pose enormous technical and ethical problems.

"It could be done by getting an embryo to implant in the bowel," Trousner, director of the institute of Early Human Development at Monash University in Melbourne, Australia, was quoted as saying.

"It can be done," Dr. John Parsons, senior registrar and lecturer in obstetrics at King's College Hospital in London, was quoted as saying. "And undoubtedly, someone will do it."

To achieve pregnancy, men would have to receive hormone treatment to stimulate changes that occur naturally in women during pregnancy, New Society said. The treatment would enable an embryo to attach to some organ such as a kidney or the

wall of the large intestine. The embryo creates the placenta, so theoretically the baby would receive sufficient nourishment, the article said.

Any attempt at male pregnancy would carry risks for both the man and fetus.

"I think those risks are too big to try to establish pregnancy in man," Trousner is quoted as saying. "But with careful evaluation of pregnancy, those risks could be reduced."

According to New Society, the doctor could choose where to insert the embryo to provide a roomier environment than that selected by chance in ectopic pregnancies. An ectopic pregnancy occurs when the embryo grows inside a Fallopian tube. It often causes the Fallopian tube to rupture, resulting in the

death of the fetus — and without surgery, the death of the mother.

But Craft said he did not think men would be able to bear children because of the high failure rate of abdominal pregnancies. "It's well known in humans that when pregnancy occurs . . . in the abdomen, it rarely goes to term," he said.

Craft said his hospital's ethical committee would be unlikely to approve such a procedure given the current suspicion and alarm over such techniques as egg donation, embryo freezing and surrogate motherhood.

"It would only bring more disrepute and public alarm to the profession when so many women need help," he said.

pleted by May 4" — last Sunday, he said.

The town of Chernobyl, in which about 30,000 people lived, is 12 miles from the plant but a senior Western diplomat in Moscow said Thursday that the evacuation was still going on two days ago. He did not give the source of his information.

Soviet officials said earlier this week that evacuation of the 20,000 people in the plant town of Pripyat did not begin until 36 hours after the accident because Chernobyl personnel did not realize how serious it was.

Boris N. Yeltsin, chief of the Moscow Communist Party, said Monday that the original "danger area" was 18 miles, later reduced to 12. He said livestock in the zone were slaughtered.

The order for additional evacuations and other steps apparently resulted from a visit to the area May 2, six days after the accident, by Soviet Premier Nikolai I. Ryzhkov and Yegor Ligachev, No. 2 man in the Kremlin.

Lyashko, the Ukrainian premier, said officials in Moscow were advised of the explosion when it happened, but the full gravity of the situation was not relayed until Monday, April 28, because the situation "was constantly developing." The Soviet Union acknowledged the accident Monday after Sweden demanded information.

According to Lyashko, 24,000 people have been evacuated and the 204 people officially reported injured were workers at the power station, not members of the general public.

Officially the death toll is two; but the official Yugoslav news agency Tanjug said in a dispatch from Moscow that a third person died in a Kiev hospital.

The Ukrainian premier said the temperature in the burning No. 4 reactor had gone down to 572 degrees Fahrenheit.

Western experts have said reports that the graphite core of the reactor was probably a fire and would burn itself out slowly. Helicopters and ground workers have dumped thousands of tons of sand, lead and boron on the reactor to reduce emissions.

In a report Thursday describing the sand drop, the official news agency Tass said pilots flew "hundreds of missions and bombed" in unbelievably difficult conditions the crater emanating heat.

It said the thinner part of the unit has been reliably choked up with a huge sticky pie of sand and other ma-

terials. . . More than 5,000 tons of them are now in that stopper."

The journalists, who provided a pool report, arrived Thursday on a visit organized by the Foreign Ministry. There has been no indication that independent travel will be permitted soon by other reporters who have sought permission.

Officials escorted the reporters everywhere and many uniformed police were on the streets.

It was difficult to talk with residents of the city, which appeared calm. People strolled in the park in temperatures of about 72 degrees on a sunny late afternoon, and fished in the Dnieper River.

In a report on Kiev, the government newspaper Izvestia said Thursday that children were ordered not to play outside and children evacuated from "danger areas" near the reactor were given priority for summer camps.

Street sales of ice cream, pastries and juices is prohibited, food in farmers' markets is checked for radiation, and food and clothing of passengers is scanned at railroad stations, airports and bus depots, Izvestia said.

Even before the committee's final vote, Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger blasted the package as designed for "political bargaining" without regard to "the greatly improved U.S. military posture that adequate resources during the last five years have produced."

In a statement released by Pentagon spokesman Robert Sims, Weinberger added the proposal

"would destroy the recent and impressive momentum we have made in rearming America by squandering part of the dollars invested in defense in the past five years."

Weinberger said the committee action represented a decline from last year's level of military spending that would plunge the Defense Department "back into the chaotic, unstable, roller-coaster defense budget trends which led to previous inefficiencies and caused large weapon unit cost increases."

Rep. Marvin Leath, D-Texas, a conservative who often sides with Republicans on defense issues, said controls over the military spending bill of the past few years were weak and Congress has not been told where large inflation increases have gone.

"The Pentagon has undressed this institution," he said.

Several Republicans said the budget should include enough money to cover inflation, as in the Senate blueprint.

**Tornado rips Oklahoma town**

EDMOND, Okla. (AP) — A tornado touched down Thursday night in this Oklahoma City suburb, injuring 12 people while destroying nearly three dozen homes and damaging 30 others, authorities said.

At one home, "the only thing left standing was a closet in the middle of the house, and inside they found a grandmother, mother and two children," who escaped unharmed, said Bob Sands, newsman for radio station KBEC.

One home was flattened, with a car on the roof. Power lines snapped in half and several cars flipped over. Shingles and lumber littered the streets.

Twelve people suffered minor injuries when the storm hit the town of 35,000 north of Oklahoma City, said Edmond Police spokesman Lt. Mike Stradigge, who said his home was among those damaged.

**British voting favors Labor**

LONDON (AP) — Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's governing Conservatives lost heavily to the opposition Labor Party in municipal elections Thursday and dropped one of two parliamentary seats at stake to a centrist coalition.

The Social Democratic-Liberal Party alliance carried the north England parliamentary district of Ryedale by nearly 5,000 votes over the Conservatives with Labor a poor third. The Conservatives had carried the district, a traditional stronghold, by 16,100 votes in the last regular election in 1983.

The Tories apparently won the second parliamentary by-election, in their north England stronghold of West Derbyshire, but the alliance demanded a recount early Friday.

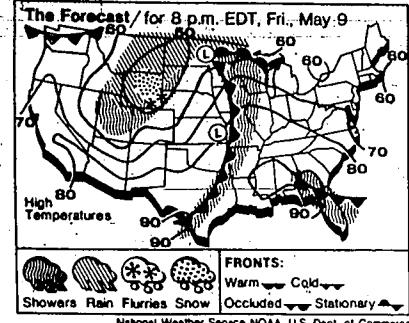

## Fallout detected in Cheyenne

WASHINGTON (AP) — The first airborne radioactivity from the Chernobyl nuclear accident has been found in barely detectable amounts at ground stations in Denver, Cheyenne, Wyo., and Richland, Wash., federal monitors said Thursday.

The "Environmental Protection Agency said its monitoring stations detected 0.012 picocuries per cubic meter of iodine-131 in a sample taken Tuesday in Cheyenne. Sampling at Denver showed 0.0057 picocuries per cubic meter of iodine-131 and 0.0022 picocuries per cubic meter of cesium-134.

Energy Department monitoring at Richland, Wash., on Monday and Tuesday showed iodine-131 in four samples ranging from 0.005 picocuries per cubic meter to 0.015 picocuries per cubic meter.

"These levels are barely detectable and represent no danger to area residents," EPA said in a statement on behalf of the inter-agency task force monitoring Chernobyl developments.

## Walker implicates Whitworth

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Spymaster John Walker testified Thursday that former Navy radioman Jerry Whitworth must have known he was spying for the Soviet Union even though Walker never told him.

Winding up seven days of testimony as the prosecution's key witness in the trial, Walker said common sense would have led Whitworth to conclude that the Soviets were the buyers of the sophisticated Navy code secrets he was providing.

"It would make no sense that a friendly government or a criminal element would buy cryptographic material," Walker said.

Walker said that only the United States and the Soviet Union had the expertise to use code-breaking information and equipment of the type that Whitworth allegedly furnished.

Whitworth is charged with selling secrets to Walker for \$332,000 with the knowledge and intention that the material would be relayed to the Soviet Union.

## Union takes over Hormel local

AUSTIN, Minn. (AP) — The international union seized control of the striking Hormel meatpackers' local and removed its elected leaders for failing to end their 6-month-old strike, officials said Thursday.

"We met on the 7th and voted to put them in trusteeship," said Al Zack, spokesman for the Washington-based United Food and Commercial Workers. The vote by the international's five-member board was unanimous, he said.

Local P-9 was informed of the decision Thursday morning, Zack said. Joe Hansen, the international's regional director, will appoint two trustees in Austin to supervise the local's daily activities, Zack said.

## Mellencamp leads farm rally

CHILLICOTHE, Mo. (AP) — Thousands of people climbed on combines and tractors and packed a gravel parking lot for a farm protest led by singer John Cougar Mellencamp, who said the event was a success if it brought smiles to the faces of financially strapped farm families.

"For some of these people, it's the first time they've smiled in months," Mellencamp said following his appearance Wednesday at a rally. Intended to bring attention to the farm crisis. "If they smiled during the 15 minutes I played, then it was a success."

Farmers have staged rallies outside the Livingston County Farmers Home Administration office for nearly two months, protesting federal farm policies and the county supervisor's loan policy.

# House panel demands Contra funds records

WASHINGTON (AP) — A House panel, trying to discover what happened to \$18 million in non-lethal aid to Nicaraguan rebels, voted unopposed Thursday to subpoena the records of bank accounts where the money was deposited.

The House Foreign Affairs Committee voted 24-0 to allow Rep. Michael Barnes, D-Md., chairman of the subcommittee on Latin America, to sign the subpoenas, which were requested earlier in the day by Barnes' panel on a 9-0 vote.

The action followed new testimony by the General Accounting Office, the investigative arm of Congress, that the administration lacked adequate controls to guarantee that the money provided to the Contra rebels for food, medicine and non-lethal goods had not been diverted to buy weapons.

In seeking the subpoenas, Barnes said, "We are looking for documents that would provide the missing paper link" to show if the funds were diverted.

Barnes signed the first of 13 subpoenas late Thursday and said the information obtained would be analyzed by GAO investigators over the next several weeks. The banks and the owners of the accounts were not revealed, but Barnes' staff said

11 banks were in Miami, one in Chicago and one in Washington.

Frank C. Conahan, director for GAO's national security international affairs division, testified that as of April 25, \$21.1 million of \$27 million in non-lethal Contra aid had been spent, with \$13.3 or 63 percent used in Central America.

Conahan said the State Department office that disburses the funds could not adequately account for how that money had been spent. Of those funds, he said, \$12.9 million had been funneled to the region through 12 accounts, the bulk of them in Miami. Another GAO official said the 12th account was in Chicago.

The subpoenas would require the banks to show the flow of money into and out of those accounts.

The rest of the non-lethal aid was spent in the United States to buy supplies that were then shipped to Central America, and GAO said accounting for those funds was adequate.

Although the investigation of the non-lethal funds has been pressed by Democrats, Republicans joined in requesting the subpoenas.

## Ex-con gets 30 years for \$1 robbery

HOUSTON (AP) — A 25-year-old ex-convict is being sent to prison for 30 years after pleading guilty to robbing a secretary of \$1.

State District Judge J.D. McMaster on Wednesday sentenced Alfred Cliff Alvis for the Dec. 12 incident in a parking lot adjacent to the Harris County Courthouse. Alvis theft conviction in California.

Alvis has a lengthy criminal record, including robbery convictions in Louisiana and Texas and a theft conviction in California.

### Genuine tax reform finally has a chance

The Senate Finance Committee has done a pretty amazing thing. Departing from a familiar past, surprising even its own members, it has reported out by a vote of 20 to 0 a bill that would genuinely reform the U.S. tax system. This is the same committee that over the years has been the source of most of the provisions the reformers wanted to strike. Maybe Hailey's Comet did it.

Under the very good bill the committee sent to the floor, the poor would not pay, and the rich mostly would. By raising the personal exemption and standard deduction, the bill would lift the tax threshold above the poverty line and take millions of lower-income families off the rolls. At the same time it would do away with the preferential treatment of capital gains, which accrue mostly to the rich, and with one important exception also take the sting out of tax shelters by denying people the right to offset actual income with concocted losses.

These steps plus the lower rates they would help finance would extract the tax code from the economy, in the sense that tax considerations would no longer play so important a part in investment decisions. The rates would be 15 percent for most people and 27 percent at the top, as against a 50 percent top rate now.

The low rates were what finally won the committee over. They were only possible because the committee also agreed to broaden the income base to which the rates would apply. That, of course, is what reform has always been about. It took the committee a while to discover its virtues.

