Land Bank's suit attacks loan rules

SPOKANE, Wash. — With its suit close to deposit, the Federal Land Bank of Spokane has filed in U.S. District Court a suit against the Federal Reserve Board, claiming the agency's latest rules about accounting for non-income violate the intent of Congress.

In a federal lawsuit filed Wednesday, the Land Bank charges the FRCB ordered rules that are "arbitrary, capricious, an abuse of discretion and otherwise contrary to law." Robert J. Krueger, Farm Credit Bank of Spokane president and chief executive officer, said the FCA regulates the national Farm Credit System. The Land Bank is asking the U.S. District Court for Eastern Washington to declare the rules "void" and to award the bank \$26.7 million in damages. The bank contributed to other failing farm credit banks in the Midwest from July 1 to Sept. 30. The 27 banks in the system share losses under federal supervision.

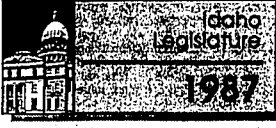

State closer to decision on prison

BOISE — Idaho might be close to a decision where to locate new prison facilities — and what is needed to solve a serious prison overcrowding problem. "By early next week, we hope to have a resolution out," said Senate President Pro Tem James Risch, R-Boise, after legislative leaders met with Gov. Cecil Andrus to talk about prisons.

"We are very close," said Andrus. "We had an excellent meeting to discuss the problems." Andrus summoned leaders of both parties to his office to break a deadlock over new prison facilities. State prison officials say the state needs a new 500-bed maximum security prison, which could cost up to \$30 million. Two state boards are divided over where it should be located.



"It's not resolved yet, we have some differences on numbers," said Risch. "But we will continue to work on that." Risch also said there should be no dispute on selection of the site for any new facilities. "The statutes are clear on that. The Board of Corrections is to make a recommendation to the Permanent Building Fund Advisory Council, which makes the final decision," he said. "That's set in law." That might favor Boise as the site, although it wasn't clear exactly what would be built.

"We disagree on need. We're coming at it from different philosophies," said Risch.

"At least we know each other's position better than when we went in," said Boyd.

"We will compromise some sort of way," said Risch. Andrus said the disagreement centers on the number of maximum security beds needed, and the money needed. But he also predicted action next week.

"By early next week, we will decide upon a course of action and proceed on it," he said. "We moved today very close to agreement on the numbers."

Andrus said he simply does not accept the report that Idaho needs to build 500 new beds for maximum security prisoners.

"We definitely need 500 beds, but we don't need 500 maximum security beds," the governor said. As to how many are needed, he said, "We've moved a lot closer on that today."

The legislative leaders said they considered

Committee approves Donovan for DHW slot

BOISE — The Senate Health and Welfare Committee on Thursday unanimously approved the nomination of Richard Donovan to head the state Department of Health and Welfare.

The nomination now goes to the full Senate for final approval. Donovan, a former Twin Falls regional DHW director, was nominated by Gov. Cecil Andrus to replace Rose Bowman, the controversial former director, who was not reappointed by Gov. Cecil Andrus. During an hour-long confirmation hearing, Donovan responded to questions on his philosophy for running the state's largest agency, which has 2,600 employees. He also was asked by Sen. Mike Crapo, R-Idaho Falls, to comment on a memo concerning day-care legislation.

signed by Donovan and the state's district health departments, which caused a furor in the Legislature last week. Donovan told committee members the meeting and memo was a "good-faith effort to work with local communities."

Donovan noted that in previous years H&W and the district health departments have been at odds on who should license day-care centers. If legislation is passed, "We've had an on-and-off relationship with district health departments and this was an attempt to show that if legislation is passed, we can work with health districts," Donovan said.

He expected some reaction to the memo, but "not as much as we go," he said. Crapo later said he was satisfied with Donovan's answer, although he still thought the memo was "presumptuous."

However, Crapo added, he did not think it was a big issue. In his confirmation hearing, Donovan said his priorities included containing Medicaid costs; looking at services for the elderly; and coordinating more child-care services.

Donovan said he also has frozen all hiring until he can review each position to see if it is needed. Donovan did not have to answer questions about H&W's massive computer problems, which have caused delays in food stamps to the poor.

Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Declo, Health and Welfare Committee chairman, said he knew the problems occurred before Donovan took over. "I know you're doing everything you can to solve them."

Following Donovan's confirmation hearing, committee members said they were "impressed" with the Nebraska native, who has a B.S. degree in criminal justice and sociology.

Trade deficit pulls down U.S. economy

WASHINGTON — The U.S. economy, weighted down by a huge foreign trade deficit, turned in its worst performance in 1986 since the last recession, the government reported Thursday. The Commerce Department said the gross national product, the broadest measure of economic health, rose 2.5 percent last year, the weakest growth rate since a 2.5 percent decline during the recession year of 1982.

Economic growth during the final three months of the year was reported at an annual rate of just 1.7 percent as consumer spending, the mainstay of the four-year-old recovery, actually fell. But the news on inflation was exceptional. A price index tied to the GNP turned in its best performance since 1967, a 2.7 percent rise last year which was held down by the dramatic plunge in oil prices. For the fourth quarter, this inflation index rose at an annual rate of 1 percent, the slowest advance of the

whole year. Overall economic growth was much weaker than the Reagan administration and many private forecasters had been expecting at the beginning of last year. The administration believed that sharply lower oil prices and falling interest rates would help lift the economy out of the doldrums. A year ago, the administration was predicting an annual growth rate of 3.4 percent. However, the country's trade deficit, which the administration expected would show improvements,

soured to a new record, throwing the country's manufacturing sector into a virtual recession, while the big drop in oil prices forced layoffs in the petroleum industry. The 2.5 percent GNP growth for 1986 followed a similar anemic performance of 2.7 percent in 1985, far below the 6.4 percent growth turned in during 1984 as the economy was racing along after the steep 1981-82 recession. Twin boys die after surgery to separate them

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Twin 3 1/2-week-old boys died Thursday after surgeons operated for eight hours to separate the infants, who shared a heart, liver and intestines, a hospital spokeswoman said. The second twin died at 4:30 p.m. MST, 6 1/2 hours after the first died during the operation. Doctors had said would give only one of the twins a chance to live. The second baby's death was caused

by "multiple problems relating to surgery, primarily cardiac problems," said Childrens Hospital spokeswoman Patricia Usner. Dr. James O'Neill, chief of surgery at the hospital, had said after the operation that "everything went as well as could be expected, and it is very questionable" whether the second infant would survive. Surgery to separate the twins, joined from breastbone to abdomen and together weighing 7 1/4 pounds, began at 6:20 a.m. MST, nearly two

hours after they were wheeled into the operating room. It was completed at 2 p.m. MST. Ms. Usner said "Baby A" separated from his brother at 12:30 p.m. MST; was clinically dead at 1 p.m. less than four hours after the operation began. He was kept attached to his brother while surgeons moved the heart and liver into the proper places in "Baby B's" body. Earlier, the hospital reported "Baby A" had not died until separated.

"To separate the children one had to be sacrificed, but without the surgery neither infant could have survived much longer," said Ms. Usner. "It was a very sad and difficult decision, and the only way we were able to justify it was knowing in our own minds that at least you have a chance to save one. Otherwise, you would definitely lose both. Everyone agreed this was the only way to go," Shirley Bonnem, another spokeswoman, said.

Funds diverted for firefighting

BOISE (AP) — Following the recommendation of Gov. Cecil Andrus, legislative budget writers have unanimously agreed to divert \$7 million from the Water Pollution Control Fund to cover outstanding firefighting and Medicaid bills.

Thursday's action by the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee marked the first spending decision of the 1987 Legislature. But the panel put off any decision on one of the governor's major budget proposals, an immediate \$400,000 appropriation to underwrite the Commerce Department's economic development campaign.

The diversion from the \$20 million Water Pollution Control Fund will be used to pay \$4.3 million the state is responsible for to provide medical treatment to the poor and \$2.7 million to carry on during last summer's battles against forest and range fires.

Coalition rips insurance firms

BOISE (AP) — A coalition of several different organizations called a news conference here Thursday to talk about insurance problems in Idaho. None of the spokesmen had anything good to say about insurance companies in general, including those in Idaho.

Insurance companies were blasted for "gouging" the public with excessive premium increases, and then trying to "blackmail" Idaho into changing the jury system to protect them.

"Insurance companies are gouging companies and individuals with large premium increases, and they're blackmailing the public," said John Stocks, executive director of Idaho Fair Share, a consumer advocate organization. "It is time for the Legislature to take a close look at the way they do business in Idaho."

Lobbyists for Idaho insurance companies couldn't be reached immediately for comment.

Stallings offers speed limit bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, is cosponsoring legislation that would allow states to raise the speed limit to 65 mph on rural interstate highways.

Stallings said the legislation would modify rather than repeal the current 55 mph federal speed limit. It would direct the U.S. Department of Transportation to consult with governors and issue regulations on which rural interstates can safely handle the higher speeds.

