House approves spending measure

Slim 201-200 vote sends bill to Senate

WASHINGTON — The House on Thursday narrowly approved \$562 billion in spending authority for federal agencies in the new budget year, the largest sum ever crammed into a single money bill.

The measure was passed 201-200 and sent to the Senate despite the threat of a veto by President Reagan. Democrats voted 186-43 in favor of the measure while Republicans voted 157-16 against.

Virtually every facet of government spending for the new fiscal year starting Oct. 1 was wrapped into a single, giant package.

"We put all our eggs in this one basket," said Rep. Frank Lautenberg, chairman of the House Republican whip. He called it the "Bloated Omnibus Money Bill — or BOMB for short," which is just what's going to happen to it when it gets to the White House.

Congress, with only a week to go before the current year runs out, has turned to a single, full-year package, rather than to complete action on any of its regular appropriations bills necessary for government operations.

Without authority to spend, their allotments of funds, federal agencies would be forced to close down next Wednesday, Oct. 1, the first day of fiscal 1989.

Only one amendment, imposing a \$50,000-per-farmer limit on federal crop subsidy payments, was adopted during floor consideration, in a voice vote.

But House passage of the bill only started a three-way struggle with the Republican-led Senate, and with Reagan who already has threatened to veto the measure because he dislikes the priorities established on military versus social spending.

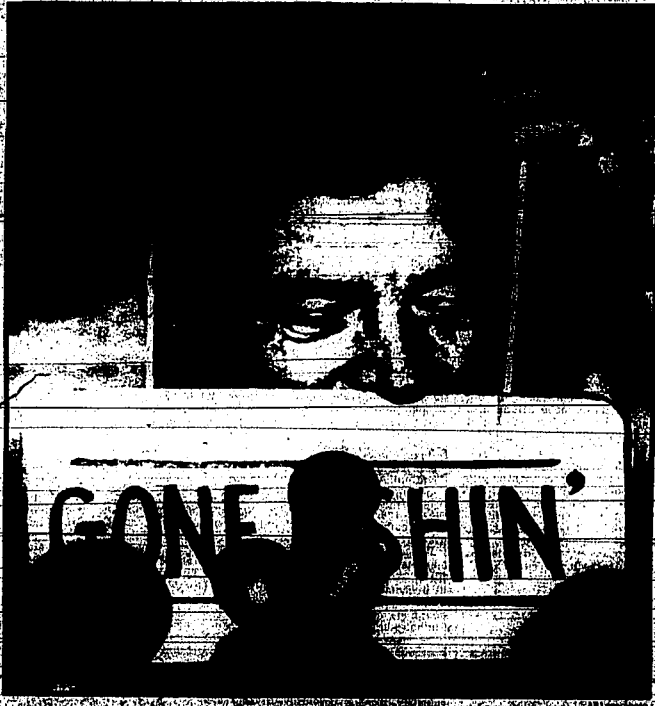
The law only a spending authority limit of \$567 billion for the entire package has been agreed upon, without accord on the specifics. The House bill estimated that additional cash outlays within the fiscal year would be \$558 billion.

Staying within the total, and reaching the expected compact on the companion deficit-reduction legislation already passed by the House and Senate, would help meet the Gramm-Rudman law's red-ink limit of \$1.6 billion.

Within the \$562 billion total, the measure known as the "continuing resolution" sets spending and policy priorities for domestic and military programs. Many of which the Reagan administration says it can't accept.

The bill survived a surprisingly strong challenge by supporters of revenue sharing with local governments, who claimed many of their cities and towns would suffer because the program was dropped from the bill. The White House proposed killing the program, and an

Landmark bill to alter taxes passes House

Burden shifts to companies as bipartisan support shown

WASHINGTON — The House of Representatives voted 292-136 Thursday for landmark legislation that would change the way most Americans pay their income taxes while shifting a big share of the burden to corporations.

The bill was hailed as the most thorough income tax revision ever. The political breakdown: 176 Democrats and 116 Republicans voted yes; 74 Democrats and 62 Republicans voted no, with many of them expressing concern about the bill's impact on an economy plagued by sluggish growth.

The margin of victory for the measure was more overwhelming than even its staunchest supporters had predicted. Some had forecast it would pass by 30 to 50 votes.

Final Senate approval is expected by the end of next week, and the legislation would then be sent to President Reagan for his signature. Officials have indicated the president tentatively plans a ceremonial signing, likely the week of Oct. 5, and would mark the end of a two-year fight for an issue that Reagan has at the top of his second-term agenda.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said Reagan "welcomes to do" by the House.

"The country is now only one vote away in the Senate from enacting the president's number one domestic priority — a tax system that will promote economic growth, simplify tax returns for the vast majority of Americans, return the code to a promise of fairness and equity, and most important of all, reduce rates for most Americans," Speakes said.

Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, D-Ill., a chief author of the bill, said, "We are going to let the American people know that their legislative process is working, that when they request of their leaders in Washington a change, that we respond."

"The legislation, he added, responds to a public demand that the family down the street or the corporation across town can't beat the system any longer."

"We must not pass up this historic opportunity to make a contribution to those elements of the American economy that have long been neglected: the working poor, the family, labor and capital," said Rep. Jack P. Kemp, R-N.Y.

This is the most sweeping tax reform legislation in the history of this nation," Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill, D-Mass., said in closing the debate. "If we pass this bill, the 99th Congress will assume a special place in the history of this country."

NASA unveils plan to build permanent space station by '94

WASHINGTON — NASA officials unveiled a new plan on Thursday that would require 17 space shuttle flights to assemble a space station, from one center to another, said beginning in 1993 and finishing in 1994.

The new design is a modified version of what had been proposed originally, using four "presurized" chambers to connect the station's living quarters with laboratories and other modules.

As he presented the design to Congress, Administrator James C. Fletcher outlined a new management plan that would keep all station production work dealing with the manned aspects of the station in Houston.

Texas congressmen had been up in arms over the previous proposal that would have shifted about 1,900

prospective jobs from Houston to the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Ala. Their protests caused Fletcher to put the program on hold for 90 days for a review.

"We are not transferring work from one center to another," said Andrew J. Stefan, the newly appointed chief of the space station program. Four NASA centers, including the Marshall Space Flight Center, are in charge of various "work packages," that will be parceled out to contractors.

Meese envisions increased drug eradication raids abroad

WASHINGTON — Attorney General Edwin Meese said Thursday the United States is discussing with other countries the possibility of conducting joint drug eradication ventures similar to the operation now under way in Bolivia.

Meese, meeting with reporters to discuss administration efforts to stop drug trafficking internationally, said within U.S. borders was asked whether the much-publicized Operation Blast Furnace operation, targeting clandestine cocaine laboratories in the jungles of Bolivia, was a one-of-a-kind campaign that would not be repeated.

"I would hope that we would have similar types of operations tailored to the situation and the needs of other countries," said Meese, adding, "We are looking at plans in a number of countries." He said

discussions were ongoing and declined to identify the countries.

In other developments Thursday, President Reagan said he and his wife, Nancy, will meet Oct. 6-7 here with a group of American ambassadors to other nations, to discuss how we can mobilize an international commitment to win the war against illegal drug use.

Reagan said the meeting would be attended by "our ambassadors from those countries which face major drug production, consumption, and transportation problems." He discussed it in more detail in a speech to the National Fraternal Congress, an organization of groups engaged in volunteer work.

An official of the U.S. Forest Service said that Viet Cong-style traps such as camouflaged pits studded with sharpened stakes are being used by narcotics growers on trails leading to marijuana plantations in some states.