The legislation is an enormous personal as well as professional victory for Finance Committee Chairman Bob Packwood. He redeemed both the bill and his own reputation by boldness. In the early voting he had been trampled by committee members seeking to increase the tax advantages of particular industries. He pulled back, proposed much more of a hands-off approach to business taxes (he would still raise them, but the bill would rely heavily on a minimum corporate income tax, simply limiting the use any corporation could make of all available preferences in any one year), and went after the advantages of wealthy individual taxpayers instead. It was a saving decision, both good politics and good policy.

The one interest group to which the committee did egregiously give ground was the oil industry. Over the objections of steadfast reformer Bill Bradley, it agreed to preserve oil and gas tax shelters even while wiping out all others. Members from oil and gas states said they had the votes to kill the bill otherwise — and they probably did. The trick will now be to keep further favors from being done for other such interest groups on the floor. The Senate is not exactly famous for saying no on such occasions. But then, neither was the Finance Committee.

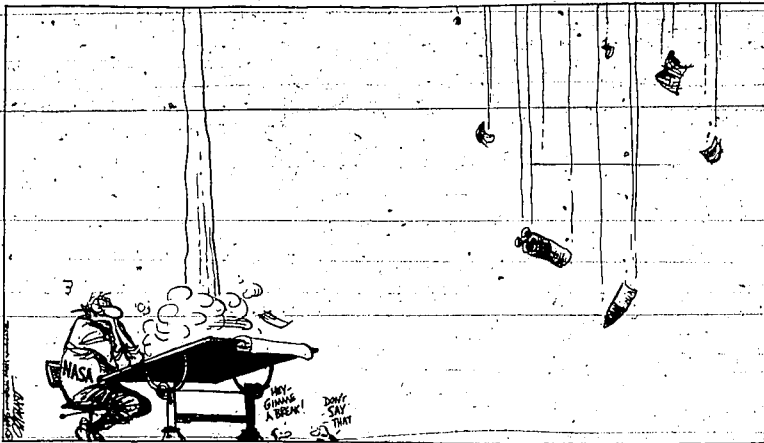

## U.S. must work to keep Arab friends

Helping Saudi Arabia to resist such threats is very much in the U.S. interest. To that end, the president recently notified Congress of his intent to sell additional air and sea defense missiles to the Saudis.

These defense systems will support Saudi air defense into the 1990s. They will allow the Saudis to continue carrying the primary burden for their own security. Completion of the sale at this time, even though the missiles will not be delivered for several years, provides a clear and important political demonstration of U.S. commitment to Saudi self-defense. It helps deter Iran from expanding the Gulf war, bolsters the resolve of other Arab moderates, and diminishes the possibility that U.S. troops may eventually have to be used to protect our interests in the Persian Gulf.

The United States and Saudi Arabia have many similar interests beyond the Gulf, and our actions are often mutually supportive. The Saudis worked closely and diligently with us in the search for a peaceful solution in Lebanon. They continue to provide critically needed support to the Afghan freedom fighters, to the government of Pakistan and to moderate forces in Sudan.

They provide important support to the World Bank and the IMF, and are one of the few countries with which we maintain an important positive balance of trade.

Some opponents of this sale have characterized it as a threat to Israel. However, there can be no doubt of President Reagan's ironclad commitment to the security of Israel. This is amply reflected in our continuing assistance to enable Israel to maintain its qualitative edge in military capability and includes the inauguration of unprecedented U.S.-Israeli defense cooperation.

There can also be no doubt that other potential suppliers of military arms to the Arabs would be less willing to keep these concerns in mind.

Currently, we are engaged in a critical struggle against Libyan-sponsored state terrorism. There is no question that the Saudis are a determined opponent of terrorism and that they have consistently worked behind the scenes to discourage terrorism from any source. It is essential during this difficult time, when (Libyan leader Muammar) Khadafi is trying to radicalize the Arab world, that the U.S. respond to terrorism be seen for what it is and certainly not as an attack on Arabs. To do otherwise would benefit only Khadafi.

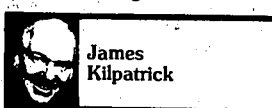
## An infuriating bit of monkey business

WASHINGTON — You would have to travel a long way to find an uglier or more depressed spring than the story of the 15 monkeys of Silver Spring, Md. The primates are now living out what is left of their tormented lives in cages at the National Institutes of Health. The government's conduct in the case is both appalling and indefensible.

The story goes back at least to 1981, when a 23-year-old student at George Washington University, Alex Pacheco, spent four months working undercover as a volunteer at the Institute for Behavioral Research in suburban Maryland. The institute's main purpose was to conduct research on potential value to victims of stroke. Dr. Edward Taub served as principal investigator. His work was financed by grants from the National Institutes of Health.

No one who has suffered a stroke, or known victims of stroke, would minimize Taub's purpose. He was seeking means to help such victims rehabilitate themselves. At the time young Pacheco went to work, Taub had been conducting animal experiments under NIH grants for eight years. He believes that his findings have resulted in important gains in the field.

When that has been said, the best has been said. As part of his research, Taub experimented with highly intelligent and socially active macaques. These monkeys were subjected to surgery that in some instances severed their spinal columns. The idea was to destroy their neural sensations. Some day-old monkeys had their eyes sewn shut. Arms and legs routinely were crippled. The animals were subjected to various forms of torment to determine if they could be taught

to regenerate their impaired limbs and organs. The monkeys went through hell. Though Taub has said that "there is no pain in these experiments," no one who has seen Pacheco's photographs or heard his testimony is likely to be so persuaded. The evidence shows open wounds indifferently bandaged. Pacheco has testified vividly of the animals' self-mutilation. One monkey named Billy chewed off eight of his 10 fingers. Another monkey, Paul, tore off all five fingers of one hand.

The laboratory conditions, according to Pacheco's testimony, were all nightmare levels. Cages were infrequently cleaned. If a caretaker failed to show up, the monkeys could go two or three days without food. The place was overrun with cockroaches and filth. Some medications were two years out of date.

On the basis of Pacheco's evidence, Montgomery County police raided Taub's institute in September 1981. They seized 17 surviving monkeys and charged Taub with violating Maryland's law against cruelty to animals. The animals, 15 of which are still alive, were sent under court order to an NIH facility at Poolesville, Md. Taub was convicted on six counts, but the Maryland Court of Appeals

reversed. It was held that federal rules preempted state law. A civil action still is pending. Almost five years later, the monkeys remain in their cages at Poolesville. The NIH does not want them. Last October, NIH spokesman William F. Raub said that "We wish to discontinue our temporary custody of the IBR monkeys as soon as possible." Taub's institute does not want them. Joseph Vassallo, chief executive officer of the Institute, said last September that in the absence of continued NIH funding, "Dr. Taub will not continue to pursue this research effort, and will not require further use of the primates."

A humane organization known as PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) does want them. PETA has arranged for Primarily Primates Inc., an animal sanctuary near San Antonio, Texas, to take the animals. Last month Wallace W. Sweet, director of the refuge, formally offered to "provide a lifelong home and permanent care for these primates."

For legal reasons that baffle understanding, the NIH has refused to cooperate with so sensible an ending to the story. On the agenda of James Wynngarden, director of the NIH, the fate of 15 monkeys has a low priority. Care of the animals is costing the taxpayers \$30,000 a year.

Maryland's Sen. Charles McC. Mathias and more than a hundred members of the House have appealed for the monkeys' release. The situation is infuriating — but when one is dealing with the obstinacy of bureaucracy and the law's delays, what else is new?

# Dissident arrives in U.S. seeking help for Soviet Jews

NEW YORK (AP) — Freed Soviet dissident Anatoly Shcharansky arrived in the United States on Thursday for a two-week visit devoted to rallying support for those "who are still waiting for their day of freedom to come."

"This is a short trip but I have a few important meetings during which I'm going to speak about the fate of those left behind, those prisoners of conscience," Shcharansky told reporters at Kennedy International Airport.

Now an Israeli citizen and calling himself Natan, Shcharansky said 400,000 other Soviet Jews were waiting to be let out.

He said he hoped through "sharing my experience of fighting great repression of the KGB, we will be able to help those of our brothers in the Soviet Union who are still waiting for their day of freedom to come."

Shcharansky's schedule has the 38-year-old computer scientist in New York for five days, flying to Washington for three days and then returning to New York until his return to Israel on May 20.

In New York, he will meet with Jewish leaders, participate in the city's annual rally for Soviet Jewry on Sunday and attend a reception in his honor hosted by Mayor Edward I. Koch at Gracie Mansion.

He will meet President Reagan in Washington on Tuesday and observe Israel's Independence day on May 15 at the Israeli embassy.

Shcharansky was freed Feb. 11 in an East-West prisoner swap after spending nine years in Soviet

prisons.

Shcharansky was a spokesman for the Jewish emigration movement in the Soviet Union and for the unofficial watchdog committee on the Helsinki human rights agreement until his arrest on treason charges in

1977.

He had first applied to emigrate to Israel in 1973. His case became a cause celebre for activists demanding rights for Soviet Jews, and one purpose of his visit is to thank those who applied pressure for his release.

# Administration pursues embargo of products made with Libyan oil

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States, seeking to escalate its sanctions against Libya, is moving toward an embargo — against petroleum products made with Libyan crude oil and refined in Europe and other foreign lands, State Department officials said Thursday.

Such a ban could put additional pressure on European countries to limit their purchases of Libyan crude oil at a time when the United States is trying to enlist allied support for specific measures against the government of Moammar Khadafi.

Robert B. Oakley, head of the State Department's counter-terrorism office, said in open testimony before the Senate Foreign Relations committee on Wednesday that further U.S. measures against Libya, including the refined-products ban, would be taken "before long."

State Department officials, speaking on condition they not be identified, said it was not clear how soon such a ban could be announced because of many technical difficulties.

"We're in the process of trying to figure out how it would be done," one official said Thursday.

He said that in early January, Deputy Secretary of State John C. Whitehead, on a mission to Europe to drum up support for sanctions, informed allied countries that a products ban was being considered by the United States.

"He didn't threaten, it was just mentioned as a possibility," the official said.

"We have always had under consideration additional economic measures and they are continuing under active consideration," White House spokesman Larry Speakes said, noting a pledge by the seven leaders at the recent Tokyo summit to do more against terrorism.

"We have since January been discussing with other nations a variety of economic and other peaceful actions to be taken against countries like Libya, who support international terrorism," Speakes said.

Meanwhile, the Pentagon said the April 15th U.S. aerial raids over

Libya "met the established objectives," but did result in 1 to 2 percent of the bombs falling on civilian areas.

The Pentagon said it appeared three errant bombs had fallen from an F-111 bomber "and it seems likely they impacted in the vicinity of the French Embassy." A ranking defense official, who asked not to be named, added that the bombs were thought to have been dropped by the one F-111 that did not return from the raids.

# Most Texas teachers pass

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Only 3.3 percent of Texas' more than 200,000 public school teachers failed a statewide competency test which they must pass to keep their jobs, the State Board of Education was told Thursday.

Officials earlier had predicted that about 5 percent of the teachers would flunk.

Legislators decided to require the Texas Examination of Current Administrators and Teachers in a school reform bill after a study committee said it found some Texas teachers were inadequately prepared to teach.

"The TECAT results are official — 96.7 percent of Texas teachers passed the test. And that's an A in anyone's book," Gov. Mark White said.

"We have asked our teachers to do more than any other state has required. Texas teachers have met the challenge and have passed their test with outstanding success," White said.

# Louisiana governor's trial heads for jury

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Gov. Edwin Edwards' lawyer made a final appeal Thursday for jurors to acquit Edwards on all racketeering and fraud charges, while the prosecutor asked the panel to send a message that no one is above the law.

After the closing arguments in the 7-week-old trial, U.S. District Judge Marcel Livaudais issued instructions to the jury, which was to begin deliberations Friday morning.

Edwards, his brother Marion and three business associates — Gus Miljalis, Ronald Falgout and James Wylie — are charged with racketeering and fraud.

Prosecutors say the defendants used their influence before and after Edwards became governor in March 1983 to obtain state certification for hospital and nursing home projects in which they held interests. Their first trial ended Dec. 18 with a hung jury.

"Send a message to old and young, rich and poor alike that no one, no

matter what their position, is above the law," U.S. Attorney John Volz told the jury Thursday.

Camille Gravel, one of Edwards' lawyers, urged jurors to return a complete acquittal.

"If you convict him of even one count, regardless of what action the judge might take, he will have received a life sentence," Gravel said.

"The stigma and pain of that conviction will live with him until his dying day."

Edwards' other lawyer, Michael Fawer lashed out frequently during his three-hour summation at U.S. Attorney John Volz.

"This prosecution, pure and simple, is the vision of a man who... views all human error with suspicion and who believes the end justifies the means," Fawer said.

Fawer said there was no evidence that financial dealings Edwards had with Wylie and Falgout were illegal or that as a result of them he would do favors after becoming governor.

# Man held for murder

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A man was charged Thursday with murder and arson in smoky fires in two apartment buildings where eight people died trying to escape, including a man found dead in a hall with a flashlight in his hand, authorities said.

At least 14 other people were injured, one critically, in the early-morning blazes.

