Agent's detention mars new anti-drug drive

WASHINGTON — The Reagan administration Thursday announced a massive new campaign to halt the flow of drugs across the Mexican border, but the new vow of cooperation from Mexico came amid the disclosure that an American drug agent had been detained by police in Guadalajara.

As he joined Vice President George Bush to announce "Operation Alliance" along the 2,000-mile border, Attorney General Edwin Meese was questioned about the circumstances involving the detention, and

subsequent release, of Victor Cortez Jr., an agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration.

Jalisco state police took Cortez into custody Wednesday, but set him free after he was identified as a U.S. government narcotics agent, said Francisco Fonseca, a spokesman for the Mexican attorney general's office.

But Terry Burke, special agent in charge of the DEA's Phoenix, Ariz., office, charged that Cortez had been kidnapped and beaten, "apparently from a public place."

Asked about the incident, coming about a year and a half after an American drug

agent was kidnapped and murdered in Mexico, Meese said, "We have reports" that an agent was "detained and allegedly mistreated" by local Mexican authorities.

DEA Administrator John Lawn said that Cortez had been in Mexico since January 1986. He said Cortez allegedly had been "mistreated and released," but said he did not know what the mistreatment entailed.

He said that Cortez had left Mexico and was en route to Arizona. Justice Department spokesman John Russell said Cortez would arrive in Tucson late Thursday.

Bush, head of the National Narcotics Border Interdiction System, said the new

program "will be conducted in full cooperation with the government of Mexico," Meese added.

"The Mexican attorney general (Sergio Ramirez Garcia) and I are determined to fight it (drug trafficking) on both sides of the border," he said.

The incident was divulged as Mexican President Miguel de la Madrid was concluding a two-day official visit to Washington.

During the news conference announcing details of Operation Alliance — the joint campaign against drug trafficking involving U.S. and Mexican officials, Meese said that Mexican officials had "pledged prosecution

of the people involved, if any wrongdoing is found."

He said officials in Washington were still receiving reports on the incident and had not talked directly with the agent.

Last year, Enrique Camarena Salazar, an American drug agent, was kidnapped and murdered in Mexico.

Earlier, an Army general said that the U.S.-backed Bolivian raids on suspected cocaine facilities were proving moderately successful. Gen. John R. Galvin, who heads the U.S. Southern Command in Panama, said he is convinced that Cuba is playing a

Fire crews gain slowly on Idaho blazes

Fire bosses were getting the upper hand on parts of the Garden Valley fire complex late Thursday, but 3,500 acres of blazes continued to rage and crews had no estimate when they might be contained.

Gary Lindholm, spokesman for the Boise National Forest, said the focus was shifted Thursday to the 3,500-acre Anderson Creek fire, about six miles east of Crouch. It is part of the stubborn series of fires in the Garden Valley area that have kept firefighters working up to 16-hour shifts since a lightning storm passed through the area Sunday.

Fire crews ringed one of the largest fires in the complex, north of Boise, with a main control line Thursday, and a secondary fire line was finished to increase protection for scores of homes on the southern front of the blaze.

Fire bosses predicted full containment of that blaze in the Skid Road above Garden Valley sometime Friday, after stubborn blazes thwarted efforts to contain that fire by late Thursday.

Lindholm said the total acreage of the Garden Valley fire complex stood at 6,300 acres late Thursday, but 2,800 acres were contained or expected to be contained by Friday.

Some 819 firefighters were committed to the complex that threatened commercial timber valued at \$30 million, and more manpower was being shipped in.

Smoke from the fire cast a dense haze over much of the Treasure Valley and the Boise area and residents with respiratory problems were advised to stay indoors. The choked skies also kept aerial retardant tankers grounded much of the morning and into the afternoon, further hampering the fire-fighting effort.

"They have been using helicopters to drop water on the fires, but they haven't been able to get the tankers up to drop retardant," said Barn Forthepase of the Boise National Forest.

Statewide, nearly 2,000 firefighters and almost half as many support personnel, augmented by National Guard troops and equipment, were still fighting many of the more than 100 blazes ignited by the Sunday night lightning storm. Over 175,000 acres of range and timberland has been charred in the state since that storm.

Gov. John Evans declared a state of extreme emergency, and federal officials imposed stringent restrictions on fires and smoking in the backcountry through most of southern Idaho.

Throughout the Northwest, where 500

fires were sparked by a severe Sunday night thunderstorm, more than 11,000 firefighters, supported by thousands of additional support personnel, continued to battle the worst of the hundreds of fires still burning on over 300,000 acres, said Dave Dammron of the Boise Interagency Fire Center, the nation's fire command post.

Dammron said requests from throughout the five-state area for about 100 more 20-man crews were canceled on Wednesday, although 26 crews were flown into the ravaged Northwest from Alaska and the center had over 89 20-man crews standing by for mobilization.

Air traffic created by the firefighting effort in Idaho, Oregon, Montana, Nevada and Utah had intensified to such an extent that the Federal Aviation Administration set up temporary air traffic control towers in Grangeville and McCall. Officials said traffic at the Grangeville airport, normally about 50 landings and takeoffs a day, was running at one every three minutes on Wednesday.

Since lightning began striking the Northwest in earnest Aug. 2, Dammron said over 500,000 acres have been charred, but much of that has come since last weekend's storm swept across a 500-mile-long corridor from eastern Oregon through

House ignores critics of bill

WASHINGTON — The House, despite slinging criticism from the Pentagon, moved Thursday toward adoption of a defense budget bill which sharply restricts five major Reagan administration defense programs.

The Democratic-controlled chamber plowed through a series of relatively minor amendments as it tried to wrap up the bill so members can leave this weekend for a Labor Day recess.

House leaders had said they were hoping to finish the bill late Thursday, but as the evening wore on, it was apparent that goal would not be reached. A final vote is likely sometime today.

One amendment approved on a voice vote would bar sending any military personnel into or over Nicaragua, where the United States is backing a guerrilla force fighting to overthrow the leftist Sandinista government.

President Reagan has said he has no plans to send U.S. combat troops into Nicaragua, and supporters of the proposal said Thursday they were trying to make that restriction part of the law. A similar amendment was approved last year by the House but later dropped from the bill.

The White House has threatened to veto the bill because it contains five major restrictions on defense programs which were approved by votes that split generally along party lines.

The measure bans testing of anti-satellite weapons, outlaws produc-

tion of chemical weapons, requires continued compliance with the SALT II nuclear arms treaty, freezes "Star Wars" spending and halts all U.S. nuclear arms tests for a year.

None of those provisions is part of the defense bill approved last week by the Republican-controlled Senate. Those, and dozens of other differences, will have to be reconciled next month in a House-Senate conference committee.

While the House debated the bill authorizing the Pentagon budget, the House Appropriations Committee gave voice vote approval to a separate bill which appropriates the money to pay for the programs in the bill on the floor.

The committee's version of the bill includes all five major arms control provisions contained in the authorization bill. It would appropriate \$269 billion.

Heagan sought \$300 billion for the Pentagon next year, but the Senate bill slashed that to \$295 billion, and the House measure would permit only \$286 billion in spending. The current military budget is \$286 billion.

The House voted 261-159 approval Thursday of an amendment which would take away the authority of governors to block the Pentagon from using National Guard troops from their states for training exercises in Central America.

The National Guard is part of the nation's 2.1-million-member pool of uniformed military manpower. But during peacetime, Guard units are legally under the control of the states for most purposes, even though their troops and equipment are paid for by the Pentagon.

Gas hazard in homes

WASHINGTON — As many as 12 percent of the nation's homes may contain unhealthy levels of radioactive radon gas, and people living in them shouldn't compound the problem by smoking indoors, the Environmental Protection Agency said Thursday.

The gas in those homes may account for 2,000 to 6,000 annual lung cancer deaths from radon, a substantial share of the 5,000 to 20,000 fatalities the agency estimates result from radon exposure, EPA officials said.

The gas concentration picked as

EPA's new recommended action level is the equivalent of smoking one-half pack of cigarettes a day, Richard Guimond, head of EPA's radon program, told a news conference.

"These are higher than the environmental risks we normally deal with," he said.

The news conference was called to publicize the agency's new brochure on the subject and what it is doing about the problem, including advice to the public and state governments as well as technical standards for measurements.

Forty states have expressed interest in republishing the brochures.

Henry's Fork bill wins committee nod

WASHINGTON — A Senate committee has unanimously approved a study to determine whether to pursue a study to build a dam on the Henry's Fork of the Snake River.

The Energy and Natural Resources Committee, chaired by Sen. James McClure, voted Thursday to move the bill to the Senate floor.

The measure was introduced by Sen. McClure and Sen. Frank Lautenberg. McClure said the dam would provide the river with a 200-kilowatt hydroelectric project at Pond's Lodge.

"The plan has been there for a long time," McClure said.

High court nominations to full Senate

WASHINGTON — The Senate Judiciary Committee recommended the elevation of William H. Rehnquist to be chief justice Thursday and that Antonin Scalia be confirmed as an associate justice on the Supreme Court.

The 13-5 vote backing Rehnquist's confirmation came as Republicans generally beat back an attempt by liberal Democrats to portray him as too extreme to lead the U.S. court system.

After the Rehnquist decision, the committee voted 13-0 to recommend approval of Scalia as one of eight Supreme Court associate justices.

President Reagan nominated Rehnquist to succeed the retiring Warren E. Burger as the nation's 15th chief justice. Scalia, 50, would fill the opening.


Both nominations were sent to the full Senate where Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., vowed the battle over Rehnquist will be renewed.

At the White House, deputy press secretary Larry Speakes said: "We are extremely pleased. We look forward to early, full Senate action."


Rehnquist, at Pepperdine University School of Law in Malibu, Calif., for a series of lectures, said, "I was very pleased that the Senate committee voted to recommend my nomination." He declined further comment and a university spokesman said that was because Rehnquist felt it would be improper to do so until the full Senate acts.

The dispute over Rehnquist's qualifications remained bitter, and partisan to the end, as relentless attacks were led by Kennedy and fellow Democrats Howard Madsenbaum of Ohio, Patrick Leahy of

About 35 percent of the heroin, 30 percent of the marijuana and 30 percent of the cocaine coming into the United States comes from Mexico, he said.
The Defense Department will provide support in the form of radar surveillance and intelligence gathering, while the National Guard will fly agents of the Drug Enforcement Administration in helicopters.

Senate votes South Africa textile ban

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate, making clear it is ready to step up economic pressure against South Africa's white minority government, voted 79-20 Thursday to add a ban on imported South African textiles to the sanctions list.
But in a narrow, 51-48 test vote, it killed an amendment by Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., that would have markedly toughened South African sanctions, including tightened financial restrictions and...
As the long session neared midnight, the Senate adopted an amendment by Sen. Paul Sarbanes, D-Md., to suspend the U.S. landing rights of South African Airways 10 days after enactment of the bill rather than one year after, the period called for in the bill.
Sarbanes said the one-year wall was unjustified even though an immediate ban involves suspending the terms of a U.S.-South Africa air agreement.

Radon

Radon is a radioactive gas derived from uranium in the soil. It tends to be concentrated indoors...
The booklets outlined several methods for reducing radon, such as sealing cracks in basement walls and floors or various arrangements of fans to draw off radon-enriched air as it comes through basement floors and walls, or after it enters basements.

Other structures — factories, office buildings and apartment houses — generally pose far less risk because they are larger and better ventilated and the radon is diluted in more air.
While officials did not urge all homeowners to test for radon, Deputy EPA Administrator A. James Barnes said that "in particular states, you may want to contact... the state health agency and ask whether they're aware of any areas in the state where elevated radon levels have been identified."

The screening test would cost \$100 to several hundred dollars and would reveal whether the homeowner can rest easy or whether more tests are necessary, officials said.
Radon itself is inert, odorless, colorless, tasteless and quickly decays into other products. It is those other products that can lodge in the lung, irradiating the tissues over a lifetime.

"For those who object," added Laxalt, "there will be another election."

Weaver before ethics panel
WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Jim Weaver, D-Ore., appeared for more than four hours Thursday before closed hearings of a House ethics panel that is conducting a preliminary inquiry into his campaign finances.
Weaver, who announced earlier this week that he was withdrawing from the Senate race against GOP Sen. Bob Packwood, declined to talk with reporters when he entered and left the hearing room.
Weaver attended an afternoon session that lasted nearly two hours and returned for another 2 1/2 hours with the panel in the evening.
The House Committee on Standards of Official Conduct is conducting a preliminary inquiry into an \$81,934 loan Weaver took out from his campaign fund.
Weaver, a former commodities trader and real estate developer, has said he lost the money he had invested. The congressman said he repaid the \$81,934 by forging an earlier loan he had made to his 1974 campaign fund.

