PUC gives Idaho Power partial 2nd chance

BOISE — The Idaho Public Utilities Commission has agreed to reconsider only part of its July order denying almost all of Idaho Power Co.'s \$66.2 million rate-bike request. In a 37-page order issued Thursday, the PUC announced hearings Oct. 29-31 in Twin Falls to reconsider some of the issues raised by Idaho Power, as well as Attorney General Jim Jones and Idaho Consumer Affairs.

chosen not to rehear some very major issues." The commission's July 11 decision granted Idaho Power only \$981,000 of its rate increase request, raising rates only one-third of 1 percent. There were three major disagreements in the case between the company, PUC staff and intervenors, including the Valmy II coal-fired generating plant in northern Nevada, Idaho Power's allowable return on investment, and the selection of water year used in calculating the utility's power-supply costs. The commission said it would reconsider its decision not to allow Idaho Power any profit on its \$132.2 million Valmy II investment until the plant is needed by Idaho customers. The PUC also will take another look at the company's allowable rate of return on investment and several other points. Idaho Consumer Affairs argued the 12.75 percent equity return allowed in the July order was too high. But the PUC rejected Idaho Power's request to reconsider the water-years issue, saying the 57-year period used by the company, 1929-86, made cost estimates

unrealistically high because it included the drought years of the 1930s. Commissioners in July ordered use of the 20-year period 1966-85, which they said better reflected Idaho Power's hydroelectric generating potential. Taylor said the water-years issue accounted for \$18.5 million of the total rate request. About \$12.5 million per year of the rate request was sought to help recover the Valmy II investment. But critics, including Jones and Idaho Consumer Affairs, said the commission erred in allowing Idaho Power to charge ratepayers too much for operating costs that Sierra Pacific Power Co. Idaho Power, in its petition for reconsideration, contended the PUC order disallowing a return on investment was "unreasonable, unlawful, erroneous, unduly discriminatory, and not conforming with the facts and the law." But besides granting reconsideration based on Idaho Power's request, the commission also granted Jones' request for a reexamination of Idaho Power's investment in Valmy I, another 250-megawatt coal-fired plant in northern Nevada which the company owns.

EPA may ban Dinoseb use

Linked to some birth defects

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency said Thursday that the insecticide-herbicide dinoseb — widely used on fields of soybeans, potatoes, cotton and peanuts — may cause birth defects. The agency warned pregnant women to avoid contact with the toxic agricultural chemical in the fields or by handling contaminated clothing. But there is little danger associated with eating foods sprayed with dinoseb, the agency said. The EPA said it has received studies indicating dinoseb has caused irreversible neurological and skeletal malformations in the offspring of lab animals exposed to the chemical. EPA's announcement also said other studies show dinoseb causing sterility in male rats and mice. But Al Heier, an agency spokesman, said officials believe dinoseb poses less risk to men than it does to pregnant women.

For women, Heier said, the biggest danger appears to lie in the first three months of pregnancy — a time when some women do not know they are pregnant. Deputy EPA Administrator James Barnes said the agency plans to take prompt steps to regulate dinoseb, which is an active ingredient in about 180 commercial products, none of them intended for use by homeowners. Heier said that the regulatory steps could be as strong as a ban on dinoseb if the agency concludes its risks to humans greatly outweigh its value to farmers. "It looks like it's going in that direction," he said. "We'll take strong action as we can consistent with the evidence." Heier said the action could be announced as early as next month. Barnes said in a prepared statement that "the dangerous routes of exposure (to dinoseb) are inhalation and skin absorption by people applying the pesticide in the field." Workman free after hearing

JEROME — Mary Susanne Workman, 40, was free Thursday afternoon to return to California and resume nurse's training, cleared of a first-degree murder charge. Workman was released at the close of a three-day preliminary hearing in which 5th District Magistrate John Varin of Fairfield ruled that the state had failed to meet the burden of proof needed to hold her for district court trial in the shooting death of her step-father.

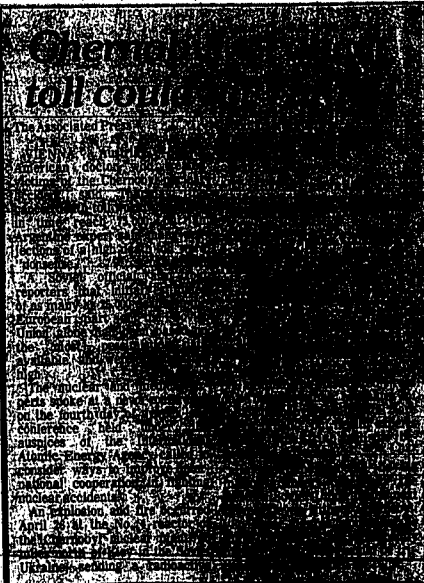
Workman was charged last month with first-degree murder in the Oct. 10, 1985, death of John Slater, 81. Slater and his wife Pauline, 68, died of gunshot wounds in their mobile home in Jerome on that date. Both were shot in the head. Workman was not charged in the death of her mother, however. Varin took the preliminary hearing testimony and evidence under advisement at mid-afternoon Thursday and returned with his decision at about 4 p.m., dismissing all charges. In explaining his decision, Varin said the state had not met its burden of proof and had not established the necessary probable cause for binding the defendant over to district court for trial. Showing stress from her ordeal, Workman put her head on her arms on the defense table and sobbed when the decision was announced. She and her daughter, Janet Robinette of Jerome, then hugged and cried in relief after three tense days of court proceedings. "I am so pleased that it's over, for myself and for my family that has stood by me through the whole time," she said. "I think it was a case of See WORKMAN on Page A2

Tired crews mop up Anderson Creek fire area

Fire crews, finally having contained the stubborn Anderson Creek fire after an 18-day battle, were mopping up the 18,400 acres of charred timber and brush Thursday as a Forest Service team moved in to map a plan for rehabilitating the burned land. "There's no problem," Boise National Forest spokesman Lee Slinger said. "We've had no reports of fire breaking out across the fire line." The blaze had commanded the attention of up to 2,000 firefighters at its peak before it was declared contained late Wednesday after destroying as much as \$4.2 million in resources, mostly commercial timber. Four firefighters died in a truck crash earlier this week, and investigators say they will never know the reason for the fatal accident. Crew strength on the fire was being reduced, but over 500 firefighters backed up by heavy equipment remained on the line Thursday, dousing hotspots and patrolling the 49-mile perimeter. "There's still some fuels out there that need to be watched," spokesman Jim Sorenson said. "This is the time when logs out there that have been smoldering for days can turn and roll down a hill, spreading the fire again."

No target for full control of the fire has been established, Sorenson said. Although over 250 firefighters were released from the blaze, hundreds more were still being held in reserve against the possibility another round of thunderstorms and lightning could fan new fire-ups. "With the erratic kinds of winds you get with a thunderstorm, anything can happen," Sorenson said. "There's no question it still worries us." Bulldozers moved into the blackened area for initial rehabilitation work to minimize erosion this fall and winter while an eight-man team worked on a more comprehensive long-range rehabilitation plan.



Too many Mrs. Cooks could spoil rites but only 1 shows up

FORT WORTH, Texas — Eddie Cooks' marital troubles in life didn't stop with his death, causing chaos for a funeral director when three women insisted they were Cooks' widow. But only one of the three women showed up at Thursday's funeral, and director Gregory Spencer said afterward, "Things went beautifully. It was a lot better than I thought." Spencer said he had never confronted three grieving widows of the same man in 17 years in the business.

Cooks, 62, was divorced from at least one woman, left a widower by another and is being claimed as the husband of three others, who wanted to be listed in the obituary and ride in a limousine at the funeral, Spencer said. A fourth woman who didn't identify herself called the funeral home, claiming to be a gravestone in Cedar Hill Memorial Park. Mrs. Cooks refused to comment on her claim. Several of the mourners said they did not know about the multiple claims of widowhood until reading news accounts, and no one could clear up the confusion. Cooks' four brothers and seven sisters attended the services, as did Helen Cooks, who says she married Cooks on April 15, 1955, and

lived with him for about 12 years. She says Cooks told her his marriage to his first wife was annulled. She was dressed in black and sat near Cooks' family at True Vine Missionary Baptist Church, where more than 200 mourners filled the room, then she joined the family at a graveside in Cedar Hill Memorial Park. Mrs. Cooks refused to comment on her claim. Several of the mourners said they did not know about the multiple claims of widowhood until reading news accounts, and no one could clear up the confusion. A. Z. Tucker, who said he had known Cooks

for several years, said "He was just an ordinary guy, a nice fellow. . . I knew him but I didn't know about all these wives." Cooks was a chicken processor until he retired two years ago. He died a week ago after being struck by a car while crossing a Fort Worth street. The body was taken to Spencer's funeral home. Within two days women began calling. Spencer solved at least part of his predicament by taking direction from the person paying the bills — Cooks' niece. On her instructions, only Cooks' brothers and sisters were listed in the obituary. Another Mrs. Cooks, Afree "Effie"

Johnson Cooks, says she married Cooks in 1951 and has the marriage license to prove it. She says they separated after about a year but never were divorced. A third woman claiming to be Mrs. Cooks says she lived with Cooks as a common-law wife in recent years. Spencer said, "Letha Davis said she met Cooks 10 years ago and they lived together ever since. Eddie Cooks was married to two other women, Jessie and Cora Cooks, Spencer said. Jessie Cooks died, leaving him a widower, and he subsequently married and was divorced from Cora Cooks.