Some people broke windows and climbed out of their apartments to escape, and were rescued by firefighters.

Frank A. Jordan, 20, who sometimes lived with his mother in a three-story, undamaged building at the apartment complex, was charged with eight counts of murder, nine of arson, nine of risking a catastrophe and other charges. He was held without bail.

# Arms talks resume; Soviets plan to make no new nuclear proposals

GENEVA (AP) — U.S.-Soviet nuclear arms talks resumed Thursday after a nine-week break with the chief Soviet negotiator saying his side plans no new proposals and that it is up to the United States to move the talks forward.

"I wouldn't be here if I didn't hope that we can negotiate," Viktor P. Karpov, who heads the Soviet negotiating team, told reporters at the Soviet mission.

But he said the proposals already made by the Soviets at the 14-month-old talks opened the way for agreement in all three areas under discussion: medium-range nuclear missiles, long-range forces and new technologies in space.

"We don't feel there are new proposals needed from our side," Karpov said. "It is for our partners now to make steps."

Earlier, President Reagan said in Washington that the Soviets should

"negotiate seriously" in Geneva and respond to U.S. proposals.

Both sides had made "new proposals during the last round, which ended March 4," Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev called for an end to all nuclear weapons by the year 2000, beginning with a 50-percent cut in both sides' nuclear arsenals and an interim agreement on medium range nuclear weapons.

The United States has said the Soviet proposal contains some positive elements but overall is unacceptable. Reagan countered with a proposal to eliminate medium range weapons by the end of the decade.

Asked whether progress was possible at the current round of talks since neither side seemed willing to budge, Karpov described it as a catch-22 situation, meaning there didn't seem to be any solution.

The fifth round of talks opened with a two-hour meeting of all three

principal negotiators from each side and their aides at the Soviet mission.

Karpov used the session to announce a shuffling of the Soviet team following the departure of Yuli A. Kvitsinsky, who headed the space and defense group and is now ambassador to Bonn.

Karpov said he will replace Kvitsinsky, meaning he will face U.S. chief delegate Max M. Kampelman across the negotiating table at least once a week.

Alexei A. Obukhov, who formerly headed the medium-range group, takes over long-range talks facing the new U.S. negotiator, Ronald F. Lehman. Lehman replaces John Tower, who resigned after the last round.

Lem Masterkov, formerly Obukhov's deputy, takes over the medium-range talks facing Maynard W. Gilman.

## Judge escapes murder attempt

MADRID, Spain (AP) — Three rocket-propelled grenades were fired at the Supreme Court president's armor-plated car Thursday and hit their mark, but he and his driver escaped injury, police reported.

The grenades were fired by remote-control from a parked car, and Basque separatist guerrillas are suspected, police spokesmen said.

Judge Antonio Hernandez Gil, 71, also heads the General Council of Judicial Power, a group of 20 lawyers and judges elected by Parliament that supervises the justice system.

Guerrillas of the Basque separatist group ETA detonated a car bomb by remote control two weeks ago that demolished a vehicle of the paramilitary Civil Guard, killing five officers and seriously wounding four.

# Shultz sees no aid hike for Philippines



MANILA, Philippines (AP) — George P. Shultz said Thursday there will be no U.S. aid increases to the debt-ridden Philippines beyond those already made, and the new government's priority should be "to get the economy restructured."

The secretary of state also said Congress was in a mood to reduce foreign aid requests, and "it is not in the interest of the United States to have the kind of cuts that seem to be in the offing."

Shultz said the "massive respect and admiration" Americans are interested in knowing how we can help resolve our economic problems, he said in an arrival statement.

He is here for talks with President Corason and also has scheduled a meeting with politicians from the government of Ferdinand E. Marcos, who fled the country Feb. 25 after two decades as president because of a military-civilian rebellion.

Supporters of Marcos have a right to demonstrate, the secretary said, provided they do not use "violent means."

Marcos loyalists, encouraged by the former president from exile, have held street demonstrations and public rallies demanding his return.

They have protested at the U.S. Embassy, claiming the United States kidnapped Marcos by flying him and his wife to Hawaii.

"Shultz's 26-hour visit is intended to demonstrate the Reagan administration's support for the new government and inform Mrs. Aquino and her ministers of action at the seven-nation economic summit meeting in Tokyo that ended Tuesday.

Shultz arrived in Manila from Seoul, where he met with South Korean President Chun Doo-hwan. On the flight from Seoul, Shultz said the

administration would not go beyond the \$200 million request for additional economic and military aid to the Philippines announced last month.

He said said Congress was engaged in a "budget-cutting exercise" that threatened deep reductions in the foreign aid program, the State Department budget and anti-terrorism security measures at U.S. embassies.

Mrs. Aquino's government must cope with a \$56-billion foreign-debt and lower investment caused by a steady decline of confidence in Marcos' government before he left and uncertainty about the course of his successors.

"They have lots of hard problems," Shultz said, "but they don't have insoluble problems."

Philippine officials accuse Marcos and his associates of plundering at least \$5 billion in public funds while in power.

## Twin giraffes born at English park

WARMINSTER, England (AP) — one female, were found Wednesday. A giraffe at the Longleat Safari Park in southwest England has given birth to twins, believed to be the first born in captivity, a park spokesman said.

The 6-foot calves, one male and one female, were found Wednesday. The mother, nicknamed Bernardine, had spent several weeks in a pen shielded from other animals at the park near Warminster in Wiltshire county.

## Lyng claims Soviets may want dairy cows

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Soviet Union may be interested in buying some of the surplus dairy cows being marked for slaughter by American farmers, a spokesman for Agriculture Secretary Richard E. Lyng said Thursday.

Dave Lane said Lyng told a group earlier that the Soviets "have not come to us for food" in the aftermath of the Chernobyl nuclear mishap. "However," he made the statement that the Soviet Union expressed interest in buying some live dairy cows.

Lane said Lyng had "nothing to go on" about Moscow's interest in dairy cows except that a senior Agriculture Department official, Undersecretary Daniel G. Amstutz, apparently mentioned it to Lyng

several days ago.

"It may even have come from private sources," Lane said. "We can't trace it back" to the origin.

Amstutz, who oversees international affairs and commodity programs in the department, was headed here until Monday, his office said.

Under a whole-herd buyout program designed by Congress last year to cut back on surplus milk production, dairy farmers will send 1.5 million cows, heifers and calves to slaughter or into export markets.

Lane said a number of groups and some members of Congress have suggested that the cows be sent to help Europeans faced with contaminated food supplies as a result of Chernobyl.

## Gunman's conviction overturned

GENOA, Italy (AP) — An appeals court Thursday overturned the conviction of the youngest gunman in the Achille Lauro hijacking on the grounds that he was a minor at the time and ordered he be retried in juvenile court.

The court also reduced the sentences for two of the three other gunmen and a convicted accomplice.

The five were convicted by a local court Nov. 18 on charges of illegal possession of arms and explosives and sentenced to prison terms ranging from four to nine years.

The appeals court Thursday set aside the conviction of Bassam al-Ashker because he was 17-years old at the time of the Oct. 7 hijacking. The court ordered that al-Ashker, who had been sentenced to 3 1/2 years in prison, be held in custody and retried in a juvenile court.

The three-judge appeals panel reduced the sentences for three of the four adult defendants by up to two years, but gave no reason for the change.

The four adults and 10 other Palestinians, including the alleged mastermind of the hijacking, Abul Abbas, face trial in Genoa June 18 on the more serious charges of kidnapping and murder as well as other terrorist crimes connected to the seizure of the Italian liner.

Abul Abbas, whose real name is Mohammed Abbas, is a member of the Palestine Liberation Organization's executive committee. He and eight of the others to be tried in June are still at large and will be tried in absentia.

Because of his age at the time of the crime, al-Ashker will not have to stand trial on the more serious charges. He is now 18, Italy's legal age of adulthood.

A 64-year-old wheelchair-bound American, Leon Klinghoffer, was shot and killed during the hijacking.

## Syria denies bombing link

LONDON (AP) — Syria denied Thursday that it was involved in an attempt to blow up an El Al airliner in London and said Syria had become the target of an "international smear campaign."

The Syrian Embassy in London issued a statement on the El Al case as Nezar Hindawi, 31, a Palestinian, was ordered held for another week on charges he attempted to blow up the El Al airliner at Heathrow airport April 17.

British authorities have indicated they want to question a member of the Syrian Embassy in connection with the El Al bomb attempt, which was foiled when an El Al guard found explosives in the hand luggage of Hindawi's Irish girlfriend before the plane took off.

The Syrian Embassy statement said: "We have offered our cooperation to the British authorities in their inquiries first because we have nothing to hide, and secondly, because we are anxious to maintain friendly relations with Britain."

## Democrats say GOP given more air time

BOISE (AP) — State Senate Minority Leader Kermit Klebert has written a letter to the general manager of the Idaho Public Broadcasting System, protesting the "unbalanced amount of air-time given the Republican members of the Legislature."

Klebert, D-Hope, wrote to Jerry Garber last week that the Senate Democrats were not aware that the Republicans had received such an extensive amount of time to express their views on public broadcasting's Idaho Reports until last week.

Senate President Pro Tem Jim Risch, R-Boise, asked last week that he receive equal time on the program to explain positive moves of the Idaho Legislature. He contended the show focused on negative aspects of the session.

Ken Mundt, executive producer of Idaho Reports was quoted as saying no Democratic legislators had been

on the show since the end of the 1980 Legislature.

"We were surprised to learn that the president pro-tem of the Senate was complaining about needing more air-time," Klebert wrote. "Considering the fact that the Republican Party holds an overwhelming majority in both houses of the Legislature, the Republican leadership had ample opportunity for the first three months of the this year to accomplish their agenda, and to communicate with the citizens of Idaho."

"Since that time, they have had the exclusive opportunity to express their interpretations of the session on your program. We protest this undue weighing of one partisan philosophy. The public deserves a more balanced coverage."

Klebert said the 14 Senate Democrats were glad to see that Risch admitted there was a need for balance.

## Supreme Court cuts backlog of cases despite more filings

BOISE (AP) — If justice delayed is justice denied, then there's more justice in Idaho these days. The Idaho Supreme Court says in its annual report on the state court system that it cut 168 days last year in the time it takes to decide an appeal of a legal matter.

Although it still takes more than 700 days to decide an appeal from the time it is filed, the time lag still is far better than it was in 1984, 872 days. The state's legal system decided a record 574 appeals last year. The Supreme Court issued 156 decisions, the Court of Appeals issued 226 rulings and a special panel of Supreme Court justices and retired district judges disposed of another 32 cases.

Although the emphasis on decisions left at least one Supreme Court justice grumbling that judicial quality was being sacrificed for speed, at the end of 1985, there were only 540 appeals pending. That was the lowest number since 1979, when 487 cases were pending.

Based on the number of filings, dispositions, and the average age of pending cases, Idaho's most productive district judge for 1985 was 5th District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt, the court report said.

While many of the state's areas of business may have been stagnant in 1985, there was no slowdown on the number of lawsuits.

The state's legal system showed an increase of more than 11,000 in the number of legal actions filed with the state courts.

There were 329,791 legal filings, up from the 318,476

the year before. But the court system almost kept up, with 329,407 dispositions during the year.

The court report noted there may be some connection between the number of attorneys in the state and the number of lawsuits filed.

Between 1970 and 1980, the state's population went up 32 percent, from 713,015 to 943,835. But the number of attorneys almost tripled, from about 600 to 1,340.

Traffic cases accounted for more than half of the increase in trial court filings last year, with more than 200,000 cases.

The court report also indicates more people than ever before are turning to small claims courts to take care of minor legal matters.

There was an 18.6 percent increase in small claims court actions, 16,808 compared to 14,167 the year before.

One area of legal activity leveled off in 1985, after big growth the year before. In 1984, there was a 35 percent increase in the number of child-support claims; last-year child support petitions fell 5.7 percent.

Of the civil cases handled by Idaho's courts, 23,974 were handled through trials before judges of law. But of the criminal cases, less than one in 20 went before a jury.

There were more than 300 cases filed for each district judge last year, with the average judge disposing of 289.

## State seeking federal money for retraining

BOISE (AP) — The state of Idaho is seeking \$763,156 in federal funds to retrain workers thrown out of jobs because of slumps in the agriculture, mining and timber industries.

"Idaho has a disproportionately high percentage of dislocated workers in these three major industries," said Gov. John Evans on Thursday.

He said 70 percent of the workers laid off from the Lucky Friday and Sunshine mines have asked to be retrained for new careers and for assistance with relocation.

Also, Evans said, farmers and workers thrown out of jobs because of the dairy herd buyout program have asked the Department of Employment for help.

In 1985, the state received \$921,000 to retrain dislocated workers.

Unless extra funding is provided, money under the program can be used to send workers to state vocational-technical schools, to retrain them on-the-job in local businesses, and to help workers and their families relocate where work opportunities are available.

## UI cuts ag, other programs

MOSCOW (AP) — The University of Idaho has reduced programs in its College of Agriculture and eliminated four vacant faculty positions.