FDA warns of cheese danger
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Food and Drug Administration said Thursday consumers in 10 states may have an imported semi-soft cheese in their refrigerator that contains potentially lethal bacteria.
The FDA said it is searching for 56 wheels of Morber Rippos, a French cheese, but believes some of the cheese may be in the hands of consumers.
The 12-pound, uncoiled wheels come from a lot that may contain Listeria monocytogenes, a bacteria that killed more than 80 people in California last year.
The FDA said Crystal Food Import Corp. of Boston, Mass., the importer, issued a recall for 82 wheels from distributors and retailers in New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Virginia, Georgia, Texas, Vermont, Maine and Massachusetts.
While 26 of the 82 wheels have been recovered, the FDA said, some of the cheese is in consumer hands. It warned consumers not to eat the cheese.

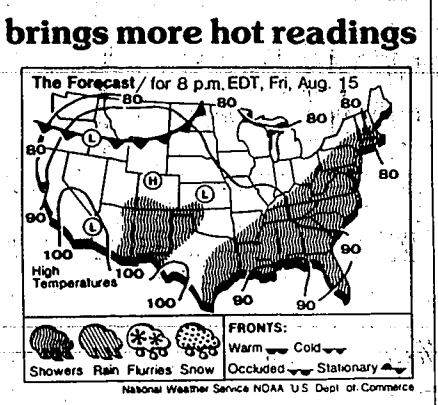

Soda Springs couple sues over IUD use

POCATELLO (AP) — A Soda Springs couple is suing a Pocatello doctor and his wife over the insertion of an intrauterine birth control device they contend caused the wife to bear a baby and the ability to bear children in the future.

Curtis and Lorri Lish filed suit in 6th District Court against Dr. Mark B. Johnson and his wife Kenita, a certified physician's assistant, asking at least \$165,000 for damages, medical costs and financial hardship.

Mrs. Lish claims Johnson suggested an interuterine device for her when she went to his office seeking a birth control method in April 1984. The IUD was inserted on April 4, 1984, according to the suit.

After the device was in place, Mrs. Lish tried to schedule a follow-up appointment but allegedly was told Johnson would be moving his practice out of town.

Mrs. Lish was admitted to a hospital in August, 1984, when she contends another doctor diagnosed a two- to two-and-a-half-month pregnancy was being miscarried. The suit says a hysterectomy was recommended.

The Lishes claim Johnson and his wife acted negligently in inserting the device so that it perforated the uterine wall, that they mispositioned the IUD, that the wrong size device was used, that there was no follow-up treatment, and that no advice was offered on risks associated with an IUD.

Trial slated for Salmon man

SALMON (AP) — A Salmon man charged with shooting his brother with a sawed-off shotgun will stand trial in district court next month on a charge of involuntary manslaughter.

Shel L. Howard is charged with shooting Allen Shane Howard, 23, on July 21 following a family argument that started over a child's haircut.

Following Wednesday's preliminary hearing in Salmon before Magistrate Fred Snook, Howard was released on his own recognizance and ordered to stand trial on Sept. 8.

Racing lack could cut funds

POCATELLO (AP) — Idaho's public school system could lose \$10 million a year in possible taxes if the Pocatello Turf Club discontinues its racing operation, said Gary Campbell, executive director of the Idaho State Racing Commission.

Owners of the club have not publicly admitted they plan to discontinue racing at the North Bannock County Fairgrounds next season. But fairgrounds manager Wally Noe said a decline in business may force the operation to fold.

The club's 11th season ended with last weekend's races. About \$150,000 is collected each year from the state's 10 horse-racing tracks, Campbell said. Based on the 2.25-percent parimutuel track, he estimates \$10,000 comes from the handle at the Pocatello track.

FORT HALL (AP) — Three Fort Hall Police Department officers have been authorized to investigate crimes committed by non-Indians on the reservation, Police Chief Mike Ostlie said.

The officers were commissioned by the Bureau of Indian Affairs on July 31 to probe such crimes, arrest non-Indians and make direct referrals to the Justice Department for prosecution, Ostlie said Thursday.

The newly commissioned officers are patrol officer Reggie Thorpe, criminal investigator Vernon Alvarez, and senior criminal investigator Cien Hidalgo. Each has completed a 13-week course in Arizona on basics of police procedure and federal law as it applies on Indian reservations.

The commissioned officers can now prepare and submit criminal cases directly to federal prosecutors, Ostlie said. Previously, tribal police had to go through a BIA investigator who would call the FBI.

Judge bars 'Bell' use by firm

BOISE (AP) — A federal judge in Boise has issued an order barring a Nampa telephone sales and repair company from using any derivation of the word "Bell" in its name.

The judgment signed Wednesday by U.S. District Judge Marion Callister requires Thomas L. Daniel, owner of Bell Tel in Nampa, to change the name of his business and stop all advertising references including the name "Bell," or its phonetic or visual equivalent, and any other name or mark confusingly similar.

The judgment follows an Aug. 6 agreement between Daniel and U.S. West in the Englewood, Colo., parent company of Mountain Bell, stipulating that in addition to provisions of Callister's order, Daniel must destroy any printed material including any variation of the name Bell by Sept. 1.

Firemen OK contract, rip chief

POCATELLO (AP) — Pocatello firefighters have voted overwhelmingly to approve a new one-year contract with the city, but also unanimously approved a "no confidence" vote against Fire Chief Don Jones.

"We don't believe Chief Jones is representing the best interests of the department," union President Gary Moore said Wednesday. He did not elaborate.

"I have no idea what they're talking about," Jones responded. "Personally, I'm a little disturbed by the no-confidence vote."

Mayor Dick Finlayson said he was disappointed firefighters felt it necessary to conduct such a vote.

Editor selected at Sandpoint

SANDPOINT (AP) — Lynne Thomas has been promoted to editor of the Sandpoint Daily Bee, Publisher Jim Thompson announced.

Thomas, 29, has worked at the Bee for four years. She edited the business, arts, religion and wire pages before being named assistant editor earlier this year.

Before joining the Daily Bee, she was a reporter for four years at the Daily Chronicle in Centralia, Wash.

Boise photographer dies of altitude illness on China trip

PEKING (AP) — An American photographer died of severe altitude sickness Sunday on an expedition on the upper reaches of the Yangtze River, according to separate reports received Thursday.

The reports, from the official Chinese news agency Xinhua and from a U.S. citizen who was on the expedition, said David Shippee of

Boise, Idaho, died Aug. 3 and was buried the next day beside the Tuotuohe River, a Yangtze tributary.

Shippee, 29, a staff photographer for The Idaho Statesman in Boise, was on an unpaid leave of absence from the newspaper to work as a still photographer for the expedition.

The cause of death was pulmonary edema, a complication of altitude sickness characterized by fluid in the lungs.

John Wilcox, a television producer who was with Shippee for part of the expedition before returning to the U.S., said the photographer's riverside grave was marked with yellow and black kayak paddles.

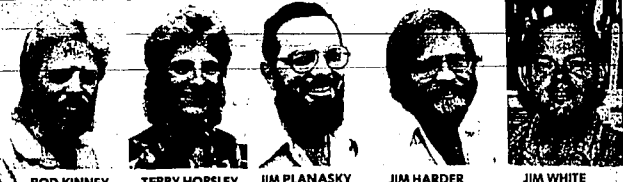

Arrows for tax bill all point wrong way

The Senate continues to play games with the revenue estimates for tax reform. To make the bill come out even, it would order the Internal Revenue Service to step up enforcement efforts.

Miracle of miracles: the senators say this would yield some \$17 billion over the next five years, which happens to be exactly what they need to balance their bill without cutting preferences more or rates less than the bill would now.

You wonder why they stopped at \$17 billion. Add a few more IRS agents and you could have the defense buildup, a smaller deficit and no doubt national health insurance in this election year, and never tax a fly.

But this is a fraud, the likeliest result of which would be the financing of lower tax rates through spending cuts or an increase in the deficit. The House is resisting, and rightly so.

Reform was supposedly to be a trade-off. The tax base would be broadened by reducing the preferences through which income now escapes. With a broader and presumably fairer base there could be lower rates.

The Senate cut rates with a flourish but never quite paid the cost. Its bill turned out to be \$21 billion out of balance over the first five years.

The gap would have been even greater, except that the Senate took credit for some \$29 billion from stepped-up IRS activities. The \$17 billion now in dispute is part of this.

The administration had earlier proposed that IRS activities be stepped up, though to a lesser degree, and that the proceeds be used in the budget process, as alternatives to tax increases or further spending cuts in hitting deficit targets.

Use the proceeds to finance the tax bill instead, and you lighten the budget equation. At the same time you reduce the pressure to uproot tax preferences.

The arrows all point in the wrong direction. The tax bill should be used to balance the budget, not the other way around.

War on drugs really one about politics

WASHINGTON — Henry Adams, that mordant observer of political foibles in the nation's capital, would have loved this last week in Washington.

"Practical politics," he once said, "consists in ignoring facts." And that, in good bipartisan measure, is precisely what the politicians in White House and Congress have been demonstrating anew.

Their war on drugs is not about facts. It is about practical politics.

The facts are that the nation's attempt to combat a genuine problem in drug use among Americans has been a singular failure, understated and underfunded. From the president down, the people lining up to give urine samples for drug testing have been unwilling to pay the price of a real anti-drug campaign. In fact, they have cut funding for such efforts.

Now, in a splendid example of political hypocrisy, they propose to make the public believe that they are "doing something" by targeting not the drug smugglers but some of the very people charged with catching the criminals. It is government workers who are to be tested, not the potential drug importers. This is not a drug program. This is practical politics. In this era of public relations policies, of photo opportunities and the symbolic gesture, this is the latest example of "feel-good," no-cost politics.

Spending time with some of the U.S. agents seeking to interdict drug shipments at American borders leaves a sense of how astonishing their battle is, how limited their resources. They face ingenious smuggling methods. Drugs

come inside coconuts, mixed with yams and mangoes, secreted in false walls of massive cargo containers lifted from ship to dockside and then cleared through customs. When agents removed the handles of knives from Pakistan, they found heroin inside. These agents know that drug smugglers use children, pregnant women, people carrying false passports. They know drugs are placed inside body cavities, in balloons that are swallowed and recovered when passed. And they know, no matter how diligently they work, that often drugs are intercepted only through luck.

A cable snaps, big tins of cashews pop open, and cocaine is found attached to the tins. A longshoreman accidentally rams a container with his hit on the docks, and goods that would not otherwise be inspected are found to contain drugs.

Agents know, too, that while they compile intelligence information permitting them to draw profiles and target likely smugglers and shipments by nationality and country of origin, the narcotics merchants also compile profiles. The smugglers know which ports of entry, airports, even individual inspectors on duty offer the best opportunity for success. U.S. agents know that in this fight they are outnumbered and losing their war.

They live with one more fact: no matter how great their effort or how much money is spent, the flow of drugs will continue as long as there is

a major market for it in the United States. One U.S. agent assigned to a drug team in New York put it this way:

"I wonder how often that junior executive sitting in some East Side disco, sticking his spoon up his nose, is thinking about the human beings that are killed by people that are importing drugs he uses? To people who deal in drugs, life means absolutely nothing.

"So I wonder if they think about that before they stick it up their noses? From what I understand about coke, it's supposed to be a great high, and it only lasts a very short time."

"So I wonder: is that short time worth a human life? People that are using it, do they ever think about that? Not the \$100 a line or whatever they're paying, but the actual cost paid, the cost in human life to get that to them? So they could feel good for half an hour?"

Something else worth pondering is his suggestion that perhaps the only way drugs can be stopped is through putting greater national resources into education. Maybe that way, he said, "the kids will see a world where they don't need drugs. Then if nobody's going to buy it, nobody's going to smuggle it in."

That's a practical proposal, based on facts, painfully faced. But as Henry Adams knew, and as we learn again watching Washington's politicians slagger toward their summer recess, practical politics here still consists largely of ignoring unpleasant facts.

There is a sound reason why Star Wars is not negotiable

WASHINGTON — One afternoon last week, the president walked over to the Old Executive Office Building to talk about his beloved Strategic Defense Initiative (SDI). His remarks were not widely reported, in part because the press was not specifically invited, and in part because he was resting basic positions. He ought to be heard.

The polls indicate that fully half of the country knows little or nothing of the 3-behaves us, as parents to support them intellectually, physically and spiritually and to listen to their message.

The idea, in brief, is to develop a defensive shield against incoming nuclear missiles. The technology is mind-boggling. All the president has asked is that American scientists come up with a device that will detect a missile as it leaves a silo, ignore decoys,

intercept the missile, and destroy it before it reaches its target. This must be accomplished in minutes — finally in microseconds. Scores of skeptical scientists have said flatly that no such device can be invented and successfully deployed.

"Clearly," said the president, "intelligent and well-meaning individuals can be trapped by a mind-set, a way of thinking that prevents them from seeing beyond what has already been done and makes them uncomfortable with what is unfamiliar. And this mind-set is perhaps our greatest obstacle in regard to SDI."