Attorney for St. Chapelle Broich at fault for labels

BOISE (AP) — Officials of the St. Chapelle Winery, a family of Idaho Sen. Steve Symms concede that at least some wine produced there was mislabeled, but attorney Robert Koontz says the mislabeling was the fault of ousted winemaker Bill Broich, not the Symms family.

"Not only was Bill Broich the manager, but he was on the board of directors, and he owned 20 percent of the stock in the company. He was the professional that ran the company," said Robert Koontz, Boise.

"If there was any mislabeling, it certainly falls on his doorstep," Koontz said.

Broich has charged that the St. Chapelle board of directors ordered him to mislabel wines. He said Sen. Symms, although not on the board, had full knowledge of the alleged scheme.

Symms has issued statements

denying that he had anything to do with management of the winery. He could not be reached for comment Thursday.

By printing "Idaho" on the labels of some 100,000 cases of wine made mostly with Washington and Oregon grapes, St. Chapelle bilked consumers who were willing to pay hefty premiums for Idaho wines, Broich said. The added income amounted to hundreds of thousands of dollars between 1979 and 1985, he said.

Koontz said there was no way of knowing whether the mislabeled wine was still on the market.

Koontz said Broich was fired by St. Chapelle for the mislabeling. "But that wasn't the only reason," Koontz said. Broich was fired for misappellation and possibly defrauding the company. He said the winery may file legal action against Broich.

Broich has said he left St. Cha-

pelle in July 1985 because he disagreed with the practice of mislabeling wine. He since has established a winery north of Boise that competes with St. Chapelle's.

Koontz said he would represent Sen. Symms, but is not the attorney for the winery. But he reiterated Sen. Symms' contention that he had no knowledge of activities at the winery and that the attention being given the investigation was politically motivated. Symms, a first-term Republican, is locked in a heated re-election race with Democratic challenger Gov. John Evans.

"To me, as an outsider, it just doesn't seem like a big deal," Koontz said. "It's just a big deal because the senator's involved."

"If Steve Symms was not Dick Symms' brother, the Idaho Stateman probably would have carried this on the obit page," Koontz said.

Artificial dairy product labels subject of disputed Idaho law

BOISE (AP) — A decision on whether Idaho will implement a law that governs the labeling of artificial dairy products is expected by Friday, officials said.

The law is scheduled to take effect Oct. 1, but it is being disputed by a national organization of companies that manufacture artificial dairy products. That group was granted a temporary restraining order against the implementation of a similar law in Kansas on Tuesday, said Marv Patten, chief of the Idaho Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Dairying.

A representative from the industry group was in Boise on Tuesday to discuss Idaho's intention to implement the law, Patten said. A

copy of the legal documents filed in Kansas will be studied by the Department of Agriculture and the attorney general's office before a final decision is made, he said.

If Idaho implements the law on schedule, it is likely that a similar court suit will be filed, Patten said. "We want to make sure our position is defensible," he said.

The law, which has the backing of the state's dairy industry, requires that artificial dairy products be labeled: "This is an artificial dairy product."

Artificial dairy products usually substitute vegetable oil for milk fat, but they are sold side by side with dairy products and often for a lower price.

Idaho would be the fourth state to have such a law.

The Idaho law was passed by the 1985 Legislature and was to become enforceable Jan. 1, 1986. Companies that sell non-dairy products asked for extra time to change labels and clear old merchandise. Patten said he granted one extension for six months and another for four months. A request to delay implementation until Jan. 1, 1987, was denied, Patten said.

A representative of CALM — the Committee for Accurate Labeling and Marketing Inc. — a non-profit group based in Illinois, met with state officials on Tuesday and indicated it would like an extension, Patten said.

Drug tests plan at INEL in works

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The Department of Energy is developing a plan to make drug testing programs consistent across the work force at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory in eastern Idaho.

"We are working to smooth out the differences and make it uniform across the site," INEL Manager Troy Wade said. "We will do everything we can to make the INEL a drug-free environment."

Efforts to clear the site of drugs and drug use have been under way for the past two years. Spot search-

ers and drug-sniffing dogs have been used, and private contractors like EG&G Idaho have been testing job applicants and workers in what have been determined sensitive positions — people with access to nuclear material or equipment, chemical processors and supervisory, security and naval personnel are all subject to random testing.

Some contractors have also indicated plans to extend their testing programs to current employees not covered by the present policies.

Although several court challenges have been filed, the specific testing

plans have been upheld so far, and officials of the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union representing the site have declined to formally enter the debate.

"I can't say we go along with it or are against it," said local President Gerald Oliver.

Wade said the facility is "further ahead and better prepared than other labs across the country" in dealing with the drug problem, pointing out that the energy department has used the policies in effect at INEL as a model for some components of its nationwide proposal.

Gem high court affirms claim against Sunshine

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court has ruled in favor of Metropolitan Mines Corp., Limited, in a long-running legal battle with Sunshine Mining Co. over ownership of an underground ore vein.

In a 4-1 decision released Thursday, the court agreed with 1st District Judge Walt Fraibler's ruling granting Metropolitan Mines clear title to the portion of the Copper Vein lying within the Metropolitan property. Justice Allan Shepard dissented without opinion.

Sunshine in 1979 served notice upon Metropolitan that it intended to

mine its Copper Vein extending on Metropolitan property, under the mining law of "extraterritorial rights."

If a mining company can prove that the apex of the vein is on its property, it is entitled to mine a vein, even if it runs on to somebody else's property, the law holds.

In 1983, Sunshine agreed to drop its claim, but Metropolitan pressed its counter-claim against Sunshine to win clear title to the vein.

Justice Jack Ames bound Emmons over for trial on Sept. 10 after a hearing in which there was sufficient evidence on the charges of murder, robbery and kidnapping with the use of a deadly weapon and grand larceny.

Emmons, a 24-year-old transient, is charged in the death of Harry Taylor, whose body was found in December 1985 near Oast, just off Interstate 89 in eastern Elko County.

Pocatello schools pay fee, but reiterate protest to city

POCATELLO (AP) — The Pocatello School District will pay a disputed \$188-per-month street fee to the City of Pocatello, but under protest, and preserving its option to fight the fee.

School superintendent Rulon Bills said the decision will not stop the district from taking action against the fee.

The board decided it would be inappropriate now to spend money to fight the fee, he said.

The school board decided in an executive session Wednesday to pay the fee. Since July 1 when the district began charging a monthly street fee, the district has refused to pay it.

School officials say the fee is improper because it is not an official tax.

Tribe launches fuel program

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — The Crow Indian Tribe in Montana has laid the groundwork for an emergency fuel program for itself and the neighboring Indian reservations in Wyoming and the Dakotas, a tribal leader said.

Richard Reabird, chairman of the Crow Tribe, announced Wednesday at the National Congress of American Indians here that his tribe is "sitting on 5 billion tons of extractable coal and we think some of that should be used to benefit our own people instead of helping utility companies get rich."

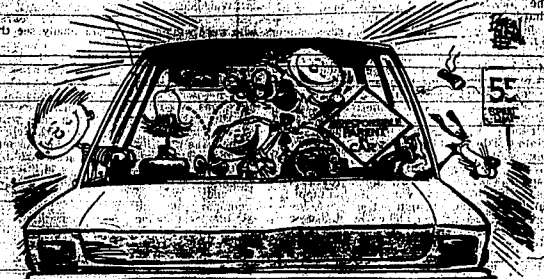

Sirica hangs up black robe

Watergate judge retires at age 82

WASHINGTON (AP) — Twelve years from the start of the trial that made him the best-known judge in America, John J. Sirica is hanging up his black robe for good.

