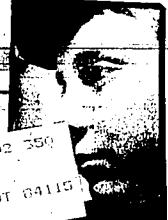

U.S. calls cease-fire on diplomat expulsions

WASHINGTON — The Reagan administration acknowledged Thursday that restrictions imposed on the U.S. Embassy in Moscow would limit American ability to monitor what happens in the Soviet Union. But the administration decided not to retaliate for the expulsion of five more American diplomats and urged the Soviets to "put behind us" a dispute over diplomats and spies.

need now to get on with resolution of the larger issues affecting U.S.-Soviet relations and build on the progress made in discussions at Reykjavik. The Soviet's have expelled 10 American diplomats in - week and withdrawn 260 Russians as cooks, maids, drivers and perform other duties in the embassy and at the U.S. consulate in Leningrad. "I think again, without question, there is going to be some change in our ability to monitor what happens in the Soviet Union," Redman said. stiffer visas and other restrictions on Americans who work temporarily in Moscow, such as on construction of the new U.S. Embassy there. Redman said similar curbs would be put on Russian laborers here. The U.S. official said the two governments had evidently accepted the concept of "parity" in their diplomatic complements and should move on to arms control and other issues pursued by President Reagan and Mikhail S. Gorbachev, the Soviet leader, at the Iceland summit two weeks ago. Adm. John Poindexter, Reagan's national

security adviser, said Thursday the expulsions have run their course. As Reagan boarded his plane in Milwaukee, reporters asked whether the war of expulsions had ended. The president just shrugged his shoulders and got on board. Redman added that Reagan stands by his arms reduction proposals. "Translating those proposals into specific negotiating instructions is a complex process," he said. "A decision on how best to table such sweeping proposals is a tactical negotiating one." Nation's red ink a record

WASHINGTON — The U.S. budget deficit for 1986 soared to a record \$220 billion, easily topping last year's \$212 billion shortfall but a full \$10 billion short of what the Reagan administration had projected. Budget Director James C. Miller III disclosed Thursday.

Miller said through a spokesman that higher-than-anticipated revenues near the end of the year and lower spending by federal agencies accounted for the unexpected savings.

The spokesman, Ed Dale, also said that projections by the White House's Office of Management and Budget suggest that the deficit will fall by \$50 billion in 1987, to the vicinity of \$170 billion, even if Congress enacts no further spending cuts.

The White House budget office as recently as August had estimated that the 1986 deficit for the fiscal year that ended Sept. 30 would amount to \$230.2 billion.

The OMB is scheduled to release its final determination of the 1986 deficit early next week.

However, Miller decided to confirm the raw figures in advance of the announcement as new reports began circulating about the dimensions of the deficit, Dale said.

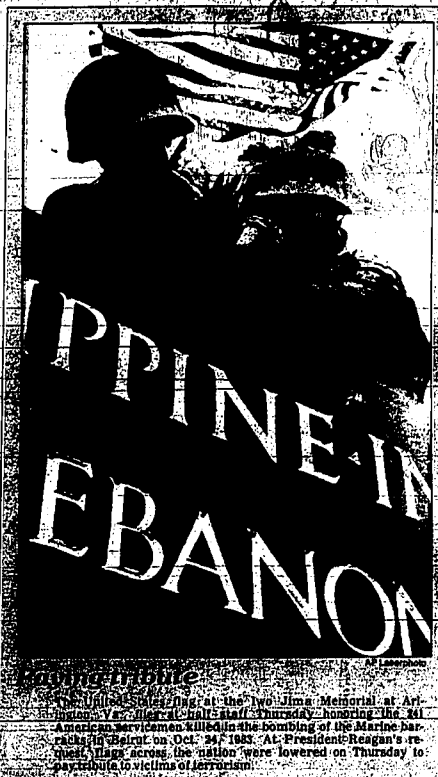
Those figures show that the 1986 flow of federal revenues rose to \$220 billion, "instead of the \$230 billion we estimated in the mid-September August report," Dale said.

"The \$10 billion improvement is a whole series of small changes, including some increase in receipts and a wide variety of decreases in outlays," Dale quoted Miller as saying.

Defense spending was not among those decreases, Dale said.

"Miller acknowledges that this was a record deficit, but the real good news is that in 1987, by any realistic estimate, the deficit there will be a reduction in excess of \$50 billion — which would be the greatest reduction since World War II," Dale said.

The \$170 billion 1987 deficit would still be far above the \$144 billion deficit target under the nation's Gramm-Rudman deficit-reduction law. But it would represent a marked turnaround in the deficit, which has been climbing steadily in the past few years.



Gunman faces courts

KENSINGTON, Md. — A gunman surrendered to police inside the Washington-area Mormon Temple on Thursday and was charged with kidnapping after holding a church security guard hostage for more than 12 hours, authorities said. Clarence Leake, 29, of Harrisonburg, Va., walked out of the Solemn Assembly room on the marble-walled temple's seventh floor at 6:50 a.m. MDT after putting his handgun on the floor, police said. The man

had released another hostage, described by authorities only as a church member, five hours earlier. Police said both Leake and the hostage security guard, Jose Mender, had their hands raised when they stepped out of the room, normally used only for meetings led by the president of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Leake was charged by Montgomery County police with kidnapping, false imprisonment and use of a handgun in the commission of a crime. See TEMPLE on Page A2

Symms, Evans trade dirty tactics charges

BOISE — The tight race for Idaho's junior U.S. Senate seat boiled over Thursday night.

Republican incumbent Steve Symms and Democratic Gov. John Evans accused each other of dirty campaign tactics.

Symms charged that Evans has been running "very negative, distorting ads," totally "distorting" or "totally dishonest" in my view.

But the governor accused Symms of lying to voters about Evans' record, particularly on abortion and gun control.

"You've been telling outright falsehoods about my stand on abortion and the National Rifle Association," Evans said. "It's not appreciated. I'm opposed to abortion. ... I expect to save the life of the mother. I'm not for gun control."

Hasenfus innocent, lawyer states; Bell calls client a 'political pawn'

MANAGUA, Nicaragua — The lawyer for Eugene Hasenfus declared to a revolutionary tribunal Thursday that his American client was innocent of terrorism and violating Nicaraguan security.

The attorney, Enrique Sotelo Borge, also said the People's Tribunal, which is hearing the case, does not have the authority to judge Hasenfus because it "lacks impartiality" and was not appointed by the Supreme Court.

Hasenfus, reportedly being held in a prison outside Managua, did not attend the hearing.

Sotelo Borge said in a written statement delivered to court officials 20 minutes before the 5:30 p.m. MDT deadline for entering a plea. "I come before the authorities to deny, reject and contradict all of the concepts of the accusations formulated against my defendant by the minister of justice."

Benefit hike for Social Security recipients least on record

WASHINGTON — The nation's 37.4 million Social Security beneficiaries next January will find the smallest raise ever in their checks: 1.3 percent, or \$5 a month for the typical retired worker.

Most of the elderly will find their "take-home" pay from the retirement program going up even less than that, because they will be charged \$2.40 more each month for Medicare coverage starting in January.

And some 8.5 million people earning more than \$42,000 will have to pay up to 4.3 percent more payroll taxes in 1987 to help cover the \$2.6 billion cost of the increase.

The 1.3 percent raise became official Thursday when the Labor Department announced the Consumer Price Index for September.

It means the average monthly benefit for all retired workers will rise from \$482 to

The boost matches the inflation rise from the third quarter of 1985 through the third quarter of this year.

Social Security beneficiaries would have gotten no increase at all for 1986 if Congress and President Reagan abolished a provision in the law that ruled out benefit hikes when inflation fell below an annual rate of 3 percent.

It marks the fourth straight year in which Social Security's cost-of-living adjustment has dipped to, or stayed at, the record low. It is the smallest increase by far since benefits were buffered against inflation in 1975.

The 1983 and 1984 benefit hikes were both 3.5 percent. The 1985 increase, which showed up in checks last January, was 3.1 percent.

Inflation has abated sharply since 1980, when Social Security benefits soared 14.3 percent.

But the elderly, who comprise almost three-quarters of all Social Security beneficiaries, are getting no break from inflation on some medical costs.

The government announced previously that the monthly charge for Part B coverage of Medicare, which pays some doctor bills and other out-of-hospital costs, will jump from \$15.50 to \$17.90 on Jan. 1, a 15.5 percent increase.

3 percent trigger and fixed the Medicare charge at \$20.

Health- and Human Services Secretary Otis K. Bowen said the 1.3 percent increase will appear in checks that Social Security beneficiaries receive on Jan. 2, and also in the checks that 3.8 million Supplemental Security Income welfare recipients get on Dec. 31.

The benefit increase also frees the government to lift the ceiling on wages subject to Social Security's 7.15 percent payroll tax.

The government will levy the tax on earnings up to \$43,800 in 1987, up from this year's \$42,000 cutoff. The tax rate does not change until 1988, when it will be 7.51 percent.