Searching for 'final victory,' 2nd group enters lottery fight

BOISE (AP) — A second group joined the battle over Idaho's ballot initiative on a state lottery — but the one wants to defeat the initiative at the ballot box, not in the courts.

A new group, Help Idaho Thrive, said it wants a "final victory" against the lottery at the polls, not a "temporary" solution through a court ruling.

Boise attorney Stanley Crow on Thursday asked the Idaho Supreme Court to delay a ruling on court action challenging legality of a lottery initiative.

Backers of the initiative gathered enough signatures to put the question before voters in November. The action came after the Idaho Legislature refused to allow a proposed constitutional amendment allowing a lottery, to go before the voters.

The Associated Taxpayer of Idaho, a lobby organization, filed legal action earlier, asking the Idaho Supreme Court to remove the initiative from the ballot, contending it is unconstitutional.

But Crow said his group opposes that strategy, because it would settle the lottery issue, and if the lottery initiative is removed from the ballot, it will come back to the Idaho Legislature as a constitutional amendment.

Help Idaho Thrive told the court the organization "wants the people to be able to vote on the initiative, thereby to defeat it and put the lottery matter, not just the initiative, to rest."

Crow said Help Idaho Thrive opposes the lottery on its merits, wants to defeat it at the polls, and doesn't want to have the issue fought over and over.

"We in Help Idaho Thrive know we are taking a risk with our natural constituency," said Crow. "Many who oppose the lottery will vote, but we want it to come to a vote. The reason is that a lottery initiative is so badly done and contains such major flaws that we will have a better chance of obtaining a final victory on the initiative than we might have later on a constitutional amendment."

Crow said the lottery initiative has the following flaws:

- It would decentralize a state lottery.
- It would permit a state lottery commission to authorize the use of slot machines, punch boards and other such devices.
- The lottery commission would be appointed by the governor without the consent of the Idaho Senate.
- And the lottery commission, not the governor, would decide whether or when a lottery proceeds would be paid to the state and how much.

"We are confident that when the voters know those facts, and that the lottery would harm the state's economy, they will reject the initiative," Crow said.

He said if the initiative comes to a vote and passes, then Help Idaho Thrive will join court action to overturn it.

Craig says he's unsure if he favors tax reform

BOISE (AP) — U.S. Rep. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, called the tax reform bill that will be considered by Congress after the Labor Day recess a "patchwork process" not equitable enough for all Americans and is uncertain if he will vote for it.

Craig, who appeared before the Idaho Press Club on Thursday in Boise, said there appears to be little chance for modifying the 1,900-page bill drafted under the direction of Sen. Dan Rostenkowski, D-Ill. and Rep. Robert Packwood, R-Oregon, and supported by President Reagan.

The measure only redistributes the tax burden to businesses and retains certain loopholes, but fails to erase the \$200 billion deficit that more far-reaching tax reform could help accomplish, he said.

"The nation's businesses cannot be overburdened by taxation while other countries allow special tax breaks to give their industries the

edge over U.S. competitors, he said.

On the other hand, the Idaho Republican said the bill could be the stimulus to get the U.S. economy rolling once again. He said major economic booms such as the lowering of interest rates in the last six months have not had the desired effect of initiating a rebound. But, businesses nationwide are reluctant to increase their production because of uncertainty in the economy and the tax legislation may provide that impetus for improvement, said Craig.

Craig said the Kemp-Roth tax cut, passed in 1981 with his support, partially to "blame" for the present federal deficit. "We were too liberal at the moment," he said, but blamed the Democrats for much of the problem because of special interest concerns that they added to the measure.

Building about dead

BOISE (AP) — Citing its failure to raise adequate matching funds, Idaho State University has taken another step toward abandoning its plans to construct a new building to house the school's beleaguered College of Pharmacy.

The State Permanent Building Fund Advisory Council on Thursday approved a request from ISU President Brian Bowen to divert the remainder of \$200,000 appropriated to plan that project to renovating the existing Leonard Hall pharmacy building on the Pocatello campus.

About \$120,000 of the appropriation has been spent on plans for a new, \$3 million pharmacy building. But appropriation of the rest of that money by the Legislature was contingent on ISU raising \$3 million on its own.

Bowen told the council ISU was unable to raise the matching funds, and probably would not for eight to 10 years. Work on plans for a new building was suspended several months ago by the advisory council while the school studied whether it would be able to raise the needed funds.

Bowen said it would cost about \$2.9 million to renovate Leonard Hall to meet criteria for accreditation set by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education. About

\$70,000 in renovation to the building was scheduled this summer, but Bowen said he was not sure if an "overall plan" was developed.

"Eventually we must have a new facility," he said. "But we cannot secure accreditation in the current facility without significant renovation."

"They're in the process of trying to throw us out of the pharmacy business, but we must show good faith," he said.

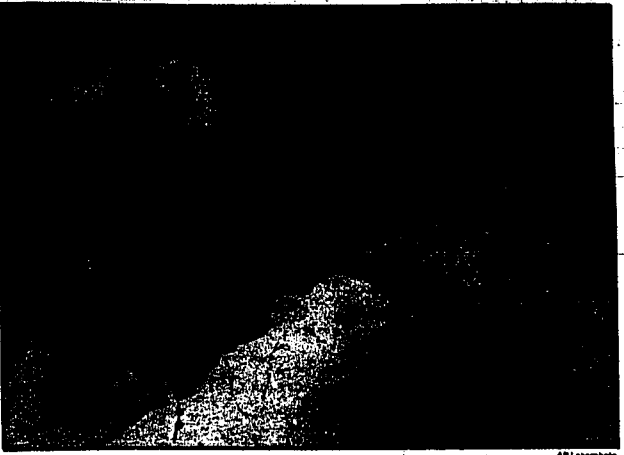

Indians' clay floor may be continent's oldest structure

BEAR VALLEY, Calif. (AP) — A prehistoric structure that could be the oldest evidence of men ever found in North America has been unearthed by archeologists in the Sierra Nevada, 150 miles east of San Francisco.

Scientists believe the Indian structure, a clay floor discovered in the Stanislaus National Forest two weeks ago, is at least 10,000 years old.

A discovery at Hells Gap, Wyo., was previously believed to be the oldest manmade structure on the continent. It was dated at 8,000 years old.

The new find could affect scientific opinion about how long ago humans migrated to North America. Sites and structures tentatively dated up to 32,000 years ago have been found in North America.

"If the date holds, then California man is much older than we've thought," Rainer Berger, chairman of the archeology department at the University of California at Los Angeles, said in an interview.

Scientists said spear points found at another site 30 miles away have been carbon-dated at 12,000 years old. They are not the oldest ever found in North America, but add to evidence of the age of the newly found structure.

Archeologists are sharply divided over when migration to the Americas occurred. Some humans arrived 20,000 to 35,000 years ago, while others contend migration began no more than 15,000 years ago.

"We're taking a quantum leap back into the past with this find, telling us that there was fairly intensive use of land in California by the Indians beyond 8,000 to 7,000 years ago, which is really the oldest-most other Californian sites firmly identified," said Ann Peak, chief archaeologist for the find.

The quality of the new discovery is "remarkable," said Robert Bettinger, a University of California

specialist in Sierra Nevada prehistory who has studied the find.

The site is significant because it indicates heavy use of mountain camps along several miles of a fork in the Stanislaus River and its tributaries, Bettinger said.

"If Indians were just getting to the New World on their way to South America 10,000 years ago, you wouldn't find this kind of permanent site, which indicates traditional heavy use," he said. "Because we weren't finding them, the idea of migration went back to 15,000 to 20,000 years has been speculation with just a little bit of sometimes shaky evidence."

Peak and Associates Inc. of Sacramento found hearthstones, rock art and numerous stone tools at both sites.

Archaeological consultant Polly Quick of San Francisco cautioned that it could be years — if ever — before the date is authenticated.

"Unfortunately every time in the past when we've had something that might be this old — it's been knocked down," said Quick, a national expert in American Indian archeology. "We need hard evidence to establish very early occupation."

Carbon-dating on a hearthstone in front of the structure's remains won't be completed by Swiss experts until November. However, there is "very strong evidence" the hearthstone existed just after the glaciers retreated from California, Peak said.