The judge, who stood up to Richard Nixon and helped break the biggest political scandal in U.S. history, is retiring at 82.

"I've paid my dues," he said recently. "There comes a time in everybody's life when you have to slow down. I've come to that point now."

His career spanned 60 years, half of that time as a lawyer and half as a judge. He officially steps down from the bench Tuesday.

Sirica, a Republican party workhorse who had made speeches for Nixon in his 1952 and 1956 vice-presidential campaigns, was put on the federal bench in 1957 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The Watergate scandal brought him to prominence. He was chief judge of the U.S. District Court in

broke into Democratic Party national headquarters in the Watergate Office Building.

Sirica decided that his Republican background would deflect charges of political bias and assigned the case to himself. "I really didn't know what I was getting into," he wrote later. "I didn't have a hank that it wouldn't be about five years later that I would finally see the last of this case."

After the burglary trial, in which five men pleaded guilty and two were convicted, Sirica's involvement in the case deepened. Judgments charging top Nixon men with taking part in trying to cover up the White House involvement with the burglars were returned before Sirica.

It was Sirica's insistence that Nixon yield his papers and secretly made tape recordings that eventually led the 37th president to resign the office. He once wrote that if Nixon had been convicted in his court, "it would have sent him to jail."

Med school graduates' debt increases; averages \$30,000

CHICAGO (AP) — Graduates of U.S. medical schools are getting deeper and deeper in debt, with the average \$30,000 burden nearly double what it was in 1980, according to an American Medical Association survey.

"That's a worrisome trend that tells us several things," said Anne Crowley, director of the AMA's Office of Medical Education Information Analysis.

"It tells us society may be a little less disposed to pay for education in general" through grants and other means, she said, and may be particularly less inclined to help educate doctors.

"Beyond that, it could have a serious impact on the number of minority applicants or those from economically disadvantaged groups who are able to get a medical education," Ms. Crowley added.

The debt was just one indication of the changes in U.S. medical education, according to the AMA's sixth annual report in Friday's Journal of the American Medical Association.

Among other trends, the report noted:

- A decline in first-time enrollments for the fourth year in a row.
- The talk about a surplus of physicians has certainly affected applications, and the problems of liability insurance have probably had an impact as well, noted Ms. Crowley.
- Even the high cost of financing school has contributed, perhaps, to making it seem a little less desirable career.
- A continuing increase in the number of women enrolling in and graduating from medical schools. Women made up 33 percent of a total enrollment of 66,604 for the 1985-86 school year, and 31 percent of the 18,191 graduates.

Winds kill two, force evacuation

ABERDEEN, S.D. (AP) — Severe winds pummeled a trailer park early Thursday, killing two girls and forcing the evacuation of at least 240 people, because authorities feared broken pipes and power lines might spark flames.

No one else was seriously injured as the storm damaged or overturned 10 trailers, resulting in the death of an elderly woman trapped in her tipped-over trailer by cutting a hole in its roof, said Brown County Sheriff

Steve Oakes.

Authorities had not yet determined what killed the girls, whose home overturned and caught fire, said Oakes. He identified them as Leanna Clausen, 11, and her sister, Roberta Clausen, 8.

"The trailer was a blazing inferno, and nobody could get to them," he said. "I guess there were a couple of people that tried."

The girls' father, Klm, was at

Senate leader: votes to save sanction veto short, but rising

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate's No. 2 GOP leader said Thursday his head count falls short of the 34 votes needed to sustain President Reagan's impending veto of legislation imposing sanctions against South Africa but that prospects have improved somewhat.

"There are more than 20 and less than 34," Sen. Alan Simpson, R-Wyo., the Senate's GOP whip, told reporters.

The Senate voted 24-14 to pass the sanctions bill which, among other things, forbids new U.S. investment and bank loans, bans the import of South African uranium, coal, steel, textiles and agricultural products, and ends commercial air traffic between the United States and white-minority ruled South Africa.

White House spokesman Larry Spinks said Reagan would definitely veto the legislation on Friday.

But he also acknowledged the president does not yet have the votes to sustain that action and that obtaining them may prove difficult.

"It's going to be very tough," Simpson said, noting that senators voice for sanctions only after a long and difficult debate.

Two-thirds of the members present and voting are needed to override a presidential veto. The votes of 34 senators are needed if all 100 senators voted, that would mean changing the votes of 20 of the Republican senators who voted for sanctions.

There has been speculation Reagan might try to win support for his position by issuing an expanded executive order imposing additional sanctions against South Africa.

Town digs in; fugitive eludes police

WRIGHT CITY, Mo. (AP) — Residents of this farm town were growing increasingly tense and angry Thursday knowing that a mentally ill man suspected in three slayings might still be in their midst after eluding a three-day dragnet.

Almost everyone had a gun, and didn't hide it. Frightened families huddled behind locked doors, fearing the suspect might show up on their doorstep. Armed FBI agents rode school buses to protect children who hadn't been kept home. Freight trains rolled slowly by officers hugg-

ing shotguns. Civic and social meetings were canceled. Business was slow except at shops selling groceries and ammunition.

Life has not been good in Wright City since Michael Wayne Jackson arrived Monday night in a stolen car and a blaze of gunfire.

"How can one man come in here and disrupt so many people's lives?" Karen Giroard asked. "We used to be a friendly, quiet little town. We'll be glad when it's that way again."

About 100 officers on Thursday swarmed the community and coun-

tryside, believing Jackson remained either holed up somewhere that had a source of food or lay wounded and immobilized somewhere in a field or woods.

"We think he is out there, and we're after him in full force," said Hal Belterhoff, FBI agent in charge of the St. Louis office. Authorities, however, said they had no solid leads on Jackson's whereabouts.

Jackson was last seen fleeing a stolen Cadillac on Monday night just minutes after he exchanged gunfire with two Wright City police officers.

FAA ripped by congressmen

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress-ional critics charged the Federal Aviation Administration Thursday with "bureaucratic footdragging" and turf-guarding in failing to have moved quickly to give commercial aircraft T-CAS devices.

"We are here to find out why it has taken nearly three decades to develop a piece of equipment that could save lives, and why the use of such equipment was not long ago made mandatory," declared Rep. James L. Oberstar, D-Minn., in opening hearings on the long-standing collision avoidance controversy.

The hearings came a week after the Federal Aviation Administration said it plans to propose a regulation next year that would require commercial jetliners to be equipped with

devices that warn pilots of nearby aircraft. The FAA and industry have for more than 20 years searched for ways to warn pilots of an impending collision. The effort gained renewed attention after the Aug. 31 collision of a private plane and a Mexican jetliner over Perris, Calif. At least 81 people were killed.

But even before that accident, the FAA apparently had serious concerns about the possibility of colliding with another aircraft.

The Air Line Pilots Association, which represents the bulk of commercial pilots, more than 34,000 altogether, said Thursday that a survey of 28,000 of its members last June showed the danger of an aerial collision was the "single greatest"

safety concern among commercial pilots. Three out of four pilots said the development of a collision avoidance system should be given a high priority and two out of three rejected a suggestion that the danger might be exaggerated, according to the union.

Last week FAA Administrator Donald Engen reiterated his commitment to get collision avoidance equipment — known as T-CAS — into commercial jetliners, but acknowledged that even at the current pace, the devices will not be in widespread use until 1989 or 1990.

Testing of the T-CAS devices on commercial flights is scheduled to begin on a Piedmont Airlines jet later this year and on about a dozen United Airlines and Northwest Airlines aircraft next year.

