's governors authority to appoint the Pardon and Parole Commission instead of the Board of Corrections.

Since 1946, Evans said, Idaho has allowed its parole board to be appointed by the Board of Corrections instead of political leaders. That system has helped shield the system from political pressures, the governor said.

Prison officials say inmates now get automatic "good time" off their sentences, and it can be taken away only by a cumbersome proceeding. What started out as a good management tool now does nothing

more than cut inmate sentences no matter what their behavior, the officials said.

The new law says "good time" can be earned only by outstanding behavior.

Another criminal sentencing law allows sentencing judges to specify a minimum period an inmate must serve before being eligible for parole.

Current laws allow almost any prisoner to be considered for early release, and judges complained to the Legislature that when they sentenced a defendant, they had no idea how long the offender would actually serve.

House Bill 451, also signed by the governor on Thursday, declares that a judge may order a repeat drunken driving offender to undergo mandatory treatment for alcoholism. The state will pay for the treatment, but the offender must reimburse the cost.

The 1985 Legislature set a Jan. 1, 1985, deadline for search and rescue organizations to apply for reimbursement from a new fund for past searches.

Stallings' Contra vote shows risks, courage

Not everyone will agree with his vote, but we think Rep. Richard Stallings has chosen the right course of action in his vote to withhold American military aid from the Nicaragua Contras until the non-military, Latin American Contadora process has had a chance to work.

In taking this approach, the United States would keep its options open, as we think they should be, in its handling of Nicaragua.

A military solution can always be applied, should non-military solutions fail. But how we would ask the proponents of military aid, is the situation harmed by allowing those Latin American nations which have the greatest stake in the outcome to work out a peaceful solution if it is possible?

Stallings' vote last month to withhold aid to the Contras was one of both courage and some political risk.

The more conservative of his opponents may attack him for it. One primary contender, for example, J.F. Chabband, has already applied some pretty crude logic in attempting to link Stallings to both Jane Fonda and Soviet leader Gorbachev.

We think voters in the Second Congressional District have had enough experience with foreign policy demagoguery from former Rep. George Hansen to see through this kind of smear.

We suspect many Idahoans in the Second District are with Stallings on this one, for a number of reasons. One is that the president has not made a solid case for the threat he says Nicaragua poses.

The fact is that Nicaragua is a poor nation with fewer people than Oregon and a gross national product of less than \$3 billion a year, not much more than the value of agricultural products produced in one Western state — Idaho.

Nicaragua has 15,000 miles of roads — there are probably more than that in Twin Falls County; its capital has only 6,000 telephones. If this nation is a military threat, God knows what we'd do against a real enemy.

The second is that the \$100 million sought by the Administration is better spent elsewhere. Idahoans, particularly those in agriculture, could use a little help. Wouldn't it be better to put that money to work in our own "Central America"?

Third, the Contadora process needs more time to work. It would allow several Latin American nations, including Mexico, to help demilitarize the region and to work for politically negotiated solutions. How can time spent in that process harm the outcome?

Stallings recognizes that American foreign policy in the region has often had the reverse effect of its intent; instead of promoting freedom and democracy, it has promoted dictatorships.

The congressman leaves the door open to a military solution if others fail. But he is not a jingoist, and that, in our view, is a welcome change from the shoot-now-question-later line we have long had speaking for us in Southern Idaho.

Fishing, barbecues, camping, etc. I moved to the Twin Falls area last year after spending 10 months in a hospital, and I will be bound to a wheelchair for the rest of my life. I am a paraplegic (paralyzed from the waist down). Thank God I am very lucky, I have a wonderful wife and two teenage boys.
Friday night, I will be playing against the CSI faculty team. However, those of us playing basketball are the lucky ones. Some of my new friends in the Magic Valley live in nursing homes and are crippled with MS or other physical problems or mental retardation.
Sometimes we are cast aside or ignored, but we can handle that. I can't even attend church because certain body functions I can't control can prove to be a source of embarrassment and may anger others that don't understand.

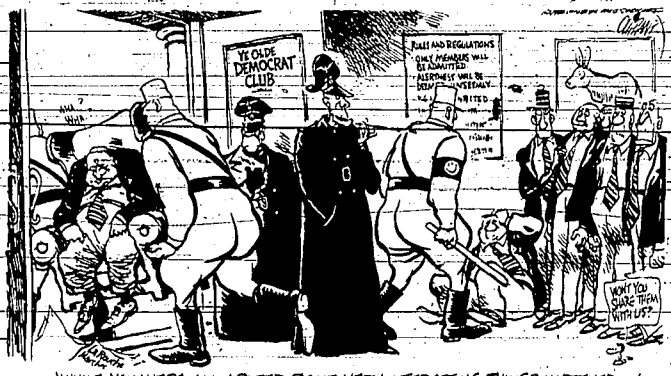
Recently my wife and I tried to raise donations from retailers without much luck. But it was certainly strange that they didn't have trouble helping me when I bought a new boat or a snowmobile or a car. G.M. even advertises their midsize cars will han-

dle a wheelchair behind the seat and they will sell it with hand controls. But yet when we ask for help, nobody's home.
I wear clothes, shoes, drive cars, eat food and deal with the doctors and pharmacists more than most. My family wears clothes and we buy our sporting goods from the local merchants. And since a lot of us vote and spend money with all the local merchants, we are asking for your help so we can make the quality of life better for those of us that are not as lucky as me.
If you will help with donations so we can arrange for transportation and gear to take them out in the open air and do something that they normally can't do, it would be greatly appreciated.
Prior to my accident, I never even paid any attention to handicapped people. Please, I beg of you, don't make the same mistake I did.
Help me to help my new friends. At least come and watch the game, we may not be any good, but we try harder than most, and we are going to have a lot of door prizes. Maybe better odds than Jackpot. Because if you help, you are certainly a winner.

Braver was selling books and pamphlets. Pictures of the bulldog-faced LaRouche appeared on many of the covers. LaRouche seems to point a lot in photos, and never, ever, smiles. We can only speculate that the surplus of international crises weighs so heavily on him that smiling is out of the question. His burden is shared by his followers, who do not smile much either.

Braver does not deny that the two Illinois candidates have said some pretty remarkable stuff. Secretary of state candidate Janice Hart, who compared herself to Joan of Arc, said LaRouche policies will "save our nation and Western civilization," and vowed to "roll tanks down State Street," a main Chicago thoroughfare. Braver said, "It's because it's the truth, and the public isn't used to hearing reality."

TV stations in Illinois have found plenty of idiots willing to go on camera and admit that they voted for the two LaRouche names (Hart and Fairchild), but as you may suspect, Braver scoffs at critics who insist that the two can-

didates won because Illinois voters did not know they were voting for this. Of course, is inconclusive, because half the voters in any primary do not know who they are voting for. LaRouche's lieutenants to world events the way a dog listens to one of those high-pitched dog whistles. They seem to hear things the rest of us do not. Their newspaper is full of stories you don't read much about anywhere else. Like a story headlined: "How Kissinger Crew Sabotaged Shuttle Program."

The newspaper, the New Solidarity (I bought a copy, eight pages for \$1, with a front-page picture of an smiling LaRouche, pointing skyward) has a motto, something Alexander Hamilton, the statesman, said a couple of hundred years ago: "It was by the press that the morals of this country have been ruined, and it is by the press that they shall be restored."

This seems an odd battle cry for a group that claims to have no use for the media. Still, I can't shake the feeling that if you write something the LaRoucheites don't like, your name gets logged in some leather-bound journal, on a page headed "To Be Dealt With After The Great Victory." But if I end up with a Russian missile in my derriere, I take it all back.

Nobel doctors' patient remains critical

BOSTON—Bernard Lown hasn't much time to rest on his Nobel laurels. On this achingly beautiful morning, the cardiology and winner of the Peace Prize is at his desk talking again, or talking still, about nuclear testing.

The co-president of International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War got involved in the arms-control, anti-nuclear, peace movement whatever year it was. He has a deep concern about nuclear tests. Back in the early 1960s, he remembers, when superpowers were exploding nuclear bombs in the atmosphere. "We collected baby teeth," and proved that Strontium 90 entered the food chain. "We drove underground, but despite a million Hiroshimas in the nuclear arsenal, it hasn't been stopped. In fact, this day is the last in the moratorium the Soviets have called and kept by themselves since July. If we go through with our own plans for an April 15 test, the Soviets will resume testing and we will have lost yet another chance."

Since last summer, Gorbachev has taken the lead in proposals as well as asked Americans to join in. He asked for 50 percent cuts in nuclear arsenals and a 15-year plan for eliminating nuclear weapons. Only last weekend he offered to meet to discuss ending tests.

The Reagan administration has countered all these proposals by speaking in foreign tongue: "no-yes-no-yes-no-yes" all over the world. As Paul Warnke, the former arms-control negotiator, said, the Soviets are offering us our own proposals for arms control and we can't



"take yes for an answer." "If our superpowers are in a relationship cursed with bad timing. One presses for a commitment and when the other finally comes around and says yes, the first dances away." Dr. Lown knows something about that international role reversal. After receiving the Peace Prize, he had a three-hour interview with Gorbachev, but he has yet to receive even an acknowledgment from the White House. On the larger scale, he says with deep frustration, "Every American president has supported tests bans until Reagan."

The doctors have won a Nobel Prize, but the patient has not yet taken the first step to recovery: the comprehensive test ban. "If we ask what has driven the arms race, it is the ever greater sophistication of technology," Lown repeats. "If the qualitative change in weapons is what's made the age so unstable and insecure, then stopping the testing will slow the process." The White House claims, in part, that we need tests to check the weapons we have now. But in fact, testing is the only way for any arms off the city garbage dump, which has been shown time and time again on TV. No human being should have to do that while their ruling family steals the foreign aid money that was sent there to stop those kind of practices of living in filth and misery.
The bottom line is: Who in our government has the responsibility for follow-up on what this foreign aid money is being used for? Or don't we have a follow-up program? Which is most likely. Or is there some U.S. officials in on the Marcos high-grading, too? And why the big rush to get him to a country where he can never be extradited to testify as to what took place? All these, and more questions have never been answered. I wonder why.