The building's supposed age is supported by the depth of the discovery in a clearly stratified area; spear points found in the same level similar to those found elsewhere in North America; and dated up to the same age, the spear points found at the second site and glacial outwash from 10,000 years ago near the structure's level, Peak said.

BLM checks claim of grading on part of controversial road

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The Bureau of Land Management is investigating a report that a graded portion of the Egin-Hamer trail in Fremont County was three miles long and graded illegally Monday.

A section of the trail, which is the proposed route of a controversial farm-to-market road, reportedly was bladed by two road graders Monday, an Idaho Falls BLM District official said. The incident is under investigation by the BLM for possible trespass violation.

"It's been reported to me that a portion of the Egin-Hamer trail, from Nine Mile Knoll east three miles, has been graded," said Don Watson, BLM area resource manager. "If that's the case, it's certainly not timely considering the

controversy."

A controversy over the right-of-way application has centered on the road's possible effects on winter elk range, which the proposed road would bisect. Idaho Fish and Game Department biologists say the road could keep the elk from using 6,000 acres of the best winter range and eventually lower their numbers.

"We're going to investigate it," Watson said. "It certainly wasn't authorized."

Jim Sidloway, Fremont County Commission chairman, said "I don't know what they do" of the county road and bridge crew. "Maybe they just knocked off a few bumps."

This is not the first time that Fremont County has been accused of working on the trail.

Liquor question left to towns

SALMON (AP) — The Lemhi County Commission has passed an ordinance to let cities decide if they want the sale of liquor-by-the-drink on Sundays.

The ordinance, passed by the board Aug. 11, also allows bars located outside the Salmon and Leadore city limits to sell liquor-by-the-drink on Sunday, which affects only two businesses outside the city limits at North Fork and Williams Lake, said Louie Demmick, board chairman.

"The cities are where most of the bars are at and I feel the matter should be at the cities' discretion," Demmick said.

The Salmon City Council will hold a hearing on the issue on Sept. 2, and the Leadore City Council has approved the ordinance, but will hold a hearing on Sept. 16.

Demmick said more than 400 individual comments were received on the Sunday sales in addition to two public hearings on the matter.

Whitworth draws 365 years in prison, fine for secret sales

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Jerry Whitworth was sentenced to 365 years in prison and fined \$410,000 Thursday by a judge who said his role in selling Navy communications secrets to the Soviet Union made him "one of the most spectacular spies of this century."

"I just want to say I'm very, very sorry," was the only comment from the 47-year-old former Navy

radoman as he appeared before U.S. District Judge John Vukasin.

Convicted on seven counts of espionage as part of the Walker family spy ring, Whitworth must serve at least 60 years before he will be eligible for parole.

Vukasin had the option of sentencing Whitworth to the maximum term of life in prison or following a prosecution recommendation of im-

posing a lengthy period of years that would delay his parole eligibility.

The government called him the central figure in the most damaging spy ring in U.S. military history, and Vukasin said he had given the Soviet Union "the very blueprint of our most coveted and guarded communications."

Whitworth, of Davis, Calif., was convicted July 24 of selling to the

Walkers the secrets of Navy decoding equipment, code keys and communications systems he gathered and photographed for nearly a decade as a trusted radio operator at ship and shore stations.

He also was convicted of tax evasion on the \$332,000 that he was paid by John Walker Jr., his longtime friend, former fellow radio instruc-

tor and confessed leader of the spy ring.

Walker was to have been sentenced Thursday in Baltimore to two life terms under a plea-bargain, with parole possible in 10 years. But sentencing has been delayed until Oct. 3 at the prosecution's request.

Whitworth's lawyer, James Larson, filed papers with Vukasin on

Tuesday urging a sentence no harsher than Walker's. Larson said Whitworth was "unquestionably more culpable" than Whitworth.

Larson said Whitworth was "racked with guilt and remorse" and had undergone three days of "debriefing" by government agencies since his conviction and was prepared for more.

Texas to rank No. 2, Florida third in population by 2000

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rapidly growing Texas and Florida will become the nation's second and third most populous states by the turn of the century, the Census Bureau said Thursday.

Americans flocking to the Sun Belt will help California retain its firm grip on the No. 1 population ranking, according to a new analysis of state and city data and projections of the population for the year 2000.

But the Lone Star and Sunshine states will surpass the current second-ranked state, New York, the figures show.

At the other end of the scale, meanwhile, the report anticipates that Wyoming will nearly double its current half-million population to jump from last place to No. 43. Vermont will drop to 50th in the year 2000, the Census Bureau projects.

The state population projections are contained in the 1986 edition of the State and Metropolitan Area Data Book, a more than 700-page compilation of statistics about the states and hundreds of metropolitan areas and their central cities.

The population projections for the

year 2000 lead off a special section of state rankings.

It projects that California will increase from its current 26.4 million people to 30.8 million by the turn of the century.

Climbing from third to second place, Texas is expected to grow from 16.4 million to 29.7 million. And Florida is likely to increase from 11.4 million to 17.4 million to skip from No. 6 to No. 3.

New York is expected to drop to fourth place from second place with a population of nearly 15 million in the year 2000. That would be a decline from the Empire State's current 17.7 million — an outlook not shared by everyone.

The Census data included in the newly published volume anticipates that Pennsylvania will be ranked 14th in 2000, a drop from fourth currently, and Illinois will slip from fifth to sixth place.

Ohio, Michigan, New Jersey and North Carolina will retain their current seventh through 10th place rankings, the report says.

Other findings reported in the new Data Book include:

- Alaska was the fastest growing states between 1980-85, increasing by 29.7 percent. Michigan ranked last, losing 1.3 percent of its people.
- New Jersey is the most dense state with 1,013 people per square mile. Alaska averages only one person per square mile.
- Utah has the most people under age 18, 37.8 percent of its residents. The smallest share is in Florida, 22.9 percent.
- For residents aged 65 and over Florida ranks first, 17.6 percent, while Alaska has only 3.1 percent of people in that age group.
- Alaska has the top birth rate, 24.9 per 1,000 residents, while Connecticut is 50th at 11.
- For infants to mothers under age 20 are highest in Mississippi, 21.9 percent, compared to only 8.9 percent in Minnesota.
- Infant mortality is highest in South Carolina at 16.1 deaths under age 1 per 1,000 births. It is lowest in Hawaii at 8.9.
- Alaska has the highest rate of women in the work force, 64.5 percent. The lowest is 39.1 percent in West Virginia.

India can build bombs

WASHINGTON (AP) — An American researcher said Thursday the United States should suspend high technology trade with India because that country has a nuclear program capable of producing its atomic bombs a year.

"India is essentially thumbing its nose at the rest of the world" by refusing to account for heavy water used "in a program to make weapons-grade plutonium, charged Gary Milhollin, a former Nuclear Regulatory Commission consultant and University of Wisconsin law professor.

He maintained that India was using about 290 metric tons of heavy water a year, either diverted illegally from plants under international supervision or imported clandestinely from China.

But under intense questioning at a news conference here, Milhollin acknowledged that his evidence was

circumstantial.

Milhollin, now working for the U.S. Natural Resources Defense Council, an environmental protection group, first published his findings last January, concluding that India lacked sufficient heavy water, without illegal imports or diversion, "to open the three new atomic reactors which went on line in 1985.

Since then, Milhollin said, he has revised upward by 90 tons his estimate of the amount of heavy water allegedly "diverted or imported. He said he also has learned that the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency has reported the secret to the United States, the Soviet Union, Canada and other IAEA member countries on his findings.

Lutherans vote today

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Three Lutheran denominations moving toward a merger deadline chose Chicago on Thursday as headquarters for the new church, but hours later decided to reconsider.

Conventions of two of the three churches, all meeting in different cities, were scheduled to adjourn today after a vote on creation of the new Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The largest of the three churches, the Lutheran Church in America, voted for Chicago over Milwaukee 373-273 after nearly two hours of discussion.

But when the American Lutheran Church voted nearly a two-thirds majority in favor of Milwaukee, 644-312, the LCA said it would bring the question up again Thursday night.

The commission that designed the new church proposed Chicago as the headquarters, and guidelines said both the LCA and ALC would have had to choose Milwaukee by two-thirds majorities to overrule the panel.

Coors drops lie detector tests for prospective employees

GOLDEN, Colo. (AP) — Adolph Coors Co. plans to stop its controversial use of lie detectors to screen job applicants, switching to three other screening methods starting Monday, The Denver Post reported Thursday.

In a copyrighted story, the Post said the brewing company, which

has more than 10,000 employees nationwide, has been looking for alternatives to the polygraph since Congress began considering a variety of bills that would curb use of lie detectors in work-place screening.

"If people are on narcotics we'll find it. We'll also find communists," said Richard Bond, Coors' director of

placement.

During the 1970s, Coors' use of the polygraph was the main issue of contention between the company and the brewery workers' union. The union was broken after a 1977 strike, but use of the polygraph continued largely as a pre-employment screening tool.