Operating expenses for the college's research and extension divisions will be reduced by 10 percent — a total of \$390,000.

The cuts were necessary because of about a 5 percent reduction in the federal money going to research and extension, Larry A. Branan, acting dean of the College of Agriculture, said Wednesday.

"The biggest impact is that there are going to be fewer programs that

we'll be able to offer because of the cutbacks," Branan said.

No county extension offices will be closed, but county positions will be lost. In Clearwater County, the extension agent's position was abolished, as were the home economist positions in Elmore and Ada counties.

Clearwater County is not the only county in the state without a county agent, and two counties have neither home economists or county agents.

All crop research will be eliminated at the Caldwell research and extension center, but it will become the focus of extension efforts for that area.

# Evans: Examine cattle exports

BOISE (AP) — Despite problems found by a private-sector task force, Gov. John Evans has directed the Idaho Department of Agriculture to begin investigating the possibility of exporting, rather than slaughtering, cattle from dairymen going out of business under the whole-herd dairy buy-out program.

Acceding to the federal government of misbanding the buyout program to date, Evans said in a statement on Thursday export of the cows was the way to ease the program's impact on the cattle industry.

He ordered state officials "to research the export of Idaho dairy cattle, and to assist farmers wherever possible with the international sale of their herds."

The buyout program, pushed for by the industry and ultimately backed by Congress and the Reagan administration, is intended to ease the multibillion-dollar milk surplus in America by reducing the nation's herd and cutting back annual production.

The plan contemplated orderly marketing of the liquidated herds over the next 18 months so livestock prices would not be unacceptably depressed. But the Democratic chief executive joined others in both parties in claiming USDA tried to push two-thirds of the dairy beef onto the market this spring and summer.

Because of the devastating effect that might have on livestock prices, the cattle industry obtained a federal court order last week ordering USDA to revamp its handling of the buyout to lessen the impact on markets.

Earlier this spring, a special task force of Idaho agriculture industry officials released a report on the prospects for exporting rather than slaughtering dairy buy-out cows. It found that chances for any major export deals being made in the coming year were slim for a number of reasons, including the fact that the cattle being liquidated in Idaho and elsewhere under the program is not of the quality foreign buyers are seeking.

That task force, however, set up a service to help put Idaho dairymen in touch with potential buyers and experienced livestock brokers to facilitate any possibility of export sales. Evans said the state Agriculture Department would be providing a similar service.

# Congressman appeals rules on farm labor

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, says he's appealing U.S. Department of Labor policies that could force Idaho farmers to pay alien farm workers \$4.75 per hour plus housing and other benefits.

"Idaho farmers simply cannot afford this additional outlay," said Stallings, on Thursday.

At the request of the Idaho Food Producers and the Snake River Farmer Association, Stallings asked reconsideration of plans involving the H-2 program, it allows farmers to hire aliens for farm work if domestic workers cannot be recruited.

"The entire Idaho and Montana congressional delegations question several of the department's current assumptions and procedures driving the H-2 program," said Stallings. "These questions have not been satisfactorily addressed. In particular, the automatic assumption that employment of alien workers always results in an adverse effect is highly questionable," he said.

# Prison OK'd by court

BOISE (AP) — Unless there's clear proof the action was wrong, an appeals court should not change a criminal sentence handed down by a judge, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

The court on Thursday upheld the 15-year prison term ordered for Robert L. Hendricks for rape and committing an infamous crime against nature, in a Kootenai County case.

On appeal, Hendricks argued that the sentence was excessive, because he had no previous criminal record and generally good character.

But the court noted that the sentence was within the legal limits, because Hendricks could have been sentenced to life in prison. "Unless there's a clear abuse of discretion, if a judge sentences a defendant within legal limits, the sentence will not be overturned," the court said.

# Group favoring right-to-work polling candidates on positions

BOISE (AP) — Contending voters have a right to know where candidates stand or refuse to stand: the Idaho Freedom to Work Committee is polling candidates in statewide and legislative races on their position on the controversial new right-to-work law.

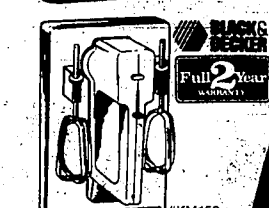
"Undoubtedly, Idaho's right-to-work law will continue to be a major topic of discussion and concern in our state in the coming months," Committee Co-chairman Terry McKnight said in the survey letter to candidates. "Now more than ever, Idahoans need to be fully informed where candidates for public office stand on this issue."

It is the fifth straight election campaign that the committee has conducted the poll on the views of potential officeholders toward the ban on compulsory union membership.

This year, however, the issue will be on the November ballot in a referendum of the Legislature's 1985 adoption of the ban over the veto of Democratic Gov. John Evans.

The Freedom to Work Committee is asking each candidate if he would oppose any attempt to repeal or weaken the law should voters agree to keep it on the books.

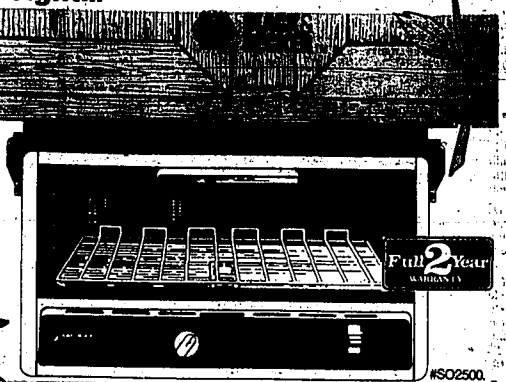

## Scientist says volcano will erupt in a few days

VANCOUVER Wash. (AP) — Earthquake activity at Mount St. Helens has increased, and a scientist on Thursday said a dome-building eruption is likely in the next few days.

It is expected to be a quiet eruption in which lava is added to the dome in the crater, but U.S. Geological Survey geologist Steve Brantley said an explosive eruption is possible.

Hazards would be confined to the crater or flanks of the volcano, although there is the possibility of a mudflow from melting snow into the North Fork of the Toutle River, Brantley said.

An explosion could carry ash to populated areas, he said. Increased earthquake activity at the volcano, overnight, led the Cascades Volcano Observatory to move up its prediction for an eruption from three weeks to within a week.

Because cloudy weather has kept scientists from visiting the crater since April 28, they can't say whether an eruption has begun. The

scientists were trying to get into the crater Thursday.

Emergency agencies were notified of the activity at the volcano and advised to be prepared for the possibility of an explosive blast or mudflow if snow in the crater melts.

Past dome-building eruptions have left a mound 800 feet high and 3,000 feet in diameter. It is about 200 feet taller than the Spine Needle, the biggest than the Kingdome in Seattle.

On Wednesday, Brantley said initial signs pointed to an event similar to an eruption on March 19, 1980, when dome growth followed an explosion that sent gas and ash soaring to 45,000 feet above sea level from the south side of the steaming, mound of jagged rock.

Pumice also was ejected in that blast, which lasted a few minutes and melted enough snow to produce the largest mudflow from the volcano since the May 18, 1980, eruption that left 57 people dead or missing and devastated a 230-square-mile area east and northeast of the peak.

## Officers seize drug suspects

SPOKANE (AP) — At least 13 people were arrested on drug charges today as part of a coordinated operation by local state and federal authorities, officials said.

U.S. Attorney John E. Lamp said all those arrested were indicted Wednesday by a federal grand jury. He called the operation the largest of its kind in Eastern Washington history.

The majority, but not all of the defendants arrested today, were charged with conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute and

distribution of cocaine," Lamp said. Officers executed five search warrants and seized personal and real property valued at more than \$300,000, Lamp said.

Exact charges against all the defendants are contained in the indictments, which will remain sealed until the defendants are arraigned Friday, he said.

Lamp would not comment on the exact number of people indicted, but said it was significantly more than the 13 Spokane residents arrested as of mid-day.

## 'Night Stalker' defendant brags about killing women

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The drifter accused of the 'Night Stalker' serial murders bragged that he enjoyed killing and gouged out a woman's eyes when she refused to give him money, according to testimony unsealed Thursday.

"I love to kill people. I love watching them die," Sheriff's Deputy Jim Ellis quoted Richard Ramirez as saying. "I would shoot them in the head and they would wiggle and squirm all over the place and then just stop or cut them with a knife and watch their face turn real white. I love all that blood."

Ramirez, who faces trial on 14 murder counts in Los Angeles County, also bragged that he was an uncatchable "supercriminal" who had killed 20 people in California, according to Ellis, who was assigned to guard him in jail.

"One time I told this lady to give me all her money. She said no. So I cut her hand, pulled her eyes out," Ramirez was quoted as telling Ellis on Oct. 10.

"Night Stalker" victim Maxine Zazzara, 44, slain with her husband March 29, 1980, in their Whittier home, had her eyes cut out, Sheriff's Deputy Russell "Loth" testified at Ramirez's preliminary hearing in March.

It was the second straight day of sensational revelations in the case. On Wednesday, secret transcripts were released quoting Ramirez as saying "Of course I did it," and linking Salan to the string of slayings, rapes and beatings. Ramirez's attorneys denied their client made the statements.

Ramirez, originally from El Paso, Texas, is to be arraigned May 21. He was arrested last Aug. 31. Police Officer George Thomas testified he took notes while sitting with the handcuffed Ramirez in an interview room at the Holtenbeck police station.

"Hey, I want a gun to play with. Can you imagine the people caught in me and not the police?" Ramirez then hummed a portion of the song "Night Prowler" by the heavy metal rock band AC-DC and banged his head on a table several times as Thomas watched and took notes, the officer said.

The body includes the lines, "Wag that 'n' noise outside the window? What's that shadow on the blind?"

## Man, 88, gets 50-year term

GREAT FALLS, Mont. (AP) — An 88-year-old Billings man convicted of soliciting to murder and kidnap a Great Falls doctor was sentenced Thursday to 50 years in prison with no possibility for parole.

Robert E. Morse was convicted March 11 on the solicitation charge. In handing down the sentence, District Judge Joel Roth said Morse's crime record was "eight pages long, dating back to 1921; and that Morse had spent more than 40 years of his life in prison."

Roth also denied Morse's petition for a new trial, but agreed to a request for a new attorney.

At the time of the two men's arrest, authorities said the suspects planned to kidnap the McGregors, extort a ransom from the McGregors' relatives for \$1 million to \$2 million, murder the doctor and his wife, cut up the bodies and dump them in the Missouri River.

## Regional sale now favored

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — The Reagan administration now favors the sale of federal power marketing agencies such as the Bonneville Power Administration to regional interests, U.S. Department of Energy officials say.

"Right now, we think a good objective is to have regional control," said Donna Fitzpatrick, the department's assistant secretary for conservation and renewable energy.

In a Washington interview with The Oregonian, Ms. Fitzpatrick indicated Wednesday that the 1980 sales target called for in President Reagan's 1987 budget proposal is unrealistic. The divestiture was proposed as a means of reducing the federal budget deficit.

She didn't entirely rule out the sale of government-owned power units to interests outside the regions in which they are located, however. She said a more extensive study of the sales proposal might recommend no sale at all.

# Utah plane crash kills all six aboard

PRICE, Utah (AP) — Crews worked Thursday to recover the bodies of six people killed when the twin-engine plane they were flying from Colorado to Utah crashed on a rugged, snow-covered mountain slope near here.

"All of them are dead," said Jim Robertson, chief deputy at the Carbon County Sheriff's Department. "We are attempting to get them out by helicopter."

He said wreckage of the aircraft, missing since Wednesday morning, was spotted by a deputy in a helicopter. The plane, owned by Kaiser Coal Co., carried three company officials and three people from the Holly Sugar Co., who were to tour Kaiser's coal mine at Price, Kaiser spokesman Jeff Desautels said.

Robertson said the wreckage was spotted near the 8,000-foot level near Goose Neck Ridge about six miles east of East Carbon City and some 24 miles east of Price.

Greg Felth, investigator in charge at the National Transportation Safety Board field office in Denver, said officials had not determined what caused the crash. However, he said there were reports of snow showers in the area at the time the plane was reported missing.

# New anti-rape spray looks to be a stinker

BILLINGS, Mont. (AP) — Animal control officials here have found a smelly way to turn a dime — selling skunk scent to a business manufacturing an anti-rape spray.

"It's just like recycling 'soda cans,'" says Dave Paul, director of the Billings Animal Shelter. "It takes a lot of 'em (to make money), but you're throwing them away anyway."

Paul, who is encouraging other animal shelters to follow his lead, said a firm called Skunks Unlimited in Wisconsin buys the scent for \$5 to \$8 per ounce. An average skunk contained from 1 to 1 1/2 ounces of scent.

Paul said using skunk scent in anti-rape sprays also has an extra advantage: "Not only will it sting the eyes, but you can pick the guy out of a crowd."

Money made from the sale of skunk scent will be used to buy equipment for the shelter, he said. So far this year, the shelter has shipped off just one bottle of scent that Paul expects will net about \$60.

May and June are the busiest months for picking up dead skunks, Paul said, as the furry black-and-white beasts begin coming out of their winter dens. Last year, 40 skunks were acquired by the Billings shelter during those months.