It also calls for a five-year demonstration project for highway officials to determine the impact of the 65 mph limit on safety.

Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, introduced legislation in the Senate last week to lift the 55 mph limit that has been in effect since 1974.

Bill proposes limited sessions

BOISE (AP) — Rep. Dean Haagenson, R-Coeur d'Alene, estimates that the state of Idaho could save \$917,160 every two years if the Legislature were limited to a 20-day budget session every other year.

He figures that as soon as people realize that, they will support his bill limiting legislative sessions during even-numbered years.

The House State Affairs Committee on Thursday approved printing and introduction of Haagenson's bill. It calls for a legislative session in even-numbered years limited to budget matters, or items of special importance and endorsed by legislative leaders or the governor.

Parole set for convicted official

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Commission for Pardons and Parole has set release dates later this year for a former Lewiston city councilman convicted of killing his wife and for a convicted murderer involved in the 1980 riot at the Idaho State Penitentiary.

But the commission denied a parole request from Walter Dale "Bud" Balle on his 20-year prison sentence for escape and being a persistent violator. Executive Director Olivia Craven said Thursday.

The board approved a July parole for Martin McKay, who received an indeterminate life sentence for second-degree murder in the 1978 shooting death of his wife, Norma.

Paul G. Hatton, who was convicted of first-degree murder in the 1970 execution-style slaying of a Boise convenience store clerk, was granted parole in October, Ms. Craven said.

Transportation board urges \$19 million hike

BOISE (AP) — Faced with possibly the largest gap in decades between need and the cash to meet it, the Idaho Transportation Board on Thursday called for a highway user fee increase of up to \$18 million a year to halt deterioration of the state's road network.

"Idaho is critically short of the funding for its primary highways," Board Chairman John Ohman told the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee. "This fee increase program would reverse the trend of



deterioration in our highways that are critical to economic development."

Transportation Department Director Dean Tisdale told the panel

that \$4.6 million in spending for the current year has already been cut to cope with inadequate user-fee revenues. Even deeper cuts will be needed in the coming year, aggravating the already severe problems in the highway system, if no relief is provided, he said.

"In my 33 years in the department, I have never seen a larger gap between budget needs and available revenue," Tisdale said.

The board's official request for a user fee increase came a day after

its members met with Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus on the issue and Andrus and Republican legislative leaders agreed to give any proposal to raise the fuel tax or registration fee a clear chance for passage. Neither the governor nor the lawmakers, however, endorsed any specific fee-increase plan.

Legislative budget analyst Jeff Youltz told the committee that increasingly fuel efficient vehicles coupled with energy-conserving shifts among motorists have left the Transportation Department with revenues that fall short of even the amount needed to maintain its current programs.

PAC developing river system bill

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Sportsmen's Political Action Committee is developing legislation to create a natural and recreational river system for the state, including the Henry's Fork of the Snake River.

"There will be a bill this session," Jack Trueblood, SportPAC

treasurer, said after a joint hearing of the House Resources and Conservation and Senate Resources and Environment committees. "What we need to do is search for a sponsor."

A proposal to create a state river system was killed in a legislative

committee last year, but Trueblood said conditions might be better this year.

"One thing we'll have to do is have a vehicle to work with local governments," he said.

The SportPAC treasurer said the proposed legislation on the Henry's Fork would cover the same 61-mile stretch from Henry's Lake south to the Ashton reservoir that is protected from hydroelectric development by federal legislation.

Trueblood said his group also is looking at inclusion of other rivers in the state system, such as the South

Fork of the Snake River.

"We would like to get at least one river in each geographic area of the state," he said.

Trueblood said some type of fee would have to be attached to fund a state system. One immediate possibility is user fees, he said.

Vigil Moore of the state Fish and Game Department said a study shows fishermen, who spend \$3.4 million annually for food, tackle and accommodations to fish the Henry's Fork, would be willing to pay an additional \$2.9 million to continue fishing under current conditions.

Boyd casts his eye toward performance

Idaho House Speaker Tom Boyd was not particularly inspirational in his speech to the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce Wednesday, but he made up for it in some common sense analysis.

As for inspiration, about as far as Boyd went was when he referred to an "attitudinal change" among both legislators and Idaho's people. "I feel like we should get on with the business at hand," he said. That low-voltage prod wasn't exactly a rousing call to action.

But Boyd has his eye on performance, not rhetoric. He knows a new day has come with his own election as House Speaker and the retirement of both former Speaker T.W. Stivers and Gov. John Evans, whose animosity for each other was great.

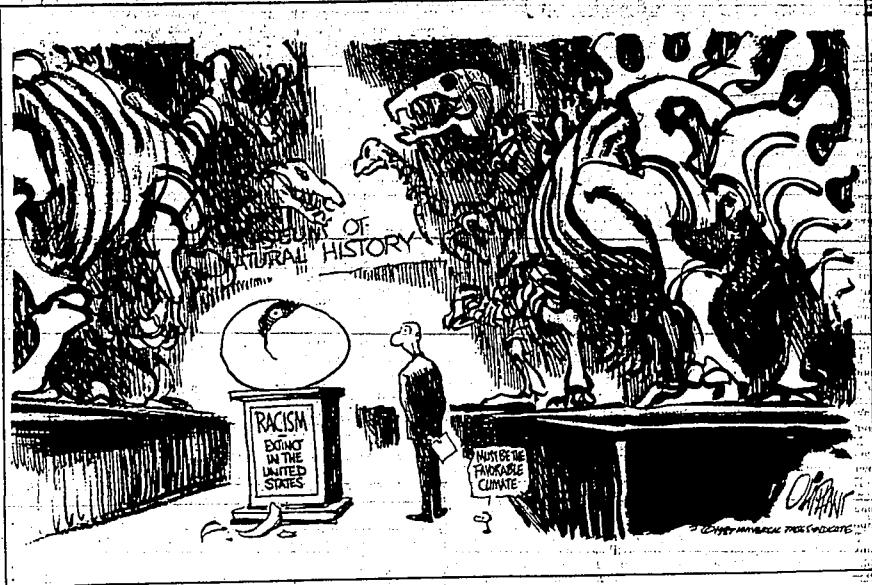
Boyd, as well as other Republican leaders, and new governor Cecil Andrus have been turtle-doving at each other since December. This week, the gap between them narrowed further as the Legislature's revenue projections committee came up with numbers very close to those of the governor.

In his speech, Boyd touched on several important issues, and on each, he indicated where he stood as well as what he thought his colleagues would ultimately settle upon.

On repeal of the investment credit tax, for example, Boyd said he favored keeping the credit which, he said, would help industries expand as the Idaho economy improves. But he added that he wasn't going to "jump in front of a train" to protect the credit if legislators wanted to repeal it.

That kind of balanced leadership may strike some as weak, and it will certainly contrast with Stivers' toe-the-line style.

Stivers and his style seemed to work, for a time. But Boyd may get better results with less bombast, and that, in politics, often depends on compromise.



Victor over nature sometimes defeated

WASHINGTON — Legal reasoning has an admirable parsimony.

It reduces controversies to manageable components. But it can sharpen society's mind by narrowing it, and may be doing so in the New Jersey case for possession of a fetus.

A New Jersey couple wanted a child. For medical reasons, the wife deemed pregnancy too risky. So her husband's sperm was used to inseminate a woman who signed a contract to gestate the fetus in exchange for \$10,000. But when the time came for the "surrogate" mother to surrender the infant, she exclaimed, "Oh God, what have I done." What indeed?

But first, what is she? She is not a "surrogate" mother, she is the mother, the "natural" mother. The court may read this case as one concerning contracts or custody (the best interests of the child), but what is at issue is our right conduct for creatures of our nature.

This argument about the mother's right to retain the child is logically reversible from but is not. It is the Supreme Court's 1973 decision that declared abortion to be a woman's "privacy" right. The father's wishes are not legally germane and the fetus has no more legal status than a tumor in the woman.

The 1973 decision gave rise to the legal location that a fetus is "potential life." The biological absurdity of that is today underscored by the development of fetal medicine. A fetus is a living creature on which medicine can work diagnostic and therapeutic marvels. The imperative of the medical ethic is to help where help is possible. Yet moral vertigo results from attempting to reconcile that imperative with the Court's decision that a fetus is akin to an appendix — a thing of no moral significance.

And now there is emerging a problematic concept of "fetal rights." Civil authorities have intervened to protect fetuses from acts and omissions by pregnant women; they have ordered unwilling women to undergo cesarean sections; a woman is being prosecuted for the death of her fetus as a result of her disregard of doctors' orders.

The idea of fetal rights is inherently problematic and is, like the application of the medical ethic to fetuses, flatly incompatible with the 1973 ruling. That ruling teaches society to consider a fetus as a mere lump of matter that acquires moral significance only when removed from the womb. And if the womb is a rented fetal container, the personhood of the woman remains. It is of no significance.

