Senate puts pay hike up to House

WASHINGTON — The Senate voted Thursday to turn down a \$12,100 pay raise scheduled to take effect next week, throwing the sticky political question to the House.
The vote was 88-6.
Unless the House also turns down the 15.6 percent increase, it will automatically take effect on Feb. 4, setting congressional pay at \$89,500.
However, an amendment proposed by Sen. Gordon J. Humphrey, R-N.H., and tacked on to the homeless emergency aid bill that cleared the Senate late Thursday would force the House to take up the question.
The Humphrey amendment, passed by voice vote, would kill the pay raises and will require the House to deal with the question when it meets to resolve differences between the homeless aid bills passed by the two chambers.
The senators who voted "no" on the resolution to reject the raise were John Breaux, D-La., Daniel Evans, R-Wash., Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., Robert Stafford, R-Vt., Weicker and Glenn.
Sen. Joseph Biden, D-Del., who originally voted "no," later changed his vote to "yes," an aide said.
Idaho's Republican senators, James McClure and Steve Symms, voted with the majority against the pay increase.
A House task force will hold hearings on the pay raises Monday and Tuesday, but the full House doesn't meet again until Tuesday and some lawmakers have indicated the Democratic House leadership has no intention of putting the issue to a vote on the floor.
"The average family in the United States earns \$27,735 per year," said Sen. Strom Thurmond, R-S.C. "Few Americans understand the need for these large increases when they have to struggle to make ends meet on salaries much lower than ours."
The pending increase comes on top of a 3 percent cost of living increase that took effect Jan. 1, making congressional paychecks \$77,400 a year.
"We can talk about how difficult it is to survive in Washington, D.C., on the present pay scale but that doesn't wash," Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., said. "Folks back home make a fraction of what we make."
Some senators said they did not deserve a pay raise when other Americans were being asked to tighten their belts.
"The bottom line is this: If you're going to lead, you have got to set the example," Sen. Phil Gramm, R-Texas, said.
"These raises in my opinion are obscene," added Sen. Quentin Burdick, D-N.D.
The Senate defeated a proposed amendment by Sen. Lowell Weicker, R-Conn., that would have set pay at a straight \$120,000 and ended the honoraria practice that allows lawmakers to substantially augment their salaries.

Captives face death threats

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Moslem kidnapers said Thursday they will kill four men seized last weekend if U.S. military forces attack Lebanon, and released a picture of an American captive with two automatic rifles held to his head.
Anglican Church envoy Terry Walte remained out of contact for the 10th day, negotiating with the captors of two Americans held since 1985, but the church said it had assurances he was safe. A Lebanese militia leader said Walte was seen "moving around freely," but would not say where.
The hostages threatened with death Thursday are three Americans and an Indian abducted Saturday at Beirut University College.
In Washington, a Reagan administration official said: "We hold the captors responsible for the safety of the hostages. We call for the immediate release of all hostages. We do not speculate on any course of action the United States may or may not take."
Defense Department sources said 11 kidnappings in Moslem west Beirut in less than two weeks prompted the United States to hold the aircraft carrier John F. Kennedy and its 11-ship battle group in the Mediterranean Sea. They called the action precautionary and one said: "The current posture of our forces is not a threat to anyone."
The USS Kitty Hawk, scheduled to relieve the Kennedy, also is in the Mediterranean.
Robert Sims, chief Pentagon spokesman, said the navy's movements would "ensure that the president has all options available to him that he might choose. He would not say what military options President Reagan was considering but dismissed speculation that Navy ships were preparing to evacuate Americans.
The United States declared Lebanon off-limits to its citizens and told the estimated 1,500 Americans still here that their passports would be revoked if they did not leave within 30 days. Many of them are of Lebanese descent or dual nationals.
A previously unknown group calling itself Islamic Jihad for the Liberation of Palestine made the death threat in a handwritten Arabic statement delivered to a Western news agency in west Beirut. Accompanying it was a photograph of hostage Robert Pothill with two automatic rifles pointed at his head.
Pothill, 53, of New York City, is a certified public accountant who is lectured at the college.
Secretary of State George P. Shultz said in Washington that all organizations involved in the 11 kidnappings have strong ties to each other and to Iran.
"II is our basic information that with whatever names may emerge they are to a substantial degree linked together," Shultz said in a satellite news conference with reporters in Europe, Israel and Japan. "And we also observe some very strong ties to Iran."

Panel tracks arms profits to island bank

WASHINGTON — The Senate Intelligence Committee has traced Iranian arms sales profits, apparently intended for Nicaragua's Contra rebels, to a secret Cayman Islands bank account, the panel's chairman said Thursday.
But Sen. David Boren said a newly written committee report has not yet determined "the ultimate resting place of this money."
The report, released Thursday night, said information regarding the "how and where" was based on sources of unknown reliability, whose statements could not be independently verified by the committee.
Boren said the report includes "no direct evidence that would state that President Reagan knew of the diversion or that he directed the diversion of funds" to the Contras.
"You cannot finally resolve that question when you don't have the testimony of North and Poindexter and others," Boren said of two departed administration figures.
Vice Adm. Oliver M. Poindexter and Lt. Col. John M. North.
Across the Capitol, sources said the House panel investigating the Iran-Contra connection had notified independent counsel Lawrence Walsh that it might have to make a decision on granting limited immunity to witnesses sooner than he wishes.
These sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said the panel notified Walsh of its findings in a letter. "The House has to make its own judgment," said one source, noting that while Walsh may take many months to complete his work, the committee's charter expires in October.
Walsh had earlier written the panel that a grant of limited immunity might create barriers to possible prosecution. Poindexter and North have refused to answer questions, citing their constitutional rights against self-incrimination.
Boren said the Senate Intelligence Committee report reveals that Reagan met a number of times with North, then a deputy on the National Security Council staff, generally with others present.
The White House denied last year that Reagan ever met alone with North over the past two years.
Of the Iran-Contra money connection, Boren said: "We take it one more step, the Cayman Islands account."

Arms profit diversion conceived as legal act

WASHINGTON — The officials and private businessmen who apparently orchestrated the plan to divert Iranian arms sale proceeds to Nicaragua's Contra rebels believed they had found a way to do so without running afoul of the law, according to a Senate report released Thursday.
One of the earliest links between the sale of arms to Iran and the effort to provide aid to the Contras came in January 1985 during talks between Lt. Col. Oliver L. North, a National Security Council staff deputy, and American Nlr, an anti-terrorism adviser to then-Israeli Prime Minister Shimon Peres, stated the Senate Intelligence Committee report.
North, under questioning by Attorney General Edwin Meese III after the plan was discovered last November, said it was Nlr who proposed using money from the arms deal to help the Contras.
At the time, North was dividing his activities between the Iran project and generating private aid for the Nicaraguan military during a period when U.S. rebuffs aid was forbidden by Congress.
The report says documents obtained by the committee indicate that at the time of the meeting between North and Nlr, the Israelis may already have been holding money from a November 1985 weapons shipment to Iran to make it available to the Contras.
North said Nlr told him then that the Israelis would take funds from a "residual account" and transfer them to an account for the Contras, the report states.
North is portrayed in the report as a zealous supporter of the Contras who saw an opportunity to combine his two missions while using Israeli intermediaries and money that did not come from U.S. sources.

'Supercollider' project may have approval

WASHINGTON — President Reagan has decided to seek construction of a \$8 billion nuclear particle "supercollider" to probe the scientific secrets of matter, Sen. Phil Gramm said Thursday, but the White House denied the decision on funding for a supercollider.
"Have learned the president has made a decision to proceed with the superconducting supercollider project which will make America No. 1 in the world in high-energy physics," Gramm, R-Texas, said in a statement which came after Reagan and the Domestic Policy Council heard a plea from Energy Secretary John S. Herrington to back the supercollider.
Doug Elmets, chief spokesman for the energy secretary, said he could not confirm Gramm's statement. But Albert R. Brashear, a White House spokesman, said Reagan had not made a decision on funding for a supercollider.
"Gramm retained Thursday night that his information was accurate and discounted Brashear's statement," by saying, "Maybe they're just not ready to make an official announcement."
The nation's physicists have been seeking such a machine for several years to explore the next layer of unanswered questions in their quest for explanations of the physical world. Proponents say the machine is essential if the United States hopes to maintain the lead in physics research.
The supercollider, resembling an oval tunnel with a circumference of about 32 miles, would be located about 20 feet underground.
In the past, the Office of Management and Budget has questioned the large expenditure that would be necessary to build the machine.