We have lived with the nuclear arms race for so long and with such a sense of helplessness that ordinary citizens have become nearly immune to the reality, and possibly to the possibilities for change. "Imagine yourself walking around your whole life with a revolver pointed at the back of your head," says Dr. Lown. "You would say, 'This guy has to be straitjacketed.' " If, however, you feel powerless, you might prefer to look straight ahead.

Today, when the Soviets are talking our line, asking us to say yes to our own test-ban proposals, we have to allow this atomic revolver in to our peripheral vision. When the government won't cover America's own proposals, we still have leverage.

If the Congress, there is a bill that would cut off funds for nuclear testing for six months, unless the Soviets tested. Before the Gorbachev moratorium, such a bill was considered a wild peace proposal. Not anymore. Americans have another recourse that Soviet citizens do not. As Dr. Lown puts it, "The American people can shout to the rooftops."

I know no way to stop the April 15 blast, a blast that will be echoed in the Soviet Union. The clock is ticking on the testing. I would like to see the rag-tag pack of peace marchers wandering across Nevada, a voice in the wilderness. But I am reassured by this physician. Having watched the pot of public concern for decades, Dr. Lown says, "The pot is boiling water. Nothing happens, nothing happens, nothing happens, and then finally there's steam."

S. Africa government denies lifting ban on Mrs. Mandela

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — The government denied Thursday that it had lifted restrictions on Winnie Mandela, but it made no effort to remove the black activist from the home that had been barred to her.

She returned to her four-room house in the black township of Soweto on Wednesday after her lawyer said the ban had effectively ended her "banning" order by deciding not to contest an appeal she had filed against it.

Cllr. Leon Mellet, spokesman for Law and Order Minister Louis Le Grange, said Thursday: "The government has not lifted the restriction order."

Mrs. Mandela has been banned for nearly all of the past 23 years, which means she could not address public gatherings, meet with more than one person at a time or enter a long list of places that included schools and printing houses. She had been prohibited from living in Soweto for nine years.

She flouted the order repeatedly in recent months with activities that included speaking at political lawyers.

Her lawyer, Ismail Ayob, said Wednesday that prosecutor Pieter Kleynhans told him the government had decided to drop the challenge of Mrs. Mandela's appeal.

Mrs. Mandela, whose husband, Nelson has been in prison since 1962, was told in December she no longer had to live in the Orange Free State town of Brandfort, to which she was banished in 1977, but still was barred from the two districts that cover Soweto.

She was arrested twice for going there in defiance of the ban, and in January she appealed a court ruling upholding the restriction order.

Neighbors and school children welcomed her jubilantly when she returned Wednesday, first raised in a black-power salute, to the cottage she and her husband once occupied together.

The tone of the official comments made it appear unlikely that the government would try to enforce the residential ban before it finished reviewing the case.

Ayob said the decision not to contest the appeal stemmed from last month's decision by the Appellate Court, the highest tribunal in South Africa, that past "banning" orders were invalid because the government did not state specifically why they were necessary.

Two other activists then successfully challenged the orders against them and Le Grange, the law and order minister, informed three others who filed similar appeals that their bans no longer were valid.

Kleynhans told The Associated Press on Thursday, however, that he gave no such pledge and the case "is definitely proceeding. . . I have not as yet been instructed to abandon the judgment or to waive anything."

Integrated government conference opens

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — White and black leaders in Natal Province on Thursday began debating a proposal to create the nation's first racially integrated regional government.

Meanwhile, police headquarters sent four blacked out racialists to take on the country, including two black youths killed in street battles with police patrols in the black township of Vostoorus, southeast of Johannesburg.

A court had imposed harsh

restrictions on a funeral in Vostoorus for a suspected black nationalist guerrilla shot by police last week.

Roving security vehicles fired repeated barrages of tear gas and birdshot to break up groups of blacks who gathered for the service in defiance of the restrictions, and militant youths enforced a one-day protest strike by workers in the township, witnesses said.

An evening police summary of a dozen unrest incidents around the country during the day said the

charged body of a black woman was found at Kwanobuhle, near Uitenhage in the eastern Cape Province.

In the black township of Soweto outside Johannesburg, a crowd stirred around a black man, placed a tire around his neck, ignited it and danced around him as he burned to death, the South African Press Association said.

The man was alleged to have been slain because he pushed a man out of a moving train over the weekend, the report said.

Weinberger warns of threat to Korea

TOKYO (AP) — Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger arrived in Japan Thursday night after attending security talks in South Korea, where he warned of an increased threat to that country as it prepares to stage the 1988 Olympics.

With Seoul also preparing to stage the Asian Games this year, Weinberger and the South Korean defense minister issued a "communique" stating "their two countries must remain especially vigilant during the period leading up to the 1988 Olympics."

Weinberger and South Korean Defense Minister Lee Kwon-ke held a news conference Thursday afternoon.

He said he and Weinberger reviewed increased Soviet-North Korean military cooperation and agreed the "next two or three

years will be critical from a security viewpoint.

There have been repeated warnings from South Korea in recent months that North Korea might attempt to disrupt the Asian Games and Olympics in an effort to prevent South Korea from gaining international prestige.

Weinberger described the U.S. presence in South Korea — which includes about 40,000 U.S. military personnel — as vital and said it will remain as long as South Korea wants.

"We have an unshakable commitment which we will keep," he said. "We have no intention of lessening our commitment."

Weinberger arrived Thursday at the Chitose base of Japan's Air Self-Defense Forces on Hokkaido, Japan's northernmost main island.

24 Navy men hurt in chopper crash

NAPLES, Italy (AP) — Twenty-four U.S. Navy personnel suffered minor injuries in a helicopter crash earlier this week on the flight deck of the aircraft carrier USS America, the Navy announced Thursday.

The CH-53 helicopter crashed Tuesday while the carrier was anchored off the coast of Sicily, Lt. Gregory Hartung, a spokesman for the U.S. 6th Fleet, told The Associated Press.

He said the helicopter was completing a logistics flight from the NATO base at Augusta to the carrier.

"Some of the aircraft on board the USS America were damaged, but the carrier is operational and can carry out its assigned missions," Hartung said.

135 bodies identified

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Relatives and technicians have identified the bodies of 135 of the 166 victims of Mexico's worst air disaster. But some bodies are so mutilated they may never be identified, a spokesman for the coroner's office said Thursday.

A Mexicana airlines spokesman said soldiers, Red Cross workers and others were still searching for remains and passengers' personal belongings at the site where the Mexicana Boeing 727 crashed Monday.

All 166 people aboard died when the plane, Mexicana's Flight 940, went down about 15 minutes after takeoff from Mexico City. The plane was bound for Los Angeles with scheduled stops in the Pacific resorts of Puerto Vallarta and Mazatlan.

The plane crashed into a 7,792-foot mountain, El Carbon, in Michoacan state, about 90 miles northwest of Mexico City.

Marcos booty hunters irked at U.S. decision

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — A government panel seeking billions of dollars that ousted President Ferdinand Marcos allegedly took out of the Philippines "ruined" dissatisfaction Thursday with Washington's efforts to help locate the "hidden wealth."

The Commission on Good Government is "not yet satisfied" with the Reagan administration's help in recovering up to \$10 billion that Marcos is accused of funneling out of public funds before he fled to Hawaii, Commission chairman Jovito Salonga said.

U.S. officials have given the panel many financial records that Marcos brought to Hawaii on Feb. 26, but they kept some, saying they were "personal."

Salonga asked at a news conference: "How can customs officials distinguish between personal and non-personal" documents? "Even a purely personal check can

involve the disbursement of public funds, and that will not be personal," he said.

"Insofar as there are still papers that are being kept by them (U.S. officials) and which we believe were entitled to get, we are not yet satisfied," he said.

Marcos has assets in at least six countries, Salonga said.

The Swiss government, which has frozen Marcos' assets in Swiss banks, advised that the commission act quickly because the order is merely temporary, Salonga said.

The order is intended to help Manila recover the accounts under international law recognized by Switzerland.

Commission member Pedro Yap, who met with Swiss officials in Bern last week, said after the conference that "quid pro quo" place Marcos' Swiss holdings at between \$3 billion and \$5 billion.

U.S., Russia lack plan to gain non-nuclear world, Tower says

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Former Sen. John Tower, who resigned this week as an arms control negotiator, said Thursday that both the United States and the Soviet Union accept "the idea of a non-nuclear world," but neither has a practical plan to achieve it.

"He called for patience and predicted the two nations will come to terms on arms control after long negotiations."

Tower, whose resignation was effective Tuesday, was the keynote speaker at a symposium on U.S.-Soviet relations since World War II.

Andrei Kokoshin, deputy director of the Institute for the USA and Canada in Moscow, will offer the Soviet perspective today.

The symposium was proposed by Elsieph Rbtow, former dean of the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs, who said the meeting was aimed at finding out "what went right" in the four decades of peaceful U.S.-Soviet relations.

She noted that Tower's career in the Senate covered 1961 to 1985 — much of the "year period that is the focus of the conference."

Tower said he has no expert on the Soviet Union, but, "I have a degree of optimism."

"I believe the most important aspect of U.S.-Soviet relations at this point is the res-

olution of the arms control issues," he said. "Both nations have embraced the idea of a non-nuclear world," said Tower. "But I must say, quite frankly, I don't think that either nation has a carefully formulated, practical plan to arrive at that result."

He said talks between President Reagan and Gorbachev "created a somewhat more favorable climate for the arms negotiations in Geneva."

"We must be patient in the Western democracies. . . . We cannot permit our negotiating position to be driven by public diplomacy considerations. It must be driven by security considerations," Tower said. "He said he believes the Soviet Union will come to terms with the United States or the two countries will find 'something that's mutually acceptable.'"

Tower said Gorbachev's economic goals "are not compatible with the continued dedication of human and material resources to the level of military capability that the Soviet Union now has."

"And certainly we in the United States would rather dedicate less of our human and material resources and less of the taxpayers' money on weapons."

USDA not ready to guide genetic engineering work

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department, one of the government's lead regulators in the growing field of genetic engineering, is largely unprepared for its role in overseeing release of new organisms into the environment, congressional investigators said Thursday.

"Underlining the finding, a group that opposes genetic manipulation also released documents showing that the department has quietly approved the first genetically altered virus for release into the environment without even consulting its supposed genetic oversight committee."

"Although USDA has displayed confidence and optimism towards biotechnology and has had time to formulate an overall biotechnology regulatory structure, it has not done so," said the General Accounting Office, the investigative arm of Congress.