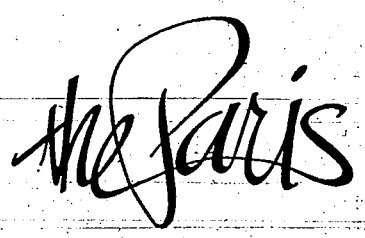

Cleveland has been chosen as the site of the Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame and Museum, but construction has not started.

The original inductees were Chuck Berry, Elvis Presley, James Brown, Ray Charles, Sam Cooke, Fats Domino, the Everly Brothers, Buddy Holly, Jerry Lee Lewis and Little Richard.

Chinese, Soviets to resume border talks

PEKING (AP) — China and the Soviet Union agreed Thursday to resume negotiations over their disputed border, officials Xinhua news agency reported. The talks were suspended eight years ago.

The agreement was made between Chinese Foreign Minister Wu Xueqin and Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze, who are attending the U.N. General Assembly session in New York, Xinhua said. In a report from the United Nations.

"Both sides agreed to resume next year the Sino-Soviet boundary talks at a vice foreign ministerial level," the Chinese news agency said.

The two men had an "extensive and frank exchange of views on the question of demarcation of the lines between the two countries and on international issues," the news agency said.

It did not give any other details. Talks on the 4,350-mile common border of the two communist countries began after clashes in 1969 over the disputed island of Zhenbao in the Ussuri River. The negotiations produced no agreements and were suspended in June 1978. The last meeting was in Peking.

China has more than a million troops along the border with the Soviet Union, and the Red Army strength along the boundary is estimated at up to 600,000.

Soviets honor firefighters at Chernobyl

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union on Thursday bestowed its highest honors for heroism on three firefighters at the Chernobyl nuclear plant who battled flames at the No. 4 reactor and prevented a greater nuclear disaster.

Two of the firefighters, Viktor Kibonok and Vladimir Fyavik, died of radiation sickness. The government newspaper Izvestia printed a picture of the surviving firefighter, Maj. Leonid Telyatnikov, on the front page, beside official decrees naming them heroes of the Soviet Union.

Telyatnikov, who was pictured in Soviet media in May with a full head of hair, was bald in the Izvestia photograph.

Doctors treating victims of the April 26 Chernobyl disaster, which has claimed 31 lives to date by official count, have said hair loss is a common consequence of exposure to massive radiation doses. Radiation from Chernobyl spread across several European countries and large areas of the Soviet Union. The losses to the Soviet economy from the disaster have been estimated by the Soviets at the equivalent of nearly \$3 billion.

Britain appeals to Soviets for Daniloff's release

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — Britain supported the United States on Thursday by appealing to the Soviet Union to free American reporter Nicholas Daniloff in order to ease East-West tensions and remove an obstacle to a superpower summit.

The British foreign secretary, Sir Geoffrey Howe, told a news conference that the Aug. 30 arrest of Daniloff in Moscow on espionage charges was "unacceptable Soviet behavior."

Howe said West European embassies in Moscow had appealed to the Soviet government on behalf of Daniloff, a correspondent for U.S. News & World Report. "Just when things seemed set for Daniloff to a summit, the arrest of

Daniloff has halted the countdown," he said.

The 51-year-old reporter's confinement to Moscow pending trial has been the subject of intensive high-level talks between the United States and Soviet Union.

Secretary of State George P. Shultz met twice Tuesday in New York with Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze. U.S. officials said Shultz is willing to meet with Shevardnadze again.

The United States has proposed a two-stage exchange—that would begin with Daniloff's release. Genadiy Zakharov, a Soviet U.N. employee arrested in New York on Aug. 23 and charged with spying, then would be swapped for an

undetermined number of Soviet dissidents.

Among prominent dissidents unable to leave the Soviet Union are Yuri Orlov, Alexander Lerner, Ida Nudel and Vladimir Slepak.

In Hamburg, West Germany, the mass-circulation newspaper Bild said Daniloff probably will be released by early December on Berlin's Glienicke Bridge. It said the reporter, a "free woman rights" activist, is a physician jailed in East Germany and several West German agents jailed in the Soviet bloc would be traded for Zakharov and two other East bloc agents.

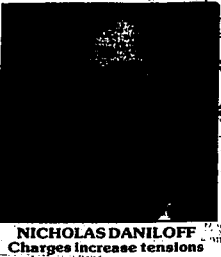
Bild did not cite its sources. Repeated telephone calls to a U.S. Embassy spokesman in Bonn went unanswered.

In Moscow, a Foreign Ministry spokesman said a compromise was still possible in the Daniloff case. "A mutually acceptable solution can be found," said the spokesman, Boris Pyadyayev.

However, he said, "To achieve a compromise we believe one needs a calm situation, without dramatizing the case. We do not believe publicizing this problem on the front pages of newspapers will help resolve it."

At his news conference, Howe said the case "has once again shown how the long haul of building confidence and predictability into East-West relations can be held hostage to unacceptable Soviet behavior."

Camacho, Bramble battle tonight for showdown

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. — Hector "Macho" Camacho and Livingston Bramble, two of boxing's most colorful characters, defend their share of the lightweight title Friday night.

What they really want is to fight each other, and such a fight is planned.

It would be an attention-getter: the wide-cracking Camacho, who swept up in New York's Spanish Harlem and who likes metallic suits and fancy cars, against the suave, cranking Bramble, a Rastafarian who trains to the beat of reggae music and keeps pit bulls and snakes as pets.

But first Camacho must retain the World Boxing Council title against Cornelius Boza-Edwards, and Bramble must beat Edwin Rosario in the defense of the World Boxing Association title.

Then each will have another defense, before their showdown next year. — Camacho against Vianis Paez of Cranston, R.I., and Bramble against Juan Nazario of Puerto Rico.

"All I've got to do is beat Bramble," Camacho said. "After that, who's left?"

Both fights will be televised by HBO. Bramble's defense is set for 10 rounds and will start about 10 p.m. EDT. Camacho's scheduled 12-round fight can't start before 10 p.m. and probably will start between 10:15 and 10:25 p.m.

"He's not fighting Terrence Allis this time," Camacho said. Boza-Edwards fought a 10-round draw

against Allis in last fight March 30. "If he's never fought a great fighter, he will be fighting one this time," Camacho added.

On paper, it would seem that Bramble has the tougher task Friday night.

Rosario rattled Camacho on several occasions when he challenged the "Macho Man" on June 13 at Madison Square Garden in New York. Camacho kept the title of a split decision.

All Rosario, fights him with the same determination as I did, he'll beat Bramble," Camacho said. "I don't think it will go past 10 rounds," Bramble said in predicting a victory. "Camacho said, 'Boza-Edwards fought a 10-round draw

Sisters maintain tradition of Basque Dinner

Annual event began 35 years ago
in the heyday of Hailey sheepherding

HAILEY — For 35 years there has been an annual Basque Dinner sponsored by the St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church in Hailey. Since the very first dinner, five of the former packhead sisters have been involved in planning and hosting the affair.

Rose Mallory, the oldest of the four, remembers the first dinner held in the 1950s at a home owned by the Astorquia family. There were so many people that the next year Rose's mother, Epi Inchausti, decided to open her home to supply additional space.

"It was very difficult because it was a private residence but we moved all the furniture out of the bedroom, furniture," Mallory said. "We put it out in the yard and on the front porch. I just can't believe now that we did those things but we did."

Mallory's sister, Julie Stevens, is the chairman of the organizing committee this year. She is helping organize the local Basque dancers and local children who will join the Oinkari dancers from Boise to entertain the diners.