Boise chamber latest to endorse investment credit repeal

BOISE — The key element in Gov. Cecil Andrus' strategy to underwrite an ambitious 1988 state budget — repeal of the investment tax credit — picked up another ally Thursday, with an endorsement by the Boise Area Chamber of Commerce.
"I am sure their decision was not an easy one, but it does indicate a positive, progressive attitude about the future of Idaho," the Democratic chief executive said. "The Boise chamber has shown a willingness to make an investment in the future of Idaho."
The chamber, the state's largest, was the second to join forces with the governor this week on the issue of repealing the tax break. Andrus needs that additional revenue to finance the \$662.6 million budget blueprint that inflicts millions of new dollars into economic development and education.
"It is clear that corporations who benefit most from the credit are major importers of jobs and dollars into the Idaho economy and provide a significant share of the present employment base," the chamber said in a statement.
"However, the Chamber Board believes that a healthy education system is necessary for the well being of Idaho and its industry and serves as a greater incentive to our state's marketability to new employer prospects," the statement said.
On Monday, the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce also endorsed repeal of the credit, and a day later the governor took his campaign for repeal outside the Capitol for the first time to seek support from the statewide association of chambers of commerce in what aides believe is a building momentum for his position.
Repeal has become the key issue in whether the governor will be able to win approval of the general spending blueprint he outlined two weeks ago. It calls for \$2.2 million for economic development over the next 17 months and more than \$37 million to upgrade the flagging public and higher education networks.
Despite state Tax Commission figures showing only a handful of Idaho businesses have used the credit since its 1985 inception, a large number of lawmakers initially indicated opposition to repeal, contending it would signal the world that Idaho is not concerned about economic expansion.

Expanded local-option tax back again

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Expanding local-option taxing authority for Idaho's cities and counties, a perennial issue for the Idaho Legislature, is on the agenda again.

At the urging of a Pocatello lawmaker to give local government the ability to use "pay-as-you-go" financing for major projects, the House Revenue and Taxation Committee on Thursday voted preliminary approval for the latest in a long line of local-option taxing bills.

Cities and counties can levy only taxes authorized by the Legislature. With restrictions on property taxes since enactment of the One Tier Cent Initiative in 1978, Rep. L. Ed Brown, R-Pocatello, said local government has been squeezed for revenue.

"They are in desperate need of revenue, but they can't load on any



more property tax," Brown said. The Legislature has debated the issue for years, but has approved no major new taxing authority of statewide application.

Brown, who in his first two session terms unsuccessfully to get some sort of local-option bill through, suggested a new approach this year.

His legislation allows cities or counties to impose a local-option sales tax, up to 1 percent, upon ap-

proval by 55 percent of the voters. The tax is to be for a specified period, such as four years, and is to be for a specified purpose.

Brown's bill also allows counties to impose a surcharge on state income taxes, up to 20 percent of the state tax paid. He said if a person had a state tax bill of \$1,000, a 10 percent surcharge would raise \$100.

As it is now, Brown said, cities and counties have no place to turn for more revenue.

"We already have a local option tax, it's the property tax," he said. The proposal says income taxes would be imposed based on the residential address of income tax filers.

As an example, Brown said Nez Perce County needs a new jail, but bond issues have failed. He said a 20 percent surcharge on income taxes

would raise \$1.8 million per year in that county, meaning a new jail could be paid for in about four years.

A 1 percent local-option income tax would generate \$2.1 million per year, based on Tax Commission estimates, he said.

Among the larger counties, Brown said Ada could raise \$11.5 million per year with a 20 percent surcharge and \$11.7 million per year with a local option sales tax.

Bannock County could raise \$3.5 million per year with an income tax surcharge and \$2.67 million with a local sales tax.

Noh offers measure to aid bus travelers

BOISE — Buses dumping passengers off in the middle of the night where there are no safe places to sit or stand prompted the introduction of a bill.

Sen. Laird R-Kimberly, presented a bill in the Senate, Transportation Committee, on Thursday to force bus companies to provide facilities for passengers as a condition of doing business.

"What we face is a serious problem in the transportation business," Noh said.

Because of the deregulation of the transportation industry, bus lines are allowed to close their offices at 6 p.m. In rural communities where the bus terminal may be a drug store, it means there are no facilities, not even shelters, for passengers to wait, he said.

Noh said he picked up a sheepherder at 2 a.m. last summer, and a woman with a 3-year-old child had to wait outside with no shelter.

"If it had been raining, there wasn't even an awning for her to get under," Noh said.

Noh said he contacted the

Public Utilities Commission, but its power is now limited in forcing change.

He said he also contacted bus lines, such as Greyhound. He said the company was sympathetic, but did not offer to change practices.

Senators questioned whether the measure, if approved by the Legislature, would not force bus lines to discontinue service to small towns. Service already has been affected.

He said that was a possibility.

Backing Noh's bill is Kimberly resident Mildred Howard, state president of the Senior Citizens Coalition.

Howard, during a telephone interview on Thursday, cited several examples of problems caused by people left in the dark. She also spoke from personal experience of being stranded at the state on a bus last summer.

She said it was an issue of health and safety, not just convenience.

"I think the trauma of being dumped off in the middle of the night with the possibility of getting knocked in the head is much more serious than not going," Howard said.

Care bill draws attack

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Eagle Family Forum says that special interest groups promoting "dogooder" legislation to establish a "costly, intruding, bungling bureaucracy" are the only ones pushing for mandatory day-care licensing.

"The smoke screen clouding the issue of child abuse and the necessity of day-care licensing is so thin, that anyone who has studied the facts should be able to see right through it," said Susan Hill, director of the Idaho Eagle Family Forum.

The group presented ballots said they represented a survey of the general public that showed overwhelming opposition.

However, a survey conducted by Marcel Consulting and Research for the Idaho Child Care Coalition showed that 87 percent of Idahoans

favor uniform, mandatory day-care licensing.

Mrs. Hill contended day-care licensing is unnecessary and would full parents into believing their children are in a secure environment.

"We need to remember that under our system, the obligation and responsibility for our young ones does not rest with the state, but squarely upon the shoulders of parents," she said. "Government has no right to intrude into those sacred areas."

But James Rand, vice president and director of Human Resources for Moore Financial Group and a member of the Child Care Coalition, said day-care licensing wouldn't alleviate parents of the responsibility to select the day-care center best for their child's own needs.

Senate votes PUC pay hike

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — A significant increase in the salaries for members of the Idaho Public Utilities Commission has won overwhelming approval from the state Senate despite attempts by critics to turn the bill into a referendum on state spending.

On a 20-1 vote Thursday, the Senate sent the measure to the House for final consideration. The bill would increase the current salary of \$26,500, the fourth lowest in the nation, to \$30,000 a year.

"The fact that our salaries don't rate with other states is immaterial," Sen. Phil Batt, R-Wilder, said, but, "This very important position needs to be paid in that range."

The national average salary for state utility regulators is just over \$55,000 a year and regionally the average is \$54,000.

Legislative log

James Hawkins, director of the Department of Commerce, introduced in House

HB85 (Transportation and Defense) — Recodification of Title 49, Motor Vehicle Laws of Idaho.

HB86 (Transportation and Defense) — Allows owners of motor vehicles 30 years or older to display as correct plates license plates from the year of the manufacturing of that vehicle.

HB87 (Transportation and Defense) — Develops interstate agreement on the transportation of radioactive material.

HB88 (Resources and Conservation) — Declares it shall be a misdemeanor for any person to intentionally interfere with the lawful taking of wildlife or lawful predator control.

HB89 (Local Government) — Outlines new procedures for issuance of civil or administrative warrants for the state of Idaho and its political subdivisions.

HB90 (Local Government) — Gives counties authority to require agreements with their boundaries when they develop new solid waste disposal facilities.

HB91 (Local Government) — Increasing certain fees for county recorder by \$1.

HB92 (Health and Welfare) — New definitions on practice of psychology to reflect current field of practice.

HB93 (Revenue and Taxation) — Provides local-option taxing authority to impose income tax surcharge up to 20 percent or sales tax up to 1 percent.

HB94 (Health and Welfare) — Requires one year domicile residency for licensure.

HB95 (Education) — Establishes that appointments for vacancies on school district boards of trustees must be made within 90 days of the declaration of vacancy.

Introduced in Senate

SB102A (Resources and Environment) — Repeals section of Idaho Code dealing

with cooperative sustained yield districts.

SB102B (Resources and Environment) — Allows state Land Board to sell subdivisions of state lands of five acres or less on installment.