So if suddenly the fetal container (a.k.a. mother) starts acting like a person — "Oh God, what have I done!" — she is acting incongruously.

Thus the natural bonding between mother and child is made to seem like the mother's caprice, and seems irresponsible in light of her contract. The very idea of what is "natural" seems to be a gossamer superstitious, a concept entailing no reasonable restraint on appetites.

The New Jersey couple wanted a child but not a "child of their own," as that phrase is used to mean a couple's child of their flesh made one. If we conclude that the mere desire for a child entitles a woman to an entitlement, the right of couples to suffer no legal impediment to partial (one spouse's involvement) biological parenthood. And there will be no grounds for denying the entitlement to unmarried people of whatever character, or to poor women who may allow their

bodies to be exploited to satisfy other people's desires. The desire for children is strong and wholesome, but life offers no guarantees and good things can have prohibitive costs. To prevent such costs, in the New Jersey case, the contract should be treated as an unenforceable statement of mutual intentions that no longer obtain. The mother must not be deprived of her baby, to which she is now bonded in the natural way.

To try to make womb rental harmless merely by expanding the mother's options for consent — by allowing a grace period after birth during which she can decide to keep the child — makes matters worse. It further subordinates responsibility to selfishness, and further encourages thinking of children as material goods.

All such contracts should be forbidden as a formalization of commerce in babies, and even voluntary donation of wombs for gestation should be forbidden as dehumanizing.

The concept of "dehumanization" is meaningless to people who deny, as the culture increasingly does, the idea of the distinctively human. That concept seems under assault from biochemists, molecular biologists, psychiatrists and others who locate the essence of man in raw material subject to manipulation, unconstrained by any notion of a constant "human good."

The blind assertion of the untrammelled sovereignty of willfulness, served by science, over nature drains all substance from moral philosophy. Philosophy, including political philosophy, which concerns right conduct, must assert sovereignty over manipulative techniques before we learn, too late, this lesson: in some conquests of nature, the conqueror is the defeated.

Land reform a key issue for Aquino

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Land reform has become a central issue for President Corason Aquino, promised by her government and demanded by Communist insurgents and the poor peasants from whom they draw recruits.

On Friday, marines fired into a crowd of 10,000 peasants and leftists demanding land reform and marching on the presidential palace. At least a dozen people were reported killed and nearly 100 wounded in the first instance of security forces firing on demonstrators since Mrs. Aquino took office 11 months ago.

Mrs. Aquino recently granted land titles to nearly 6,000 tenant farmers in northern Luzon. Heherson Alvarez, the agrarian reform minister, says his ministry is preparing to distribute about 18,000 titles in the coming year.

Language in the draft constitution, scheduled for a ratification plebiscite Feb. 2, commits the government to "encourage and undertake the just distribution of all agricultural land."

Mrs. Aquino hopes up to 4 million landless peasants eventually will own their own tracts.

Equitable and politically viable land reform has eluded Philippine governments since the end of Spanish colonial domination in 1898. The archipelago's history is full of unfulfilled programs that were blocked by influential economic interests and powerful landlords, many with their own private armies.

Ecuador students want resignation

QUITO, Ecuador (AP) — Hundreds of students threw up barricades, burned tires and stoned police Thursday in protest against Leon Febres Cordero's refusal to resign.

Congress passed a non-binding resolution calling for the president's resignation to "preserve peace" early Thursday following an eight-hour session in which tempers flared. Results were traded and one government lawmaker was challenged to a fistfight.

Legislators debated the motion after the major opposition party dropped plans to seek impeachment of Febres Cordero for allegedly exceeding his powers.

The president in a written response said he had no intention

of resigning and said the constitution did not grant lawmakers "the right to exert the president" to resign.

Those who voted for the measure "tried to ignore the will of 1,300,000 Ecuadorians who elected me president for four years," he said.

Students opposed to Febres Cordero mounted two separate demonstrations that had to be quelled with tear gas and water cannons late Thursday, authorities said.

In one protest, officials said, several hundred high school students

barricaded an avenue 30 blocks from the government palace. In the other, hundreds of college students blocked four major intersections near the Central University.

Five students were arrested and one officer was hospitalized after being struck by a stone thrown by a demonstrator, according to police.

Earlier in the day, government spokesman Marco Lara said that Congress' resolution had no legal force.

Baghdad target for missile

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — An Iranian missile exploded in a crowded Baghdad neighborhood Thursday, killing or wounding at least 54 people.

It was the sixth long-range missile fired into the Iraqi capital since Iran launched an offensive aimed at Basra, the southeast, two weeks ago. Iran claimed earlier Thursday that

at least 212 of its civilians had been killed in attacks by Iraqi warplanes.

A big explosion was heard across Baghdad, a city of 4 million people, when the missile landed Thursday night, it destroyed at least three two-story residential buildings.

Ambulances and fire engines rushed to the scene and an AP reporter counted at least 54 people either killed or wounded.

There was no comment from Iran, but in the past the missiles were fired in retaliation for Iraqi attacks on its cities.

American agenda may be accepted

GENEVA (AP) — The chief U.S. delegate to superpower talks on nuclear testing said Thursday the Soviet Union appeared close to accepting an agenda proposed by the Americans.

"I hope we can begin these (negotiations) as early as next week. That is up to the Soviet delegation," Robert Barker, assistant secretary of defense, told a news conference.

He said recent statements by Soviet officials including leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev and Barker's counterpart, Andronik Petrosyan, made him optimistic.

News conference ends with suicide

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP) — Pennsylvania's treasurer, facing jail for defrauding the state, proclaimed his innocence at a news conference Thursday but said "it's too late for me," then pulled a pistol from a manila envelope, put it into his mouth and killed himself.

R. Budd Dwyer died instantly after he fired a single shot from a .357 Magnum pistol in front of two photographers and reporters, photographers and aides, said Dauphin County Coroner William Bush.

"No, No! Budd, don't do this!" several people gathered in Dwyer's office suite in the state Finance Building screamed just before he pulled the trigger.

Moments after the shot rang out, someone cried, "Dear God in heaven."

Dwyer's son Rob, 21, said his father had given the family no indication of what he intended to do.

"We're pretty broken up," he said, his voice breaking during a telephone interview. He said he heard the news at home with his mother, Joanne, 47, and sister, Dyan, 19.

On Wednesday, the attorney general's office had declared that Dwyer, 47, would be out of office as soon as he was sentenced Friday in federal court in Williamsport. Prior to that, Dwyer, a Republican who had been elected to his second term in 1984, had planned to stay in office on a leave of absence without pay until his appeal was resolved.

A jury in December convicted Dwyer of awarding a \$4.6 million contract to a firm called Computer Technology Associates in return for a promised \$300,000 payoff. No money ever changed hands.

He faced up to 55 years in prison for five counts of mail fraud, four counts of interstate transportation in aid of racketeering, one count of perjury and one count of conspiracy to commit bribery.

At the news conference, Dwyer read a rambling, half-hour statement in which he said he was a victim of the legal system.

He held up his hands when he saw some television cameramen start

taking down their equipment and told them: "You don't want to take down your equipment yet."

Then, he reached into the large envelope, telling those people nearby, "Stay away, this thing will hurt someone."

Fred Cusick, a reporter for the Philadelphia Inquirer, was in the front row at the time of the shooting.

"I should have run and grabbed him when he pulled out the envelope," Cusick said. "I knew that was it."

Police official backs Miranda ruling review

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Miranda ruling helping to protect the rights of the accused "definitely needs to be reviewed and could be set aside," the executive director of a police chiefs' association said Thursday in supporting a report issued by the Justice Department.

The report, written 11 months ago by the department's Office of Legal Policy but not publicly released until this week, urged Attorney General Edwin Meese to launch a concerted drive to have the Supreme Court reverse the 21-year-old Miranda decision.

"Overturning Miranda would... be among the most important achievements of this administration — indeed, of any administration — in restoring the power of self-government to the people of the United States in the suppression of crime," said the report by Assistant Attorney General Stephen J. Markman.

While stopping short of saying the department was looking for a case it could argue before the Supreme Court, Meese said it would take advantage of any situation that would help overturn the Miranda decision.

Major winter storm sweeps along East Coast

A major winter storm roared up the East Coast and churned into a blizzard in New England on Thursday, dumping up to 20 inches of snow that shut down highways and airports, schools and businesses, and government offices from Mississippi to Massachusetts.

At least three deaths were attributed to the storm, and officials up and down the Atlantic coast urged motorists to stay home.

The storm, born in the Gulf of Mexico and packed with moisture, began blanketing Dixie with snow on Wednesday night. Scores of accidents were reported, as Southerners struggled to cope with unfamiliar snow and ice.

For most of the Northeast, it was the worst winter storm since mid-February 1983. In New Jersey, Gov. Thomas Kean declared a state of emergency.