The shelter only picks up skunks killed by cars or caught in cat traps that are rented to local residents.

# Stolen baby is found alive; suspect arrested

DENVER (AP) — A newborn baby was taken because someone simply wanted a child of her own.

"It's very important for the mother to know how the baby's doing," Frohm told reporters at a hospital news conference at 11 a.m. only 1 1/2 hours before the baby was found alive. "As long as I know that, it's easier to get through this."

Frohm had focused on questioning women known to have taken a child recently, through death, abortion or miscarriage.

Frohm said she had decided that seemed to be a likely motive. "If she has lost her baby, she has to know what this is like for me," Frohm told reporters at the news conference. "It's just that I can't understand her actions. I can't comprehend her reasons for doing this."

The FBI entered the case Wednesday, alerting authorities in Utah, New Mexico and Wyoming to watch for the missing infant. Her photo had been widely publicized.

## Jerome voters approve school override levy

JEROME — With three times as many voters turning out Thursday as cast ballots in last year's supplemental levy election in the Jerome School District, the requested \$205,000 levy carried by a 62 percent margin.

Charles Carrell, Jerome School District clerk, said election returns showed 854 for and 524 against the levy request. He said the turnout was unusually heavy, requiring nearly two hours for election officials to tally the ballots. Passage required only a simple majority.

Voters in American Falls and Blackfoot also overwhelmingly approved property tax increases that school officials say are needed to head off major cutbacks next year.

In Blackfoot, about 71 percent of the 2,012 people voting approved a \$975,000 property tax hike, the largest being decided Thursday.

Seventy-eight percent of the 1,040 people voting in American Falls approved the tax increase.

Jerome School Board Chairman Nancy Churchman said board members were

delighted with the results.

"We are thrilled. We want to express our appreciation to the many people who showed the support of our schools and students by approving the override levy," she said.

"We announced the items to be covered by the supplemental revenue and that's exactly how it will be budgeted and spent," she added.

Churchman said the 1985 supplemental levy election in Jerome attracted only about 400 voters and passed by 60 percent.

"The district labeled the levy essential to maintain existing programs and staff, say-

ing without it the district would have been hard-pressed to maintain the present quality of education in Jerome.

Churchman said apparently the issue of a full-time athletic director in the system did not hamper passage of the override levy.

"It's hard to say what effect it had," she said. "But we had some very positive meetings to explain the situation to the public and the athletic director and coaches joined us in that effort. I'm sure that helped a lot."

A public delegation had asked the board to expand the levy to cover the full-time salary

of high school athletic director Jon Jund. The board reduced Jund's athletic director duties. Jund resigned and assigned the remainder of his time to classroom teaching. The board declined to reverse the decision and Jund has since resigned.

The additional \$205,000 will allow the district to go ahead with its budget for the coming year, Churchman said. The funds will be used for Jund's material and equipment at all grade levels of the district. It also helps the district overcome part of a three-year-old \$400,000 fund deficit and to continue extra-curricular programs.

## Faulty tire case ruling challenged

Jerry and Nadine Vannoy had filed a claim Sept. 28, 1982, in 5th District Court against Unroyal Tire Inc. of Middlebury, Conn., and other manufacturers. Jerry Vannoy was severely injured when a tire exploded as he attempted to mount it on a rim, according to the claim.

On Feb. 11, 1984, a jury ruled the tire defective and "unreasonably dangerous" when manufactured. The jurors found the company 90 percent responsible for the incident and Vannoy 10 percent responsible, according to court records. The jury awarded the couple a

total of \$299,583. The amount later was reduced by a judge.

The Idaho Supreme Court later granted the company's appeal, which included a request for a new trial.

The Vannoys asked for a re-hearing of the case, which was what the justices heard Wednesday.

The main issue was the tire company's unsuccessful attempt at trial to place the names of the rim and mounting machine manufacturer on the verdict form, though they no longer were defendants. In the action, The Idaho Supreme Court had ruled a jury could consider the responsibility of all parties, even those which previously settled with the plaintiffs.

Twin Falls attorney Ken Pederson, representing the Vannoys, asked the court to reconsider. His clients had alleged strict product liability in the case, meaning the product was dangerous when it was manufactured by the company in 1969. Their evidence showed that if the product was made correctly, the accident would not have occurred, he added.

Although their own expert admitted the rim

and mounting machine were defective and partly a cause of the accident, the judge was right to keep the manufacturers' names off the jury form, Pederson said. No substantial evidence had been presented about the other products, for example, when they were manufactured.

His case for the Vannoys would have been thrown out if he hadn't proven when the tire was manufactured, he added.

As the decision stands, juries may consider the actions of individuals only connected by cause, Pederson said. "The result will be a 'washing out' of negligence because the more people on the jury verdict form, the bigger the risk and juries will place a greater amount of responsibility for an accident on the plaintiff than on the person he is suing."

This spreading of guilt "strikes terror in your heart... if you are representing a plaintiff," Pederson said.

Tom High of Twin Falls, the company's attorney, countered that individuals involved in an accident should be included, even though

## Farmers' loans, delinquency rates climb, says FmHA

BOISE — The U.S. Farmers Home Administration is sending out money faster than in 1985, Idaho Director Bill Norberg reports.

Delinquency rates also are wrapping up last year's rate as farmers wrap up their financing plans for the growing season.

The Idaho FmHA office loaned \$49.2 million to farmers during the first seven months of its fiscal year, almost 22 percent more than in the same period of 1985, Norberg announced.

About \$26.2 million went to farmers and ranchers directly in operating loans, which they use to raise crop and money spent in direct operating loans. The FmHA's most popular program — legged about 15 percent behind last year's performance. The federal government originally had allocated \$17.4 million to Idaho for operating loans.

Meanwhile, loan guarantees, which back operating loans from private lenders, had amounted to \$8.6 million on April 30, far ahead of the \$1.5 million issued during all of 1985. The FmHA is emphasizing the guarantees because of limited national funding for direct loans, Norberg said.

Together, the two programs for operating loans stand at \$34.2 million, 7.9 percent ahead of the same point in 1985.

The FmHA's latest figures show a significant increase in the size of loans being made for growing crops. So far, 487 Idaho farmers have received an average of \$53,500 from FmHA in direct loans. The average loan is up \$1,200 from last year and 69 percent higher than five years ago.

At the same time, fewer farmers have received loans than the 690 served by April 30 last year.

While Idaho's office has been lending more money overall, the proportion of delinquent borrowers is rising markedly, Norberg said in an interview.

"We're still in a difficult situation," he said. As of April 16, 51.8 percent of the FmHA's 4,069 borrowers in Idaho were delinquent on their loan payments. That was 10.4 percent more than in April 1985.

In south-central Idaho, which contains almost 40 percent of the agency's borrowers, federal figures

showed 50.1 percent of 1,613 borrowers to be behind in payments.

The northern part of the state had the lowest delinquency rate, 40.2 percent, and the southern part of the state had the highest at 54.9 percent. In eastern Idaho, 54.8 percent of the loans were delinquent.

Attempting to collect some of its long-overdue debts, the FmHA now has issued 329 warnings to borrowers who are delinquent more than three years or who have illegally sold collateral pledged against FmHA loans. Norberg said the agency is being watchful that the FmHA will start "adversive action," which can lead to foreclosure, if they don't pay up, he said.

Numbers of applications still are awaiting action. The state office has 139 applicants for direct operating loans and another 34 for guaranteed loans. The backlog is 101 fewer than at the same time last year.

Some applications can't be processed because potato crops are not yet sold, Norberg said. "Under Farmers Home regulations, we can't do anything for them until they dispose of their crop," he said.

However, the office also is handling 132 farm ownership applications, which are not likely to be funded because no money is available nationally, Norberg said.

Another 183 farmers are asking for emergency loans. A technically ill that program has delayed — and may prevent — some farmers from obtaining a loan and an engaged Idaho's congressional delegation.

The technically revolves around the definition of a "family farm." Norberg said, although the FmHA once offered an unreviewable policy on the permissible size of a family farm, top officials withdrew the policy. Now each local FmHA county committee must devise its own definition, he said.

Norberg also said Idaho has received \$165,100 from Washington for overtime to speed loan processing. The Idaho office also has hired 21 workers temporarily to aid in screening applications.

Norberg recently was attacked by a group of Idaho farm groups, which claimed the Idaho office has been insensitive to borrowers and slow to process applications. In letters to the state's congressmen, the Western Borrowers Association of Shoshone sought Norberg's resignation.

## GOP hopefuls show stances

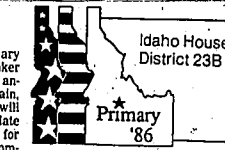

TWIN FALLS — In the primary election for the seat House Speaker Tom Stivers gave up when he announced he would not run again, voters in Twin Falls County will have to choose among a candidate who favors better state funding for education and supports more computer education, another who says the way to boost the state economy is to better fund schools, and a third who says the state should nurture economic growth before increasing school funding.

Respectively, those candidates are Rep. Jeff Stoker, R-Twin Falls, a one-term incumbent from the eight-county florial district; Bert Remaley, a retired Methodist minister from Twin Falls; and Celia Folsking, a rancher from Buhl.

The three Republican candidates for the District 23B seat in the Idaho House staked out their positions on education funding and taxation at a Thursday noon forum sponsored by the Sawtooth Press Club.

Stoker said his frustration with the legislature's approach to education funding was the main reason he decided to run for re-election. He said that the state should invest in education despite the slack economy. He also said the state needs to teach students to use computers or they will be "functionally



illiterate" in years to come.

Remaley said people are willing to pay more for education.

"I think people will pay for a good product that they want," he said. "Because Idaho schools are underfunded, teachers like one of his sons are able to take jobs in neighboring states for as much as \$9,000 per year more than they are paid in Idaho."

Folsking said that she is a strong supporter of education, but does not want to raise taxes.

"I realize that we want to do a better job with education... I also know that the key to that is the Idaho economy," she said. "By making Idaho a more salable product, new business such as an Anheuser-Busch bottling plant that bypassed southern Idaho for a Colorado location could increase the tax base and provide the needed funds for schools," she said.

On taxes, Stoker said he has voted in favor of local option taxation to give cities and counties the chance to raise money for roads and schools.

He said he doubts the sales tax will go beyond five cents, but expects income and cigarette taxes may be increased.

Remaley said the tax structure needs to be reformed by closing loopholes and making the recent temporary 1-cent sales tax increase permanent.

The Legislature's failure to raise more tax dollars has caused local property taxes to increase in recent years, beyond that he said he would have to study the issue.

Folsking said she opposes local option taxation because it would create a patchwork of taxing districts across the state. She said taxes ought to be collected locally as much as possible, but that some tax money has to be collected statewide.

Asked if they supported tuition tax credits for parents sending their children to private schools, Folsking said she did, and Stoker and Remaley said they opposed them.

Stoker said everyone should support schools because public schools benefit everyone. Folsking said that families sending their children to private schools ought to be given a break.

In the only thing like fireworks at the gathering, Remaley said the current legislative leadership has wrapped the state in a cocoon of yesterday's politics and yesterday's dreams.

I'm sorry I didn't save it, but I never dreamed I'd need it.

DEAR B.: The piece is from my booklet, "What's Every Teen-ager Ought to Know." Many junior and senior high school teachers would say that they had read it aloud to their students.

HOW TO GET PREGNANT One of the questions I have been asked often by teens is: "How far can I go without getting pregnant?"

That is not a dumb question. It's a very intelligent one. A lot of kids get aroused by just lying close to each other while kissing. Then they just naturally proceed to the next step, which is putting.

Sometimes they remove some of their clothing because it's "in the way," or they burrow underneath it to explore each other's bodies with their hands. This is known as heavy petting, or "doing everything else but."

The technical (and legal) definition of sexual intercourse is "penetration." (The male's sex organ must penetrate the female's.) However, as impossible as it may sound, in the medical literature can be found cases where there has been no penetration — the girl remained a virgin, but after engaging in heavy petting, she found herself pregnant. Women's wedding rate down

WASHINGTON (AP) — The marriage rate for eligible young women has dropped to the lowest level ever recorded, new government statistics disclosed Wednesday.

The marriage rate for single women aged 15 to 44 was 99.3 weddings per 1,000 women in 1983, the first time that measure has dipped below the 100 mark, according to the new report from the National Center for Health Statistics.

The report, the most recent complete marriage statistics available, showed a decline in total marriages from the record level of 1992. There were 4.6 class valedictorians elected in 1983, down 10.674 from the year before.

The total number of marriages in the United States has managed to maintain high levels in recent years

despite declining marriage rates, because the maturing of the boom post-war "War II" Baby Boom generation increased the number of people in the most common marriage ages.

"The pool of people eligible for marriage had continued to expand and was keeping the number of marriages high, but more and more women eligible to marry were not doing so," the new study reported.

Marriage rates are calculated in three fashions — per 1,000 people; per 1,000 women aged 15 and over and per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44.

The basic marriage rate are calculated for women because those statistics have proven to be more accurate than figures for men, Barbara Foley Wilson of the Statistics Center explained.