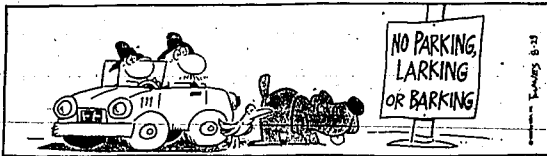

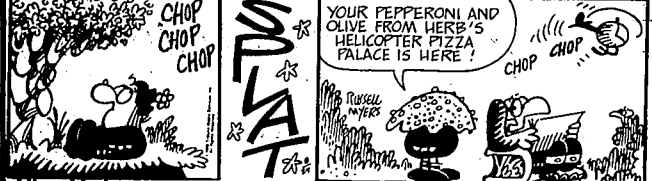

Indicators up; analysts wary

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government's main gauge of economic health rose a strong 1.1 percent in July after two months of decline, providing what one analyst called "good but not great" news for the sluggish economy.

The gain in the forward-pointing Index of Leading Indicators announced by the Commerce Department on Thursday was bigger than most private economists had expected.

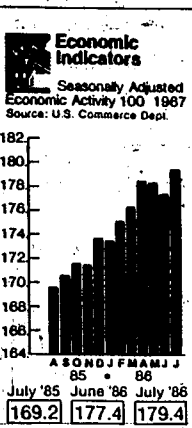
However, the report also revised June's index sharply downward — from a 0.3 percent increase to a 0.4 percent decline — perhaps making the July increase look misleadingly large by comparison.

"It's good but not great," said David W. Wyss, chief financial economist at Data Resources Inc. in Lexington, Mass. "The downward revision of June just about offsets the big jump in July."

Lawrence Chimerine, president of Chase Econometrics in Balala, Pa., also saw little reason for cheering.

"This is consistent with the general pattern we have been seeing," he said. "The economy isn't getting any worse. It is growing very slowly and there is no evidence that this pattern is changing."

"We would need several more months of significant increases and maybe widespread gains in the components to indicate the economy was accelerating," Chimerine added.



Private analysts have no doubt the U.S. economy is growing more rapidly in the current July-September quarter than the barely visible 0.6 percent annual rate of the April-June quarter.

However, most are predicting growth the rest of this year and in

early 1987 at about a 2.5 percent rate, and building permits, which he said should increase as home loan rates decline.

However, looking at the positives in July, Wyss questioned the real significance of the money supply increase and he said the gain in business formation merely made up for a big June decline in that category.

The report said the biggest reason for the overall revision from a positive to a negative index number was a big drop in business inventories on hand and on order. The figure had been unavailable when the June report was compiled.

The May decline of 0.1 percent was unchanged from the previous report, but the April gain of 1.2 percent was revised down slightly from 1.3 percent.

Adding to Commerce Department problems with leaks of sensitive information, the overall July index gain had been widely rumored on Wall Street on Wednesday.

The department's inspector general, already investigating reports of leaks of last week's figures on the gross national product, added the new reports to his investigation.

Further reports were circulating concerning a possible leak involving the report on the foreign trade deficit for July that Commerce is to release Friday.

The July leading indicators gain put the overall index at 179.4, compared with the 1987 base level of 100.

The recent sluggishness hasn't increased the national unemployment rate or set off other warnings that a new recession might be imminent.

However, the slow rate of economic expansion has disappointed business leaders and government officials who had gotten used to much faster growth in the first 18 months of recovery after the 1981-82 recession.

The index of Leading Indicators, a compilation of 11 forward-pointing figures from various areas of the economy, was given its biggest push upward in July by substantial increases in the money supply and in the rate of new business formation.

Other positive indicators included slower business deliveries and higher raw materials prices — both indicative of a business pickup — an increase in contracts and orders for new plant and equipment, a rise in outstanding credit and a decrease in initial unemployment claims.

Negative indicators included rising stock prices, building permits and new orders for consumer goods and materials, while there was no change in the average work week.

Wyss said two of the negatives have or soon will become positives — stock prices, which are rising again,

Frontier finally files

DENVER (AP) — Frontier Airlines filed for Chapter 11 reorganization Thursday in U.S. Bankruptcy Court, ending five days of speculation about the fate of the grounded carrier, a subsidiary of People Express Inc.

The filing had been expected since Sunday, when People Express shut down the Denver-based airline, putting 4,700 employees out of work and stranding thousands of passengers.

United Airlines, which had been the most serious bidder for the Denver-based carrier, on Wednesday dropped its \$146 million bid.

On Thursday, United turned down an offer by the Air Line Pilots Association to reopen negotiations.

The Frontier-United deal had required that United reach agreement with United's ALPA unit and Frontier's five units before the sale could go through. Negotiators for United and United's ALPA unit had got-

ten hung up over the timetable for bringing Frontier pilots up to United pilots' 60 percent higher scale.

"The decision to file a bankruptcy petition was made only after we had exhausted every other available alternative, including the possible sale of Frontier to parties other than United Airlines," said Donald C. Burr, chairman of the Newark, N.J.-based People Express.

Airline officials said it was costing People Express \$1 million per day in overhead and leases to maintain Frontier's grounded fleet and idle facilities.

People Express has been saying for days that it would file bankruptcy papers on Frontier this week.

Frontier attorneys chose to file for Chapter 11 reorganization, which will enable the carrier to pay off its debts and possibly resume service at some point, after the Bankruptcy Court had closed for the day.

Remains unearthed in ruins on Cyprus

Family skeletons tell story of tragedy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The poignant human side of a tragedy that occurred 16 centuries ago is revealed in the discovery of a family of well-preserved human skeletons on the Mediterranean island of Cyprus, scientists disclosed Thursday.

The remains of a man, a woman and a small child, lying together in the ruins of a house shattered by a powerful earthquake, add pathos to the dry excavation of the Roman city of Kourion.

David Soren, a classical archeologist at the University of Arizona, said the find brings to seven the number of human skeletons found in the house, the only one explored at the site so far.

"I think seven skeletons in one house indicates a tremendous loss of life," he said. "We may very well find hundreds of others."

The earthquake that destroyed Kourion on July 21 in the year 365 may have produced a human catastrophe that of Vesuvius' volcanic eruption which destroyed Pompeii and Herculaneum in A.D. 79, said Soren, who headed

the team that found the Kourion skeletons earlier this month.

The earthquake which scientists say struck the southwest coast port city shortly after sunrise appears to have caught the people by surprise, giving them little chance to flee.

"We're finding people trapped at home," Soren said. "Stone by stone, room by room, we should be able to unearth the most complete picture of a late-Roman-Empire population trapped in its original context."

The scientists, who have unearthed 15 rooms in the house so far, found the latest three skeletons buried under three feet of rubble in what may have been a family bedroom.

Because of the way the skeletons were grouped, lying together on their right sides in a close embrace, scientists speculate they may be the remains of a young family.

The woman, estimated to be about 15 years old, cradled a small child of about 18 months of age to her chest. Her arms were raised to protect the child's head, which was tucked under her chin.

The man shielded the woman with his body, stretching his left arm across her to hold the child's back and putting his left leg up over hers.

The neck of the woman was broken at a right angle by falling plaster and stones. The man, whose age has not been determined, had his skull and spinal column crushed by 500-pound stone blocks found on top of him.

Two rings lie near the man's left hand, one of plain iron and the other of copper alloy inscribed with a symbol of Christ, the Greek letters Chi Rho. Scientists say this indicates the family might have been Christian.

The first skeletons found at the site were two unearthed in 1974. Soren used records of this preliminary work to begin intensive work there 50 years later, with the support of the National Geographic Society and other organizations.

In 1984, the scientists discovered the skeleton of a young girl, her hands clasped over her face, lying atop the skeleton of a male. The next year, they found the upper skeleton of a man, aged 30 to 40 years, crushed in a doorway of the same house.

Soviet sounds gloomy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Declaring the Soviet Union was not interested in an empty summit, Deputy Foreign Minister Anatoly Adamshin said Thursday that preparatory talks with a high-level U.S. delegation on regional problems had failed to achieve much progress.

The Soviet official's statement indicated that General Secretary Mikhail S. Gorbachev was still unwilling to set a date to meet here with President Reagan by year's end, as they agreed to do last November in Geneva.

Yet he has to have some results, concrete gains," Adamshin told reporters at the State Department. "We are not interested in an empty summit."

The U.S. side responded with a terse statement saying the talks

were not designed for negotiations and had been conducted in a "constructive and businesslike" way.

Among the topics covered were the war in Angola between the Cuban-backed government and pro-western guerrillas and tentative Soviet moves toward restoring diplomatic ties with Israel.

A U.S. official said other topics included the wars in the Persian Gulf and Afghanistan and developments in southeast Asia and the Mideast. The talks yielded "no miracles, no breakthroughs," the official said.