The GAO report said agencies within the department had been struggling with each other for regulatory control of the new field, and "questions remain as to which agency is responsible for what."

The department's designated focal point for biotechnology, its Recombinant DNA

Research Committee, "has lacked authority and direction," the report said.

The Foundation on Economic Trends, meanwhile, petitioned the department to revoke the license it granted Jan. 20 to TechAmerica Group, Inc., of Omaha, Neb., to use a genetically engineered vaccine for pseudorabies.

The group's founder, Jeremy Rifkin, said the vaccine — based on a genetically altered virus — received routine treatment at the department and "was not even reviewed by the DNA panel, as required by the department's own regulations."

"This is a stinging example of the worst-case scenario given what the GAO found," Rifkin said. He said field testing of the genetically altered vaccine had been approved for animal herds in Minnesota, Illinois and Michigan on the basis of an incomplete review of the new drug.

"It's a sad commentary when the leading agency for biotechnology bungles the first licensing of a genetically engineered product in agriculture," said Rifkin, who vowed to take court action if the vaccine is not immediately recalled. "They look totally irresponsible and incompetent at best."

Shuttle

Investigators to recommend flight safety panel

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Challenger investigating commission said Thursday it will recommend that an independent safety panel oversee all future space shuttle flights to remedy what one commissioner called NASA's "perpetual movement heading for trouble."

The idea, raised by astronaut Henry Hartsfield, was instantly endorsed by commission chairman William P. Rogers, who said "all of us think there should be an independent safety panel of some kind."

One commissioner said an astronaut should be on the safety panel.

The commission at the midpoint of its four-month life, heard four of America's most experienced

astronauts say they did not know or did not realize the seriousness of potential booster rocket problems.

It was another example of a communications breakdown within the National Aeronautics and Space Administration uncovered by the commission which is trying to find the cause of the Jan. 28 explosion that destroyed Challenger and killed its crew of seven, including schoolteacher Christa McAuliffe.

After hearing Hartsfield describe the shuttle as "the most magnificent and fantastic machine," commission member Richard P. Feynman commented that it is also a risky machine with flaws and difficulties.

"I tried to figure out where the difficulty is in this system that made it go wrong," he said. "The problem is communication and that communication will be fixed if you have the safety panel. If there is a member of the astronauts on the safety panel, because then you'll be fully aware of all the things that are unsafe."

NASA practice, Feynman said, is to review flight problems, agonize over them, and then decide to fly despite the problems. If nothing falls, he said, "it is suggested therefore that that risk is no longer so high. For the next flight, we can lower our standards a little bit, because we got away with it last time."

All remains from floor found

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Researchers have retrieved all the remains of Challenger's astronauts that they expect to find on the ocean floor, reliable sources reported Thursday.

The sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said the last remains that were recovered were brought into port several days ago.

NASA reported Thursday it had suspended the cabin search operation because recent strong winds

had deposited a large amount of silt on the wreckage, causing "the normal recovery method using divers to be ineffective."

"Alternate means of debris recovery are being reviewed," a statement said. "In the interim, the USS Preserver is being utilized for recovery of other debris from the ST-L mission."

About 75 percent of the cabin has been recovered, the Navy reported.

Garn raps media for its approach

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Sen. Jake Garn, R-Utah, said Thursday that those in the news media who were critical of numerous delays in the ill-fated Challenger launch now are questioning whether NASA pushed too hard to get the mission off the ground.

Garn, who rode the shuttle Discovery in April 1985 as the first elected official in space, urged resolution of the Challenger investigation so America can resume shuttle flights.

"Whether than find out what happened on Challenger, we have to find out how to fix it and get back up into space," he told students and faculty in a speech at the University of Utah.

Garn said he was bothered by criticism, particularly from the news media, of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration since the Jan. 28 explosion which killed Challenger's crew of seven.

Bush departs for mission to Persian Gulf

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President George Bush, armed with disclaimers of any change in U.S. policy on oil prices, prepared to set out Thursday on a 10-day mission to the Persian Gulf region.

After a refueling stop in Shannon, Ireland, Bush was to go to Frankfurt, West Germany, to relax before heading to Saudi Arabia on Saturday.

No meetings were planned with

West German officials, said Bush's spokesman, Marlin Fitzwater.

The trip, which also takes Bush to Bahrain, Oman and North Yemen, comes in the wake of threats against Americans by Libya's Moammar Khadafi, following U.S. military action against Libya in the Gulf of Sidra.

He was leaving one day after a bomb killed four Americans flying on a TWA plane over Greece.

Officials said there is increased concern for Bush's safety, but that prudent precautions will be taken.

"We assume the host countries will have adequate security," said Fitzwater. Another official, speaking privately, said Secret Service agents would be more conspicuous than on most journeys.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The board of directors of the World Bank on Thursday unanimously approved President Reagan's selection of Barber Conable, a former New York Republican congressman, as the next president of the 149-nation organization.

The bank also approved a \$350 million loan to Argentina to help that debt-plagued nation increase its agricultural exports and production.

White House denies pressure

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (AP) — The White House on Thursday issued a new denial of placing any pressure on NASA to launch the space shuttle Challenger on Jan. 28 the day it exploded and killed seven astronauts.

Responding to a request from Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., for information about White House telephone calls made in the days before Challenger was launched, White

House spokesman Larry Speakes said there was no indication of any White House pressure to rush the space shuttle into orbit.

Rumors of White House involvement in the decision to launch Challenger are false, Speakes declared.

"Our review reveals no evidence to substantiate (White House pressure)," Speakes, holding a briefing here, told reporters.

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist William Kennedy, whose tales made this city "mythic," says he feels honored to receive awards from Brandeis University and the Lotus Club.

The Lotus Club, an organization for artists and government and business leaders, gave Kennedy its Medal of Merit last week. Or may in New York City, Kennedy is to receive the Brandeis Award for outstanding work in the creative arts.

"They just came along, and I feel honored," said Kennedy.

Brandeis will also bestow awards on actor-director John Huston, historian George Kennan and paleontologist Stephen Jay Gould.

"William Kennedy has taken a small city like Albany and made it mythic," said Evelyn Simha, executive director of the Brandeis Awards. "We think Kennedy is one of the really important writers of our time."

Kennedy, 58, received the Pulitzer in 1981 for "Ironweed."

Pope may hear Sinatra sing at benefit concert

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Frank Sinatra may sing for Pope John Paul II this summer at a benefit concert, Italian newspapers reported Thursday.

The newspapers, quoting unidentified sources, said the concert could take place in St. Peter's Square in July and the proceeds would be used to help Third World famine victims.

The sources were quoted as saying "complex negotiations have been going on for months" and involved a "mega-concert via satellite which could involve other holy places like the Walling Wall in Jerusalem, Milan's Corriere Della Sera reported.

But Vatican sources told The Associated Press the Holy See knew

nothing about such a concert. Sinatra wanted to sing for John Paul, the sources said, he would first have to ask for an audience.

Sinatra, 70, is often referred to in Italian papers as "The Voice." He has visited Italy many times but has never visited with John Paul.

Crown prince may ask bobbies to visit Japan

TOKYO (AP) — Japanese Crown Prince Akihito and Princess Michiko have invited the British bobbies who guarded their son, Hiro, during his two years at Oxford University to visit Japan, a chamberlain of the crown prince said Thursday.

Tsuyoshi Soga said two security police from Scotland Yard, Roger Bacon and Bruce Eyre, will arrive in Tokyo on April 7 for a week-long visit.

Hiro will be host at a luncheon for the bobbies April 9 at the East Palace, where the crown prince and his family live, Soga said.

Hiro, first son of the crown prince and princess, studied marine transportation in medieval Europe and other subjects at Marton College of Oxford University during 1983-85.

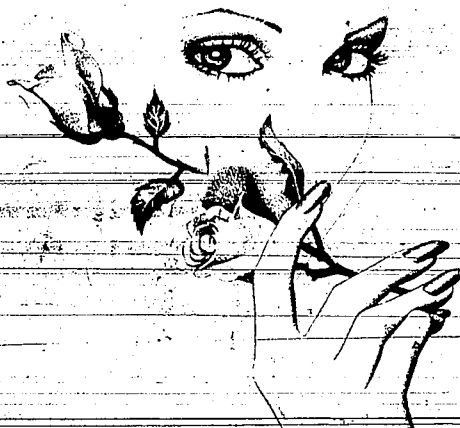

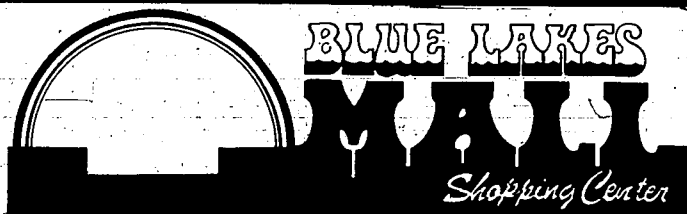

Override to include teachers' salaries

TWIN FALLS — Twin Falls voters will be asked to approve a \$680,717 tax override levy that for the first time includes salary increases for teachers, the Twin Falls School Board decided on Thursday.

The \$680,717 amount is about \$4,000 less than voters approved last year in a tax override levy. If approved in a May 13 election, property taxes will not go up, School District officials said.

After an hour of discussion and whittling down requests for new roofs and repairing playgrounds at Lincoln and Harrison Elementary schools, the board set the override amount.

"I think it's time to take the attitude that we've got to do a little fighting for teachers' salaries," said Board Chairman Gene Champlin. "A lot of people tell me they're willing to support education. Now, they're going to have the chance."

Half of the money, or \$342,372, will go toward increases in salaries for both teachers and classified personnel and adding one new elementary teacher.

It is the first time in the three years the district has gone for an override levy that salary increases will be included.

And the reason for that, said Superintendent Carl Snow, was the difference in the way the Legislature appropriated money. The district will be receiving more money for textbooks and less money to pay salaries and benefits, he said.

The override levy request includes \$19,000 to buy 800 gallons of paint to paint all the schools; \$14,200 to replace and repair boilers and furnaces at all schools; and \$9,995 to remodel restrooms for both boys and girls at Twin Falls High School.