The maximum tax on an individual worker in 1987 will be \$3,131.70, an increase of \$128.70, or 4.29 percent, from this year's maximum of \$3,003. Employers must kick in the same amount.

The self-employed, who pay a 12.3 percent tax, will see their maximum tax rise by \$221.40 to \$5,387.40.

They judge my client like a Somocista."

Somocista is a term referring to followers of the former right-wing President Anastasio Somoza who was deposed by the leftist Sandinistas in 1979.

The defense now has eight days, beginning Friday, to present its evidence to the tribunal in a written form, according to Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Angela Sadales. The lawyer can request a four-day extension.

Former U.S. Attorney General Griffin Bell arrived Thursday night at Sandino International Airport and said it was "an absolute fact" that Hasenfus was on board a plane that

contained weapons destined for the U.S.-backed rebels.

But, Bell added, "I have great reason to doubt that he is a terrorist or committed crimes that happened 110 years ago."

Bell, an Atlanta attorney who is assisting Soleto Borgen in Hasenfus' defense, said, "Some of the government's 12 pages of charges are about the bad relations between our country and Nicaragua throughout history. He couldn't possibly be guilty about some of those things."

Bell also characterized the trial as political.

"He is an absolute pawn, that is what the trial is about," Bell said. "It is sort of a windfall to Nicaragua that they have him, so they can put

on public display the whole foreign policy of our country to Nicaragua."

Soleto Borgen had refused to say in advance what plea he would enter for his client. He and Hasenfus met on Wednesday for two hours at the tribunal offices located about a half-mile from the U.S. Embassy in Managua.

It was only the second time he was allowed to meet with his client, a first American, taken prisoner in the Sandinista government's 4½-year war against U.S.-supported Contra rebels.

Hasenfus, 45, of Marinette, Wis., was captured Oct. 5 when the C-123 cargo plane on which he was a crew member was shot down in southern Nicaragua.

Symms also avoided matching Evans' hard stand against any attempt by the federal government to locate a national nuclear waste repository in Washington state so that the bulk of any waste would have to be transported through Idaho.

The senator also had to defend his lone vote in the Senate to legalize the so-called cop-killer bullet, a vote Evans used to depict the senator as "consistently putting himself on the very fringe of the Republican Party" to maintain his reputation for "odd-ball ideas."

Symms said his vote was based on preserving the constitutional right to bear arms, claiming the move to ban ammunition of this kind was a step toward gun control.

The senator also reiterated his support for the American trade

sanctions imposed against Canada for subsidizing timber imports into the U.S. but defended his opposition to trade and other sanctions against the South Africa government as a penalty for continuing apartheid. He said the Reagan administration's earlier policy of constructive engagement would work better toward ending black discrimination and segregation in that nation.

The debate was televised statewide by the Idaho Educational Public Broadcasting System, although viewership was limited because it was up against the fifth game of the World Series.

The two candidates, however, face off again Saturday night at a candidate forum in Coeur d'Alene.

Evans, unbeaten in a third of a century in Idaho politics, had been hoping the debate could boost his bid to hand Symms the first defeat of his political career.

Neither candidate expected the

debate to make or break his campaign in the final surge, but a number of observers saw the confrontation as an opportunity for either candidate to make a major mistake or miscalculation that could turn out to be the deciding factor.

"Both are capable of that," said former state lawmaker and independent gubernatorial candidate Perry Swisher, now chairman of the Public Utilities Commission.

Symms has been trying to counter Evans' broadsides with attacks on the governor's 10-year stewardship of the state, but during his campaign tour through the small towns of Idaho, traditional Republicans have peppered him with questions about the Evans' charges and forced him to defend his own record.

Both sides - have - discounted a Washington Post-ABC News poll released last week showing Evans with a working lead in the race. But each camp has maintained that it is in a position to win.

Comatose firefighter expires

BOSTON (AP) - A comatose firefighter whose case tested the legal limits of a patient's right to death with dignity died Thursday of pneumonia at the hospital that granted his wife's request he no longer be fed artificially.

Paul Brophy, 44, was pronounced dead at Emerson Hospital in Concord, where he was taken after hospital refused to remove feeding tubes that kept him alive for 3½ years.

His death came after eight days without food, but his doctor said the situation would have killed Brophy even if he had been fed.

Greek attache escapes pursuit

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Greece's military attache escaped an apparent kidnapping attempt in Jerusalem west Beirut on Thursday, and embassy of the Greek Coast Guard government for more protection against feared terrorist attacks.

The British embassy urged the estimated 500 Britons left in Lebanon to leave the country or "take extra security precautions" because of fears they will be targets for extremists as a result of a terrorist trial in London.

A Greek Embassy spokesman said two unidentified gunmen chased the attache, Col. Nicholas Pappoianou, as he drove through west Beirut.

Saudis help bankroll Contras

WASHINGTON (AP) - Saudi Arabia has spent almost \$15 million to supply arms, food, medicine and clothing to the rebels fighting in Nicaragua in the past 18 months, according to a report broadcast Thursday night.

The Saudi Arabian government has denied any involvement in assisting in aid to the rebels, also known as the Contras.

Unidentified sources quoted on "NBC Nightly News" said Lt. Col. Oliver North, on the staff of the National Security Council at the White House, set in motion the Contra-Saudi relationship but did not involve himself in the details of the operation.

Pakistan air crash kills 13

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan (AP) - A Pakistan International Airlines passenger plane crashed Thursday night as it approached the western frontier city of Peshawar, and hospital officials said at least 13 people died.

PIA officials said the propeller-driven Fokker Friendship F-27 slammed into an empty field about five miles south of the Peshawar airport three minutes before it was to land there. The plane was on a flight from the eastern city of Lahore.

Officials at three Peshawar hospitals told The Associated Press they had received 13 bodies from the crash and had treated 31 injured people.

Rebels ambush trucks, seize 5

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP) - Contra rebels destroyed three government trucks and abducted five occupants in an attack Thursday in the northeastern part of the country, the Defense Ministry said.

"The Defense Ministry said in a statement that the attack occurred on the road linking the towns of Santo Domingo and La Libertad in Chontales province, about 80 miles northeast of Managua."

In an attack Monday, six people were killed and 26 were injured when a bus struck a land mine in a road in Jinotega province, 133 miles north of the capital.

Poland keeps Wales at home

WARSAW, Poland (AP) - Polish authorities on Thursday refused to give former Solidarity leader Lech Walesa a passport for a trip to the United States where he was to receive a humanitarian award, a Walesa aide said.

The aide, Wladyslaw Trzelski, said officials at the Gdańsk Interior Ministry told him Walesa had not completed the passport application properly.

Walesa, 43, was invited to the United States by the John-Roger Foundation, a California-based organization that named him one of three recipients of its annual "Integrity" award. The presentation ceremony is in Los Angeles on Friday.

Reagan, addressing a rally for Missouri senatorial candidate Christopher Bond threw in a reference to Gorbachev's television speech Wednesday.

"It was heartening to find Mr. Gorbachev agreeing with me that the proposals we made in Iceland are on the table," Reagan said.

"Our negotiators are ready in Geneva. We must not allow areas where there is agreement to be held hostage to areas where there isn't."

The Soviets should move the ball forward in areas such as long-range intermediate nuclear forces and nuclear testing," Reagan said, "and we are prepared to do so."

Presidential spokesman Larry Speakes ignored the Soviet leader's criticism and focused on Gorbachev's assertions of good will.

"We believe an historic breakthrough occurred in Reykjavik and there is no turning back," Speakes said. "For the first time, there is serious discussion of arms reductions rather than arms control."

Asked about Gorbachev's speech saying that Reagan consented to the elimination of all strategic offensive nuclear arms, White House spokesman Larry Speakes told reporters Thursday that "the president discussed it. But it was not formally tabled."

Speaking with reporters aboard Air Force One as the president flew from Milwaukee to Springfield, Ill., on a political campaign trip, the spokesman said, "The matters that we presented to them were in writing. And our position stressed ballistic missiles" during the second

five years of the 10-year period under discussion.

Speakes said the "ultimate goal" of the United States is the elimination of all nuclear weapons, but "there was not enough opportunity for the two of them to discuss a time frame for the implementation" of that objective.

When asked if Gorbachev was wrong in the implication of his remarks, Speakes said, "No, I don't know. I can't make judgments about what his judgments are."

On the flight from Springfield, Ill., to Oklahoma City, Speakes said arms negotiators in Geneva have received two sets of instructions and will receive a third before the weekend, but he would not go further in explaining what the instructions were.

"Where we left it in Iceland, we can take up again in Geneva," he said.

Elsewhere in the nation, Thursday's high temperature was 91 degrees at Miami, Fla. The low was 16 degrees at Gunnison, Colo.