"Many of the vocal opponents of SDI, some of them with impressive scientific credentials, claim our goal is impossible; it can't

be done, they say. Well, I think it's becoming increasingly apparent to everyone that those claiming it can't be done have clouded vision. Sometimes smoke gets in your eyes."

Progress has been made over the past three years. Reagan himself is serenely confident that continued research will perfect a device that will protect our people, not just our missile silos. He mentioned no timetables or deadlines. The talk here is that research and development, with appropriate testing, will take another eight to 10 years. Two presidential terms may have come and gone before the shield could be deployed.

The president last week was preaching mainly to the choir. His audience came from such fervent supporters as the Heritage Foundation, High Frontier, the American Defense Preparedness Association, and the American Conservative Trust. But Reagan also was talking to the Congress and to the American people. He was trying to disabuse everyone of the notion that SDI might be

bargained out of existence in order to get an agreement from the Soviet Union on control or reduction of nuclear arms.

I am satisfied, after talking at some length with the president, that any such bargaining is out of the question. When the president gets his feet dug in, believe me, those number 12s are set in concrete. SDI is his baby. This imaginary program could be the one accomplishment by which his presidency would find its place in the books of American history. SDI is to this president what the Great Society was to Lyndon Johnson, the China breakthrough was to Richard Nixon, the Camp David accord was to Jimmy Carter. Reagan is absolutely hooked on the vision of a world free of fear of a nuclear holocaust.

"Let me reassure you," he told the group last week, "that our response to demands that we cut off or delay research and testing and close shop is: No way. SDI is no bargaining chip. It is the path to a safer and more secure future."

Reagan's trouble right now is that his critics are coming at him from both left and right. Liberals oppose SDI partly because they are convinced it won't work and partly because the program souks up billions that might be spent on social causes. Conservatives, led by Rep. Jack Kemp of New York, are fearful that Reagan will make a deal pledging not to "deploy" the new device for at least eight years. Kemp knows that the Soviets have been working night and day for 20 years on an SDI of their own, and he urges that other, more feasible anti-ballistic weapons be developed and deployed first.

Reagan will not get all the money he wants in fiscal '87 for continued SDI research, but he will get most of it. And if it works — this sort of protective superastrodome over the whole nation — he will indeed have given us something to remember him by.

House approves borrowing boost

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House approved an emergency credit increase for the Treasury on Thursday, setting up a confrontation with the Senate over plans to strengthen the Gramm-Rudman budget-balancing law.

The \$73.3 billion borrowing boost was passed 216-199 after the House defeated an attempt by House Republicans to force action on a cost-cutting package that Democrats opposed. That sent the measure to the Senate, where action on it was expected today.

The Treasury has exhausted its statutory debt limit of \$2.078 trillion. Unless Congress approves an increase before leaving this week for its Labor Day recess, the government might default on its obligations, according to Treasury officials.

Democrats, saying it would be dangerous to mix the debt increase with other issues, killed a Republican plan to pass about \$7 billion in spending cuts before taking up the debt bill.

The House Democratic Leader Jim Wright of Texas promised the House would complete necessary budget cuts when it returns from the recess. Republicans shouldn't "cram down our throats something that we haven't even examined or understood," he said.

The Republican initiative was blocked on a 24-178 procedural vote. House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill said earlier Thursday he was not sure the House can defeat Senate efforts, expected Friday, to attach an automatic Gramm-Rudman budget cut mechanism to the emergency debt ceiling bill.

Marchers greeted

CHICAGO (AP) — The nationwide peace march arrived Thursday in Chicago, where the demonstrators were welcomed by Mayor Harold Washington to "the largest nuclear-free zone city in the world."

The 250 marchers, who are promoting worldwide nuclear disarmament with their cross-country walk, were joined by several hundred others and walked through the downtown Loop, carrying signs that read "Bread Not Bombs" and "Star Wars — \$1 trillion! No Way!"

They wound up at Grant Park, where Washington told them, "No words could possibly even remotely express our appreciation for your dramatization of this."

Girl turns in parents to police

TUSTIN, Calif. (AP) — A 13-year-old girl who fought with her parents over their drug use finally turned them in to police, along with a trash bag of pills, pot and cocaine she found at home, officers said Thursday.

Bobby Dale Young, 49, a bartender, and Judith Ann Young, 37, a U.S. Bankruptcy Court clerk, were charged Thursday with one count each of cocaine possession, said Orange County Deputy District Attorney Jim Mulgrew.

Both were later released on their own recognizance. Orange County Municipal Court Judge Manuel Ramirez ordered them to appear for arraignment Sept. 23.

Their daughter, Deanna, was taken to Orangewood Children's Home, a county shelter for abused and abandoned children, officers said.

Lawyer defends Deaver's party

WASHINGTON (AP) — An attorney for lobbyist Michael K. Deaver said Thursday that the former presidential aide did nothing wrong by entertaining three high-level White House officials at a fancy dinner party last March.

"Nothing in the law prohibits social contacts with current government officials," Randall J. Turk said when asked about the March 13 party that Deaver hosted for Korean Ambassador Kyung-Won Kim. Deaver represents the Korean government and the Daewoo Corp., a Korean industrial company.

Records filed at the Justice Department's foreign agents registration unit show that David Waller, then a senior associate counsel at the White House; Dennis Thomas, the top aide to White House Chief of Staff Donald T. Regan; and Stephen Danzansky, a special assistant to President Reagan, were among the 60 guests who attended the party at a posh hotel.

The dinner occurred about 10 months after Deaver left the White House where he served as deputy chief of staff.

Reagan orders a fourth shuttle

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan has decided to order a fourth space shuttle to replace the lost Challenger, and an industry magazine says the vehicle would be stationed at Vandenberg Air Force base for use by the military when it is completed in about 1992.

Reagan rejected the suggestions of some advisers to ban commercial satellites as shuttle cargo, deciding instead to allow some such satellites on a selective basis. Aviation Week and Space Technology says in its Aug. 18 edition.

Officials defend China sugar sale

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reagan administration contended Thursday that its bargain-rate sugar sale to China will not disrupt world markets or the security relationship with Australia — a sugar-producing U.S. ally already angered by American farm subsidies.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said China gave assurances that its purchase of 145,850 metric tons of sugar from the United States would not interfere with its acquisitions from other nations.

"It does not disrupt the normal trade flow," said State Department spokesman Charles E. Redman.

Admiral makes exit reluctantly

BOSTON (AP) — Rear Adm. Grace Hopper, the nation's oldest active military officer and co-inventor of the widely used computer language COBOL, retired Thursday aboard the Navy's oldest commissioned warship.
The 79-year-old Hopper, nicknamed the "Grand Old Lady of Software" and called "Amazing Grace" by her subordinates, appeared to be making a reluctant exit as she was honored on the USS Constitution.
"I regret leaving active duty," she told

the 275 relatives, friends and Navy brass assembled on the deck of "Old Ironsides." "Do you realize I'm the last of the World War II WAVES to leave active duty?"
Normal retirement age for a military officer is 62, but Hopper had remained on active duty under a procedure approved by Congress that allows yearly extensions.
"She's challenged at every turn the dictates of mindless bureaucracy," Navy Secretary John Lehman said as he awarded her the Defense Department's highest

honor, the Defense Distinguished Service Medal for exceptional meritorious service. He recalled that she once "gave me a stern lecture on computers—it was the roughest wire brushing I've had since I got this job."
Navy spokesman Lt. Russ Greer described Hopper's retirement ceremony as the grandest ever held on the 189-year-old ship.
An 18-piece Navy band played, an officer bedecked in a War of 1812 uniform presented Hopper with 43 roses, one for each year of

her Navy career, and seamen scampered up rigging for a salute to the diminutive woman.
Her admirers describe Hopper as a vigorous, tireless, occasionally contrary woman who smokes unfiltered cigarettes and has a four-page resume of awards, honorary degrees and professional activities.
"The only phrase I've ever disliked is, 'Why, we've always done it that way,'" she said. "I always tell young people, 'Go ahead and do it. You can always apologize later.'"

BID forges forward on plans for downtown

TWIN FALLS — The Downtown Business Improvement District is jumping into the future (and first) with work or discussions under way already on five of the recommendations made last month by an independent, unbiased, third-party study to help the downtown stay healthy when a new regional mall opens this fall.

If work proceeds as planned downtown, travelers will be directed off Interstate Highway 84 to downtown, bypassing the new Magic Valley Mall; new businesses will be wooed with market information; existing stores will know better how to cater to local customers; and the downtown will be unified with a central theme.

The BID's first response to the advice urban planner David Peterson dispensed in a \$7,750 study released July 22 was to conduct an employee census.

Letters were mailed Aug. 5 asking all the businesses in the central business district to return information indicating how many employees they had and whether they were professionals, managers, clerks or sales people.

The information will be used to compile a block-by-block employee census, says BID Coordinator Sue Ann-Jones.

drawing from, as far as downtown employees," she says. "It could also be useful for an existing business to determine whether they are reaping the benefits of an already existing

base of potential customers." The information is particularly important for restaurant and bar owners who may want to know how many people are already downtown

for work at certain times of the day and what their income levels may be," said Peterson in July.

He also told the downtown business people that one of the advantages they had over businesses on Blue Lakes Boulevard North, where the Magic Valley Mall is under construction, is being in the heart of the area where most city residents are employed.

The downtown's next step will be a customer survey that the BID hopes to have ready in late August or early September, Jones says. The survey, which will be short, will most likely ask about extended and Sunday hours, how well the downtown is maintained and why shoppers come downtown. There will also be space provided for general comments,

Jones says. The surveys will be sent to downtown employees, mailed to address delivery, and to downtown residents picked at random and handed out in stores, she says.

Work is also under way to install signs to lure travelers to the downtown, Jones says.

"Downtown is not real close to the arterials," she says. "We feel we need to advertise so people know how to get to downtown."

Merchants are particularly interested in installing a sign near the Hansen bridge, Jones says. Travelers would be directed to downtown via the eastern freeway exit to the city and down Addison Avenue, bypassing the Magic Valley Mall, which will be near the western

Stivers: State misspends on road projects

Officials say work is for safety

TWIN FALLS — Calling Interstate 84 median-strip renovations unnecessary and a "gross, obscene expenditure of money," House Speaker Tom Stivers is blasting the Idaho Department of Transportation for projects officials said are required by law.

"I've been carrying on a kind of one-armed disagreement on their use of our money," Stivers said in an interview Tuesday with The Times-News. His complaints stem from Department of Transportation improvements to the median strip between Pocatello and Boise and exit-ramp improvements at the Stage Stop truck stop 15 miles south of Boise.

"The feds have not required them to do it," Stivers said. The median-strip improvements will cost \$10 million to \$15 million, he said, charging that they were for "safety enhancement and ethnic enhancement and beauty enhancement."

But the director of the Idaho Department of Transportation and the regional administrator of the Federal Highway Administration both said Tuesday that Stivers was wrong and that the median-strip grading is done only for safety reasons and is required by federal law.

"The state (Department of Transportation) is kind of taking the brunt on that. From an operational standpoint, they have done what they are supposed to do," said Jack Coe, Federal Highway Administration chief in Boise.

Coe said that under the Surface Transportation Act of 1982, interstate resurfacing projects must be accompanied by flattening of median strips or erection of guardrails

to improve safety.

Dean Tisdale, director of the IDT, said Tuesday that none of the lava rock removal or flattening in the median strip of Interstate 84 has been for beautification.

He said Congress has made the interstate highway system its top priority in all transportation spending and that some secondary roads get underfunded, while the interstate highway repairs get full funding.

Hugh Lydston, chief of transportation services for the IDT, said Wednesday that \$3.3 million of the \$42 million budgeted for interstate improvements between Boise and Pocatello went to median-strip and guardrail work. Of the \$3.3 million, \$708,000 was for median-strip work, Lydston said.

Tisdale said federal law does not permit spending of interstate funds anywhere but on the interstates. Federal funds account for about 93 percent of the money spent on the interstates, he said.

Stivers also criticized a \$297,000 on-and-off-ramp renovation at the Stage Stop south of Boise. He said that with only one business there, the widened ramp is a boon to the Stage Stop. But other businesses, such as the Gear-Jammer truck stop near Mountain Home, would like. "I bet they wish the interstate would make them a ramp like that," Stivers said.

Tisdale said the Gear-Jammer ramp was improved in the late 1970s. The ramp at the Stage Stop was built 20 years ago as a farm access ramp and had to be widened to accommodate the longer trucks permitted under state and federal law. He said the recent move from 45- to 48-foot trucks increased the amount of side space needed for turning trucks by six feet.

New wing at CSI close to completion

TWIN FALLS — Workers carrying tall ladders threaded their way through students and doorways on Thursday as they scurried to complete construction on the new wing to the Taylor Administration Building at the College of Southern Idaho.