Another \$23,800 will be used for asphalt repair of parking lots at the High School, Robert Stuart Junior High and O'Leary Junior High, which Snow said was imperative.

The remainder of the override money will go to repair and replace roofs at O'Leary, Harrison and Morningstar.

"What it amounts to is that we're cutting back on maintenance and adding in teacher's salaries just to keep the status quo," said Snow.

Farmers, ranchers push for FmHA director's resignation

SHOSHONE — A group of more than 300 farming and ranching families in southern Idaho is pressing for the resignation of Bill Norberg, Idaho director of the U.S. Farmers Home Administration, saying he takes a "no" approach with farm borrowers.

The Western Borrowers Association, which has three branches in the Magic Valley and eastern Idaho, has collected 339 signatures on a petition calling for Norberg to step down.

The organization has mailed requests for action in Idaho's congressional delegation and Gov. John Evans, said President Gaigen Guthrie.

Norberg was flying back to Idaho from a meeting of state directors in Washington, D.C., on Thursday and could not be contacted for comment.

Vance Clark, FmHA administrator, said he had not been informed of the group's dissatisfaction, but "Certainly I don't like to hear those things," he said. "We like to back our leadership, but if there are specific allegations, sure, we'd look at that."

In a letter to Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, the group charged that Norberg "displays a 'no' philosophical approach to requests from borrowers. It appears he takes no approach so he will not make an error."

Guthrie criticized Norberg's attitude Thursday in a phone interview. "When you're the bank of last resort, you should be

taking more risk than regular banks and their (FmHA's) current philosophy is they are not willing to do so," he said.

The borrowers' group also claimed Norberg is "not familiar with some FmHA procedures, has understated numbers of delinquent loans and has not fielded FmHA programs at local offices. At some offices, borrowers have been told they would have to wait two to three months for appointments with loan officers; Guthrie charged.

"Some borrowers will not have a conference until after farm planting commitments should have been made," he said in an announcement. Guthrie alleged Norberg has been unwilling to add workers or extend work hours to help borrowers.

An FmHA borrower himself, Guthrie also acts as a private advocate for southern

Idaho borrowers who deal with the agency. He has been at odds with Norberg many times during the past three years. Guthrie consistently has charged the Idaho office with mishandling loan applications and with being unresponsive to some borrowers.

However, "This is coming from the farm borrowers themselves," he said. "A lot of farmers have been hesitant in the past to sign a petition. They were afraid they'd be liquidated if they did that," he said.

McClure, senior Idaho senator, had not yet received the borrowers' request by Thursday and will not comment at this point, said H.D. Palmer, his press aide.

In a phone interview, FmHA Administrator Clark said the agency has put \$25 million into operating loans for Idaho farmers so far this fiscal year.

"However, it's hard to keep everybody happy these days," he said. Some dissatisfaction also may be coming from the administration's overall policy, Clark suggested.

"We're still the lender of last resort, and we have to be the prudent lender of last resort," he said. The agency can't be "so stringent and strict that we cause the failure of a lot of farmers," Clark said. "We can't bend a lot of rules, though."

Guthrie said he had neglected to send Clark, who runs the FmHA, the petition for Norberg's resignation. The Western Farm-Borrowers represents about 600 people in about 20 farm families in the Magic Valley; the upper Snake River Valley and the Moran Valley area in the southeastern part of the state.

Lawmakers give Legislature passing grade

TWIN FALLS — Rep. Donna Scott, R-Twin Falls, Thursday defended the recent performance of the state Legislature, saying lawmakers faced tough issues and pressures from a politically diversified state.

Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, admitted the lawmakers made mistakes, but added that they also did some good with several "positive" bills.

The Republican legislators from Twin Falls criticized the recently completed session at a meeting of the Sawtooth Press Club. Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey, was scheduled to attend, but didn't appear.

Scott said she made no apologies for the length of the session because of the issues with which they had to cope. Lawmakers this year encountered state agencies with outstretched hands, while limited state revenue had to be "spread around."

Legislators contended with a broad spectrum of views, she said, such as conservatives laden with the Mormon influence in the southeastern part of Idaho and those who resided in what they considered the "Great State of Ada." The hub was the Magic Valley, whose people were "astonished at what's going on."

She could relate to the "disgust of people" about the Legislature, she said. But they didn't see what the lawmakers saw, including more than 1,400 bills to digest.

"You don't pass that many without frustration," she said.

The Legislature this year exercised more control over budgets of some state agencies to ensure that money was spent only where it had been budgeted, Scott said.

On education funding, Scott said the \$10 million increase in education was designated for textbooks and supplies if people want teach-

Zoning plan draws last protest

JEROME — A cheese plant proposed by a Colorado dairy cooperative is now in the hands of Jerome County's top elected officials for the second, and final, decision.

But, despite builders' assurances of safety and economic benefit, the factory and its proposed zoning continues to draw protests from neighbors.

The main objections centered on the use of the land, which would come under the county's most permissive zoning. Nearby residents voiced angry Thursday their fears about odors, road damage and loss of property values.

The Jerome County commissioners heard the proposal of Mountain Empire Dairy Association and the concerns of county residents at a public hearing.

MEDA, which buys milk from producers throughout Southern Idaho, is asking the county for heavy industrial zoning on 160 acres, four miles south and five miles east of the city of Jerome, just north of Interstate 84. The cooperative has rights to another 1,400 acres, which would remain in an agricultural zone.

The factory, which would employ 35 workers, would process raw milk into cheese and dispose of whey, a byproduct, by sprinkling it on surrounding land.

County zoning commissioners have approved the idea, provided that only a cheese plant be placed there.

MEDA representatives have said they want to build a cheese factory, but they have balked at any special-use permits that would restrict their use.

Campaigns fire up forest controversy

TWIN FALLS — U.S. Forest Service officials dispute timber industry claims that current national forest plans could have an adverse effect on the industry.

The Forest Service's national forest plans "could have a severe impact on forest industry employment and in communities where the industry is a major job provider," says a recent news release from the Western Wood Products Association.

The release continued to say that current forest plans "are likely to reduce domestic timber harvesting by 2-billion board feet per year" in Idaho, Montana, California, Washington and Oregon.

Rus Fredsall, director of Resources and Environment for the WPA, said the plans include "many timber harvest reductions in response to pressures from environmental and preserva-

tionist groups." That critique of forest plans has become a familiar one in Idaho as the political campaign season draws closer. Candidates running for both national and state offices have claimed that additional wilderness areas under consideration in Idaho will cripple the state's already ailing timber industry.

But figures from the regional offices of the Forest Service that are responsible for national forest lands in Idaho paint a very different picture of timber supplies and the impacts of possible wilderness areas.

"Based on forest plans, I wouldn't say that any drastic increase (in wilderness areas) is indicated in our region," said Dick Pine, public information officer for the service's Intermountain Region office in Ogden, Utah.

The Intermountain Region oversees national forests in the southern portion of Idaho, such as the Sawtooth and Boise national forests. Harvest levels in the region call for 275 million

board feet of saw timber in 1985, Pine said. Harvest levels set by forest plans would rise to 437 million board feet in 1990 and then drop off to 300 mbf in the year 2000.

Despite potential withdrawals for wilderness and wildlife, harvest levels would remain essentially unchanged in the Intermountain Region, according to Pine's figures.

The picture is much the same for national forests in northern Idaho, says John Combes, assistant director of timber management for the Forest Service's Northern Region, headquartered in Missoula, Mont.

"I don't see the impact (on the timber industry) as far as the ones proposed by the Forest Service," Combes said of possible new wilderness areas in northern Idaho and Montana.

Snow depths in the district range from 6 inches at Muldoon, with 27 inches of water, to 84 inches at Dollarhide Summit, with 31.6 inches of water. The snowpack atop Galena Summit was 82 inches, containing 28.8 inches of water.

Cuttings were taken and planted along a treeless stretch of the river to control erosion and improve fish and wildlife habitat.

Curtis Rose, an Eagle Scout candidate from Twin Falls, organized the work project as part of his Eagle requirements, according to a BLM news release.

With the help of five other scouts and three adults, they reintroduced willows to the area. During previous times, the willows grew naturally in this area, but they disappeared over 40 years ago and erosion began to occur.

Working wives' husbands less satisfied

NEW YORK — Husbands of working wives experience lower levels of job and life satisfaction than do husbands of non-working wives, a study out of Rutgers University has shown.

Regardless of the husband's age, income bracket or educational level, the study found that a wife's employment had a negative effect on her husband's mental health. Even those husbands who expressed positive attitudes about their wives' working were found to be less satisfied in their home and work lives than were the husbands of non-working wives.

Conducting the study of 1,515 American workers with their then-Rutgers colleagues Graham Stalnes and Deborah Fudge, psychologist and social work professor Kathleen Pottick concluded that "husbands' perception of their adequacy as breadwinners in the family is a central component of their mental health."

"It appears that husbands may not be ready yet to abandon the 'good provider' role... that the traditional role of being sufficiently resourceful as a provider for one's family that one's wife does not have to enter the labor force."

But as Pottick also pointed out, "clearly in this day and age, it's very difficult to support a family on one income. And so it seems to me that another way of looking at these findings is that men and women are going to have to share the breadwinning role. Men will need to broaden their conception of what it means to be a good provider. They're going to have to not feel ultimately solely responsible for providing for the family, just as women will need to not feel ultimately solely responsible for the enculturation and nurturing and nourishing of the children."

Pottick and her colleagues undertook the study of a national cross-section of men ages 16 to 65 to

follow up and expand upon studies conducted earlier in this decade by sociologists Ron Kessler and Jim McRae at the University of Michigan. Using national survey data on the effects of wives' employment on wives themselves and on husbands—the latter researchers found, Pottick said, that "basically, women who worked had better mental health, using a variety of measures." At the same time, however, Kessler and McRae discovered that the husbands of the working wives had worse mental health than the husbands of housewives. Although those researchers eliminated certain explanations, "they were not able in any way to conclusively understand what may have created this effect," Pottick said.

"At Rutgers, Pottick and her colleagues decided "this was an interesting sort of unsolved puzzle," she said, "as to why it was that wives' employment had this negative effect on the mental health of husbands."

I was 42 at the time. I was allowed five years to complete the high school course, but I finished in a year and a half. After I got my high school diploma, I applied for college, passed the entrance exams, earned a college degree and taught school for 15 years.