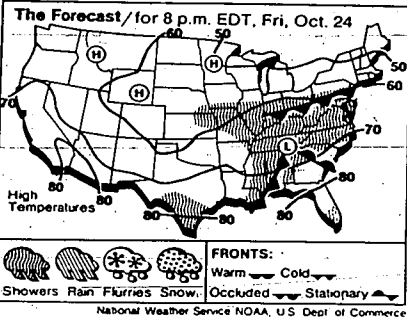

Bush: Idaho race a key one

BOISE (AP) — Vice President George Bush said Thursday Idaho's U.S. Senate race will be one of the most closely watched in the country next month, because it could determine whether the Senate remains Republican-dominated for the last two years of the Reagan administration.

The vice president made his third trip to southern Idaho this year, stopping in Boise two hours. He made a brief airport speech, urging Idahoans to re-elect Republican Steve Symms over Democrat Gov. John Evans. Bush also campaigned for other top GOP candidates.

Bush was whisked away in a motorcade for a private fundraising reception at the Boise home of Robert and Pat Wilcomb, then took off on Air Force 2 for another campaign stop after about two hours on the ground.

A security guard holding a counter said 58 people were checked through a metal detector, including politicians, students, guests and reporters.

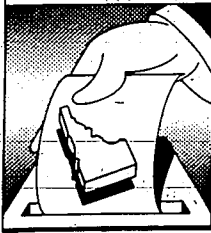
Contending it has the support of GOP senators like Symms that enabled Reagan to hold firm against the Soviets at the recent Iceland-Surmit, the vice president said.

"The only thing they (the Soviets) understand is fiber, strength, and purpose. Thank God that Steve Symms understands that," he said.

With a group of school children wearing shirts bearing Nancy Reagan's anti-drug slogan "Just Say No," Bush credited Symms with helping in the crackdown on drugs long before it became fashionable.

"We are not going to stop until we push the drug users out of the classrooms and bring quality education back into the classrooms,"

vice president said. Symms, who left his three-week motorcade Wednesday night to greet Bush and prepare for a debate with Evans, praised Bush's loyalty to his country and to his party. "His life has been dedicated to helping his fellow man," he said.

2nd District congressional candidate Mel Richardson used the occasion to denounce Democrat Rep. Richard Stallings for "a whole group of falsehoods" in their campaign. Richardson said some of the things Stallings has been saying since their debate Tuesday night "simply are not true."

"He's on the attack if, but people are not going to be deluded by a lot of half-truths," he said.

Richardson said he has been gaining on Democrat Cecil Andrus, and with Bush's visit, he may be even.

Symms' latest campaign finance report also was received at the secretary of state's office in Boise, showing the Republican with heavy media spending in the first two weeks of October.

It showed Symms received about \$275,000 for the period, about \$100,000 more than Evans reported. Symms' report said he spent more than \$428,000 in the period, including \$125,000 to a Boise ad agency and \$172,100 to DCM, an Arlington, Va., media, consulting and polling organization.

For the campaign, Symms reported he has spent \$2.8 million, about \$1 million more than Evans has raised.

"Elsewhere, Leroy's opponent, Andrus, said in Fruitland that the election will be "a referendum on progress" in Idaho.

"The question is clear. Do you want to take aggressive, positive action that will move Idaho ahead, or do we continue to stand still?"

A coalition of sportsmen, SportPAC, endorsed several Democratic candidates including Evans, Andrus, Stallings, Auditor Joe Williams and Rep. Larry Craig, campaigning in the Panhandle, defended his proposal for a road through the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness, saying he just wanted to make a point.

"The people who use public lands, use them because they can get them," he said. "If you want to talk economics in wilderness, then you have to talk people access."

He called "the Fish and Game Department "a small collective group of protectionists" because they "order—Forest—Service—roads closed for wildlife management."

Richardson collected \$28,597, had \$6,168 on hand but more than \$50,000 in unpaid debts and has collected about \$210,000 for the campaign.

Indictments raise arrests possibilities

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — Counterfeiting indictments against three members of a white supremacist group in northern Idaho bombings raise the possibility that additional arrests may occur in the case.

The indictments from a federal grand jury also expand earlier counterfeiting and conspiracy charges and stiffen potential sentences against the three people already in custody.

Named in the indictments handed down Wednesday were David Ross, 35; Edward Wade Hawley, 22; and his wife, Olive Diane Hawley, 27. Each is accused of conspiracy, attempted passing of counterfeit money and possession of counterfeit bills.

The three "and other persons presently not charged and some of whom are presently unknown" were involved in the conspiracy to print and pass counterfeit money, the indictment alleges.

The indictment supersedes a criminal complaint filed against the three Oct. 3, two days after they were arrested by 70 federal and state law officers who raided Dorra's home near Athol, Idaho.

"I can't elaborate on the 'persons unknown' who haven't been charged," said Earl Hicks, assistant U.S. Attorney. "It is a continuing investigation."

In comparison, I witnessed an open-shop plant in Heyburn about 10 years ago. Loyal union members carried their own signs and stayed away from work. Non-members or other workers who were too greedy, or too broke and scared to stay away, continued to work. In addition, the plant manager hired temporary (scab) workers, and after a few weeks, the strike collapsed. Nothing was left; nothing was gained. Workers were left with a feeling of mistrust and resentment for one another. This is the situation the right-to-work advocates want to put all working people into.
I deeply resent this attempt by a bunch of pocket-stuffing, big business interests, to enslave me to the merest whim of my employer. They are only trying to steal my right to effective, collective bargaining. All the Republican legislators, who allowed the law into our state in the first place, are their willing accomplices. And all the poor souls who believe their lies, are unsuspecting accessories in this assault on our American freedom.
Please help all the loyal American workers. Turn back this vicious attack. Vote "no."

During a United Auto Worker strike, a cow ran from a driveway to wreck the car for my wife. We ordered a new one and waited three months for it.

On my retirement, we contracted for a Boise Cascade home to be moved to our property. Union carpenters went on strike and we waited seven months for our home. Two years later, a friend bought an identical home and the price had gone up \$9,000. Boise Cascade quit building them.
Meat cutters strike and the ensuing lawsuits cost Blincoes heavily and they eventually closed up. Magic Valley lost a cattle market. Jobs were lost, towns lost customers, and Magic Valley stockholders' shares were worthless.
Our son-in-law did research work for a large Wisconsin company. After three years, they said he could stay with a wage cut or move to their new plant in Georgia. He moved. Three months later, he crashed his truck into a pleasure spin during a snow after-work hour. A concussion left him temporarily blind and in the hospital. Two weeks and two months off work before going back on short days. Our daughter spent two months here with a broken ankle, broken left foot, leg bones through the hide, and back broke in three places. His wages never stopped, and company insurance paid all hospital bills. Six months later she was in town with a broken neck, and saw a help-wanted sign in a window. With her children graduated and working, she wanted something to do. She got the job with a stool at the cash register.
We visited there in 1982, and she took a week and a show us around. It seemed every city block had at least one help-wanted sign. All this in a right-to-work state.
I asked why the company moved to Georgia and she said the company president went to the Wisconsin governor and told him that unless they got better treatment they would move out of state. Result, they moved 200 top employees to Georgia, closed all but one small plant and discharged all other employees.
Evans and Andrus show these things, so why are they so against the right-to-work? Mondale learned it the hard way. The Democratic governor refused to meet with him.

ABA leader blasts Meese for court decisions remark

WASHINGTON (AP) — The head of the American Bar Association on Thursday criticized Attorney General Edwin Meese's statement that Supreme Court decisions on the Constitution do not represent the absolute law of the land.

In a speech Tuesday night at Tulane University in New Orleans, Meese said government officials should be guided by their own views of the Constitution rather than always deferring to the Supreme Court.

One legal scholar said that Meese was "out of contact with reality" while a "civil libertarian said his comments were "an invitation to lawlessness."

"Supreme Court decisions are the law of the land just as acts of Congress are the law of the land," Eugene C. Thomas of Boise, president of the 200,000-member ABA, the largest lawyers' professional association in the country, said in response to Meese's comments.

"Both can be tested in the courts, but unless and until they are overturned, they are the law of the land," Thomas said.

"It would shake the foundations of our system to say that a Supreme Court 'holding is not law,'" the ABA president added.

A Supreme Court decision "binds the parties in the

case and also the executive branch for whatever enforcement is necessary," said Meese. But he added that "such a decision does not establish a 'supreme law of the land' that is binding on all persons and parts of government, henceforth and forevermore."

The ABA president said, however, that until a court decision is overruled, "public officials and private citizens alike are not free simply to disregard that legal holding, for it is a part of the body of binding constitutional law of the land."

Terry Eastland, head of the Justice Department's public affairs office, said that Meese had not been suggesting defiance.

Eastland said that "proper and appropriate ways of disagreeing with the Supreme Court" include seeking to have the court overturn its rulings, as has been done successfully more than 180 times in its history.

Eastland said the attorney general was suggesting that other branches of government and other opponents of the court's rulings should not be "shy" in respectfully disagreeing.

Laurence H. Tribe, a professor of constitutional law at Harvard University, said Meese's position "is a knife that cuts both ways."