Just odds and ends, and a light bulb here and there, were all that were left to complete on the 7,500-square-foot facility, CSI is still waiting for furniture for the student lounge.

Otherwise, employees have already moved in and begun work in the \$550,000 two-story, brick wing.

"It's really going to be a big help for the students," said Ned Vaughn, head counselor.

The addition took 15 months to complete. Construction was delayed, in part, because

bricks matching the Taylor Building were no longer available and had to be specially ordered.

The addition means that, for the first time, both academic and vocational counselors will be in the same location so that students don't have to trot across the campus for help, said CSI Public Information Director Annette Jenkins.

Downstairs is a large, gray-carpeted student area where students can watch TV, play pool, or buy snacks. Also downstairs is a new bookstore, three times the size of the old one, where students can now peruse before they buy.

"Before, students had to wait at the counter and clerks brought them the books, because there wasn't enough room," Jenkins said.

"Now they can browse."

Across the hall from the bookstore are the

new counseling offices. Upstairs, adjacent to the cafeteria, is the centralized registration area and student services.

The expansion in the administration building means less crowding in faculty offices. The expansion also provides two more classrooms in the Shields Building by moving offices.

A new student service is being added and housed in the wing, also. The Career Planning and Placement Office will provide both career counseling for students and serve as a clearinghouse for job requests from both students and area businesses, said Director Colin Randolph.

"We're hoping that with this office, our retention of students will go up dramatically," said Randolph, standing in a hot office. Workers were still trying to fix the bugs in the air conditioning.

'Paint Magic' volunteers prepare to give area some color

TWIN FALLS — Long years of weathering have dulled their colors and faded their coverings. Like their inhabitants, 20 homes in Twin Falls, Kimberly, Jerome and Shoshone bear the marks of time.

But on Saturday, the colors return. The scars disappear.

An army of 500 volunteers, called "Paint Magic," will brighten the outside walls of the homes, as well as the lives of the elderly residents inside.

In the hours from 8 a.m. to noon, teams from area businesses and institutions will

give the time-ravaged homes a new coat of paint — no charge. For some houses, it will be their first spruce-up in as long as 15 years.

"In some cases, you can't really tell what they are on them," says Dick Boyd, vice president of Paint Magic Inc. and director of the Senior Citizens Program at the College of Southern Idaho.

The homes belong to elderly people who can't climb up ladders and can't afford to hire professional painters.

"We were looking for families that really were low-income, that had no immediate family in the area that could assist... and (that had) physical impairments that would allow them to paint," Boyd says.

Paint Magic is patterned after a Boise project called "Paint The Town," which is now in its third year. Organizers from Idaho Power Co., which is involved in the Boise effort, suggested a similar project in the Magic Valley. The idea caught on about 2 1/2 months ago, says Roxie Simcoe, Idaho Power Co. consumer education representative, who had coordinated many of the arrangements.

Paint Magic is an all-volunteer effort, from the money that buys the paint to the muscles that spread it.

Elven sponsoring businesses chipped in \$2,500 apiece in cash or services to put the

project on its feet, says Simcoe. About \$16,000 in cash has been raised.

A number of businesses, schools and organizations recruited teams of workers to handle the brushies.

Three local paint suppliers — Columbia Paint Co., Sherwin-Williams Co. and Twin Falls Glass and Paint Co. — are providing the paint at cost, along with some expertise.

At least 25 other businesses are donating equipment or helping to feed the workers at a picnic in Twin Falls City Park, after the last wall is covered. More contributions are arriving daily, Simcoe says.

Much of the work at the homes is under way as well, says Simcoe. Most teams have washed the buildings, scraped off flaking paint and dabbed on a coat of primer.

The main event is tomorrow. Each house will be identified with a sign and with the name of the team doing the painting.

But Paint Magic's reward is more penetrating than public recognition or a picnic, says Boyd. He recently told an elderly neighbor that her home had been chosen to be painted.

"The phone went silent, and then all you heard was her just crying," he says. "Made it all worthwhile."

Arguments heard on Egin-Hamer road issue

BOISE — Political candidates, environmentalists, and county commissioners squared off Thursday on proposed road improvements through the winter range of elk in eastern Idaho.

More than 100 people attended the Bureau of Land Management hearing at the public library in Boise.

A spokesman for Gov. John Evans said he favored the road improvements but wanted the road closed during winter when the elk graze in the area.

Leroy took an opposing stance, favoring construction of the improvements on the Egin-Hamer road and calling for restrictions on the effects of the road on the herd during winter.

"The key ingredient is to insure viable multiple use cooperation in a manner that benefits all," said Leroy's spokesman.

Environmentalists have charged that the BLM's decision to support the improvements is politically motivated. Evans is a candidate for the U.S. Senate and Leroy is running for governor.

Jay Sutton, Fremont County commissioner, called a draft en-

vironmental impact statement on the issue "insulting to the intelligence of a 6-year-old." Sutton labeled "ridiculous" the claim that improving the road from dirt to gravel would reduce the elk herd from 3,000 to 150 animals.

Ranchers and users in Fremont and Jefferson counties are seeking the improvements to gain greater access to their markets, according to testimony. The BLM has said public sentiment has been running heavily against the road.

Fremont County Commissioner James Sledzow said "I'm putting this road in because people out there need the service." He said the environmental impact statement on the issue was full of "suppositions and falsehoods."

He said the local elk herd has caused property damage and farmers have had to feed the herd for years.

Oceanographer takes his audience on video exploration of the Titanic

SUN VALLEY — Residents and visitors of this high valley amidst the Pioneer Mountains were taken on a scenic mountain journey Wednesday evening. It was a journey to another world, which most earthbound people were unfamiliar with, an underwater voyage three miles below the surface of our oceans.

During a special public lecture at Sun Valley this week given by oceanographer Charles Hollister of the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute in Woods Hole, Mass., a standing-room-only crowd of over 250 people saw a video presentation, just released, of the sunken Titanic and its deep-sea environment.

Viewers were given a glimpse of what makes the underwater world so impressive — trenches, faults and crevices, avalanches, erupting volcanoes, storms and an abundance of life forms.

Viewers were taken, by means of video tape and 35mm slides, on a whirlwind cruise of the discovery and exploration of the "unsinkable" Titanic.

Hollister presented the video tape and slides, which were taken by his former student and now colleague, Robert Ballard, who located and became the first person to see the ill-fated Titanic since it sank in 1912.

The views of the sunken vessel, located at a depth of 2 1/2 miles, revealed an eerie world where the effects of the sea and its creatures had eroded the once-graceful ship to a pile of deteriorating debris.

All the wood and iron was gone from the ship, and the steel siding was pouring off in massive amounts of rust. The crystal chandelier still hangs in the ballroom, but a deep-sea sponger now clings to it and calls it home.

Andrus held a conference on adult basic education in Twin Falls on Thursday that state government should expand the availability of continuing education.

"An investment in adult basic education is a direct investment in a better work force," he said. "It's an investment in higher productivity and ultimately it's an investment in a richer, more prosperous society."

Citing statistics that 30,000 Idahoans are not educated beyond the eighth grade level, Andrus called for a renewed commitment to funding long-term education programs to avoid long-term problems of poverty, crime and a lack of community participation.

The former governor and Carter administration Interior Secretary faces Republican Lt. Gov. David Leroy in November's election for governor.

C of I has new vice-president

CALDWELL (AP) — The College of Idaho in Caldwell has announced the appointment of Rodney J. "Pepper" Reese to the new position of executive vice president of the college.

Reese was vice president of finance and administration for the private, liberal arts school. His promotion is part of a reorganization of college administrative personnel.

Before coming to the school in 1984, Reese was vice president of Idaho operations for Cal-Pacífico of California. He also owned and managed his own business in Halley.

C of I officials said the move consolidates the day-to-day fiscal operations of the college under one office.

Reese said the executive vice president is responsible for the areas of financial affairs, college relations and financial aid.

"Where once the wealthy walked is now a home for a rat-tailed fish," Holister said.

When the Titanic went down, it appears it broke apart mid-ship, Holister said. The bow section is buried deep in mud and the stern is an "absolute mess" of twisted steel.

Holister said the Woods Hole Institute has no plans to go back to the ship's graveyard, but he suspected others may try. Countless artifacts have been left behind, untouched by Ballard's crew. A copper bucket on the ship's floor has been kept polished and clean from the action of drifting sand in the ocean floor currents. It is a temptation for ocean scavengers.

The Titanic has created a vast amount of public interest in the ocean depths, a point oceanographers at Woods Hole are cashing in on. Their intent is not to gain wealth, but to create an interest in America's youth to encourage them to pursue a scientific education, take chances and risks in discovering what lies beneath the seas, Holister said.

In deep-sea dives in "Alvin," a 6-foot diameter sphere which can dive to depths much greater than conventional submersibles, scientists have recently located an abundance of marine life in an environment where no other life can penetrate.

"It is really like another world," Holister noted, as he described marine life at 35,000 feet below sea level. "It's the formation of the sea here. Everest is high above sea level. Here scientists found life forms such as eight-foot tube worms, which exist without any help from the sun."

Recently, with advanced instrumentation techniques, scientists have discovered the ocean has weather patterns and geological formations similar to those on land. There are deep undersea currents and storms which help shape and reshape the topography of the ocean bottom.

The storms, which were recently discovered, scour the sea bottom similar to the formation and hurricanes above sea level. "The interior of the ocean is more turbulent and

mobile than we ever imagined," Holister said. He said this raises important environmental questions as to the validity of using the oceans as a dumping station for the planet's hazardous wastes.

The crust of the planet is moving over a weaker crust, causing massive faults and crevices around the Earth. Holister said scientists do not yet understand if Earth's plates are being pushed or pulled apart, but it is a significant fact in further understanding of the planet's continuing evolution.

As the snow-covered mountain areas of the world experience avalanches, so do the depths of the deep; but ocean avalanches may typically cover millions of acres. This does not pose much of a threat to humans life, but does work have with ocean cables which link international telephone service.

This lecture was the first in a series of presentations sponsored by the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities.

Walker said for what it costs to conduct the environmental impact of the improvements four to five times over.

Lil Erickson of Idaho '86 and Rick Johnson of the Idaho Conservation League both oppose the road improvements which would stretch 8.8 miles.

Erickson said some farmers who have claimed they will take steps against the herd if they don't get the road are "venting their ire like a spoiled child."

Johnson said the road improvements would cause the elk to shy away on a one-half mile strip on either side of the thoroughfare. He said the improvements would cause a loss of hunting opportunities for the 10,000 eastern Idaho elk sportsmen. He said this would add

pressure on other hunting regions. Johnson claimed the BLM had rejected the proposed improvements in 1983. He said the federal agency's change of heart "clearly smacks of political pressure."

Johnson said Idaho has plenty of roads but it doesn't have plenty of tree-running elk herds.

A decision on the controversy which has been a 10-year running battle between state and federal agencies, is expected later this year.

A spokesman for the Idaho Fish and Game Department has been quoted as saying the BLM's recommendation is politically motivated.

Officials concerned about wildfires

BOISE (AP) — The full environmental impact of the wildfires that have scorched southern Idaho the past week has not been calculated yet, but officials are concerned about the economic and the destruction of deer and elk habitat.

"Unless it's an easy winter, game

will have a tough time," said Monte McClendon, natural resources specialist with the Bureau of Land Management.

Although some game range and forest fires can be beneficial to plants and animals, others create threats to the environment.

While the now-blackened ranges

totaling 107,000 acres north of Emmett could show green again as early as fall, those grasses are not good feed for the elk and deer that winter in the area, McClendon said.

McClendon said hungry game might be driven onto private lands where ranchers grow hay for their cattle.

Idahoan told to pay back investors

BOISE (AP) — A Nampa man has been ordered to pay back \$3.8 million received from Minnesota investors, according to the Minnesota attorney general's office.

Theron Nelson, 48, also was ordered to pay \$20,000 in criminal fines and serve 90 days in jail for violations of Minnesota securities statutes.

The July 28 order by Douglas County District Court in Alexandria, Minn., gave Nelson five years to serve the jail time and pay the fines and restitution, or he must serve five years in federal prison.

Nelson pleaded guilty in January to willfully violating cease-and-desist order, selling securities without a license and two counts of selling unregistered securities. Nelson he nor his attorney could be reached for comment on Wednesday.

Nelson was arrested on a Minnesota court of soliciting more than \$5 million from friends and business

associates from 1982 to 1984. According to Janet Newberg, criminal prosecutor for the Minnesota Attorney General's Office, Nelson sent the money to J. David Dominehl, who promised to invest the money in foreign currency speculation and pay investors a 2-percent monthly profit.