I'm retired now, but I never get bored. I'm too busy. Tell "Closest Dropout" to let nothing stand in her way. Anyone who really wants a high school diploma can get it.

school in our country — many of whom would dearly love to earn a high school diploma. A great many either feel embarrassed or find it inconvenient to attend resident school programs.

I served 51 years in the field of education and have a suggestion for your readers:

Anyone who wants to earn a high school diploma should write or phone the National Home Study Council, 1601 18th St. N.W., Washington, D.C. 20009 (phone: 202-234-5100), and ask for information on accredited home-study high schools. (For university courses: National University Continuing Education Association, One Dupont Circle, Suite 409, Washington, D.C. 20036.)

Correspondence by mail is a very effective method of learning. The prime advantage is that students can study at the time and place of their choice and proceed at their own pace. And correspondence courses are generally far less expensive than resident programs.

I served as the director of education at the American School of Correspondence for 34 years, then left to

become dean of Hadley School for the Blind in Winnetka, Ill. — the only school that offers correspondence courses for the blind, tuition-free, to students throughout the world.

Mets ready to rise to NL east division title

Editor's note: This is the second in a four-part series examining the prospects of the major league baseball divisions this season.

To win, ballclubs often must perform not only up to their ability but above it, says New York Mets Manager Davey Johnson.

With that in mind, Johnson likes his team's chances of taking the National League East crown away from the St. Louis Cardinals this year.

So do a lot of other people, including Cards Manager Whitey Herzog, who says, "The Mets are favored, and their starting pitching is their strength and their power."

The past two seasons, the Mets have finished second — behind Chicago in 1984 and the Cards, by three games, last year. After the Mets it was Montreal, Chicago, Philadelphia and Pittsburgh.

This year, it will look more like this:

New York Mets
The Mets have made some moves that underscore their optimism. Acquisitions of pitcher Bob Ojeda, infielder Tim Lincecum and infielder/outfielder Tim Corcoran strengthen the bench.

The deal that brought Ojeda from Boston could be particularly valuable if Ojeda can perform well in long relief and as a spot starter.

"We won 98 games last year," Johnson said, "and at times we had guys out there who had never started on a major league level."

Cy Young winner Dwight Gooden, 24, heads a starting staff that certainly is one of the best in the majors. It also includes Rod Daring, Sid Fernandez, Bruce Berenyi and Ed Lynch.

"I think we're better than last year," Mets second baseman Wally Backman said. "We've got a lot of young guys who've had an extra year; we're well balanced and we know what it's all about now."

Health will play an important role. Catcher Gary Carter underwent offseason knee surgery. Last season, Darryl Strawberry missed seven weeks after surgery on his right thumb, and Berenyi was out almost all year with a slight tear of the rotator cuff.

Without major injuries, the Mets may well have won it in 1985. St. Louis Cardinals

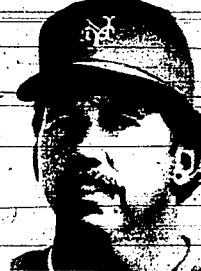
Joaquin Andujar, a 21-game winner, is gone, traded to Oakland for catcher Mike Heath. That, plus the odds against repeating, may be enough to take the Cards down a notch.

Todd Worrell anchors a good bullpen, but Herzog admits it may not be easy to replace Andujar. He has 21-game winner John Tudor and 18-game winner Danny Cox returning "and five or six other pitchers trying for the other spots."

Still, Herzog feels his club is better than just competitive with "the best defensive team in the history of the game" and the best team speed in baseball, Shortstop Ozzie

Smith, with a sore shoulder, is the only question mark, but slick-fielding Jose' Oquendo is the backup.

Third baseman Terry Pendleton sparked in the World Series. Tommy Herr is better than solid at second, and Jack Clark has turned in a good first baseman. Heath replacing Darryl Porter, is one of the best in the business behind the plate.

Nothing falls in the outfield with Vince Coleman, Willie McGee and Andy Van Slyke from left to right. Coleman and McGee led a team that stole 31 bases last year, and they may steal even more this time.

Herzog now is hoping for a little more from Van Slyke, who had 55 runs batted in and 19 homers last year.

Second all the way

Chicago Cubs
Cubs General Manager Dallas Green sealed a few deals — Manny Trillo and Jerry Mumphrey could help, but the key will be keeping the pitching staff healthy.

At different times during last season, the Cubs were minus all five starters — Rick Sutcliffe, Steve Trout, Dennis Eckersley, Scott Sanderson and Dick Ruthven — due to injuries, but all apparently are well now.

If they stay that way and if Shawn Dunston can hold down the shortstop job, the Cubs could be in it until the end.

Age may be a problem. Left field-

er Gary Matthews is 35, and third baseman Ron Cey is 38. Mumphrey can back up in the outfield, and Trillo, who is 35 himself, could play third.

If it all holds together, third Philadelphia Phillies

The Phillies are hoping to erase an image of talented underachievers with some personnel moves. Two problems, though, and they are big ones — pitching and catching.

Only three players — second baseman Juan Samuel, shortstop Tom Foley and right fielder Glenn Wilson, remain at the same positions. Gary Redus and Mill Thompson, offseason acquisitions, will fill in the rest of the outfield. Von Hayes will move to first from the outfield, and Mike Schmidt is going back to third.

Pitcher Steve Carlton has a bad shoulder, and his effectiveness is in doubt, and John Denny was traded. Thus, the Phillies are left with Kevin Gross, Shane Rawley and Charles Hudson in the rotation with the rest of the spots up for grabs.

The Phillies also traded catcher Ozzie Virshup leading the job to Darren Daulton and John Russell. Maybe fourth on offense alone.

Montreal Expos
General Manager Murray Cook has done some rebuilding of his pitching staff, and the Expos could hang in for a while.

"The Expos have come a long way," the Mets' Johnson said. "The

key to their success is their pitching staff. They've reshaped it quite a bit."

One are Bill Gullickson via trade and Bill Lea via injury. That leaves Bryn Smith and Joe Hesketh as the top two starters, while youngsters Jay Tibbs, acquired from Cincinnati, and Floyd Youmans take up two more spots.

Offensively, the Expos have two of the game's best performers, outfielders Andre Dawson and Tim Lincecum. They can only hope that shortstop Hubie Brooks, 13 homers and 100 RBI, can repeat.

Looks like fifth place

Pittsburgh Pirates
When the Pittsburgh Pirates got first baseman Sid Bream and outfielder R.J. Reynolds from the Los Angeles Dodgers last season for third baseman Bill Madlock, it actually improved them. That's how bad they were.

Only two veteran players, second baseman Johnny Ray and catcher Tony Pena, are assured of their jobs. The rest are open to competition. Two veterans, Jason Thompson and Steve Kemp, are coming off bad seasons made worse by injuries.

Rick Rouschell, 36, may be the best pitcher the Pirates have after saving a sliding career with a 14-8 campaign in 1985.

The silver lining is their youth. They could get better, but not good enough this season.

Other Americans to post high finishes were 22-year-old Tiger Shaw, like McGrath a Vermont native and B Team member, who took third place and Tom Foote, who finished ninth in the men's event. Heidi Voelker and Tori Pillingier captured fifth and sixth place respectively while Kristi Terzian came in 10th for the U.S. women.

The Nor-Am was conceived in 1971 and has provided many of the athletes who have spearheaded the U.S. rise to the top in international ski racing. Firmly established as the most prestigious and important

antiqueur race circuit in North America, the Nor-Am provides world-class skiers from 14 participating nations in this year's event the opportunity to develop the skills that prepare these men and women to represent their countries in World Cup and Olympic competition in years to come.

The U.S. Ski Team is divided into several programs, based on the individual's need for differing levels of training and competition. The National "A" team is made up of a small group of top racers with proven ability to win in international alpine ski racing. While their training programs are intense and highly individualized, there are no age criteria.

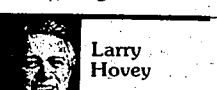
Minico and Twin Falls joining Highland and Pocatello in a newly-created district, the result was a financial disaster.

Wall Street falters under-selling attack

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market took its second sharp drop of the week Thursday under a barrage of selling attributed to program trading involving index futures and individual stocks.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial fell 28.95 points to 1,766.40, only two days after it took a 28.50-point tumble in Tuesday's session.

Volume on the New York Stock Exchange came to 1,482.2 million shares, against 145.30 million Wednesday.

The market spent most of the day drifting quietly around Wednesday's

closing levels. In a few weak attempts to rally, it made little progress with no help from a weak bond market.

Then, in the last hour of activity, prices suddenly tumbled as program traders, engaged in multiple maneuvers, sought stock index futures and sold stocks.

Through this specialized influence seemed to dominate the session, there was evidence that the broad market was suffering at the hands of an opposing interest rates.

Prices of long-term government bonds, which move in the opposite

direction from interest rates, showed losses of more than \$10 for every \$1,000 in face value.

In addition, many stocks that benefited from the recent plunge in oil prices seemed to be encountering selling pressure from investors who have begun to suspect that the oil market may have bottomed out.

Crude oil futures, which briefly got below \$10 a barrel earlier in the week, rose Thursday to \$11.75.

Over the first four sessions this week, the Dow Jones industrial average has fallen 53.32 points, wiping out last week's \$33.16-point gain.

The daily tally on the Big Board showed more than two declining issues for every one that gained. The exchange's composite

index dropped 1.67 to 134.41.

Nationwide turnover in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 175.2 million shares.

Standard & Poor's index of 400 industrial fell 3.64 to 256.58, and S&P's 500-stock composite index was down 3.24 at 232.47.

The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market rose 38 to 374.51. At the American Stock Exchange, the market value index closed at 266.61, down 1.48.

Auto stocks were mostly lower in Thursday's trading as domestic car manufacturers posted sharply lower March sales figures.

Take a good look at today's trump game. If you think there's only one percentage way to play the cards, look again. Sometimes our minds make prisoners of us all.

East's lead-directing double works well, and the defenders take the first three club tricks. East exits with a diamond to dummy's queen and it's obviously time to start the trumps. How should South proceed? The popular approach is to cash dummy's trump king before finessing to South's jack, guarding against the possible singleton. East exits West. However, with these particular spot-cards in the spade suit, declarer would not benefit by picking up a singleton queen with West. East will then score a natural trump with the 10-8 over dummy's 9-7.