SB104C (State Affairs) — Provides that a political treasurer shall not accept contributions of more than \$20 from a political committee not domiciled in Idaho and not otherwise required to report under state campaign disclosure law, unless the contribution is accompanied by a written statement setting forth name and address of persons who contributed.

SB104D (State Affairs) — Provides that division administrators of Department of Employment shall be exempted from state class employment system.

SB104E (Judiciary and Rules) — Clarifies authority of an Idaho corporation to advance litigation expenses to directors, officers, employees or agents.

Reagan primed to veto clean water bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan told congressional leaders Thursday in a meeting in which Democrats were described as "giving the president the business on the budget," that he will veto an \$18-billion clean water bill.

Senate Minority Leader Bob Dole of Kansas quoted Reagan as saying "right up front" that he was going to veto the clean water bill, which the GOP leader described as a "budget buster." White House spokesman Larry Speakes had said Reagan's aides were advising a veto, but the president had not announced his intention.

House Majority Leader Thomas S. Foley, D-Wash., said White House officials had "signaled" that the president would veto the bill on Friday. Speakes, however, said no decision had been made on when Reagan would act. He has until Monday.

The measure calls for \$18 billion for sewage treatment facilities and \$2 billion for waterway cleanup over an eight-year period. It is virtually identical to a bill Congress passed in November, which the president killed by a pocket veto after the lawmakers had adopted it by a vote of 406-6 and the Senate by a

vote of 93-6. It takes two-thirds of both houses to override.

Speaker of the House James C. Wright, D-Texas, said a veto override vote would be scheduled in the House on Tuesday and he believes supporters will have the necessary votes to override.

Dole said Reagan commented during the meeting that he realized his veto might be overridden. Dole also said he believed it probably would be.

Senate Democratic leader Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia offered an even stronger prediction, saying, "I'm confident" that the veto will be

overridden.

Byrd defended the bill, saying it "is not a budget buster by any stretch of the imagination." He said it calls for less money than was being spent to fight water pollution when Reagan came to office.

The measure would re-authorize and strengthen the Clean Water Act of 1972, one of the nation's most successful environmental programs.

The administration is known to feel that the act provides too much aid to states for building more of the wastewater and sewage treatment plants that have been credited with cleaning up the nation's waterways.

His comments ended a year of almost complete silence from relatives of the Concord, N.H. schoolteacher, who was killed along with six fellow astronauts when the shuttle Challenger blew up shortly after liftoff Jan. 28, 1986.

Corrigan, who made similar comments Wednesday to a local newspaper after a memorial service for his sister, said he believes his parents share some of his feelings. They have declined to comment on the accident that killed their daughter.

He said the program did boost the morale of teachers and improve the way the public viewed them, but he said he still believed the space agency took advantage of his sister.

"These teachers, these journalists, I think it's really using them for the publicity in a negative way," said Corrigan, 35, of Framingham.

Corrigan said he thought perhaps ordinary people could be sent into space sometime in the distant future, if NASA deals with the many safety issues that came to light after the explosion and if the space program's focus turned more toward discovery and away from commercial and military projects, "like Star Wars."

But Corrigan, who works with computers used by the administrative staff at Framingham State College, where his sister went to school, added: "I don't think they should go ahead and do anything else for the moment, if ever."

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration has put the space program on hold and has said no ordinary citizen would be on any of the next five shuttle flights and perhaps not on any of the first 20, said Edward Campion, a spokesman in Washington.

AIDS epidemic will dwarf disasters like Black Plague, Bowen declares

WASHINGTON (AP) — A worldwide AIDS epidemic will become so serious it will dwarf such earlier medical disasters as the Black Plague, smallpox and typhoid, the nation's health chief said Thursday.

"You haven't heard or read anything yet," Health and Human Services Secretary Otis R. Bowen told a National Press Club audience.

"If we can't make progress, we face the dreadful prospect of a worldwide death toll in the tens of millions a decade from now," he said.

Listing other diseases that have killed millions of people over the years, Bowen said AIDS "will make these other ones pale by comparison."

He said he is confident a vaccine will be found, but is equally sure it

will not be in time to head off an epidemic of a scope that most people have not yet grasped.

Noting that there is no known cure, Bowen said 50 million to 100 million people worldwide could have the AIDS virus in the next two decades and that at least 270,000 actual cases are expected in the United States alone in five years — with more than 10 percent of the new cases by then being among heterosexuals.

Between 1 million and 1.5 million Americans are now believed to be carrying the virus that makes them susceptible to developing the disease.

"No one really knows how many, since AIDS is spread by people free of symptoms and we don't yet have a comprehensive national program to provide blood tests that identify

AIDS carriers," said Bowen.

He observed that researchers do not know the incubation period but have established that "a carrier can spread it to others and not know it for 10 years or so."

"So remember when a person has sex, they're not just having it with that partner, they're having it with everybody that partner had it with for the past 10 years," said Bowen.

Educating the public about how to keep from getting AIDS remains the most potent weapon against its spread, said Bowen.

FAA endorses drug test plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — The chief of the Federal Aviation Administration Thursday endorsed the government's new program of drug testing for air traffic controllers and other transportation workers.

"The FAA is nothing more than a diagonal slice of the United States ..."

Donald D. Engen, the FAA administrator, told members of the Senate aviation subcommittee. "I'm sorry to say to you that I'm sure I'll find (in the FAA) people this year with a drug problem, (but) ... I don't think it's rampant."

Transportation Secretary Elizabeth H. Dole announced the program last week, saying it would include testing for workers whose jobs were critical for safety.

Meanwhile, the chairman of a House panel on aviation said Mrs. Dole's directive appears to be at odds with the Federal Aviation Administration's approach to the problem of drug and alcohol abuse.

Rep. Norman Y. Mineta, D-Calif., released a letter to Mrs. Dole calling on her to provide a clarification of the department's position.

Support pledged

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State George P. Shultz promised continued U.S. support Thursday for Mexico's efforts to restore economic growth and said he was encouraged that the country is no longer plagued with the problem of capital flight.

Shultz praised the Mexican government's efforts to overcome the setbacks to the country's economy, including the sharp drop in oil prices.

U.S., Common Market avert trade war

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — The United States and the European Common Market reached an eleventh hour settlement of a grain-sales dispute Thursday, averting a politically embarrassing trade war, officials said.

The accord was reached less than 24 hours before punitive U.S. import duties on a variety of European products were to take effect. The European Economic Community, as the Common Market also is known, had pledged to answer the American retaliation by slapping new charges on some U.S. products.

The dispute began when Spain was required to raise tariffs on U.S. corn and sorghum when it joined the Common Market last year. The U.S. government demanded \$400 million in compensation for lost grain sales, but the Europeans resisted, leading

the Reagan administration to order the retaliatory duties.

Duties of up to 200 percent would have been imposed on British wool, French cognac and some white wines, Danish canned ham, Belgian endives and carrots, Spanish and Greek olives and various types of European cheese.

U.S. Customs agents had been told to begin collecting the retaliatory tariffs beginning at 10:01 p.m. MST Thursday. The EEC had threatened to strike back against the U.S. duties with stiff import duties on American corn gluten feed and certain varieties of rice.

Representatives of the 12 EEC governments met in Brussels to hear details of the agreement and decide whether to formally approve it. Sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said that while some

members were not happy with the deal, final approval was likely.

However, trade trouble loomed on another front Thursday. Sources in Washington said the Reagan administration is considering retaliatory action to protest European commercial aircraft subsidies.

In Brussels, Willy de Clercq, the EEC's chief negotiator, told reporters he was satisfied with the accord on grain sales, which he called an "honorable compromise."

U.S. Trade Representative Clayton Yeutter expressed satisfac-

tion with the accord, but U.S. farm groups said the compromise does not go far enough because part of the compensation will be in the form of reduced tariffs on non-agricultural products.

De Clercq said at a news conference he was dismayed that a dispute between two of the world's biggest economic powers had come to the verge of a trade war.

"I'm not proud when I have to discuss like this with a major trading partner," he said.

Aquino orders rebels punished

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — President Corason Aquino on Thursday ordered the prosecution of soldiers and civilians who took part in an attempted coup and said the "gravity of the crime" was not lessened by their peaceful surrender.

The government also said it thwarted an attempt by former President Ferdinand E. Marcos to return to the Philippines from his exile in Hawaii.

One Cabinet minister linked Marcos to the coup plot.

"While we continue to cherish the virtue of compassion, we shall have justice in this case for we must have respect for the law," Mrs. Aquino said a few hours after about 250 rebellious troops and civilians surrendered at a downtown television station.