Reducing barriers impact minimal

WASHINGTON (AP) — Lowering Japanese import barriers would increase sales of U.S. farm products by \$1 billion but reduce the overall trade imbalance between the two nations by only 2 percent, a congressional study said Thursday.

The \$1 billion gain would not cover the \$1.3 billion decline in U.S. agricultural shipments to Japan from 1984 through 1985, noted the

study by the Library of Congress' congressional research service.

The decline in trade generally attributed to the high dollar and intensified competition was from \$6.7 billion to \$5.4 billion and still left Japan as the American farmer's biggest single-nation customer.

"Unfortunately, additional sales of \$1 billion in U.S. agricultural commodities would have very little influence on the 3.5 percent drop in total value of U.S. agricultural exports since 1981," said the study, which was prepared at the request of Sen. James Abdnor, R-S.D.

The total U.S. trade deficit with Japan was \$4.7 billion, about one third of the nation's worldwide imbalance.

4 Viet war remains identified

WASHINGTON (AP) — The remains of four American servicemen killed during the Vietnam war have been positively identified by an Army laboratory, the Pentagon said Thursday.

The remains of the three Air Force officers and one Navy officer, recovered earlier this year, will be flown from Hickam Air Force Base in Hawaii to Travis AFB, Calif., to be buried after a ceremony.

Three of those identified were among a set of 21 remains repatriated by Vietnam to the United States last April and are the first of that group to be identified.

The fourth set of remains was

among 14 recovered last February during an excavation at the crash site of an Air-Force AC-130 gunship in Savannakhet Province, Laos, the Pentagon said. Four other sets of remains recovered during that excavation were identified earlier this year.

The men identified Thursday, including their rank and home of record at the time of their disappearance, included:

- Lt. Col. Richard Castillo of the Air Force, born Nov. 21, 1938, with a home of record of Corpus Christi, Texas.
- Castillo's remains were identified from among those recovered in Laos.

His gunship was reported lost on March 29, 1972, after being struck by a surface-to-air missile.

- Lt. Col. Harold J. Zook of the Air Force, born Oct. 21, 1940, with a home of record of New Holland, Pa., lost over North Vietnam on May 31, 1966.
- Maj. Gordon S. Wilson of the Air Force, born June 3, 1940, with a home of record of Hobart, Ind., lost over North Vietnam on Nov. 22, 1966.
- A flight instructor, Lt. Col. Patrick L. Ness of the Navy, born Nov. 22, 1941, with a home of record of Minneapolis, Minn., lost over North Vietnam on Aug. 23, 1967.

Fatal helicopter firm grounds similar make

NEW YORK (AP) — The operator of a helicopter that crashed into the Hudson River, killing a radio traffic controller and seriously injuring the pilot, said Thursday it was grounding four similar helicopters.

"We want to know what happened," said Barbara Bilmes, executive vice president of Spectrum Helicopters-of-Ridgefield-N.J. "We want to know what was wrong with that machine."

The Wednesday crash was Spectrum's third this year, and last year the Federal Aviation Administration, citing numerous violations of safety rules, restricted the company's flights for 45 days.

The helicopters grounded Thursday, like the one that crashed, were piston-driven three-seaters made by Enstrom Helicopter Corp. of Menominee, Mich. Bilmes said Spectrum was still flying two turbine-

powered helicopters.

National Transportation Safety Board investigators inspected the wreckage of the helicopter, but had no immediate comment on what may have caused the accident.

The helicopter's pilot, William Pate, 30, was hospitalized in critical condition after surgery Wednesday night to explore internal abdominal bleeding.

The WNBC radio traffic reporter killed in the crash, Jane Dornacker, 40, was riding in another Spectrum helicopter earlier this year when it plunged into the Hackensack River in New Jersey.

Dornacker escaped injury then, but one colleague said the crash left her "afraid of flying," and that she had only recently resumed airborne reporting after several months of studio work.

Merger is closer

WASHINGTON (AP) — Delta Air Lines won tentative approval Thursday from the Transportation Department for its proposed purchase of Western Airlines, a transaction that would establish Delta as a formidable air carrier from coast to coast.

The department said the merger of Delta and Western poses no significant competitive problems, a view also expressed earlier this month by the Justice Department's antitrust division.

Delta, the country's fifth largest airline, announced in September it planned to buy Los Angeles-based Western for \$860-million-in-cash-and-stock.

Report raises ire of S. Africa

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — The Foreign Ministry summoned a U.S. diplomat Thursday to protest a U.S. report that said the country was turning into a chronic debtor and the government into a "repressive regime."

The South African government took "the strongest exception to the insulting and hostile language of the report," the Foreign Ministry said in a statement after U.S. Charge d'Affaires Richard Barkley met with Deputy Foreign Minister Ron Miller. Barkley is the highest-ranking U.S. diplomat until the arrival of a new U.S. ambassador.

written in July by the Foreign Commercial Service of the U.S. Commerce Department. The report described policy objectives for the United States after the imposition of economic sanctions. It gives a pessimistic assessment of the climate in South Africa for American business.

The document said South Africa was "closer to becoming just another African state: A chronic debtor, import-starved, ridden with ethnic diversities, a repressive regime unable to manage its own domestic constituency in any positive way, whose only leverage is its ability to manipulate foreign gov-

ernments and attract international attention — for better or worse. This is not an ambience which can attract U.S. trade and investment."

The report had been prepared for internal use, but was made available to reporters on request after portions of it were quoted in Thursday's editions of the Business Day newspaper.

"It was impressed upon the charge d'affaires that South Africa is part of Africa and therefore takes exception to the arrogant and insensitive comment that South Africa is 'closer to becoming just another African state,'" the Foreign Ministry said.

Water combed for U.S. plane

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) — American and Israeli teams searched the eastern Mediterranean on Thursday for a missing U.S. submarine-hunting plane with a four-man crew.

Both American and Israeli teams were trying to find the S-3A Viking assigned to the 6th Fleet, the American Embassy said. Israel radio reported that contact was lost when the plane transmitted distress signals off the Cyprus coast at about 6 p.m. Tuesday.

The plane had been scheduled to return to the carrier John F. Kennedy at 6:15 p.m. Tuesday from a routine patrol north of Egypt, the embassy said in a brief statement.

Enrile hedges on patch up

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Defense Minister Juan Ponce Enrile said Thursday it was too early to tell whether his reconciliation meeting with President Corason Aquino resolved arguments that have threatened to cause a government crisis.

U.S. Ambassador Stephen Bosworth, asked to comment on the rift, told a civic club that Washington supports Mrs. Aquino's government "firmly, completely and unequivocally."

Communist insurgents against whom Enrile wants tougher action, continued their campaign in the countryside. The military command said seven people, including a village chief and a child, were killed Thursday during two clashes between rebels and government forces near Davao City, 610 miles southeast of Manila.

About 2,000 people have died in such battles this year, according to official figures.

Bokassa spotted in return try

PARIS (AP) — Deposed Emperor Jean-Bedel Bokassa of the Central African Republic tried to return under an assumed name on Thursday to the poor land he once ruled with pomp and an iron fist, but he was arrested immediately.

Bokassa, 65, is under a death sentence in his homeland, where after his 1979 ouster he was convicted of murder, cannibalism, embezzling state funds, illegal use of state property and assault and battery.

An official at the office of President Andre Kolingba confirmed that Bokassa was arrested as soon as he arrived on an Air Afrique flight from Rome.

The official, who refused to give his name, was reached in the capital, Bangui, by telephone from Paris. He said he had no further information on the former emperor's situation.

The Pan African News Agency, in a dispatch from Bangui monitored in Senegal, said the Central African Republic's presidential office issued a statement declaring "the former Central African dictator, the man with the red hands, Bokassa, was arrested Thursday."

It quoted the statement as saying Bokassa tried to enter the country under the name Christian Sole.

Bokassa's clandestine departure from France first was disclosed by Denis Baudouin, a spokesman for President Jacques Chirac.

Baudouin said Bokassa, his wife and five of his children drove to Brussels, Belgium, on Wednesday, then flew to Rome where they boarded the plane to Bangui. Bokassa's children reportedly were not allowed to enter the country with him.

Islands quake

HONG KONG (AP) — Two strong earthquakes about a half-hour apart struck the Santa Cruz Islands in the South Pacific early Friday, scientists reported.

The Hong Kong Royal Observatory said the first earthquake occurred shortly before 3 a.m. Friday (10 a.m. MDT Thursday) and was recorded at a preliminary magnitude of 6.7 on the Richter scale.

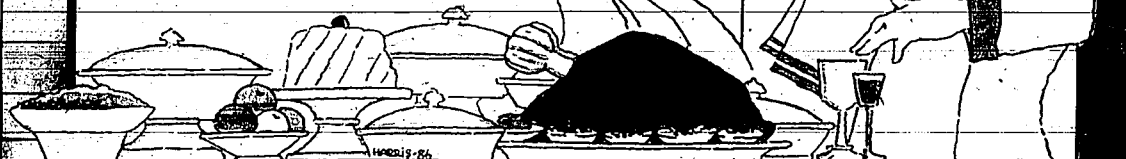

Doctor rethinks his opposition to transfer

TWIN FALLS — A local physician is changing his diagnosis of the proposed transfer of Magic Valley Regional Medical Center from county control to a non-profit organization.