Dominehl, of San Diego, never did invest the money, though he took about \$200 million from people across the country, Mrs. Newberg said. He now is serving a sentence in federal prison for mail fraud, bankruptcy fraud and tax evasion, she said.

Mrs. Newberg said Nelson has maintained throughout the case that he did not know Dominehl was operating an illegitimate business selling unregistered securities. Nelson he nor his attorney could be reached for comment on Wednesday.

In a settlement reached in April 1985 in 4th District Court, Nelson agreed to pay back the \$14 million, Klein said. He did not know how much he had paid back so far.

Nelson is a majority stockholder in Hidden Paradise Ranch, a resort area he is trying to develop in Fairfield, Klein said. Nelson offered investors a deal in which they paid \$5,000, to be invested in Dominehl's and the 2-percent monthly profit would be applied toward a lot on the Fairfield ranch. The idea, Klein said, was that investors "got the ranch" site without ever paying more than \$5,000. The sites sell for \$30,000.

Mrs. Newberg said Nelson is a high-level salesman with Amway, a national cleaning products firm, and is traveling around the country. She said he can often make up to \$400,000 a year selling for the company.

"We want him to continue making that income so that money is available to Minnesota consumers," she said.

"We asked for a road and we got kicked in the face. If we don't get cooperation it's going to be the end of the elk herd," Sidoway said.

Jefferson County Commissioner Paul Walker said Union Pacific trains approach the area near Roberts every winter and he doesn't understand why a car or pickup on the road would have more impact on the herd than a train running through the area.

Walker said for what it costs to conduct the environmental impact of the improvements four to five times over.

Lil Erickson of Idaho '86 and Rick Johnson of the Idaho Conservation League both oppose the road improvements which would stretch 8.8 miles.

Erickson said some farmers who have claimed they will take steps against the herd if they don't get the road are "venting their ire like a spoiled child."

Johnson said the road improvements would cause the elk to shy away on a one-half mile strip on either side of the thoroughfare. He said the improvements would cause a loss of hunting opportunities for the 10,000 eastern Idaho elk sportsmen. He said this would add

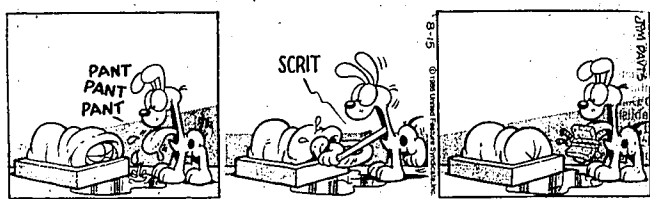

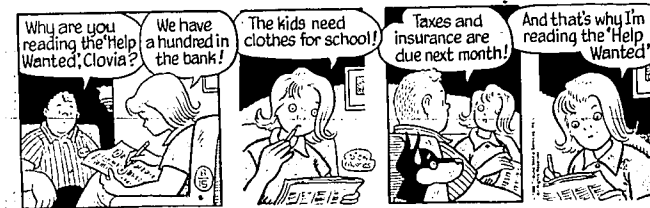

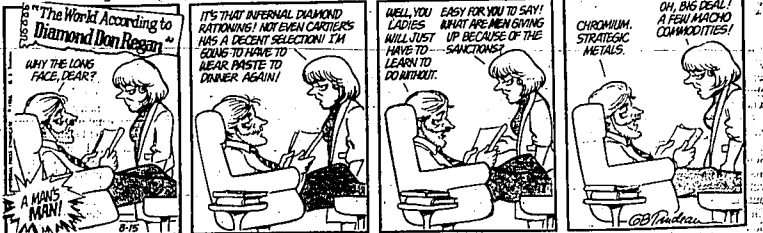

Viets free American; search fruitless

BANGKOK — Thailand — (AP) — Vietnam has freed an American who went there secretly last year searching for his fiancée he left behind when the war ended in 1973.

On Thursday he was in Bangkok en route to the United States.

The few friends to whom Robert Schwab III of Atlanta, Ga., revealed his plan said the Vietnam war veteran had been certain of capture but had hoped to reach Ho Chi Minh City, which was called Saigon until South Vietnam fell in April 1975.

They said his goal was to negotiate exit permits for his fiancée and a child he believed was his.

"I don't see that I have any choice," he wrote to a friend, Thomas O'Donnell, an American investment banker working in Hong Kong. "It's a little late, but now I'm going to get her out."

Richard Childress, director of Asian affairs for the U.S. National Security Council, was with Schwab in Bangkok. They could not be reached for comment.

Friends said Schwab, now 44, set sail from the Philippines in an 18-foot boat for a journey across 600 miles of water infested with pirates and regularly swept by typhoons. He carried water for about 70 days, and

basic navigation and communications gear but no weapons, they reported.

The official Vietnam News Agency, monitored here, said Thursday that Schwab was arrested April 23, 1985, for violating the communist nation's territorial waters and

committing acts "against the sovereignty and security of Vietnam."

It said the People's Committee of the province of Nghia Binh decided on Wednesday to expel Schwab.

Nghia Binh is on the eastern coast facing the South China Sea.

In Washington, White House spokesman Larry Speakes said Schwab was flown to Bangkok by helicopter and was declared to be in good physical condition after a medical checkup. Speakes said it was not known when Schwab would arrive in the United States.

Schwab's stepfather said in Atlanta that he had spoken with his stepson.

"We feel absolutely wonderful that he's fine, he's healthy, he's in good shape. He says all he needs is a little sunbat," Robert Davis said in an interview with radio station WGST.

The Vietnam News Agency said: "The American in question recognized that his acts constituted an infringement of the penal code of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam. He undertook not to repeat them and asked for clemency from the Socialist Republic of Vietnam."

It made no mention of Trai, the pseudonym Schwab used for his fiancée, whom he met during army ser-

vice in Vietnam in the early 1970s.

"Another White House spokesman, Dan Howard, said: "He came out alone; no girlfriend."

Friends said Trai was a teenager when Schwab met her, from a family that lost its wealth in the war.

O'Donnell, the investment banker, said in an interview with The Associated Press late last year that his friend spent 1½ years preparing his rescue mission, talking with refugees "boat people" and sailors who had piloted the South China Sea.

Schwab stayed on in South Vietnam after his army service, taking various civilian jobs. When the communists were closing in on Saigon, he was widely credited with selflessly helping evacuate Vietnamese civilians who had worked for the Americans.

He apparently was unable to take Trai's family out, and he was evacuated from the roof of the U.S. Embassy as the city was falling.

O'Donnell said Schwab re-established contact with Trai in 1981 and learned that she had been jailed twice for trying to flee Vietnam by boat. He also learned of the child.

U.S. officials made inquiries after he sailed from the Philippines on his search for Trai, but Vietnam initially said it knew nothing of him.

Actress plans attempt to bring out cousins

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actress Ruta Lee, who made headlines 22 years ago by rescuing her grandmother from behind the Iron Curtain, embarks today on a new mission to Lithuania to try to bring more relatives to America.

Miss Lee said Thursday that her return to the Soviet-bloc Baltic country was prompted by a letter she received from relatives there some time ago.

"The information was very sketchy, but apparently a cousin I had visited in Vilnius three years ago had been arrested, along with her husband, and their house had been confiscated," Miss Lee said as she packed her bags at her Laurel Canyon home.

"I wrote back to get more information but received no replies. Finally I heard from a second cousin who wrote that the family had been upset by the happenings — no explanation of what they were — and they were trying to pool their limited money to buy back the house so the couple would have a place to return to when they got out of prison."

"Apparently, there was going to be some kind of trial this month. I can't just sit here and do nothing."

The actress and her husband, Webster Lowe, will fly to Vilnius, where she hopes to gain permission for her cousin's three children, one of whom is adopted, to come to America.

"I'm going to bang on doors and say, 'Please help me!'" Miss Lee said. "I hope the spirit of (last month's) Goodwill Games in Moscow will prevail, along with the good feelings about a future meeting of

Mikhail Gorbachev and President Reagan.

"If all else fails, I have a court of last resort," she added, pointing to an autographed photo of Reagan.

Miss Lee, whose parents emigrated from Lithuania to Canada 50 years ago, spent 12 years trying to get Lithuanian permission for her grandmother, who lived in Siberia before being hospitalized in Vilnius, to come to the United States. Her grandmother made it to California in 1966.

"Grandmother, who was 90, knew only two words of English, and she said them as soon as she came off the plane: 'Hello, America.' She died two years, two months and two days after she arrived," Miss Lee said.

Ruta Lee has appeared in such films as "Seven Brides for Seven Brothers" and "Penny Face," as well as other TV films.

World Briefly

Car bomb kills 19 in Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — A car-bomb blew up in a busy Christian district Thursday, killing 19 people and wounding 90. Witnesses said the explosion tore whole balconies from apartment houses and hurled them through the air.

The blue Mercedes exploded at the entrance to a seven-story apartment building owned by President Amin Gemayel's family, about 100 yards from St. Joseph Hospital in the Dora district of Christian east Beirut. No members of the president's family lived in the building.

It was the fourth explosion in a deadly duel of car bombings that has killed 93 people and wounded 574 since July 22.

In another development, units loyal to Christian militia commander Samir Geagea crushed pro-Syrian rebels within his Lebanese Forces, the largest Christian militia, in a counterattack that coursed through three residential areas of east Beirut.

Dissident imprisonment upheld

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — A provincial supreme court, contradicting a previous ruling, on Thursday upheld the indefinite imprisonment without charge of dissidents.

A black student boycott spread, and the country's leading financial newspaper denounced a government proposal to give blacks a limited vote, saying the plan did not go far enough.

The student boycott, launched to protest the deployment of security forces on school grounds, affected dozens of schools in Soweto and other Johannesburg-area black townships.

Plot to kidnap Aquino revealed

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Defense Minister Juan Ponce Enrile said Thursday the military had uncovered a plot to kidnap President Corason Aquino and top government officials, and return Ferdinand E. Marcos to power.

Enrile said Marcos loyalists planned to kidnap the officials, seize the Malacanang presidential palace, communications centers and nine military camps around Manila.

Marcos said he was unaware of such a plan.

Soviets irked by Wall protests

BERLIN (AP) — The Soviet ambassador was rebuffed in his bid to make a formal protest to West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl of activities on the Berlin Wall's 25th anniversary, a Bonn government spokesman said Thursday.

The Soviet envoy, Yuli Kvitsinsky, tried to deliver the protest Wednesday after commemorations on both sides of the divided city. The activities included late-night protests in West Berlin and a military parade in East Berlin.

Bonn government sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the Soviets wanted to complain officially about alleged "terrorist acts" against East German soldiers guarding the wall.

West German newspapers prominently featured a photograph of a protester in West Berlin kicking an East German guard at the boundary between the two sectors. Elsewhere in West Berlin, protesters also taunted and jeered at East German guards.

Refugee mysteries remain

TORONTO (AP) — Fishermen who first spotted more than 150 Sri Lankan refugees crammed into two open lifeboats off the Newfoundland coast also noticed a large, stationary blip on their radar screens, officials said Thursday.

Coast Guard spokesman Bruce Reid said it was possible the blip was the freighter that carried the 145 men, six children and four women, who were rescued Monday.

It could also have been a large trawler or fogbound freighter, he added. "We're going through our records to check the vessels that reported in that day."

One chartered plane flew 132 of the refugees from St. John's, Newfoundland, to Montreal on Thursday, while others were taken aboard a separate plane. Some had relatives waiting to greet them.

The Sri Lankans, who have been given one-year permits to live and work in Canada, are mostly in their 20s.

They are Tamils, an ethnic minority group in the Indian Ocean Island, which has been wracked by civil warfare for the past three years. One said he was a member of the Tamil United Liberation Front and had been in hiding from the Sri Lankan armed forces.

The name of the freighter that carried the refugees to Canadian waters remains a mystery, and questions have grown over the refugees' claim to have paid up to \$5,000 to an Indian agency for passage to North America.

The Tamils say they set off from India on the night of July 7, spent all of their time below decks and were put off the freighter in lifeboats Aug. 6.

However, Rudolf Fischer, a West German state legislator, said he had information that the Sri Lankans left Jork, near the port of Hamburg, on July 27 bound for France, where they reportedly were to board a freighter for Canada.






LAHORE, Pakistan (AP) — Opposition leader Benazir Bhutto was arrested after denouncing the government at a Karachi rally on independence day Thursday.

Protests spread through the nation and police killed at least four people in Lahore.

Other opposition leaders issued a statement from hiding that demanded Miss Bhutto's immediate release. They accused President Mohammad Zia ul-Haq of starting a "bloodbath" and pledged a nationwide effort to overthrow him.



The righteous overlook sins of soap operas

HOLLYWOOD — To date, the legions of the righteous waging holy war against immorality in America have taken on movies, prime-time television, rock lyrics, cable programming, upscale skin mags and "Catcher in the Rye," not to mention alleged subliminal satanism in the Procter & Gamble label and the theme song from "Mr. Ed."