The mutineers were the last holdouts from about 500 rightist soldiers who tried to take over key communications and military installations around Manila on Tuesday. It was the most serious challenge to Mrs. Aquino's government since she took power last February.

"The gravity of the offense is not lightened and the damage inflicted on persons and property is not diminished by the

perpetrators' change of heart," Mrs. Aquino said in a speech at the installation of a university president.

She said she had ordered Defense Minister Rafael Nieto to begin court-martial proceedings against the soldiers and instructed Justice Minister Neptali Gonzales to charge the civilians with rebellion before the civil courts.

Vice President Salvador Laurel said Marcos planned to board a chartered Boeing 707 at Honolulu Airport Thursday to return to the country he was forced to flee 11 months ago after civilian-military uprising.

Government spokesman Godoro Benigno said the plan was blocked by the Philippine consul general in Honolulu, Tomas Gomez III. Benigno said the government received reports that Marcos and his wife Imelda were preparing to fly back to the Philippines in a special plane.

In Honolulu, an angry Marcos told reporters he felt like a prisoner because two State Department officials, Carl Taylor and Edward J. McGuire, visited him at his home and told him not to leave Hawaii.

Iran ignores appeal to end war on Iraq

KUWAIT (AP) — Iran has ignored appeals from a summit of other Muslim nations to end the long war with Iraq, repeating its vow that the carnage will continue until Iraqi President Saddam Hussein is overthrown.

Islamic leaders from the Middle East, Africa and Asia told the summit in Kuwait by turns that the escalating Iran-Iraq war is out of control. They warned of superpower intervention if it spreads through the Persian Gulf, one of the world's main sources of oil.

Said Rajala-Kharasani, Iran's ambassador to the United Nations, declared Tuesday that Tehran's fundamentalist Shiite Moslem leaders will not negotiate until Hussein has been driven from office.

He dismissed the summit of the Organization of Islamic Conference, which represents 850 million Muslims in 45 countries, as "self-defeating" and a "failure."

Iran did not attend the summit because it says Kuwait is supporting Iraq in the war. Kuwait is Arab, like Iraq, and Iran is Persian.

King Hussein of Jordan, who supports Iraq in the war, told the summit: "Things have reached a critical stage that brooks no hesitation or delay."

He urged an immediate cease-fire as a prelude to peace talks, and declared: "There is no doubt that a solution of the conflict between Iraq and Iran is the key to the solution of other conflicts in the Islamic world."

He was arrested while driving through a working-class section of the capital.

The Dupont Plaza blaze, the second-worst hotel fire in U.S. history, killed 96 people and injured 140. The commonwealth charged Rivera Lopez, a bartender at the hotel for the past two years, with 96 counts of murder and with arson, the same charges facing the other two suspects.

Opposition surfaces to pumping extension

BURLEY — Most of the farmers and hunters attending a public hearing here Wednesday night opposed the proposed extension of the Northside Pumping Division extension as unnecessary.

The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation is seeking approval from Congress for the project, which would irrigate some 9,400 acres and bring improvements to 5,590 acres of wildlife habitat north of Burley and Rupert, bureau officials said.

Some of the habitat, principally for ring-necked pheasants, has been eliminated due to changes in farming practices.

The project is supported by the A&B Irrigation District, which operates the existing northside project, said Norman Schoon, A&B board member.

Charles Baran, an aide to U.S. Rep. Richard Stallons, told The Times-News

after the meeting that "We're reassessing our position." The \$15,490,000 project would require the support of the Idaho congressional delegation and the approval of Congress.

About 75 people attended the hearing at the Burley Inn on Wednesday. It was supposed to be on the environmental impact of the project but instead centered on its merits.

Most of the speakers opposed the plan. The first speaker, Arval Peterson, who farms near Paul, set the tone for the meeting when he said, "It's uncalled for now; the farm economy is such that no one would buy those lands."

Part of the plan involves a wildlife agreement between A&B and the state Fish & Game Department to set aside sagebrush areas for escape and winter cover for pheasants.

"Fish & Game is trying to impose something on the farmer which is uncalled

for," he said. Several other speakers echoed this sentiment.

Peterson said he would feel better about the overall proposal if he could see something in writing saying there would be no assessment on present irrigators in the development of those lands.

Daniel Stapelman, a board member of the Minidoka Irrigation District, said the board opposed the project because of surplus crops in the world and low farm prices. He said it would be folly to add another 9,000 acres to benefit F&G.

Stapelman said the board was concerned about runoff and drainage from the acreage. He said the acquisition costs of \$1,600 per acre were high and to purchase at this price "would be economic suicide even for the well-established farmer."

He said the land should revert to the U.S. Bureau of Land Management and the principles of supply and demand should determine its use.

According to the Bureau of Reclamation, 9,400 acres of irrigable drylands would be sold to A&B Irrigation District landowners. The lands would be sold at appraised value through a drawing, in tracts of 100-160 acres each. New project facilities would provide water to these tracts and F&G would help landowners develop wildlife habitat plans.

"The more I study this plan, the more questions arise regarding its benefits," said Lloyd Smith of the Magic Rio Turkey Chapter, a hunters' group.

He said there was nothing in the plan for good structural cover. "This plan is far too loose in wildlife benefits," Smith said.

He said he disagreed with the Bureau of Reclamation that if the use of the land was not authorized, it would be withdrawn by the BLM.

Lyle Barton, a Minidoka County commissioner, urged the audience: "Let's not quit on this now." He said it was apparent the farmland wouldn't be needed now but would

be at some time in the future. "If it isn't, then there won't be any choice. A&B will suffer."

Other parts of the plan include Minidoka County receiving 210 acres for developing a public golf course. Rupert would receive a 600-acre site it leases as a disposal area for wastewater effluent. A&B would receive a 30-acre site north of Paul for development of an operation and maintenance building.

A&B now uses three sites for this purpose.

James said the final environmental impact statement will be issued this spring; in the meantime, the public will have until Feb. 28 to make written comments to be included in the hearing record. It will be available at area public libraries.

"If the proposed plan is found to be acceptable, the report/environmental statement will be used as a basis for seeking authorization for the project from Congress," the Bureau of Reclamation said.

Deadline set for removal of toxic materials

TWIN FALLS — The state has set a deadline for a Cassia County couple to make arrangements for the removal of hazardous materials which were dumped on their property at least 4 months ago.

Mr. and Mrs. Richard Tilley have 30 days from receipt of a Jan. 23 letter to complete disposal arrangements, said Mark Tori, a manager in the hazardous materials bureau of the state Division of Environment.

The state learned of the dumping more than 3 months ago.

Mrs. Tilley told The Times-News on Dec. 29 that she thought it was the state's responsibility to remove the pesticide and herbicide containers on their property, which sits on the Snake River. The dumping occurred behind the Del Monte vegetable packing plant, west of Burley.

Mrs. Tilley could not be reached for comment Wednesday.

Among the containers were herbicides: Roundup, Banvel, Furadan and Temik; Aldicarb, a pesticide; and Ro-Neet, a herbicide used on sugar beets.

Laboratory tests showed none of the pesticides seeped into the soil after cleanup at the site. The hazardous waste was put in drums and moved to a different location on the property — but it remains there, said Mike McMasters, source control officer with the DOE.

There was also household garbage, a battery, construction debris, feed grain and paper at the site, which, McMasters said, has been removed.

There are nine landfills in Cassia County where solid wastes can be disposed of legally. Illegal dumping can bring fines of \$1,000 to \$10,000, said Greg Trueblood, assistant attorney general.

Hazardous materials can be disposed of only at government-approved sites and a number must first be obtained from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The only hazardous waste dump in Idaho is Envirosafe, near Grandview. There are a number of others in surrounding states.

Inmate boarding costs take plunge

TWIN FALLS — The bill for transporting and boarding Twin Falls County inmates in other jails during December dropped significantly compared to the previous month.

The county spent \$6,724 to transport inmates and hold them in other Magic Valley jails during December, Sheriff Jim Munn reported. That amount compares to \$22,605 — a record high — spent during November.

During December, an average of 10 inmates were boarded in out-of-county jails each day, compared with 29 inmates held during November, Munn reported.

The overall daily population of the Twin Falls County jail averaged 27 inmates last month, compared to 57 inmates held during November, he said.

Munn had no explanation for the decrease in population during said. Prior to the contract, Twin Falls County would place its juveniles in the Jerome center in Ada County. Last year, for example, the daily population during December averaged 47 inmates.

On Wednesday Twin Falls County had three juveniles in the Jerome center.

CSI president urges state to return to 50% funding

BOISE — The College of Southern Idaho has taxed to the "max," and now it's time for the state to come through, CSI officials said on Thursday.