Most opinion surveys show Hart the leading contender for the Democratic presidential nomination. He decided against running for a third Senate term last year in order to concentrate on a bid for the White House.

Hart surprised many observers in 1984 by finishing second to former Vice President Walter F. Mondale in the race for the Democratic nomination.

Symms: Water bill prolongs federal funding

WASHINGTON — Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, said he supports a "more fiscally responsible" Reagan administration version of the water-quality bill passed overwhelmingly by the Democratically controlled Senate.

Clear-water projects in the Magic Valley could receive millions of dollars, starting under the bill passed Wednesday, according to the state Division of Environment.

The \$18 billion reauthorization and strengthening of the 1972 Clean Water Act was approved Wednesday on a 93-6 roll-call vote, with Symms in the minority.

The legislation is identical to a bill vetoed by President Reagan last year. Symms said it prolongs federal funding of local sewage

systems, includes a mandatory non-point source pollution program that "smells of land-use planning," as well as a number of regional "pork barrel" projects.

Congress wants to give the states \$18 billion before ending the government's construction-grants program for waste-water and sewage-treatment plants in 1994.

But Symms said he favors the administration's \$12 billion compromise proposal, up from the \$6 billion aid package proposed by the White House last year.

"Although the (Senate) bill recognizes that construction of sewage treatment systems is better left to state and local governments, it drags out the transition from federal grants to local funding over 9 years," Symms said in a press release. "If we are truly committed to the policy advanced in this bill, then why postpone an improved system of funding for sewage control?"

Symms voted for a bill which would authorize \$12 billion over 8 years.

The Idaho Republican said he also opposes the Senate bill's program to control "non-source-point" pollution from street, farm and mine runoff, even though the Reagan administration is not fighting the proposal.

"This mandatory program smells of 'land-use planning,' and the last thing our farmers need is for Washington bureaucrats to start planning the use of their land," Symms said.

Cities have received up to 75 percent federal funding for sewer projects and Twin Falls City Manager Tom Courtney told the Times-News Thursday that, in an age of high federal budget deficits, it is difficult to justify such continued federal support.

"The federal funding could be less, but there were no federal funding it would be difficult for cities, including Twin Falls,

because they're (sewer projects) expensive," Courtney said.

During the past 12 years Twin Falls has received \$10 million to \$12 million for sewer projects, 75 percent of which has been paid for by the federal government.

The bill that passed recognizes that the federal government is not the best funding source for sewer projects, said Symms aide Trent Clark. "Why delay it 9 years?" he asked.

Symms also objected to so-called "pork barrel" provisions in the bill that pertained which authorized special grants for certain municipalities, Clark said. Another problem was the requirement that states address high pollution problems created by runoff from farmland, streets and mining sources.

Symms wanted to leave this up to the discretion of the states, Clark said.

Clark said Courtney's concern about the

elimination of federal funding would be solved by a revolving loan fund for cities, a provision which was in the bill Symms favored. It was also in the one he vetoed against.

Despite the 93-6 vote in favor of the \$18 billion bill, Clark said that if President Reagan chooses to bring up its cost in his State of the Union Message, he might garner public support to change votes in Congress.

Reagan vetoed the Clean Water Bill passed by the 99th Congress. The overruling, mainly in favor of the latest bill in the Senate, Reagan will not have the votes to sustain a veto.

The revolving loan fund authorizes that \$2.4 billion be spent each year between 1987 and 1991, with specified amounts to go into the revolving loan fund each year until 1991. All the money will go into the loan fund. The balance of the \$18 billion will go to cities.

Veterans to unite on health issues

TWIN FALLS — Veterans groups in Twin Falls are proposing to band together nearly 1,000 members to drum up interest and research in health-related issues.

"It's going to be an organization designed to examine these issues and not just complain about them," said Stanley Sorenson, of the American Legion. "We're trying to plot a course for these community resources."

Siplon said the Twin Falls Veterans Health Commission will investigate, without an axe to grind, the broad range of health issues; with the understanding that changing policy will affect veterans' families, if not the people themselves.

The commission also will accept public comments and present information to legislators.

"Our main objective is to put a little pressure where it ought to be put," said Stanley Sorenson, of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Executives from local groups of VFW, the Legion, Vietnam Veterans of America and Disabled American Veterans agreed Tuesday night to by-laws establishing the commission. Each group must ratify their executives' support, and an organizational meeting to establish commission officials is set for Feb. 23.

The local Pearl Harbor Survivors Association is also expected to join.

The four groups represent an estimated 935 members concerned

with veterans' hospitalization benefits and all forms of community health care.

"It's to our benefit to see that we do what we can to keep all the veterans benefits in force," Sorenson said.

As a veteran of World War II, Sorenson said all veterans should be concerned about cuts to their medical benefits because older members suffer more from cuts and there is concern younger veterans may be left with no medical benefits as they grow old.

"I'm one of the younger ones," Sorenson, 63, said of the VFW. "Now we're getting up to the age when any cutback, even at just a few dollars, is quite dear to us."

The late start with respect to the current legislative session doesn't deter the executives. Siplon explained that the group will study issues over the long-term, without regard to timeliness.

"These problems are not going away and they will not be solved by a single Legislature or a single Congress," Siplon said.

Among their concerns are decreasing federal budget cutbacks and lack of consideration for veterans who did not fight in a war. Siplon said another area of concern at the state level is in support of day-care licensing.

"If we say the appropriate things and have the facts, then we will be listened to," Siplon said. "If we don't have credibility and just try to blow smoke, then we'll just be another group who won't be listened to."

U.S. Attorney's Office appeals dismissal of Birmingham indictment

BOISE — The U.S. Attorney's Office in Boise has filed a notice of appeal with the U.S. Court of Appeals over the dismissal of a federal indictment against Twin Falls Police Commander Patrick Bermingham.

U.S. Court clerks in Boise said on Thursday that the appeal notice was filed about 4 p.m. Wednesday and will be forwarded to the U.S. Court of Appeals in San Francisco.

The Boise district office is preparing a time schedule and list of documents that will be needed from both the U.S. attorney and the defense attorney, Thomas McCabe of Boise.

The brief notice gives no basis for the appeal and the U.S. Attorney Maurice Ellsworth said he is not yet ready to disclose the grounds for the appeal.

Bermingham was indicted by a federal grand jury last September on a felony charge of falsifying a witness expense voucher in connection with a federal trial in which he testified.

U.S. District Judge Harold Ryan of Boise dissolved the indictment Dec. 23 after a 10-day evidentiary hearing in which he frequently criticized Assistant U.S. Attorney Daniel Biehl, who represented the government.

In the dismissal order, Ryan ruled that the city of Twin Falls had acted in good faith in carrying out an agreement with the U.S. Attorney's Office for handling the matter within the local police department. The agreement called for a 30-day suspension and reprimand of Bermingham.

The hearing did not deal with the \$132 expense voucher, but centered on whether or not the city had violated the agreement when Bermingham was temporarily called back to work after completing only half of the 30-day suspension.

Ryan ruled that a manpower shortage existed in the Twin Falls Public Safety Department, warranting Bermingham's temporary return to work. He also supported

the city's contention that sending Bermingham to a seminar in Chicago after he returned to work was a logical, in-view of the Twin Falls police and fire department consolidations.

The 30-day suspension was completed after several injured officers were able to return to duty.

Twin Falls City Manager Tom Courtney said Thursday he feels taking the case to the federal appeals court is a very costly step for taxpayers as well as Bermingham and the city, over \$132 that has been repaid. It was returned by Bermingham when the expense voucher accounts were questioned initially.

"As taxpayer, I don't like having to pay for this case," Courtney said. "I think the decision by the judge (Ryan) was pretty clear on the matter, but I guess if you represent the government (the thousands of dollars) cost doesn't matter."

Courtney pointed out that Ryan's dismissal of the indictment stated that the U.S. attorneys had not acted properly in handling the matter.

This is the final week in which the appeal could be filed.

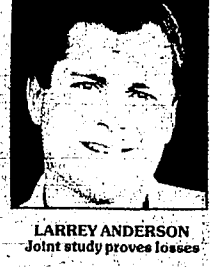
Courtney also confirmed that a grievance has been filed by Howard Elliott, a Twin Falls detective who brought the expense voucher to the attention of the government attorneys.

The grievance involves the Public Safety Department's rotation of officers between the detective and patrol divisions in a broad training plan. Elliott was scheduled to move into the day shift of the uniform division for a second 8-week period when he filed the grievance. Courtney said the matter has been heard in accordance with city grievance policies.

Meanwhile, Elliott is on "extended" leave after submitting a letter from a doctor saying he was under extreme pressure and unable to work. The matter is still under review by the city, Courtney said. Elliott said he had no comment, other than to confirm he is on leave.

Revised agreement could end zoning flap

TWIN FALLS — A legal dispute over professional offices on Addison Avenue could come to an end Monday, when the Twin Falls City Council holds a special meeting over a proposed settlement.