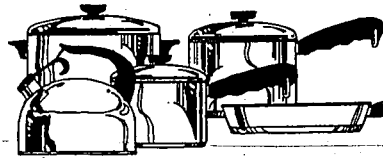

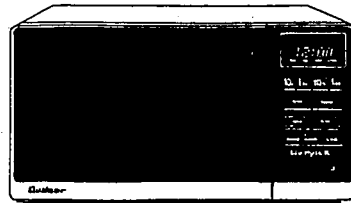

Over 40

Actresses find satisfaction in life while breaking age barrier

Linda Evans has learned a lot, Joan Collins wants to change the image and Susan St. James is having another baby. — that's how three big stars react to breaking the 40 age barrier.

Evans, Collins and St. James were among the women profiled in the August issue of Harper's Bazaar, devoted to "Over 40 & Terrific." Others include Valerie Perrine, Ali MacGraw, Patti LaBelle and Maud Adams.

"For years I didn't recognize my own potential," said "Dynasty" star Evans, 43. "Whether it was choosing my acting roles or making a dinner reservation at a restaurant, I always relied on other people's opinions. Now I handle my own decisions, and if I fail, well, that's the breaks."

Collins, at 52 more successful than ever in "Dynasty," does not believe 40 should be a cut-off point in finding new opportunities and taking advantage of them.

"But it's not necessarily the case," she said. "Age can be a big obstacle. I'm proud of my accomplishments, and those of women like Jane Fonda, Linda Evans and Sophia Loren.

"If we can set a good example of what life after 40 can bring, and if that can change societal attitudes, it's all for the better."

Collins said she would not consider a facelift. "It erases all the character — the natural beauty. Skin may look smoother, but the whole appearance is artificial."

St. James, star of "Kate & Allie," turns 40 in August and expects her fourth child in November.

"I've always had very easy pregnancies," she said. "This time around, I feel the aches and pains more. Also I know this will be my last one, so there's a little sadness, too, kind of like my baby-making days are over."

Perrine, 42, keeps in shape with dance classes, playing soccer and general house and yard work. She said: "Basically, I believe no matter how careful you are, you're going to age anyway. The trick to looking good is to be satisfied with yourself. I am, and plan to stay that way."

MacGraw, 47, thrice married, has been single since her divorce from Steve McQueen eight years ago. "My 40s have been the decade of biggest

change for me," she said. "I've figured out what I like about myself and hopefully eliminated the things I don't."

"I've also determined that whether you're old or young has nothing to do with chronological age. I have friends in their 60s who seem much younger than some people I know in their 30s, simply because their interests are more vital. And that's what I am striving for, that's the person I want to be."

For LaBelle, who lost two sisters to cancer in the last five years, being over 40 has special significance.

"Sometimes I think I will die of cancer because they did," she said. "That's why, when I think about being 42, I welcome every day that comes into my life. When I'm 65 or 70, I'm going to brag about it, because just to live is a wonderful thing."

"People who hide their age, that's sick. I'm very happy to be 42. I can't wait to become 55. I'm gonna be an awesome diva by then."

Adams summed up the attitude of many over-40 women. "The last thing I expected was to like being over 40," the model-turned-actress said. "In fact, I love it!"

Relief effort brings shelter, food to volcano gas survivors

YAOUNDE, Cameroon (AP) — A well-coordinated relief effort brought food and shelter Thursday to those who survived the lethal gas that burst from a placid volcano lake a week ago and killed more than 1,500 people, officials said.

International teams of scientists were inspecting the scene and interviewing survivors, trying to identify the gas or gases and determine how and why the disaster occurred.

Gov. Fai Francis Yengo of the air-forged Menchum region is in charge of the relief operation in Wum, about 20 miles from the disaster area around Lake Nios. He said most victims had been buried in mass graves and carcasses of dead animals were the main cause of the deaths.

In Geneva, the Office of the U.N.

Coordinator for Disaster Relief said 5,000 survivors needed help in the volcanic mountains of this West African nation. The International Red Cross appealed for at least \$90,000 in emergency aid.

Brifal's Foreign Office said in London that a plane would leave for Yaounde on Friday carrying \$75,500 worth of relief supplies including food, medicine, tents, children's clothing, coats and blankets.

Fear arose immediately after the disaster last Thursday that help would be slow in reaching the Lake Nios area because of primitive roads and poor communications, but Gov. Yengo said on the state radio Thursday that "aid is not coming too late."

Officials said food, medicine,

blankets and mattresses were being moved to villages from the provincial capital of Bamenda, where two truckloads of food arrived Thursday morning.

Yengo said most of the homeless had been housed with relatives in nearby towns, or in community centers and schools.

"At least 90 nomadic Fulani cattle herders, who normally wander the lush mountain pastures, had arrived at settlements seeking help, the governor said.

"The Cameroonians are doing a fantastic job," said Neil Walsh, U.S. Embassy public affairs officer. "They are melding the international assistance with their own, and it's working quite well."

Bolivia arrests miners

LA PAZ, Bolivia (AP) — The government imposed a nationwide state of siege Thursday to quell labor trouble and hundreds of arrests were reported.

Troops surrounded 7,000 miners who were marching on La Paz to protest layoffs.

Low world prices for tin have been disastrous for Bolivia, whose economy is in chaos, and the government decided Monday to close most of the mines that provide the bulk of its export income.

President Victor Paz Estenssoro has said the illegal cocaine traffic brings more money into the country than legal exports.

His government already has fired 7,000 miners and is expected to lay off at least 8,000 more out of a total remaining work force of 20,000.

Witnesses said air force planes buzzed the miners' camp in the frigid Andean highlands near the village of Calamarca, 45 miles south of the capital. The workers, some accompanied by wives and children, began the march last week from Oruro, a mining center 150 miles from La Paz.

Soldiers and armored units surrounded the camp and sealed access roads. Congressman Roger Cortez said he and seven colleagues were turned back at a roadblock.

At least 2,000 soldiers, 10 trucks and 6 tanks were used to isolate the camp, witnesses reported. Red Cross president Gaston Ponce said five of its vehicles were denied access.

Radio reports said troops took over Ururo and Potosi, the two principal mining cities, which have a combined population of 200,000 almost entirely dependent on the industry. The government closed the mines there on Tuesday.

Roman Catholic bishops said they would try to reach the miners' camp near Calamarca to make sure the miners were being treated well.

The Information Ministry said the miners were being put into army trucks and sent back to Ururo.

Arms treaty progress cited

GENEVA (AP) — Delegates to the 46-nation Conference on Disarmament made "remarkable progress" this year toward a treaty banning chemical weapons, the head of the drafting committee said Thursday.

"The area of common ground... has been much enlarged," Ambassador Ian Cromartie of Britain said. He urged delegations to dig on increasing this momentum with a view to the early conclusion of a convention, which the conference has been trying to forge for nearly two decades.

In a speech to the delegates, Cromartie reported headway on draft articles governing the destruction of chemical weapons stocks and dismantling of factories. He was not specific but said "remarkable progress has been made in many important areas of the draft convention."

The conference, the world's only multilateral disarmament negotiating forum, ends its 1986 summer session today.

New threat issued

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — The Shiite extremist group Islamic Jihad said Thursday it will kill its American hostages if the United States tries to rescue them by force.

A typewritten statement in Arabic, delivered to a Western news agency in Beirut, was accompanied by a photograph of captive David Jacobsen, 55.

The group, whose name means Islamic Holy War in English, did not explain why it chose this time to issue a warning about a rescue attempt.

Japan, U.S. plan exercise

TOKYO (AP) — Japan and the United States will conduct their first full-fledged joint military exercise involving sea, air and land forces, the Kyodo news agency said Thursday.

The five-day exercise will take place in October off Japan's northernmost island of Hokkaido, Kyodo said.

The agency said a total of 10,000 soldiers would be involved in the exercise aimed at repelling an attack against Hokkaido.

Among those participating would be soldiers from the U.S. 7th Fleet base in Yokosuka west of Tokyo, the U.S. 18th Strategic Air Attack Wing at Kadena Air Base in Okinawa and the U.S. 25th Army Division from Hawaii, the news agency said.

In the past, joint military exercises have involved only a single branch of the armed forces. This is the first time air, sea and land forces from both countries will cooperate in an exercise, Kyodo said.

Libya's leader isn't worried

MISURATA, Libya (AP) — Col. Moammar Gadhafi, touring this port on the Gulf of Sidra, said Thursday he was not worried about the possibility of another U.S. attack on Libya.

The 44-year-old Libyan leader briefly visited a mosque to pray, then stopped at a government rest house.

Although journalists had been led to expect they would meet with the Libyan leader, Gadhafi strode out of the guest house toward his car without a word, pursued by two dozen reporters who thrust their microphones at him and shouted questions.

Asked if he feared another attack, he curtly replied, "No," slammed the car door and was driven off.