"We've raised our local property tax 82 percent in the last 6 years, and we've raised tuition and fees 180 percent during the same time," President Jerry Meyerhoeffer told lawmakers. "We're at the max."

Meyerhoeffer appeared before the Joint Finance and Appropriations Committee to present CSI's budget needs.

Meyerhoeffer would like the state to return to a 50 percent of CSI's costs, giving the college an additional \$1 million over the next 3 years.

"We're not asking for it this year," he told lawmakers. "We're trying to build the momentum to begin it next year and carry it over a 3-year period."

During the 1970s CSI received close to 60 percent of its money from the state. But, beginning in 1981, state funding decreased to the point that in 1987 CSI received just 10 percent of its state money.

Meyerhoeffer called the request an investment.

"If we were a business, we'd be a good investment, said

because we have a lot of acceptance from consumers," Meyerhoeffer said.

As proof, Meyerhoeffer said the state's two junior colleges "have enrolled 25 percent of all the state's incoming undergraduate students."

For fiscal 1988, CSI is requesting about \$2.6 million in state aid. Overall, CSI is requesting \$7.5 million, which includes state, federal and dedicated money.

Together, CSI and North Idaho College in Coeur d'Alene, the state's two community colleges, are asking for \$16.1 million in state funding. The governor's budget calls for \$15.9 million.

But Gov. Cecil Andrus also is seeking an additional \$3 million to fund a 5-percent pay hike for all college and university employees, which is separate from CSI's budget request.

Rep. Mack Nelbauer, R-Paul, a JFAC member, said he does not think CSI's request for \$800,000 to \$1 million will succeed.

"Unless the economy comes on real strong, I don't think it's going to happen," Nelbauer said.

He added that among lawmakers there's more support for the state's four universities.

"People are sympathetic, but it's not as strong for community colleges as for higher education," Nelbauer

Community colleges, vo-ed official plea for more support

BOISE (AP) — The state's two community college that their other sources of support from student fees presidents and the new Idaho Vocational Education administrator have added their voices to the chorus of Idaho educators pressing lawmakers to make good on the campaign pledge for increased state education support.

College of Southern Idaho President Gerald Meyerhoeffer and Robert Bennett, the new president of North Idaho College in Coeur d'Alene, underscored on Thursday the significant contributions to local economic development their schools make through nonacademic courses in the technological and vocational areas — programs that help improve job prospects for Idahoans.

And William Ultery, the new state Vocational Education administrator, emphasized the importance of a strong vocational education program in any attempt to revitalize Idaho's flagging economy.

"Vocational education is basic to the infrastructure of the state economy and the stability of its local communities," Ultery said.

Both Bennett and Meyerhoeffer also called on the budget panel to consider boosting the state support for their operations from one-third of the total community college budget of nearly \$16 million to one-half, arguing

that their other sources of support from student fees and local property taxes have been pushed to the limit.

Gov. Cecil Andrus, while not recommending the entire budget requests for either the 2-year schools or vocational education, has proposed significant increases in state financing for both, calling them "an important element of our educational system" and a "vital link in developing economic growth."

"We've got a product that the average man believes in," Bennett told the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee. "It's those citizens out there who will make a difference in the economy if they have a second chance."

Citing the structural change under way in Idaho's economy that has seen the permanent disappearance of many jobs in traditional resource-based industries, Bennett and Ultery said that community colleges and vocational programs offered through them and other institutions will play a key role in restraining those ousted workers.

"Give us that challenge in Idaho. We can do it," Bennett said, but "You must invest in us. You must have faith in us."

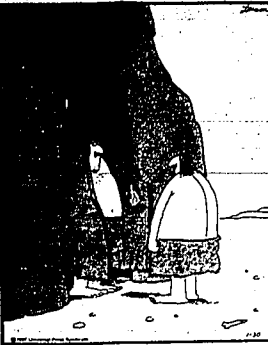

Ex-rocker warns of satanic music



Eric Barger says that demons are real and that rock music opens young people up to occult ideas

JEROME — Eric Barger, a 35-year-old former rock musician and record producer, has been cautioning a full house at the Faith Chapel Assembly of God Church in Jerome against occult involvement during a five evening seminar which ends tonight.

The dark-haired, mustachioed baby-boomer, who is now a licensed minister with United Evangelical churches, is telling audiences that participation in superstitious rites, magic arts, magical arts or satanism can lead to demonic oppression or possession.

"Occult" shouldn't be a word that scares us," says Barger. "We, as Christians, had better learn to answer to witchcraft. There are people all around us that need help."

Barger said that 65 million people in the United States are involved in the occult or witchcraft, and "not everyone knows they're involved." According to a Gallup poll, 59 percent of American teen-agers between the ages of 13 and 19 believe in ESP, he said. The poll also found 55 percent believe in astrology, 28 percent in clairvoyance, 22 percent in witchcraft and 20 percent in ghosts.

"ABC's 20/20 did a report and said that satanism is alive and well in all 50 states. If they're saying it, we'd better not deny that," said Barger.

The Washington resident, who now heads Eric Barger Ministries in Bellingham, Wash., started playing rock music at the age of 11 and "that's all I did 'til I was 29."

It was while Barger was managing a recording studio that he became a Christian. He and his wife, Melanie, were having marital problems.

"We were both of us ready to kill the other, so to speak. We were both ready to get divorced. One night she threw a telephone book at me and I told her I was going to call a Christian marriage counselor. I don't know why I said 'Christian'; neither of us do," said Barger.

The next day, he opened the phone book, closed his eyes and put his finger down on a name.

"We saw the guy over 50 times," he said. Barger's wife became a Christian, and, after calling her a fanatic for 8 months, she did Barger. He spent two more years at the recording studio before calling it quits.

Barger spent some time as a telephone counselor for the Seattle 700 Club center, then became a youth pastor at Bellevue Presbyterian Church in Bellevue.

He tells of the time he saw a 17-year-old girl pick up a wall by the throat and pin him against a pastor. It took three men to restrain her, he said. They later learned she had sacrificed a baby during a satanic rite in Canada.

He tells of the time he saw a man in a bar in his hometown in Parkersburg, W.Va., eat a whiskey glass, an ashtray and a Budweiser bottle. There were demonic forces at work there, he said.

"Satan wants to take you down to another reality," said Barger. "He wants to degrade you as a human."

Barger said that some heavy metal groups like W.A.S.P., whose stage gimmicks include drinking blood from a skull and throwing raw meat at audiences, are also demonically inspired.

"The ASI stands for 'We Are Sexual Pervers' by their own admission," he said.

"And you've got Alice Cooper out there who says he's possessed by a spirit that came to him when he was at a seance playing with a Ouija board. He says he can't help it, he's possessed. He told the secretary in a record company office with nobody else around — I mean there were no cameras or anything — 'I can't help it. They're saying it, we'd better not deny that. I worked for him. I'd be famous.'"

Barger noted that the groups Motley Crue and Rush use a five-pointed star inside a circle, the "second highest worship symbol of Satan," on their record jackets.

Another group, stage sets and costumes. A recording group, Motorhead, put out a record called "Kill by Death." Promotion for the record showed one band member hanging on a cross with the rest of the band dressed as Roman soldiers.

"In the occult, God mockery is every bit as important as the worship of Satan," Barger said.

He said that the group Venom, on the back of a record called "At War With Satan," had the words printed, "We stand for all that's evil/The death of you, God, we demand/We spit at the virgin you worship/We sit at the lord Satan's left hand."

"There's all kinds of themes going on: sex, drugs, the occult, open satanic worship, anti-God proclamations, alcohol, you name it. But the thing that is really affecting the kids today is the fatalistic idea. They're getting it through the music, they're getting it through TV. Everything is surreal, supernatural and you see a lot of that." BARGER on Page D4

Winterfest Ball honors Sun Valley's legendary bandleader, Hap Miller, and kicks off scholarship

SUN VALLEY — The late Hap Miller, the long-time Sun Valley bandleader who became one of the resort's legendary characters, will be honored at the first Winterfest Ball, tomorrow night in Sun Valley's Elmsight Room.

The ball is scheduled to begin at 8:30 p.m. Tickets, which sell for \$12.50, can be purchased at the door, with all proceeds to go toward funding the first Hap Miller Memorial Music Scholarship. Music will be provided for the ball by the GIB Hochstrasser Big Swing Band, from Boise.

Donations are also being accepted for the scholarship fund, developed by a group of Miller's friends and co-workers, who expressed the hope that enough money could be raised to guarantee the scholarship would be awarded every year from now on.