A new version of an agreement was drafted during an executive session Wednesday afternoon and will be formalized by City Attorney Shane Bengoechea, said Mayor Doug Vollmer.

"Things are pretty well settled," Vollmer said.

The newest version of the agreement will probably not be much different than the one the City Council had been set to vote on Monday, at its regular meeting. The agreement, the details of which were not available, pertains to allowing professional offices on Addison Avenue between Lincoln Street and Blue Lakes Boulevard North.

The agreement was prepared by attorney Jeff Stoker, who sued the city over its failure to allow professional use on the section of the street, with language from another agreement proposed by attorney Wall Sneliker, who opposed the professional "overlay" at prior public

hearings.

But at a work session prior to the meeting on Monday, property owner George Detweiler presented some additional ideas, the details of which were not released by the city.

The council decided to postpone the vote on the agreement to review Detweiler's proposals. Detweiler and other residents of the streets off Addison Avenue opposed the placement of the overlay because, they said, it would increase traffic and destroy the residential character of the neighborhood.

The council looked at Detweiler's suggestions on Wednesday and incorporated some "small changes" into what may be a final version of an agreement, Vollmer said.

He (Detweiler) had some good points, the mayor said. But some proposals involved actions which weren't possible because they would have meant the present council blanding the action of future councils.

Bengoechea reported previously that the agreement the council was going to consider on Monday, which he recommended for approval — contained language pertaining to Stoker, who opened an office in the residential section of Addison Avenue, and more than a dozen peo-

Minidoka survey favors kindergarten

RUPERT — An overwhelming 80 percent of Minidoka County residents who responded to a school district survey said they favored beginning a kindergarten program.

Minidoka Director of Instruction and Personnel Darwin Anderson told the school board this week that 864 survey responses had been received.

There were 777 votes in favor of starting kindergarten, 82 opposed and nine uncertain.

The survey showed most patrons were in favor of a one-way transportation program. Only 30 people voted "no," with two voting "maybe," and one person voting "only if necessary."

A similar survey in 1975 showed only 43 percent of the respondents in favor of starting a kindergarten program.

"We have quite a number of interested parents in the district," Anderson said. "Superintendent Stan Bengoechea, however, despite the strong community interest in starting a kindergarten program, it's imperative we take a look

at the financial part of it," he said. "Initial start-up costs will run about \$700,000 for furniture and supplies, and we may have to add more bus routes to accommodate the additional children. It costs about \$10,000 a year to run a class."

Bengoechea said that a 10-year plan to phase in the program would cost \$100,000, which was used to hire additional teachers to cut down class loads.

"We thought we would not have to raise it up again; that was the hope," he said. "We haven't discovered any of the 'hidden costs' in the district," he said. "We will affect their taxes."

Because of the increase in enrollment, kindergarten would be a significant part of the district's budget, he said.

Anderson said he will submit a report to the board after the survey. He said the survey was based on enrollment and attendance, would take care of teacher costs and supplies.

Stock scores largest single-day advance

NEW YORK (AP) — Stock prices roared higher Thursday, shocking off the previous day's declines and pushing several market indicators to record highs as the New York rally returned with a vengeance.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial, off about 10 points on Wednesday, soared 51.80 to 2,145.67 at the close.

It was the biggest one-day gain ever for the widely-watched market index, topping the 44.01-point jump

on Jan. 5. It also pushed the Dow past the record close of 2,104.47 set Thursday and marked the 15th record close this year.

Broader market indexes also posted gains. Overall on the New York Stock Exchange, gainers outnumbered losers by nearly 3 to 1, with 1,249 advancers, 433 decliners and 567 unchanged.

The gains followed a broad market retreat on Wednesday, which many analysts labeled a temporary "correction" due to profit-taking following the torrid rally that has pushed the Dow industrials up by about 13

"percent since Jan. 1. "All the people that did not catch this market at the beginning are kicking themselves for not getting in," said Hildegard Zagorski, an analyst for Prudential-Bache Securities Inc. "Every time the market backs off there's this pool of money that comes in."

Helping to boost prices Thursday was short covering by speculators, fearing the market was not about to stage the declines that many have been expecting for weeks.

In a short sale, an investor sells borrowed stocks in the hope of buying them back later at a lower price. Short covering occurs when the ex-

pected price drops do not occur, and the investor must buy shares to repay the borrowed stock.

Helping lead the charge upward was heavy trading. Offer computer and technology issues posted sturdy gains: Digital rose 6 1/4 to 146 1/4, Cray Research 8 1/4 to 114, and Texas Instruments 4 1/4 to 139 1/4.

Phillips Petroleum led the NYSE most active list, rising 7 1/4 to 25.3 million shares changed hands. Among active blue chips, AT&T rose 3/4 to 27 1/4, Navistar rose 1 1/2 to 49 1/2, and Philip Morris rose 1 1/2 to 82 1/4.

Magazine finds most adults are in favor of sex education

NEW YORK (AP) — A large majority of the 534 adults polled by Parents magazine say they favor sex education in public schools, the magazine reported in an issue released this week.

Two-thirds said contraceptive devices should be available through schools, with parental consent. Parents of children aged 10-17. The survey also found that 29 percent of those polled thought sex education programs should teach students that sex should be saved for marriage. Sixty-six percent felt it should be an individual choice.

"That reflects what's happening in reality," Sol Gordon, professor emeritus of child and family studies at Syracuse University said in the February issue of the magazine.

"Very few couples wait for marriage; 80 percent of women and about 95 percent of men have had premarital sex," Gordon said.

Seventy-seven percent of the respondents favored sex education in public schools.

Forty percent said such programs would reduce teenage pregnancies but not sexual activity; 17 percent thought they would reduce sexual activity and 20 percent believed they would encourage sexual activity and experimentation.

Seven percent said the programs have no effect, and 16 percent said they had no opinion.

The survey was conducted by telephone last October by Kane, Parsons & Associates.

The respondents were equally split among men and women; 69 percent were married, 11 percent separated or divorced, 8 percent widowed and 12 percent single. Seventy-eight percent of those polled had children.

The margin of error for the survey was plus or minus 4.3 percent.

Rancher poet takes verses to Gathering

HOLLISTER — Rancher Dave Chadwick said he had a "Christmas surprise" this year: an invitation to read his poetry at the Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Elko, Nev.

The private poet had shared his work with family and friends but seldom sought a larger audience. His daughter, Lynn Jones, didn't tell him that she sent two of his poems to the judging committee for the Gathering which will be held Jan. 29-31.

Chadwick got a call just before Christmas telling him he had been chosen to be one of nine poets representing Idaho at the annual event.

His feelings about family life and ranching have found their way into his poetry over the years. He isn't sure what started him writing poetry.

"Frankly, I don't know how come I'm writing poetry because I avoided literature and everything related to it when I was growing up," he said.

Chadwick was born in 1923 and his family moved to Weiser from Oregon when he was a baby.

Raised on a farm near Weiser, he broke his first horse for a neighbor at age nine and began his lifelong infatuation with ranch life.

That first job led to many more. Chadwick began riding to school on horses he was training.

"I loved the farm. When I was in grade school — it was a one-room schoolhouse — a neighbor used to take his cattle and go to the hills, and it just used to really impress me. Made school seem pretty long all the time when spring came and I thought, 'that's what I'd like to do.'"

When he was 12 he had his first job away from home. For 10 days he worked stacking hay for a neighbor at a day.

When payday came he decided to take a pair of silver mounted spurs instead of the money. Those spurs when worn on a mounted steel horn in his study.

"I've never worn 'em, but I've kept 'em all this time." He added with a shy grin, "It was a pretty foolish thing to do, to take the spurs when you even have a bride."

Chadwick's father sold the farm during World War II when his older brothers were gone and there were not enough people to do the work. Chadwick was a teen-ager then and

thought his dream of a ranch life would never come to pass.

He went to Brigham Young University on a football and track scholarship. There he met and fell in love with Jenny Hoopa, a native of Hollister. When his National Guard unit was called to active duty because of the Korean War they had to wait two years before marrying in 1951.

The Chadwicks took up the management of a ranch southwest of Hollister owned by Jenny's father. "We started with 13 cows," Chadwick said.

They eventually bought the ranch and expanded it. Now known as Deep Creek Ranch, it includes about 1,700 acres of deeded land.

They have raised 10 children on the ranch. The youngest, Rachel, is a junior at Plier High School. Two of their married daughters live on the ranch with their husbands, doing the day-to-day work of keeping the herd of polled Herefords healthy.

Wearing a dress shirt and suspenders, Chadwick sat in the dining area of the spacious four-year-old brick home on a bill overlooking the ranch. The kitchen and eating area is larger than you might expect to see at a corporate ranch with 15 hands to feed.

They built the house to accommodate the large groups that congregate at holiday time. "We had 89 people for Christmas with children and grandchildren, Grandma and sister," said Jenny.