# Third district expected to dominate classic

**TWIN FALLS** — If last week's forms hold true, no one east of Mountain Home will take the top in first place in this week's Twin Falls Track and Field Classic.

The meet, the best regular season event of the year and perhaps even the strongest with 14 of the state's largest schools participating, will begin with some field events at 11 a.m. Saturday at Bruin Stadium along with whatever running preliminaries are needed. The final round of field events will begin at 12:30 p.m. with the running finals slated for 2 p.m.

This one pits the nine members of the Gem State Conference against

the five schools that currently remain in the Southern Idaho Conference in the Boise area.

The two alignments ran off their conference finals last week, qualifying the top eight in each event and all relays for this week's Twin Falls Classic.

On that basis, the Gem State troopers don't match up that well on paper. The SIC teams, with Meridian winning both girls and boys division, hammered down some records during an evening meet that was blessed with good weather. The Gem State Conference, won by Highland on both counts, had warm enough temperatures but all races finished

into rather a brisk wind and doubtfully held up times.

But not even the wind could account for the differences in some of the races. If the SIC's times are as accurate as expected.

For instance, Borah, although disqualified for making the billion exchange in the acceleration zone, turned a 1:28 time in the 800 relay and 3:22.9 in the 1600. In the 400, Borah had a 42.7 and the medley went to Nampa in 3:41.5. None of the Gem State boys' times approximated those. The difference was about as glaring in the girls division.

In the boys division, the only Gem State leader is Skyline discus

thrower John Hall at 164 with Twin Falls' Steve Chapman second at 152.

There doesn't seem anyone capable of handling Meridian's Jim Walte in the short-sprints or the long jump, where he is fourth in the nation. Borah's Thayne Chaumell pulled off a 48.5 against 51.9 for Meridian's Nikko Gordon.

Minico's Scott Halverson could contend in the high hurdles, his 15.6 against the wind compared to Meridian's Jeffries 51.1. In the intermediate, Halverson is only eight-tenths of a second away. Robin Carl, Capital, the state cross country champion, is the 3200-meter favorite against Highland's Robb Rene. Rene

also will drop from the 800 to the 400 this meet under dispensation from Twin Falls Coach Duane Stands.

Twin Falls junior Gabe Ostyn just missed a record at 6-6 1/2 last week but that leaves him behind Boise's Jeff Sanor who went 6-10.

In the girls division, Twin Falls sends sophomore Jenny Hannah out in the 800 and 1600 looking to continue her undefeated ways. But Capital replies with Trina Henrie, a sophomore, who clocked a 2:78 last week against Hannah's Gem State record of 2:22. In the longer event, Hannah logged 9:32.9 against a 5:14.5 by Shaun Sintay of Borah; the only person who have beaten the Twin

Falls sophomore in the mile this year.

The sprints will match Pocatello's quick-starting Yolanda Frazier against Meridian's Donna Swindell. Swindell had a 10.2 100 and 25.2. Frazier last week while Frazier had the wind problem. Twin Falls' junior Eva Talambent will not compete, currently wearing a leg cast for a shin problem. The cast will come off Monday and there is hope she'll be available for regional meet Friday.

Jenny Jacquot of Mountain Home gives the Tigers the favorite in the long jump at 18-2 and 100 hurdles at 15.2. Mountain Home also could easily go one-two in the high jump.

# Lakers silence Mavericks' fans, move up in playoffs

**DALLAS (AP)** — The defending world champion Los Angeles Lakers silenced the talkative Dallas Mavericks on Thursday night by bouncing them out of the NBA playoffs.

Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Earvin Johnson, the Lakers' prime-time performers, led Los Angeles to a 120-107 victory and a spot in the NBA Western Conference finals.

"Dallas is history now and we didn't have to boast to do it," said Lakers Coach Pat Riley. "That's one of the strengths of this team."

Riley said: "We were geared up and ready to play. We had been through some adverse situations."

Dallas Coach Dick Motta had dragged the Mavs should have led 3-1 in the series.

"Dick did what he had to do to tighten the screws and there's no ill feeling," said Riley. "I just didn't want to get caught up in a war of words. We're the winners."

Abdul-Jabbar was hit with a cup of ice while he was leaving the floor.

An Iraate Abdul-Jabbar jabbed the quiet Dallas fans in the fourth period saying "I was wondering where they were. They didn't have much to say then, did they?"

Dallas' Mark Aguirre missed most of the fourth period with a twisted

ankle and said, "I would have loved to have been in there. I just couldn't move."

He said losing to the Lakers like Dallas did "leaves a scar. We just couldn't get going."

Motta said "The Lakers deserved it. They just played better, that's all."

He added, "We lost to a great team. We deserved to be on the floor with them."

Asked about Aguirre's injury, Motta said "We were on a roll when he got hurt, but that's not the reason we lost. We lost because the Lakers played good and they had to beat us."

The Lakers are attempting to become the first team in 17 years to successfully defend their title.

Abdul-Jabbar had 27 points to lead the Lakers.

The Lakers took the bitter best-of-7 series and will play the winner of the Houston-Denver series for the Western Conference title.

The Lakers built a 73-53 lead early in the third period, then had to beat back a Maverick rally that narrowed the deficit to 91-89 early in the fourth period.

Aguirre, who injured an ankle and missed most of the fourth period,

had 14 of his 28 points in the third period.

Dallas' Rolando Blackman scored 12 straight points at the start of the fourth period but James Worthy and Johnson got the Laker offense into gear. Blackman finished with 23.

Worthy had 21 points and Johnson added 21, including 13 in the fourth period. Johnson made nine free throws in the quarter.

The Lakers were called "clowns" by Dallas General Manager Norm Sonju before the game, but the intense defending champions took control from the start.

Abdul-Jabbar scored the last three baskets of the first half on a dunk's skyhook, and a 20-foot set shot to hand the Lakers a huge 69-51 halftime lead over the cold-shooting Mavericks.

Dallas got the opening basket from Aguirre but never led again.

The 39-year-old Abdul-Jabbar, playing in a record 175th playoff game, scored 11 points in the second period as the Lakers devastated Dallas with a 23-9 run to end the half.

Los Angeles shot 62 per cent from the field in the first half (14 of 22) and 57 per cent from the field in the second half (14 of 24).

# Seattle shifts managers

**SEATTLE (AP)** — The slumping Seattle Mariners fired Manager Chuck Cottler on Thursday, naming coach Marly Martinez as interim manager. But the Associated Press learned that Dick Williams will be named manager shortly.

Mariners President Chuck Armstrong announced the firing, saying the team's sixth-place standing in the American League West "is far below our expectations."

The Mariners, who had hoped to contend this season, are 9-19 after losing eight of their last 10 games.

The team said a decision on hiring a new manager would be made in the next few days, and would not comment on whether Williams would get the job.

A source who spoke on condition he not be identified told The Associated Press earlier Thursday that Cottler called a Mariners' clubhouse attendant and told him to clean out his locker because he had been fired and was being replaced by Williams.

Williams quit, earlier this year as manager of the San Diego Padres. Neither Cottler nor Williams could be reached for immediate comment.

"This is the toughest baseball decision I have ever had to make," Armstrong said. "I have

a great deal of respect for Chuck as a manager and a person."

Asked if he was denying Williams had been hired, Porter said, "As far as I know, we

## Penelope Reedy: Redneck literature champ

### Camas Prairie grabbed writer

FAIRFIELD — If your vision of a "writers group" includes anything to do with a Greenwich Village cafe, fee house peopled by Eastern sorts, then meeting Penelope Reedy would put you through some astounding psychological twists.

Camas County farmwife, writer and publisher of the "Redneck Review of Literature," Reedy calls herself "dictator" of the loosely knit Camas Writers' Workshop. She is also a spokesman for all who appreciate Western-oriented literature.

She is dead set against the belief that "culture" can only be found east of the Mississippi or in university settings. She didn't learn that by accident; rather, she spent five years in New York City "searching for culture — thinking it's not where you're at."

After growing up in western Washington state, she made her move to the Big Apple, where she attended classes first at New York University, then at the Brooklyn College. She also worked for Lutheran Churches of America and did some off-Broadway play reviewing. But she never became "Eastern."

"It's difficult being a Western person on the East Coast," she says. "The concept of space is different. The language is different. I spent so much time trying to break through and explain myself, but without any tips to work with."

"It's being here," she says of Idaho. Her transition to Camas County from New York City was a natural one. Reedy's grandparents, Frank and Louella Croner, had homesteaded on the prairie in 1910. And, it was a visit by Reedy that returned her to the West permanently.

"She explains that return and her early vision of Jim Reedy, her husband, in the preface of the current issue of "Redneck":  
"One day, when I was 23 years old and visiting the Prairie for the summer, colors came crashing in on me, forcing me to see as I have never seen before. I stayed on because of what happened in the hills in autumn, on a day warm with yellow Quakes, the sun high overhead, cattle bawling and bawling each other. A corral bulged with beery red storting hulks. Sun-tanned men, every inch of flesh covered but face and hands, milled about stubbing a horse or two good by. "I'm him down," a cowboy said. A stubbing steve pawed the ground, his head lowered, eyeing every possible escape route. Two cowboys on horseback threw lassos and miss-

ed. Dust boiled up. My tongue tasted it, dry, slightly sweet, though one would expect it to taste of salt...

And that's when Jim bull-dogged the steer. The sun ricocheted off his silver buckle when he jumped off the fence into the corral. That's what I thought it was, rays of gleaming secondhand light teasing my pupils, striking hard at my face as a bystander might arouse a dazed man. The earth moved over a notch; muscles bulged and twisted; sun-tanned forearms became magnified in the glare. He set his feet in the shallow dirt and each hand grabbed a horn; the thick red neck twisted, loose puppy skin and coarse hair nodding like Jello as it thundered to the ground, heaving, wild-eyed, exhausted.

It was after that re-baptism in the West and her marriage that Reedy became an activist for Western-oriented literature. Her first move was founding the Camas Writers' Workshop with charter members Danell Wolf and Derrol Hupler, both farmers from the west end of Camas Prairie. Together, they pieced together the publication "The Camas," which was a tabloid that focused on the groundwater issue, a controversial topic that year.

In following years, that tabloid grew to book form, sporting the titles, "Sideroad," "Fairfield Tractor Company," "Operator's Manual," "The Plain Brown Wrapper," "Guns and Grammar," and finally, "The Redneck Review of Literature."

The "Redneck" name came from a flash of inspiration that struck Reedy while attending an Idaho Commission on the Arts session in Coeur d'Alene. "The conversation there was that—the provincial deadheads in Idaho don't understand literature," she says. "This denigration of Idahoans angered me, and I told them what we really needed was a Redneck Review of Literature."

"The juxtaposition of the words 'redneck' and 'literature' are actually a statement to our readers that defies the generalization that no Idaho farmer could actually enjoy or understand literature. Using "Redneck Review" is a challenge to the whole concept of the ignorant provincial, which is a myth."

The outspoken publisher adds, "There's a lot of thinking that goes on in a place like this. People on a tractor are concerned in philosophical thought, in fantasies, in dreams, in wishes. They would have said during conversations that day before. When I drive a swather or weave — no-brain activities — that's when my ideas come." To Reedy, those who work the soil

and lend the cattle have as much to say as anybody. And some of those people of the land find their way into publication in "Redneck." "What we're really committed to," she explains, "is not leaving the literature of the West up to English professors. "It's like music. When it's really fun it's when you're doing it as a group. When literature is concerned, you can practice it, write stories, share it and discover."  
Yet, Reedy is aware that you can't do it all from the outside. She is a past president of the local historical society, and has, for the past four years, been a member of the Association for the Humanities in Idaho. Of her seat on AHI and the position as a member of the local historical society, she says, "I'm not all that proud for grants; but I wanted to see it from the other side. "A lot of it is worthwhile, but I still have reservations about whether

government should be involved in such things. For me, it's a dilemma. But, it's no dilemma where "Redneck" is concerned. "We do all the printing ourselves. We are not in it to make money. We don't take advertising. All the money from selling it goes right back in to pay for supplies. We are not going to ask for a grant because, in a way, you sell your soul."  
Reedy says the Camas Writers' Workshop meets at the Club Cigar in Fairfield where they use the club's long bar to lay out the magazine, then print it on an offset press they keep in the county jail. Issue 11 of the annual book is currently out of that press, and is available by writing: Camas Writers' Workshop, P.O. Box 1085, Fairfield, ID 83327. Cost is \$5 per book plus 75¢ postage for up to two books, and an extra \$.75 for each book after two.

## A day in the life

### 200-plus photojournalists take a 24-hour snap of U.S.

DENVER — In the baroque, seven-tiered lobby of the Brown Palace Hotel, a photographer is taking a picture of a photographer taking a picture of a photographer taking a picture — and nobody finds this phenomenon the slightest bit unusual.  
It's the kind of thing you have to expect, after all, when professional photographers get together. And last week a star-studded team of 200-plus photojournalists from 27 countries got together on assignment for what is arguably the biggest photo opportunity in U.S. history: 24 hours in the life of America.