"We're looking for private contributions in the \$5- to \$10,000 dollar range," said Ed Laverly, who played the saxophone for Miller's orchestra. He said he expected tomorrow night's affair to raise a substantial amount, as well.

"I expect 1,000 to 3,000 people," said Laverly. "I'm hoping for it."

Joe Maccarillo, a bass player who worked with Miller and who now leads his own trio at Sun Valley, said the first scholarship will be awarded this spring. It will be given each year to a graduating senior from the Wood River Valley, based on need, talent, scholarship and citizenship, he said.

Those competing for the scholarship will submit to personal interviews and auditions, said Maccarillo, though no precise guidelines have

yet been established, and no dollar amount has been determined.

Miller, who died of leukemia Oct. 31, 1985, was a part of Sun Valley from the beginning of the resort's history. A member of the Earl Smith Orchestra, he stepped off a bus with the other members of the group at the new resort on Dec. 10, 1936, and served as Smith's piano player and arranger until 1952.

When Smith retired, Miller took over the group, which eventually became internationally known as Hap Miller's Sun Valley Orchestra. A few years after Miller took over its direction, the band became famous for its national radio broadcasts from Sun Valley's Duchin Room.

Miller retired in 1972, moving his winter home to Sun City, Ariz., but he returned to Sun Valley in the summers, playing piano in the Lodge Dining Room. His last local performance was in October 1984, a year before his death. He was 76 years old when he died. In Sun Valley, he isn't forgotten.

"He was Sun Valley in my mind," said Maccarillo. "He was the ultimate professional musician as far as I was concerned."

He described Miller's final performance with the orchestra as "one of the most memorable nights in the history of Sun Valley." Bob Mitchell, another longtime friend, agreed.

"When he retired, we had a series of parties that went on a week or 10 days," said Mitchell. He said that among those who called to wish Miller well in his retirement were then-President Ford, Frank Sinatra and Averell Harriman, who first led the Earl Smith Orchestra for his ski resort. Though he wasn't a musician, Mitchell said Miller awarded him a distinctive honor.

"Harry Truman and myself were the only honorary members of the musicians union," said Mitchell. He said Truman was sitting at a Sun Valley piano playing "The Missouri Waltz" when Miller walked over and gave him the other honorary membership.

Another long-time friend was Lou Holliday, a photographer for Sun Valley Company who was working as a waiter when Smith's orchestra stepped off the bus. He said he met Miller that day, and that he probably knew him better than anyone, except for Miller's wife.

"We were both here that first winter," said Holliday, offering high praise for his friend. "He was a great musician, and a great man." Miller, he said, loved nothing more than his music.

"The thing about Hap was he was a musician's musician," said Holliday. "I think he invented the piano."

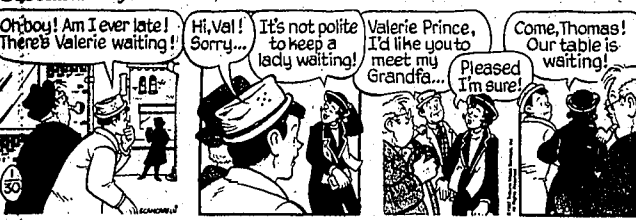

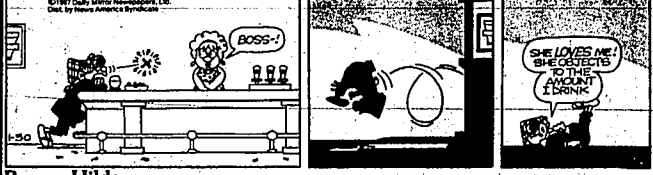

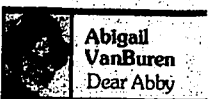
I hate pants on older women. The only females who should wear pants in public are cute little girls with well-rounded behinds.

fatalism. In other words, 'Why should I want to live? I'm not going to make it past 20, anyway.' And the music is affirming that idea."

Barger gives country music a lower rating than rock, a vote which surprises most seminar audiences.

"I think country music is the most devilish, devious form of music in the field today," he said. "We'll more easily accept the ideas of adultery, drinking and divorce through a music that's 'good ole throw home,' good, old-fashioned country music. What we're saying is 'Now listen, you kids, you can't listen to that music that talks about drugs and the occult,' but you can listen to our music that talks about sleeping with somebody else's wife and getting so drunk you can't see and then breaking up a bar. So it's good ideas that are just as detrimental, but more easily acceptable."

Barger said that Saturday morning and weekday afternoon cartoons are full of references to such occult practices as telepathy, psychic power and divination.

"I believe there's a conditioning process under way, either knowingly or unknowingly, against our courage occult values are all around us. Everything from He-Man to Smurfs is doing it."

"Papa Smurf's a male witch, a warlock. They admit this in print. It's all through the cute little cartoon books they put out, all through the TV series. I mean, there's no mistake about some of these things once you get into it and begin to find out some of the things."

"I think some of it's very deliberate. But I think most of all, people are just pawns and don't understand what they're doing. See, it's a big money business. In fact, rock music - this will blow your mind - last year rock music grossed more than TV, movies and sports combined."

Barger said that he receives hate mail ("not an extreme amount, but we get them"); has had a witch stand up during a seminar and begin to curse him, and has been pelted with rotten eggs. He said he's had a good reaction from most of the Christian community, with a few exceptions.

"I'll be honest with you," he said. "Some of the worst enemies you ever get are from within there, because people are so comfortable where they are they don't like you coming and telling them there could be something wrong with their particular walk with the Lord."

"It's a free society. I'm not trying to stop anybody from doing what they want to do."

Quaid changed his impression of fellow Texan on 'Early Years'

LOS ANGELES — Randy Quaid was a 13-year-old schoolboy in Houston when Lyndon Baines Johnson became president. The youth wasn't too impressed with his fellow Texan.

"I'd greatly admired John Kennedy," Quaid said. "I vaguely remember Johnson having a bad rap in Texas. The fact that he was going to be president didn't thrill me too much. Not knowing much about politics, I went by looks. Johnson seemed rather stiff. He really didn't impress me."

Twenty-three years later, after completing his role as young Lyndon Johnson in a three-hour NBC movie, Quaid has a totally different view.

"I went into this project with some prejudice and with the joy of getting a meaty role," he said. "I came away with tremendous admiration and respect. I really believe Johnson was one of our greatest statesmen and leaders."

"He was on the side of the people. He did a lot for racial equality. He did a lot for his state when he was in Congress. He had the ability to look at both sides of an issue and bring two opposing sides together. He was a man of great heart and compassion."

Quaid said he also saw Johnson as "a man with a huge appetite for work, food and sex. He does have that dark side. I think the film is pretty true to that. I was afraid at first the script would try to whitewash him, but it doesn't."

"LBJ: The Early Years" will be broadcast on KXSB and KUTV 7 p.m. Sunday. It follows the life of Johnson from 1934, when he was secretary to a Texas congressman, through his years in the House, then the Senate, to his swearing-in as president following the assassination of John F. Kennedy in November 1962.

The movie also stars Patti LaBelle.

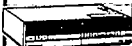

Machinations behind series' fate read like real-life daytime drama

All right "Capitol" fans, listen to Clarissa's Connie Towers. If you're really sore about losing the soap, write CBS-affiliate stations, make a fuss.

The five-year-old soap is a dead duck, being replaced by "The Bold and The Beautiful" beginning March 23. But then again, public outcry has worked before. Who knows?

Better yet, other networks express interest. Nibbles and rumors. "Capitol" defenders blame time slots for the demise, not the show's quality. Some wishful thinkers talked of expanding "Capitol" to an hour, followed by the newcomer, "The Bold and The Beautiful." It would be a good setup for the new half-hour soap about the world of fashion seen through two Chicago families.

Blame also goes back to last May's Ted Turner takeover assault on CBS. Until Turner came along, "Capitol" seemed over the hump, surviving nicely against the odds in the old-fashioned 30-minute format. After the costly Turner-CBS battle, the atmosphere changed on the set. "Capitol" seemed shaky and paranoia prevailed through the summer. The cast grew edgy. Deborah Mulrowney became dispirited, eager to work out her five-year contract and leave. Not Connie Towers (Mrs. John Gavin — the ex-ambassador's wife), who commuted between Mexico City and L.A. for the show. Her Clarissa McCandless-sweet, goody-goody Clarissa was embroiled in high drama, torn between Baxter McCandless (Ron Harper) whom the fans favor, and the old friend Sen. Mark Denning (Ed Nelson). Connie believes the show was cancelled at its peak.