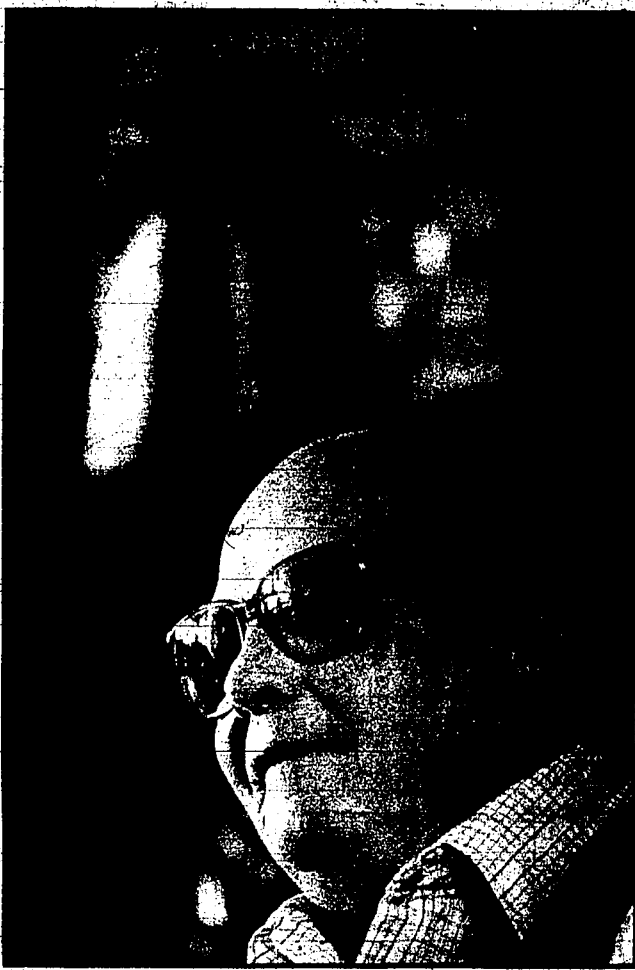

Screenwriters discuss careers at film festival

PARK CITY, Utah — It's a long, sometimes painful road between the typewriter and the screen.

In the not-so-distant past, screenwriting was not only creatively painful, but hazardous in the days of blacklisting and a senator named Joe McCarthy.

Views from the people whose ideas are conceived on paper and born on film were presented last weekend at the U.S. Film Festival in Park City during a seminar on screenwriting. The panel featured distinguished and successful writers, among them two

who were blacklisted during the 1950s and the McCarthy era.

The formerly blacklisted Ring Lardner Jr. and Walter Bernstein spoke of lists of suspected "Reds" and careers cut down in their prime.

Lardner was called to testify before Sen. Joseph McCarthy's infamous Committee on Un-American Activities and was asked the question now synonymous with the "Red scare" — "Are you now and have you ever been . . . ?"

Lardner said he and others refused to cooperate in protest of the hearings. As a result, he received a prison sentence, but never served. Instead, he served an unofficial but

 real 15-year sentence on a blacklist. It was 17 years altogether between screen credits for Lardner.

Bernstein, a television writer, said he still didn't know why he was blacklisted for eight years. But it occurred after his name appeared on a list in a pamphlet for what he suspects was his support for Spanish loyalists and an article he wrote for a Communist publication.

The writers said they remained working during the blacklisting by using different names. While writing for British television, Lardner used the name "Phillip Rush" which happened to be the name of an historian not at all pleased with being connected to television.

Bernstein not only used pseudonyms but a "front," someone who presented his work to networks. He later re-took the days of blacklisting in a movie called "The Front," starring Woody Allen.

Screenwriter Frank Pierson said he began his career during the fall of the blacklisting.

"It certainly was an era where writers were really taken seriously," he said. "It was an invidious process."

And he wondered how it could happen in a country priding itself on freedom, said Pierson, known for his work on "Dog Day Afternoon" and "Cool Hand Luke."

"Let's hope it doesn't happen again," he told the audience at the seminar.

Frank Daniel, a Czech filmmaker

and dean of the School of Cinema at the University of Southern California, related experiences similar to those of Lardner and Bernstein. But the location was Czechoslovakia.

Some of his films were "fucked away" because their content was considered unacceptable by the government.

"One film was about a clairvoyant who gets nationalized," Daniel said. "We always knew we worked with one foot in prison."

Daniel recalls a time when government men took notes during a comedy and did not laugh, while the filmmaker was out in the hall "wondering what the verdict will be."

When the subject of the seminar turned to more recent aspects of screenwriting, the panelists showed their skills for good storytelling weren't restricted to the screen as they told how they entered the business.

Ward, who wrote "The Sting," said he got his start as a screenwriter during film school.

He had a car accident with an agent, and had no insurance, but did have an idea for a film.

"All I had to give him was the script," Ward said.

While Lardner said he made the transition from journalism to scripts, Jill Dennis said he went from pipetting to screenwriting via a producer who made a film in which his girlfriend starred in his film.

The producer offered him \$100 a week to work on the script, Dennis

said. "And, like a fool I finished it in nine days."

Lardner, who wrote the movie "MASH," said at one point in his career he became an ending specialist. One of his endings had Janet Gaynor introducing herself as "Star is Born," at the end of "Star is Born."

The works of the screenwriter seem effortless in the theaters, but they said putting the words down on paper was anything but.

"To start (writing) is tremendous, and difficult to continue," Daniel said.

Bernstein added, "Writing is rewriting."

Ward said he constantly rewrites but never reads the finished script because a writer is never satisfied.

The process of writing is slow and often turns out something entirely different than what was begun.

Ward said he spent six months on a script for "The Sting," but quit because he believed the audience might not accept the con of the confidence man. So, he decided to start from scratch and wrote the movie so the audience itself was being conned.

Among the work and agony, there is joy when "a moment works," when it's real, said Tom Rickman, who wrote "Coal Miner's Daughter."

There is magic when the characters they create come to life and live.

Said Pierson, "All we have to do is tell their story."

Commentator Madden returns to scene of 10-year-old triumph

In this decade of non-dynasties, there will again be a new Super Bowl champion when Super Bowl XXI is played Sunday at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

The game caps a season that saw the demise of last year's top squads: the Chicago Bears and the New England Patriots. This year, CBS carries the game — and all the attendant hype and hoopla — with John Madden and Pat Summerall manning the mikes (4 p.m. Sunday, KMYT, KBCI, KSL).

For Madden, 50, the event will

mean a return (by tram, undoubtedly) to the site of his biggest Super Bowl triumph. Ten years ago, Madden coached the Oakland Raiders to a 24-14 victory over the Minnesota Vikings in Super Bowl XI, in front of more than 100,000 Rose Bowl fans.

The Raiders' victory laid to rest the cliché that they couldn't win the big one. Madden, the team's coach since 1969, had won division titles in six of his first seven seasons. But in five of those years, the Raiders got as far as the AFC championship game only to lose.

But 1976 was a good year not only for Jimmy Carter and Peter Frampton, but for Oakland, which compiled a 13-3 record.

At the end of the '76 season, the Raiders destroyed the Pittsburgh Steelers in the first round of the playoffs, 24-21, and then advanced to the big enclash by drowning the once-mighty Steelers, 24-7 — the same team that

had destroyed them in the past two AFC title tilts.

The Raiders' attack was engineered by quarterback Ken "The Snake" Stabler, who led AFC quarterbacks with 194 pass completions in 291 attempts and accounted for 2,707 yards. The former University of Alabama signal caller was about as cocky as his Crimson Tide predecessor Joe Namath.

"In the NFL there are 25 quarterbacks who can throw better than I can," Stabler said. "But I can make guys win. I can motivate players and they'll tell you that. It's part of my job. Winning is what we're all here for. It cures colds, heals fever blisters, what ever's wrong with you."

"I'd like to think that this is nothing more than a sandlot game and all we had to do is go out there and have some fun," he continued. "But I can't. The game is just too big. It means too much to too many

people for me to say it's just another game. It means money and job security.

But the big game turned out to be a romp for the silver-and-black. After a scoreless first quarter, the Raiders took a 18-0 lead. With 13 more points in the fourth quarter, the outcome was never in doubt.

In the locker room following the game, Madden said matter-of-factly: "We had tougher games than this in the AFC. I knew last night that we were going to win big. I usually don't feel that way before a game. But I was so sure of it that I was even saying it. Everything was perfect."

WTVJ, an affiliate of CBS, is owned by Wometco Broadcasting Co., Inc.

NBC and GE already own stations in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Cleveland, Denver and Washington.

D.C. With the addition of WTVJ, NBC-GE-owned stations will cover more than 22 percent of the national viewing audience.

FCC rules limit ownership to 25 percent of the national audience. GE acquired NBC last year when it took over NBC's parent company, RCA.

Robert S. Walsh, NBC Group Executive Vice President, said the network will continue to honor its agreement with its Miami affiliate, WSVN-TV, which expires in 1989.