S. African university students, police clash

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — University students threw stones Thursday at police and cars after leaving a meeting held to protest the police killings of 20 blacks in Soweto.

The government promised to hold a public inquiry into the shootings. Witnesses said police fired tear gas when students at the University of the Witwatersrand began throwing stones at police vans and other vehicles and at a police film crew.

The university is officially for whites, but many blacks attend. Both blacks and whites were involved in the clash.

The South African Press Association said that one white student

fired a gun into the air and that a police cameraman was injured when he was hit by a stone.

SAPA said about 7,000 students attended the protest meeting but only about 400 clashed with police.

The students were protesting the police shootings of 20 blacks during riots in the sprawling black township of Soweto on Tuesday night and Wednesday morning.

The government said Thursday that 20 blacks were killed by police and confirmed that a black Soweto councillor was killed by youths. It said 98 other people were injured.

Anti-apartheid leaders, however, said up to 30 people were killed and 200 wounded.

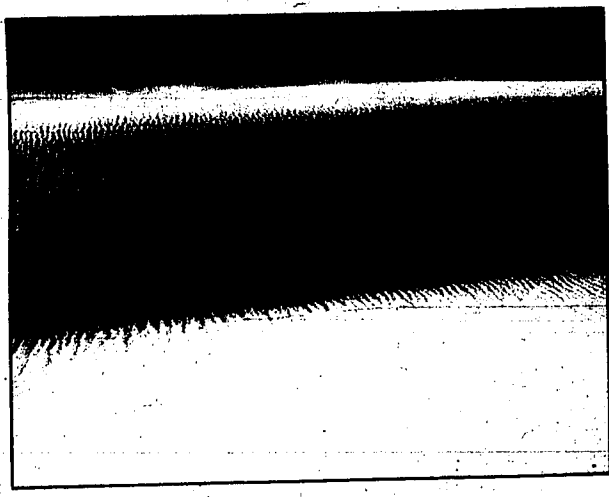

Idaho Photographic Workshop prints in Sunspot Gallery show

TWIN FALLS — Tucked away on the second floor of the Taylor Administration Building on the College of Southern Idaho campus is the Sunspot Gallery. Created by Wes and Linda Wada, instructors at the college, the gallery exhibits are devoted to photography, usually by local artists. Their exhibition season opens today with "Selected Works of the Idaho Photographic Workshop."

The workshop is a Boise group begun in 1985 by former students of photographer Kevin Fuller. Members of the group have taught photography courses and workshops in Boise, Idaho City, Fairfield and Sun Valley and have mounted shows in Boise. This is their first exposure in Twin Falls.

According to Wes Wada, curator of the Sunspot, "Most people's view of photography is very narrow. This show illustrates photography's diversity. It includes a variety of things, from well-done landscapes to abstract work."

The majority of the entries are black and white.

The subject matter is as mixed as might be expected among 25 selections from 29 different photographers. Viewers will recognize a few typical Idaho scenes among those with more universal themes.

Wada visited in Boise in April last year to work with members of the group. He said, "Photography is such a solitary art form and it is easy to get out of the habit of doing it. Group stimulation is what you need to keep involved. There is a lot of creative energy up there. They're very excited about being together."

Wada said that exhibits at the Sunspot throughout the school year will be as diverse as possible and include photojournalism, as well as fine art photography. There will be six different shows. Skye Savason, a Times-News photographer, will mount a one-man show in October. Other shows will include one comprised of work by Art Wright, the head of the photography department at Idaho State University in Pocatello; Carol Leonard's first one-woman show in color and a collection of recent travel photos by the Wadas.

ages who came on their own. Most of the visitors are local but busloads come from as far away as Sun Valley, Pocatello and Owyhee, Nev.

In addition to the Maya exhibit and the local prehistoric Indian cave display, there is a room devoted to an archeological display of the hand work of pre-Columbian Indian tribes of Western Mexico. Most of the works are small replicas of human figures. Some pieces depict several figures apparently dancing together. The works are primitive but detailed enough to give clues about the people who made them several thousand years ago.

Visitors may also visit the Herrett Art Gallery, which will house seven exhibits during the coming school year. The first of these is a collection of works by nine Chicano and Latino artists of Washington and Idaho.

The Maya exhibit will be completed some time in December. Student lecturers will begin training in October. Bill West, display artist and curator of exhibits, and Nick Peterson, display technician, and Woods will have spent about six months designing and executing the project. It will remain unchanged for at least two years. But they will still have plenty to do.

Only about 10% of the museum's collection is on display at any one time. The creative staff will be putting their heads together to come up with a replacement for the Western Mexican Indian display. They will have plenty of possibilities to choose from in the Herrett Museum's extensive collection of artifacts from ancient people of the New World.

wanted the wagons to remain intact as a symbol of the valley's and his family's past. He donated them to the city in the 1950s with the stipulation they be given a permanent home and displayed once each year to the public.

The first Wagon Days events started shortly after the donation as an Independence Day celebration, but in the 1960s, the event was cancelled without a home yet established for the wagons. In 1975, primarily through the work of Mayor

Jerry Seiffert, the city revived the celebration, this time over Labor Day weekend.

Finally, last year, three-quarters of a century after they last carried ore, the wagons found their permanent home in a museum across the street from City Hall where visitors can view them year-round, except once each year when they again roll down the now-paved streets of Ketchum.

"I think you're going to see Lucius emerge this year," says Ault.
The Pack also returns four of its top five receivers from last year.
Six starters on defense also will return, including first-team all-Big Sky standouts Henry Rolling, a 6-foot-3, 216-pound linebacker, and cornerback Joe Peterson.
All that returning talent has made the Pack the overwhelming favorite to win this year's Big Sky Championship. In a recent poll of Big Sky coaches, the Pack was named Nevada-Reno was tabbed to finish first on seven ballots.
The lone holdout was Ault.
Like good football coaches everywhere, Ault is fond of poor-mouthing his team's chances, and he is not concerned without reason for concern: he must rebuild both offensive and defensive lines decimated by graduation.
Ault concedes the talent is there to accomplish that feat, but experience is sorely lacking.
And the schedule would seem to be a hindrance to a Big Sky championship. Although the Pack plays six of this first eight games at home, it also must play top contenders Idaho State and Boise State on the road.
Ault says his biggest concern is defense, especially the line. UNR must replace five first-team all-conference players on defense.
The line will be anchored by returning sophomore nose guard Bill Bon-sall, 6-0, 230 pounds. The leading candidates for the two tackle spots are junior letterman Scott Martin (6-2, 240) and Don Shearon (6-4, 230) and junior college transfers Lindon Lilly (6-2, 235) and Dean Hodges (6-4, 235).
The linebacker corps that forms the heart of Ault's 3-4 defense looks strong and the secondary, although relatively inexperienced, will be quick and aggressive.
"That (defensive) front is my biggest concern," said Ault. "I want some aggressive, tough people up there. The talent is there. It's a

matter of attitude; attitude is the key to defense."
The offensive line is another question mark.
Nevada-Reno returns only one starter from last year's line, first-team Big Sky tackle Bob Brown (6-1, 230). "He (Brown) may have to play the whole left side by himself," quips Ault.
Leading candidates on the offensive line are junior letterman Donal Rose (6-4, 240) at tackle, senior letterman Tom Epton (6-4, 245), red-shirt freshman John Armstrong (6-4, 245) and redshirt sophomore Tom Kilsiewicz (6-6, 260).
While the offensive line candidates are short on experience, they may compensate for that shortcoming with pure athletic ability.
"The thing I like is we don't have any jelly bellies," says Ault. "They're all firm. Whether they'll hit anything, I don't know."