The proper play is to lead a low trump from dummy, intending to finesse the jack. East's singleton queen is picked up, the trump jack confirms the trump distribution and a low trump toward dummy's K-9 picks up the suit.

When guarding against singleton queens, one should be careful to identify where the danger might lie.

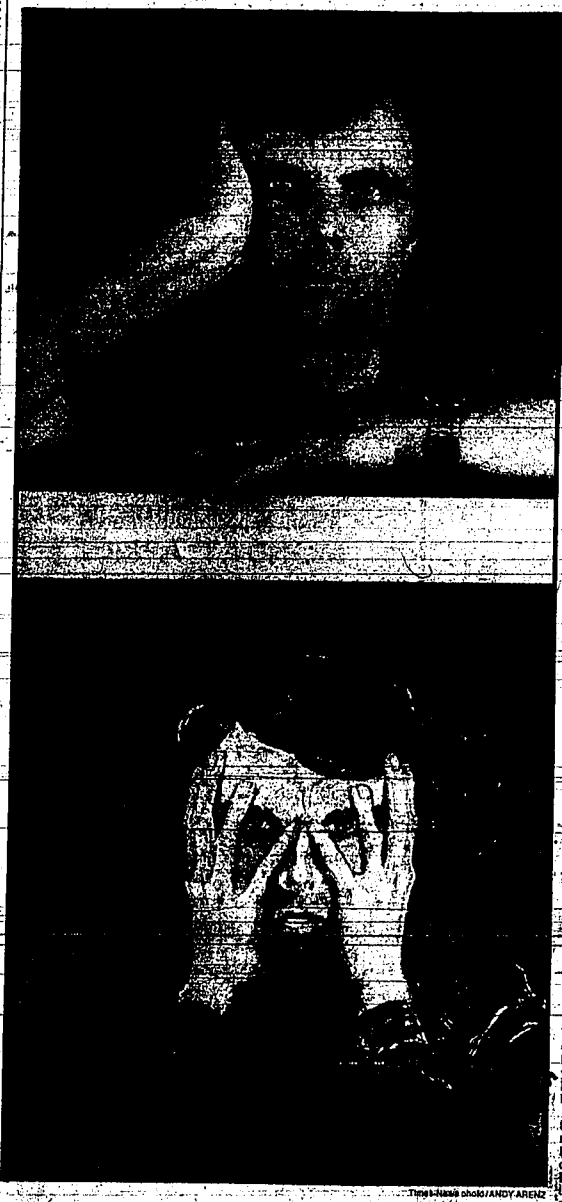

Driving emotions spring from teacher's canvases

TWIN FALLS — These are visions from a fevered brain, altered by emotion, disguised as reality and compelled by a form of disease.

Such is the statement of Michael Youngman, artist, College of Southern Idaho art instructor, salesman, and high councilman for the Filer Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Youngman's statement accompanies the psychological artwork he displays. Recently, an emotion-charged sample of his work was exhibited in "Recent Vintage" at Herrett Museum and fellow CSI art instructors LaVar Steel, Michael Green, Wesley Wada and Bill West. Selected works from that exhibit are currently hanging in the Canyonside Gallery in Twin Falls.

"Art for me is an emotional thing," says Youngman. "Most of my involvement in art is to do with the figure and the emotions that drive it. Things existing in the mind are different than face to face."

Youngman makes no secret of his admiration for Egon Schiele, the turn-of-the-century Austrian artist whose most persistent motif was the human figure. "With Schiele, the face and hands display more emotion, more anxiety, than any other part of the body," Youngman explains.

And, like Schiele, Youngman's portraits exude a brooding intensity with strong emphasis on face and hands. In some instances, the viewer feels intimidated, sensing that the figure on the canvas is threatening to spring into reality.

One case in point is Youngman's "TRC," an individual (the standing Tyrus Raymond Cobb), the legendary, violence-prone baseball player. The figure seen on canvas appears demonic, tense and unreluctant. Youngman's inspiration for the piece was Cobb's statement: "I was like a steel spring with a growing and dangerous flaw in it. If it is wound too tight or has the slightest weak point, the spring will fly apart and then it is done for."

Other Youngman works that haunt the viewer are "Egon's Brother," which makes you tremble, Schiele, and "Lament," which features, starring Youngman, "My art is emotional. It evokes a visceral response. It might have something to do with the way I was brought up. I was kind of a street kid, smaller and weaker than the other kids went to school with."

Born in New Ulm, Minn., Youngman, the son of a career Air Force officer, never had the chance to set roots. Home to him was wherever his father's career landed him — Thailand, Japan, the Azores, Oregon, California, several times in France. He began school at age five, remembers being schooled back and forth between grades and liv-

ing an insecure childhood. As a youth, he studied art in France for three years under "signed train," yet Youngman never took his own art seriously until doing post-graduate studies at Utah State University.

A lot happened before that. The artist remembers himself as "just a silly kid" when he first went to college. His father had made him a deal. He could go to any college he wanted — and pay for it himself — or he could go to Brigham Young University and his father would pay for it. He went to BYU.

Ironically, Youngman's family was not Mormon. "It was because of BYU's reputation for intolerance of alcohol and partying that his father had chosen the school. In Youngman's senior year, he converted to Mormonism.

After graduating from BYU with a bachelor of arts degree in 1968, Youngman became a teacher in Delta, Utah. Being married and being a schoolteacher, he should have been doubly exempt from military service.

Yet, through a quirk in the rules, he found himself drafted and serving with the 101st Airborne Division in Viet Nam. "I guess I was just destined to serve in the military," he says with a wry smile.

After his discharge, Youngman took advantage of the GI Bill to attend Utah State University where he studied under Adrien Van Suchtelen. "He introduced me to Egon Schiele," Youngman says, "mostly because my art was already like that. It gave me direction when I saw an artist who already knew what the figure-as-a-force was."

After graduate school, Youngman sent an application out to numerous schools and was accepted by the Filer School District. To his wife Judy (the former Judy Ward), that was home territory. To Youngman, it was as good a place as any. "I didn't have any roots and didn't care where I lived," he says.

From 1972 to 1974 he taught high school art, then began a mural painting business with partner Kent Jepson. Their commissions included Morrison-Knudsen, Blue Cross, El Rancho Restaurants, Sandpaper Restaurants, Twin Falls Bank & Trust, Mayfair Fashions and numerous private commissions.

Even so, the steady income wasn't sufficient. Moreover, his youngest son, Wes, contracted meningitis and incurred a burden of medical bills. Youngman took a job with Sears in Twin Falls to pay the bills, became a

Tradition acknowledges the rebel

ASCAP honors Dylan's innovations

WEST HOLLYWOOD, Calif. — The setting alone provided some culture shock — Monday night when Bob Dylan, for years the symbol of a defiant, questioning spirit, was honored here at Chasen's restaurant, a longtime citadel of the show-biz establishment.

But the approximate 100 guests represented an equally striking mix of eras and attitudes at an American Society of Composers, Authors & Publishers reception saluting the 44-year-old singer-songwriter.

As longtime ASCAP songwriters stood by in suits and ties, Dylan — wearing motorcycle boots, leather pants and a white T-shirt under his loose-fitting black sport coat — accepted the Founders Award from ASCAP President Hal David.

"Without a song, the day would never end. Without a song, the road would never bend. When things go wrong, a man ain't got a friend, without a song."

But what is a Dylan public appearance without a few sparks? Though publicist Norman Winter instructed the assembled writers and TV crews that this was to be a presentation, not a press conference, reporters could not resist shouting questions at Dylan.

One caught Dylan's ear: Is music as meaningful today as it was in the '60s?

"Not really," Dylan responded softly. "Warming up to the topic, he added, 'But I think it's going to change.'"

Asked to explain why, he said, "People are going to get sick of it." The Founders Award — whose only previous recipient was Stevie Wonder in 1984 — is designed to salute innovators and trend-setters whose song change the direction of pop music.

Because Dylan has been hailed by critics for years as the most influential songwriter of the modern pop era, this type of ASCAP recognition

was as obviously overdue as the lifetime achievement award that the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences handed out recently to the Rolling Stones.

Indeed, ASCAP was long considered the enemy by the country music and black music artists whose work led to the maverick rock 'n' roll sound.

Dylan had many of those artists on his mind Monday. Asked what he meant when he said he was accepting the award for other writers, he said, "People like Hank Williams, Jimmy Reed ... Muddy Waters. They should have gotten awards like this too."

Dylan also made it clear he meant it when he praised the traditional ASCAP writers. "I really respect what those guys did," he said, sitting at his table. "They wrote some great songs ... What song on the radio today is better than 'What a Difference a Day Makes' or 'Fruit' ... I'll give you a million dollars if you could find a better song ..."

On a roll, Dylan said that most record makers today think that all they need to know about music is how to "push a button" on a rhythm machine.

Hank Thompson to perform country music at Elks Club

TWIN FALLS — Country music star Hank Thompson will perform in concert tonight at 8 p.m. and again at 10 p.m. at the Twin Falls Elks Club.

With record sales nearing 40 million and chart songs numbering over 150, Thompson ranks high among country music lovers. In 1946 his first record, "Whoa Sailor," a song he wrote in the Navy, started a career that has taken him to all 50 states, Canada, Mexico, Africa, Asia and Europe.

It was Thompson's song, "Wild Side of Life," that inspired an

answer song, "It Wasn't God Who Made Honky Tonk Angels," that launched the career of Kitty Wells. Other Thompson favorites are: "Six Pack To Go," "Tumpty Dumpty Heart," "Green Light," "Blackboard of My Heart" and "Squaws Along the Yukon."

Thompson is also a prolific songwriter who has written or co-written over 200 songs. Tickets for the Elks shows are \$10 per person, and are on sale at the Elks Building between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. For more information, call 733-5313.

Howard Hughes: Filmmaker, film user?

HOLLYWOOD—Over three decades, Howard Hughes was a provocative and compelling figure in the movie world, filming aerial epics, battling censorship and turning cheaply beautiful stars like Jean Harlow and Jane Russell into stars. Was he a daring filmmaker or simply a dilettante who used movies to promote romances with glamorous actresses?

There are arguments for both sides. His films include true achievements like "Scarface," "Hell's Angels" and "The Front Page" to later trash like "The Outlaw" and "The Conqueror,"

which starred John Wayne as Genghis Khan.