Two more sisters are Jo Head and Dorothy Anseloni, who will come from Boise. They will supervise the cooking of roast lamb, Spanish rice with chorizo, Basque beans, parsley potatoes, and salad. Bread and pastries are made by members of the church. Flan, a traditional caramel custard dessert, will be made by Bill Mallory, Rose's husband, who is a professional baker. All of this will be prepared in

quantities to serve the 500 people expected to attend.

Another sister, Mary Louise McGonigal, will be helping to sell raffle tickets and working in the bingo room.

The sisters are reluctant to take the limelight, Mallory said. "There have been many others through the years responsible for the work and planning."

Mallory commented that the Basque population in the area has dwindled in recent years as the size and number of the big sheep herds have declined.

"A lot of the owners were Basque, and so were many of the sheepherders," she said. "These people were great friends of my parents and the Astorquias. There used to be two or three bands of sheep a day going right by my parents' house on River Street. Now there aren't many and they go around by the railroad tracks."

The dinner which started as a get-together for all the Basque sheep men in the area now draws many of the Basque people who come out of town for the event. In fact, out-of-towners outnumber the local residents served at the dinner, said Mallory.

The dinner will take place on Saturday from 5 to 9 p.m. A dance follows at about 9:30 p.m. Both dinner and dance will be at the St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church hall at 305 1st. Ave. South. Tickets cost \$10 for adults, \$5 for seniors and \$3 for children.

There will be a raffle in conjunction with the dinner. Prizes are a three-day trip for two to California wine country, an original painting by Ralph Harris, a pair of Pre skin, and a hinoquarter of beef.

Vanity videos play private MTV needs

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. — In Hollywood, so the common wisdom has it, everyone has a screenplay, a book or a play tucked away in the hopes that her or his latent genius will be recognized someday.

Now, thanks to a do-it-yourself audio-video studio in the Universal Studios "Four" complex — here, amateurs can add a demo tape to that short list of dreams. Hopelists may make an audio tape or a full-blown music video for \$20 or less.

Until recently, few companies had updated the old "make your own record" machines that appeared at carnivals and tourist attractions in the 1950s. So in 1984, when entrepreneur Glenn Pierce began Sound Tracks Inc. and opened his first public studio in the Great Smoky Mountains resort town of Gatlinburg, Tenn., producing personal tapes and videos seemed like an idea whose time had come.

To hear Brenda Aveyard, executive producer of the company's three-month-old, six-studio Universal City facility, tell it, the dream business is doing quite well.

Sound Tracks, which is based in Sevierville, Tenn., has opened more than 50 of its fantasy franchises across the United States, mostly in shopping malls and amusement parks. In Cincinnati's King's Island amusement park, but the new plant in the Los Angeles suburb of Universal City is the company's biggest, handling as many as 50 aspiring artists an hour.

"You'd be surprised how little encouragement people need to go in there and sing something," Aveyard said.

Her point was demonstrated by John Lepper of Mesa, Ariz., his wife and four children, who beamed setside tourists when they walked in to the video mini-studio. But once settled, the sextet launched into the Oak Ridge Boys' "Elvira" with gusto, even though John and the kids forgot the words halfway through.

Asked about the experience, Lepper said simply, "It was a gas."

But it is not quite that simple. Though the studios try to take most of the kinks out of the process, a selection of about 200 songs — pre-recorded instrumental tracks with what are called "helping vocals," half-volume vocal lines to guide wayward singers back on pitch — run the gamut from "San Francisco" to "Don't Mess With My 'Toot-Toot'" to "Amazing Grace," and all can be either lip-synched or sung live and mixed with the instrumental tracks for a stereo demo tape. The audio-only version runs \$9.95.

The video, with the pre-recorded singing mixed onto the videotape, costs \$19.95, and it is a more deluxe production: "Artists," as the Sound Tracks staff call their customers, choose costumes or wild clothes from an employee and then set up behind dummies drums, keyboards, guitars and microphones and, as Robert Palmer's "Addicted to Love" (with the Roccos' guest vocals) came through the speakers, youngest son Dennis blithely bashed away at the drum. Rocco Jr.

Goldblum's 'Fly': Groucho-like insect

TWIN FALLS — Following are capsule reviews of movies currently playing in the Twin Falls area. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

Movie reviews

THE FLY (R). As much a romantic tragedy as a black-humor horror film, "The Fly" unfolds with such eerie grandeur that it will leave you stoked with a creepy high hours after you have left the theater. As scientist Seth Brundle, Jeff Goldblum never loses touch with the dark, comic side of this adventure, offering some delightfully droll, comic touches as a character who's not so much a monster as Groucho Marx with antennae instead of a cigar. Director David Cronenberg has created more than a nightmare with this "horror," even disgusting shocker. He is expert at taking you into the darkest corners of our wildest dreams.

ALIENS (R). The image of Sigourney Weaver, from some Stephen King in exorcist, battling scrappy, skinny 9-year Carter Hearn, is what really powers James Cameron's sequel. It does not have

the pure, primal horror of Ridley Scott's original; hordes of aliens are less powerful than one, and the Marines who invade the planet with Weaver are almost faceless, there simply to be kicked off. But Weaver — fine, furious, given biting dialogue for that patrician-looking mouth — may be quite enough.

BACK TO SCHOOL (PG-13). A big belly laugh of a comedy, expertly tailored to the talents of Rodney Dangerfield, cast as a bolsterer self-made clothing tycoon who returns to college to set a good example to his wallflower son (Keith Gordon). A sleek, witty Sally Kellerman is Dangerfield's English prof and a hilarious Adrienne Barbeau is Dangerfield's social-climbing, twomiling wife. With Robert Downey Jr., Burt Young, Ned Beatty, Terry Fator.

FERRIS BUELLER'S DAY OFF (PG-13). Teen chronicler John Hughes has constructed the mythic teen-ager, Ferris Bueller (Matthew

Broderick), a giddy scamp who is too savvy for his parents, too cool for school and an absolute terror when it comes to restaurant malfeasance. The film's hook is a lightning fantasy for adults as well as kids: what if you could fool your parents and teachers (or for that matter, your boss) into thinking you were sick, earning yourself a 24-hour pass to give you the responsibilities of real life? It's a hilarious miscalculation. Bueller, played by hero so smug and invulnerable that he does not give us any chance to root for him.

THE KARATE KID, PART II (PG). This sequel to 1984's teen choppy-socky hit is another "massive audience action fairy tale — but without the obsession with virility, cheap cynicism and endless kill count of the "Cobra's" and "Raw Deals." Director John Avildsen and writer Robert Mark Kamen send Ralph Macchio's Kid — and Pat Morita's implicitly sage martial arts mentor, Miyagi, to Okinawa; there, they stumble into a Chinese "kung fu" story line escalating kung fu, and a ludicrously contrived climax — but also into some unexpected cross-cultural romance and sentiment. Morita, once again, is marvelous, and you can even cheer for the heroes at the end without feeling sordid.