So much for the easy targets. But what about an entertainment medium that regularly brings to the television screen promiscuity, adultery, incest, endlessly serial marriages, drug abuse, violence and double-dealing of every imaginable variety, conduct often portrayed as normative behavior: where people who do good are not always rewarded and those who do evil are not punished?

You know, daytime soap operas. Last week alone there was seduction, illegitimate birth and divorce on "All My Children" and attempted rape, an alleged affair, voodoo and a back-street abortion on "As the World Turns," not to mention dirty doings at the Love mansion ("Another World"), pill addiction ("Capitol"), teen-age pregnancy ("Guiding Light"), suicide and even toxic cookies ("Santa Barbara").

Where are the Jerry Falwells and other custodians of the public morality when it comes to what the pandering promos call "love in the afternoon"? Why the conspicuous silence about network shows that breathlessly offer "passion in the heat of the desert in the heat of the day," complete with fleshy bedroom scenes, and are readily available to any youngster home from school?

Could it be that these dramas — with their ample supply of pre-, extra-, intra- and post-marital sex — are the secret vice of the "traditional family values" gang? After all, with dad at work and the kids at school, soap operas are the Total Woman's daytime home companion. Like most of us, the one thing modern-day Know Nothings may know is what they like, and it surely isn't art and Bible stories.

Not that evangelical leaders do not recognize the threat posed by the soap operas. The National Federation for Decency, headed by the Rev. Donald Wildmon, has noted the problem in its newsletter, but a spokeswoman for the Tugelo, Miss.-based organization said in a recent telephone interview that "we do not monitor soap operas. We do prime time only."

A recent broadcast of Pat Robertson's "700 Club" television show featured back-to-back segments on the issue. One was an interview with a Christian network soap opera star

who explained how he was fighting the immorality "from within," and that if he quit, some less principled actor might take his place.

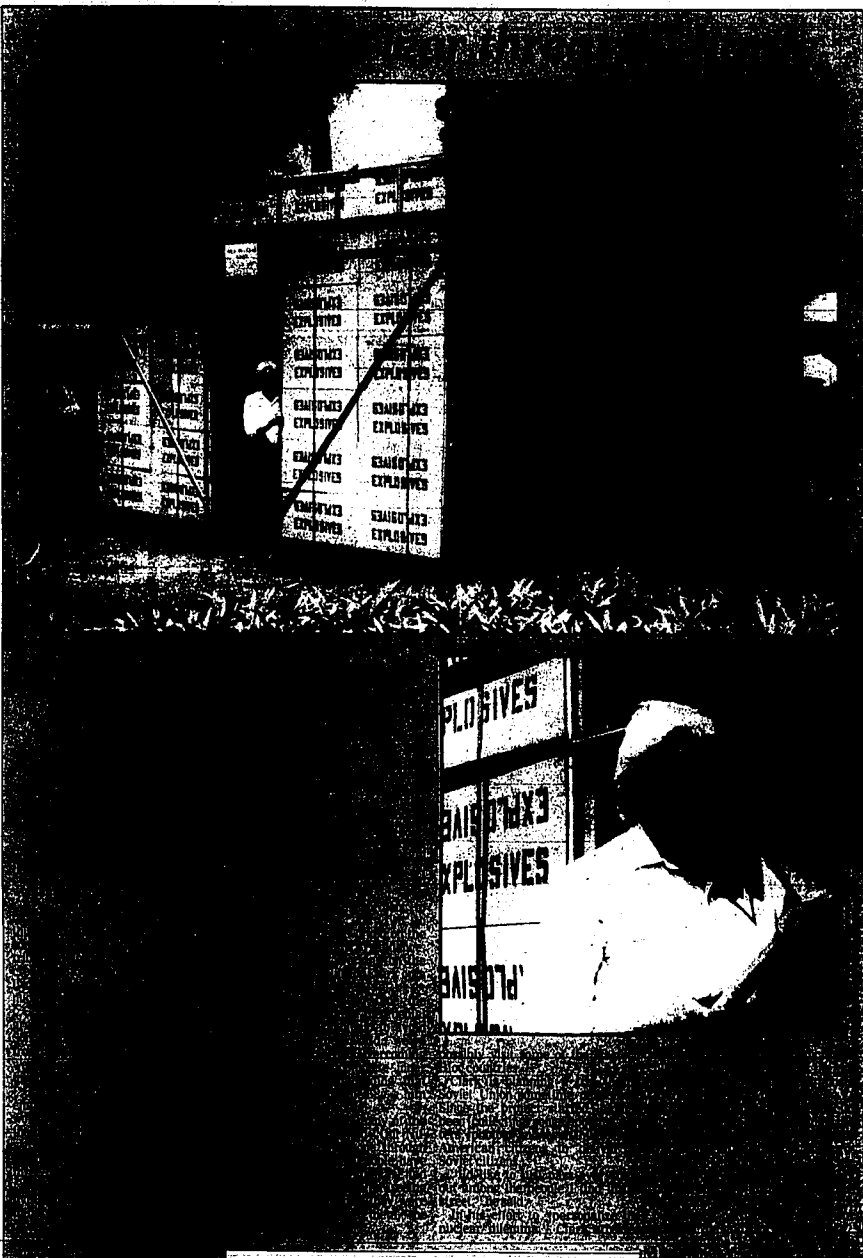
The other segment featured a farm housewife from Macon, Ga., whose afternoon viewing habits turned into "an obsession that began to threaten her marriage." Because of her soap-opera viewing, the woman explained over a dramatic re-creation of the incident, "my values had gotten so warped" that she had gone out and had an affair. A recent episode of the popular "General Hospital" that was to have included honeymoon bedroom play between two of the stars went so far that the network censored them, according to People magazine.

Despite such reports, there have been no public campaigns against the shows or any of the threats of mass-advertiser boycotts that have been so visible in the past, and the U.S. Commission on Pornography, which released its final report in July, did not consider soap operas. The silence of leading reformers on this subject probably has more to do with maintaining their base of support than upholding morality.

It is a tough job, weeding somebody else's secret garden. As the Meese Commission hearings demonstrated, the process inevitably becomes a matter of personal judgment and taste. Absent the elements of violence and children in visual depictions, it is often difficult to define the precise boundary between the sensual and the sexual, the erotic and the pornographic.

"Sexuality and nudity are a part of life, and it's appropriate," said Gloria Steinem, explaining why Ms. magazine accepted Calvin Klein's Obsession ad. "There's a difference between women in tight jeans — where the ads are aimed at pleasing men — and ads like the Calvin Klein Obsession ad, where a man and a woman are in positions of equality." When it comes to the written word, delineating what should be forbidden from what should be permitted is especially difficult. Thus Kurt Vonnegut in high school is dangerous for junior, but bodice-busting romances for mama are harmless. Florello LaGuardia, the late mayor of New York, issued the definitive judgment on censorship of literature, proclaiming that "no girl was ever ruined by a book."

Jesus is pretty tough on hypocrites, on one occasion admonishing those about to confront an adulterous woman: "He that is without sin among you, let him cast the first stone." Perhaps the absolutist abolitionists sense that taking on soap operas and romances just might result in some weeping and gnashing of teeth — not to mention some understanding for the rights of others — among the otherwise faithful.

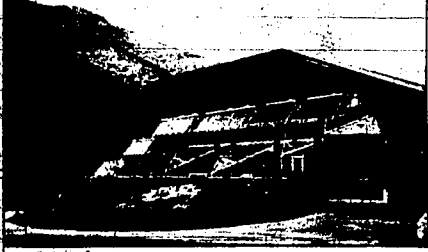

'Stand By Me' hits the heart of youth

HOLLYWOOD — As directed by Rob Reiner, "Stand By Me" is the summer's great gift, a compassionate, perfectly performed look at the real heart of youth.

It stands, sweet and strong, rife, outrageous and funny, like its heroes themselves; a bit gamy around the edges, perhaps, but pure and fine clear through. It is one of those treasures absolutely not to be missed.

The screenwriters, Raynold Gideon and Bruce A. Evans, have seen this trek by four tight buddies about to move into junior high school, with the greatest clarity. It will be a pivotal two days in which matters closest to the bone are revealed, but it is not treated importantly. Instead, the atmosphere is full of the great, crude, buddy, ripe banter of four 12-year-old boys, pre-girls, post-cigarettes and full-on to the mysteries of life. And death.

"Stand By Me" is told in the form of a memoir, as established writer Richard Dreyfuss, stunned by a local newspaper item about the death of a

close friend, sits in his car, remembering back to 1959. Then, in the late summer, he and his three friends had an instant of absolute perception: Who they were, what was around them, where they were going. Before the world blurred all the outlines.

(Dreyfuss' amused, ironic intelligence as the narrator and his bracketing scenes at the opening and close contribute enormously to the picture's tone.)

It should not turn anyone away from "Stand By Me" to learn that it is based on a novella by Stephen King, written with that scalding that feels like autobiography. What the movie may do is send readers back to some of King's less celebrated, less cranked-out stories to see if they can possibly match up to this one (which was called "The Body"). Whoa! Come back here. It really is not that kind of Stephen King story.

"The body" is what sets the boys on their adventure; actually, the breathless news that a pair from an older gang have spotted the body of a 12-year-old boy, missing since he went woodburying in these dense Oregon woods.

Circumstances keep the older gang at bay. The four younger boys determined that they will become the town's heroes by finding the body, meld their alibis and set off to see their first dead person.

"The body" may also mean this body of friends, four totally different, absolutely loyal kids whose strengths and weaknesses work together like one of those chain you make with four interlocking bands.

Gangs invariably have a natural leader, but the screenwriters (who wrote the lovely, undervalued "Starman") do not tell us, they show us why Chris (River Phoenix) heads this one. Slightly older than his buddies, he is tough but a peace maker, the one who acts instinctively in a crisis. With alcoholism and delinquency the major strains in his family, his view of his own future is blunted and sardonic; we see him for the princeling he is.

Slight, neat Gordie Lachance (Wil Wheaton), Chris' generous, adoring buddy, sees his friend's real qualities too. Wheaton makes Gordie's sensitivity tangible, but not effete. He is a gem.

Teddy Duchamp (Corey Feldman)

is, of all the boys, the one closest to the edge. Damaged and abused by his father, he still carries the Normanly Beach heroics that distinguished and traumatized his dad. What is heartbreaking about the rage-filled, daredevil Teddy is how easily he can go in either direction.

Chunky Vern Tessel (Jerry O'Connell) is a compendium of all our fears as kids: the one who will invariably forget the secret password knock, who is afraid of almost everything from heights to darkness. Earnest and sweetly dim, he is also outrageously lovable.

What a director Reiner has become. These four young actors (and, among the less differentiated roles of the older gang, Kiefer Sutherland) have a depth and understanding that makes each character soar and live for days after the film. They are simply brilliant. These are also roles with enormous risks to them, but Reiner has seen that his cast stays honest and his movie marvelously restrained; except for one scene, staged to be as marvelously gross and unrestrained as a kid's unfettered imagination can make it.

Book shows that Hitler, Nazis are good business

This is more than just the story of how newspaper tycoon Rupert Murdoch, renowned historian Hugh Trevor-Roper and the editors of West Germany's leading magazine, Stern, were taken in by a crude forgery, by humdrum chronicles written on postwar paper by a petty crook and passed off as the diaries of Adolf Hitler.

It also is a depressing but fascinating account of how the traffic in Hitler and Nazi memorabilia has become big business in both the United States and Europe.

In this book, we travel through a strange world, where rich American businessmen are paying ever-higher

prices for Hitler's undistinguished watercolors, where Hermann Goering's yacht is reconditioned at vast expense and put on public display, where a supposedly respectable investigative journalist comes to believe incredible stories that Martin Bormann is still alive and where forgeries of Nazi relics command thousands of dollars.

It is truly bizarre that a Maryland military dealer would sell lots of Eva Braun's hair for \$3,500 and that such items as Heinrich Himmler's glasses and a tablecloth that once belonged to the commandant of the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp would fetch good prices. Yet it is part and parcel of the morbid fascination that many still feel for Hitler.

In Britain the Elson Books publishing house was "built entirely on the strength of the public's fasci-

nation with the Nazis," writes author Robert Harris, a BBC journalist. He notes that the company's founder, Sidney Meyers, was anything but apologetic about the reasons for his success, quoting him as saying, "I don't want to end up as Hitler's publisher. I would hate to get the public was asick of it as I am. But they are not. The booksellers always want more. Hitler sells. Nazis sell. Swastikas sell — and they sell better and cover. It's the swastika on the cover that gets them. Nobody can out-swastika us. I've even thought of putting one on our vegetable cookbook because Hitler was a vegetarian."

So there is enough here to make one marvel at the perseverance of sordid tastes. And when the author gets down to telling the story of the manufacture of the Hitler diaries it is also a description of how some

leading journalists pandered to those tastes.