Convinced by a need for the unique technologies and services available at the center, Dr. J. W. Newcomb, M.D., is operating from the position that there is a sufficient health-care market for all the hospitals in the area.

And, accompanying the freedom of entering cooperative ventures with area private hospitals, MVRMC administrators are op-

timistic about improving the "regional" aspect of the institution.

Newcomb said he was also concerned about the potential money-making arms of the non-profit organization competing against county hospitals. But the points he argued against have been remedied, so his opposition is "not as vigorous."

"I think that all of my concerns for why I opposed it have been settled," Newcomb said.

Report hits Symms on vote

TWIN FALLS — The Idaho Fair Share Citizen Action and Program on Thursday released a report criticizing Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, for voting against the \$3 billion Superfund cleanup fund known as Superfund while ac-Agency Administrator Lee Thomas testified that \$5.5 billion would do the job, rather than \$9 billion.

The report, entitled "Contributions Voting Record and Campaign Contributions Supporting Toxic Pollution (five-year period). The rest of the money comes from 63-79 percent of Idaho residents disagree with Symms on hazardous waste and toxic chemicals.

Candidates agree, disagree

TWIN FALLS — The District 23A state Senate race pits three-term incumbent Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, against independent Donald McMurrin, a vying for a seat in the Legislature in January.

McMurrin, 48, is critical of the 1986 Legislature's performance, saying it has ignored the state's economic and environmental problems and the issue of day-care licensing.

The candidates differ on right-to-work, with Noh supporting the referendum to keep the state law and McMurrin opposing it.

But the candidates agree on a number of issues, including the need to increase state revenues to develop the state's economy.

McMurrin said he would like to see the temporary 5-cent sales tax be made permanent and that the state tax on alcohol and tobacco should be increased. He is in favor of raising taxes "on things people have a choice on."

Noh, also 48, said the cigarette tax is low compared to surrounding states and it could be raised, but state taxes on liquor are relatively high. However, both items are

declining as sources of tax revenue. He calls rising taxes in these areas only a partial answer to state funding problems.

One question is whether Idaho should conform to the federal income tax law on its state income tax, Noh said.

With the sweeping changes in the federal tax code as a result of tax reform, states such as Idaho which rely on federal definitions of net and taxable income have much to ponder, Noh said Idaho "has to remain competitive with tax systems in other states." Idaho is high in the amount per capita paid in personal income taxes, but relatively low in the amount paid per capita in corporate income taxes, he said.

Sixty-two percent of retail sales in Idaho is exempt from taxes and this is something that must be examined, he said. The sales taxes fall on the basics such as food, transportation and clothing, but virtually all nonessential services such as accounting and legal services are exempt from sales taxes.

"The Idaho economy has shifted in the direction of services, but the tax structure has not," Noh said.

McMurrin said he is against tax reform, unless the persons hurt most by taxes are protected — such as those on Social Security. He said he is concerned about the cutbacks in social programs, particularly at rehabilitation centers. "They can't do the work they should do," he said.

McMurrin said he would have to wait until he gets to the Legislature before he can name specifics on what should be done to improve the state's economy.

Request leads to cars debate

WENDELL — School officials in Wendell are concerned about allowing students to travel to school-sponsored events in cars, and school policy may soon prohibit use of private vehicles.

At a Wendell School Board meeting this week, a request was made to allow about 12 Wendell students to use private cars for a voluntary meet in Boise, Mont.

School Superintendent George Crawford recommended the wrestlers be allowed to go. But, he

said, the State Board of Education has been strongly cautioning schools not to use unauthorized vehicles.

To keep the school from being liable, Crawford said, students should travel only in authorized vehicles — yellow buses with appropriate mirrors, stop arms and other safety features.

Crawford said this would present a problem, although it is not a likely situation. The Wendell School District can share a bus with other districts when, for example, a few students from each district must go to state or county events.

Trustees agreed the school cannot afford to buy a small shuttle bus in the immediate future, although leasing one may be a possibility.

TWIN FALLS — Negotiations over civil liability between the city of Twin Falls and the Twin Falls School District were grinding along tracks of legal nuances Thursday while the fastbreak of girls' basketball remained sidelined.

The School Board unanimously approved Thursday its version of the agreement requiring each organization to share civil liability from use of the other's facilities.

But differences in its phrasing from a City Council proposal passed Monday for a second approval by the city. Meanwhile, more than 300 elementary-aged girls who play in a privately-sponsored league on school property are waiting to see if an agreement will be reached.

"Civil liability became an issue between the city and School District in late September because of the city's use of school grounds — namely, the gym at Robert Stuart Junior High School. Since the city carries no independent insurance, the district wanted the city to agree to share liability in civil action stemming from use of its facilities."

What followed was weeks of haggl-

ing over the wording and contents of the agreement, with disparities over the amount of liability and, most recently, what should be exempted from the agreement.

The School Board approved its version during a special meeting Thursday. The board's decision to sign the agreement and send it to the city to take it or leave it.

Supervisor Carl Snow summed up the board's position, saying that if the city didn't rubber-stamp the district's wording of the agreement, "our facilities will not be open."

Board Trustee Steve Tolman, who developed the agreement with the district's attorney, Ed Benoit, said the city's changes would not alter the meaning of the agreement and would only make it redundant and vague. Since the agreement is reciprocal, either set of wording would apply to both organizations.

The differences involve exceptions in a section of the two-page agreement to which the organizations are mutually liable for. Civil claims attributable to structural defects or improper maintenance of the facility would apply to both organizations. In the district's version differences

RUPERT — The Rupert City Council has directed City Attorney Don Chisholm to draft an ordinance to set up a Local Improvement District to install water and sewer lines in the Wiley-Craven Subdivision.

Mayor Bill Whitton said that because there are 16 land parcels included in the district, each owner will be assessed 1/16th of the cost of the system. He said the engineering estimate of the cost was \$35,000 for the sewer system and \$20,000 for the water system. This would mean an approximate cost of \$3,500 to each owner.

Ten residents of the subdivision attended the hearing to question the action, and Whitton noted that five written objections had been received. Most of the objections centered around what the council would charge residents hooking onto the system at a later date.

"We're simply adjusting the fees to reflect the current cost of doing business," Whitton said. The new fee, which will include valve costs, is \$180 for a 4-inch line connection, \$235 for a 6-inch and \$275 for an 8-inch line.

• A blue spruce tree on the northeast corner of the city square was approved as a "living memory tree" at the request of Clarence Birrer, chairman of the Christmas decorating committee.

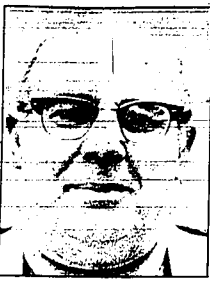

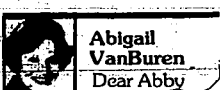

Bruins try to contain Charlton, Bees tonight

TWIN FALLS — With their eyes still on a break-even season, the Twin Falls Bruins are preparing for the invasion of the rushing leaders — or at least rushing individual — in the Gem State Conference tonight.

The Bruins will be hosting the 44-Bonneville speedster Scott Charlton. Charlton, who was credited with an 11.1-second clocking in the 100-meter dash in track last spring, had picked up 1,049 yards in 143 carries thus far.

"He presents us with a different challenge than we've seen in the past few weeks," admits Coach Bill Jones whose Bruins are 2-5 overall and 2-3 in conference. "He's unlike (Idaho Falls' Tim) Spanbauer (the league's second rusher) in that Spanbauer will get you tough yards

inside and still has the speed to hurt you outside. You don't expect to see Charlton run inside much. Quick pitch plays are his forte and with 11.1 speed, he's faster than anyone the Bruins have."

The teams are fairly closely matched in the lines. Bonneville runs from 185 to 200 pounds in the offensive line and its down defensive linemen are 230 and 200 with defensive ends in the 175-180-pound area.

"They are not an overly big team," Jones said. "They execute well." One thing the Bruins think works to their advantage is that Bonneville is more a rush-oriented team and operate out of a veer offense. The Bees have averaged only 75 yards per game passing this season. Twin Falls' defense has been con-

siderably more consistent against the run. Jones said the reasons for that again were evident last week in the 21-17 victory over Blackfoot.

"We went out and played damn good defense in the first half," Jones said. "In fact, while we didn't set it off on offense, we seemed to be improving until we mishandled the punt. They took that one in and after that we did very little offensively."

"But throughout the night I felt our defensive line and linebackers played excellent football," he said. "Our defensive end (Chris Martinez) had three sacks by himself and (linebackers) Jon Mehr and Jerry Kepner had good games. In fact, that's three great games in a row for Mehr. He's just done an outstanding job — for us — this entire month."