Montana St.
Here's a tough one to figure out. Dave Arnold is heading into his fourth year as head football coach at Montana State, and his overall record is a mediocre 15-21.
But Arnold already has accomplished more with that losing record than most coaches do in a lifetime.
He has a national championship under his belt, as well as having been named NCAA Division I-AA Coach of the Year in 1984 by Kodak, *The Football News* and CBS.
For Arnold, who came to MSU as an assistant in 1982 from Michigan State, his first three years as a college head coach were a roller-coaster ride, to say the least.
The Bobcats went 1-10 in 1983 — had the nation's best turn-around the following year when they finished 12-2 and won the Division I-AA title — then bombed to a 2-9 mark in 1985 and finished in the Big Sky Con-

ference cellar.
Arnold is hoping the pendulum will swing MSU's way again this season, with a healthy Kelly Bradley leading the way.
Bradley, a 205-pound senior quarterback, was a third-team All-America selection and the Big Sky's MVP in 1984. Last season, he threw for 1,801 yards and 16 touchdowns in less than five games before he was sidelined with an elbow injury.
Even at that point, MSU was 1-4. And things got worse, as the offense sputtered except for a 41-18 victory over Montana, and the defense gave up an average of 25.6 points per game, worst in the Big Sky.
"Last year, so many people asked the question if we were going to

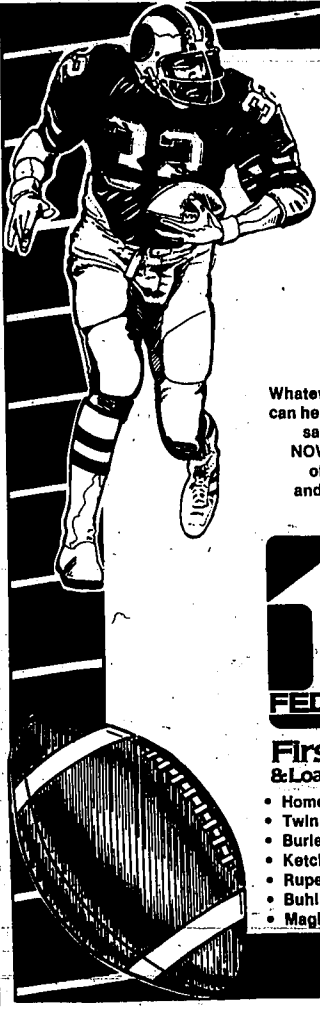
repeat as champions, that I think it was unfair," Arnold said. "But we certainly didn't want to go 2-9. We're just looking to re-establish ourselves in the win-loss column," he said. "As far as everything else goes, I think we're fine."

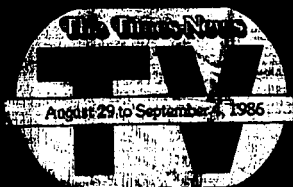

15-year-old Kirk Cameron finds star status with 'Growing Pains'

By ANDREW J. EDELSTEIN

When it debuted a year ago, ABC's "Growing Pains" was the show that most critics zeroed in as being an example of TV at its most cretinous. Its plot seemed of be a desperate attempt by ABC to grab some of the glory created by NBC's smash domestic sitcoms, "The Cosby Show" and "Family Ties." Its star was Alan Thicke, a person whose name evoked snickers as a result of the failure of his much-ballyhoed syndicated late-night talk show. But to the surprise of the know-it-alls, "Growing Pains" became a hit. It ended up as No. 18 in the final Nielsen ratings and during the summer, it has been ABC's highest-rated series in reruns. It has become a key part of ABC's Tuesday-night lineup, providing the bridge between two of the third-place-network's other successful shows, "Who's the Boss?" and "Moonlighting."

"Growing Pains" is another 1980s show that owes a debt to "Father Knows Best." Psychiatrist Jason

Seaver (Thicke) moves his practice into his house, while his wife Maggie (Joanna Kerns) returns to the job market as a newspaper reporter after a 15-year absence. They have three kids: 15-year-old Mike (Kirk Cameron), described in last year's opening episode as "a hormone with feet," precocious 14-year-old daughter Carol (Tracey Gold) and 9-year-old son Ben (Jeremy Miller), who has a strong attachment to his mother.

When the show first aired, most of the attention was focused on Thicke, a genial if bland Canadian. Just two years earlier, in a campaign masterminded by former network programming whiz Fred Silverman, Thicke's talk show, "Thicke of the Night," was promoted as the show that would replace "The Tonight Show" as required late-night viewing in America's bedrooms. Unfortunately, the show bombed and Thicke retreated, red-faced.

But the true star of the show turned out to be 15-year-old Kirk Cameron, who is on the verge of becoming the David Cassidy of the late '80s. His grinning face is on the cover of most teen magazines. In fact, he even has his own TV fan magazine devoted to him. He

receives 4,000 pieces of mail a week. This could be the season in which he replaces Michael J. Fox as the premier heartthrob of the pre-pubescent set. Unlike Fox, Kirk is a genuine teen-ager.

"I used to have regrets that I had no social life, that I was missing out on all the things kids get to do," Cameron says. "I would want to play when I couldn't. But now I like it all and regret nothing. My friends still treat me like they always did. There are a few jealous ones, but I don't bother with them."

Cameron says his parents help keep him level-headed. "But I don't have any way to compare my fame," he says. "I thought every kid got 4,000 letters a week. My mom and sister run my fan club — they answer the letters on a computer."

Q. Was Jackie Gleason at all hesitant about tackling the off-beat role of the garment salesman in the new movie "Nothing in Common"? It does seem rather unlikely casting for his comic image. — E.A.

A. Maybe so, but truth is that Jackie realized right away that the part of Max Basner, wayward father of the young ad whiz (played by Tom Hanks) was ideal for him at this stage of his career. Ray Stark, chairman of the board of Rastar, producers of "Nothing in Common," recalls that he messengered the script to the 70-year-old Gleason's Miami residence, and it arrived promptly at 10:30 a.m. By the time Stark had reached his office in Hollywood at 10:30 a.m. (remember the three-hour time difference) that same day, Gleason was already excitedly on the phone, committing himself to the role. "It was the fastest yes I've ever received from a star in my entire producing career," marvels Stark.

Q. When the Reagans have a private celebration of any kind the guest list seems always to be limited to old-time pals. Do the president and first lady have a reason for not expanding their intimate circle? — M.V.

A. Privately, Nancy has said that you don't make new friends in the White House very easily — there are just too many pitfalls. This is probably the reason that Nancy Reagan has always treasured her friends and includes them in any gatherings whenever she can.

Their occasional celebrity replacements, however, receive just a thank you along with a bottle of elderberry wine, the drink served by Jean and Polly in the play. And don't worry about the aged actors who get bumped to make way for the surprise replacements. They

Walker twins confuse producer on the set of hit soap 'Capitol'

Have you noticed anything different about "Capitol's" Trey Clegg recently? A turn of that cultivated head? The walk? The height?

It's a legitimate point. Nicholas Walker, who plays Trey in the soap opera, was joined by his twin brother Malcolm, the handsome opera star from Paris, on a visit recently, and not even producer John Conboy could tell one from the other. A debonair pair, the Walkers can double for each other, and not get caught. Fans wouldn't have a clue over a walk-on.

All summer, while Jordy cracked up and Sloane found her sheik, Trey rummaged about, keeping cool. He is happy with Kelly, a dead spot in soap terms.

"I'm grey," says Nicholas about Trey, a Kennedy prototype, too handsome and devilish for his own good. But somewhere along the way, Trey got sidetracked. Politics lost out to daytime plotting. Juicy inside Capitol Hill maneuverings went out the window. Soap fans were not interested we're told, so play it safe and offend no one. Trey teamed with Sloane, and when both grew bored Kelly moved in. Polished, artful, handsome Trey is relegated to grey. He deserves better.

Twin Malcolm is anything but grey, an American in Paris with his wife, pianist Catherine Dalpres, and two small children. Spending most of his years abroad, Malcolm may belong to the U.S. but his heart is European. He loves Paris, the language, the beauty. He is not the ugly American, the outsider savoring, but wanting to come home.

It's hard for an American baritone to edge native singers for roles, but Malcolm trained in Paris, a student of Nadia Boulanger, broke through in the Paris Opera, performed at the Glyndebourne Festival, in Vienna, in Nice and drew raves for his Nick Shadows in Robert Altman's "Rake Progress."

After visiting his brother, Malcolm auditioned for the San Francisco Opera Company, the Santa Fe Opera and St. Louis companies. The Met in New York comes later.

"The Met in New York is number one in the world," says Malcolm. "It's the pinnacle even though it slipped. For my money San Fran-

cisco is right up there."

Breaking through in Europe takes time and training, so Walker avoided America because "I wasn't ready. Now I am."

If he sings like he looks, Malcolm can't miss at the Met, an American at home in Paris, a twin with a future.

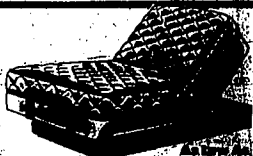

CBS to reveal morning program

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS expects to announce the format and anchors next month for its abbreviated "CBS Morning News" program and a new 90-minute program which will replace most of the news show, the network said Monday.

Van Gordon Sauter, president of CBS News, told department managers and bureau chiefs Sunday in Park City, Utah, that hard news would be carried between 6 a.m. and

7:30 a.m. when the new format begins early next year.

A new, entertainment-oriented program will run in the 7:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. time block now occupied by "CBS Morning News," and may include segments of hard news, Sauter said. It will not be produced by the news or entertainment divisions, but by new group reporting to Sauter, said Ann Morfogen, a network news spokeswoman.

The new programs are expected to debut early next year, she said in a telephone interview from Utah.

CBS earlier had dropped Maria Shriver and Forrest Sawyer as anchors of the morning news show. Faith Daniels, anchor of the "CBS Early Morning News," is going on maternity leave in late October or early November. Ms. Morfogen said, and her role in the new format was not announced.

NBC wins slow week of reruns and sports

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC's Thursday night lineup proved stronger than the best of CBS' Sunday and Monday shows as NBC eked out a first-place finish in a week of reruns and inconsequential sporting events.