The truth is that the editors of Stern, the editors of Newsweek, the editors of the Sunday Times of London seemed little concerned about the quality of the so-called diaries. They were not a whit dissuaded from publishing them because they were utterly banal. They exerted little effort to get them truly authenticated. They hardly questioned even where they had been for nearly 40 years. They rushed to publish them, and were willing to pay millions of dollars for the privilege, because they had Hitler's name on them. It is a sad commentary.

Boy George falls from the top to rock bottom

LONDON (AP) — When he stroled on to the music scene four years ago, Boy George left audiences in an adrogous daze with his mascara, lipstick and thrift shop rags.

His first three albums with Culture Club sold platinum in the United States — a million or more copies, they won a Grammy award for best new artist, and swaggered in success. Then came a slow, artistic decline.

The witty, 25-year-old singer hit rock bottom in July when he pleaded guilty in a London court to possessing heroin and was fined \$370. His carefully crafted image as a clean-living, post-punk pop star was shattered by drug addiction.

"I flirted with it," he said in an interview with the British Broadcasting Co. "Unfortunately, I always thought I could control it, which is what any intelligent person thinks. ... I don't want to think of any excuse for what has happened. I am responsible for what I did — I can't blame anyone else."

Last week, a 27-year-old songwriter and keyboard player named Michael Rudelski was found dead in a London mansion owned by Boy George, whose real name is George O'Dowd. Scotland Yard said the New York musician had died of a drug overdose, but that Boy George was not involved.

"He is absolutely devastated by the whole thing," said David O'Dowd, a rock-music photographer

and Boy George's brother. "It has come at such a bad time. He was basically just getting over his own problems, and this has hit him straight in the face."

"It's a terrible nightmare," said his brother, Kevin, who discovered the body. "When's it all going to end?"

At their peak in 1982-83, Boy George and Culture Club — Roy Hay, Jon Moss and Mikey Craig — were raging through the world with such hits as "Kissing to Be Clever" and

"Karma Chameleon" and tunes that seemed a backlash against punk's harsh lyrics.

Then came the decline. Their string of chart-topping pop ditties, dominated by Boy George's soulful, instantly recognizable crooning, petered out. Adolescent fans lost interest and the Boy George lookalikes that had sprouted in New York, Tokyo and London vanished from the streets.

So Boy George cut off his dreadlocks, cheerfully admitted he

was bisexual and, after months of rumors about his dramatic weight loss and gaunt appearance, sought therapy for drug addiction.

His myth of sexlessness and distaste for drugs, which "music critics" said was crucial to his success, had exploded.

The publicity about his drug abuse will hurt, said ELLY SMITH of Virgin Records, Boy George's record label. He has already lost a \$1 million advertisement contract in Japan on a "morality clause," she said.

"My personal opinion is that he will continue in an artistic decline," said Danny Kelly, deputy editor of New Musical Express magazine. "It (the publicity) will do wonders for his profile in terms of appearing on

chat shows."

Boy George's appeal had been surprisingly broad. This 5-foot-1, big-shouldered man with the strong masculine voice was articulate, confident, funny, good-mannered.

His band's slick, soft rhythms were a melting pot of styles, and cracked Britain's black soul market, the mainstream Top 10 and pop single charts in more than 50 countries.

"Boy George made records that your grandmother would happily buy," Steve Sutherland, features editor of Melody Maker magazine, said in an interview. "He was the perfect puppy dog pop star, a character who looked absolutely outrageous but at the same time was very accessible."

CBS news division loses morning slot

NEW YORK — Gene F. Jankowski, president of the CBS Broadcast Group, smiled gamely when asked if one might conclude that when it comes to creating a competitive morning program, CBS in recent years has been the gang that could not shoot straight.

"Quite the contrary," he insisted, despite much uproar over CBS' most recent major attempt to concoct a winning plan and its subsequent decision to end after December the nearly 23-year saga of the troubled, low-rated "CBS Morning News."

And, he said, "I'm afraid there is a lot of misunderstanding" by some in CBS News that "what they considered their property" "was suddenly taken out of their hands and they no longer were going to be a contributor. Nothing could be farther from the truth."

Next January, the "Morning News" will be history. CBS News will not have the program's time slot then, either. It has been announced that a new special unit created in the broadcast group will run CBS' next attempt in the morning ratings race.

It also may mean a finale for what now is known as the "CBS Early

Morning News," which precedes the two-hour program. CBS News President Van Gordon Sauter said that the new unit will be responsible for the entire early morning time slot each weekday.

He declined to say if this also means the end for the "Early Morning News," saying that "it's premature to speculate about it at this stage ... there's going to be a significant news presence there, but what form it will take has not been decided."

Sauter, to whom the new morning-show unit will report in his capacity as an executive vice president of the broadcast group, was asked if the new unit is a stopgap measure and if the morning effort eventually will be assigned to CBS Entertainment.

"Well, there's no plan for it to do so now," he said. "I don't think that's part of anybody's vision."

In recent years, uncertainty has periodically been the news at the "Morning News," what with changing anchors, producers and formats, and now CBS' decision, made after strong pressure from affiliates to create a contender, to take the time from CBS News.

The news division's efforts to date have resulted only in a program that remains a distant third in ratings to

NBC's front-running "Today Show" and ABC's second-place "Good Morning America."

(The latest available Nielsen for the week ending Aug. 1, show that the "Morning News" had an average rating of 2.7 compared to 4.9 for "Today" and 4.2 for ABC's entry. Each ratings point represents 659,000 homes.)

The lasting legacy of the "Morning News" includes the controversial nine-month stay of Phyllis George, the subsequent exit after only 11

months of co-anchors Forrest Sawyer and Maria Shriver, a shift in emphasis from hard news to lighter fare that emulates that of the competition and a succession of five executive producers in seven years.

McEnroe and Lendl lose in Toronto

TORONTO (AP) — Kevin Curran used his booming serve to bounce up-seeded Ivan Lendl and Robert Seguso slowed John McEnroe's comeback, headlining a string of upsets Thursday in third-round play at the \$50,000 Player's International tennis tournament.

Lendl lost for just the fourth time this year, losing 7-6 (7-5), 7-6 (8-6) to the powerful Curran. Lifetime Curran, a native of South Africa who is now a U.S. citizen, holds a perfect 3-0 record over the world's No. 1 player.

Seguso of Prairie Oaks, Fla., defeated the fifth-seeded McEnroe 4-6, 6-3, 7-5. McEnroe took seven minutes off the tour — for various reasons — before returning last week in the Volvo International at Stratton Mountain, Vt., where he lost to Boris Becker in the semifinals.

Joining Curran and Seguso in the

quarterfinals — will be American Jonathan Canter, who downed third-seeded Yannick Noah of France 3-6, 7-5, 6-4. In another upset, Bud Schultz downed fellow American, No. 7 seed Brad Gilbert, 3-6, 6-3, 6-3 and South Africa's Christo Steyn took out American Jimmy Arias, the No. 8 seed, 6-3, 6-1.

Seguso, the No. 12 seed, used a strong return of service and good second serve to derail McEnroe.

McEnroe appeared shaky on the big points. Leading 4-3 with a break and serving in the third set, McEnroe could not hold the crucial game losing it at 30 on a beautiful backhand passing shot by Seguso.

Then at 5-6 and serving, McEnroe went up 30-love but dropped the next four points, the match point coming on a great return of serve.

"John wasn't as sharp as he usually is," said Seguso. "He was hitting

the ball all right but I think he needs more match play.

"On a lot of shots he was unsure of himself. He wasn't as good on the big points."

The final shot, a return of serve off a patented McEnroe slice to the ad court was returned cross-court and by the charging McEnroe who could only push it wide.

"It was a lucky shot; I mis-hit it totally," said Seguso with a grin. "I just swung and wham."

Lendl said he wasn't surprised by his defeat, because of the way Curran was serving.

"When he plays well he's usually pretty effective with his serve, so I was not surprised," said Lendl of Curran's first serve which produced 15 aces. "But he didn't do anything, he was just serving."

"Then he took chances in both tiebreakers. He would come in on

anything and hope I wouldn't pass him which happened."

The first set reached 6-6 following two service breaks by both players.

The key came in the 11th game when Curran fell behind love-40 but rallied on two aces to get to deuce, then took the game with another ace forcing Lendl to hold serve to get to the first tiebreaker.

At 5-5 in the tiebreaker and the Czechoslovakian serving, Curran got a break when a Lendl forehand hit the net and popped wide.

On set point Curran took the set with an ace down the middle.

There were no breaks in the second set and in the tiebreaker with Curran having a match point at 6-5, he missed a forehand from the baseline.

But incredibly, Lendl came back with two ace faults and Curran clinched the match with his second match point.

Rodeo Cassia roping leaders? Don't even need to ask

BURLEY — We've got the leaders in team roping after the first go-round of the Cassia County Rodeo on Thursday. You might have heard of them. Couple guys out of Caldwell by the name of Mike Beers and Dee Pickett.

Beers, a National Finals Rodeo veteran, and Pickett, the 1984 Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association all-around champion, joined forces Thursday night to finish off their steer in 6.4 seconds — nearly a second faster than the best team roping time here last year.

In second at 7.5 seconds was the team of Challis' Tim Ingram and Gene Jett of Garden City, Kan.

During an evening dominated by pokes from outside of Idaho, Beers and Pickett, the '84 World Champion team ropers, protected the home state pride with their finish, which came after Beers clocked an 8.7-second effort in calf roping to take the lead in that event.

Beers topped the two initial top scorers: Chino Valley, Ariz., hand Brad Smith, at 10.1, and Gooding's Benny Stevens, who finished in 10.5.

But the go-round's wildest performance came in the saddle bronc competition where Clay Blanhorn of Las Vegas went airborne on a horse named Deception, the name fit, as Deception sat frozen in the

gate for five seconds before exploding into the arena.

Blanhorn's effort earned him a score of 77 and a five-point lead over second-place Vince Garcia, a Lee, Nev. cowboy who scored 72 points. Tracy, California's Albert Aguayo was third with 68 points.

Crowd-pleasing Bobby DeVechio, the Concrete Cowboy from New York City, protected his reputation by grabbing the bull riding lead with a powerful 74-point ride, ahead of Nipomo, California's Jack McCugan and his 69-point effort and Pocatello's Rod Speelman, who finished at 68.

The bareback riding competition was a Utah show as Duane France of Hyrum scored 69 atop Sure Fire, Tim Rydalc of Stockton rode Silver Bullet for 66.

Flossy scores mean nothing in 2nd round of International

CASTLE ROCK, Colo. (AP) — Ray Floyd picked up his golf ball, put it in his pocket and walked in from the golf course Thursday — but he still qualified for second-round play in the new, \$1 million international tournament.

"What difference does it make?" Floyd, the current U.S. Open champion asked after playing just 17 holes in the second half of first round play.

The answer was that it didn't matter at all.

At least not on this stormy day, when play was interrupted on two occasions by thunderstorms.

But it will matter tomorrow. They're changing the rules.

"This is something new," Jack Nicklaus noted wryly. "We'll probably be getting new rules every day."

Nicklaus, who designed the Castle Pines Golf Club course that is hosting the new tournament and its unusual, controversial scoring system, obviously was miffed after he finished with a medal score of par 72, and thought he failed to advance to the second round.

"I shoot 72 with two birdies and two bogeys. And somebody else shoots 72 with six birdies and six bogeys and he's killing me."

It's stupid," Nicklaus said. He had two points under the modified Stableford scoring system in which medal scores do not count and scoring is based on points awarded on each hole: 1 for a double eagle, 1½ for an eagle, two for a bogey and minus one for bogey or worse.

Under that system, Floyd's point total reached 14 when he dropped an 18-foot eagle putt on the 17th hole.

Floyd simply decided to take the maximum penalty of the final hole — minus three points, reducing his total to 11 — and call it a day. After all, there is no reward for high point totals at this stage of the tournament. Points are not carried forward, so, until the final round, there are no leaders, only survivors.

"I think it was an intelligent decision," said Floyd, who had five birdies, the eagle and a bogey — and was credited with a double bogey on the 18th.

But it prompted a ruling from PGA Tour Commissioner Deane Beman that, through the remainder of the tournament, players will be required to complete their rounds.

Bruce Lietzke tied Floyd for high points, not that it matters, with 11. He had six birdies and a bogey.

"The only regret I have is that I leave a card with 67 on it in the scor-

ing tent. It doesn't go forward," Lietzke said.

PGA champion Bob Tray finished with birdies on the last two holes to get in with two points and place himself among the 39 survivors of 81 starters who will go to Friday's second round. Another 81 players completed for 39 spots in the first half of the first round Wednesday.

Those 81 players again will play for 39 spots Friday. On Saturday, the 39 survivors will be reduced to 12 for Sunday's final round.