STAND BY ME (R). "Stand By Me" is the summer's great gift, a compassionate perfectly performed look at the real heart of youth. Its atmosphere is full of the great, crude, cruddy, ripe bunter of four 12-year-old boys, and these four young actors (River Phoenix, Will Wheaton, Corey Feldman and Jerry O'Connell) have a depth and understanding that makes each character believable for days after the film. And what a director. Rob Reiner has become: He has seen

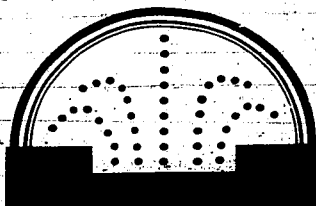

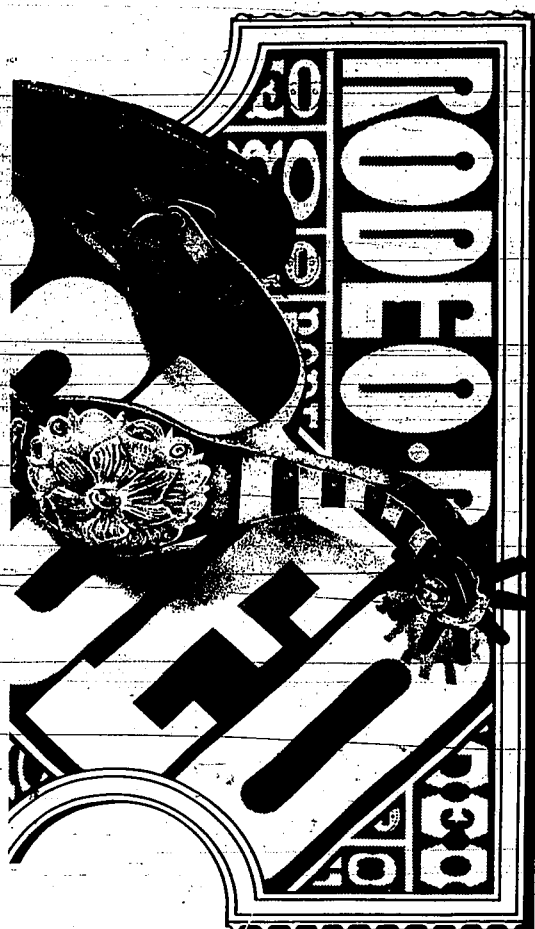

Judge affirms open markets

Kills Melcher's Fed challenge

WASHINGTON — A federal judge Thursday upheld the constitutionality of the way the Federal Reserve system regulates the nation's money supply.

Judge John Melcher, D-Mont., challenged the make-up of the membership of the policy-making Open Market Committee because Congress does not get to vote on the appointment of five of its 12 members.

U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene ruled in a 19-page opinion that the sale and purchase of government securities — the committee's primary tool for controlling the supply of money and credit — in the economy — was done without direct governmental involvement for many years before the committee was established in 1955.

"Like the Federal Reserve Board itself, the committee is composed of

public officials and private citizens. Congress decided in 1955 the committee should include the seven members of the Fed's Board of Governors plus the president of the New York Federal Reserve district bank and the presidents of four of the 11 other Federal Reserve district banks.

The members of the board serve 14-year terms to insulate them from the daily pressures of politics. They are appointed by the president, subject to confirmation by the Senate.

However, the five bank presidents on the committee work for institutions owned by commercial banks and are chosen by the district banks with the approval of the Board of Governors. Neither their jobs as presidents nor their appointments to the committee are under the jurisdiction of either the president or the Senate.

Melcher argued that Congress violated the Constitution when it passed a law giving the authority to make important government policy to private citizens whose fitness was not approved by the executive or legislative branches.

"Congress has employed its undoubted power to regulate the banking industry and the nation's money,"

Early gains from finance offers drop late in month

DETROIT — Sales by the nation's automakers in mid-September ran slightly ahead of a year earlier but dropped from the runaway business produced earlier in the month by bargain financing, the companies said Wednesday.

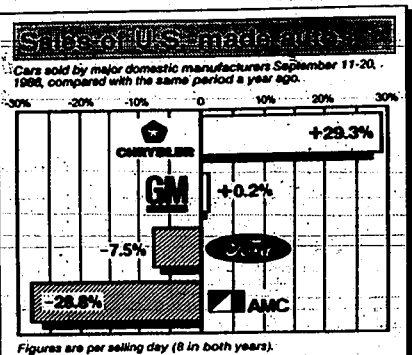
The seven domestic automakers sold 294,636 cars in the Sept. 11-20 period, up 1.7 percent from the 289,582 sold in the corresponding period last year.

Chrysler Corp., the No. 3 automaker, showed the greatest increase from a year earlier, 23.3 percent.

No. 1 General Motors Corp. sales rose a bare 0.2 percent from mid-September 1985, and No. 2 Ford Motor Co.'s sales fell by 7.5 percent.

Sales were more than 20 percent below the near-record 388,674 cars sold during the first 10 days of September, the first reporting period to include sales under sales promotions by the major automakers that included now-car loans with interest of under 3 percent.

Analysts said sales trailed off in early September because dealers

were running short of 1986 models. Mid-September's seasonally adjusted annual selling rate, a standard measure of sales, was 1.1 million vehicles, virtually unchanged from 10.9 million a year earlier but down sharply from 17 million recorded in early September, the first reporting period to include sales under sales promotions by the major automakers that included now-car loans with interest of under 3 percent.

Family income splits undercut by new law

One of the all-time favorite tax-cutting techniques is family income splitting. And there is a solid reason for it.

Family income-splitting shifts income out of the high tax bracket of one family member into the lower tax bracket of another. As a result, the overall family tax bill is cut.

The new law undercuts (or tries to undercut) income-splitting in a big way.

Smaller savings: Before 1987, the difference between the top and bottom bracket is 39 percentage points (from 50 percent to 11 percent). For 1987, the difference is 27 1/2 points. For 1988 and later, the spread is only 13 points under the new two-bracket system (from 28 percent to 15 percent). But the tax savings can still be substantial. For example, if you shifted \$3,000 of income a year from the 28 percent bracket to the 15 percent bracket, you would save \$390 a year. So-for-10 years you save \$3,900.

According to Eli J. Warach, chief consulting editor of Prentice-Hall Information Services, the new law makes it tougher to shift income. Generally, the simplest way for a parent to shift income is to give the child a gift of income-producing property. The new law cracks down on

this basic income-shifting technique for many families. Under new provisions, investment income given by a parent to a child under age 14 is generally taxed to the child at the parent's top rate. Watch this piffle. The effective date could be a disaster. The crackdown applies to income received after 1986, even if cash or property was transferred to the child before 1987.

In addition, starting in 1987, your child cannot use his/her personal exemption to shelter income if he can be claimed as a dependent on your return. However, a minor can use up to \$500 of his standard deduction (\$2,570 in 1987) to offset unearned income from any source. He can also shelter another \$500 of investment

Idaho's crop lien system passed

Gem State is third in U.S. to be OK'd

BOISE — Idaho has become the third state in the nation to win federal approval for a central filing system of crop liens.

The registry, required by the 1985 Farm Bill, will begin operation by Dec. 23. Banks and other lenders will start building the file on Oct. 24, Chief Deputy Secretary of State Ben Yursa said Thursday.

Liens against agricultural produce have been filed in the state's 44 counties. Buyers of farm commodities and lenders have had to check each county where a farmer grew crops to discover liens.

The new registry will centralize those records, allowing subscribers or the general public to search out liens by name at one place, Yursa said. Reports will be available on microfiche or on more costly paper.

The federal Packers and Stockyards Administration, a division of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, announced the filing registry on Tuesday. Sen. Jim McClure and Steve Symms and U.S. Rep. Larry Craig announced.

"Getting this certification from the USDA ends a long and confusing process," they said in a joint release. The system will encourage more farm lending, because banks and other financiers will have more assurance of being repaid, the lawmakers said.

The crop lien file is designed to pay for itself, Yursa said. The Idaho Legislature appropriated \$620,000 to start the system. The Secretary of State's Office has added about eight workers and purchased computer equipment, Yursa said.

The registry will be supported by an array of fees. Fees will be charged for registering liens for filing, liens for subscription service to the filings, for searching out liens, and for multiple copies of searches. State officials expect to raise fees to \$75,000 a year from the user fees, Yursa said.