Jones reiterated his belief that the first two Twin Falls touchdowns came too easily (the results of two

blocked punts) for the Bruins to maintain their intensity.

"I was a little disappointed the team didn't hang together a little longer and put the Broncos away when they had the chance. You don't like to see your team let another one slip after you get them down. But at least the guys had enough left to put together that fourth-quarter drive and pull it out," Jones said.

"And while we didn't do a lot offensively, we believe there was improvement. And that's what we want to see from week to week is that improvement. It means we're

becoming a better football team," he added.

Kickoff time is 7:30 p.m. in Bruin Stadium. Elsewhere in the Magic Valley tonight, Filer will try to keep its state playoff hopes alive when the Wildcats, 6-2 and 4-1 in the Canyon Conference, host Glens Ferry (2-6 and 0-5) at 7:30 p.m.

Elsewhere, winless Minco will entertain Burley (2-6) in the renewal of a traditional non-conference rivalry at 7:30 p.m. in Rupert. Winless Wood-River will visit Declo (2-6) in another non-league season-

ender at 7:30 p.m. in the Magic Valley Conference. Murtaugh (4-4 and 3-3) will visit Oakley (6-2 and 4-2) at 7:30 p.m., while winless Hagerman will play at Castletown (2-6 and 1-5) at the same hour.

In other Canyon Conference action, Kimberly (4-4 and 2-3) is slated to entertain Valley (2-6 and 1-4) at 7:30 p.m.

In Fairfield, 5-1 Camas County — already headed for the state eight-man playoffs — will host 2-4 Carey at 4 p.m. The Musers are 3-1 in conference, while the Panthers are 1-3.

That's where Montana State plays Montana in a rivalry that's one of the oldest in college football. The schools, 200 miles apart, have played 55 times since their first meeting in 1892 with the Grizzlies holding an edge of 48-32-5.

In other games this weekend, undefeated No. 1-ranked Nevada-Reno will play independent Eastern Washington; Boise State is at Oregon State and a game against former Idaho State Coach Dave Kragthorpe and Idaho State is at Weber State.

It's the first time Boise State ever has played a Pac-10 team.

The Broncos will have the services of a tailback for the first time since the Idaho State game a month ago. Tyler Burke and Greg Harrison, who were injured in that game, will make the trip to Corvallis this week. The Broncos have been making do with Dale Dele and Greg Aplegate and Cliff Sexton in the tailback position.

The Grizzly-Bobcat game not only might be the most intense, it also probably will be the loudest. Both teams like to pass a lot, and neither

has much defense. MSU ranking seventh and Montana dead last in the league.

Montana's the Big Sky's top passing team, averaging 290 yards per game behind quarterback Brent Pease. But the Grizzlies also have the least pass defense, surrendering 354 yards per game.

New Montana Coach Don Read says he hasn't taken part in the rivalry yet, but is looking forward to an exciting Saturday. "We should have a good crowd and a lot of enthusiasm. It should be one heck of a game," he says.

The Grizzlies won't try anything new, he said. "We're basically the same every week, a drop back passing team. What we do depends on what the other team does, how they handle us," he said.

MSU's Dave Arnold acknowledges the game could be wide open. "They are very explosive, very dangerous," he says.

"They have given up a lot of big plays, but they have come up with a lot of big plays, too," he said.

Eastern Washington, 3-2 against Big Sky this season, takes on a Nevada-Reno team that Coach Chris Ault says hasn't played up to its potential the last couple of games.

"We just hope to maintain the high-intensity level we have set,"

said Ault. "We played well last week but we did not play great. We have an opportunity to do better and bigger things if we stop hurting ourselves," he said.

The Weber-Idaho State rivalry isn't quite as old as the Montana matchup, but may be just as intense. Weber holds a 13-12 lead in the series.

But Weber's Mike Price said his Wildcats, 1-3 in Big Sky and 2-4 overall, have a lot of injuries this week.

Last week the Wildcats lost linebacker Jerry Richardson with a dislocated elbow and tight end Gerald Wilcox with a broken arm.

Price said his team played very well in a loss to Boise State last week, and its attitude is good. "Our attitude is improving, but we've still got to win football games. We're still fighting through injuries," he said.

On ISU, he said, "They really haven't been playing very well. I don't know what kind of a team they are. I'm looking forward to a win, I really am."

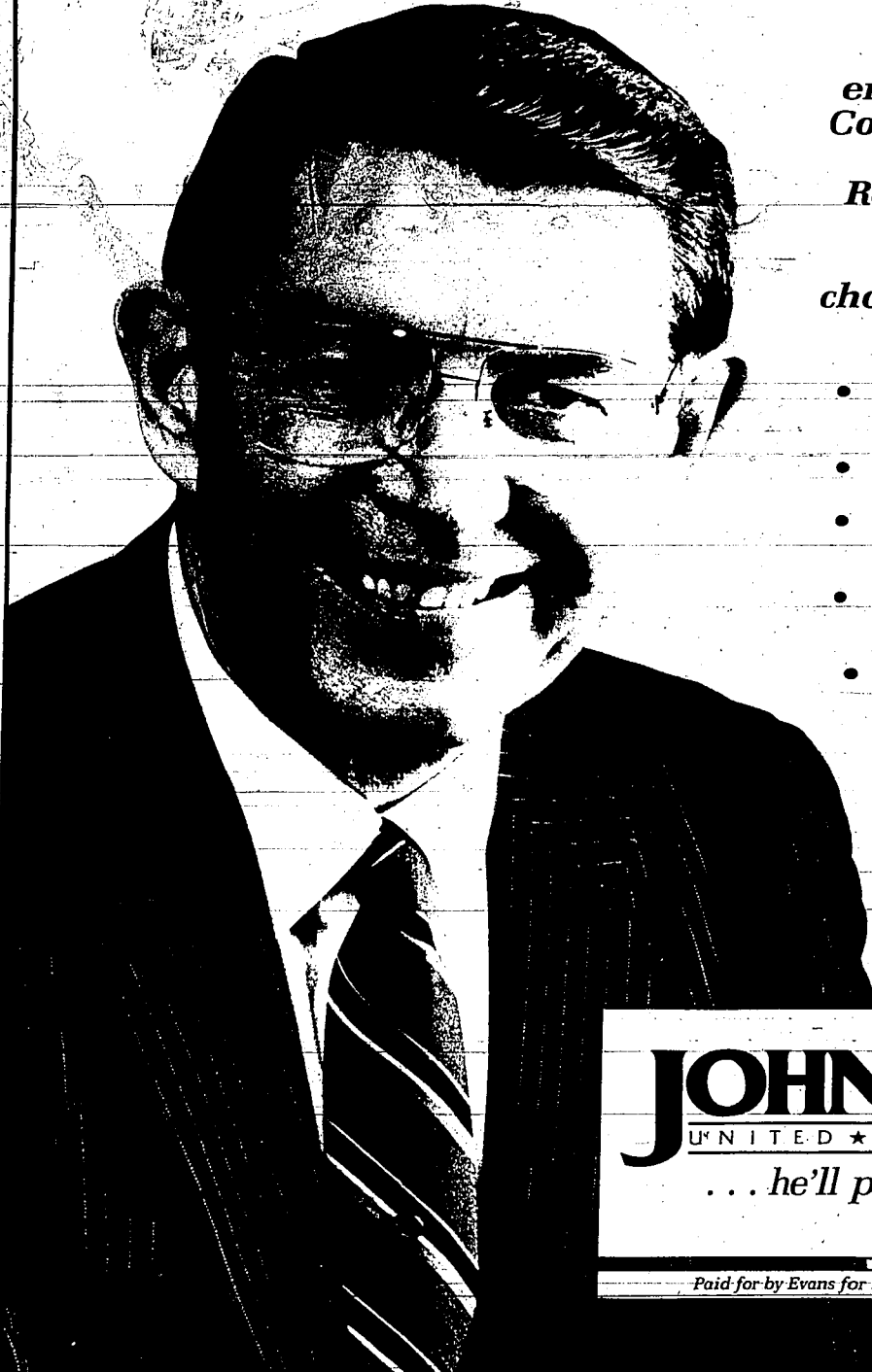

With its multiple contributors, 'Jumpin Jack Flash' is a mess

There are certain things in film credited to writers that are like a bullet before a matador's cape. For instance, multiple writing credits. If three or four writers are listed, critics sniff disaster, as in too many cases they are right. The case of "Casablanca" was adapted by three screen writers from a play by two others).



The writers credited for Whoopi Goldberg's first comedy film, "Jumpin' Jack Flash," are David Franz, W. Melville, Patricia Irving and Christopher Thompson. What's more, there were two directors — Howard Zieff was replaced by Penny Marshall — and two producers, Lawrence Gordon and Joel Silver. With all these contributors, you might expect "Jumpin' Jack Flash" to be a mess. You would be right. Not since 20th Century Fox combined writer Stone and Dolly Parton in "Rhinestone" has the studio produced such a mishmash. The miscast and miscellaneous "Rhinestone" was doomed from the start. The tragedy of "Jumpin' Jack Flash" is that in fewer and more gifted hands, it could have been a winner.