Tom Watson also advanced with four points on four birdies and four bogeys.

Ben Crenshaw didn't make it; He had zero points, and four players with one point played off for the 39th position.

Calvin Peete was another of those who didn't advance. He had minus five points when the first of two storm delays occurred and he chose not to finish.

Sheehan takes two-shot lead at LPGA-Nestle world finals

BUFORD, Ga. (AP) — Patty Sheehan, breaking out of a two-shot lead, won a 5-under-par 67 Thursday to take the first-round lead in the \$240,000 Nestle World Championship women's golf tournament.

"I'm speechless," Sheehan said. "I am so happy. I haven't had a round like that since the last round of the LPGA Championship."

The bogey-free round on the 6,037-yard Stuffer Pineisle Resort course gave Sheehan a two-shot lead over Stacy King and Chris Johnson in the elite event with a limited field of only 12 players battling for the LPGA's richest first prize — \$78,000.

The field consists of the top 11 money winners on this year's tour plus Nancy Lopez, who qualified by winning the Vare Trophy in 1985.

Lopez, who gave birth to her second daughter in May, had not completed this year, until finishing in a tie for third last week in the Henredon Classic. She was one of five players with 73s, highest round of the season.

Sheehan, who hasn't had a top 10 finish in her last six tournaments; made her surge to the lead late in the round, with birdies on three of the last five holes.

She made the turn at 34 after sinking birdie putts of 10 feet at No. 5 and 3 feet at No. 8.

Sheehan put a pitching wedge to within 3 feet for a birdie on No. 14 and then scored from 1 1/2 feet on 16 and from 7 feet on 17.

"I haven't been worried about it (slump) because I knew one of the things I'd come out of it," Sheehan

said. "This is such a prestigious tournament that I better play well or get left in the dust."

Sheehan saved pars with chips to within 7 and 3 feet on the 12th and 13th greens before pulling away down the stretch for the lead.

"This was a real solid round," she said. "I played very well."



Long-running game show profits from national fixation on prices

If word association is your forte, you tune into "The \$25,000 Pyramid." If you get a kick out of watching normal Americans scramble through their handbags for bric-a-brac they can swap for cash, Monty Hall and the costumed contestants of "Let's Make a Deal" beckon. But what if you like money? According to Bob Barker, you watch "The Price Is Right."

"The show's basic premise is a powerful one," says the veteran game-show host who is entering his 14th season on the CBS show. "Everyone can identify with prices. I don't care if you're a university president or a New York cabbie or an Iowa farmer. You still care about how much you pay for something."

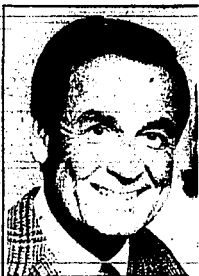
Americans must be getting concerned over the do-re-mi — in addition to its weekday scheduling, "The Price Is Right" can now be seen on Thursday evenings for the next five weeks.

But pricing Whirlpool dryers and guessing the bottom line on blenders aren't the only things that appeal to "Price Is Right" viewers. That bastion of game-show charm, Bob Barker, has a lot to do with it. His small-screen affability and tenure is what prompted the Guinness Book of World Records to dub him TV's "Most Durable Performer" for his 18 years on "Truth or Consequences." And over a decade on "The Price Is Right" isn't peanuts, either.

"I don't believe TV hosts are any more similar than second basemen," insists Barker. "Each is a completely different personality."

"When you're on TV for as long as I've been, it's difficult to be anything but yourself. The TV camera has a way of boring in and seeing you for what you are. You have to ask my viewers why I've lasted so long."

"The Price Is Right" has endured the daytime-TV ratings jungle to the point that the occasional blooper and audience-participation faux pas that would make newer shows' hosts cringe are standard fare for Barker.

"Oh, things go wrong," admits Barker airily. "But they're often more amusing than anything else. Once one of our models came out with a car, and she was so busy smiling that she walked right into a wall."

"Another time during a commercial a woman went into labor and I called for the attendants to get her

an ambulance. 'Oh, I don't want to go,' she cried, 'you might call my name.'"

Then Barker chuckles, recalling the most infamous contestant of all: The Woman in the Tank Top. "We called her name, she came on down, and they came on out."

And through the shrieking contestants, child-birthing and cleavage, Bob Barker has emerged unscathed. Directing the steady parade of eager contestants and retail prices, he has only one goal in mind: entertainment.

"It's stimulating trying to get an audience to laugh," says Barker. "It's like mining for gold; you're constantly looking for the nugget that you can have fun with."

Lynn Herring, "General Hospital's" current bad lady, the first in a long spell, could be just what the doctor ordered. For "Hospital" has been off its feet lately, sending viewers to the opposition, notably "Santa Barbara," the new kid on the block, inching up in the ratings.

Lucy appeared this spring as the mousy librarian who turned into a dish after dark. She lied on the sand for pal Kevin, accused of murder, got caught at it and was supposed to be written off.

But fans were intrigued by devious Lucy, and boss Gloria Monty decided to keep Coe on. That cut into Lynn's sideline, studying for her masters degree in psychology at nearby Loyola College. The wife of former "Days of Our Lives" star Wayne (Roman Brady) Northup was also moonlighting as Ricardo Montalban's secretary Lena on "The Colbys," little bits since Lena is mostly ornamental.

"Acting comes first," says Lynn. "I thought I wanted to do counseling. But Lucy turns out to be more fun. No one knows what to make of Lucy. She's smart and shifty, very good at manipulating people. I want to know more about her."

Meanwhile, fans want to know about Lynn Herring, a charmer who can play ugly or stunning. 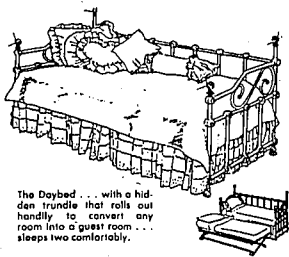

NBC's balance of programming wins yet another ratings victory

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC demonstrated programming balance with Top 20 series on four nights last week to post a 2½-point ratings victory, meaning it averaged 2.2 million more viewing households a night than No. 2 CBS.

Figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. for the week of Aug. 4-10 showed NBC with an average rating of 12.8 to CBS' 10.3 and ABC's 9.9. A single ratings point equals 859,000 homes with television.

As usual, NBC's blockbuster Thursday night lineup paced the triumph with its comedies taking Nielsen's first four positions last week. "The Cosby Show" had a 25.8 rating and 50 share, meaning half the sets on were tuned to the Huxtables. "Family Ties" had a 24.0, followed by "Cheers" and "Night Court."

NBC also was represented in the Top 20 by "Miami Vice" on Friday (No. 7), "The Golden Girls" on Saturday (No. 11), "You Again?" and "Gimme a Break" on Wednesday (Nos. 13 and 15, respectively), the movie "The Elephant Man" on Monday (No. 19) and "Hill Street Blues" on Thursday (No. 20).

In the rest of the Top 20, CBS' "Murder, She Wrote" was fifth; CBS



"Kate & Allie" was sixth; CBS' "60 Minutes," eighth; CBS' "Newhart," ninth; ABC's "Who's the Boss?" 10th; the CBS movie "He's Fired, She's Hired," 11th; ABC's "Perfect Strangers," 14th; ABC's "Moonlighting" and ABC's "20-20," tied for 16th; and CBS' "Cagney & Lacey," 18th.

The "Hill Street Blues" episode featured a flashback to when Capt. Frank Furillo and Joyce Davenport began their courtship, a reminiscence sparked by an assassination attempt on Furillo. CBS' competition was the second part of the "Christopher Columbus" miniseries, which ranked 54th among 63 shows with a 7.2 rating. The first part of the miniseries, on Wednesday, had a 6.8 rating.

"Miniseries generally do not repeat well," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice president for research

projects.

Perhaps most surprising was the performance by "The Elephant Man," not a commercial hit in the theaters. Even NBC expected it to perform the way the highbrow "A Death of a Salesman" and "Hunchback of Notre Dame" did when they sank to the bottom of the ratings the previous two weeks.

"We're as surprised as anybody that it worked that well," Jaffe said. "But you have to remember, it went against (ABC's) 'Monday Night Baseball.' That's the difference."

Even with ABC generally opting for teams in the major markets of New York, Los Angeles and Chicago, "Monday Night Baseball" has averaged only a 9.3 rating this season, down 2 percent from last year. Last week's game, either Chicago White Sox vs. Boston or Los Angeles Dodgers vs. Houston, had a 9.6 rating and ranked 43rd.

But the big news the first day of this week's Nielsen ratings period was that the first episode of Phil Donahue's "The Human Animal" surpassed NBC's expectations and easily won the night. The first installment of five consecutive hourlong specials had a 20.8 rating, 37 share of the viewing audience. NBC had predicted a 25 share.

CBS tries a Thursday game show gambit

NEW YORK (AP) — "The Price Is Right," coming to prime time tonight for six weeks, is part of a larger game show called "Let's Throw Something Against the Wall and See If It Sticks Against 'Cosby.'"

NBC's top-rated "Cosby Show" has forced CBS and ABC to resort to unusual, even desperate measures.

Since losing is a foregone conclusion, ABC will take its lumps with dignity this season, sacrificing "Our World," a new historical news program. This comes after much more expensive entertainment series, including one about ghosts ("Shadow Chasers") and "Ripley's Believe It or Not," didn't dent the weekly 50 percent audience share for "Cosby."

CBS also is trying cheaper anti-"Cosby" programming, but won't gain prestige points with new hour-long episodes of "The Price Is Right." Although billed as a limited

experiment, CBS could put "Price" on the fall schedule if the home audience plays "The Ratings Are Right."

Last season, CBS' victim against "Cosby" was "Magnum, P.I.," which now has found safer haven against ABC's "Dynasty" on Wednesdays. CBS' "Simon & Simon" will move up an hour to challenge "Cosby" this fall.

"If 'Price' can get its current 9.3 daytime rating, it would be one of our most successful programs against 'Cosby,'" said Dave Poltrack, CBS' vice president for research. Last season, "Cosby" averaged a 34 rating, or 29.2 million households with TV.

The daytime "Price Is Right," on CBS since 1972, is this season's No. 1 network game show. Like the prime-time version, it stars Bob Barker.

There also is a syndicated "Price

Is Right," with Dennis James. On many stations, including 17 CBS affiliates, the syndicated "Price" is on at 7:30 p.m. Eastern time, the so-called prime-time access period before "The Cosby Show."

Forty other CBS affiliates run "Wheel of Fortune," the highest-rated syndicated series ever, just before prime time.

Monday Night Football to pare highlights?

NEW YORK (AP)—A broadcast sign you may see on "Monday Night Football" this season: "Hi Mom. Hi Frank. Where Are My Halftime Highlights?"

Since ABC's traveling side show of pro football and amateur entertainment began in 1970, the break between halves has been filled with key clips from Sunday's NFL action.

Highlights this season will get less emphasis. In a break with tradition, 3½ minutes of network news and two minutes of local news will serve as ABC's main defense against America raiding the refrigerator.

In addition, ABC will have 3½ minutes of sports that may include some highlights. The rest of the 15-minute halftime will be filled with commercials.

Halftime clips, once the province of Howard Cosell's enthusiastic and bombastic narration, are not the draw they once were. With characteristic humility, Cosell would say they lost appeal when he left the broadcast last season. But that's not telling it like it is.

"Howard brought a certain flair to the highlights," said Dennis Lewin, ABC Sports' senior vice president for production. "But even when Howard was doing them, they had lost some impact."

The culprit is advanced video technology, now enabling CBS and NBC to give viewers a potpourri of highlights on Sunday and local stations and cable networks to do more of the same Sunday night and Monday.

The change is also linked to pressure by ABC affiliates, which

lose audience and revenue because their late-night news is delayed by the game. The local news presence at halftime might stave off some dial-switching at 11 p.m.

"To some degree local stations were victims of 'Monday Night Football,'" Lewin said. "It disrupted local news viewing habits."

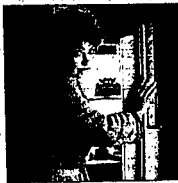
However, ABC's national news segments, giving ABC anchor Peter Jennings a prime-time forum, will have twice the time allotted to local news, leaving some affiliates grumbling about ABC's priorities.

"We're having a journalistic discussion with ABC," said Bob Regalbuto, vice president-general

manager of KSTP-TV in Minneapolis. "We feel we can serve our community better by taking the entire window and doing local news. We'll run their spot (the network commercial). This is not a business decision, it's a journalistic decision."

"Monday Night Football" will sport other changes this year: Gone are athlete announcers Joe Namath, after one season, and O.J. Simpson, after three. The three-man booth, an ABC prime-time trademark, gets roomier with the reconstituted duo of Al Michaels, on play-by-play, and Frank Gifford, who moves from play-by-play to analysis.