The Packers and Stockyards Administration at first had resisted use of microfiche for the registry, and then of a more expensive rate for paper. However, the state's congressional delegation convinced the agency to accept both, Yursa said.

Farm products to be listed in Idaho's registry range from major crops such as wheat to minuscule products such as worms and rice.

Against any lead but a trump, today's game is a cinch. Against the accurate trump lead, South must develop another plan.

Without the killing trump lead, South would have had an easy time. Leading diamonds at every opportunity would have allowed him to ruff his third diamond before dummy's trumps were gone.

With the trump lead, it's another matter. If South bows his head and tries to ruff a diamond anyway, the defense will win the race. A trump is led after each diamond lead, and South is forced to concede three diamonds and one club, down one.

After the trump lead, South's best chance lies with finding good luck in both major suits. After winning the first trick, South cashes his high hearts and leads a diamond, giving the defense a chance to err. Back comes another trump to dummy's jack, and South ruffs a heart to split the suit 3-3. Another trump to dummy draws the last trump, and South's losers go on dummy's long hearts. Instead of down one, South enjoys an overtrick. He can also afford to compliment the opponents for putting up the most troublesome defense.

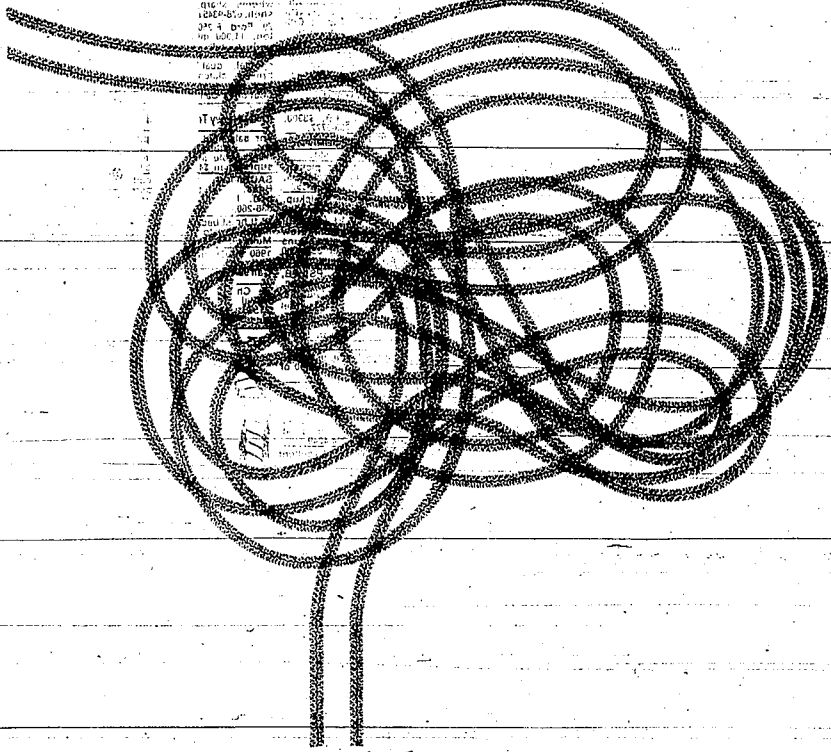

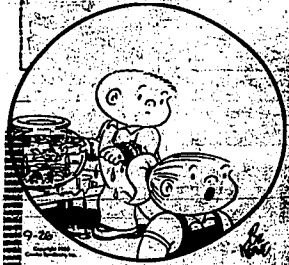

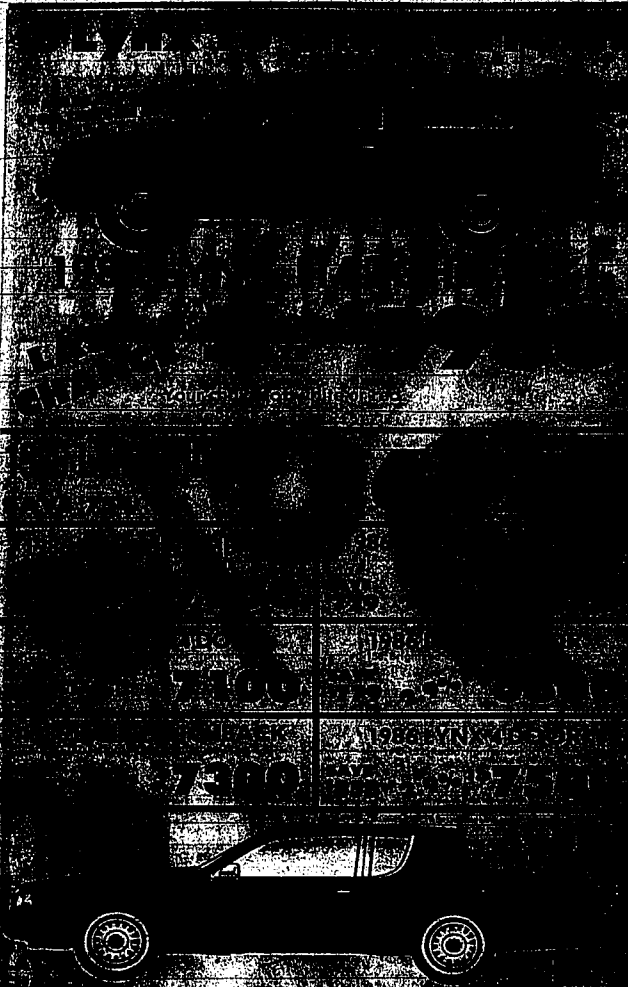

An Alien Life Form invades TV Land, and big laughs ensue

History has seen many famous Ali's - Landon, Lunt, Neuman - but never before has there been an ALF quite like the one viewers will see Mondays on NBC starting Sept. 29.

Imagine the by-product of a union between Miss Piggy and a hairy ant eater who was raised on charm lessons from Don Rickles.

This ALF stands for Alien Life Form. He lives with the ultra-macho hero of ABC's "Sledge Hammer!" for the title of the hippest TV cult hero of the new season.

The premise of "ALF" would hardly seem to be original. An alien

crashes into a middle-class suburban household, the kind of family who thinks Volkswagen is Wonder Bread is gourmet fare. But this is no small-screen rip-off of Steven Spielberg's lovable extraterrestrial. In fact, "ALF" - created by two veterans of "Buffalo Bill" - is sweet revenge for all those viewers whose blood-sugar counts were raised to unbearable levels by the over-the-top "E.T."

The Tanner family doesn't know what this ALF is all about. Mom (Anne Schaefer) wants to send him over to the vet, but Dad (Max Wright) has taken in a lost kid of Ozark, Mo. - born idea. "ALF" is a sweet kid (Albert Einstein) and a typical over-the-top CBS TV 2-year-old (John) - though they are both over-

collective. ALF is a goodly, but annoying. As the family starts to like in awe, Mom the comedian wonders what to do with him. ALF speaks his first words: "Can I make a suggestion? If I can't be of any trouble, how about fixing my spaceship?"

He then requests his first meal: the family cat. When that wish isn't granted, he cracks, "Well, how about a cat-food can?" "I'm used roughage."

We learn that ALF is a native of the planet Melmac - which, like Superman's home Krypton, has exploded and disintegrated. He arrives on Earth speaking flawless English and possessing an intimate grasp of American pop culture. Apparently, Melmac must have had satellite dishes. ALF describes a police officer as looking like Eddie Munster; his favorite phrase, said with the aplomb of someone who has watched hours of John Wayne movies, is "No problem."

As the first episode ends, ALF, wearing a bib, is sitting around the dinner table telling Milmac jokes. He has become a member of the Tanner household and a welcome one at that.