"We were in good shape. The best ever. We had a direction and momentum. I felt wonderful. When I began, I lacked camera technique. John Conboy (the producer) has done everything for me. He treats everyone like a star.

"I've had my cake and all the frills. Allowed to perform and then fly to Mexico and play the ambassador's wife. Those three hours on the plane were perfect — alone, away from phones and all distractions."

Although the soap shoots until Feb. 22, Towers is already working

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC is expanding "Late Night with David Letterman" to five nights per week from the current four beginning in June.

The show, which is broadcast Monday through Thursday nights, will celebrate its 5th anniversary Feb. 7. Beginning June 12, it will also be broadcast Friday nights, followed by "Friday Night Videos."

An NBC spokesman said one of the

five shows a week will be a repeat, but not necessarily on the same night each week.

"Friday Night Videos," a 90-minute music video show that occupies the "Letterman" time period on Fridays, will be pared back to one hour.

"David Letterman keeps getting better and better every year as his show keeps breaking new ground and reaching bigger audiences," said

NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff in a prepared statement.

The Letterman show, a talk show with hip comedy, attained its highest rating ever: New Year's week, a 4.8. A rating point equals 874,000 households.

The "Late Night" fifth anniversary show will be broadcast in the "Saturday Night Live" time period.

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC is expanding "Late Night with David Letterman" to five nights per week from the current four beginning in June.

The show, which is broadcast Monday through Thursday nights, will celebrate its 5th anniversary Feb. 7. Beginning June 12, it will also be broadcast Friday nights, followed by "Friday Night Videos."

An NBC spokesman said one of the

five shows a week will be a repeat, but not necessarily on the same night each week.

"Friday Night Videos," a 90-minute music video show that occupies the "Letterman" time period on Fridays, will be pared back to one hour.

"David Letterman keeps getting better and better every year as his show keeps breaking new ground and reaching bigger audiences," said

NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff in a prepared statement.

The Letterman show, a talk show with hip comedy, attained its highest rating ever New Year's week, a 4.8. A rating point equals 874,000 households.

The "Late Night" anniversary show will be broadcast in the "Saturday Night Live" time period.

LOS ANGELES — WUSA in Washington, by refusing to air Jan. 11's episode of Oral Roberts' syndicated "Expect a Miracle" show, was among the first of a growing number of stations nationwide to take action following the evangelist's Jan. 4 request for funds. In the broadcast, and in the program rejected by the station, Roberts said that God had told him that unless he raised \$4.5 million by March for scholarships at the Oral Roberts University Medical School, he would die. "I want to be able to stand on this television program in April alive and tell you I have all I need," Roberts said.

Since then, several other stations, including KCNC in Denver, WAVE-TV in Louisville, WFAA-TV in Dallas and KWTY in Oklahoma City, have said they will refuse to air future broadcasts that include pleas for donations to extend the evangelist's life.

Representatives of WDFW-TV in Kansas City and KHJ-TV in Los Angeles also expressed concern about the nature of the broadcasts, saying they would be watching all future programs very carefully.

Roberts' program is aired in more than 200 markets nationwide.

Roberts' plea alters policies

LOS ANGELES — WUSA in Washington, by refusing to air Jan. 11's episode of Oral Roberts' syndicated "Expect a Miracle" show, was among the first of a growing number of stations nationwide to take action following the evangelist's Jan. 11 request for funds. In the broadcast, and in the program rejected by the station, Roberts said that God had told him that unless he raised \$4.5 million by March for scholarships at the Oral Roberts University Medical School, he would die. "I want to be able to stand on this television program in April alive and tell you I have all I need," Roberts said.

Since then, several other stations, including KCNC in Denver, WAVE-TV in Louisville, WFAA-TV in Dallas and KWTU in Oklahoma City, have said they will refuse to air future broadcasts that include pleas for donations to extend the evangelist's life. Representatives of WDAF-TV in Kansas City and KHL-TV in Los Angeles also expressed concern about the nature of the broadcasts, saying they would be watching all future programs very carefully. Roberts' program is aired in more than 200 markets nationwide.

Nielsen: Only 9th highest in 21-year history

Super Bowl not a ratings winner

NEW YORK (AP) — Super Bowl XXI wasn't a champ in the ratings, but it gave CBS first place in the prime-time network competition last week.

The Super Bowl had a rating of 45.8, only ninth highest in the history of the football championship and the lowest Super Bowl since 1981.

But David Poltrac, CBS vice president for research, said the game Sunday had the second-highest total audience, because a 1987 rating point stands for more households equipped with television than a rating point in previous years.

He called the rating "reasonable for the Super Bowl," but noted some audience dropoff after the third quarter when the Giants had put it away.

The highest-rated Super Bowl was the 1982 matchup between San Francisco and Cincinnati with a 49.1, or about 41.5 million households tuned in. The rating for Sunday's game, 45.8, means about 40 million households.

A rating is a percentage of the total number of households with television, now estimated to be 87.4 million.

Furthermore, the Super Bowl did not give a super boost to the new CBS drama "Hard Copy" that premiered in a 90-minute special

after the game. Last year, the police comedy "Last Precinct" followed NBC's coverage of the Super Bowl and ranked 8th for the week. "Hard Copy," about crime reporters, rated

19.8 and was 18th.

After the Super Bowl, the season-to-date score for weekly wins was NBC 15, CBS 3, ABC 0.

CBS' average prime-time rating for the week ending Jan. 25 was 18.5. NBC had 17.9. ABC trailed with 14.6. NBC now has a season-to-date average of 17.9, CBS 16.1 and ABC 14.1.

NBC once again barely edged CBS for first place in evening news ratings last week, with ABC trailing.

"ABC has seemingly fallen out of the race," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects. "It has become a two-network race."

For the week ending Jan. 23, NBC's "Nightly News" edged the "CBS Evening News" by a tenth of a rating point with a 13.4. ABC had 11.6.

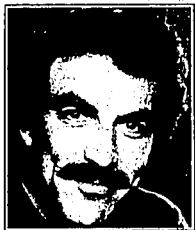
Each rating point equals 874,000 homes equipped with television.

Both NBC and CBS had a 22 share, or percentage of the viewing audience. ABC's share was 19.

The rest of the top 10 programs, No. 4 down, were: the Super Bowl post-game show. "Cheers," "Golden

Girls," "The Tortellis," "Moonlighting," "Growing Pains" and "Who's the Boss."

NBC said "Miami Vice" had its highest rating against "Dallas" this season, but "Dallas" still won the time period and was ranked 12th. "Vice" was 16th.

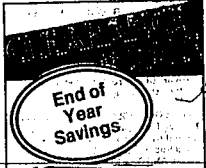

TV litigant nabbed again on drug charge

HOLLYWOOD — The Houston-area woman who last month filed a \$30 million libel suit against TV reporter Geraldo Rivera after her arrest during a nationally televised drug bust was arrested again Jan. 22 for allegedly selling marijuana.

Terry G. Rouse, 28, was one of six persons arrested in suburban Channelview, Texas, at the conclusion of what the Harris County Sheriff's Department called a two-week undercover narcotics investigation. Rouse was charged with two counts of felony delivery of marijuana and one misdemeanor delivery charge.

The arrest was made after a Harris County grand jury handed up sealed indictments Thursday naming nine different persons. All of the suspects were accused of selling marijuana to undercover police officers. Three suspects were reported to be still at large Jan. 23. Rouse was reported to be in custody that day in lieu of a \$4,500 bond.

Rouse gained national attention after she appeared on Rivera's Dec. 2 "American Vice: The Doping of a Nation" syndicated television special. In the live broadcast, Rouse was shown being arrested and handcuffed after Rivera said deputies were raiding the Channelview home of an alleged pimp and prostitutes.

She was released two days later after a Houston judge ruled officers had no probable cause to arrest her.

Rouse, denying Rivera's allegation, filed her libel suit Dec. 29 in Houston.

Her lawyers said that Rouse had never before been arrested.

Larry Simon, an attorney repre-

sented Rouse in the libel suit, said Jan. 22's arrest might have resulted from an effort by the sheriff's department to harass Rouse. "They've been doing everything they can to get ahold of her," Simon said. Sheriff's Department officials said Rouse's arrest was unrelated to the Dec. 2 incident.

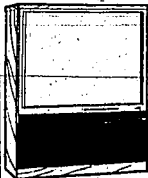
Rouse's suit named Harris County Sheriff Johnny Klevenhagen and other local officials as well as Rivera and Tribune Entertainment Co. of Chicago, distributor of the program. She charged in her suit that Rivera and Klevenhagen — who per-

sonally participated in the Dec. 2 raid — maliciously used her in a "conspiracy to arrest, imprison, prosecute and defame anyone they found" in order to boost the ratings for the program. The show was entertainment, not news, she and her lawyers said.