Last Friday the "shooters" — as the photographers like to call one another — fanned out from near to shining stars to some 200,000 frames of the land and people of the U.S.A. A team of editors will then call the best 200 or so, and the result — due in the bookstores next fall — will be published as a colorful, high-gloss coffee-table book to be titled "A Day in the Life of America."  
To construct this pointillist portrait of the nation, the photographers poked their lenses inside refrigerators and under boardwalks. They shot atop Mount McKinley and at the bottom of Grand Canyon. They focused on a missile silo in Minot, a Maharishi meditation in Kashmir, a tennis match in Tulsa, a KKK bash in Georgia and a dope bust in Miami.  
Canadian photographer Doug Kirkland shot the first frame of the 24-hour extravaganza at the first frame of dawn off Malibu. He then raced across the continent to catch the last glimmer of twilight as the sun drops west of Hawaii.

Manila, where photographer Larry Speiser was shooting pictures aboard Air Force One as it departed President Reagan toward Tokyo. This is the ground rules, the project's editors argue, because the president's plane is legally considered U.S. territory, wherever it may be.  
The three-shooters assigned to Washington were inside the Supreme Court with Warren Burger, outside the White House with Mitch Snyder and among tourists as the photograph of the Capitol — which is a myth.  
The \$5 million "photo up" is the most ambitious endeavor yet by the hyper-energetic young photographers and editors who have so far produced stunning pictorial books on "A Day in the Life of Australia" (1981), Hawaii (1983), Canada (1984) and Japan (1985).

The patriarch of the project is a 59-year-old New Yorker, a photographer who spent who dreamed up the general idea six years ago during an eight-month assignment photographing the Australian outback for National Geographic. Along with editor David Cohen, the organizational brains of the mission, and Spencer Reedy, a Newsweek reporter who is serving as managing editor, Smolan has spent most of the past year making plans for America's day on film.  
They recruited a blue-ribbon list of photojournalists that includes nine Pulitzer Prize winners and such luminaries as Carl Mydans, a member of the original Life magazine photo team, and Frank Johnston, three-time winner of the White House News Photographer's Photographer of the Year award.  
A smattering of amateurs is also taking part. Former Senate majority leader Howard Baker will be shooting the Kentucky horse country,

and Colorado Gov. Richard Lamm will be shot by camera around Denver.  
Although text plays a small role in the "Day in the Life" books, the editors are looking for a writer who can help capture the essence of America. Editor Reedy said he hopes to persuade Joel Garreau, author of "The Nine Nations of North America," to accept the assignment.  
In a media-soaked nation, of course, a big media project like this becomes a media event in its own right. And so the shooters will be accompanied on their assignments by camera crews from all three television networks and a PBS documentary team. "Sometime Friday evening, an NBC-TV cameraman will be shooting a Russian photographer Vladimir Sirov as he shoots the NBC News cameras shooting Tom Brokaw delivering the nightly news."

Smolan, a master of commercial tactics, has worked out an intricate network of corporate ties with companies willing to help out in return for a plug in the book and the right to use the pictures in promotions.  
United Air Lines, for example, is giving all the shooters free passage to their assignments. Hertz rental car will handle transport on the ground — and will also give \$3,000 to the photographer who comes back with the best picture that just happens to have a Hertz Rent-A-Car in it ("no rear seats, no muddy cars," the company has decreed).  
Kodak will process all 150 rolls of film — but only if the shooters use Kodak film. In return for setting up headquarters here in Denver, the project got free hotel rooms and a nearly endless string of parties from civic boosters.



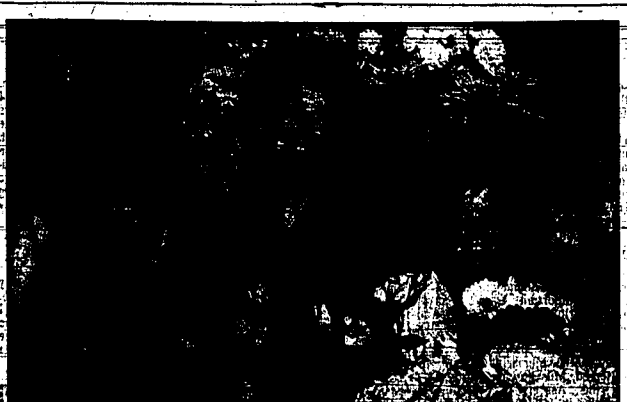

## Jackson renews deal with Pepsi

NEW YORK — In acknowledging what the Guinness Book of World Records has pronounced "the biggest commercial sponsorship deal" since a struck-between-a-corporation-and-a-performer, Michael Jackson made a brief appearance here Tuesday to renew his partnership with Pepsi-Cola and to say, simply, "Thank you."

As reported Monday by the Los Angeles Times, the contract is worth \$50 million, with an initial upfront payment to the singer of between \$10 million and \$15 million. Neither anyone in Jackson's entourage nor beverage company sources would specify the dollar amount.

With advertising underwriting, tax breaks for Jackson and promotional tie-ins with a possible international concert tour, the value of the deal will come to more than \$50 million, a close adviser to Jackson says.

The long-term agreement between the soft-drink company and the singer calls for Jackson to help create and appear in worldwide Pepsi ads, and for Pepsi to sponsor Jackson's next album and any accompanying concert tour.

In 1984, in an agreement that reportedly earned Jackson \$6 million, Pepsi sponsored the entertainer's hugely successful Victory

Tour, and the singer appeared, along with his five brothers, in two highly publicized and award-winning TV commercials on behalf of Pepsi. The lucrative deal resulted in "a whole new generation" image for Pepsi and "skyrocketing" sales, said Pepsi-Cola USA President Roger Enrico.

Formal announcement of the new agreement was made by Enrico and Frank Dileo, Jackson's personal manager, at a packed press conference at the Red Parrot nightclub on Manhattan's Upper West Side. The 27-year-old Jackson, wearing his signature sunglasses and military uniform, appeared with the two men for about five minutes, but refused to take questions from the press.

The photographers are to be paid a flat fee of \$500, but that's just the beginning. Each will also receive a barrel of corporate goodies ranging from Nikon hats, Waldebook's tote bags and Merrill-Lynch briefcases to Sony compact disk players and \$3,000 Macintosh computers from Apple, which is both a major sponsor of the project and one of the specified assignments on the long list the shooters will shoot.

For many, the project is also a chance to shoot pictures they have long dreamed of. Many of the American photographers asked to go back to their childhood hometowns for this assignment. French and Polish shooters, in contrast, fought hard to get out to the wild West and leke pictures of cowboys.

During the meetings and parties, though, many participants said the

best part of the job was just being a participant — being admitted to the stellar crew of professionals who are picked for a job like this.

The gathering had the feel of a slightly bohemian class reunion. Hour-after-hour, photojournalists who had last seen one another in a bar in Managua — or on last year's "Day in the Life" excursion to Japan — shook hands and started back in on conversations in interrupted months or years before.

What do shooters do when they meet together? They carouse some and complain some — about colorblind editors or overpriced cameras. But mainly they shoot: picture after picture of anything that happens to fall before the lens.

One of the prime photo subjects for all the shooters here was the grandfather of the "Day in the Life" team, Carl Mydans, the sprightly

septuagenarian from Time-Life who is legendary in the trade for his world-famous photo of Gen. Douglas MacArthur, comorb pipe in teeth, wading ashore at Luzon, in 1945. When Mydans was introduced at the group's initial meeting here, the entire assemblage burst into a loud, air-lectonate ovation.

Evoking Mydans' achievements, editor John Durnlak then delivered a pep talk to the assembled shooters. He started slowly, but built up to a socko finish: "Go out there and shoot the hell out of the country."

With a lusty roar, the "Day in the Life" shooters agreed to do just that.

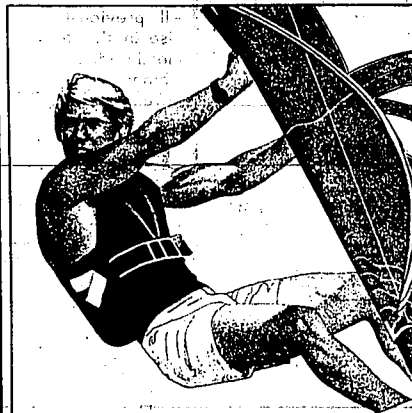

# 'Jo Jo Dancer' tops weekend box office

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Comedian Richard Pryor's semi-autobiographical movie "Jo Jo Dancer, Your Life Is Calling" topped the weekend box office while "Blue City," with Judd Nelson and Ally Sheedy, took second place.

The rest of the Top 10 films were largely holdovers from the past several weeks, languishing before summer releases on Memorial Day weekend.

"Jo Jo Dancer," delayed for editing before it was released, grossed \$4.9 million at 1,203 theaters. The Columbia release starring Pryor is about a comedian troubled by drug problems, and was originally scheduled for Christmas audiences.

"Blue City" largely hit by critics for casting nice-looking Nelson as a fearless avenger of his father's murder, placed a distant second, with the Paramount release pulling in \$2.7 million at 1,650 theaters.

Universal's "The Money Pit" dropped from second to third place, earning \$1.9 million at 1,105 theaters and boosting its six-week gross to \$27.9 million.

Another Universal release, "Legend," which topped the charts during its first two weeks, dropped to fourth place, bringing in only \$1.3 million at 1,050 theaters to push its three-week total to \$10.9 million.

"Police Academy 3" from Warner Bros. landed in fifth place, with a draw of \$1.5 million at 1,103 theaters. In its seven weeks in circulation, the film has grossed \$38.3 million.

New Line's "Critters" earned \$1.2 million at 595 screens to cross its sixth place and boost its four-week earnings total to \$6.5 million.

"Gung Ho" from Paramount took in \$1.1 million at 872 theaters. "Gung Ho" has earned \$51.3 million during the last seven weeks.

"Pretty in Pink" also from Paramount, earned \$1,041,813 at 864 screens, for an eighth place spot, with a cumulative gross of \$35.1 million for 10 weeks of release.

"Pretty" nipped Cannon's "Murphy's Law," which took in \$1,041,355 at 915 theaters. Columbia's "Violets Are Blue" finished off the Top 10 with \$877,790.

**OFF BEAT (PG)** A young dancer (Judge Reinhold) represents his friend, a New York City cop, at a police benefit auction, only to win the job and the attentions of an attractive policewoman (Meg Tilly). Also stars Cleavant Derricks and Harvey Keitel. Directed by Michael Dinner.

**9-1-1 WEEKS (R)** Sanitized for our protection and presented with full "Flashdance" fervor by that movie's director, Adrian Lyne, this emerges as a swooning silly cautionary tale about the bad (Mokey Rourke) and the beautiful (Kim Basinger) whose love affair lasts just that long. The S&M excesses and degradations of the novel are now represented by sexual tastes that might have surfaced after a night of watching "Bolero" on videocassette. An intent Rourke wears only one expression, mildly interested quizzicalness; Basinger is not only tremulous but touching, downright miraculous under the circumstances.

**POLICE ACADEMY 3: BACK IN TRAINING (PG)** No worse than

"Police Academy 2," which was not rancorous high jinks suggested by awful Steve Guttenberg and other recruits from the hilarious first film by John Hughes; it stars Molly Ringwald as a resourceful free spirit from becoming a victim of a budget crunch. (Just think, if they fail, there will not be a "Police Academy 4.")

**PRETTY IN PINK (PG-13)** This delightful comedy is one of those rare Hollywood youth films that winks, exploring feelings instead of caricaturing them.

# 2 old plays vie for Tony

NEW YORK (AP) — Two old plays, one of which was produced off-Broadway more than 20 years ago, were nominated Monday for Tony Awards as the best plays of the 1985-86 Broadway season.

"Blood Knot," by Athol Fugard, originally produced in South Africa 25 years ago and off-Broadway in 1964, and John Guare's "The House of Blue Leaves," first produced off-Broadway in 1974, will compete for best play against Michael Frayn's "Benefactors" and "I'm Not Rappaport" by Herb Gardner.

Plays are eligible for a best-play nomination if they have never been produced on Broadway. At a stormy meeting Thursday, the Tony Awards administration committee allowed "Blood Knot" and "The House of Blue Leaves" to compete as best play rather than in the revival category.

"The Mystery of Edwin Drood," a musical version of Charles Dickens' unfinished last novel, received the most nominations — 11 — including best musical. It will compete in that category against "Big Deal," "Song & Dance" and "Tango Argentino."

"Tango Argentino," a surprise success of the 1985-86 season, also scored with a collective best choreography nomination for its tango dancers, and a direction nomination for Claudio Segovia and Hector Orezzoli. Their competition: Bob Fosse, "Big Deal"; Wilford Leach, "The Mystery of Edwin Drood"; and Richard Malby Jr., "Song & Dance."

Hume Cronyn and his wife, Jessica Tandy, were nominated in the top acting categories for their portrayals of an aging British general and his wife-in-law in "The Petition." Cronyn's competition for best actor includes Ed Harris, "Frolic Some"; Judd Hirsch, "I'm Not Rappaport"; and Jack Lemmon in the controversial revival of Eugene O'Neill's "Long Day's Journey into Night."