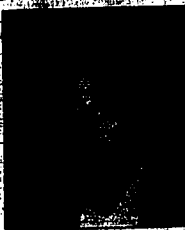

LOS ANGELES — If "E.T." spent a year in the Catskills working as a comedian, took a course in EST and studied "How to Win Through Intimidation," he'd be "ALF."

If "E.T." ever saw him he'd head back home. ALF, which stands for Alien Life Form, looks like a cross between an aardvark and a rooster spangle.

This wisecracking, pushy,

temperamental, take-charge alien drops in from outer space and immediately makes himself at home with the Tanner family. He literally drops in when his spaceship crashes into their garage.

The Tanners are your average American family, a father, mother, son, daughter and cat. ALF, who

swills beer — can and all — loves cats like the two kids love Twinkles.

You've probably guessed by now that "ALF" is a half-hour comedy. The Monday night series made its debut on Sept. 22. Max Wright is Willie Tanner, Anne Schedeen is his wife, Kate, Andrea Elson is daughter Lynn, and Benji Gregory is son Brian. ALF is played by, well, ALF. There's a little person inside the costume and reportedly it takes six people to manipulate it.

Actually, "ALF" is funny.

NBC's crafty premiere strategy helps it win another weekly war



NEW YORK (AP) — NBC had eight of the Top 10 shows last week, including three new series that opened in favorable time slots. Meanwhile, one new ABC program succeeded, but it wasn't Lucille Ball's new situation comedy, results from the A.C. Nielsen Co. showed Tuesday.

Among NBC's winners was its Emmy broadcast, which helped send CBS' "George Washington" two-part movie to one of the worst starts in miniseries history.

NBC's strategy of introducing new series before the regular prime-time season began Sept. 22, to ensure sampling against rerun competition, worked better than anticipated. "I'm very satisfied," said NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff.

Four of NBC's seven new series were on last week. ABC introduced seven of nine new series, while CBS showed only "The Wizard," among its seven new series. In its second outing, "The Wizard" fell to 37th place.

For the week of Sept. 15-21, NBC averaged a 17.3 rating, while ABC had a 13.5 and CBS a 13.1. The week also marked the end of the 52-week, 1985-86 season, which NBC won with a 15.9 rating to CBS' 14.6 and ABC's 13.5. A single ratings point equals 874,000 homes with television.

Last week, a rerun of "The Cosby Show" was first with a 29.8 rating, followed by a repeat of "Family Ties." NBC's Emmy awards broadcast was third with a 23.1 rating, its best since 1979. The two-hour opener for NBC's "L.A. Law" was fourth. It was on Monday, although the second episode will be in its regular Friday slot Oct. 3. ABC's new comedy "Head of the Class," starring Howard Hesseman, was fifth.

Three NBC shows tied for sixth: the premieres of "Easy Street" and "Crime Story" and a repeat of "The Golden Girls," which won the Emmy for best comedy. CBS' "60 Minutes" was ninth and NBC's "Bob Hope Special" 10th.

NBC scored a ratings sweep with a half a point victory in dinner-time news: "NBC Nightly News" with Tom Brokaw averaged a 10.6 rating. "CBS Evening News" with Dan Rather, had a 10.1, ABC's "World News Tonight" with Peter Jennings had a 9.7.

The premiere of Miss Ball's "Life

With Lucy," lambasted by the critics, ranked 23rd and won its time period.

Rival researchers considered that a lackluster performance, particularly since CBS' tracking study found more people aware of "Life With Lucy" than any other new show.

ABC's Marvin Mord, vice president for marketing and research services, said Miss Ball's show "performed reasonably well."

In other premieres, ABC's "Starman" was 26th, ABC's "Sidekicks" 30th, ABC's "Ellen Burstyn Show" 31st, ABC's "Jack and Mike" 37th and ABC's "Heart of the City" 56th out of 59 shows.

The first part of "George Washington: Forging of a Nation" ranked 31st with a 13.3 rating. The first "George Washington" miniseries, about the war years, averaged a 21.3 rating in 1984.

Tartikoff said the biggest surprise was "Crime Story," the cop show set in Chicago in the 1960s. Although it will be on Tuesday against ABC's

tough "Moonlighting," "Crime Story" was introduced last week after "The Cosby Show," then given a spot behind "Miami Vice" the next night. The two-hour opener had a 20.1 rating and the follow-up ranked 14th with a 17.9 rating. "Easy Street," Leni Anderson's sitcom, performed well after "The Golden Girls" on Saturday, but eventually will face CBS' "Murder, She Wrote," a Top 10 show, on Sunday.

Off to a good start is NBC's "Our House," starring Wilford Brimley. In its third outing, second in its Sunday spot against "60 Minutes" and "The Disney Sunday Movie," "Our House" ranked 25th. Its 25 share (percent of homes with their sets on that are tuned in) was a big improvement over NBC's tandem of "Punky Brewster" and "Silver Spoons" last year. Lead-ins are particularly important on Sunday when the three networks have movies at 8 p.m.

"Our House" seemed to attract new viewers to Sunday. In the time period, NBC was up seven share points over the same date a year ago, while CBS was up one point and ABC three.

Researchers at ABC and CBS said NBC effectively introduced its new programs, but one questioned the timing and another was skeptical about the long-term benefits.

"Whether it carries into the regular season, when the shows face their regular competition, is yet to be seen," Mord said.

"NBC has ideal incubator positions behind 'The Cosby Show' and 'Golden Girls' and used them very well," said Dave Poltrack, CBS vice president for research. "But they could have put them behind blockbusters during the regular season when the ratings really count."

Andy Griffith is a convincing Southern lawyer in 'Matlock'

LOS ANGELES—Andy Griffith stars in NBC's "Matlock" playing what is known as a simple country lawyer. Benjamin Matlock is one of those lawyers with gray hair, silver tongue and a winning smile who disarms witnesses and bluffs juries. He's great to have on your side in time of trouble, but he might end up owning your house and car for his effort. He's got a Harvard law degree and a penchant for getting mixed up in sensational murder cases.

"Matlock" made its debut on Tuesday, Sept. 23, and the first show was a humdinger. Dick Van Dyke plays a respected judge, who murders his mistress in a jealous rage when she dates another lover. He names her lover, then

presides over his trial and tries to throw a monkeywrench into Matlock's defense.

This is Dick Van Dyke as you've never seen him before. Forget lovable Rob Petrie, the husband of Laura (Mary Tyler Moore) on "The Dick Van Dyke Show." This guy is evil. Van Dyke is absolutely marvelous as the villain. He's angry when he discovers his mistress is playing around, he's devious covering up the murder, he's smug as he tries to thwart Matlock's defense, and he sweats bullets when Matlock gets on his case.

Griffith plays Atlanta lawyer Matlock to perfection.

 LOS ANGELES—When you hear the sound of machine-gun fire you can be almost certain television has only been taken aim on Chicago's war on crime.

The latest is NBC's "Crime Story," which made its debut last Thursday with a gang of hoods knocking over a nightclub and taking hostages. The time is the 1960s.

On hand to lead the criminal element is Lt. Mike Torello, who is cut from the same cloth as Eliot Ness (Robert Stack) in "The Untouchables" and Lt. Frank Ballinger (Lee Marvin in "M Squad"). Torello is played by Dennis Farina, who is a former Chicago detective.

Torello, like Ness, Ballinger and other television cops, is out to make the streets of Chicago safer. He works with the Major Crime Unit.

"Crime Story" is a serial that will follow not only the world, but also the careers of a rising young mobster, Ray Luck (Anthony Denison), and a dedicated prosecutor, David Abrams (Stephen Lang). It starts in Chicago