Gregory expanding his horizons

Q. I noticed Dick Gregory's name associated with a new movie titled "Place of Weeping," reviewed as a powerful film about the apartheid struggle in South Africa. Did Gregory produce this picture, or does he have money invested in it? — D.N.

A. Gregory tells me that his interest in "Place of Weeping" is motivated purely by his respect and passion for its theme. By the way, Gregory's 1960s image as a stand-up comic is now much out of date; he's abandoned his artistic and business success immeasurably. Though still lecturing on the college circuit, Gregory's discourses are now largely centered on such diverse subjects as politics, drug abuse and nutrition — lectures which he hopes will enlighten his audiences. The 56-year-old Gregory, still charmingly inventive and outrageous, claims to have made a fortune with his own diet plan formula.

Q. What's become of Henry Winkler, the "Fonz" of the old "Happy Days" TV show? — B.S.

A. "I have not thought about acting since 1983," said Henry when I asked him your question. Fact is, Winkler has been making a fortune as a TV and movie producer, and is planning to become a big time director as well. He made his bow in that capacity directing Dolly Parton in her recent Christmas TV show. The ratings were good, convincing the former "Fonz" he's on the right career path.

Q. For my money, Mario Van Peebles, the young actor who portrays a live-talking Marine in the new Clint Eastwood movie, "Heartbreak Ridge," stole the picture from Eastwood. Was there any friction between the two? — B.R.

A. None whatever. Mario, who's the son of the distinguished filmmaker Melvin Van Peebles, tells me that he has enormous respect for Eastwood, who taught him a great deal regarding film technique, and who helped him immeasurably during shooting. "What can I say about Clint?" asks Mario. "When he told me they needed a song for 'Heartbreak Ridge,' I said, 'I'll write it' — and that was fine with him! He's completely supportive, very generous with his knowledge, and would spend hours with me in the editing room, showing me the ropes. He's very low key, and is great at keeping things balanced on the set."

Q. I'm told that Kenny Rogers

pursues a weird new medical treatment to lose weight. What is it? — K.L.

A. Kenny, for a number of reasons, has to be weight conscious. For one thing, he worries continually about his blood pressure. For another, it wouldn't do to come out in public as a genuine fatty. I do know that Kenny sees a Hollywood physician who practices "liposuction," a procedure that reduces fatty tissue in various parts of the body. Rogers told his friend, perennially chubby producer Allan Carr, about the procedure. Carr became a convert and went to the good doctor to "take the fat out of my neck," Kenny jokes; that he's happy as long as the fat doesn't come out of his bank account.

Q. I was surprised to read that legendary black entertainer and chanteuse Josephine Baker, who became popular during the 1920s and '30s dancing and prancing at the Folies Bergeres wearing a bunch of bananas draped around her waist, fell upon hard times years later and made ends meet by living in a maid's room. Any other famous stars who were reduced to similar indignities? — P.H.

A. Yes. During the 1970s, Hedy Lamarr dwelled for a spell in the cell-like basement maid's room of a helpful doctor friend living in a luxury Park Avenue co-op. The tiny maid's room was smaller than Hedy's studio dressing room had been; yet it represented a haven for the then down-and-out star. Since the room didn't even boast its own bathroom facilities, most nights Lamarr would take the back elevator up to her benefactor's

swank apartment to join him for dinner or to take a bath.

Q. John Schneider, the handsome actor who starred in the TV hit "The Dukes of Hazzard," has since emerged as a prolific talent — acting in the made-for-TV movie "Stagecoach," writing, directing and producing TV specials, plus becoming a red-hot rock star. Which of these creative careers does Schneider find most gratifying? — M.W.

A. Though he excels at varied avenues of self-expression, my perception is that John is a born writer and prefers that field to all others. A fully credentialed member of the Writer's Guild of America, he has already completed three screenplays and has an agreement with Warner Brothers to develop a TV series. TV movies and feature films under his own Trails End Productions banner. He hadn't first become an actor, I strongly suspect Schneider may have developed into a class-A novelist.

Q. It was truly inspiring to read that George Abbott, the famed playwright/director, is still active in varied productions even though he'll shortly be celebrating his 100th birthday. What is it like to work for this grand old man of the theater? — G.W.

A. If by this query you mean does Abbott still have all his marbles, he certainly does. Bill Daugherty, a young actor who was in the cast of a recent regional production of the musical "Damn Yankees," tells me, "Mr. Abbott is an incredibly alert

It's quite a sight — "Guiding Light's" ex-madam Sally Gleason sampling pies in a Midwest bake-off. Proof that the soap's sponsor, Proctor and Gamble, knows its market.

"Guiding Light" fans turn out in droves to see Patricia Barry, the soap madam, drumming up trade. It makes sense because the cultivated Barry is really a farm girl from Davenport, Iowa. She has never let her following forget her life on the Davenport farm. Barry may look more at home in a Fifth Avenue drawing room, but the lady can sample 24 pies and pick the winner — lemon meringue.

She's very proud of her Iowa background, and still runs the family farm from New York and Hollywood, when she's not rolling her eyes as Sally Gleason. The Gleason storyline, put on a back burner last fall until January, allowed Proctor and Gamble to send Barry on the road. The crowds responded, but the actress came away shaken by what she saw.

"The family farm is in deep trouble," she says. "I don't know how we're all going to survive at these prices. I've got a silo filled to the brim with grain, and I'm worried. We're getting paid not to grow crops, and that can't go on much longer."

Patricia Barry is lucky. She has the soap to lean on, an apartment she bought in New York on "Guiding Light" wages, and California real estate. She watches all with a sharp eye, being the skeptical Midwesterner with handsome cheekbones who wants to know where every penny is going.

"I was the hick who came to New York for a career, and married the sophisticated son of playwright Philip Barry," Patricia recalls. "I had to learn in a hurry. It wasn't easy."

Shrewdness, drive, and good looks are parlayed to daughter Miranda Barry, leaving her American Playhouse post to write "The Sarah and Gerald Murphy Story" after other versions missed the Playhouse mark.

"Miranda's decision to enter the production end of the business seemed like a wise move," Mom continues. "I was paralyzed at 35, believing my career was over. Things have changed. I'm still hanging in there. Character acting is

Anne Meara, who stars as an embattled school librarian, will appear at the conclusion of the program to alert viewers to three young adult

novels that focus on the rights of individuals in a free society, as suggested by The Library of Congress. These include: "A Matter of Principle," by Susan Beth Pfeffer; "Maudie and Me" and the "Dirty Book," by Betty Miles; and "White Mountains," by John Christopher. They were selected by the Library from a larger list of books on the subject.

"Read More About It" is a partnership between CBS and the Library, which joined together in 1979 to illustrate that books and television are complementary and that there is a lot of programming on television worth reading.

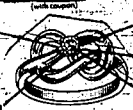

NBC reclaims top spot in ratings

NEW YORK (AP)—NBC reclaimed first place in the prime-time ratings race with its highest weekly average this season, except for three weeks last fall when World Series games upped the network's ratings.

NBC had won the first 15 weeks of the season, then lost two weeks in a row to CBS. Last week, with the network's regular prime-time schedule not subject to pre-emption for sports, NBC racked up all-time high ratings for two series, a season high for another and a season second-highest for a made-for-TV movie.

NBC won the week with a rating of 19.1 and an average share of the viewing audience of 29. CBS had a rating of 18.9 and a 24 share, and ABC had a rating of 15.9 and a 21 share.

Laura Swain, director of NBC's television network research, said the average for the week was NBC's highest since October when the World Series gave the network its highest rating of the season, 21.7.

NBC has a season-to-date, prime-time average rating of 17.9. CBS has a 16.0 and ABC has 13.9.

The ratings measure the total households with television tuned in

to the network. One rating point equals 874,000 homes. The share is the percentage of the viewing audience.

"The key thing is on Friday we didn't have our regular schedule. The previous week we had an average rating of 19.5. The following Friday, without our regular schedule, we lost almost two rating points," said Michael Eisner, CBS director of audience measurement.

The CBS lineup was pre-empted by special movies.

NBC also won the news ratings race last week. Its "Nightly News" had an average rating of 13.1, the "CBS Evening News" rated an average 13.0 and ABC's "World News Tonight" averaged 10.8.

"The Cosby Show" was the No. 1-rated prime-time program on the week.

"Family Ties" and "Cheers" which follow "Cosby" on Thursday night, were second and third respectively, with all-time high ratings—"Family Ties" with a 35.9 and "Cheers" with a 30.3.

"Miami Vice" scored its season-high rating, 31.3, and was in fifth place in the rankings.

NBC also said "ALF" had its highest rating for the season, 28.1, except for a one-time airing after "Family Ties" when it was rated higher.