Miss Tandy will compete for the best actress award against Rosemary Harris, "Play Fever"; Mary Beth Hurt, "Benefactors"; and Lily Tomlin in "The Search for Signs of Intelligent Life in the Universe."

George Rose, the ebullient master of ceremonies in "The Mystery of Edwin Drood," leads the best actor in a musical category and will go against Don Corcoran, "Singin' in the Rain"; Clancy Brown, "Big Deal"; and Maurice Hines, "Uptown ... It's Hot!"

One of "Drood's" leading ladies, Cleo Laine, was nominated as best actress in a musical. Also in that category are Bernadette Peters, "Song & Dance"; Debbie Allen, "Sweet Charity"; and Chita Rivera, "Jerry's Girls."

"The Mystery of Edwin Drood" also received multiple nominations in the featured actor and actress categories. Howard McGillin and John Herrera will compete against dancer Christopher d'Amboise of "Song & Dance" and Michael Rupert, the shy accountant in "Sweet Charity."

Patti Cohenour and Jana Schneider of "Drood" go against Bebe Neuwirth of "Sweet Charity" and Elisabeth Welch of the short-lived "Jerome Kern Goes to Hollywood."

# First top ratings spot in 30 years makes anniversary show special

By ANDREW J. EDELSTEIN

Now that NBC has been declared the Neilsen winner for the 1985-86 season — the first time in 30 years that NBC was No. 1 — the timing couldn't be better for the Peacock network to salute itself on its 60th anniversary.

On Monday, May 12, more than 100 stars will mark the occasion as highlights of those 60 years real out in quick-cut, clip-job fashion.

Among the stars participating is Sid Caesar, whose "Your Show of Shows" was one of NBC's most popular programs in the early 1950s. The shenanigans of Caesar, Imogene Coca, Howard Morris and Carl Reiner on the 90-minute live show made Americans stay home on Saturday nights — to the extent that Broadway theater owners complained that business was down whenever the show aired.

"There's a dimension of comedy that's missing today — and that's doing it live," says Caesar, 63. "A prop won't work, a sound effect might not work, someone would forget their lines, scenery will fall down — all these things could — and did — happen and that added an extra-dimension. People knew it could happen and it was an extra thing that they watched for. If you make a mistake, let the audience see it.

"We had no laugh track. What you saw is what you got and if something died and you didn't get a laugh, that was it, you went on to the next bit.

"We didn't need a laugh track to find out how big a laugh something should get," Caesar continues. "We had knock-down, drag-out fights about what we thought was funny. If an idea didn't work for me, we'd give it to Coca, if it didn't work for her, we'd give it to Carl because a good idea is too precious to throw away. It didn't matter whether I was funny or Carl was funny. The main thing was 'Is the show funny?'"

The twin pressures of doing a live show for 39 weeks as well as being a millionaire star at the age of 32 turned Caesar into a pill-popper and alcoholic and helped cut off his comedic career. He overcame his 20-year battle in 1978 and chronicled his tale in his 1983 book "Where Have I Been?" He is now working on a second book (a self-help tome), has completed a physical-fitness home video and will be hosting syndicated

episodes of "Your Show of Shows." Today's fine-tuned, market-researched TV business leaves Caesar cold.

For example, "The Admiral Broadway Revue," the show from which "Your Show of Shows" evolved, was proposed in 1949 at Manhattan's Roast Beef House at a lunch between Caesar, Broadway impresario Max Leibman and NBC vice president Sylvester "Pat" Weaver.

"Who knew from television?"

recalls Caesar. "Weaver said you have an hour-and-a-half, fill it up." In those days the network didn't know how to put a TV show together.

# Jean Rivers picked to host new network's late-night talk show

LOS ANGELES — Caustic comedian Joan Rivers said Tuesday she will lead the attack for Fox Broadcasting Co.'s new fourth network by serving as host of a live talk show that will compete with late-night king Johnny Carson.

Miss Rivers served as a substitute host for Carson's "The Tonight Show" on NBC for the past three years, and occasionally substituted on "Late Night With David Letterman." Her contract with NBC expires July 19, and the inaugural Fox Broadcasting Network show premieres in the fall.

"With all due respect to the Carson show and Letterman, there were certain people I couldn't get as guests because they felt it was not the right image for their shows. I had to fight to get David Lee Roth, Boy George, and Lily Tomlin," said Miss Rivers.

"I want to thank NBC a thousand times. I am grateful to NBC for the three years I had on 'The Tonight Show,' but they should thank me, too. My ratings were good. And they were better than the regular host."

Carson did not immediately return a call seeking comment.

Barry Diller, chairman of Fox Inc., said the company is just beginning to line up affiliates for its fourth network to compete with NBC, ABC and CBS, but plans to go ahead regardless of how many deals it makes.

"Our stations cover 22 percent of the country, and we're going to start broadcasting with that, even if no one else joins us," Diller said. "As far as we're concerned, we're not waiting for affiliate stations or advertisers."

Diller said Fox is committing more than \$100 million to the new satellite-delivered national program service and is willing to spend "years and years" to see it through.

In all, he said more than \$2 billion stands behind the new service, including the 20th Century Fox film studios and the former Metromedia stations purchased by Rupert Murdoch and consolidated under one management.

Prime-time programming will follow in March 1987, said Diller, who added the network would concentrate on late-night and prime-time shows.

Membership would be open only to independent stations, meaning Fox will not campaign for stations already affiliated with the three major networks.

Since Carson became host in October 1963, he has met and conquered such late-night opponents as Joey Bishop, Dick Cavett, David Frost and "ABC's Wide World of Entertainment."

The last major talk-show competition for Carson came with the syndicated "Thicke of the Night" in 1983. The program, which starred Canadian singer-comedian Alan Thicke and was produced by former NBC president Fred Silverman,

bombed in the ratings and lasted less than a year.

"From Fox's point of view, it's a home run," Silverman said. "She certainly has the experience and familiarity with late-night audiences."

Since 1983, Miss Rivers has been the sole guest host on NBC's "Tonight Show." She has two stints remaining on that contract, Fox said.

Miss Rivers said she talked by telephone to Grant Tinker, chairman of NBC, and to Brandon Tartikoff, president of NBC entertainment.

"I called Johnny Carson twice, but he would not take my call," she said.

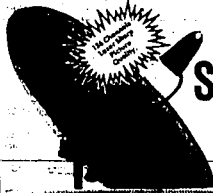

NBC comedy wraps up the week

NEW YORK — NBC won last week's ratings race with its four Thursday comedies finishing in the Top Five, and all three networks placed Sunday night movies in the Top 20 in the first major match-up of the May sweeps.

Figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. showed ABC winning a close competition among its "North & South, Book II," NBC's "Deliberate Stranger" and CBS' "Vanishing Act." May is one of the four sweeps months for which local station ratings are measured, prompting the networks to schedule major programs to hype audiences for their affiliates.

The first part of the 12-hour ABC miniseries ranked 10th for the week and drew a 19.8 rating, 30 share. The first part of the four-hour "Deliberate Stranger" placed 17th with an 18.6 rating, 28 share; CBS' two-hour movie, "Vanishing Act," was 20th with an 18.3 rating, 27 share.

"It was one of those cases in which everybody got a piece of the viewing," said Mike Eisenberg, CBS' research director.

Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice president for research projects, said the ABC and NBC miniseries appeared to find different audiences. He said ABC's was older and more rural, while NBC

seemed to attract younger, urban viewers.

Last November, ABC broadcast the 12-hour "North & South" and it became the season's No. 1 miniseries. Its opening installment, against NBC's "48 HRS" and series programming on CBS, had a 25.8 rating, 37 share — better than the current opener.

"We think it did well given the competition and we're expecting it to improve," said Jeff Tolvin, an ABC spokesman. Besides the network competition, pay-cable's Home Box Office showed "Ghostbusters" for the first time on TV on Sunday night.

For the week of April 28-May 4, top-ranked NBC, which had finished third the previous two weeks, won with a 15.4 rating. CBS averaged a 14.0 rating and ABC had a 13.2. A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million homes with television. A share measures the percentage of sets in use that are tuned to a broadcast.

A repeat of NBC's "The Cosby Show" ranked first with a 29.5 rating, 49 share, followed by original episodes of its follow-up Thursday comedies, "Family Ties" and "Cheers." Only CBS's "60 Minutes," which finished fourth, kept NBC's blockbuster comedies from a sweep. "Night Court" was fifth, in a tie with NBC's Saturday comedy king,

"The Golden Girls." Then came CBS' "Murder, She Wrote," CBS' "Kate & Allie," CBS' "Newhart" and the first part of "North & South, Book II."

The next 10 shows, in order, were: CBS' "Dallas," ABC's "Dynasty," NBC's "Miami Vice" in 12th, NBC's "Highway to Heaven" and ABC's "Moonlighting," tied for 14th, ABC's "Hotel" in 16th, "Deliberate Stranger" and CBS' "Knots Landing," tied for 17th, ABC's "Perfect Strangers" in 18th and "Vanishing Act" and ABC's "Who's the Boss?" tied for 20th.

The week also was notable for two CBS programs: "West 57th" and "Magnum, P.I."

"West 57th," the CBS News magazine that had a six-week run last summer, was introduced in the 8 p.m. EDT slot on Wednesday, where CBS has failed with entertainment series all season. The first of at least 13 episodes ranked 64th out of 71 shows with an 8.0 rating, 13 share. In the 10 p.m. Tuesday slot last August, the first installment of "West 57th" had a 10.4 rating, 18 share.

"We're disappointed that it wasn't seen by more people," said Ann Morfogen, a CBS News spokeswoman. "But a broadcast like that takes time to grow." She noted that it was up against "Highway to Heaven," which ranked 34th, and ABC's "MacGyver," which was 34th.

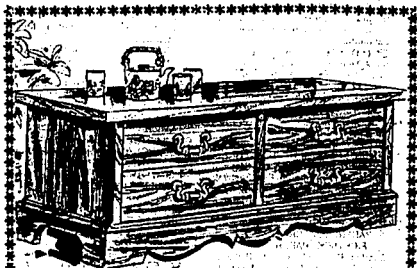

# Pepsi announces plans for a 2nd ad series with Michael Jackson

NEW YORK — Pepsi-Cola USA said Tuesday it has signed Michael Jackson to a new three-year advertising contract that is the largest ever of its kind — worth somewhere between \$5 million and \$15 million.

The pop superstar will perform in an unspecified number of Pepsi commercials in the United States and abroad, including one in Spanish, said Roger Enrico, president and chief executive of Pepsi-Cola USA.

Jackson is to contribute two pieces of original music and perform one song from an upcoming album.

"This new relationship will be the most comprehensive, the most significant, the most far-reaching ever between a corporation and a performing artist," Enrico said.

Enrico declined to say exactly what Pepsi is paying Jackson, except that it is more than \$5 million and less than the \$15 million that has been widely reported. The entire Jackson advertising campaign will cost more than \$50 million, he said.

Enrico said the rest of Jackson's family, which once performed as a

unit, probably won't be involved in the latest Pepsi campaign.

He and Jackson appeared together at a news conference in a Manhattan nightclub. Jackson, who does not grant interviews and rarely appears in public, whispered three short sentences and made a hasty exit.

"This is a great honor," said the 27-year-old singer, who wore sunglasses, a red shirt and a black military jacket with a medal over his chest. "Thank you, Mr. Enrico and Pepsi Associates. Ladies' and gentlemen, thank you."

After Jackson left, his personal manager, Frank Dileo, answered questions on his behalf. Dileo said Jackson is recording a new album and finishing work on a 12-minute movie for Walt Disney Productions entitled "Captain EO."

The album, which is being produced by Quincy Jones, will probably be out this fall, said Dileo. He said Jackson has no current plans for performing.

Jackson's last album, "Thriller," was released in 1983 and became the biggest-selling album of all time. In 1984, before their "Victory Tour" of North America, Jackson and his

brothers signed a \$5.5 million, one-year contract with Pepsi — at the time, the largest contract of its kind.

The Jacksons produced two commercials for Pepsi, including one that featured a Pepsi-oriented version of Jackson's biggest hit, "Billie Jean." During filming of the commercial, Jackson was injured when a spark landed in his hair and set it afire.

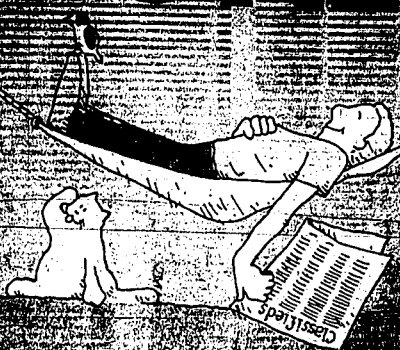
The new commercials, which will air in 1987, will continue the company's "New Generation" theme, Enrico said.

He said Jackson will have a strong creative voice in the ads. "After '87, and in 1988 and beyond, Michael will serve as a creative consultant and he may even make his commercial directing debut," Enrico said.

The announcement of the new Pepsi campaign was made two days before the 100th anniversary of Coca-Cola.

Coke products' account for 58.6 percent of the estimated \$33 billion retail market for soft drinks, while Pepsi products trail at 27.4 percent, according to analysts.