Hughes' romances included Billie Dove, acclaimed as the most beautiful woman in film. Katharine Hepburn, whom he taught to fly, Jean Peters, who he married, and Terry Moore, who received a settlement from the Hughes estate on her claim that he had married her.

"Howard was the best lover I ever had," said Miss Moore, who has been married five times.

The lanky Texan arrived in Los Angeles in 1925 when he was only 19

but already in charge of an oil-drilling manufacturing empire he inherited from his father. In an oil business matters, he hired an accountant named Noah Dietrich, who ended up being Hughes' manager, fixer and right-hand-man for 31 years.

"Howard was crazy about the movies, especially because of all the pretty girls that were around the studios," Dietrich said in his late years. "An actor named Ralph Graves attached himself to Howard and convinced him to back him in a movie called 'The Outlaw.' Graves directed, and the picture was so bad that it was never released."

"But Howard was never thwarted by failure. He merely resolved to find a better help the next time."

Hughes hired an established director, Marshall Neilan, to make a sophisticated comedy, "Everybody's Acting," and it was 1926 hit. Hughes then became associated with a brilliant Russian emigre, Lewis Milestone, who won an Oscar for "Two Arabian Knights."

With Howard Hawks' "Scarface," Hughes had his first run-in with film industry self-censorship. He refused to eliminate graphic scenes of gangster violence, and the outcry against the glorification of crime brought a stricter censorship code.

Hughes' fascination with airplanes led to "Hell's Angels," an epic of World War I aerial warfare. He directed it himself and even flew stunt planes, injuring himself in a crash. When talkies emerged in mid-film-

ing, he scrapped all the silent footage, fired his Swedish-accented star and replaced her with Jean Harlow. "Hell's Angels" took \$3.5 million and three years to finish.

In the 1930s, Hughes lost interest in films — though not in actresses — and devoted himself to breaking flight records and developing his aircraft industry.

In World War II, he discovered a beauty in a dentist's office, and he starred Jane Russell in an overwrought Western, "The Outlaw." After he fought the censors, this time over his star's cleavage. He removed the film from release but brought it out three years later, again to critical scorn.

Jane Russell became Hughes' favorite star even though there was no romance. In a memo cherished by his aides, Hughes gave a detailed account of how her brassiere should be engineered.

In 1948, Howard Hughes bought control of RKO Studio and theaters for \$10 million. Legend insists that Hughes visited the studio only once, touring with a night watchman and departing with the words, "Paint."

Operating from the Goldwyn Studio a mile away, Hughes embarked on an ambitious program, designing a John Wayne film "Jet Pilot" as his latter-day "Hell's Angels." But "Jet Pilot" failed, as did most of the RKO films. He lost interest in the movies and sold the company in 1954 for a \$10 million profit.

Benton exhibit debuts at Boise Gallery of Art

But Benton, more humanist than a proponent of Regionalism, held interests in all aspects of life. In addi-

tion, to being a well-known artist, he was a writer and musician with an affinity for story-telling and folk tunes. He is reported to have said his ultimate goal was "for art to regain a more purposeful place in society."

He blended all of these interests into his art, which was sometimes inspired by musicians and American myths. His last work, a mural for the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville, Tenn., was titled, "The Sources of Country Music." A finished study for this mural is included in the exhibition.

The gallery is located at 670 South Julia Davis Drive. It is open Tuesday-Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and weekends from noon to 5 p.m. Guided tours are available every Wednesday at 12:15 p.m.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP)—A 200-room hotel with a guitar-shaped swimming pool will be built beside Elvis Presley's former residence, managers of his estate said Tuesday.

Ground breaking for the hotel is expected within two months, said David Beckwith, a spokesman for Graceland Enterprises Inc., the company that takes 500,000 visitors a year through the Presley residence.

The two-story, Georgian residence he lived in for most of his profes-

sional life is called Graceland, and the hotel will be called Graceland Hotel. The hotel will sit on nine acres adjacent to Graceland and will include a restaurant, lounge and meeting rooms.

Presley's estate will operate souvenir shops in the hotel and hotel operations will be free to use the Graceland name, but the estate will have only a small financial investment in the venture, said Jack Soden, director of Graceland Enterprises.

HOLLYWOOD—Over three decades, Howard Hughes was a provocative and compelling figure in the movie world, filming aerial epics, battling censorship and turning shapely beauties such as Jean Harlow and Jane Russell into stars. Was he a daring filmmaker or simply a dilettante who used movies to promote romances with glamorous actresses? There are arguments for both sides. His films include true achievements like "Scarface," "Hell's Angels" and "The Front Page" (to later trash it), "The Outlaw" and "The Conqueror."

which starred John Wayne as Genghis Khan. Hughes' romances included Billie Dove, acclaimed as the most beautiful woman in films; Katharine Hepburn, whom he taught to fly; Jean Peters, whom he married; and Terry Moore, who received a settlement from the Hughes estate on her claim that he had married her. "Howard was the best lover I ever had," said Miss Moore, who has been married five times. The lanky Texan arrived in Los Angeles in 1925 when he was only 19

but already in charge of an oil-drill manufacturing empire he inherited from his father. To help on business matters, he hired an accountant named Noah Dietrich, who ended up being Hughes' manager, fixer and right-hand-man for 31 years. "Howard was crazy about the movies, especially because of all the pretty girls that were around the studios," Dietrich said in his late years. "An actor named Ralph Graves attached himself to Howard and convinced him to back him in a movie called 'Swell Hogan.' Graves directed, and the picture was so bad that it was never released. "But Howard was never thwarted by failure. He merely resolved to find better help the next time. Hughes hired an established director, Marshall Neilan, to make a sophisticated comedy, "Everybody's Acting," and it was 1926 hit. Hughes then became associated with a brilliant Russian emigre, Lewis Milstone, who won an Oscar for "Two Arabian Knights."

ing, he scrapped all the silent footage, fired his Swedish-accented star and replaced her with Jean Harlow - "Hell's Angels" took \$3.5 million and three years to finish. In the 1930s, Hughes lost interest in films - though not in actresses and devoted himself to breaking flight records and developing his aircraft industry. In World War II, he discovered a beauty in a dentist's office, and he starred Jane Russell in an overwrought Western, "The Outlaw." Again he fought the censors, this time over his star's behavior. He removed the film from release but brought it out three years later, again to critical scorn. Jane Russell became Hughes' favorite star even though there was no romance. In a memo cherished by his aides, Hughes gave a detailed account of how her brassiere should be engineered. In 1948, Howard Hughes bought control of RKO Studio and theaters for \$10 million. Legend insists that Hughes visited the studio only once, touring with a night watchman and departing with the words, "Paint it."

Benton exhibit debuts at Boise Gallery of Art

On April 10 at 8 p.m., a lecture on the artist will be presented by Henry Adams, curator of American Art at the Nelson-Atkins Museum in Kansas City, Mo. Admission to the lecture is \$3. Along with John Stuart Curry and Grant Wood, Benton, in his search for an authentic American art, became known as a leader of the Regionalist movement of the 1930s. "But Benton, more humanist than a proponent of Regionalism, held interests in all aspects of life. In addition to being a well-known artist, he was a writer and musician with an affinity for story-telling and folk tunes. He is reported to have said his ultimate goal was "for art to regain a more purposeful place in society."

The gallery is located at 670 South Julia Davis Drive. It is open Tuesday-Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and weekends from noon to 5 p.m. Wednesday at 12:15 p.m. He blended all of these interests into his art, which was sometimes inspired by musicians and American myths. Paperback tells story of Diamondfield Jack

TWIN FALLS — Every few years a much maligned 19th century cowboy returns to haunt Magic Valley residents.

This time around, it is in the form of David Grover's book, "Diamondfield Jack: A Study in Frontier Justice."

Published by the University of Oklahoma Press, the paperback relates the story of an innocent cowboy who was sentenced to hang for murdering two shepherders, but subsequently was released.

As Grover's book tells it, Diamondfield Jack Davis was hired in 1886 by a wealthy cattle company to intimidate any sheepmen who might bring their flocks onto the company's ranges in Cassia County. When two young Mormon sheepherders were found murdered, Davis became the prime suspect in the case. He was tried in a Mormon farming community, Albion, some

distance from the cattle ranges, before a jury that contained no cattlemen.

In spite of high-powered legal help provided by the cattle company and a lack of evidence placing him at the scene of the murders, Diamondfield Jack quickly was convicted by the jury and sentenced to hang.

Appeals kept him alive until the true murderers confessed, but the appeals and confessions did not speed the course of justice in Idaho. Davis was not pardoned until 1902. He then moved to Nevada, where he became a rags-to-riches mining man before sinking into obscurity.

Grover, a retired education specialist for the California Postsecondary Education Commission, has written the 206-page book as a who-done-it account of the whole affair, recounting in detail the life and times of that portion of the frontier West.

The book is available in local bookstores.

Oregon education program will accept Idaho artists

VIDEOCASSETTES

"Little League's Official How-to-Play Baseball" (MasterVision). \$39.95. This 70-minute cassette explains the offensive and defensive fundamentals of baseball in a way that 8-to-12-year-olds can easily understand. Little Leaguers and two coaches are the teachers, demonstrating the skills with imaginative use of slow-motion. Well organized for easy reference, the tape has 19 sections, including bunting, throwing and pitching. The sections on sliding and playing catcher are especially well done. A terrific primer for youngsters. (4 stars) — DENNIS HUNT

"Ken Murray's Shooting Stars" (Cinemagrats). \$19.95. When young vaudevillian Ken Murray entered the movies in the late '20s, he started taking home movies of his movie-star pals — and in return, accumulating a rich variety of archival footage. The result is this irresistible potpourri, highlighted by tributes to Harold Lloyd, John Wayne and Bing Crosby. SUN VALLEY — The Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities is offering a new series of fiber- and related workshops for the 1986 summer season.

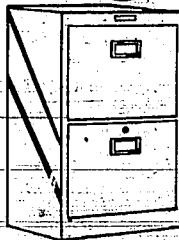
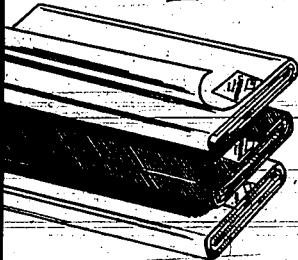

After several successful series, Harry Morgan tackles another

Whenever Harry Morgan piles his trade, he imparts a special kind of magic to his characters, making them endearing and memorable. His success, however, is not the result of sleight of hand. More than 100 films and scores of guest appearances have made him a consummate character actor.