The promising premise: Whoopi Goldberg is an unorthodox computer operator in a Manhattan bank. Along with money transfers, she dispenses recipes and sex-life advice to her foreign correspondents. One day she hooks into "Jumpin' Jack Flash," who turns out to be a British intelligence agent seeking escape from an Iron Curtain country. Miss Goldberg seeks help from the British consulate, but she is intercepted by a pair of suave moles who assign a small army of assassins to eliminate her. The rest of the movie is devoted to her escapes from

the episodes became a string of unconnected and illogical sitcom sketches. For instance, the bad guys attack her phone booth to a wrecking truck and drag it through the city streets. What's the motivation here?

The good news about "Jumpin' Jack Flash" is that Whoopi Goldberg emerges as a comedy star of the first order. She rises above the lame material to create a character that is both credible and endearing.

The other actors fare less well. Stephen Collins is a bumbling newcomer to the computer room whose true identity is revealed unconvincingly in the final shootout. John Wood is the suave double-agent, and Jim Belushi appears implausibly as a hit man.

"Jumpin' Jack Flash" is rated R, apparently because of Miss Goldberg's vulgarisms. Running time: 100 minutes.

Bonner book rips the KGB

BOSTON (AP) — Soviet authorities won Yelena Bonner's silence during her recent visit to the United States, says the wife of Soviet dissident Andrei Sakharov gets her say about life in a KGB fishbowl in a book appearing Friday.

In "Alone Together," translated from the Russian by Alexander Cook and published by Alfred A. Knopf, she chronicles the frustrations and uncertainties of internal exile in Gorky which began for Sakharov in

1980 and for her in 1984.

"I think if there were no restriction on her talking to the press when she was in the United States, then maybe no book," said her daughter, Tanya Yankelevich, who lives in the Boston suburb of Newton.

"But I think there was a need for her to speak this word so people can learn about the Sakharovs, if they want to. And I think there was an urge to relieve herself of all the suffering."

"Writing a book is not an easy task," he says. A born-again Christian, he credits God with presenting him with the creative talent to complete the work.

It was only about 10 years ago, at the age of 34, that he first learned how to ride a horse and was introduced to the cowboy way of life.

He believes that, like himself, virtually every grown man once dreamed of being a cowboy. Now his recreation includes herding cattle, riding in rodeos and listening to other cowboy poets at their annual meeting in Elko, Nev.

He once saw a timeworn cowboy break down in tears listening to an old cowboy melody during the Elko meeting. It was a moment he says he'll never forget, showing him the intense emotions of the cowboy life.

Miller says he has discovered that cowboys have a "neat way of life, and I don't think many people understand it."

He hopes that through reading his book, people who live in the city will see how cowboys really live.

His book, illustrated by Don Gill, Glenns Ferry, and photographed primarily by another Idahoan, Pete Conlon, was published by Miller's own Medicine Elk Press in Kuna and costs \$14.95. It is available at the Book Store and Hogglin's in Rupert.

Ornaments sought for Idaho tree

BOISE — The Idaho Commission on the Arts has issued a statewide invitation to artists to make ornaments for two holiday trees: Idaho's national Christmas tree in Washington, D.C., and the Idaho Artists Tree at St. Alphonsus Regional Medical Center's Festival of Trees.

The Idaho national tree will stand with 55 others around the National Christmas Tree to form the Pathway of Peace on the Ellipse at the nation's capital.

Individual artists, artisans, arts groups and/or school classes are invited to make and submit ornaments to hang on the trees. In keeping with the custom established in previous years, state ornaments are created especially for the national Christmas Pageant of Peace theme. Most are handcrafted and made in such diverse materials as blown glass, hand-carved wood, cornhusks, sewn fabrics and bread dough. They often feature birds, flags, emblems and seals, historic sites, buildings and events as well as personalities who contributed to liberty.

The theme for this year's tree is Liberty, in celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Statue of Liberty. The theme as well as the State of Idaho should be reflected in the ornament design.

According to a fact sheet issued by The White House, each ornament must not exceed four inches in any direction and should be able to fit neatly inside a four-inch circular area. Also, each individual ornament should weigh approximately six to eight ounces and have a thin wire or thread "so they may be hung within a plastic globe."

Ornaments should be sent or delivered to the Idaho Commission on the Arts, 304 West State St., Boise, 83720, no later than Nov. 14. A panel will select 40 ornaments to be shipped to Washington; the remainder will decorate the Idaho Artists Tree at St. Alphonsus' festival.

"This is a great opportunity to show Idaho arts to the world as well as to Boise," Gaetha Pace, the commission's executive director

"Because we have so many talented people in this state, we expect both of Idaho's trees to be outstanding."

Traditionally, the President of the United States officially lights the National Christmas Tree and state trees then delivers his Christmas message at the opening ceremony that will begin the three-week long Christmas Pageant of Peace. This year's opening ceremony, a one-hour, outdoor musical program highlighted by the lighting of the National Christmas Tree, is set for Dec. 11 on the Ellipse.

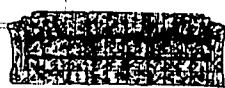

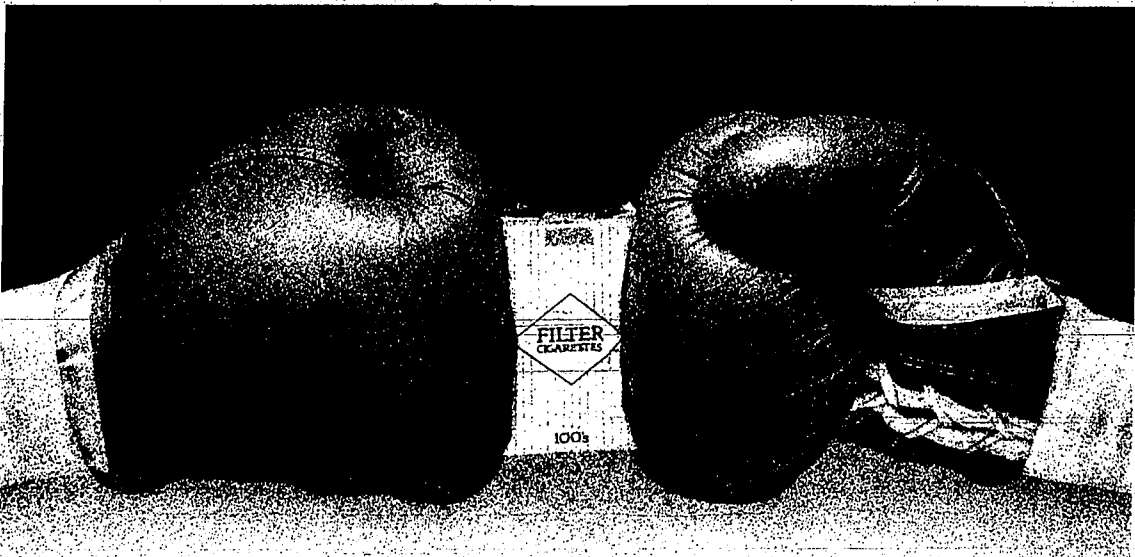

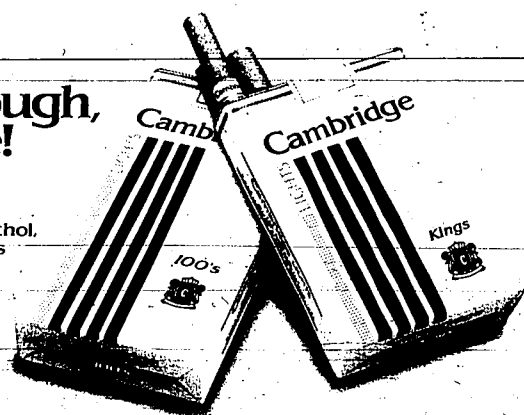

CBS adds bold female surgeon, 'Kay O'Brien' to its series lineup

By ANDREW J. EDELSTEIN

CBS, the network dominated by TV superwomen shows such as "Kate & Allie," "Cagney & Lacey" and "Designing Women," recently added a new heroic female to its prime-time lineup: a second-year surgery resident named Kay O'Brien. But Kayo (played by former soap star Patricia Kalember) was not created specifically as a superwoman.

"I didn't want to make a feminist statement," says "Kay O'Brien" producer Bill Asher ("Bewitched," "I Love Lucy"). "Kayo is more like an '80s version of Ben Casey — a young rebel surgeon who has spirit and goes up against the establishment."

Of course, Casey never faced problems like Kayo. In the first episode, a crestfallen Kayo is lectured by Dr. Robert Moffitt (Lane Smith), the head of surgery at Manhattan General Hospital: "Seventy-five surgeons," he says, referring to her male classmates, "and you gotta be a better one than all of them. It ain't right and it ain't fair. But that's the way it is."