The NBC movie "Blood Vows: The Story of a Mafia Wife" attracted the second-highest audience of the season for a TV movie. It was in 6th place last week with a rating of 24.8. The highest-rated TV movie, also on NBC, was "Stranded" with Lon Anderson and Perry King, getting a 24.9 back in September.

The rest of the top 10—"Murder, She Wrote," "Night Court," "60 Minutes" and "Golden Girls" (tied for 6th), "Growing Pains" and "Who's the Boss?"

ABC's "Moonlighting" was 11th. The first of Shirley MacLaine's two-part autobiographical quest for the meaning of life, "Out to a Limb" on ABC, did not fare well in the ratings. It was third in the time period and 48th among the 71 shows ranked last week, with a rating of 13.8.

"Swell Game," CBS' new entry on Thursday nights, dropped a share point and was 68th, and the network's new time-warped western "Outlaws" continued to decline on Saturday, dropping four share points each of the three weeks it has been on. It was 65th.

The lowest-rated show of the week was ABC's sacrifice, its NBC on Thursday, "Our World," which had a rating of 6.9.

The rest of the bottom 10, from the bottom, were "Dads," the movie "My Assistant Mom," "Swell Game," "Gung Ho," "Sledge Hammer!" "Spenser: For Hire" (the movie), "Sister Margaret Had the Saturday Night Ladies," "Slackjacks" and "Colbys" (tied for 62nd).

Show on teens features call-ins

Some of the most frightening statistics we face today have to do with our young people. For example, statistics reveal that one out of every four children will become a problem drinker in high school, that 34 percent of high school seniors regularly abuse drugs, and that an American teen commits suicide every ninety minutes.

"Generation At Risk," Wednesday at 8 p.m. on KAID, addresses the tragic numbers with hope, in a documentary profiling communities that once suffered some of the worst teen problems in the United States and successfully turned them around. Immediately following the special, a live program from the Idaho - Educational Public Broadcasting Service will be aired, with experts speaking from Pocatello, Boise and Moscow. Viewers will be encouraged to call during the program with specific questions and problems that will be answered by the panel. The call-in number is 1-238-2857, and collect calls will be accepted.

"Generation At Risk," hosted by First Lady Nancy Reagan and actor Sam Waterston, is a sequel to "The Chemical People," a two-part national outreach series broadcast on public television in November, 1983. "The Chemical People" brought about the establishment of more than 8,000 community task forces to deal with teen-age substance abuse.

Gripping stories from 3 wars told during upcoming POW special

LOS ANGELES — Producer Arnold Shapiro says the toughest part of making a documentary on American prisoners of war was that it was nearly overwhelmed by stories of heroism and survival in enemy hands. Shapiro picked nine men to tell the story in the two-hour documentary "P.O.W. — Americans in Enemy Hands: World War II, Korea and Vietnam." The program, narrated by Robert Wagner, will be seen across the country between now and Feb. 10.

"We began by talking to more than 100 former POWs and each had great stories to tell," said Shapiro. "We wanted to get it down to nine men. It was the toughest selection process I've ever been involved in. It's a tribute to all POWs because these nine men together are representative of all the things that happened."

Shapiro says "P.O.W." rounds out a trilogy saluting American servicemen that began with "Return to Two Jims" and "The Unknown Soldier." He won an Oscar for his 1978 documentary "Scared Straight!" and has won 12 Emmys for various documentaries.

"More than 150,000 Americans were taken prisoner in all three wars," said Shapiro. "Most people here have no idea what these men endured and what physical and emotional scars they were left with."

"If you think about it, young people's knowledge about prisoners in World War II is limited to 'Hogan's Heroes.' Their knowledge of the Korean War is non-existent or limited to 'M-A-S-H.' And for Vietnam, they have 'Rambo' to look to. This documentary is the first TV special to deal accurately and factually with the POW experience."

The nine former prisoners are Daniel Steckler, Ralph Leyenberg, Morris and David Shoss from World War II, Davy Booker and Robert Fletcher from Korea, and Everett Alvarez Jr., Nick Rowe and Richard Stratton from Vietnam.

The Shoss brothers were prisoners on opposite sides of the world. David was captured by the Germans in Europe and Morris was taken prisoner by the Japanese after his ship was torpedoed in the Pacific. Both escaped and returned home

within the day of each other. "I think the experiences of these nine men give a pretty complete picture of what our prisoners endured," he said. "We deal not only with their survival but the humor that kept them going. You wouldn't think so, but there was a lot of humor. There was also a lot of heroism. It took a tremendous amount of courage and stamina to survive."

The special examines how the prisoners were captured, their day-to-day existence, torture and brainwashing, great escapes, the waiting families at home and the homecomings.

It points out that survival often depended on who the captors were. For instance, only 1 percent died in German prison camps, but 35 percent died in Japanese camps. Shapiro said the Germans separated Jewish POWs and sent them to forced labor camps where the survival rate was very low.

"We took one former prisoner back to the camp, which was in East Germany," he said. "To say it was an emotional experience for him is an understatement. He cried. He took the crew to the spot where he was beaten and whipped and tortured."

He said the Veterans Administration hospitals have therapy groups for former World War II prisoners who still find it difficult to talk about their experiences.

Carol L. Fleisher, was producer-director-writer for the special, which she called "the most emotionally difficult project" she had ever worked on. She added it was also extremely gratifying because it "gives me great hope for the resiliency of the human spirit."

Shapiro also returned to New Jersey to interview all the youths who appeared in "Scared Straight!" for a follow-up documentary called "Scared Straight! — 10 Years Later." The original show, narrated by Peter Falk, will be re-released, followed by the new documentary narrated by Whoopi Goldberg.

He is also at work on a documentary called "Future Flight," which will create 10 flights of the future both on Earth and in space.

Another show, "Hiroshima Maidens," an hour-long drama, is being prepared for PBS. "Wonder works."

Needles CBS for history pilot

'Our World' represents 'silver lining' to network, ABC executive claims

NEW YORK—ABC News executive Av Westin needed CBS News Jan. 14 for developing a contemporary history series, calling the

project a "carbon copy" of ABC's "Our World," a contemporary history series.

He referred to CBS' earlier announcement that a pilot for a one-hour prime-time series, tentatively entitled "The Way We Were" and

anchored by Charles Kuralt, would be made this spring.

Westin also said the loss of an ABC's prime-time schedule this season showed that there was a "silver lining" in an era of heavy cutbacks at the network because of lean economic times.

It demonstrates that executives of Capital Cities, the new owners of ABC, "have come to the conclusion that prime time does not automatically go to entertainment," he told a luncheon meeting of the New York Television Academy.

Westin is executive producer of "Our World" and ABC's "20-20," both of which air on Thursday nights. The former usually is among America's lowest-rated network programs because its chief competition is NBC's popular comedies "The Cosby Show" and "Family Ties."

Industry observers, however, have noted that ABC is saving money and perhaps turning a profit with "Our World" because it is produced for \$350,000 per episode, far below the cost of an entertainment series that probably would fare just as badly against NBC.

By conventional standards, Westin said, ABC's "show is doing beautifully in the ratings." Had those standards been applied, he said, "This program would have been dead long ago."

Westin, who shared the speaker's podium with Linda Ellerbee and Ray Gandoif, co-hosts of "Our World," said the fact that their one-hour series is on the air in prime time signifies a "new era" of hope for news divisions, at least at ABC.

Ellerbee also joined in the joshing of CBS and its new prime-time news pilot, to be produced by Robert "Shad" Northshield.

(Northshield has been reassigned from the critically praised "CBS News Sunday Morning," anchored by Kuralt. The producer developed that program and has been its executive producer since its premiere in 1979.)

But she also used the opportunity to jab at her former employer, NBC, which canceled her late-hour, irreverent "NBC News Overnight" in late 1983 because of low ratings.

"She was glad to see that CBS liked "Our World," she said, dryly saying that she found that quite interesting "since I've read that NBC News is going to do a late-night (general news program)." JOYCE

Just one year later, he reprised this role in the sequel, "The Bells of St. Mary's," this time at RKO! For your information, "Welcome Stranger" was a yarn about two small-town doctors in which Crosby was re-teamed with his "Going My Way" co-star, Barry Fitzgerald.

Q. I realize that Gypsy Rose Lee appeared in many Hollywood movies. Was she the only stripper from burlesque's golden era to have had a film career? — N.S.

A. There've been others, but Gyp was the only peeler to achieve a Hollywood niche of any consequence. Blonde Lili St. Cyr turned up in "The Naked and the Dead" and "Son of Sinbad" — though her stab at Hollywood fame wasn't too successful, at least she acted in higher grade films. Fanny LaRose emoted in the B-movie "Queen of Burlesque." Ann Corio starred in such steamy schlock as "Jungle Siren," "Savage Girl" and "Swamp Woman," while Margie Hart ground out a Z-movie called "Fare of the Islands." 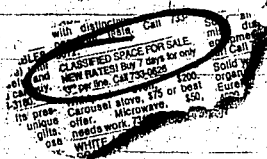