Today, he is one of the most popular actors on television. He was loved by millions in his role as Colonel Sherman T. Potter in the phenomenally successful series "M*A*S*H." Fans celebrated his return in "AfterMASH," but the series did not receive strong ratings and was canceled after one season.

Morgan, 70, pronounced that he had had enough acting in his lifetime. He would direct and write to keep busy. But such plans were not in the cards. Along came "Blacke's Magic."

"I did 'AfterMASH' because I wasn't tired of doing 'M*A*S*H,'" says Morgan, father of four and grandfather of eight. "A lot of people were tired of the show, like Alan Alda, Loretta Swit and I think even Mike Farrell and David Ogden Stiers. But Jamie Farr, Bill Christopher and I weren't. So we kind of went into 'AfterMASH' as if we were doing 'M*A*S*H.' But the show never really worked."

"Unfortunately, my wife Eileen died just about a year ago and I didn't really feel like doing anything," continues Morgan. "But people said it was no good for me to mope around. Then this thing came along and it was a very attractive part and quite different than anything I had done."

"This thing" was "Blacke's Magic." In the new, already-popular adventure-mystery series, Morgan stars opposite Hal Linden as a loveable, crafty, energetic con artist from whose games and own brand of sleight of hand no one is safe, including his son, renowned magician-turned private eye Harry Blacke (Linden).

"Working with Hal had a lot of appeal because of the exposure we both had had through two shows we did. More people have come up to me to say that the two shows they watch are the most were 'M*A*S*H' and 'Barney Miller.' Linden's series before, 'Blacke's Magic', not necessary

Dick Boone. So I thought 'What the Hell, I'll go to work.' Now I'm not sure I didn't make a mistake," says Morgan, his voice rising in emphasis of the words.

He explains: "It's an hour show. Today, we're at the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel. Tomorrow we'll be in Pasadena. Sometimes we work through to 8 o'clock the following morning. I'm a little bit old for that. It's very tiring. We're putting in a full week and then some. It's a lot of work."

But without any prodding, Morgan, who displays seemingly boundless energy, admits that he is enjoying his work. "I would have to say that underneath I really enjoy working with Hal. I can do almost anything with the part that I want to do because he's always conning everybody, including his son."

Although Morgan is devoting much of his time these days to bringing Leonard Blacke to life, there may also be some directing in his future with this series.

"My father skipped out when I was 3," answered Guy. "My desire is to be the best out of spite. I need to show him."

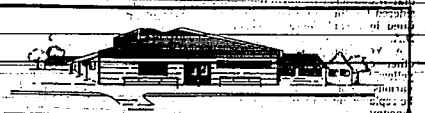

Nielsen ratings

ABC climbs out of 3rd-place rut; might have won without Oscar

NEW YORK — ABC leaped up from its third-place rut to tie NBC in this week's television ratings, according to the A.C. Nielsen Co., and might have won the race but for the sagging popularity of the Academy Awards telecast.

"The movie audience isn't necessarily a television audience, and that's reflected in the lower level of viewing," George Keramidas, ABC's vice president for research, said after figures released Tuesday showed the Oscar show with its lowest rating ever.

The Oscars on ABC finished third for the week with a rating of 27.3, or 43 percent of the viewing audience. "The Cosby Show" on NBC again topped all the competition with a 32.0 rating and 54 share, followed by NBC's "Family Ties" with a 28.5.

Barbara Walters' hour-long interview with President and Mrs. Reagan before the Academy Awards finished 10th with a rating of 20.9, but she pulled a 25.2 rating before the Oscars last year, when the subjects included Boy George.

NBC had two other shows in the Top 10: "Cheers" was sixth with a 22.3 rating and "Golden Girls" was seventh with 21.8.

In addition to the Oscars and Ms. Walters' special, ABC had "Who's the Boss" ranked fifth at 22.5 and the premiere episode of "Perfect Strangers" eighth at 21.3.

CBS' "60 Minutes" finished in a tie with the Walters' special, while "Murder, She Wrote" was fourth for the week at 23.7 and "Mrs. Delanfield Wants to Marry," a TV movie starring Katharine Hepburn, ninth at 21.0.

Each rating point represents \$39,000 homes; the share reflects the portion of the set in use during a particular time period.

For the week, NBC and ABC each had a rating of 15.8, while CBS lagged at 14.2 and finished third for the first time since November. With three weeks to go in the 30-week prime-time season, NBC leads with an average rating of 17.7, followed by CBS with 16.7 and ABC with 15.6.

As recently as 1983, the Oscar ceremonies claimed a 38.0 rating and a 59 share, still short of the glory days. In 1974, the Oscars got 78 percent of the audience and in 1960 they au-

dience share was 81 percent, according to NBC.

"Something like the Academy Awards very often is a function of the titles and the people up for the awards and their appeal," said Keramidas. Films which do big business, such as the "Rocky" epics and "Porky's," don't get many nominations for Academy Award, he noted.

"It isn't helpful for the Oscars to be on the network doing poorest in overall ratings," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice-president for research. A network doing well, he said, tends to

do just a bit better in ratings on any of its shows.

"I don't know how much that inertia is worth," Jaffe said; "but it's there."

"Perfect Strangers," a comedy of clashing cultures starring Mark Linn Baker and Bronson Pinchot, got an obvious boost from following the hit series "Who's the Boss."

"We'll have to watch it in the weeks ahead to see how it holds up," Keramidas said.

Although it's unusual for a first episode to crack the top 10, it isn't unprecedented, nor is it a guarantee of success. In 1979, ABC spun off "The Ropers" from "Three's Company," and the new show started in second place in the Nielsen list. By the end of the season, it was near the bottom and was canceled.

"Perfect Strangers" got one-third of the audience in its time slot, while its competition on CBS, the debut of "Morningstar Eveningstar," attracted only 15 percent of the audience and a rating of 9.7.

Mary Tyler Moore's new show, "Mary" and "Foley Square," which CBS moved to Tuesday night in search of an audience, finished 38th and 60th for the week. "Mary" had a rating of 9.8 and "Foley Square" 9.0, about half the audience which ABC's "Moonlighting" and NBC's "Hunter" each captured in the same hour.

more than 5½ million people live. Official statistics published earlier said 95 percent of Peking families have a black-and-white or color television set.

The potential nationwide television audience in China is 300 million viewers.

Harold Gould will star with Katherine Hepburn in 'Mrs. Delafield Wants To Marry'

After some 25 years of waiting, Gould will play romantic role

LOS ANGELES — Harold Gould waited nearly 25 years to play his first romantic role, and he got a real plum — leading man in a television movie with Katharine Hepburn.

The character actor, distinguished by his white hair and mustache, stars with Miss Hepburn in the CBS movie "Mrs. Delafield Wants To Marry."

He plays a Jewish physician of humble origins who falls in love with a wealthy widow from an aristocratic WASP family.

It's the first romantic leading

role for Gould, who at age 37 gave up a college teaching career to become an actor in 1962.

"I've played a few things close," he said. "In 'Golden Girls' I was Betty White's date. But it wasn't a lead. So now that I'm in my 60s I play a romantic lead. I don't know if this will open up anything or not. Maybe this is it. But it's nice to do."

Miss Hepburn, the winner of four Academy Awards, was cast first and given a choice of leading men.

"She looked over a number of people," Gould said. "I had to fly to New York to talk to her. She didn't know who I was. She's outspoken and frank and thorny.

She doesn't mean to be cruel. We hit it off from the beginning. We found our ideas on the play and the approach to our characters coincided."

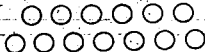
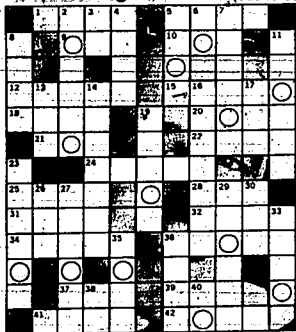
What was she like to work with? "You just recognize a pro. It was quite wonderful. It was fun."

Gould said that as he did the romantic scenes, there were always visions in his head of Miss Hepburn's famous leading men: Spencer Tracy, Cary Grant, Henry Fonda.

"Once you get past these legends she's played with, you just follow the script and respond to one another," he said. "She's very

giving and doesn't hold back.

"The whole idea of acting and make-believe still has a sense of childlike wonder for her, as it does for me. We had a scene where we were eating. She insisted that the plates be warm. No one watching at home would ever know, but it's just part of her process of make-believe."

Gould, the son of a postal worker, got his doctoral degree in theater arts at Cornell University. He taught acting at Cornell, UCLA, Stanford and Randolph-Macon Woman's College in Virginia. He was teaching at the University of California-Riverside when he made his decision to try acting.

"I was getting close to 40 and I knew it was now or never," he said. "I gave myself a year to make it. I lived in a \$7-a-week attic room in Hollywood and my wife stayed in Riverside and supported the kids. I had an old second-hand car that leaked oil and smoked."

Gould soon landed guest parts in "The Virginian" and "The Fugitive." He performed in TV shows and movies. His major films included "The Sting," "Silent Movie," "The Front Page," "The Arrangement," "Inside Daisy Clover," and "Harper."

He was Valerie Harper's father in "Rhoda," and also starred in the series "Father and Father," "Park Place," "Foot in the Door," and "Under One Roof."

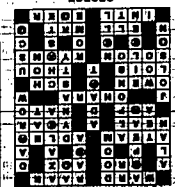
Gould also does voice-overs for commercials.

"It's just exploded the last year or two," he said. "It changes your perspective, too. It gives you a solid base and you don't have to grab at things desperately. But there's a danger, too: You can fall asleep. You can say, 'I'll just do voice-overs and forget the rest. That's the danger. It's not what I want to do with my life.'"

"I think that's why; those who are really serious about their craft do plays and workshops. You find more in yourself to give, rather

than the spontaneous things that come when you work quickly. The stage is the only place to discover what you have to offer, to find what's beneath the surface. It doesn't have to be Broadway, if the part's interesting."