Neither Rivera nor Tribune Entertainment has filed a response to the suit, Tribune attorney Charles Sennet said Jan. 23. He also said the company would have no comment about Rouse's new arrest.

Rivera's New York office said he was not available Jan. 23.

LuPone, the star of Broadway's "Evita," as Lady Bird Johnson; Pat Hingle as Speaker of the House Sam Rayburn, Johnson's mentor; Charles Frank as Kennedy; Morgan Brittany as Alice Glass; and Barry Corvin as a judge—who-sponsored-Johnson's first run for Congress.

In the beginning, Johnson is shown as a man of high principles and morals. But they are eventually bent, if not broken, as he becomes a power broker and wheeler dealer. The poor man from Texas becomes a multi-millionaire.

Johnson is portrayed here as likeable although flawed. Previous portrayals, in "The Right Stuff" and films and miniseries about the Kennedys, have made Johnson to be a buffoon, or a dark and devious character. Jack Klugman played a well-rounded Johnson in his one-man stage play.

"I've wanted to play LBJ since I became an actor," said Quaid. "There's a physical resemblance.

we're both big men and we're both from Texas. I thought I probably wouldn't play him until I was in my 50s.

"I responded to him and his wants and needs in a way I've never done with any other character. I really wanted this to work. There has been so much about the Kennedys, but whenever you saw Johnson he was a caricature. I wanted to give it a good shot. If this generates enough interest I think we'll do a sequel about the presidential years."

Quaid would like to do the sequel because Johnson and his presidency were undone by the Vietnam War. "He thought he could handle the Viet Cong the way he handled people in Texas," he said. "He thought he could reason with them. But he had no understanding of them or their culture."

LBJ had been part of Quaid's repertoire of impressions when he did standup comedy. He also did

Nixon and later spoofed Ronald Reagan during his stint on NBC's "Saturday Night Live."

Two years ago, Quaid starred opposite the actress Ann-Margret as Mitch, the gentleman caller, in ABC's "A Streetcar Named Desire." He and his brother, Dennis, appeared together in the movie "The Long Riders" and in Sam Shepard's play "True West." Their father, Buddy, has a small role in "LBJ: The Early Years."

Quaid got his first movie role in 1971 right out of college.

"They were shooting 'The Last Picture Show' in Texas and I went to see Peter Bogdanovich, the director," he said.

"I was doing my impression of Dustin Hoffman in 'The Graduate' and I had this smirk on my face. I read for the role of a truck driver but he cast me as a student. It was the smirk that he liked."

Suicide coverage: Good sense shown

HOLLYWOOD—It was the ultimate media stunt, the big bang in front of the cameras, in plenty of time to make the evening news.

But having it was no reason to show it.

So the networks, CNN and Los Angeles TV stations used good judgment on their Jan. 22 newscasts by not showing Pennsylvania State Treasurer R. Budd Dwyer actually put the barrel of a .357 magnum pistol into his mouth and pull the trigger.

TV is not shy about showing violence and anguish, filling the screen with Dwyer's death-contorted face, though, could serve no purpose other than to exploit a tragedy for the sake of gruesome, unforgettable TV.

Stations here covered the story in varying degrees, including using footage of Dwyer with the gun as others pleaded with him to put it down. Happily, the pictures stopped there.

Hence, Los Angeles viewers—who are accustomed to the most outrageous media spectacles—were at least spared the Super Bowl of suicides.

Not all newspaper readers were, though. Some local papers (including one edition of *The Los Angeles Times*) ran wire-service photos of "the moment of impact" as Dwyer pulled the trigger, imagine picking up your paper and, without warning, seeing that. It was ghastly. It was unnecessary. It had the potential to traumatize.

The suicide was reportedly shown to its bloody conclusion on some stations in Pennsylvania, too.

Everyone had footage of Dwyer's grisly public act, which came a day before he was to be sentenced in federal court for fraud. Of course, they

had footage. The man wanted his death televised, photographed and written about in every newspaper in the land.

So he called a press conference in Harrisburg, where he made a half-hour statement in front of reporters and cameras, professing innocence and blaming his troubles on the legal system. Then came the surprise, as he produced a pistol from a large manila envelope and shot himself.

Dwyer orchestrated his own obituary.

Death on camera has a tradition, from the assassination of Lee Harvey Oswald to the fatal stabbing of a Japanese socialist leader in 1960 that Japanese TV aired again and again.

To air or not to air is always a tough judgment call in a medium in love with violence, and the Dwyer story must have sparked debates in newsrooms across the nation.

If TV sends suicides into our homes, though, which domino falls next? Televised hangings? Murders?

On very rare occasions, they should be shown.

Dwyer's story appeared in newscasts, for example, that also carried footage of unarmed anti-government demonstrators in Manila being shot down by apparently panicking Filipino troops. Death in the streets, chaotic, revealing images of post-Marcos Philippines.

Now flash back to the 1960s. Nothing from Indochina better conveyed the excesses of war than shocking pictures of a young Viet Cong suspect having his brains blown out at point-blank range by South Vietnam Police Chief Nguyen Loan in 1968. TV was revolting that day—but important.

From the same era came TV pictures of Buddhist monks in Vietnam who torched themselves before the media to protest the Saigon government, fiery suicides that showed Americans another side of the conflict there.

Dwyer's suicide, though, was merely the act of a desperate, troubled man that became national news only because he had summoned the unsuspecting media to witness it. If he had ended his life in private, his suicide would have merited slight notice outside his home state.

So his media stunt worked, even though most of the media used relative restraint in reporting the story.

"If suicides are going to be media events, then we're all in trouble," said Pete Noyes, managing editor for KNBC Channel 4 news, which stood alone in Los Angeles in running no footage of the Dwyer press conference.

Channel 4 merely reported the story and showed a picture of Dwyer.

Other stations showed segments of the news conference up to the point of Dwyer inserting the barrel and pulling the trigger. KTTV Channel 11 added one touch, using the sound of the gunshot over a freeze-frame of Dwyer holding the pistol.

"I'm offended by this," Noyes said about even the limited coverage on other Los Angeles stations. "We don't report suicides unless they're extraordinary, like Marilyn Monroe. We feel that reporting suicides might encourage border-line people who are thinking of doing it themselves."

That's a humane policy. But worrying about potential copycats can be carried to the extreme.

To air or not to air? R. Budd Dwyer is dead, but the debate lingers.

Concern by statesmen, doctors expressed on 'Amerika' showing

NEW YORK (AP) ABC, whose "Amerika" miniseries has angered the left, the right, the Soviet Union and the United Nations even before it has aired, now has a letter of concern signed by three former U.S. secretaries of state.

In it, Edmund Muskie, Alexander M. Haig and Dean Rusk urged the network to provide programming about U.N. peace-keeping operations to offset the miniseries' depictions of oppression by Soviet-controlled U.N. forces.

And, in Boston, U.S. leaders of an international peace group said the ABC-TV miniseries will reinforce stereotypes about the Soviet Union and could harm efforts to prevent nuclear war.

"Amerika" will pour fuel on the embers of the Cold War," U.S. members of International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War, said Monday in a letter to top ABC executives. "It panders to the worst instincts and most irrational fears of the American public."

Spokesman Peter Zheutlin said the Boston-based group did not ask ABC to reconsider its broadcast but urged the network to make air time available for a discussion of the issues the program raises and ABC's decision to broadcast it.

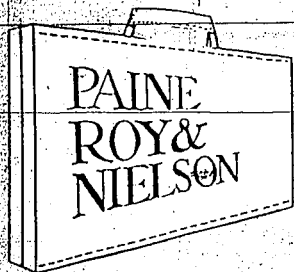
The \$40 million, 14½-hour production, to air Feb. 15-22, dramatizes life in the United States 10 years after a bloodless takeover by the Soviet Union, with the occupation forces known as "U.N. Special Service Units."

The letter signed by the Muskie, Haig and Rusk was organized and sent by the United Nations Association of the U.S.A., a private research and educational group. Others who signed the letter included Jeane Kirkpatrick and Andrew Young, two former chief United States delegates to the U.N.

Former national security advisers Robert McFarlane, now a central figure in the Iran-contra arms investigation, and Brent Scowcroft, currently on a three-man Special Review Board appointed by President Reagan to investigate the Iran-contra arms affair, also signed the letter.

ABC officials previously have insisted that the \$35 million miniseries in no way means to disparage the United Nations as it exists today.