Nonetheless, Asher says Kayo can



provide a realistic role model for female viewers, even though the number of female surgeons in actuality is not high. "She's someone with spunk and determination," says Asher, speaking from Toronto, where the Thursday-night series is being filmed. "Women will be encouraged by her. It's not unrealistic to look at a gal who aspires to something few others have achieved. She is an underdog who has to struggle to be better than everyone else. Plus she has to give up what most gals have — a serious relationship with men."

Kayo's lack of male companionship provides the requisite amount of

melodrama in the series. In the pilot, Kayo was living with a doctor (Franc Lux) who walked out on her. In a hokey scene (and a plot-line reversal), he wanted to her: "What about our relationship, doesn't that matter?"

According to Asher, Kayo's boyfriend "is not out of her life forever."

"They'll be friends," he says. "All right, for a gal to have a normal relationship because of the hours, because of the dedication. But in times of need, he'll be there."

Asher says that as the season progresses, Kayo will be involved in the dating game.

"She runs into guys who want to take her out of all this, the Donald Trumps of the world who want to whisk her away," says Asher. "She will also have 'unconsummated attractions' with her co-workers."

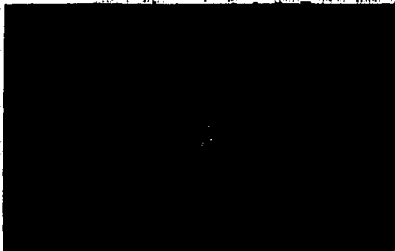
Theater was and is her first love but Ellen finds a new excitement in doing soaps.

All three networks tie in news ratings battle

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC, CBS and NBC all finished first in the evening news ratings last week, depending on how you count it.

CBS and NBC had the best average rating at 10.6, while ABC trailed with a 10.4 average. However, ABC averaged a 21 percent share of the audience, while CBS and NBC trailed at 20.

Blame it on baseball. ABC's ratings were a four-night average because its Wednesday night newscast was pre-empted by the 16-inning finale between the New York Mets and the Houston Astros in the National League Championship Series.

Not only did that night not count in ABC's news ratings, but the cliff-

hanger game also pulled away viewers from the NBC and CBS news programs, said Paul Sonkin, ABC's vice president for network audience research.

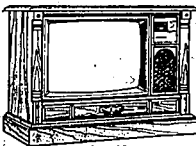

ABC's Jennings smiled the most in '84 Reagan coverage — study

WASHINGTON — An assistant psychology professor at Syracuse University has conducted a study indicating that ABC's Peter Jennings smiled more than either NBC's Tom Brokaw or CBS' Dan Rather when reporting on President Reagan during the 1984 campaign.

Nevertheless, Jennings scored lowest in "overall facial expressiveness."

The "facial expressiveness" study by Brian Mullen was conducted in two phases. Subjects who had "proved they could accurately gauge facial expressions" were shown silent video tapes of the three network anchors discussing Reagan and Democratic presidential candidate Walter Mondale in the week before the election.

The second phase of the study surveyed the voting habits of residents of five states.

On a "facial point" scale, Rather and Brokaw scored in the middle, indicating no preference for either candidate," according to the study. In the same scale, Jennings "scored considerably higher" in "facial positivity" when talking about Reagan. "Jennings did appear to exhibit a strong positive bias in favor of Reagan," the study concluded.

Eighty percent of the voters who watched Jennings voted for Reagan. An average of 61.7 percent watching Rather or Brokaw voted for Reagan.

Mullen says, "Further measures must be taken before conclusions can be drawn about the study's findings."

Reports circulating of more CBS cuts

Reports continue to circulate in New York that another 400 could be leaving CBS in the next few months, part of a further "downsizing" that began in mid-September when financial Laurence Tisch moved in as acting chief executive officer.

Last week, the corporate personnel unit went from 120 to 50 people; some 25 pages were given their notice; and Peter A. Derow, head of CBS' publishing group, and 14 members of his staff were fired. Other corporate areas, like finance and administration, are getting a close look.

Two weeks ago, Tisch brought aboard a consultant from the firm of Coopers & Lybrand who is reportedly on the West Coast this week analyzing the Entertainment Division.

Meanwhile, CBS-Broadcast Group has almost finished the 700-position cut ordered last summer before the Tisch management team moved in. Attrition will probably account for the last of the Broadcast Group departures.

air for several years," Selleck said in a telephone interview from Honolulu.

This season, CBS has moved "Magnum" into a later time slot Wednesday nights, and the show is prospering. Last week, it was 22nd on the A.C. Nielsen list.

"I'm real pleased that there has been a response," Selleck said. "It vindicates the show in a way."

He was bothered, he said, by what seemed to be an increasing fascination with the weekly Nielsen numbers in newspapers and on shows like "Entertainment Tonight."

At the television writers-tour this summer in California, Selleck recalled, he had urged writers to do more reviews and fewer top 10 lists.

It's one thing for the network and advertisers to fuss about ratings, Selleck said, "but when people are coming up and quoting share points to you, it gets ridiculous."

The risk when there is such a preoccupation with ratings is that it kind of crosses over into believing there is something wrong with the show.

This year's high-rated "Magnum" is the same show as last year's struggling "Magnum," Selleck said.

With one difference — there is a much deeper personal commitment from the star.

This summer, Selleck turned down all movie offers and spent the 10-week break working with the writers and producers.

Not only was there ratings pressure, but "Magnum" was not immune to the cost-cutting going on throughout CBS.

"I knew if we didn't have our stuff together, budget consciousness would result in pulling quality off the screen," he said.

In the previous seven seasons, Selleck said, production of "Magnum" began in August. This year, they got going in mid-June.

As of this week, the crew was working on the 11th episode of the season.

That not only leaves time for more work on the scripts, he said, but for

more attention to editing and post-production as well.

"We haven't had a turkey we've had to slip in this season," he said.

Indeed, Selleck claims the best shows this season are yet to come. One involves the possibility that bachelor Thomas Magnum has a 5-year-old daughter, and another tells of a chase for a serial killer.

There's also a "crossover" show with "Murder, She Wrote," in which Selleck and Angela Lansbury appear on each other's shows to wrap up a single case.

This week, Selleck was working on a lighter hour in which Magnum and Higgins (John Hillerman) get trapped in an elevator and spend about half the show there.

The two men start pulling pranks

on each other, Selleck said, until war breaks out.

The remarkable comeback for "Magnum" comes in the last year of Selleck's contract.

"I have some tough decisions to make," he said.

He holds no grudge against Cosby's network, NBC, and is eager to get back on "Late Night with David Letterman."

At the Emmy Awards ceremony, where Letterman was a reluctant host, Selleck talked with some of the comedian's associates. "I told them, I need my Letterman fix," Selleck said.

"I've had great fun makin' an idiot of myself," he added. "If I get back to New York, I've got to get back on that show."

Network films examine same crime

1985 race between Athenium and Doubleday to publish the best-selling books upon which the two productions are based. It also has placed television executives on the defensive, insisting they are unruffled by the competition.

"As far as I'm concerned, they're not doing it," said Bob Markell, executive producer of CBS's "At Mother's Request." "We're going to look at it differently. When it's over, I hope to God we have two different pictures."

CBS, now filming in Salt Lake City, has based its script on Jonathan Coleman's book of the same title. It stars Stephanie Powers as Frances Schroeder, the former New York City Ballet Board member serving a life term at Utah State Prison for conspiring her father's murder to prevent his cutting her from his will.

NBC is relying on "Nutcracker," by Shana Alexander, as the basis for its series starring Lee Remick.

"Nutcracker" focuses on the bitter Bradshaw family relationships that led to the murder. Except for some exterior shots in Salt Lake City, it is being shot in New York and Los Angeles.

Stephens said he knows of no other instance in which two networks have simultaneously filmed movies based on the same event.

"The competition is really more of a network thing. We wish it didn't exist," he said. "All of us hate to see movies go up on the same subject."

The network rivalry has taken on a personal dimension for Ms. Powers. She and Ms. Remick have been close friends for 20 years.

"We laugh about it. What else are we supposed to do? We can't figure out why they're doing this," she said.

No date has been set for either film to air. But NBC's Stephens said CBS, which plans a two-part, four-hour production, almost certainly will have the jump on its rival's six-hour version.

"The arithmetic is very simple. It takes less time to make a four-hour movie than a six-hour movie," he said. "But we're not the ones under the gun... We went along on our own schedule."

Stephens said Ms. Alexander signed an option with NBC more than 2 1/2 years ago, when her book was only an outline for her publisher, Doubleday. NBC had learned of the story from author Tommy Thompson, who was researching the Bradshaw case when he died of cancer in 1982.

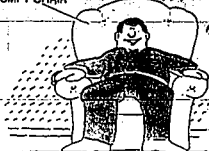

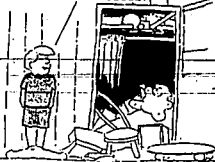

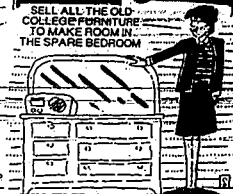