NBC, with "The Cosby Show," "Family Ties," "Cheers" and "Night Court" in their customary top four places, won the ratings by one-tenth of a point, the A.C. Nielsen Co. reported Tuesday. NBC has finished first for 16 of 18 weeks this summer.

CBS nalled down fifth through eighth places with "Murder, She Wrote" from Sunday Night, "Newhart" and "Kate and Allie" from Monday, and "Trackdown: the Goodbar Killer," which was broadcast on Sunday.

ABC's "Moonlighting" and "MacGyver" rounded out the top 10.

CBS, which had eight shows in the top 20 to ABC's 7 and NBC's 6, had a 12.1 rating for the week, compared to NBC's 12.2.

CBS won the evening news race with a 10.1 rating, ahead of NBC with a 9.8 rating and ABC at 9.7. The race was so close, however, that each network was credited with 21 percent share of the audience in the time period.

Each rating point equals 859,000 homes equipped with television.

NBC's ratings were hurt by a Mets-Dodgers game, a matchup between a runaway winner in the National League Eastern division and a struggling loser in the NL West; on Wednesday night. It finished 47th in the ratings with a 9.6, just ahead of ABC's Monday night Mets-Dodgers game which finished 50th with an 8.9 rating.

CBS did only slightly better with the Chicago Bears-St. Louis Cardinals pre-season football game on Sunday night, which had a 10.0 rating and 43rd place for the week.

Stations scrambling to replace lost USFL games with padding

The USFL may be sinking, which could set the Good Ship Lollipop to sail once again.

"There will be no black holes on Thursday night. Maybe Shirley Temple, but no black holes," said Bill Schwing, the president of Mizlou TV Sports. The stations he contracted with now have to replace the USFL games which were have been televised this fall — probably with old movies or reruns, Schwing said.

The deal with Mizlou was one of two the league had before it decided not to play this year. The other was with ESPN, a cable TV outfit, which now has to find a substitute. Mizlou, a syndicator, does not.

"This leaves no void in our sales effort. We don't have time periods to fill," Schwing said. The package which was being offered to independent stations will simply not be offered.

Mizlou was planning to syndicate 13 regular-season games on Thursday nights. ESPN had the rights to 22 games on Sun-

day nights. Four of those were playoff games and one of the four was the league's championship game.

Now, of course, the Baltimore Stars may reign forever without defending their championship again.

After the USFL-NFL jury decision was announced on Aug. 4, leaving the USFL with \$3-in damages, ESPN said it had nothing specific to plug the USFL hole if the decision not to play was made. That's what the USFL decided.

Two and a half weeks later, only September has been filled, but ESPN feels the crisis has been met.

"It might have been more of a problem in previous years," ESPN spokesman Chris LaPlaca said, adding that these days, the station has a sufficient reservoir of events to avoid being caught short-handed.

The games of Sept. 14, 21 and 28 will be replaced by a wrestling event, karate and a fight card on the 14th featuring former Olympians Mark Breland and Tyrrell Biggs.

Polish satellite dish TV receptions make military government see red

SZCZECIN, Poland (AP) — Zdzislaw Zniniewicz fiddled with his television set as he sat down to watch the news. After a few adjustments, the announcer appeared speaking in English, from the United States.

The broadcast was "CNN Europe," from the Cable News Network in Atlanta, beamed from a satellite to a 5-foot-wide metal dish in Zniniewicz's backyard.

The picture switched first to Moscow and a report on the Aug. 18 speech by Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev announcing an extension of his nuclear test ban moratorium, and then to Washington for U.S. reaction.

With his satellite antenna, Zniniewicz has a choice of 21 channels from Western Europe and North America. If he had his way, every

Pole would have a similar selection.

"This is another epoch in communications," he said. "You cannot avoid technological progress."

Not everyone in the Polish government agrees with Zniniewicz, a businessman whose private company SVENSAT is Poland's sole producer of satellite TV antennas. Most of his dishes are now exported to Western Europe.

Poland's Communist authorities are debating how to meet the challenges of satellite technology, which threatens to further erode their official monopoly on information.

More than 100 satellite receiving dishes operate in the country, according to Polish press reports, most of them in private hands despite a new law strictly regulating their use.

The dishes are another headache for a government that faces a lively underground press and has already lost control over private video recorders — there are believed to be more than 300,000 in the country.

For now, the government appears to have decided to accept the spread of satellite dishes while trying to make Polish TV more attractive.

In a resolution adopted at its congress in July, the Communist Party said satellite TV should be developed "within the framework of cooperation with socialist countries." Polish newspapers have reported that a Soviet satellite will be placed in orbit by the end of the decade to broadcast TV signals to Eastern Europe.

At the same time, the party said, the quality of Polish TV programming

 ing should be radically improved so it is more attractive to audiences, and thus more competitive with foreign broadcasts.

Since the congress, the head of the state radio and TV committee, Miroslaw Wojciechowski, has been replaced by Janusz Roszkowski, who had directed the official PAP news agency, in what is seen as an attempt to strengthen the party's hand in setting priorities for state broadcasting.

A poll conducted by the government's Public Opinion Surveying Center, excerpted in the party weekly *Polttyka*, July 26, concluded that Polish life as depicted on Polish TV was not like reality.

"The official media do not supply information but put on a kind of show — they answer questions which they themselves ask," *Polttyka* said.

There are signals that Poland may adopt a more liberal media policy like that of Hungary, which improved the openness of its broadcasting after concluding that if Hungarians do not get answers from their own media, they will seek them from foreign broadcasts.

Unlike Poles, Hungarians living near border areas can pick up Austrian and West German satellite dishes are in use in the country.

The widespread impact of Western TV is difficult to assess. Some Western officials maintain that Hungary and East Germany, which receives West German TV signals, have found that Western broadcasts provide harmless escapism that poses no threat to political stability.

Other officials argue that if such organizations as Radio Free Europe or the British Broadcasting Corp. begin native-language TV broadcasts, satellite TV would pose a much bigger problem to closed societies.

As of May 1, all satellite antennas in Poland had to be licensed by the Communications Ministry and the Interior Ministry, which decide

whether a dish would pose a threat to security.

An official at the Board of Central Radio Inspection, Col. Wladyslaw Urbanski, said in an interview that 200 applications for satellite dishes had been filed, but he expected none would be approved until mid-September.

Krzysztof Toeplitz, a leading columnist in the party weekly *Polttyka*, attacked the law as a senseless attempt to stop the march of technology, reminiscent of past


regulations limiting the use of cars and radios.

Speaking of the Western television available to people in Hungary, East Germany and Czechoslovakia, Toeplitz wrote: "Maybe... they get a broader view of the world, broader and more objective. I presume, than do those Poles who supplement the domestic supply of information with Radio Free Europe broadcasts or reading underground bulletins, which are naturally inclined to exaggerate and caricature reality."

Puppets, Frost slam celebrities on NBC

NEW YORK (AP) -- Ever since Watergate or maybe even a year or two before, American politics has defied satire.

Sylvester Stallone for president? Why not?

Would anyone be shocked if the Democrats nominated a populist former window washer? Nah.

No, a country that has survived G. Gordon Liddy, Billy Carter and young Ron Reagan isn't going to collapse laughing at "Spitting Image: Down and Out at the White House," a two-part special appearing on consecutive Saturdays, Aug. 30 and Sept. 6, on NBC.

Despite its marvelous life-size puppets, this British import is disappointingly easy on the funny bone: It has a nasty and occasionally tasteless edge, portraying President Reagan as a senile resident of Fantasyland and making a crude reference to Sen. Edward Kennedy's auto accident at Chappaquiddick.

It's too bad, because with a better script these puppets would be natural winners.

It's silly rather than trenchant, taking the easiest and cheapest shots.

Some jokes are not for the squeamish, such as the game show

"Saw Your Head Off," in which contestants race the clock to decapitate themselves.

Other jokes are hopelessly dumb, as when host and co-executive producer David Frost says the Famous Corp. "knows things which even the

president does not know," such as how to spell "yogurt."

Pop quiz: Why is David Frost famous?

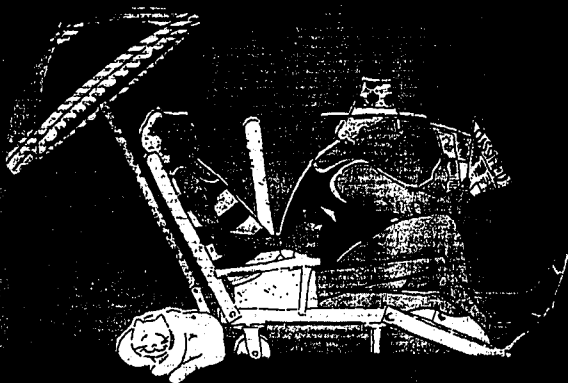
